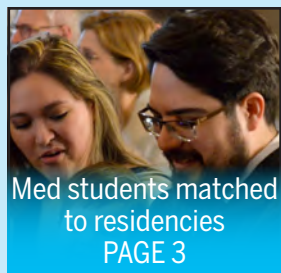

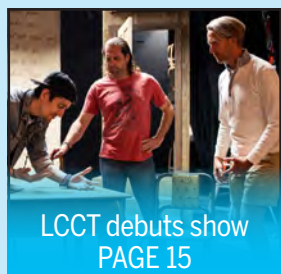

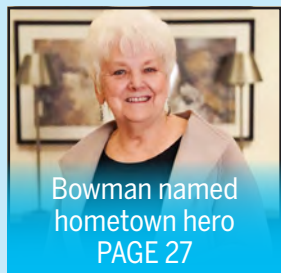

# Charter school calls police over rude comment

Las Cruces police responded Monday evening to a complaint of disorderly conduct at Alma d'Arte Charter High School. A lone officer walked into a public meeting of the governing board, where members of the public were waiting in the school's auditorium while board members met in closed session.

A former student of the school had made angry remarks during the meeting's public comment period, aiming a disrespectful remark at the school's principal, Adam Amador, and using an expletive before leaving the podium. The board chair, Richelle Peugh-Swofford, asked him to leave the meeting, but he declined. The board then went into executive session to discuss Amador's evaluation as well as possible litigation, according to the meeting agenda, as permitted

under New Mexico's Open Meetings Act.

The police officer appeared several minutes later and was met by members of the public who defended the young man's presence and argued the police call was retribution for public criticism. Among those in attendance were two state legislators: Sen. Carrie Hamblen and

Rep. Angelica Rubio of Las Cruces.

Two more officers arrived as the board members emerged from closed session and continued with the meeting. The police eventually departed without pursuing the investigation further or removing anyone.

In recent public meetings, community mem-

bers including students, families and former staff members have focused criticism on the governing board as well as Amador, the school's new principal, and Monday's meeting continued the trend. Dozens of people attended the meeting and eight offered public comments.

Among the speakers was Chris Bardey, a former art

teacher recently dismissed by Amador, who upbraided Peugh-Swofford for commenting that the school's academic performance presented "zero percent proficiency in almost every category."

"Stop saying 'zero percent proficiency,'" Bardey told the board. "It's dumb. It's mathematically not possible. It's not the right narrative."

Other comments aired concerns about bullying, removal of decorations in support of the LGBTQ community, erosion of special education services and complaints about Amador's comportment among students and families.

Attendees leaving the school after the meeting was adjourned reported that board members were taking photographs of individuals as they left the auditorium without explaining why or what they would do with the images.

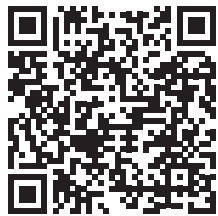

# Burrell medical students matched with residencies

Each year, on the third Friday in March, medical students preparing to graduate join tens of thousands of others across the country in finding out where they will be placed for their residency programs.

Over 100 fourth-year students at the Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine in Las Cruces joined the Match Day festivities this year, all opening envelopes revealing their matches simultaneously on Friday, March 15.

The event was held in a banquet hall at the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum, which hummed Friday with the students' excitement and their loved ones' anticipation.

A countdown ended with gasps and shouts of joy as everyone opened their envelope to reveal where they would be spending the next few years. Student doctors were placed in national and local programs, including in Las Cruces.

Match Day is part of the National Resident Matching Program, which provides a standardized pairing of programs to medical students – both doctor of medicine (MD) and doctor of osteopathic medicine (DO) students. According to the NRMP website, over 44,000 medical students applied to be matched this year, along with nearly 6,400 residency programs.



According to a news release from BCOM, the residency matching process begins in September of the student's final year of medical school. They first apply to residency programs in their specialties and then interview with the programs over the rest of the fall semester. By February, students rank their program preferences while program directors rank the students they are interested in training.

NRMP takes the rankings into consideration and students and programs are matched via a mathematical algorithm.

William Pieratt, dean and chief academic officer at BCOM, explained that residencies can take between three and seven years to complete, depending on the specialty. Family medicine, internal medicine and pediatrics typically take three years while areas such as neurosurgery and plastic surgery take seven years, with other subspecialties landing somewhere in the middle.

After completing the residency program, these student doctors will be able to practice medicine independently, he said. He added that Match Day is second only to graduation for these medical students.

Adrian Campos, 27, was born and raised in Las Cruces, attended New Mexico State University for his undergraduate degree and is now preparing to graduate from BCOM and begin his family medicine residency at Memorial Medical Center.

"It's finally coming to an end, but the real work's about to start," Campos said of his medical education. "I'm all about community medicine. I'm all about helping the community out in any way possible and this is the perfect school to do that."

Campos explained that he has always had the mindset of remaining in and helping the people of his community. Memorial Medical Center was his first choice for residency program, which will allow him to remain close to his

wife, Valerie, and their son, Abram.

"I hope to be a family doctor that can practice a wide range of things so that way ... patients don't have to wait for months on end for a simple procedure or be transferred over or

sent over to El Paso or Albuquerque. It can all be done here in town," Campos said.

Students Analekha Chesnick, 26, and William Weissinger, 29, are also interested in remaining in the southwest. Weissinger is from Illinois but Chesnick is from Tucson, and both completed their rotations at hospitals in the Four Corners area.

The two students were couples matched to HealthONE hospitals out-

side of Denver – Chesnick for family medicine and Weissinger for neurology.

Before opening their envelopes, the couple spoke of nervous excitement about finding out where they were going to "put down roots" over the next several years. Afterwards, they were excited and relieved to find out they were placed with their first choices for programs.

However, their goal

## WATER TOWER OR CELL TOWER?

## Mesilla trustees approve placement of disguised tower south of the town

After researching and debating the proposal of placing a Verizon cell tower in or near the town of Mesilla since 2021, the issue has finally moved to the next stage as the board of trustees voted in favor of the newest placement proposal on Monday, March 18.

In 2022, the tower was turned down because a proposed location in Town Hall Park in the middle of town received numerous protests from community members.

During a public hearing held Wednesday, March 13, the proposal was presented, discussed and opened for public comment. Community members were given the opportunity to speak in response to this newest proposal, which includes placing a tower in a pecan field south of town and disguising it as a tree.

During the meeting Mesilla Community Development Coordinator Eddie Salazar introduced Sun State Towers representative Grant Chapman to explain the project.

He described the proposed location as a 57-acre pecan farm south of the town, saying it is in an appropriate zone designation, exceeding required distances. He said stealth (disguised) towers are only mandated in commercially zoned districts but that putting a simulated tree in a field of trees makes sense.

Chapman also emphasized Verizon can demonstrate a clear need for the town including gaps in reception which this tower would fill. He argued cell towers are just infrastructure, like any power pole visible in the community.

Addressing some of the concerns and objections community members had already brought up, Chapman said small cells

on existing poles are not the right kind of technology for this location, and mini-towers still have to be at a 65-foot in height and would just necessitate more poles in various locations.

Following Chapman's explanation of the project, Salazar pointed out legally there is a need to not discriminate against the company for health concerns, because the FCC has done the testing and have determined the project is safe to be in the community.

Salazar did agree that the proposed tower would be an eyesore.

"A tree was proposed," he said. "But the tree is much taller than the rest of the trees, so it stands out. I have proposed a recommendation of a cell tower with the condition that the screening is changed to a water tower. It's agricultural and fits the area."

Two people spoke in

favor of the tower, describing the need for better cell service and internet accessibility in the town.

The first citizen who stood to speak about their concerns said nobody is contesting the need for the service.

"What we are contesting is the need for a monolithic tower," she said. "It's no longer considered the standard and ... will be obsolete in 5 years."

Other concerns raised by community members included the humming noise the tower would

generate, particularly with other cell service companies adding their equipment to it; a loss of nearby property values; health concerns; and the effect of the tower on the historical and aesthetic nature of the town.

Several people re-

quested the position of the tower be moved at least 660 feet northwest of the proposed placement.

"It is an aesthetic blight," said Dáša Baušová, who lives near the proposed placement of the tower. She handed out a packet to the trustees including a letter from an attorney and 45 letters of protest.

Mesilla resident Renee Beltran pointed out communities are giving away things that can't be regained as the world progresses in technology.

"I hope we approach it with caution," she said. "I hope we don't act in

remains to practice in the rural southwest, where they have seen a need for doctors to fill gaps in care.

"That's always been a dream of mine, just to serve the community," Chesnick said. "We saw the gap of care (during our rotations) and we just wanted to pursue a training in the southwest because we're hoping to

stay here long term. ... It's so special because there's so much rich culture and things to learn from your patients out there. So it's really just like a lot of personal growth and it's beautiful to learn from a different community and feel like a part of something."

Weissinger added that learning in these rural communities is where he "fell in love with neurology."

"There aren't many neurologists within many, like, two-hour radiuses of where these individuals live, so that's something we want to give back to the area – provide this care that they didn't have access to prior," he said.

Pieratt added that it is always nice to see another class of students move through the program and get matched to a residency, but this year was particularly meaningful

for him. He joined Burrell in 2020, the same time these students started medical school, still in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic.

"It's like we tell them: Days are long, but the years fly by," he said.

## PATRICIA (PAT) LILLEY

Well-known Roswell jeweler Patricia (Pat) Lilley died March 11 at age 95.

While she never lived in Las Cruces, Lilley and her late husband James (Jim) had many connections to Las Cruces over the decades. Lilley sold her designer jewelry at many Las Cruces arts and craft fairs and private shows over the years, and many locals still wear her distinctive art.

Eight of her ten children, as well as seven grandchildren, are graduates of New Mexico State University. Six children live in Las Cruces – retired attorney Michael (Diane), contractor Chris (Jerra) engineer Dan (Lisa), teacher Monica Reynolds (Chris), attorney Jess (Bernadine), and Kay, a specialist in working with developmentally disabled young adults. Nine of her grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren also reside here.

Jim Lilley was a staple at Las Cruces running, triathlon and Senior Olympics events and worked as a general contractor here with son Chris.

Services will be held at 2 pm April 5 at Assumption Catholic Church in Roswell.

Amador told the Bulletin he was not aware who called police and said, “I am not aware of any board members or staff taking photographs as the community was leaving.”

Peugh-Swofford provided a written copy of her address at the meeting and did not respond to questions from the Las Cruces Bulletin except to say, “As a governing council we cannot comment on personnel matters. We are working hard to make Alma D’Arte a better place for all student artists who want to succeed.”

Amador said the only LGBTQ decorations removed were personal belongings of staff who had left, and pointed to artwork on display in the student commons, incorporating rainbows and messages of unity, as a sign of representation.

Alma d’Arte, holding arts integration as part of its mission, is a public charter school founded in 2004. Its charter is overseen by the state Public Education Commission and currently in effect through 2027. The school is under a corrective action plan for compliance with the state’s special education requirements.

Public meetings of government bodies in New Mexico are governed by the Open Meetings Act, which requires that the public be permitted to attend, but does not require public input.

Amador, in his first school year as the school’s head administrator, is

due to address the Public Education Commission in Santa Fe next month to answer questions about the school’s academic performance, corrective actions with respect to its special education compliance, enrollment and disenrollment processes and recent financial audit findings.

During Monday’s meeting, the governing board, which has seen high turnover in recent years, announced more changes. Board member Zeke Rodriguez resigned, and three new board members — Cesar Alvarez, Martin Swafford and Tom Escudero — were announced. Remaining on the board are Kimberly Skaggs, Sherri Hursey, Ron Fitzherbert and Peugh-Swofford. Fitzherbert was absent from the meeting.

The board also postponed action on updated student and staff handbooks as well as a new social media policy for students, staff and faculty. Amador told the Bulletin the handbooks will incorporate input from strategic planning sessions in April, as required by the school’s policy. “There we will have feedback from

the learning community on addressing the student, staff and faculty handbooks,” he said, bringing them current for the 2024-25 school year.

Steven Van Coblign, 17, said he had been “illegally withdrawn,” without being formally suspended or expelled but simply told not to return to school in January. He spoke of other students who had also been ejected abruptly from their high school.

Amador told the Bulletin, “No students have been disenrolled due to discipline.”

Van Coblign, who is finishing his senior year at New America School, agreed to an interview with his mother’s blessing after his angry comment.

He said he wants to see changes in the school’s administration, but: “I don’t want the school to be shut down. I know ... from a state perspective, the easiest thing may be to shut down the school, but I want a new administration. I want a new board. ... I truly want the school to prosper, especially for the teachers still here and the students who want to go here.”

# Council narrows city manager selection from nine to three

The Las Cruces City Council narrowed the pool of nine applicants for the open city manager position to three candidates during a closed session on March 18. In a news release the next day, the city released the names of the three finalists.

The three candidates are Sonya Delgado, assistant city manager and former parks and recreation director; David Sedillo, director of public works; and Ikani Taumoepeau, assistant city manager.

The other six applicants included Barbara Bencomo, chief administrative officer; Leeann DeMouche, director of finance; Christopher Faivre, deputy director of economic development; Timothy Pitts, deputy director of community development; Elizabeth Teeters, director of economic development; and Inspector General Charles Tucker.

The narrowing was the latest step in finding a new executive for New

Mexico's second-largest city after City Manager Ifo Pili announced his resignation in February. The city manager leads a 1,800-person bureaucracy and a \$519 million budget.

While the elected city council members set priorities, the city charter dictates that the day-to-day operations of executing those priorities – and the countless little decisions that affect the lives of Las Cruces residents – fall on the unelected city manager.

Pili's last day as city manager is March 31.

In a news release announcing Pili's resignation, the city said it would only accept internal applications to fill the position even though the council had not met in a formal session to discuss how they would search for a new leader.

Typically, municipalities seek candidates across the U.S. by hiring a search firm. New Mexico State University and Doña Ana County are also searching for new executives. Their governing councils elected to

hire firms to provide them with a candidate list of people from across the country.

"The city manager hiring process was suggested by Ifo (Pili), who spoke individually with the city council members and got their OK to move forward," city communications director Mandy Guss told the Bulletin shortly after Pili's announcement.

During an interview on March 19, Mayor Eric Enriquez reiterated this process.

"There have been no guarantees, and there has been no selection made," Enriquez said. "We want

to give the first opportunity to those internal, based on what's taken place and how things have gone."

Enriquez and the other city councilors have spoken highly of Pili's time in Las Cruces.

"We're all comfortable with how things are going and what a tremendous job Ifo did bringing the city, the organization and the leaders together," Enriquez said.

Following this process, the city said in a news release on March 18 that nine city staff applied for the position. According to Enriquez, during a

closed meeting on Monday morning, the city council narrowed that list to three based on basic qualifications such as experience.

In interviews with the Bulletin, council members said consistency and stability are their top priorities.

"I feel like we're at a fork-in-the-road moment in Las Cruces," District 4 Councilor Johana Bencomo said. "I want to work with a city manager who exudes confidence and is willing to collaborate with a lot of folks."

Bencomo added the last two months in Las Cruces – including the killing of

Jonah Hernandez and its aftermath – have greatly influenced her thinking.

"I really want a city manager who brings continuity and stability and confidence," she said. "I think we have so many pieces of work moving that are transformational."

District 5 Councilor Becky Corran said something similar.

"I think that Ifo did a lot to establish a culture of valuing employees, emphasizing their importance and fulfilling the city's mission," Corran

said.

Corran pointed to consistent employee pay raises as one way Pili's administration accomplished this.

"I think we've seen a lot of things like consistent pay raises, revisions of benefits and things like that. They have been really thoughtful management approaches that I hope show the employees that we value them," Corran said.

District 2 Councilor Bill Mattiace pointed to transparency as another feature he'd like to see.

"From my perspective, an ideal candidate should have experience leading all departments of a similar-sized city and a strong passion for transparency and open government. The candidate must act as a positive uniter so we can continue to focus on improving our community," Mattiace said in an emailed statement.

The council was set to meet next on March 20, in closed session, to interview and discuss the three candidates, as this issue of the Bulletin went to press.

New Mexico law allows boards to conduct interviews like this behind closed doors.

## Las Cruces seeks comments for major codes and zoning changes

### BULLETIN REPORT

The city of Las Cruces is seeking public input for a draft of Realize Las Cruces, a massive overhaul of the zoning and codes that govern how, when, and where different types of buildings can be erected.

The comment period, which opened March 13, 2024, and lasts until April 5, 2024, is meant to gather public input about the Realize Las Cruces draft.

"Realize Las Cruces specifically involves land development codes related to historic preservation, zoning regulations, subdivision regula-

tions, development standards (roadways, transportation analysis, parking, drainage and stormwater, landscaping, parks, and trails, outdoor lighting, signs), and the zoning map for the city," said a news release announcing the comment period.

David Weir, Deputy Director of Community Development, said the best way to comment on the draft is to go to Realize Las Cruces' website at [RealizeLasCruces.com](http://RealizeLasCruces.com) and find the highlighted link.

Weir said another way to comment was to contact him via email or phone or go to the city's website and follow the posted links.

# Sen. Soules talks about new graduation requirements

Last month, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed House Bill 171, updating graduation requirements for secondary school students across New Mexico. It was the first update since 2007 and takes effect for students entering high school in 2025-26.

In 2023, the governor vetoed legislation that would have reduced the required number of academic credits. The new law retains the 24-credit requirement and increases unit requirements in core subjects. It also permits career technical education courses (commonly referred to as CTE) and work-based learning to count academically, and emphasizes financial literacy as essential civic knowledge, which were priorities for Lujan Grisham as well as lawmakers. The debate about financial literacy hinged chiefly on whether to make it a standalone course requirement.

Fundamentally, the question gets to what New Mexico feels are the core competencies needed to graduate from high school, whether the student goes on to college, career training or another plan.

The legislation states what lawmakers feel the high school diploma is for: “To demonstrate that a

student is ready for success in post-secondary education, gainful employment and citizenship and is equipped with the skills to be a lifelong learner.”

Currently, New Mexico’s graduation rate is 76.2 percent, as reported in a legislative analysis. That is significantly below the national average of 85 percent, though a marked improvement from the recent low of 63 percent in fiscal year 2010.

Getting the governor’s signature on a bill was a process years in the making, according to Sen. Bill Soules, D-Las Cruces, who chairs the Senate Education Committee. In an interview, he told the Las Cruces Bulletin he worked closely with his counterpart on the House Education Committee, Rep. Andrés Romero, an Albuquerque Democrat who, like Soules, is an educator.

Because New Mexico has a part-time legislature that meets 60 or 30 days per year in regular session, and partly because of the time required for professional educators to provide input and for debate among legislators, Soules said it took essentially four years to craft the legislation.

Financial literacy proved to be the largest hurdle, and not a partisan one.

“There were a number of legislators and some

groups, Think New Mexico and others, that had been pushing for a standalone financial literacy class,” he said. “We very much indicated that is deeply embedded through all of the social studies and in several different levels in different places in the standards that are required to be taught.”

Soules also addressed provisions of the bill that give local school districts or public charters some control over requirements in keeping with standards mandated by the state, as well as graduate profiles describing how students are prepared for life after high school. In the past, Soules said the tools used

to measure competency focused on how universities determined eligibility, compared to a contemporary understanding that not every student’s goals require college – or necessarily should.

The graduate profile is a document answering, as Soules put the question: “Who are you, as a result of you graduating from high school? What can you show that you’ve done, what CTE courses have you taken that demonstrate who you are?”

“Then you show an ability to communicate, to write, to do math in the fields that you’re looking at, that you’ve got civic competence and under-

stand the world around you. We’re setting it up more focused on the needs of the student rather than what are the needs of the university,” he said.

The next question is, how much of it is focused on what employers want, in the short- or long-term?

“Certainly, we hear from the business community that they want workers, we aren’t preparing enough of whatever the flavor of the month is,” he said, noting an emphasis in recent years on science, technology, engineering and math, or STEM. “Not all kids want to go into STEM, and if we force them into that, we’re setting them up for failure.”

CTE has demonstrated, in data cited by legislative analysts and Soules during our interview, benefits for student engagement through the school years as well as graduation. While workforce development is needed for individuals and society, Soules argued that is not the sole concern of universal education.

“I don’t think the role of the public schools is to provide a workforce for business to exploit with minimum wage, an inexpensive workforce,” Soules continued. “I don’t think that’s our role. I see

# State Police: Fed plan was flawed ahead of fatal stop

The plan to arrest a suspected drug smuggler was flawed and failed to adequately value the life of a New Mexico State Police officer who was shot to death by that suspect, according to a report released March 13.

The report, drafted by an internal review committee of NMSP officials, examined the events leading up to the interaction between Omar Cueva and officer Darian Jarrott on Feb. 4, 2021, and made several criticisms and recommendations to change departmental policy. The report also provided details about Jarrott's life, goals and policing experience before his death.

"Omar Cueva-Felix killed Officer Jarrott in cold blood, and unfortunately, we cannot change that," NMSP Chief Troy Weisler said in a statement attached to the report. "The highlighting of mistakes by different individuals involved

in the incident and noting areas for improvement is done solely to learn and find ways to operate more safely."

As shown in dashboard camera video released by state police, Cueva killed Jarrott during a traffic stop on Interstate 10 near Deming. A supervisor told Jarrott to pull Cueva over but gave no information about his criminal history, his drug smuggling, or the fact he armed himself with a semi-automatic weapon.

"No NMSP representatives were a part of any briefing for this operation," the report said.

Cueva then fled east into Las Cruces before beginning a chaotic shootout with Las Cruces Police Department officers. The incident ended when an LCPD officer fatally shot Cueva after Cueva shot him.

Lawsuits against the state and federal government alleged that Jarrott had no way of knowing that federal agents with Homeland Security Investigations (HSI) had tracked Cueva for weeks, suspected

he had armed himself with a semi-automatic rifle, and had set up a sting operation to arrest Cueva.

"HSI Tactical plans were flawed based on the suspect's criminal history, the totality of the investigation, and the priorities of protecting life," the report said. "These plans led to improper tactical decision-making on how to conduct the traffic stop."

Jarrott's family filed two lawsuits against the state of New Mexico and the federal government.

The state agreed in 2023 to pay out about \$523,000 (with about \$341,000 going to the family and the rest going to at-

torneys) after the family alleged the actions of the state led to Jarrott's death. A federal judge dismissed a similar federal lawsuit the same year. In that case, a federal judge ruled the government could not be held liable based on the doctrine of qualified immunity.

# How NM will enforce new deepfake disclosure law

About one week after early voting in New Mexico's primary elections begins, a new law will go into effect requiring political campaigns and candidates to tell the public whenever they use false information generated by artificial intelligence in a campaign ad.

The New Mexico Secretary of State's Office and the state Ethics Commission will investigate alleged violations of a new election law called House Bill 182.

The Ethics Commission is the state agency mainly responsible for enforcing the Campaign Reporting

Act, according to the governor's message signing the bill. The Ethics Commission has "more capacity for investigation" than the Secretary of State's Office, said spokesperson Alex Curtas.

"We operate under the idea of trying to seek voluntary compliance from people," Curtas said. "We don't really have investigators, so we try to get people to come into compliance."

While the Secretary of State's Office will take complaints related to the new disclosure requirements in the law, often they will refer them to the Ethics Commission, Curtas said, because they fall under an agreement

between the two agencies.

Since the bill doesn't specify an effective date, spend money, or contain an emergency clause, it will go into effect on May 15, 90 days after the end of the 2024 legislative session.

Before then, the New Mexico Secretary of State's Office will launch a statewide public education campaign about AI's influence, Curtas said.

The bill focuses on the content of political advertisements, while the education campaign will try to supplement that by informing the public about the potential for AI misuse in elections, Curtas said.

The public messaging will focus on rural communities and include radio, television, billboards and digital ads, Curtas said.

The agency hired Albuquerque-based Esparza Advertising, Curtas said. They met in the second week of March and were finalizing their strategy and content, he said.

## Governor asks for AG opinion

Curtas said the legislation could curb the potential misuse of AI in elections.

"I think it's a really good step in the right direction, that you see a lot of other states taking," Curtas said. "So we're fairly out in front here on this issue in New Mexico."

New Mexico is among

eight states that have enacted similar legislation since October 2019, according to a bill tracker run by Public Citizen, a consumer advocacy group that supported the bill. On Tuesday, 31 more states were considering related bills.

When Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed the bill on March 5, she wrote, "With the rise in artificial intelligence, it is vital that we address and prevent its use to deceive voters and disrupt democracy — especially before the upcoming elections later this year."

However, she also said after lawmakers passed the bill, the Ethics Commission "expressed concerns to my Office about this legislation's enforceability" because the

Legislative Finance Committee "failed to request the Commission's input during the session."

"I, too, am concerned that portions of this legislation are ambiguous and may pose legal issues," Lujan Grisham wrote. "To that end, I will be requesting an official opinion from the Attorney General to address these issues."

New Mexico Department of Justice spokesperson Lauren Rodriguez said Tuesday they had received Lujan Grisham's opinion request. The agency assigned it to an attorney and will publish it on their website once it has been completed, she said.

"It is my hope that this opinion will clarify any ambiguities and provide

guidance to those who will enforce, or be subject to, this legislation," Lujan Grisham wrote.

## How to submit a complaint

Complaints can be handed in to the Ethics Commission in two ways, said spokesperson Jane Kirkpatrick: either as "administrative" complaints or informal ones.

The commission investigates and resolves administrative complaints alleging violations of ethics laws through its administrative proceedings portal, Kirkpatrick said. Once someone submits a complaint, it goes to the executive director, she said.

The administrative process does not allow complainants to be anonymous, Kirkpatrick said, while informal complaints or "tips" do. Those can be submitted here.

These tips are the main way to submit complaints against local officials but the law is more limited when it comes to local elections, Kirkpatrick said.

When the Commission gets a tip, it will start an internal overview and investigation, and then the executive director decides whether to sue someone in state district court, Kirkpatrick said. That decision must be approved by a quorum of the commissioners, at least two Republicans and two Democrats, Kirkpatrick said.

haste.”

During the March 18 trustee meeting the cell tower location permit was approved. Trustee Biviana Cadena voted against the proposal.

Two conditions were added: The tower was moved 250 feet deeper into the orchard with

the distance needing to be verified by town staff. And the tower’s appearance was changed from a fake tree to a water tower, the appearance of which must be approved by Mayor Hernandez and town staff.

“The ball is now in Sun State Towers’ and Mr. (John Jr.) Clayshulte’s (the property owner at the proposed tower loca-

tion) court,” Baušová told the Bulletin via email. “Either party can now reject the conditions at which point the search for a location/solution would start all over. Or they can accept the conditions at which point the town’s residents may sue. ... the extra 250 feet and the visual upgrade to a water tower does not get us residents to our goal.”

# New laws could stem high turnover among NM election officials

New Mexico has seen some of the highest turnover among local election administrators in the country in recent years, according to a new study. But new funding approved in this year’s legislative session could help stem the tide.

Over 60 percent of New Mexico counties have lost at least one county clerk since 2020, with some seeing multiple resignations, according to findings from the Institute for Responsive Government and Center for Tech and Civic Life.

Sam Oliker-Friedland, executive director of the Institute for Responsive Government, said several factors have fueled the churn, including the pandemic and unprecedented harassment and threats.

“Chief among them is a lack of resources that goes to local election officials,” he said.

Senate Bill 108, passed by lawmakers and signed by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham last month, takes on that top issue. It ensures the state’s election fund is reimbursed for however much an election costs to run, or \$15 million, whichever is less.

“We are incredibly proud of that,” Oliker-Friedland said. “That’s the kind of thing that’s going to fix the local election turnover problem.”

The law goes into effect in July, ahead of the upcoming general election.

The state has also taken a crack at the

influence of harassment and threats. Last year, it made intimidating an election worker a fourth degree felony and, this year, largely banned guns at polling sites.

Oliker-Friedland said that while high turnover is a “warning sign” that there’s a problem in how states are supporting election workers, it’s not all bad.

“One of the positives we’re seeing is that new folks are coming into the space, despite the challenging environments surrounding elections right now,” he said. “These folks are creatively supporting voters in their communities and ensuring elections are secure, accessible and accurate.”

The New Mexico primary is on June 4 ahead of the November 5 general election.

The Gannett chain, the largest owner of newspapers across the U.S., has been cutting back on opinion pages altogether, especially institutional voice editorials that are

an important way for newspapers to engage in local issues and share letters reflecting a spectrum of opinion among readers. Some of its papers have piloted alternative offerings for local dialogue in print and online. Others announced that their opinion pages would take a hiatus from national politics and focus on local matters instead.

Trust in news organizations has been running at historic lows for several years, and related to this are opinion surveys indicating blurred distinctions between factual reporting and opinion. How much of this is because of how news is reported, how much is to do with reading habits and proficiency and, finally, how much is to do with how well we tolerate differ-

ences of opinion?

These questions are not just inside baseball for journalists. They bear directly on how we serve our communities, including how we boost civic knowledge and promote civil discourse. Moreover, the dire economic outlook for the industry has worsened the problem, as smaller staffs are motivated to populate their opinion pages with syndicated writers from outside the community.

## Uncontested races are unfair to voters

The geographic political divisions in New Mexico have become so entrenched that both parties have just stopped trying in areas of the state where the other side has the advantage.

Of the 42 seats up for re-election in the state Senate this year, only 15 will be decided in the general election. Democrats will claim 17 seats, and Republicans will win 10 without posting a yard sign, shaking a hand, making a campaign promise or kissing a baby.

Democrats have apparently given up on the seat they held from 1989 to 2020 when John Aurthur Smith was in office. Republican Sen. Crystal Diamond Brantley is among the many incumbents this

year running unopposed.

In the House, Republicans and Democrats will square off in just 33 of the 70 races on election day. Democrats will win 20 seats uncontested, Republicans will take 15 and Libertarian candidates will compete for two seats.

Like many Las Cruces voters, I'll have a say in one chamber, but not the other. My senator, Carrie Hamblen, faces a challenge. But my representative in the House, Micaela Lara Cadena, does not.

Other local legislators to get a free pass are Rep. Do-

Cervantes and Sen. Bill Soules. Rep. Angelica Rubio will face a challenge in the Democratic primary, but the winner will be uncontested in the general election.

I've written several columns in the last few months reminding voters that all seats in the Legislature will be on the ballot this year, and encouraging them to ask their candidates tough questions about whatever issue I was writing on. But candidates running uncontested need not worry about tough questions, or the voters, for that matter.

I understand the frustration of Republicans in

Doña Ana County, or Democrats in the southeast and northwest corners of the state. But they can't stop trying. Fielding a candidate means at least being able to join in the debate.

The show I co-host on Las Cruces community radio will invite all candidates running in contested local races to come on the air. To be honest, it's one of the few times we offer that platform to conservative voices. But they've got to be in the race.

There will be other candidate forums and debates held throughout the county in the weeks leading up to the election. Those in the minority need to take every opportunity they get to make their case as forcefully as

possible. Even if it falls on deaf ears, you keep chipping away.

And who knows? There's always a chance that the favorite will slip up and open the door for a worthy challenger.

This will be perhaps the most depressing presidential election of my lifetime. I'm advising friends not to pay attention to the top of the ticket. Most folks have made up their minds on that one. We should focus instead on the down-ticket races that often have a greater impact on our daily lives. I just wish there were more races to focus on.

We are incredibly grateful to everyone in Las Cruces, Doña Ana County and the surrounding area who entrusts us with their care and who have been our partners in advancing our mission of making communities healthier.

We take our responsibility to the communities we serve very seriously and are proud to share our 2023 Community Benefit Report on our web site, which summarizes the investments, advances and collaborations that have improved access to quality care throughout our region.

MMC continually strives to meet the evolving needs of our communities and offer as many services as we can, close to home. In 2023, we invested almost \$8 million in new technology and equipment and other improvements that allowed us to grow important services and build new

ones. We also added 167 employed and independent providers in areas including gastroenterology, ear-nose-and-throat and orthopedics to our region.

We were pleased to continue expanding cardiac care last year, by bringing in highly experienced interventional cardiologists and becoming the first and only hospital in southern New Mexico to offer transcatheter aortic valve replacement, a state-of-the-art heart procedure. In addition, we launched a cardiac electrophysiology program and continue to expand our cardiovascular surgery services. We advanced cancer care in the region as well, adding automated breast ultrasound to enhance imaging and early detection of breast cancer, and a VitalBeam radiotherapy system for radiation treatment for a variety of cancers. As part of our dedication to mental health services, we reopened our Behavioral Health Unit last summer in partnership with our local Peak Behavioral Health Hospital.

We know that caring for our communities means

going beyond the walls of our hospital. This is why we broke ground on a new urgent care facility in Anthony, New Mexico, a visionary project led by the city of Anthony to revitalize a former golf course into a vibrant health and wellness multi-generational community center. This new facility will ensure that residents in Anthony and neighboring communities will no longer need to travel for urgent care services, keeping New Mexicans in New Mexico.

Delivering safe, quality care to all our neighbors, regardless of their ability to pay, is foundational to our mission. In 2023, MMC donated nearly \$54 million in care and services, including charity care, uninsured discount and uncompensated care to local individuals and families in need.

Great local care requires the work and dedication of a great team, so we constantly strive to create an environment where employees are recognized and valued, and everyone can effectively use their skills to the highest level. Last year,

the hospital distributed a payroll of \$132.7 million to more than 1,425 employees and funded professional development and tuition assistance so all employees can learn, grow, and improve the care they provide.

We also continued to build and expand our educational programs, which include a pharmacy residency and opportunities to become a central sterile technician, OB technician or grow as a perioperative nurse. Because of regional shortages, we grew our medical assistant and surgical technician programs and proudly welcomed 39 new nurse graduates into our nurse residency program last year.

Our MMC culture has always been a testament to the dedication and commitment demonstrated by our teams. All of us at MMC look forward to further enhancing how we serve and collaborate with people across our region today and for generations to come.

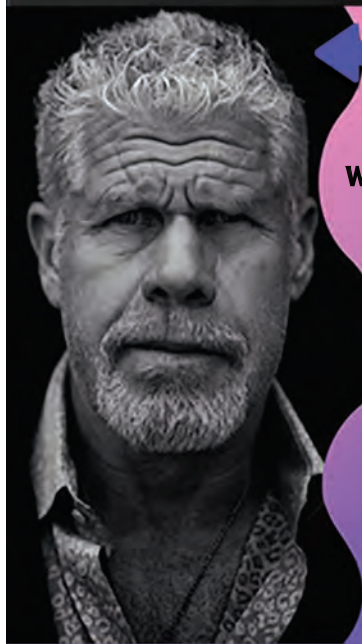

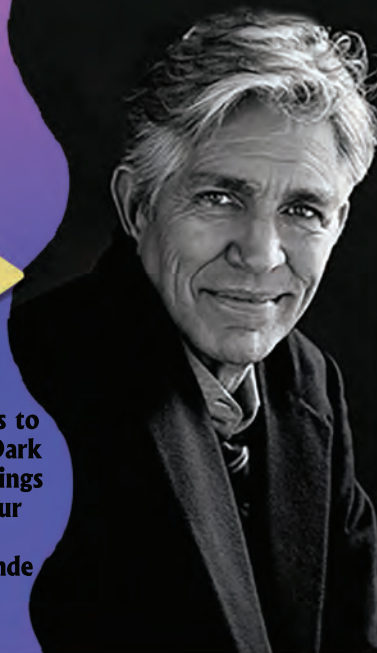

Tugel likes the pure, glowing color that can be achieved with watercolor, her preferred medium.

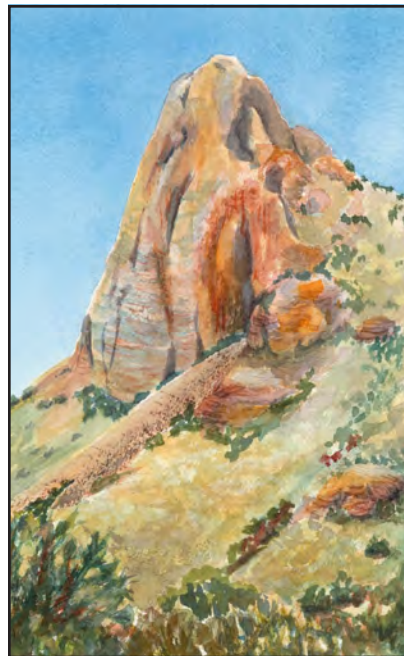
"I do most of my painting 'en plein air' (outdoors) where I can immerse myself both physically and emotionally in the glorious landscapes of the West," she said.

**Q: I heard that Katy Perry is going to leave "American Idol" after this season. Is there any chance she might change her mind?**

A: Well, there's always the potential for someone to change their mind about anything ... but in making her announcement during an appearance on ABC's "Jimmy Kimmel Live!" last month, she seemed to leave the door open for a possible return to "American Idol" someday "if (the producers will) have me."

Perry will have done seven seasons on the talent competition as a judge — along with Luke Bryan and Lionel Richie, spanning the entirety of the program's ABC run thus far — when the current Season 22 concludes, and she has indicated that she is working in new music. The show's production schedule definitely involves a time commitment, with the judges having to go to different cities during the audition phase, then making sure they're in Hollywood on a regular basis once the given season's episodes are centered there. If Perry were to return to "Idol" after leaving, it wouldn't be the first time a judge has done that. Jennifer Lopez was a regular on the show during its earlier Fox era during Seasons 10 and 11, then she left for Season 12 but returned for Seasons 13, 14 and 15. Also, if Perry (who took a brief break from "Idol" last season) came back to the series, it wouldn't necessarily be as a full-time judge ... which might be more conducive to the schedule she apparently wants to get back to with her own music career. She could step back in as a guest mentor, a position that Jelly Roll and Tori Kelly are filling this season.

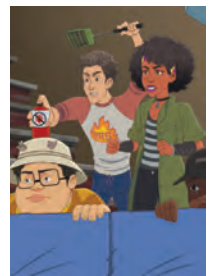

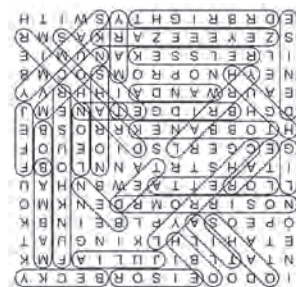

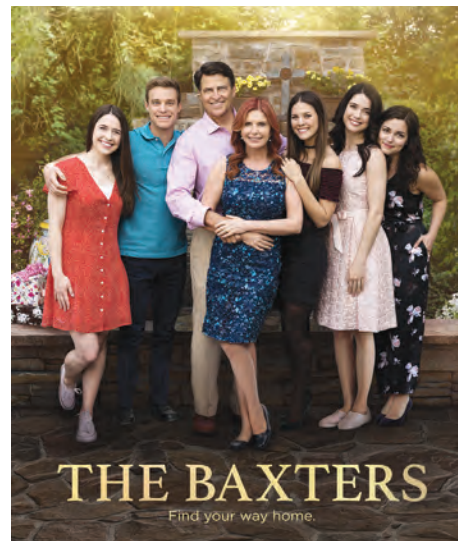
## “Tig Notaro: Hello Again” (March 26)

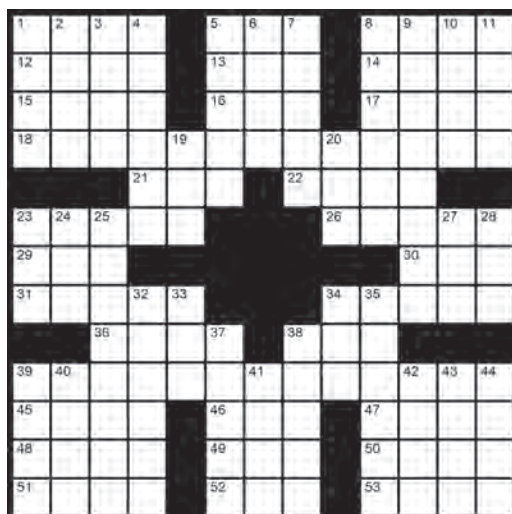

# Outdoor equity fund hits \$3.7 million this year

## BULLETIN REPORT

New Mexico's Outdoor Equity Fund will distribute \$975,142 to 33 local organizations offering outdoor youth programming, hitting a high mark of \$3.7 million in funding, state officials announced Wednesday.

The new awards will reach 16 rural and 13 urban communities as well as five Tribal communities and one land grant, as reported by the New

Mexico Outdoor Recreation Division.

The fund was created in 2019 to ensure that all New Mexico youth have equitable access to the outdoors with programs fostering stewardship and education in New Mexico's land, water and cultural heritage. Over the life of the fund it has distributed \$5.7 million to nearly 250 organizations statewide, according to the state Economic Development Department. It

distributed \$3.7 million in fiscal year 2024 alone.

Included in the new tranche of grants is La Semilla Food Center in Doña Ana County, which will receive \$40,000 for its Descubrimientos Del Desierto program, which brings middle and high school youth to the outdoors to learn about native plants and their uses in food, medicine, art and culture, with hikes and excursions in the Chihuahuan Desert ecosystem.

Nominations are open to organizations

and living artists in New Mexico only. Nominations may be made by any New Mexico resident except for New Mexico Arts commissioners and New Mexico Arts Division staff, according to a news release.

Galleries may not nominate artists they represent and self-nominations or nominations by immediate family or members of the same household will not be accepted.

# On Kindness

Most religious faiths endorse kindness of some sort. Jews have commandments to welcome and treat the stranger as their own; Christians have Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, and, if they were to follow the Old Testament, treat strangers as kin.

Yet, it seems today in the United States, we do not do well with kindness since it requires us to be generous and compassionate even to strangers. We want to "gird up our loins," build walls and treat the strangers among us with suspicion. We are afraid.

Last night I had occasion to talk with a young woman. She is 23 and has a 4-month-old baby. She is

employed at minimum wage, is finishing her GED and refuses to apply for food stamps. We talked for quite a while, but wouldn't have had I not said hello as we sat together at a table outside her work. She was the child of an immigrant.

I have had many such conversations and, in each case, those I spoke with were themselves kind and generous with their time. I believe we each left such conversations better human beings and perhaps more compassionate.

My small but important point is this: it is up to each one of us to pierce the walls we build around us. It may be uncomfortable. It may feel at odds with the contemporary habit of avoiding those we don't know. But it is a beginning.

Compassion, or the quality of being with someone's suffering, is, it seems to me, the building block of any society. It advances the core value of mutual aid. Without it we are a society of strangers, alone and too often



feeling entitled to remain that way. The notion of a social contract makes no sense, and we are left to fend for ourselves. Is that the society we want to live in?

## Study outlines major expansion of Santa Teresa Port of Entry

The Santa Teresa Port of Entry could see a major expansion if findings of a federal feasibility study, released last week, are realized.

The General Services Administration and the Customs and Border Protection department presented findings of a feasibility study that envisioned expanding the port of entry to fifteen commercial lanes (from three currently) and eleven passenger lanes leading from Mexico, plus five

lanes southbound and the inspection bays for commercial trucks.

If the project is prioritized and funded, the project could transform Santa Teresa into one of the largest ports of entry on the U.S.-Mexico border, more than tripling its current size.

Funding for the study was secured in 2022 by U.S. Sen. Martin Heinrich, who pressed both agencies to finalize the study and make the proposal a priority project.

In a letter to the agencies, Heinrich wrote that the port in southern Doña

Ana County “has become a critical facilitator of international trade – especially with Mexico, our largest trading partner. ... Santa Teresa has proven its strategic importance to strengthening the United States’ supply chains, facilitating increased domestic production, and improving the economic well-being of New Mexicans and all Americans.”

The present facility, constructed in 1997, is located over 40 miles south of Las Cruces and near downtown El Paso, Texas, bordering San Jerónimo in Chihuahua, Mexico,

and is convenient for commuter travel to and from Ciudad Juárez. Open seven days a week, it has become an alternative access point for motorists to congested crossings in El Paso. In recent years, the state has also made large investments into road improvements and other infrastructure and economic development, seeing Santa Teresa’s open space and proximity to rail and a county airport as a strategic opportunity.

Yet it also has room to expand, unlike many of its counterparts, Heinrich said.

“A lot of these ports of entry are constrained by the development around them. For a long time, we’ve known that Santa

Teresa has the capacity to expand.”

He said the study affirms an argument he has been making to CBP for years, to wit: “This is the strategic place to be expanding trade with our largest trading partner.”

Border Industrial Association president Jerry Pacheco told the Bulletin that Santa Teresa has rapidly grown from a link to maquiladoras (manufacturing plants) in Mexico to a logistical and industrial hub at the foot of New Mexico. That has led to billions of dollars of investment, the and the creation of solid, well-paying jobs.

“Santa Teresa has become an electronics hub and an automotive hub

and a metal fabrication hub and a packaging hub,” he said. “The Santa Teresa region has grown to be the originator of 63 percent of New Mexico’s total exports to the world. That’s more than Albuquerque and the rest of the state put together. We’re the sixth largest port of entry on the U.S.-Mexico border in terms of volume.”

Pacheco said expansions are already underway, including \$1.5 million on the U.S. side and a similar-sized investment on the San Jerónimo side. More is needed, he argued, in order to avoid throttling the progress that has been made.

# Poop Patrol: Cheerful service for unglamorous need

Issac Misqueze hit upon his business idea because of something he did not like to do: Cleaning up his yard after his two large dogs. Figuring many people felt the same way, he spotted a market opportunity without many providers, compared to larger cities.

Misqueze founded Poop Patrol last year and, as a business, he says he enjoys it enough that he hopes to make this part-time enterprise, for which he works around his regular job, his full-time occupation. With a business license acquired last year and a branded shirt, he proceeds with an unglamorous yet popular service, growing his clientele since last August.

Stopping at the home of one of his clients, Misqueze carefully unlocked a gate allowing him to access the back yard. (Clients are asked to bring in their dogs while he works.) Some of his clients are one-offs, while others bring him in weekly, every two weeks or

monthly.

He proceeded to walk the yard slowly with a rake and a closing scoop, covering the U-shaped grounds in a pair of unhurried laps, making sure he did not miss a load.

"I like being outside," he said. "I've been working inside for a lot of years and this gets me to go outside every day, at least once or twice."

For now, Misqueze focuses on cleaning up after domestic dogs but he envisions a full-time operation that would handle commercial jobs, such as for realty companies that allow renters to keep pets or are preparing residential properties for sale. Even larger jobs, requiring equipment and elaborate safety gear, will wait for the future, he said.

"Every year, just grow a little bit more," he described his plan. "Eventually hire somebody. When I'm too old, maybe I won't have to do the work. Maybe my son will be old enough to do it." (No word on what the son thinks about that.)

For now, he devotes week-ends and weekday evenings,

approximately 30 hours per week, to Poop Patrol.

Some of his clients are older, others work during the day while their dogs stay outside in warmer weather, and others may have an injury or disability that doesn't allow them to clean up themselves. Among his clients he reported a disabled military veteran with a

service animal. Misqueze says some homeowners apologize to him for the mess, which makes him chuckle: "I tell them it's all right, that's why I do this job. It is what it is."

Using long-handled tools, Misqueze rarely has to bend or squat – he notes that he has a bad back – and for the most part he says it is not a dirty job,

whatever its reputation might be. "A lot of people think it's a messy job, but as you have seen, I haven't picked up anything by hand. A lot of people, in their mind, think it's a super gross job."

Most jobs are small enough that he usually disposes of the waste in bags deposited to the client's own trash. However, he has had to make occasional trips to the dump. His largest assignment, he said, led to a haul of 70 to 80 pounds.

Misqueze has a website (Poop-Patrol7.godaddysites.com) and he said social media and word of mouth have helped him accumulate clients.

One thing he learned, he said as he scanned the yard for any missed business, is that cleaning up after little dogs is actually more challenging than bigger dogs, as the deposits are easier to miss.

With the work done and the disposal taken care of, Misqueze carefully secured the gate and returned to his pickup truck with his tools as the setting sun glowed over the neighborhood.

With border security looming as a major issue in the 2024 presidential campaign, Heinrich noted that ports' role in national security, where most illegal narcotics are intercepted. According to data cited by Heinrich's office, 99 percent of fentanyl seizures in fiscal year 2023 — over 240,000 pounds' worth — were caught at the southern border, mostly through the ports. CBP officers at the ports also interdict

smuggled weapons bound for organized crime organizations south of the border.

Heinrich, who sits on the Senate appropriations committee, said millions of federal dollars in the final 2024 appropriations bill for projects in New Mexico's border counties partly address the added burden southern rural counties face: The projects include funding for a new emergency response complex in Anthony, an expansion of the Hidalgo County Emergency Medical Services building, and ballistic imaging machines for use by the state's Crime Gun In-

telligence Center, including one for Las Cruces.

The bill also includes funding for equipment detecting fentanyl and other narcotics for law enforcement agencies in Hidalgo, Catron and Grant counties; drug identification equipment and youth education programming for the Las Cruces Police Department; and similar equipment plus training for Silver City police.

"The counties on the southern border in New Mexico are dealing with a finite tax base," Heinrich said. "On top of providing those health care

and public safety resources to their own constituents, they also have to deal with whatever comes their way with respect to being border counties. ... That's not really accounted for in the rural tax base. It's incumbent upon the federal government to think about the needs they have ... and help them be able to provide those services, as well as those services we provide directly through Customs and Border Protection and Border Patrol."

Yet both men emphasized that expanding facilities and upgrading technology will not over-

come the long-standing problem of insufficient staffing at the ports. A bipartisan immigration and border security package negotiated in the Senate recently stalled after Republicans in Congress declined to support it. Pacheco said it included funding for 1,900 agents on the border.

"We could have 20 commercial lanes, we could have 30 lanes — if we don't have enough customs people to man the lanes, it doesn't matter. Concurrently with expanding the lanes, you've got to put more boots on the ground there."

# Environmentalists to address climate change in NMSU panel

Tim Davis, a staff attorney for environmental organization WildEarth Guardians, will lead a panel discussion at New Mexico State University on Tuesday examining the affects of oil and gas pollution in New Mexico.

The discussion, titled “The pollution control clause of the NM Constitution: State accountability for oil and gas pollution crisis in New Mexico,” is part of the Cambios Climate Change Speaker Series at the university. The free presentation will begin

at 7 p.m. on March 26, at the Rio Grande Theatre, 211 N. Main Street, according to NMSU.

The series, formerly known as the New Mexico State University Climate Chance Education Seminar Series, was founded in 2018 to promote informed discussion of climate change led by a range of experts.

“The state of New Mexico is at an interesting juncture,” geological sciences professor and department head Nancy McMillan stated in a news release. “Oil and gas extraction is a main contributor to



our economy, and yet we know that fossil fuel use is a major contributor to climate change.

On one hand, the state needs to move away from oil and gas for the sake of the environment, but it is difficult to watch those revenues decline. This panel discussion discusses a lawsuit that results from a similar dilemma: The state needs to protect both the environment

and revenues from oil and gas extraction.”

The lawsuit reference involves civil litigation filed against the state in 2023 by a coalition of citizens and Indigenous and youth groups alleging the state has violated its Constitution by failing to curb pollution from petroleum production.

The panel will include Jonathan Juarez and Jozee Zuniga of Youth United for Climate Crisis Action, an organization that is among the plaintiffs in that lawsuit.

# Supreme Court denies PNM renewable energy incentive

New Mexico’s largest electric utility was denied a rate rider that would have allowed it to collect millions of additional dollars from customers for allegedly exceeding what it was required to do under New Mexico’s Renewable Energy Act.

In a unanimous ruling issued by the state Supreme Court on Monday, the state’s high court rejected an appeal by the Public Service Co. of New Mexico, aka PNM, and upheld a decision by the state Public Regulation Commission.

Under the law, utilities are required to derive 20 percent of their retail electricity to come from renewable sources and increase to 40 percent in 2025, with additional benchmarks after that:

50 percent in 2030, 80 percent in 2040 and 100 percent by 2045.

The company had proposed in 2021 to retire renewable energy certificates, which are used to document compliance with the law, from 2022 to 2024 in order to exceed the law’s renewable requirements and qualify for the incentive. If permitted, it would have been claiming it reach the 40 percent standard in those years, sooner than is required by the statute.

The certificates can be “banked” for up to four years if they are not used in a given year, and then retired to meet renewable energy requirements for a particular year.

However, the court found, as had the PRC, that the company’s plan did not meet the requirements for an incentive,

writing: “[The utility] seeks a reward— not an incentive — for renewable resources or energy that it already has produced or acquired beyond the REA’s demands.”

The company had sought a rate rider that would have allowed it collect \$5.2 million from rate payers over three years. But the court ruled that “SPS’s supporting documentation showed that in 2020, it actually generated and purchased renewable energy in an amount that was substantially equivalent to its RPS obligation — twenty percent of its retail electricity sales.”

The ruling also upheld the PRC’s order changing the rules for administering the law, including financial incentives used to accelerate utilities’ transition to renewable energy.

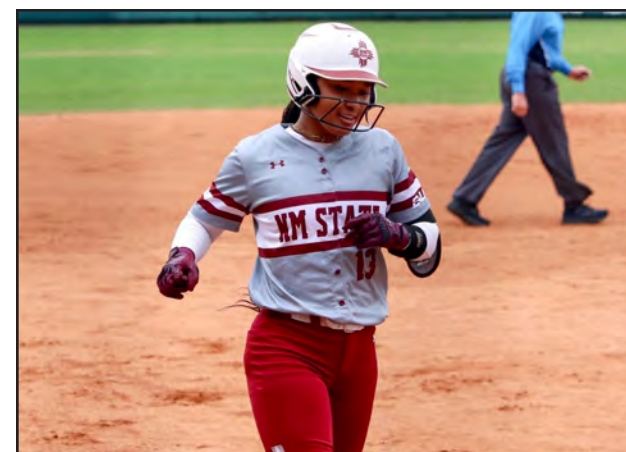
## NMSU's Spearman reaps freshman honors

### NM STATE ATHLETICS REPORT

Last weekend, the Aggies returned to their winning ways with help from Desirae Spearman, who was named the Conference USA Freshman of the Week for the third time through just six weeks of the 2024 campaign.

Over the course of the Aggies' road sweep of Sam Houston, the true freshman was once again dominant at the plate - leading the Aggies in batting average (.455), total hits (5), home runs (2) and RBIs (6). While serving as the Aggies' starting leftfielder, Spearman recorded at least one hit and one RBI in every game this weekend while accounting for exactly half of the Aggies' RBIs against the Bearkats.

In the series opener, Spearman went 3-of-4 at the plate, including a two-run home run to help guide the Aggies to a commanding 6-2 to set the tone for the weekend. The El Paso native also served a pivotal role in a 5-4 win on Saturday - hitting a two-out three-run home

run to help the Aggies get out to a 4-0 lead. Finally, Spearman drove home the lone run of the game on Sunday to help NM State secure a narrow 1-0 win and its first CUSA sweep of the season.

Through two weeks of league action, Spearman has dazzled - ranking among the top 10 CUSA batters in home runs (t-2nd, 2), RBIs (t-4th, 7), total hits (5th, 9) and batting average (10th, .421). In just her first year at the collegiate level, Spearman is maintaining a .476 batting average while pacing the Aggies in home runs (8) and ranking second on the team in RBIs (19), third on the team in total

hits (20) and first on the team in total bases (50) despite missing 11 of the Aggies' 25 games due to injury.

By receiving the weekly award, Spearman becomes the first Aggie since Karysta Donisthorpe in 2015 to haul in three conference weekly awards in one season. During the 2015 season, Donisthorpe claimed four WAC Pitcher of the Week honors.

Spearman and the Aggies will return to action this weekend when they host I-10 rival UTEP in a three-game series which is scheduled to begin on Friday evening at 6 p.m. MT.

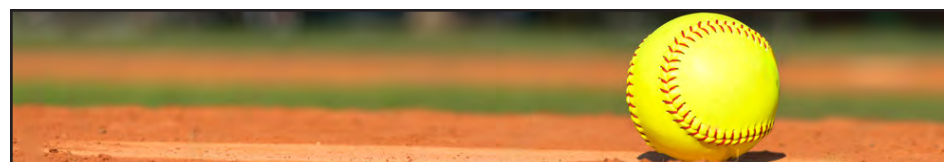

# Advice for avoiding score-wrecking blunders

We all know how one or two disaster holes can spoil an otherwise proud score card. All it takes is one or two thoughtless, stupid moments, or a couple of terrible swings of the golf club, and “poof,” there goes a great round.

It even happens to the pros. Jake Knapp, the PGA Tour rookie who was a first-time winner of the Mexico Open a month ago, made a septuple bogey 12 on the par 5 sixth hole at the Arnold Palmer Invitational at Bay Hill after hitting three shots into the water.

There are ways you can avoid some heartbreaking mishaps with only a few simple tips and tactics.

First of all, let's take

your club selection off the tee. I see a lot of middle-to-high handicappers pull a driver on a tight par 4 when they can't come close to hitting the green with an approach shot.

Sometimes we need to play a long hole with a 3 or 5 wood or a long iron off the tee to get it safely in the fairway, and then do our best to get a third shot close. It is absolutely critical that you pay attention to your setup and aim, and swing confidently.

With approach shots to the green, club selection and aiming at the target are equally important.

If you tend to hit short

of the green after a good tee shot, break that habit by taking one or two more clubs. Many golf courses have what we call “sucker” pins, meaning the pin placement is in such an awkward place that one would be a sucker to go right at it.

Playing to the middle of the green may be boring to some folks but it will promote better scores. Pins tucked in the corners of the greens are hard to get to and you find your misses wind up “short-sided,” with very little green to work with for difficult chip shots.

Golf course designers

put sand bunkers around greens to challenge golfers. To avoid these, learn to hit short of them and then hit a good pitch shot, or take enough club to carry the sand. If you have to play your ball out of the bunker, you had better know the proper technique. The same with lakes and ponds, which are also hazards – or to be USGA-correct, “penalty areas.” How many times have you seen a player hit his ball into the water and moan, “That's where I didn't want to go?” Chances are he had muttered, “don't hit it in the water,” but his brain only registered “hit it in the water.” It is never a good idea to begin a swing

thought with “don't.”

If you haven't done it yet, now is the time to get a true yardage measurement for each club in your bag. That means how far your carry distance is, and then a typical roll out. Most recreational golfers overestimate their carry yards, especially with metal woods. If you know your carry distance, it is easier to adjust for wind, lie, elevation and temperature. You should consider having your club pro accompany you to the range with an up-to-date launch monitor.

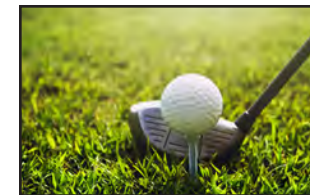
Poor chipping can spoil a round and cause major frustration. The average golfer hits fewer than half the greens in the regula-

tion number of strokes, so deft chipping is needed to save par. Chipping requires learning the proper technique and a lot of practice. Chipping the ball within a foot or two of the hole from off the green is great, but it demands superb putting to save strokes. That's why short game practice is a must if you want to lower your scores and your handicap.
