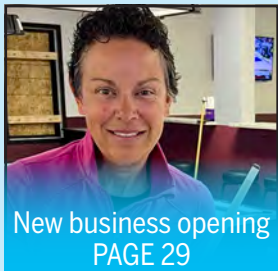

Local candidates file to run

BULLETIN REPORT

Election season in the Mesilla Valley has officially begun.

In all, 38 candidates filed to compete for 19 offices ranging from county clerks to district attorneys to state legislators.

March 12 was the day to file to run for office in New Mexico. Many of the contests will effectively be decided in party primaries on June 4, while the rest will be decided by Election Day, Nov. 5.

New Mexico is a three-party state, with Libertarians sharing major party status with Democrats and Republicans. Statewide, six Libertarian candidates are seeking office, but not in Doña Ana County.

Voter registration can be done online at the New Mexico Secretary of State's website, SOS.NM.gov. The same website can also tell residents what elections they can vote in.

3rd Judicial District Attorney

Incumbent Gerald Byers, a Las Cruces Democrat, faces Las

Cruces Democrats Shaharazad Booth, Ramona Martinez and Pedro Pineda as well as Mesilla Democrat Fernando Macias. The winner of that Democratic primary faces Michael Cain, a Las Cruces Republican.

Doña Ana County Clerk

Incumbent Amanda Lopez Askin, a Las Cruces Democrat, faces Las Cruces Democrat An-

drew Ostic. The winner of that Democratic primary race faces Las Cruces Republican Cheryl De Young.

Doña Ana County Commissioners

Incumbent Diana Murillo (District 2), a Democrat from Anthony, faces Anthony Democrat Gloria Gameros. The winner of that Democratic primary faces Chamberino Republican Lorraine Limon McCullough.

Incumbent Irma Susana Chaparro (District 4), a Democrat from Las Cruces, faces Organ Republican Stacie Durham.

Incumbent Manuel Sanchez (District 5), a Democrat from Doña Ana, faces Las Cruces Democrat Oscar Vasquez Butler.

Doña Ana County Treasurer

Marisol Richardson, a Democrat from Mesilla Park, is running unopposed.

State Senate District 31

Incumbent Joseph Cervantes, a Democrat from Las Cruces, is running unopposed to hold his seat.

State Senate District 35

Incumbent Crystal Brantley, a Republican from Elephant Butte, will run unopposed.

State Senate District 36

Incumbent Jeff Steinborn, a Democrat from Las Cruces, faces Las Cruces Republican challenger David Tofsted.

State Senate District 37

Incumbent William "Bill" Soules, a Democrat from Las Cruces, runs unopposed to hold his seat.

State Senate District 38

Incumbent Carrie Hamblen, a Democrat from Las Cruces, faces Las Cruces Republican challenger Samantha Barncastle Salopek.

State Representative District 32

Democrats Linda Alvarez from Hatch and Andrew Simon Hernandez of Deming will face each other in the June 4 primary, with the winner facing incumbent Jenifer Jones, R-Deming.

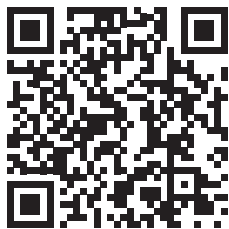

AG to set task force for missing Indigenous people

Attorney General Raúl Torrez plans to establish a task force focused on the disproportionate rates at which Indigenous people experience violence and go missing, the New Mexico Department of Justice announced Tuesday. The agency also launched the initial phase of an online portal for tracking cases of missing Indigenous people.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham's administration in mid-2023 dissolved a group dedicated to addressing a crisis of missing and murdered Indigenous people. Advocates and affected families spoke against the decision, saying their work was just beginning.

The Legislature seemed to agree, unanimously passing Senate Joint Me-

morial 2 last month calling on Torrez to convene tribal representatives, survivors and families, and law enforcement officials to update a state response plan created by the defunct task force in 2022 and offer legislative recommendations.

The state budget includes \$200,000 for that purpose.

A spokesperson for Torrez, Lauren Rodriguez, said he'll follow the Legislature's guidance outlined in the memorial as he figures out the task force's membership.

The public portal unveiled on Tuesday — which includes 201 missing Indigenous people, with an average time missing of 2,886 days, or nearly eight years — comes two years after lawmakers mandated it.

Lawmakers in 2022 passed a bill requiring

the attorney general's office to develop an online portal for cases of missing Indigenous people. The bill permits the department to give tribes grants, as well, to help them use the portal. Lawmakers appropriated \$1 million for the work. In November, New Mexico In Depth reported none of the money had been spent.

"We have to break down barriers to communication in this space and give the public and key stakeholders direct access" to information, Torrez said in a news release, adding the portal is a "critical first step in that process and will provide invaluable insights for policymakers," including the task force he intends to create.

The portal lists known missing persons cases and provides families with information about where

they can file cases, depending on where they live.

But for the portal to be as useful as possible, it needs to include more information, said Darlene Gomez, a member of the defunct task force and attorney who represents affected families pro-bono.

Gomez pointed out the missing persons entries don't have photos attached to them and don't include many details.

"To me it just seems like something that they just

threw up there to say they have a portal," Gomez said. "And if this is what they're going to produce, why did it take them two years to do so?"

The department is working to gain access to criminal justice information systems maintained by the FBI, Rodriguez said in an email, which will allow for more detailed entries, including photos.

Rodriguez said the department doesn't yet have the ability to directly

collect reports on the portal because that will require memorandums of understanding. For now, she said, the portal directs people to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

This reporting was supported by the International Women's Media Foundation's Fund for Indigenous Journalists: Reporting on Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, Two Spirit and Transgender People.

Hatch mayor dies at his business

The Hatch Police Department announced on Sunday that the village's mayor, James "Slim" Whitlock, died suddenly on Saturday at the age of 64.

Whitlock, who grew up in the Hatch Valley and lived there most of his life, died at Jim's Supermarket on W. Hall Street, the family business he owned and managed, Mayor Pro Tem Dennis Torres told KRQE-TV. The supermarket was a short walk away from the village's administra-

tive offices on Franklin Street.

He had served as an elected member of the Hatch Valley Schools Board of Education and as a village trustee before being elected mayor in 2021.

On the village board and from the mayor's office, Whitlock was known for advocating for infrastructure investment in his community, particularly for flood mitigation and protection in the aftermath of catastrophic flooding in 2006.

"Slim was a kind man, a respected friend, and a strong leader," U.S. Sen. Martin Heinrich, D-N.M., wrote on X, the social website once known as Twitter.

State Sen. Jeff Steinborn, D-Las Cruces, remembered Whitlock as a "dear friend" and wrote, "I honestly don't know that (I've) ever met a more loving person who gave 100% of himself to help his community."

Torres now serves as mayor on an interim basis.

City breaks ground on housing for low-income families, seniors

The city of Las Cruces broke ground on two affordable housing projects in March and February.

The projects – one located at El Paseo Road and Farney Lane and the other at 130 N. Walnut Street – are part of Las Cruces' efforts to alleviate an affordable housing crisis that prevents residents from finding affordable places to rent or

buy a home for the first time and causes people to become homeless.

The city broke ground on the N. Walnut project in February. That project, called the Three Sisters Apartments, will be a 70-unit housing complex for families with children. The units will be reserved for families who make no more than about \$30,000, or 60 percent of the area's median income.

Chelsea Investment

Corporation – a California-based company that's done business in New Mexico before this project – is the developer. The city sent about \$3.4 million to the project.

"The project boasts a range of amenities tailored to its residents' needs, including a community space, laundry facilities, a computer center, BBQ and picnic area, a dog park, and two playgrounds," the city said in a news release.

The city broke ground on the second project on March 11. Pedrena Apartments will be located at the northeast corner of El Paseo Road and Farney Lane.

The 80-unit apartment complex is reserved for residents 55 or older. Like the Three Sisters Apartments, Pedrena Apartments are reserved for residents making no more than about \$30,000, or 60 percent of the area's median income. The city expects the apartments to be completed in the summer or early fall of 2025.

"Pedrena Apartments is expected to be 100 percent occupied by December 2025," a news release said.

Thomas Development

Co., of Boise, Idaho, is the lead developer.

The residents of Las Cruces approved a \$6 million General Obligation Bond in 2022. The city pitched the bond as a vital source of money to help alleviate the negative impacts of a stunted stock of affordable housing. The city council issued the bond at a council meeting on March 4.

The federal government defines affordable housing as rent or mortgage that costs less than 30 percent of the combined income of everyone living in the unit.

According to a review of Las Cruces income data from the U.S. Census Bureau and available data about average rental and

mortgage prices, more than half of all residents in Las Cruces could not afford over half of the available units.

Additionally, the city estimates that Las Cruces would need 5,600 more units to meet demand.

A recent report commissioned by the city noted that New Mexico State University and the various U.S. military installations in the area create additional demand. The report also found that only 20 percent of units in Las Cruces were suited to be easily rentable as a single-family attached unit (commonly known as a "mother-in-law casitas") or multi-family housing such as apartment complexes.

Police auditor vets more complaints against LCPD

An independent police auditor noted a rise in allegations against the Las Cruces Police Department during a presentation to the Las Cruces City Council on March 11.

However, OIR Group, a California-based police auditing firm, attributed the rise in allegations to better reporting and a more thorough process by LCPD.

"I think this report, more than anything, is starting to reflect the shift in culture that I think we've all been really happy to see," Councilor Becki Graham said.

Other members of the council and city administrators also felt Monday's report signaled a positive change in LCPD.

"I think if you zoom out for this entire period, you'll see a lot of positive change that resulted because of our relationship with OIR, that might not have happened otherwise," LCPD Chief Jeremy Story said.

The city of Las Cruces hired OIR Group in March 2021. The city council renewed the agreement in February, asking the group to continue monitoring LCPD and host four public meetings yearly in exchange for about \$75,000.

OIR reviews LCPD's internal investigations into misconduct allegations to "determine if cases were complete, objective, and thorough."

Misconduct allegations can range from foul language from officers to improperly written reports to deadly use of force.

OIR also reviews what, if any, corrective action the department took following investigations. According to OIR, LCPD often follows up by amending its general orders to reflect national best practices and OIR's recommendations.

"I'm so appreciative of this relationship (between OIR and LCPD) and I actually enjoy the conversations that we have," Story said.

OIR reviews and presents about once every six months. This audit's time frame was from June 1, 2023, to Dec. 1, 2023. However, cases from outside the time frame can also arise to OIR's attention depending on several circumstances.

For this audit, OIR reviewed 98 allegations made either by residents or members of the police department, a higher number than typical.

"When you see an increase in a category like misconduct investigations, there's obviously an initial impulse to think, 'This is concerning.' It's been our experience that isn't necessarily true," said Stephen Connolly, a principal of OIR and one of its investigators.

Connolly said part of the reason for more cases was simply a coincidence. He noted that many allegations came in towards the

end of the period, but most amounted to low-level misconduct allegations. That created a backlog, bloating the number when the cases went to OIR.

One incident documented in OIR's report involved a police officer attaching a police report to a divorce filing. LCPD found the officer did not have the authority to view the report, much less use it in divorce court. According to OIR, LCPD disciplined the officer and retrained him regarding the confidentiality of records.

Connolly also said OIR believes LCPD has prioritized "a more timely completion" of misconduct allegations and a more thorough review process.

"We really see it as a hallmark of an effective discipline process," Connolly said.

About half of the 98 allegations were substantiated, meaning the department found the allegation did occur and took disciplinary or corrective action. Sustained allegations led to various consequences, including

verbal reprimand and suspension or termination. According to OIR, at least

one officer was fired during this period.

"Unless you're separating the employee from the agency altogether, (discipline) really should be about changing behavior and correcting behavior," Connolly said, adding that LCPD was enforcing

debriefs or training for officers with sustained misconduct allegations.

"The department has gotten much better about adding some sort of counseling, training or debriefing session with the involved officers to make sure that, along with the formal consequence, there's some opportunity to grow and improve," Connolly said.

The department found that most of the allegations had not occurred.

"In almost all of the cases, we agreed with and aligned with the finding. In some, we had some disagreements, and we raised that to the chief and to the department," Magula said, adding that the cases in disagreement were closed.

OIR investigator Teresa Magula also said OIR reviewed incidents

in which two LCPD officers improperly used their police status to "gain access to information that otherwise would not have been available to a member of the public."

"The department really quickly put in some safeguards around sharing information and around access to information, which we felt was very appropriate," Magula said. "We look forward to not seeing these types of allegations in the future, given the new guard rails that are up."

Sen. Martin Heinrich, a Democrat from Albuquerque, faces no primary challenger as he seeks a third six-year term. It appears he will face Republican Nella Louise Domenici of Santa Fe, as a second Republican candidate, former Bernalillo County Sheriff Manny Gonzales, was disqualified.

With over 300 employees, LCU strives to grow and teach the next generation of skilled trade workers by offering on-the-job training and certification programs for individuals interested in natural gas and energy, water, wastewater, and solid waste.

“If you are interested in joining the team, come in motivated and ready to work hard. We will do the rest and get you trained,” said Juan Molina, LCU Interim Gas Systems Supervisor.

Molina, Hernandez, and the other natural gas representatives set up a



booth at the event and demonstrated the variety of skills one can develop working with natural gas, including construction, maintenance, corrosion control, leak surveying, operations, and pressure and service. The LCU booth visually demonstrated an underground pipe system with corrosion control measures, including pipe conduction test boxes and underground anodes that protect metal pipes from rust.

The LCU team frequently participates in community events like “Plan My Future” to ensure the

next generation is informed about the career opportunities right in their hometown.

“Overall, it was a great event,” said Hernandez. “It’s something I wish they had when I was in school. Students need to know about trades and other careers that can be attained without a college degree while still making good money. Most had no idea about all the different utility positions and benefits of working for LCU. I’m fortunate to have been able to share my experience.”

Bataan memorial event this weekend

White Sands Missile Range is revving up for the 35th Annual Bataan Memorial Death March on Saturday, March 16.

More than 5,000 people are signed up to participate in the memorial march conducted in honor of the service members who defended the Philippine Islands during World War II, and were forced to march 65 miles to confinement camps.

In 1945, U.S.-Filipino

forces recaptured the Philippines and freed the captive soldiers who were suffering in the confinement camps. These soldiers would be impacted by the poor conditions of the camps and the mistreatment by their Japanese captors. About one-third of the prisoners died from health complications after they were freed.

Others were wounded or killed when unmarked enemy ships transporting prisoners of war to Japan were sunk by U.S. air and

naval forces.

During the Bataan Death March, approximately 10,000 men died. Of these men, 1,000 were American and 9,000 were Filipino.

This had a huge impact on New Mexico families. Of the 1,816 200th and 515th Coast Artillery men identified, 829 men were to never return home, losing their lives in battle, in prisons or after liberation.

The Army ROTC Department at New Mexico State University began sponsoring the Bataan Memorial

Death March in 1989.

The event was the idea of NMSU ROTC cadet Ray Pickering, now a retired Lieutenant Colonel, and it has continued to be a significant event in Southern New Mexico. Pickering, now 88, will be on hand for this year's event.

The memorial march was to mark a page in his-

tory that included many native sons and affected many families in the state. In 1992, White Sands Missile Range and the New

Mexico National Guard joined in the sponsorship and the event was moved

NMSU Regents punt on presidential finalists, start new search

The Board of Regents of New Mexico State University began a second search for a new leader on March 11 after deciding not to hire any of the five candidates they'd interviewed in recent weeks.

The regents also moved to find an interim president in the same vote.

The vote does not indicate whether Jay Gogue,

who has been filling the presidential role since April 2023, will remain interim. In September 2023, the regents amended Gogue's contract so that it must be renewed monthly.

The unanimous vote of the regents renews the process of hiring a long- and short-term leader for NMSU.

"After careful consideration, I do not believe that any of the current

finalists fully meet the needs of New Mexico State University at this critical juncture," regents chair Ammu Devasthali said in a prepared statement. "Finding the right leader is paramount."

Student-regent Garrett Mosley made the motion following a closed-door discussion about the five candidates that lasted about an hour.

The five candidates

were:

- Wayne Jones, Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at the University of New Hampshire
- Richard Williams, former president of Utah Tech University
- John Volin, Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost of the University of Maine
- Michael Galyean, Paul Whitfield Horn Distin-

guished Professor in the Department of Veterinary Sciences and former Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs at Texas Tech University

• Austin Lane, Chancellor of Southern Illinois University
"While the presented candidates possess impressive qualifications and are assets to their respective institutions, we have yet to see the next leader

for our university," Devasthali said.

No other public discussion was had during the meeting on March 11.

"The Presidential Search Committee has worked extremely hard to bring forward the best candidates from the pool, and we appreciate their efforts," Devasthali said. "The motion today does not reflect the committee's valuable contributions."

Alma d'Arte charter school again under scrutiny

During spring break, Alma d'Arte Charter High School principal Adam Amador worked through the week assembling documents addressing a number of financial and academic concerns raised by the New Mexico Public Education Commission.

Amador is the new principal at Alma, a public charter school dedicated to arts integration founded in 2004 and based at the historic Court Junior High School on Court Avenue.

At its February 16 session, the 10-member elected body — which authorizes and oversees state-chartered charter schools in New Mexico — discussed concerns raised by parents and faculty of the arts-based public charter school founded in Las Cruces in 2004, as well as the school's financial audit and annual report from the state's Charter Schools Division.

PEC staff have encouraged Alma to develop a grievance process in order to handle complaints that have been coming to the PEC from the school's community. At the meeting, held in Santa Fe, staff also addressed a number of concerns with which they had been addressing directly with Amador, who started on the job last July.

Charter Schools Division Director Corina Chavez told the commis-

sioners the agency was concerned about the governing board's compliance with the Open Meetings Act, noting that the school's website — where notices of public meetings, agendas and contacts for the school's governing council — was down for an extended period of time in recent months. A revamped and updated web site is currently live.

Additionally, the CSD was troubled by complaints of students being expelled from the school without process; that the school was placed on a corrective action plan by the Public Education Department's Office of Special Education; and that its annual report identified gaps in performance in numerous areas.

The commissioners voted to notify the school it would be placed on the agenda of a future meeting to report on its academic performance, special education compliance, enrollment and

disenrollment processes, as well as organizational matters such as reporting requirements, use of grant funds, grievance policies and how it will address audit findings. Meanwhile, the CSD would continue its own process of finalizing the annual report and addressing its concerns, Chavez explained.

In 2021, Alma d'Arte's charter was renewed through 2027 with conditions, as the agency worked with the school on a list of issues related to governance, finances, enrollment and services for students with special needs.

This followed a tumultuous few years in which a former principal was indicted for embezzlement and the school came a procedural step away from possibly losing its charter under the PEC's "intervention ladder," when a notice of breach of its charter was issued in 2019. The notice addressed

problems in the school's special education services and services for English language learners among other items, as both the principal's office and governing board saw rapid turnover.

Chair Patricia Gipson, who represents PEC District 7 and lives in Las Cruces, suggested the notice was an effort to assure the school was on track, saying, "I think we're trying to be proactive here and (give) the school the opportunity to hopefully clear up a lot of these things and then take a look at those areas that may still need further review and feedback from the school."

Although initially the PEC wanted Amador to report to the body at its March meeting, it has been pushed back to April, Amador said during an interview.

A major problem for the school, he said, was that a good deal of special education documentation for time prior to his arrival was simply missing: "When I got here, this office was empty. I mean no documents, no nothing. We're starting from zero."

Amador acknowledged that he arrived following a school year he described as "a wash," with no improvement in proficiency or growth, plus low and inconsistent attendance among the school's 130 students — conditions he's been struggling to turn around rapidly to get the school into compli-

ance with its charter. He has also contended with drugs on campus and bullying. Besides empty drawers in the special education office, he said some of the policy documents and handbooks that did exist were out of date.

"It's an art integration school, but the arts doesn't keep the school open, the academic side

of the house does," he said, while maintaining the school was committed to maintaining music, performance and fine arts at the core of its academic instruction, with visiting artists being brought in to work with students and investments in its culinary program.

ACE scholarships flow to Mission Academy

Private education recently became a bit more accessible at one Las Cruces school through a partnership with a national organization's partial tuition scholarship program.

Early this year, Mission Academy, a private micro school in Las Cruces, became a new partner school with the ACE Scholarships program. The school currently serves 75 students from kindergarten through 12th grade.

ACE, or Alliance for Choice in Education, is a nonprofit organization that supports the expansion of school choice. The organization also provides scholarships for children from lower income families to attend private schools in several states

across the country, including New Mexico.

According to numbers for the 2023-24 school year provided by Kirsten Eastwood, vice president of scholarships at ACE, the organization partners with 1,047 schools across 12 states – 34 schools are in New Mexico.

Mission Academy joins Three Crosses Christian School and Las Cruces Catholic School as program partners in Las Cruces.

Eastwood explained that schools interested in the program send in an application and the program administrators review “schools holistically” from enrollment history to location to determine a good fit.

“Adding Mission Academy as an ACE partner school not only allows us

to reach even more students in the Las Cruces area, but it also gives our ACE families expanded school choice,” Eastwood said.

According to their website, the standard ACE awards are \$3,000 for K-8th grade and \$4,000 for high school grades. However, the scholarship should be no greater than 50 percent of private school tuition, though this can vary by circumstance.

The program has family income caps that administrators look at to determine whether a student qualifies for a scholarship. For example, a two-person household has a maximum qualifying yearly income of \$71,540 while a four-person household has a cap of \$109,200 yearly income.

The program's website includes a chart for families to easily determine whether their child qualifies.

Mission Academy's annual tuition is \$9,500 for students K-12 along with an annual registration fee

of \$375, which means a student awarded the scholarship will likely receive the full amount to cover half of the tuition expenses.

In comparison – according to the National Center for Education Statistics, Las Cruces Public Schools served over 23,600 students during the 2020-2021 school year and spent \$12,277 per student. These expenditures were paid for largely through state funding, as well as federal and local revenue.

The second half of Mission Academy's tuition must be paid out-of-pocket. The school offers need-based financial aid and several different payment plans to assist families.

ACE scholarships will then follow the awarded student through the rest of their private education career until they graduate high school – as long as the student completes the application on time each year and remains enrolled in one of the program's partner schools.

Liane Conaway, pro-

gram director for Mission Academy, noted that school administrators recognize their tuition is high. However, the hope is that the new scholarship partnership will financially assist current students as well as open an avenue for potential students who otherwise would not be able to afford tuition.

“This isn't any type of elite school, so to speak. I mean, we really do want to welcome any who are interested in this type of learning, since it's not a traditional school. So yeah, I think that it would be a great opportunity to bring in other families from different demographics,” Conaway said.

Scholarship applications open annually on the first Monday in February. Students attending or interested in attending Mission Academy can apply for the scholarship beginning this year. The application window for the 2024-25 school year closes at 11:59 p.m. April 15.

“For the 2023-2024 school year, we provided 20 students an ACE Scholarship (at) our partner schools in Las Cruces,” Eastwood said.

She added that it is “yet to be seen” how many Mission Academy students will qualify for a scholarship.

Mission Academy originated in 2016 as Acton Academy Mesilla Valley, founded by Anna Emerick-Biad. Conaway, who has worked for the school

for five years, said the idea originated through looking for new creative and “innovative ways to educate our children.”

The school followed the Acton Academy model – a learning model launched in Austin, Texas with schools open across the country. Emerick-Biad left the Acton model about two years ago, forming Mission Academy.

Conaway explained that the Acton Model places a lot of focus on online learning, which can be limiting for this particular school's population of students. Now, Mission Academy continues to incorporate guided online learning paired with hands-on education, entrepreneurial projects and outdoor learning.

“We are a micro school, so we're not designed to get big or anything like that. But we definitely want to give that individualized learning to each student that we possibly can and be able to meet those needs,” Conaway said.

She added that the school graduated their first student from high school last year and will have three graduates this year.

“I feel like we are a very magical school in the sense that we love to bring learning to life. So, the kids aren't going to just learn from a platform or a textbook,” Conaway said. “We're going to have real world experiences as to why it's important to learn what we're learning.”

Las Cruces mulls spending millions in cannabis and opioid money

Las Cruces is sitting on at least \$10 million of unspent money. Some of the money stems from the expansion of cannabis operations; but most of it arises in the aftermath of the historic opioid settlement. How and where to spend the money rests in the hands of city officials and elected representatives.

Las Cruces officials presented an update on the two funding sources during a budget presentation on March 12, adding to a previous discussion

in council chambers Sept. 11, 2023.

For now, the money remains unspent.

According to a March 12 presentation, the city has collected about \$1.5 million from the cannabis excise tax, which is a 12 percent tax placed on sales of legal cannabis within city limits.

The tax rate will grow yearly. It stops at 18 percent on July 1, 2030. But as long as residents (and people from Texas) continue to buy legal weed, Las Cruces can count on the money as a stable revenue source. This money

can also be used for anything the city wishes, as it is considered “unrestricted.”

Josie Trevino, interim Finance Deputy Director, told the council that two possible uses for the money were the metropolitan redevelopment areas (MRAs) and the real-time crime center (RTCC).

The MRAs are small districts the council established over El Paseo/S. Solano and W. Picacho. The districts allow the city to invest public funds in infrastructure development to stimulate economic growth in those

corridors.

The RTCC is a project pitched by the Las Cruces Police Department as a tool to solve and prevent crime. It would connect LCPD to public cameras and allow LCPD to surveil areas in real time. It also provides information to officers when they arrive at a scene that they might not otherwise have access to.

The council has said that both projects are top priorities. Because cannabis excise tax money is unrestricted, both can be funded.

The same cannot be said for the opioid settlement money.

Municipalities across Doña Ana County expect to receive \$25 million.

About \$9.9 million of that will go to the city of Las Cruces. So far, Las Cruces officials said they’ve collected about \$3.4 million. The rest will filter in between now and 2038.

According to the settlements, the money is restricted for use in center areas to repair the damage from decades of crisis inflicted by pharmaceutical manufacturers, distributors and retailers.

The money stems from a massive lawsuit in which dozens of attorneys general across the county sought compensation from big pharmaceutical companies, alleging they caused the opioid epidemic that has rocked America and New Mexico.

“All these monies can

be used for opioid remediation,” attorney Luis Robles told councilors in 2023. “And that is to provide the treatment, the services, and develop the strategies and infrastructure necessary to treat those that have the opioid use disorder.”

Barbara Bencomo, the city’s chief administrative officer, divided the spending options into three categories: treatment, prevention, and everything else.

Bencomo said that the “Treatment” category includes medication-assisted treatment and improvements to the criminal justice system. She said the “Preven-

A project underway on campus is the development of working studios and a gallery he suggested could be not only an exhibition space for students’ work but an opportunity to practice management and professional art curation skills.

Amador has been the target of complaints at governing board meetings as well as to the PEC about expulsions and fir-

ings and heavy-handed policy shifts, but Amador told the Bulletin his actions have been devoted to bringing the school into compliance with its charter as well as the corrective action plan with the special education office, while getting students as motivated about academics as about arts.

He said he looked forward to apprising the PEC of the supports the school has put in place — saying he would show documentation of art integration, use of grants, and

progress on the school’s corrective action plans — and he said he welcomed accountability, if it comes with prospective solutions.

Patting a copy of the school’s charter and correspondence with PEC, Amador said, “This is what closes a school, right here.” While chances were the school might end up on the intervention ladder again, he said, “This is accountability, and I’m not fighting it. ... The best I can do is move forward, as positive as I can.”

Deming's solution for public comment

Elsewhere on this page, columnist Walt Rubel notes a major drawback to public comments at open meetings: Nominally allowing the public a space to provide input on public business, they are vulnerable to grandstanding, defamatory statements and false assertions presented as fact. They can also prolong business meetings, making them less accessible for other members of the public. These are meetings that often run for several hours.

City council meetings in Deming were also a side show at times. Councilors and staff sat through personal abuse and ridicule as well as efforts to draw them into public debate, while some speakers exhibited their own lack of knowledge of how the city functioned or paid for things.

In 2022, the city of Deming eliminated public comments from business

meetings altogether, except for hearings where the opportunity is required, and introduced monthly town halls instead. Once a month, with occasional exceptions, the city manager, police chief and department heads take questions and hear comments from the public. One or two elected officials also attend, but under the law they need to avoid a quorum since these are

not legally noticed public meetings of the council. The public can give input or ask questions and engage in back-and-forth that the council meetings did not allow.

The city made excellent use of Q&A, along with its own presentations, to educate the public about how government works. City staff explained their jobs and made note of problems requiring investigation. Importantly, they followed up on many complaints, prompting some citizens to come

back expressing gratitude and, importantly, greater trust.

This solution demands time from non-elected staff on top of their regular duties, and there are the perennial problems of scheduling town halls at a time when the greatest portion of the public may attend. I would still defend time for public input at business meetings. Still, this town hall approach to public input, accompanied by civic education, has largely won me over.

Public comment part of messy process

Most Americans think we have the right to attend public meetings and let our elected officials know what we think about how they're doing. There is no such right in New Mexico.

Our open meetings law requires that accommodations be made for the public to attend and listen to meetings of the city council, county commission and other government boards and commissions. But there's nothing that says we have the right to speak at those meetings.

It's up to each board to set its own rules. Typically, elected leaders understand the obvious danger in ignoring

the voters and allow for public comment. But they're not required to.

The Las Cruces City Council provides ample opportunity for the public at its meetings. There's a chance to speak for or against every item on the agenda before a final vote is taken. And there is time reserved at the start of the meeting for public comment about things not on the agenda.

That open comment period has recently become problematic, with an organized effort by critics of the city council who are concerned about

crime in their neighborhoods and at their places of business. That has led to an organized effort by supporters of the city council to defend them. Maybe that's just democracy in all of its messy glory, and if the meeting gets delayed for a while, who cares?

But I do understand the frustration of city council members who, under the current rules of order, are unable to respond to criticism.

During a recent interview on KTAL-LP community radio, Mayor Eric Enriquez said he was

considering tweaks to the system but made it clear that the public comment period is not intended to be an open debate.

Enriquez referred to city council meetings as "business meetings." He urged people who have concerns about what the city is doing to contact members of the city council and speak to them directly.

While I agree, I also understand that speaking to the councilor doesn't always resolve the problem. There should be an opportunity for people to raise their concerns publicly.

As a reporter, I wasn't a fan of public comment. Listening to 20 people

trying to find different ways to make the exact same point gets tiring. But it's a necessary part of the process.

To raise awareness of government transparency, the American Society of Newspaper Editors created Sunshine Week in 2005. They scheduled it for mid-March every year to pay homage to James Madison, an early proponent of open government.

Newspapers all across the nation jumped on board with a collaborative effort featuring editorials and investigative reports exposing violations of open records or

Celebrating a Tax Win for New Mexico's Kids and Families

As mamas, we know that having kids changes how you see the world. Figuring out how to keep your little ones safe and healthy, so they can grow up to thrive, is a worry that doesn't go away. Finding access to high-quality care for our children has felt nearly impossible, and for too many, affording that care truly is impossible. Yet parents across New Mexico deserve peace of mind,

and all our kids deserve a bright start in life.

In the recent legislative session, we just made that a little easier. After nearly six years of advocacy, we exempted the gross receipts tax on child care, for those eligible for state child care assistance contracts and state pre-K services. This small but important change to our state's tax code is a win for New Mexico's families.

Typically, businesses pass GRT down to their consumers. Yet many child care providers have been shouldering the cost

of this tax because the families they serve simply couldn't afford it. The GRT has been a significant operating expense, particularly for those serving our most in-need communities. For many providers, this expense has limited their ability to recruit and retain staff or purchase classroom supplies. Other providers have had to pass this tax on to families who are already struggling to make ends meet.

By creating opportunities for parents to pursue further education or participate in the workforce

and support their families, childcare providers play a critical role in our economy. A vast and still growing body of research also shows that child care providers play a pivotal role in children's development and wellbeing – with kids who get quality early childhood care having

better outcomes throughout their entire lives.

But it's also important that we support and trust the people who provide the child care that we all depend upon. Many of those caring for our kids and helping to power our economy are women of color and, unfortunately,

all too often these voices are excluded from the spaces where policy decisions are made.

Our capital can be a challenging place to navigate, especially for newcomers to state politics. Not everyone in Santa Fe

NAME, RANK AND SERIAL NUMBER: RON PERLMAN HAS MORE TO SAY

LCIFF outstanding achievement honoree coming to town for event

If aliens landed and found Ron Perlman in the desert, he would give them no information other than rank and serial number. When asked what his rank is, he said corporal.

“In the big military of life, I’m just a corporal doing all the grunt work,” Perlman said. “I would be more interested in hearing from them (the aliens) and getting their takeaway about what they see here.”

Although he can be described as surly and opinionated, Perlman takes little credit for his life’s work and the success in the industry he has seen. Having worked on numerous films, television shows and voiceovers for animations and video games, he said, “What you see is a representation of a guy who was just trying

to put his kids through school and keep the lights on.”

“I feel like I have been the recipient of a great deal of fortune,” he said. “It looks like I have something to do with the shape and scope of my career, but I have little to do with it. Most has come out of the blue.”

But today he is working to make systematic changes in the industry and leave a mark on how grateful he is to cinema. While it’s almost like an act of God every time he gets work, he said there is a great deal of responsibility involved in what you do.

“When you receive grace, there is responsibility to make the most of it that you can, leaving nothing on the dance floor or in the locker room,” he said. “It’s putting your all into a beautiful character that somebody wrote.”

Perlman said his rever-

ence for great writing is unequaled. It all starts with the written word, and everything emanates out of that.

“When you have been endowed with the imagination of a great writer and he has identified a piece of behavior in a character that engages you fully then, and only then, you are in a position to do great things,” he said. “So now it’s just a question of marshaling your forces and rising to the challenge.”

Perlman is disgusted with changes in his industry that involve the corporation of everything including art forms, he said.

“It’s mostly degradation that comes along with the corporation of the studios,” he said. “It’s the opposite of growing the industry and almost unrecognizable. Now they think they can deliver everybody’s culture into

their homes. Once you had to go see a movie, sit in a darkened place with 200 other people. If you think those two things are the same, I have a

bridge to sell you in Brooklyn.”

He said the model of staying home and delivering things to your house is unsustainable.

“I feel like cinema and all the things it provides is way too important to turn into a business that looks like selling blue jeans,” he said. “You can only be little it for so long before it roars its way back.”

The film festivals have always been a celebration of the “power and glory, poetry, sound, fury that movies provide – as important as any of the

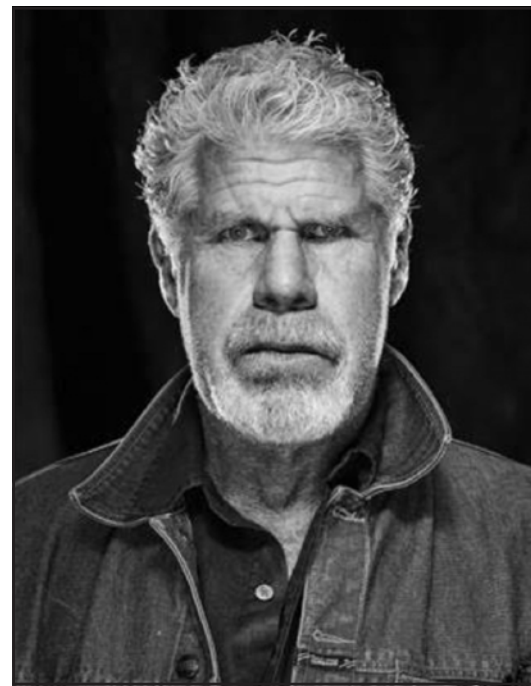
humanities.”

In 2014 Perlman launched a production company Wing and a Prayer Pictures. He said he enjoys all the aspects of the work of putting pictures together as a producer.

“I love everything about how holistic it is in terms of projects, from picking the script to the font on the poster,” he said. “I love doing everything that gets that movie from the page to the screen. It’s the most engaging thing I’ve ever done via my relationship with movies.”

He is looking forward to a visit to New Mexico as he will be in Las Cruces for a couple of days. In addition to participating in talk with students at New Mexico State University’s Creative Media Institute, Perlman will be doing Q & A sessions in conjunction with screenings of his film, “Hellboy,” on the evening of Thursday, April 4.

“I will be at the mercy of the people bringing me down there,” he said, which he loves. “You see the world through the people who live there. Those are the colleagues who live in an area. You sort of create these families throughout the world, far away from your little

Piano virtuosos join New Horizons for March performance

Director and conductor of the New Horizons Orchestra in Las Cruces, Jorge Martinez-Rios, an associate professor at New Mexico State University, came across an idea. Having been introduced to a man who is a remarkable piano player but who chose to be a professional businessman, together they decided it would be fun for this individual to perform one movement with the orchestra.

“He proposed a movement of a Mozart concerto,” Martinez-Rios said. “Then I asked him if he knew anyone else who might be interested.”

Ultimately, he found five individuals from across the country, including one from Canada, who wanted to come to Las Cru-

ces and play.

“I thought, ‘Why don’t we do a piano fest,’ so I named it ‘Piano Virtuosi,’” he said. “Each of them will play one movement. They are excited to be here. They’ve never been to Las Cruces.”

“They are not music professionals, but they are professional people from all over and will be just playing movements of piano and concertos like Rachmaninoff, Mozart and Beethoven,” said New Horizons member Kathryn Ray.

The concert plans have come together, and it all happens at 3 p.m., March 24 at the Atkinson Recital Hall on the NMSU campus.

The nonprofit New Horizons Symphony was founded at NMSU in 2003. It provides opportunities for adults to either

return to their musical roots or explore their artistic side for the first time. For Martinez-Rios, who stepped in when the previous director passed away in

2018, it has been the inspiration to follow through with his conducting dreams.

“I love conducting and that’s why I became a musician – be-

cause I wanted to be a conductor,” he said. “Then I became a performer, I play the viola, and loved it so much, for so many years.”

Directing and conducting came naturally for Martinez-Rios, who started getting a feeling for how it works quickly.

“We put things together, tune, listen to each other, find who has the melody, and who is accompanying,” he said.

He found a university with an online conducting course, did a lot of writing theory and reading about conducting and, thanks to the NMSU Philharmonic and New Horizons, is getting all the experience he needs to work on a doctorate.

“So now conducting is my passion number one,” he said.

Q: I enjoyed Hilary Swank's newspaper drama "Alaska Daily." Why did it have such a short run?

A: The main answer is the one that applies to so many shows that don't last long ... ratings. ABC expectedly wasn't shy about promoting that it had a double Oscar winner as the star of one of its shows, and the high hopes for it were evident from its getting a slot on Thursday, a night anchored by one of the network's biggest and most enduring hits, "Grey's Anatomy."

Though there was some response from critics and viewers alike to the theme of the plight of Indigenous women in Alaska, that didn't translate into a wider audience, with a significant dip in the numbers after the show's premiere. It likely didn't help that the series had an extended hiatus that saw it go off the air in November 2022 and not return until March 2023, which had to have impacted any momentum it might have been building.

The back half of the lone season of "Alaska Daily" proved interesting for another reason. At the point she filmed those episodes, Swank was pregnant with twins, though her journalist character Eileen Fitzgerald wasn't expecting. Therefore, the actress was filmed creatively, using angles that concealed her condition — with head-and-shoulders shots, scenes of her captured from a distance, or views of her wearing bulky clothing.

What ultimately was the series finale set up "Alaska Daily" to continue if ABC opted for that, but it wasn't to be. The last episode aired at the end of March 2023, and the cancellation notice came when the next season's lineup was announced that May.

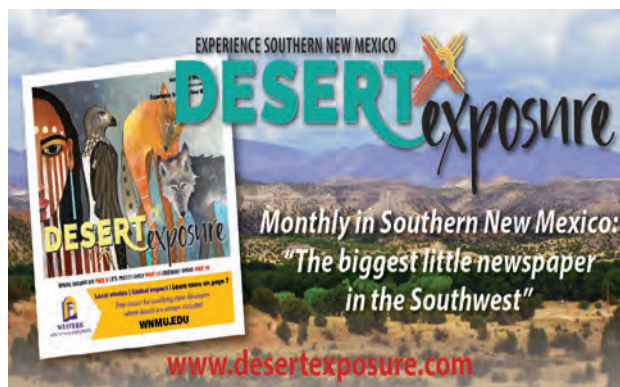

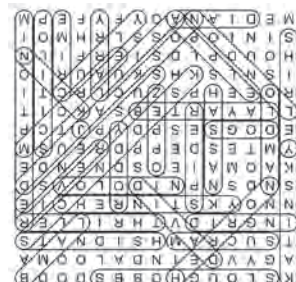

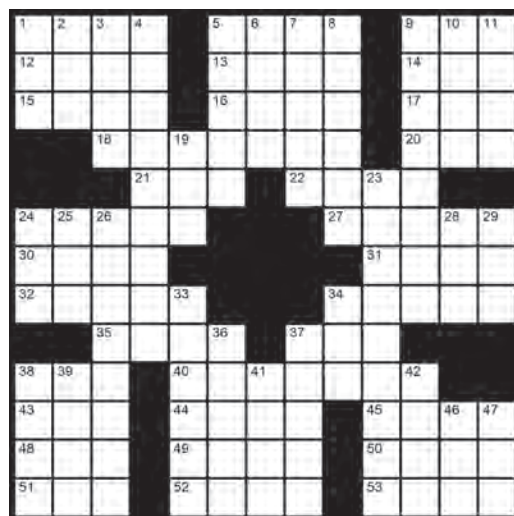

to the White Sands Missile Range.

Since its inception, the Bataan Memorial Death March's participation has grown from about 100 to about 9,600 marchers. These marchers come from across the United States and several foreign countries. While still primarily a military event, many civilians choose to participate in the challenging march. Participants get to choose between two courses: a 14.2-mile and a 26.2-mile course.

Marchers participate in the Bataan Memorial Death March for many reasons: personal challenge, the spirit of competition, or to foster esprit de corps in their unit. Some march in honor of a family member or a particular veteran who was in the Bataan Death March or

who was taken as a prisoner of war by the Japanese in the Philippines.

The NMSU ROTC has created the Bataan Battalion Alumni Organization (BBAO), which aims to develop a robust alumni network while supporting the NMSU Bataan Battalion. This spring, the BBAO is supporting cadet teams participating in the Bataan Memorial March and will gift commissioning cadets a uniform stipend to cover the cost of the "Army Greens."

Opening ceremonies begin at 6:35 a.m. at WSMR, and the march continues throughout the day. Marchers come from all the U.S. Armed Services and include Wounded Warriors. Hundreds of area volunteers organize to support the event.

of New Mexico Press and the Southwest Environmental Education Cooperative.

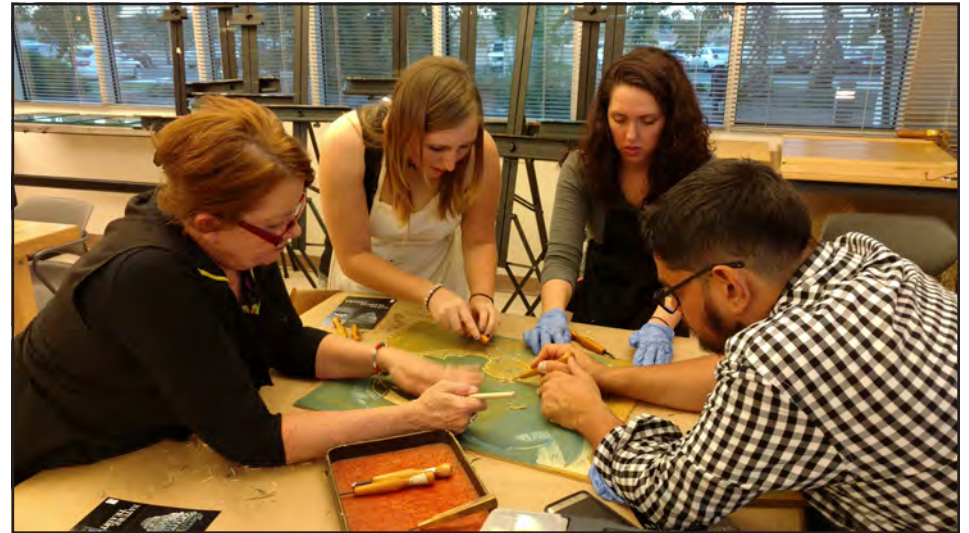
This celebration and appreciation of the literary arts is from 7-8:30 p.m. at 230 S. Water St. Admission is free and appetizers and refreshments will be served.

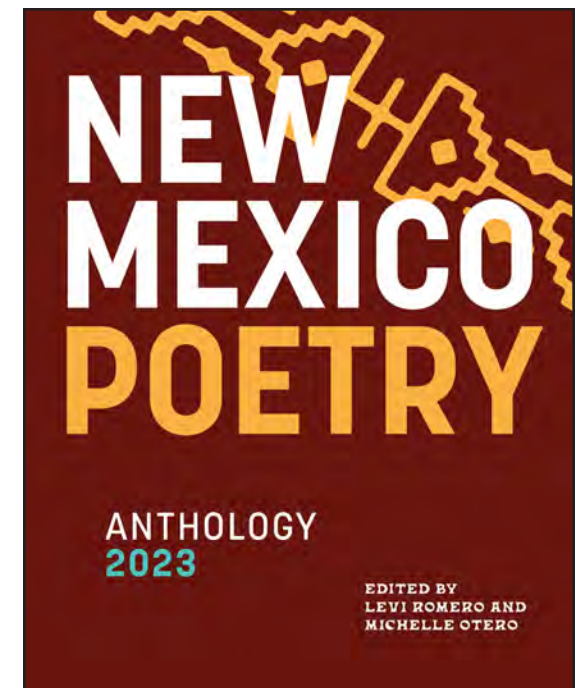

These images are on display at nmculture.org/poetry and are as varied as the institutions that house them: ranging from photographs of life in early New Mexico statehood



on display in the New Mexico History Museum on the Santa Fe Plaza, to cosmic depictions of the universe's vastness at the New Mexico Museum of Space History in Alamogordo. However, each piece of art contributes to New Mexico's artistic and cultural heritage in its own small way.

Throughout the month of March, New Mexicans

will have the chance to write and submit ekphrastic poetry that responds to any of these 10 selected artworks.

The contest includes two categories, youth (6th to 12th graders only) and adult. Individuals may submit one poem for review during the contest. All poems must be submitted by Sunday, March 31.

Internet subsidy for southern NM winding down

A federal initiative helping more than 68,000 low-income homes in New Mexico's 2nd Congressional District pay for the internet has begun winding down.

That's because Congress has not renewed funding for the pandemic-relief measure known as the Affordable Connectivity Program.

In New Mexico's 2nd Congressional District, which covers much of southern New Mexico, 42 percent of eligible homes – about 68,400 – are receiving the subsidy, according to a dashboard compiled by the Institute for Local Self Reliance. Nationwide, some 27 million households are enrolled in the program, which provides up to \$30 per month (or \$75 per month on tribal lands) toward qualifying families' internet subscriptions, according to the Federal Communications Commission.

“One of the biggest concerns for the Office of Broadband right now is the ending of the ACP,” said Drew Lovelace, acting director of the state Office of Broadband Access and Expansion. “It is one of the most important funds that's come around to help with digital equity. The money is looking like it's going to run out in April. Congress has not reinvested into it.”

In early February, the Federal Communications Commission began winding down the program by halting new enrollments. People who were registered before Feb. 8 will continue to receive the subsidy until funding runs out – projected to happen in April. But anyone not signed up before that cutoff date can no longer enroll, even if they would've previously qualified.

Just over 60 percent of homes have access to a high-speed internet connection in Congressional District 2, meaning there are many that don't, according to a Congressional District Health Dashboard. This poses barriers for residents trying to connect to school, work, business and health care opportunities.

ACP participants nationwide expressed deep concerns about possibly

losing access to the program, according to an October 2023 survey by Benenson Strategy Group and the cable TV and communications company Comcast. Some 95% said they would struggle with balancing household costs. Other findings include:

- 65% of ACP participants fear losing their job or their household's primary source of income
- 75% of ACP participants fear losing access to important healthcare services, including online appointments or prescription medicine refills
- 81% of ACP parents worry about their children falling behind in school
- 79% of ACP participants worry about losing social connections they foster through the internet

Closing the digital gap

There are several major aspects to New Mexico's digital divide. One is that high-speed internet infrastructure is lacking in many places, especially rural and low-income areas. But another is that, even where infrastructure is more robust, many families and individuals can't afford to pay for the internet among competing demands like rent, utilities and groceries. That's where the Affordable Connectivity Program has made strides.

On tribal lands, families were able to receive up to \$75 per month toward their internet subscription. Lovelace said there were another 24 zones throughout the state deemed “high-cost” service areas where families and individuals also could qualify for up to \$75 per month. The payment could go toward cell phone-based internet, as well as other types of connectivity, as long as the provider or company was signed up to participate through the FCC.

The ending of ACP comes at a time when families in Southern New Mexico are struggling with steep costs of housing, groceries and other living expenses.

During the pandemic, Las Cruces Public Schools students and their families benefited from an initiative that paired the Affordable Connectivity Program with a special internet access deal by

Comcast Xfinity, a major cable and internet provider in Las Cruces. The company offered internet for about \$10 per month to families, but when the ACP was factored in, the internet essentially was free to many homes.

Notices to go out to ACP enrollees

If you're an Affordable Connectivity Program participant, what does the wind-down mean for you?

Households that are enrolled in the ACP will continue to receive monthly discounted internet

service through the end of its funding, likely in April, as long as they remain enrolled in the program and eligible for it, according to the FCC.

During the ACP wind-down period, ACP households will receive notices from their internet company about the impact of the end of the benefit on the household's bill and service. The notices will tell internet users:

- that the ACP is ending,
- the impact on their bill,
- the date of the last bill they will receive that includes the ACP benefit,
- that they may change their service or opt-out of continuing service after the end of the ACP, and
- ACP households may also switch their internet plans without penalty.

Will the state step in?

State broadband officials had previously discussed with the SNMJJC the possibility of seeking funding from New Mexico lawmakers to continue the program. However, the state broadband office didn't pursue that proposal in the legislative session that ended Feb. 15.

Lovelace said, however, it's likely that New Mexico will pour much of an impending federal funding award for digital equity into continuing the program. The state hasn't yet received the digital equity funding, but it's in the process of finalizing a plan that's a precursor to receiving the money.

The digital equity funding is fairly substantial, but it also would run out eventually. A rough estimate of the total cost to fund the current ACP enrollment level in

New Mexico, assuming that an average subsidy was about \$30 monthly, is about \$5.4 million per month or about \$64 million annually, according to Lovelace.

“The state will try to take a look to see what we can do, but we don't have large enough pots of money to continue that indefinitely,” Lovelace said.

It's unclear when a state version of the program, if it happens, would launch.

Alison Riley, spokesperson for the Office of Broadband Expansion and Access, noted there's still a chance that Congress could choose to act and fund the Affordable Connectivity Program.

NM's delegation seeks ACP renewal

Members of New Mexico's congressional delegation have expressed support for extending the ACP. But some observers have said the proposal faces an uphill battle.

Congressman Gabe Vasquez, representing New Mexico's 2nd Congressional District, said he's backing a federal measure called the Affordable Connectivity Program Extension Act of 2024. He described it in a newsletter as “very important to securing funding to ensure our New Mexican families can continue getting access to affordable, high-speed internet.”

Among New Mexico's three congressional districts, the 2nd District has the highest percentage of eligible homes participating in ACP. The numbers are as follows, per the Institute for Local Self Reliance:

- Congressional District 1: 138,055 homes eligible; 47,261 enrolled (34% participation rate)
- Congressional District 2: 162,359 homes eligible; 68,400 enrolled (42% participation rate)
- Congressional District 3: 158,900 homes eligible; 57,906 enrolled (36% participation rate)

U.S. Sens. Martin Heinrich, D-N.M., and Ben Ray Lujan, D-N.M., chair of the Subcommittee on Communications, Media, and Broadband, signed onto a letter with other senators last fall urging congressional leaders to extend ACP funding.

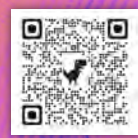
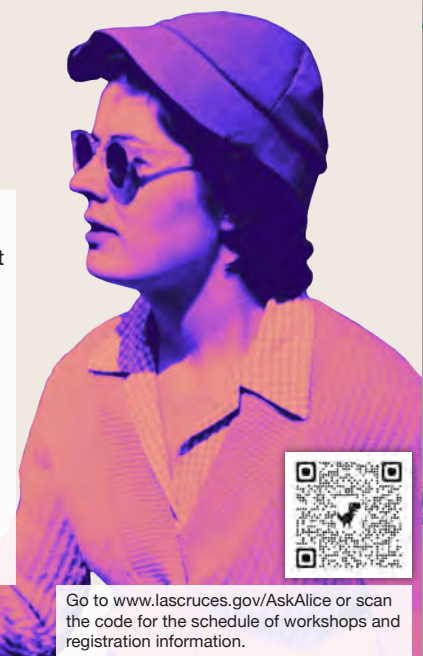

Why the Rio Grande is running early this year

CABALLO — Rio Grande water released from Caballo Dam over the weekend has flowed 125 miles across Southern New Mexico, bound for irrigation in far west Texas and northern Mexico.

In order to send water down, federal officials with the Bureau of Reclamation opened the gates at Caballo. On Saturday, the water roared out at 2,000 cubic feet per second, splashing up white founts stretching along the valley below the dam, and flushing unlucky fish out with it.

A lone gull, with heavy beats of black-tipped

wings, dove and dove again, in an unfruitful hunt for slippery silver fishes.

The river crept its way through the streambed, above and below, swallowing isolated pools of groundwater.

But the water release is not for New Mexico farmers – yet. The water passed Las Cruces early Saturday afternoon and farmers in Texas said the Rio Grande was hitting Country Club Road, a state line divide. Texas irrigation officials said they anticipate the first deliveries to farmers by the end of the week.

“We will pressurize the entire system, divert to Mexico [March] 13th,



flush out debris, and start deliveries on March 14th or 15th,” said Jay Ornelas, the manager of El Paso

County Water Improvement District No. 1.

Mexico will receive deliveries on Wednesday, officials with the International Boundary and Water Commission told Source New Mexico.

In years – more often, decades back – irrigation water deliveries started in March and April. For Texas, Ornelas said the district plans a full allocation of four-acre feet will go to pecan orchards, potential cotton and other crops.

El Paso County Water Improvement District No. 1, often shortened to EP No.1, is expecting to par-

cel out four acre-feet this year to members.

“I want to say it’s been at least 4 to 5 years now, in 2019 was the last time there was a four acre-foot allocation,” said Jay Ornelas, the manager of the district.

Much of that is “carryover” water held in Elephant Butte, which are defined as unused portions from prior diversions.

“Hopefully we’ll have as good a snowpack as we did last year and we can finish off this season run efficiently and carry over a significant amount and have some of that runoff

come in and put us at a good amount to be able to start early next year as well,” Ornelas said.

Officials with Elephant Butte Irrigation District, a quasi-government agency which manages irrigation for Sierra and Doña Ana counties, is starting presentations this week for its own irrigation season.

The district planned to issue its schedule at a March 13 public meeting, which took place as this issue of the Bulletin went to press.

“At that meeting there will be presentations of the forecast, the allocation, the allotment, and then the announcements of when we should have growers meetings,” Eslinger said.

On Monday, families flocked to La Llorona park as the sun dipped low. Dog walkers and cyclists passed by lit barbecue grills, as families picnicked and children played. The rush of the river accompanied their laughter.

tion” category includes programs to address over-prescribing, misuse, and overdoses. The remaining

category included items like training for first responders and research.

Bencomo said more will be decided by May, and options will be delivered for a council vote this

summer.

“We’ll have, hopefully, all the information you need to make some good decisions about the use of these funds,” Bencomo said.

Of ides and eggs

March 15 is commonly known as the Ides of March, but in fact, the ides do not always fall on that date.

On the Roman calendar, kalends fell on the first day of the month; “nones” landed five or seven days before the ides, depending on the month; and the ides referred to the first full moon of the month, which generally happened somewhere around the 13th to the 15th.

While March 15 is generally held as the “Ides of March,” and given ominous portent by a famous scene from

Shakespeare’s tragedy about Julius Caesar, March’s full moon lands on March 25 this year. It is known as the paschal moon, as it occurs after the spring equinox on March 19. The March full moon is also known as the worm moon, in association with springtime, thawing ground and visible activity by earthworms. It has other nicknames, as well. We have read that among the Sioux and some other Native American nations, this moon was known as the “sore eye moon” for

the effect of sunshine on snow at the end of winter.

Since Easter is observed by Christians on the Sunday following the paschal full moon, this “movable feast” lands on March 31 this year, although some churches observe Easter on a different date based on the Julian calendar.

St. Patrick’s Day, landing on Sunday, March 17 and marking the death in 461 of the Christian saint, is often a symbolic opening day of spring as it lands

close to the equinox. The pre-Christian celebration of Ostara has been revived and adapted in modern times, observed as a sacred day in pagan traditions and contemporary Wiccan practice. It honors a pagan goddess of fertility, in human reproduction and agriculture, named Eostre. A name that sounds curiously close to Easter, doesn’t it? Many of the symbols associated with Easter, from the bunny to the gaily colored eggs, actually stem from celebrations of Eostre.

Dickerson set to open billiard parlor downtown

An era ended in downtown Las Cruces when My Brother's Place, the popular restaurant and billiard hall that had been in operation on Main Street for over 40 years, closed in 2016. Q Time, adjacent to 10 Pin Alley on Amador, shut down along with the rest of facility in 2018. Options for a game of pool, especially downtown, abruptly seemed to be getting scarce.

In 2020, Lucky Dog Billiards opened its doors on E. Lohman, but was plagued with setbacks dealt by the Covid-19 pandemic on top of the routine pitfalls of launching a new business, ultimately closing last August. But a new outfit plans to resume pool and darts at the location.

Marci Dickerson, owner of restaurants The Game and Game 2 in Las Cruces, told the Bulletin she is on track to open her third place, The Game Billiards,

at the former home of Lucky Dog, with a full bar, a menu featuring pizza and wings, 12 pool tables, shuffleboard, dart lanes and a small outdoor patio.

"I was a significant investor in Lucky Dog," Dickerson said in an interview at the business. "I certainly believed that the concept would do well ... the pool atmosphere and the darts was very limited in Las Cruces."

Dickerson has many pots on the fire. Dickerson's Catering and Event

Services, which she considers her primary business, is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year. The Game (established in 2008) and Game 2 (established 2016) operate near the New Mexico State University Las Cruces campus and on Northrise Drive, respectively. Dickerson also sells real estate with Steinborn and Associates.

She is also one of the founders of The Association, an organization of local professional women and entrepreneurs, and of the nonprofit Revolution 120, which distributes aid to individuals and groups through goods and services.

When Dickerson feels there is a need in the community, she reacts. Her autistic nephew wanted to play baseball, so she created the Warrior League for special needs youth. After her cancer diagnosis, she created Cancer Warriors to provide resources for cancer patients in the community.

The Game Billiards fulfills her desire to expand into downtown, she said. Beginning March 19, it will be open Tuesdays thru Saturdays from 4 p.m. to midnight.

Among the first special events in the works is a

memorial pool tournament in tribute to fallen Las Cruces police officer Jonah Hernandez, who was murdered on duty in February.

The restaurant industry is challenging, and the difficulties multiply with the addition of managing a bar. Dickerson said for female entrepreneurs, this kind of business – requiring attention at night and weekends, and subject to emergency calls – is harder still.

"One of the biggest challenges is that women are, historically, the

predominant caregivers for the children the majority of the time," she said. "Most restaurants and bars are run in the evenings; they're not run when the children are in school. That causes a problem for a lot of people, and a lot of sacrifices must be made of that time with the children to run them."

"I was very blessed and able to do because, the entire time I've been in business, my mother has been the primary care-

Homeowner Assistance Fund served 4,200 NM households

BULLETIN REPORT

The New Mexico Mortgage Finance Authority has assisted 4,217 households across the state, it announced this week, with \$43.5 million provided through the New Mexico Homeowner Assistance Fund from 2021 to the beginning of March 2024. The assistance came in the form of housing grants to income-eligible households strained for reasons related to the Covid-19 pandemic.

A federal allocation of \$9.9 billion through the American Rescue Plan Act nourished similar programs nationwide. New Mexico's allotment was managed by the Mortgage Finance Authority and the agency said the funding helped prevent mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosures, utility loss, property tax delinquencies, loss of insurance and displacement.

It was not clear how much funding, if any, was left over, but the agency

said remaining funds were used to address applications pending up to March 1, the program's deadline for application. Those applicants will receive a determination letter about their eligibility for assistance based on program criteria and availability of funds, the agency said in a news release. Applicants can log in to their accounts for updated information or contact MFA at housingassistance@housingnm.org or call 505-308-4206.

Burrell students to be matched with residencies

The Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine in Las Cruces announced that more than 100 local student doctors will enter local and national residencies, with the matches unveiled Friday, March 15.

National Match Day is an event in which the results of residency and fellowship applications are released, the college said in a news release. The process and the National Match Day event are governed by the National Resident Matching Pro-

gram and accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education.

BCOM will host its Match Day event Friday morning at the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum. During the ceremony, student doctors will simultaneously open envelopes with their placements, accompanied by addresses by faculty and students of the college.

The process of entering a residency begins during students' final year of medical school, BCOM explained, when they

apply for residencies in their specialty of choice in September. Interviews for their programs take place through the fall and winter, and students and program directors have an opportunity to rank their preferred programs and applicants, respectively. Those lists are then provided to the NRMP, which processes and completes the final matches.

Nusenda acquires Western Heritage Bank

Nusenda Credit Union announced this week that it had completed its purchase of Western Heritage Bank, effective March 12, with approval from the National Credit Union Administration.

Nusenda's president and CEO, Joe Christian, wrote in a news release, "I am pleased to welcome Western Heritage customers and employees to the Nusenda family. ... The combination of our community focused institutions and shared beliefs about customer service, community impact and employee wellbeing will support the ongoing growth and financial service needs in the Borderplex region."

The first sign of change, according to

Nusenda, will be signs at its branches in El Paso, Las Cruces and Deming as well as its website and social web sites that Western Heritage is now "powered by Nusenda Credit Union." The statement said "more than fifty" employees of the bank will join Nusenda but a spokesperson said no layoffs were part of the acquisition.

For now, Nusenda said the existing bank branches would continue to serve its customers, with accounts and systems transferred to Nusenda later in 2024. According to a transition web page, Western Heritage debit cards will be eligible for service through Nusenda's network of ATMs with no surcharge. The credit union also assured customers that their de-

posits will be insured for the same amount, now through the NCUA rather than the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, which insures bank deposits. The agencies cover credit union or bank accounts, respectively, up to \$250,000, with the backing of the federal government.

The acquisition of Western Heritage, headquartered in Las Cruces, by the Albuquerque-based credit union was first announced last June. At the time, Western Heritage president and CEO Greg Cory called it a "win-win" for both institutions and their customers, combining 29 branches and more than 800 employees for more than 260,000 account holders, and Nusenda's \$4 billion in assets with Western Heritage's \$338 million.

giver for my kids. She has been the one that has been there making sure the homework is done, they're at all their practices and all those things. Because of her role in my company, I was able to go do all of these things."

Dickerson added that her mother had been a restaurateur herself, operating a business open for breakfast and lunch only, allowing her to be a full-time mother while

running her enterprise.

The restaurant-and-bar business, she said, remains male dominated, among vendors as well as other bar owners, and upon entering the field at the age of 23 she soon toughened up.

"Twenty-five years ago, there wasn't 'Me Too,' there wasn't any of that," she recalled of a time she learned to negotiate with vendors and watch the flow of cash, as well as alcohol, closely. "I developed some coping mechanisms to make sure they

took me seriously ... and I am the best bouncer we have."

She now sits atop an organization of over 100 employees including managers across several businesses, including two bar-and-grills that open seven days a week and a catering operation that she said sometimes operates for stretches of 21 consecutive days.

But how is her break shot? She grinned and admitted she is not a pool player, but would be willing to learn.

Golf doctor's advice could be a game changer

Every sport has its game changers, whether it's people, equipment, rules or something else.

In golf there were Bobby Jones, Arnold Palmer, then Jack Nicklaus, and then Tiger Woods and Annika Sorenstam. In terms of equipment, first there was the mechanical lawn mower, the gutta-percha golf ball (replacing the "featheries"), the sand wedge developed by Gene Sarazen, graphite shafts and automatic rangefinders.

What are your game changers? For me, it was being invited by Herb Wimberly to be a golf instructor at Rocky Mountain Golf School in Gunnison, Colo. in 1998, which

later turned into our Performance Golf Schools in New Mexico. I learned more golf from teaching with Herb than at any other thing in my golfing career.

I invite everyone to get a personal golf coach. Every professional golfer has not only a swing coach, but a short game coach, a mental coach, a physical trainer, a dietitian, an agent and usually several other members of his or her "team." Over the years a coach knows your swing and is able to spot tendencies and mistakes or lapses, and get you back on the right track quickly. A really good coach is

going to spend ample time with you on putting and chipping, and certainly will suggest a game plan for key things to work on between lessons.

Another game changer may be making an overhaul in the equipment you are using.

Before you fork over \$2,000 for an off-the-shelf set of clubs that may or may not suit your swing, consider paying a few hundred dollars for a club fitting from a professional fitter who can match your swing and distance with a set of irons and woods that have the right shafts, the right loft and lie angle and the suit-

able weight and flexibility for you.

If you don't have them in your bag, hybrid clubs could be a game changer for you. Hybrids are clubs with heads bigger than irons but half as big as fairway woods, which are typically replacements for 3, 4, 5 and 6 irons. Those irons demand that you trap or squeeze the ball between the clubhead and the grass. From a tight lie or even moderate rough, that gets to be quite difficult as you get older. Hybrids are easier to hit, especially for senior golfers, partly due to the fact that the motion to the golf ball is a sweep, rather than a dig, which is easier for players with lower club

speed. Some club companies are making entire "Iron" sets with all-hybrid designs.

If you aren't already doing it, try working out at the gym or at home. That will be a game changer and possibly a life saver. In the winter of 2011 I suffered a life-threatening accident that put me in a coma for three days, fractured several bones and required a week in the ICU and a month in the rehab hospital. After rehab I joined a local gym and began working hard four days a week. The gym work outs, including chest, legs, back, arms, shoulders and cardio, helped gain back the 27 pounds I lost during rehab. My left wrist

was shattered but I was back in three months at the range swinging an 8 iron with my right hand. I'm still doing my routine at the same gym, only with heavier weights.

How about your attitude when you're playing golf? Many golfers get lost in self-pity when their golf turns sour. If you let it, the arduous game of golf can drag you down if you're not careful. Think about this: "Once you replace negative thoughts with positive ones, you'll start having positive results," from Willie Nelson, famous singer and avid golfer.
