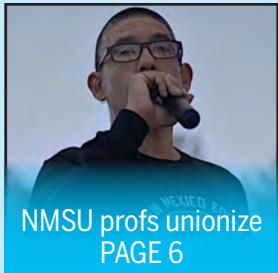

TAUMOEPEAU TAKES OVER

New city manager approved by council

PRONOUNCING TAUMOEPEAU

Ikani Taumoepeau does not seem to worry much about how people pronounce his last name. "When people ask me if they said it right, I just say yes," he said during a recent visit with the Bulletin.

His surname is Tongan, from the island of Tonga in Polynesia from where his parents immigrated, and he says that the pronunciation likely comes easily for Spanish speakers, since the vowels are all pronounced as they would be in that language: *tau-moeh-peow*.

Ikani Taumoepeau is not Ifo Pili. The new city manager of Las Cruces wanted to make that point. But it would be a step too far to say that Taumoepeau didn't owe Pili something.

Taumoepeau acknowledged he has big shoes to fill, saying Pili's work creating a culture of confidence and collaboration among city departments should be commended. "To come in and do what Ifo did, I'll be the first to say I can't do that. But I can continue the momentum," Taumoepeau said.

The Las Cruces City Council confirmed Taumoepeau as city manager on April 1.

The job is a big one. Unlike Albuquerque or Santa Fe, Las Cruces has a "council-manager" system that empowers an unelected city manager as the executive officer. Taumoepeau will oversee a workforce of 1,700 and a budget of more than \$500 million.

In a joint interview with the Las Cruces Bulletin and Las Cruces Sun-News on April 2, Taumoepeau said he was still formulating goals and had few to share. He wanted to speak with councilors individually to garner priorities. Still, he said public safety and infrastructure improvements – including a plan he intended to propose at an upcoming work session – were vital.

"My job is to give our departments and our department heads the resources that they need. And that's what I'll work to do," Taumoepeau said.

Taumoepeau grew up in San Francisco, Calif. He holds a master's in public administration from Brigham Young University. He began his career in Eagle Mountain, Utah under Pili before serving as city manager of Clayton, Calif. from Dec. 2019 to Dec. 2020. He became an assistant city manager in Las Cruces in January 2021.

At 42, Taumoepeau's career advanced rapidly during the past decade. But in Las Cruces, he said he had found a home.

"If we're gonna serve the community, we have to grow roots," Taumoepeau said. "And we have to be here for the long haul to see things to see things through."

City managers think in three-year increments, Taumoepeau said. That's the length of the average contract.

"My goal in the next three years is to kick butt and do as much as we can without breaking the bank and execute the city council's vision and continue on the path and trajectory that (Las Cruces) is on," he said.

An empowered administrator

The system of government in Las Cruces is called a council-manager system.

Councilors set priorities via resolution, ordinance and vision. They also represent residents to state and national entities. The mayor is merely one of these figures. They hold no

veto power and represent all residents instead of limited districts.

In this system, the mayor and council have no administrative authority. The city manager's office handles all day-to-day operations.

The system arose in the early 20th century as a reform to Gilded Age problems of patronage over merit, according to passages published in the Encyclopedia of American Urban History. Vast networks of clients and patrons dictated elections to maintain power and use the government to enrich themselves. This system was bolstered by a "weak council system," which left municipal governments suitable for patronage networks.

Today, most cities in the U.S. follow the council-manager system: 59 percent, according to the International City-County Management Association. Still, it's not well understood.

"I've had to explain this to my family before because they still think I'm the mayor," Taumoepeau joked. "And I tell them that I have seven bosses. I work at the behest of them."

Taumoepeau said he sees little room for his values. Administrative operations are all about the elected council and the mayor's appetite.

"I follow their vision. It is whatever they come back with, and they tell me to do. I am their sole employee," he said.

One councilor votes no

Taumoepeau agreed to

a three-year contract. The contract is worth \$216,000 annually and includes a \$500 monthly vehicle allowance, health benefits, two weeks of vacation, 16 hours of personal leave, 160 hours of annual leave and 96 hours of sick leave.

"Folks might look at that and say, 'Wow, that salary,' or 'Wow, those benefits,'" Councilor Johana Bencomo said before affirming the contract. "But honestly, it's because this job is incredibly difficult."

The contract also included controversy. Cassie McClure, who represents District 1, was the only councilor to vote against it.

"I also have faith in (Taumoepeau)'s ability to do his job and have had nothing but good interactions with him even before I was a councilor," McClure said during the meeting. "As a writer, I place a huge premium on communication, and this is still a very uncomfortable forum for me to speak in public. But I think communication builds trust, and I think we failed in that for this round."

McClure declined an interview with three media outlets, including the Las Cruces Bulletin, who were at the meeting. Instead, she published a statement on Facebook. There, she wrote that picking a city manager was among the council's most important jobs. But the process was rushed and skipped over the public, she said.

"I – speaking for myself as I won't speak for the rest of council – would have wished there had been more ways to cre-

ate confidence, and build trust, for the voters by explaining why an internal hire was preferred," McClure wrote.

Taumoepeau said he appreciated McClure's opposition.

"I appreciated her following her gut on that, and being transparent in communicating with me because I told all of them, I will give each of them 120 percent," he said.

Taumoepeau starts the job with three years of experience in Las Cruces. He has already acclimated

and said he knows where the landmines are.

"Normally, in the first 90 days, you're doing site tours, you're getting a lay of the land, and honestly, you waste a year and a half," Taumoepeau said.

But Taumoepeau arrives in Las Cruces amid ongoing efforts.

The city nears its deadline to draft and approve a \$500 million budget. The budget includes request to hire more firefighters, money for road improvements and much more.

Public safety initiatives – including a myriad of policy ideas from criminal-

izing panhandling to bolstering police recruitment and technology – will also be a major effort in the first three months, Taumoepeau said.

But for now, he needs more information.

"Stay tuned. I'm going to continue to get new priorities from them," Taumoepeau said.

Reducing poverty, which Pili regretted not having a greater effect on, would also be a goal.

"It's going to continue to build on top of the legacy and the foundation that's already been set here," he said.

City sells affordable housing bond a year after vote

One year and four months after Las Cruces voters overwhelmingly approved a \$6 million cash infusion to the city's affordable housing efforts, the city announced on March 25 that it had begun putting that money into action.

The \$6 million affordable housing bond, sold on March 14, was one of four general obligation bonds, often referred to as GO bonds, Las Cruces residents approved in 2022.

The city waited to sell the bond and receive the money because staff and council feared interest rates and taxes would cannibalize a significant portion of it. Ultimately, the city settled on selling the bond despite high taxes and interest rates.

While this unlocked other funding from federal and grant sources, it also made the bond taxable.

Money for a new fire station, the East Mesa Recreational Complex, and park improvements were also approved.

David Sedillo, director of Las Cruces Public Works, presented updates about the four bond projects during a March 25 work session of the Las Cruces City Council.

Fire Station 9

Voters approved the fire station bond, with 22,974 voters in favor (77 percent) and 7,900 against (26 percent).

The vote sent \$10 million to

the construction of a new fire station in Las Cruces' East Mesa-Sonoma Ranch area. The region is one of the fast-growing corners of Las Cruces, often a target for the development of new homes.

As part of budget talks in 2024, the fire department requested that the council provide funding for 30 new firefighters to staff the station. The council signaled that they would agree to this.

"We're on schedule for the project," Sedillo told the council.

Sedillo said the design was complete. Next, he estimated the project would go out to bid in April 2024. Overall, he estimated the cost would be \$13.2 million.

Fire Station 9 is the second fire station Las Cruces has

However, the money's promise has allowed Las Cruces to begin working on some projects, such as the Three Sisters Complex and Pedrena Senior Complex.

The housing bond was different from the other four. Instead of building a brick-and-mortar project, the \$6 million housing bond was sent into the city's affordable housing trust fund.

County approves \$10 million for new emergency management center

The Doña Ana County Board of County Commissioners unanimously approved funding for a new emergency management center during a meeting on March 26.

The Office of Emergency Management serves as the emergency management agency for both Doña Ana County and the city of Las Cruces. OEM has played a major role in local disaster response, including the 2006 Hatch flood, the 2013 South Valley floods, the 2019 migrant crisis, the 2020-21 Covid-19 pandemic, and the response to the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority water safety emergency in December.

The commission approved nearly \$10.9 million for a new home for the county's emergency management operations. Steven Lopez, OEM's director, said the new building would help OEM better respond to disasters.

"I'm very in favor of the OEM building," said commission chair Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez. "I think it's a very needed thing for our community."

Commissioner Susana Chaparro and Manuel Sanchez joined Schaljo-Hernandez in affirming the vote. Commissioners Diana Murillo and Shannon Reynolds were absent.

About half of the money the commissioners allocated was \$5.6 mil-

said the new building will cost \$12,453,309.70, with another \$650,000 for furnishing and computer equipment.

"We know that we can wait a year for furnishing and equipment because the building's got to be built before we can put in any of those anyway," Lopez said.

Some of that has already been covered. Lopez

said federal money has covered about \$2.9 million of the construction cost.

The new building is set to be built on land leased to OEM from New Mexico State University. The parcel is located near the NMSU Golf Course. The lease is 45 years long, with two 10-year renewable leases.

"In 65 years, this building will need at least some pretty significant improvements, at least from a maintenance side," Lopez said.

The building will house OEM's administrative offices and a disaster supply warehouse. The building can also be a

constructed via recent GO bonds. The 2018 GO bond allowed the city to rebuild Fire Station 3, which serves the region near Valley Drive and Picacho Avenue.

Park improvements

Voters approved the park improvements bond with 23,074 in favor (74 percent) and 8,077 against (26 percent).

The vote sent \$2 million to park renovation and improvement. The city

chose to spend the bond money on La Llorona Park.

For La Llorona, the city will upgrade amenities and trail improvements. Design for that was complete, Sedillo said. The city expects the work to go to bid by August 2024.

"If there are any funds left over for this project, those will be assigned to Tellbrook park for any equipment replacements," Sedillo said.

East Mesa Public Recreational Complex

Voters approved the

East Mesa Recreational Complex bond, with 19,389 in favor (63 percent) and 11,396 against (37 percent).

The vote sent \$5 million to further construction of the complex.

Sedillo said there's a myriad of tasks underway at the complex. Construction of phase 1, which involved a lot of groundwork, is 80 percent complete. Construction of some of the lighting is done, and Sedillo expects that sod work will begin in mid-April.

NMSU faculty rally for union as deadline draws near

On the same day New Mexico State University announced a new interim president, professors pushing for a union expressed optimism about their endeavor.

At a March 29 rally, about 100 educators and students called on NMSU to voluntarily recognize their union. A group of professors began unionizing in March under the National Educators Association of New Mexico. The university can voluntarily recognize the union or push against it.

Although a previous organizing effort in the middle of the 2010s failed,

Bronstein and other faculty interviewed by the Las Cruces Bulletin were optimistic despite the past.

“We are really hoping that the current administration, which is kind of in flux, will see that it’s probably better in terms of cultivating good will with the faculty to just recognize this voluntarily,” Bronstein said.

The board of regents recently rejected a slate of candidates for president selected by a search firm, ended a contract with Jay Gogue as interim president and appointed Monica Torres, chancellor of the university’s community colleges, as its second consecutive interim

president. The board also relaunched the search for NMSU’s next president.

Carrie Tafoya, an English professor, said the top grievance leading to the effort was compensation. NMSU needs to pay educators more, she said.

“Especially for the amount of hours that you have to work,” Tafoya said. “In my department, it’s a lot of grading. So it takes a lot of outside time.”

Salary and benefits were the top grievances expressed by other attendees of the rally.

“Initially, in 2019, it was kind of like a lack of respect for the faculty. That was two administrations ago,” Bronstein said.

“As we’ve spoken to each other more, and as we’ve had more conversations with our colleagues, there are people who leave here because their salaries can’t keep up.”

Bronstein said others have raised issues with disciplinary practices against professors and the pipeline’s health for younger faculty.

Mary Parr-Sánchez, president of the National Educators Association of New Mexico, also at-

tended the rally.

“It’s just been the culmination of a lot of bad policy, a lot of revolving door of leadership, and a faculty that’s frustrated and wants to see more stability and better conditions for students and themselves,” Parr-Sánchez said.

Parr-Sánchez, who taught at Picacho Middle School for 25 years before joining the union’s leadership, said NMSU’s unionizing efforts are

part of a wider trend. One review found that faculty across the U.S. created 118 bargaining units between 2013 and 2019.

“It’s just really simple. We see the wealthier get wealthier, and we see everybody else doesn’t,” Parr-Sánchez said. “Life just becomes more challenging and more challenging. It’s just a basic inequity. And people are not stupid. They may not want to engage immediately. But there does come a point where they can’t take it anymore, and they need to be heard.”

NMSU’s effort includes tenured and tenure-track faculty, not adjunct professors.

The date to recognize or reject the union is not set in stone. NMSU requested an extension on a procedural step on April 1, delaying the process. Justin Bannister, associate vice president and NMSU’s spokesperson, said the university would recognize the bargaining unit “in accordance with applicable legal requirements.”

Natural gas pipes are buried under the ground, out of sight, safely away from people. However, being underground results in unique challenges to the natural gas pipes, including leaks and corrosion. Fortunately, the Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) Corrosion department is dedicated to detecting and controlling corrosion on underground gas piping and reducing these risks. Lupe Valdez, Gas Cathodic Technician, explains this process.

"Federal law mandates that Corrosion inspections be conducted every year," Valdez explains. Early detection of corrosion allows us to repair underground pipes before they start to corrode and leak. By being proactive, we are keeping our community safe."

Natural gas pipes are either metal or polyethylene. While metal pipes are more resilient

than polyethylene pipes, they can become corroded over time, increasing the risk of leaks. Metal pipes are made of steel and are coated with a material that protects them from the elements, —soil, water, and air. When steel is exposed to air, the oxygen in the air causes atmospheric corrosion. This chemical effect between oxygen and steel is called oxidation. Most people know this as rust.

This same effect can also happen to the pipes underground if the protective coating is damaged, exposing the steel pipes to the soil and water in the ground. When metal is rusted, whether above ground or below the ground, it cannot conduct electricity as effectively as metal with no corrosion. By detecting where corrosion is occurring, LCU technicians can effectively locate damaged pipes.

Along the natural gas pipelines are wires that originate from the pipes below all the way up to street level, terminating at test boxes. Using a "Digital Cathodic Protection Meter," a corrosion control technician can obtain a reading at these test boxes that will measure how well the pipes conduct electricity. This value is measured in volts/millivolts, the unit of electrical potential difference.

This measurement is an indicator of the pipe's integrity. If the electric current is measured at -850mv or a value more negative, this indicates a well-coated pipe. If the current is measured at a value more positive than -850 millivolts, then this indicates that the pipe is in poor condition. When this positive reading is obtained, the Corrosion and Maintenance team will dig to expose the pipe and conduct repairs.

Just as the plastic coating protects the pipes from corrosion, an interesting object called a "sacrificial anode" also protects the pipes from damage. A sacrificial anode looks like a giant bar of silver, is placed underground, and is then connected to the gas pipes. The anode diverts oxidation reactions away from the pipes and to the anode. Over time, the anode will deteriorate instead of the gas pipes. When the sacrificial anode is depleted, it can be easily replaced with another one rather than replacing a section of a natural gas main or service line.

"Most people can agree that prevention is the better solution," Valdez explains. "That's why we are out here every day, to keep everyone safe."

AG affirms public's right to know

The Open Meetings Act is an easy law to break, which means promoting its importance and calling out violations is a responsibility of citizens, journalists, organizations like the New Mexico Foundation for Open Government and even the New Mexico Attorney General.

Last week, the state Department of Justice issued several determinations regarding violations of OMA and the Inspection of Public Records Act – laws which protect the public's right to know

what government agencies are doing. These inquiries were initiated by complaints from FOG, some in tandem with local news outlets.

The DOJ informed the Eastern New Mexico University Board of Regents it broke the law in January by taking final action on the president's contract and another personnel matter during closed session. Because President/Chancellor

James Johnston's contract was not approved in open session, the action is invalid, the office ruled.

Responding to other complaints, the office found that the Metropolitan Detention Center in Bernalillo County improperly applied an exemption in

the law to certain video footage and that the District Attorney's office for Luna, Grant and Hidalgo counties sought improper fees for redacting a video

before fulfilling a public records request last year, which the DOJ said could have a chilling effect on such requests. (The office provided the video without the fees.)

DOJ complaints are an important recourse, short of potential litigation, in promoting transparency and the rule of law.

The Las Cruces Bulletin filed a complaint last week seeking an inquiry into 1-3 potential violations of OMA during the city of Las Cruces' recent lightning-quick city manager selection process,

nearly all of it out of public sight.

The city maintains it followed the law. Fair enough. If and when a determination comes, we will report what the DOJ says, even if we got it wrong. The point is to promote your right to know.

Funding system leaves billions unspent

The capital outlay bill passed by the Legislature this year provides just under \$290 million for 136 projects throughout the state, including \$20 million for steam tunnel and electrical infrastructure upgrades at New Mexico State University.

NMSU will also get \$10 million for facility construction in the Creative Media Institute and \$1.575 million for road improvements on the Gadsden campus. Other local funding includes \$3.083 million for construction of a new senior center on the East Mesa, \$310,000 for the Munson Senior Center and \$344,000 for the Anthony Senior Center.

All 136 projects will be funded without any kind of ranking system to determine what our top priorities are, or vetting process to ensure that the projects are needed and wanted by community leaders.

Many projects will get partial funding, meaning they will either take years to complete or stall out before the finish.

The Legislature also reauthorized funding this year for 253 projects that were approved in past sessions but not completed on time. They include construction of a local

district courthouse, a new dam on the lower Spring Canyon arroyo, a new reproductive health care clinic in Doña Ana County and a multipurpose trail connection in the county.

How many of these projects will actually be completed remains to be seen, but the track record isn't good.

According to reporting by Source New Mexico from a November 2023 meeting of the Legislative Finance Committee, the state has appropriated nearly \$5 billion for 4,900 projects that has not been spent. Of the 766 active

projects with an appropriation of \$1 million or more, 415 are on schedule, 170 are behind schedule and 181 have had no activity at all, meaning local governments have not taken the steps needed to access the money.

Our state has two very different ways for funding public projects. Because education is more tightly regulated under the constitution, funding for schools goes through a rigorous evaluation process to ensure that money goes to those with the greatest needs and fewest resources.

Funding for everything else in the state is essentially one big pie, and

each lawmaker can do pretty much whatever they want with their slice.

Too often that slice isn't enough to complete the project. And so lawmakers either have to find other local legislators willing to give up their slice, or keep coming back year after year, hoping to reach the finish someday.

Our capital outlay system stems from legislation passed in 1961 to fund dam construction based on bonds that would be paid back through severance taxes. All projects required their own bill until 1977, when the Senate merged 27 different

bills into one.

That bill passed unanimously because there was something in it for everybody. It's for that

same reason the system has been so hard to reform. It works great for legislators, who are each guaranteed to bring home a little pork every year. This year's bill passed 67-0 in the House and 39-0 in

the Senate.

The state has at least made the process more transparent in recent years. The online capital outlay dashboard now allows the public to track all of the projects that

are stuck in the pipeline. What it shows is how many needs are still unmet.

Intricacies of competency reform stall legislation

This is the conclusion of a two-part story about competency and the New Mexico justice system.

Conrad Perea, chief judge of the Third Judicial District Court in Las Cruces, addressed a question during an interview with deep roots in New Mexico and U.S. history: If someone can't understand legal proceedings, how can they have a fair trial?

Judge Perea said questions of competency come down to the liberty owed to people accused of crimes.

"We're locking them up, so it's a liberty question," Perea said. "And should we, in fact, be locking up an individual who really doesn't understand that he's doing anything wrong?"

Perea said the process begins when someone in the court raises the issue. That person can be the prosecutor, the judge or the defendant, but it is most often the defense attorney.

"I think our defense attorneys, our judges are in tune with what's happening. And they see when an individual isn't understanding the process. So that seems to be working," Perea said.

Once they raise the issue, the case is transferred to district court, unless it is already there.

"Sometimes it is clear that an individual may have difficulty understand-

ing the processes," Perea said.

Once in district court, a state-certified psychiatrist evaluates to determine competency. The evaluator can only take a limited number of these cases at a time.

Perea pointed out three questions that the evaluator seeks to resolve. They are:

- Does the individual have the sufficient present ability to consult with the defendant's lawyer with a reasonable degree of rational understanding?

- Does the individual have a rational and factual understanding of the proceedings against the defendant?

- Does the individual have the capacity to assist in the defendant's defense and comprehend the reasons for punishment?

The case can continue if the defendant is found competent to stand trial. If not, the district court is obliged by state law to dismiss the case.

When it works perfectly, Perea said the process takes about 180 days. It takes longer when the defendant has to be treated back to competency, which is the ultimate goal of a finding of incompetence.

"The judge may ask or order that individual to be transferred to the New Mexico Behavioral Health Institute for further treatment to competency. We do that quite often. I have individuals there today," Perea said.

But competency is a

moving target, Perea said. Some people may move away from a place of competency, while others may get there and then leave once they return to circumstances, such as poverty or abuse, that fuel mental illness.

A person can only be detained for treatment for as long as their sentence would have been: If a person committed a crime with an 18-month sentence, they can only be detained for treatment up to 18 months.

Alternatively, a judge can rule that the defendant is dangerous to the community and therefore should be remanded into treatment.

However, this is a high standard and does not apply to people accused of petty crimes like trespassing and property damage. It is also less stringent than a jury's standard of proof, called "beyond a reasonable doubt."

"We have people that don't understand what's going on. And they're not truly dangerous, but they're committing crimes," Perea said.

For Perea, who's been a chief judge, a police officer and a prosecutor, the breakdown is occurring at the point of evaluation – a reality compounded by pressure from the fentanyl crisis and the lack of mental health infrastructure in New Mexico.

"We have very few evaluators in the state of New Mexico," Perea said.

He added, "If we alone

(judges of the 3rd Judicial District Court) refer, let's say hypothetically 15 to 20, up to 30 a month, can you imagine the rest of the state when there are only a handful of doctors evaluating, and their turnaround has to be quick? ... And we have to hold hearings within a very, very quick timeline because people are in custody."

The second breakdown concerns the state's lone hospital capable of housing people undergoing competency evaluation and treatment.

"They're waiting in custody (typically at a county jail) to be transferred to Las Vegas for treatment to competency. And I think the breakdown is, how long are they going to wait in custody," Perea said. "Then once they get to that facility, they're limited in beds, so the turnaround is quick."

Perea said this leads to a situation where a defendant may wait weeks in jail to go to Las Vegas, is quickly treated there, returns to their community and becomes incompetent again by the time they return to court.

Perea said the fentanyl crisis compounds the lack of infrastructure.

"I think when you add these illicit drugs to our homelessness, and our unhoused population, and those people that begin to abuse, we have exacerbated the problem greatly," Perea said. "I've had individuals that were defendants in my court

cases that were found a block and a half away from (the district courthouse) overdosed on fentanyl. And it's terrible."

It is unclear how many people in the Doña Ana criminal justice system experience this.

Barry Massey, a spokesperson for the state's court coordinating and administrative agency, said there are no data showing how many people undergo competency hearings.

Is changing the law a solution?

The New Mexico Supreme Court organized a commission in 2022 to review the problems with mental health and criminal justice.

The body is called the Commission on Mental Health and Competency, and one of its members is state Sen. Gerald (Jerry) Ortiz y Pino, D-Albuquerque. Ortiz y Pino brought a bill to the 2024 legislative session that, at least on the surface, sought to address the issue.

"(S.B. 16) tries to give judges an alternative to what they have now. ...

They would be able to order people into treatment," Ortiz y Pino said, adding that it would allow judges to divert people found to be incompetent into treatment.

However, Ortiz y Pino told the Bulletin in an interview that the legislation was meant to test the waters, gauging reaction to a bill that gives judges an easier path to strip someone of their freedoms.

"And boy, did it get a reaction," Ortiz y Pino said.

Before the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee, chaired by Ortiz y Pino, multiple people who spoke against the bill lauded its intention and called for a new bill.

"I regret having to stand in opposition to this bill because we very much support the concept and what the sponsor and the proponents are trying to do," Ellen Pinnes of the Disability Coalition said.

“We support treatment in the community, we support diversion in the criminal justice system. But this bill, quite frankly, in its current state, is a mess.”

Pinnes said the bill sought to combine two things that should remain separate: competency and mental illness.

“You can be mentally ill, homeless and unable to adequately care for yourself and still be competent to stand trial,” Pinnes said. “Under this bill, if there’s no issue with your competency to stand trial, you can’t be diverted to treatment.”

Public defenders, defense attorneys and the ACLU of New Mexico praised the bill’s intent but raised technical issues with the bill and its implications.

Marshall Martinez, executive director of LGBTQ-rights organization Equality New Mexico, said the bill also raised questions about bodily autonomy.

“Bodily autonomy is at the crux of the LGBTQ liberation movement, and bodily autonomy is at the crux of this legislation,” Martinez said. “Any time any system seeks to restrict or limit bodily autonomy, we must ensure LGBTQ community members are brought to the table early and collaborated with.”

That didn’t happen in this case, Martinez said, adding that the state should focus on making the mental health systems more robust so that people

can choose to access treatment at their discretion.

Monet Silva, executive director of the New Mexico Coalition to End Homelessness, said the bill would have an outsized impact on the unhoused residents of New Mexico.

“The bill does not address the many issues with current competency determination, lack of trained evaluators, lack of meaningful cognitive testing, etc., or create a competency restoration program,” Silva said. He went on to say that the bill would also burden the jails.

Ultimately, an amended version of the bill passed the committee but did not make it to the full Senate for a vote before the session ended.

Ortiz y Pino said he intends to bring a new bill back in the 2025 legislative session.

But he also acknowledged that the bill can only go so far. He said the law needs to be changed, but there are still not enough programs for people to enter voluntarily and not enough providers to cover the people who would be forced into treatment.

Then comes the cost in dollars.

“It’s going to be expensive to provide treatment to these people,” Ortiz y Pino said. “But this is how we’re going to get a handle on our homeless population. And this is how we wind up spending a lot less on police activity and the need for police protection, because we won’t need them to deal with these folks, and they can deal with real criminals.”

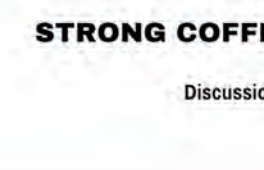

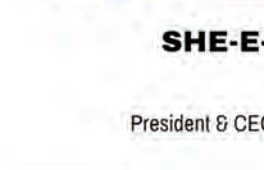

'Discord' hits all the right notes

An American, an Englishman, and a Russian walk into a room. There is no punch line, and despite what the title suggests, "The Gospel According to Thomas Jefferson, Charles Dickens and Count Leo Tolstoy: Discord" is not nearly as ponderous as it sounds.

Instead, Las Cruces Community Theatre's latest staged production is a thoughtful and entertaining look at flawed humanity and its search for redemption through truth. Sounds heavy, and it is, but it also presents a refreshingly original night of compelling theatre with a skill and verve rarely seen on community stages.

Written by Scott Carter, a longtime writer and producer for "Real Time With Bill Maher" (whose name is conspicuously absent from the playbill), "Discord" puts three prominent historical figures together in an afterlife consisting of a locked door, a desk and three chairs. Melissa Muñoz-Chavez exceeds expectations with a set design that is both inspired and otherworldly, making use of a series of parchment scrolls showcasing quotes from not only the men present, but others of like mind. The effect is both arresting and sublime. The same

can be said for the splendid costumes designed by Janet Payne-Cold.

In their titular roles as Jefferson, Dickens and Tolstoy, Jason Wyatt, Aaron Setliff and Christian Nieves, respectively, give triumphant performances, never missing a beat and never letting you see the artifice in their portrayals. For

a full 100 minutes, sans intermission, we are drawn into the conflict between these gentlemen of letters, with a passionate authenticity that is enthralling. Not once do their masks slip, which makes it all the more surprising that this is Setliff's very first acting gig.

Now almost ten years old, "Discord"

also presents a timely vivisection of patriotism and religion, with a large part of the play dedicated to each man presenting his own version of the Bible, written during his own lifetime. Jefferson extols the virtues of reason, while Dickens promotes the "sparkle" of miracles and Tolstoy commends the spirit of individualism. Their discussions run the gamut, from when the Bible was actually written to what Jesus was actually trying to say in his teachings. Each argument has its merits, and its flaws.

Those flaws become the crux of the situation in which these men find themselves. Because it seems that despite all efforts to live lives of exemplary virtue, each is (or was), in his own way, a failure. What this has to say about the uses and abuses of power, by people in a position to make a real difference, is compelling. It's also refreshing in a way that today's media cannot seem to embrace.

In the end, it's up to the audience to decide whether or not the three figures presented did enough in their lifetimes to advance prosperity in the human condition. It's a decision that will haunt you.

Q: With some streaming series getting additional runs on regular TV lately, will Sylvester Stallone's "Tulsa King" also be one of them?

A: As a matter of fact, yes. CBS announced at the end of February that the Paramount+ drama's first season will get a broadcast run this summer (a premiere date hadn't been specified at the time of this writing), and its move to the broadcast network side wasn't necessarily a sure thing before that news was confirmed, since it seemed such deals largely were being made to help fill gaps created by Hollywood-strike-related production shutdowns last year. However, it makes total sense that "Tulsa King" would also get such treatment, for multiple reasons.

First is the outcome CBS had from running past seasons of Paramount Network's "Yellowstone," which proved to be a considerable ratings success. That had been a question mark going in, since no one knew for sure how the Kevin Costner-starring show having already run elsewhere might impact the size of the audience for it on CBS. The gamble paid off, with a sizable number of viewers evidently sampling the saga of the Dutton family for the first time in its broadcast afterlife.

Then, as with Costner in "Yellowstone," there is the star power of Stallone. He is bound to be a considerable draw for CBS, whether or not those tuning in already have watched "Tulsa King" in its original home ... and particularly for those who haven't seen it yet, big curiosity should exist about how Stallone fares in a series role. Having the first season widely available on CBS also should whet appetites for Season 2, which is expected to start production for Paramount+ in the near future.

Businesses for a Safer Las Cruces

As many of you are aware, recently a group, Businesses for a Safer Las Cruces, was created and consists of concerned business owners coming together to work with the Las Cruces Police Department to improve the safety of our community. The Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce is in full support of this group and is asking businesses in Las Cruces to take a few steps to help improve the safety in our city.

ASK #1: A "We Have Your 6" program has been started, a program designed for Las Cruces area businesses to support our local officers. We ask all businesses to place a "We Have Your 6" sticker in their business window. These stickers have been designed by Chad Getz and Vic Villalobos and are printed and sponsored by Getz Funeral Home and Sisbarro Auto Dealerships. The stickers can be picked up at the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce building at 150 E. Lohman Avenue in Las Cruces. If you are unable to come to the Chamber to pick up a sticker, we will gladly have someone bring one to your business.

ASK #2: If your business is willing and able, please add a police officer benefit program, customized to your business. Ideas include designated parking, fee discount to officers and their immediate families, etc. By customizing it to your business, you can do as little or much as you choose. To sign up for this program, please call us at the Chamber (575-524-1968). Your business will be added to a list given to officers. Each officer will receive a "We Have Your 6" card which they will be able to provide you and your staff to prove they are a part of the LCPD's family of officers.

ASK #3: We're asking all businesses to place "No Soliciting" signs in front of their businesses or business complexes. LCPD has informed us that "No Trespassing" signs are not adequate. If "No Soliciting" signs are placed, officers can come on your property and make anyone, homeless included, that are trying to convince your customers to give them money to leave the premises. Like any other ordinance, this is something that cannot be done unless the guidelines are followed.

Specifications for the signs: Signs must be 12" x 18" and have one visible from the road and another visible in the parking lot from the building. Signs should include a statement at the bottom of the sign that states "unless permit granted." With this phrase, groups such as Girl Scouts or Scouts (formally Boy Scouts) can set up stands in front of your business to sell their fundraisers. You would have them fill out a simple form with their information so that if there is a complaint that you were being discriminatory, you can provide proof that they had a permit to be there soliciting.

Chief Story and the Las Cruces Police Department are listening to businesses and are willing to work with us at the Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce as well as the Businesses for a Safer Las Cruces group to improve the safety of our community. These may seem like small steps, but they are steps in the right direction. We will continue to take necessary steps to improve the safety of our community.

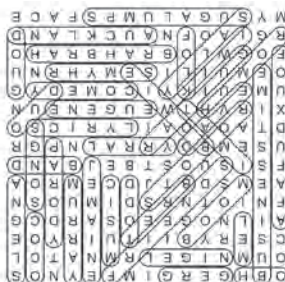

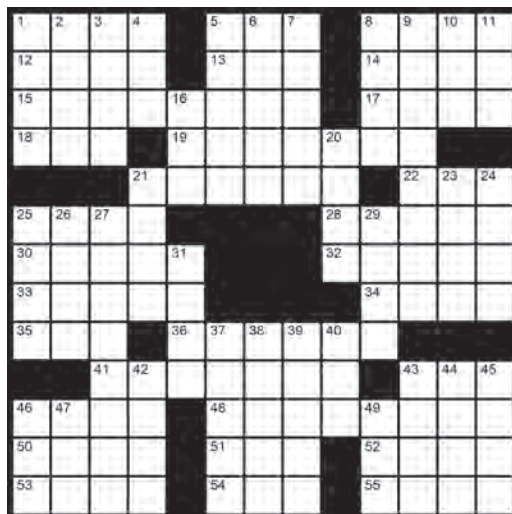

Solar eclipse

Ancient peoples sometimes viewed an eclipse as a celestial being swallowing the moon, possibly a sign of a god's anger: The Egyptians told tales of the serpent Apep, an agent of chaos or evil, consuming the sun god Ra until he was cut open to release the light. For the Vikings, the loss of Sol opened the world-ending conflict of the Norse gods, called Ragnarök.

A total solar eclipse, as we learned in school, occurs when the moon, passing between us and the sun, momentarily blocks out its light. They don't happen very often: The last total solar eclipse was in August 2017 and NASA says the next one is expected in 20 years.

Tens of millions of Americans are expected to watch

the spectacle as it passes over North America on Monday, April 8. If you are planning to view the eclipse,

be sure to wear protective eyewear before and after the totality phase when the sun is completely blocked: If there is a dot of sunlight, you need to wear eclipse glasses or a handheld solar viewer. No regular eyeglasses, no camera or binoculars, no telescope or other devices. NASA recommends solar viewing glasses that meet the ISO 12312-2 standard, and reminds the public that it does not endorse individual products. More information is available online at science.nasa.gov/eclipses/safety.

The visibility of the totality phase is dependent on weather conditions. NASA says Mexico's Pacific coast should experience totality at approximately 11:07 a.m., Pacific time. Although there will be local viewing parties in New Mexico, our state is not in the path of the eclipse, which passes northeast through Texas on its way over Newfoundland, Canada at approximately 5:16 p.m. in Newfoundland time. (That's 1:46 p.m. in New Mexico.)

New film studios could affect housing prices, study shows

It's Friday morning, and outside a Las Cruces home, a film crew calls "action" at a pop-up movie set on a neighborhood street.

Maybe the crew is filming a car chase or a shoot-out for an action movie. Or perhaps a luckless man who's done everything wrong professes his love with a boombox, hoping a grand gesture erases 90 minutes of missed cues and near kisses.

It's a sight Las Cruces could experience more often as officials funnel public funds toward rounding out a budding film industry.

Public investment in 828 Productions – which has been promised over \$6 million in incentives to build out a permanent film studio in Las Cruces and hire 100 people – and the Creative Media Technology building – an \$11.2 million building at New

Mexico State University Arrowhead campus – signal local government's efforts to grow Las Cruces film.

However, the efforts could have unforeseen consequences on the Las Cruces housing market, particularly in neighborhoods abutting film studios.

A 2022 study by Velma Zahirovic-Herbert, a researcher at the University of Memphis, and Karen Gibler, a researcher at Georgia State University, investigated how film studios affected housing prices in Atlanta, Georgia.

In their paper, "The effect of film production studios on housing prices in Atlanta, the Hollywood of the South," published in the academic journal *Urban Studies*, Zahirovic-Herbert and Gibler found that homes near studios tended to sell for higher rates. They also found that those neighborhoods saw more transitions as residents moved away and

new people came in.

"(The Atlanta metro area) has a number of large studios, but it also has smaller ones," Zahirovic-Herbert said in an interview with the Las Cruces Bulletin. "They might have supporting roles, or maybe they did animation."

Zahirovic-Herbert said

all studios increased housing prices, but the larger ones had a greater effect. She also pointed out that many of the Atlanta studios — which typically fit into areas zoned for industrial use — were near neighborhoods targeted for revitalization. She also pointed out that her research depended on rela-

tively new studios studied over a short period.

In Las Cruces, the most significant potential film investment of 828 Productions plans to build a large campus adjacent to the Alameda Depot neighborhood and the neighborhoods adjacent to North Valley Drive and West Picacho Avenue.

George Pearson, Alameda Depot Neighborhood Association, said the association supports the 828 Productions campus moving in.

"We see the benefits of the movie industry in our neighborhood. While not all movie activities are conducted by 828, we know that their presence in Las Cruces attracts and facilitates other production companies to spend money in our neighborhood and Las Cruces," Pearson said. "Personally, I've seen productions happening both across the street and next door to my house."

Steve Montañez, owner and qualifying broker at New Mexico Properties and a Las Cruces Bulletin contributor, said the growing presence of industrial film production is still not something on his radar. Since the studios — particularly 828 — remain unbuilt, Montañez said

A barefoot woman was seen leaving a grey SUV, a voice called out "No!" and was immediately drowned out by multiple gunshots before the car drove off in the direction of Mesilla.

That much was reported by two callers to emergency dispatch Monday evening. Minutes later, at approximately 8:22 p.m., Mesilla marshals found 39-year-old Shiereen Al Jibury unresponsive with multiple gunshot wounds. She did not survive.

At a press briefing Tuesday afternoon, Me-

silla Marshal Sgt. Tress Diaz said the SUV had been located by Doña Ana Sheriff's deputies in Sunland Park and named a person of interest, Oscar Renee Sandoval of Chaparral, 59, who was at large.

Investigators continued to sweep the scene, with University Avenue closed to traffic at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday. A search warrant targeting the car was executed as well.

"We believe currently (the shooting) is an isolated event, as both the victim and suspect are non-residents of the Las Cruces or Mesilla area," Diaz said, reading from a prepared statement where

he displayed a photograph of Sandoval, whom he described both as a "person of interest" and "suspect" during the briefing. "Oscar Renee Sandoval is considered to be armed and dangerous and should not be approached. He was last seen in Sunland Park, New Mexico on private surveillance cameras."

Sheriff Kim Stewart, along with DASO Major Jon Day and Undersheriff Tessa Abeyta, were present for the briefing but did not speak. Mayor Russell Hernandez and Diaz said the investigation was active and ongoing, and therefore no questions would be answered.

Christine Woods, Make-A-Wish Southern Ambassadors chair, works every day to bring a moment of joy into the lives of children in the area who have a critical diagnosis.

The small group of ambassadors in the area raise funds to grant the wishes of local children. At 6 p.m. on Saturday, April 6, they will again be holding their Love at First Wish event, with a theme titled Wish Upon a Star, at the Rio Grande Winery in Las Cruces.

Taylor, Spearman shine at CUSA

Another week led to another set of hardware for NM State Softball. This time around, Jillian Taylor was named Conference USA Player of the Week after a walk-off grand slam highlighted a 4-1 week for the Aggies. Once again, Desirae Spearman won Freshman of the Week honors for the fourth time in what is now her fifth conference award of the season.

As a team, NM State improved to 20-13 overall. The Aggies played two non-conference opponents, starting with a Tuesday doubleheader versus rival University of New Mexico. The home team swiftly defeated UNM in the opener, thanks to a masterful Spearman performance in the circle and an equally impressive performance from Taylor at the plate. Spearman allowed just one unearned run in the first inning, striking out five batters and allowing four hits in the complete game.

Over the course of the five-game week, the senior tallied a .467 batting average, seven hits, two home runs and eight RBIs. Two walks and a HBP increased her OPS to 1.526 on the week. She added a stolen base as part of a 15-total base week, scor-

ing six of the Aggies' 36 runs. On defense, Taylor made multiple impressive plays, and boasted a 1.000 fielding percentage on the week. Her season mark is .979, making just one error all year across 31 starts in center field.

For the week, Spearman was exceptional once again, despite missing the final two games. Spearman pitched the opening game of each series, going the distance in each outing. She allowed 3 runs (2 earned) across 12 innings, for a 1.17 weekly ERA, just over her season average of 0.83. That mark ranks among the top 15 in the nation, and well ahead of her league peers. Spearman is now 6-0 with an ERA nearly half that of any other CUSA pitcher (1.58). She is one of just two pitchers in the league with an ERA of less than

2.00, and holds the only sub-1.00 mark. Despite missing 13 games, she has still finished five complete games this season, averaging 6.0 innings per outing.

The El Paso native is also top-50 in the nation and third in the conference with 9 home runs on the season.

Taylor became the first Aggie to pick up a Player of the Week award from the new conference, completing the collection of all three league awards won by an Aggie this season. Spearman now holds five CUSA awards, including four Freshman of the Week selections. She has won an award every week she has appeared on the field, only missing out in the two weeks she dealt with injury. She will look to continue the trend with three games at Jax State this weekend.

Saluting golfers who served in World War II

Golf and professional golf celebrities have been prominent in America's wars. This is a story about World War II and the pro golfers who actually served their country in uniform.

Let's start with Bobby Jones, known for his single calendar year Grand Slam four wins in 1930. After retiring from golf, he founded the Augusta National Golf Club in 1933, which has held the Masters Tournament since 1934. When the attack on Pearl Harbor occurred on December 7, 1941, Jones was about to turn 40 and thought he might be judged too old to serve. Undeterred, he enlisted in the Army Air

Corps, serving as an intelligence officer, eventually rising to the rank of lieutenant colonel. He and Clifford Roberts shut down Augusta National from 1943 to 1945, using the property to raise cattle and turkeys to support the war effort. Bobby Jones died in 1971.

Another famous pro golfer, Ben Hogan, who was in his 30s and in the prime of his career, was drafted into the U.S. Army Air Forces, where he served as a physical trainer, and later moved up to flight instructor at the rank of lieutenant. Hogan won the Masters in

1951 and 1953.

Two golfers who famously defeated Hogan also served during World War II. Jack Fleck, who beat Hogan in 1955 to win the U.S. Open, served as quartermaster in the Navy and was part of the D-Day invasion at Normandy. Herman Keiser, who won an upset victory over Hogan in the 1946 Masters, served in the Navy aboard the cruiser USS Cincinnati.

PGA tour player Ed Oliver also served in the Army during the war. Oliver finished 2nd behind Hogan in the 1953 masters and was a three-time

member of the Ryder Cup team.

Sam Snead gained approval to delay his entry into the U.S. Navy by a week so he could play in the 1942 PGA Championship, which he won. After that, he served as an athletic specialist for the Navy in San Diego until being medically discharged due to a back injury in 1944. Snead won three Masters Tournaments and is now tied with Tiger Woods at 82 total PGA tour wins.

My favorite true story about pro golfers serving in World War II is about Lloyd Mangrum. Serving in a dangerous forward reconnaissance group of the 9th Division of

General Patton's Third Army, Mangrum landed on Omaha Beach a day or two after the initial D-Day invasion. During the Third Army's breakout from hedgerow country, Mangrum's jeep flipped over, resulting in a broken arm in two places. He was sent back to England to heal, then was sent back to Patton's army to fight in the Battle of the Bulge, which began shortly before Christmas 1944. During a recon mission, he was hit by shrapnel in the knee and chin. An inch in any direction would have proved fatal. Mangrum recovered in a field hospital and was back in action when the war was in its final days in Czechoslo-

vakia. Of his original platoon, he and one other GI were the only ones to survive the war. Mangrum was awarded two Silver Stars, two Bronze Stars and two Purple Hearts.

Despite a prognosis that he would never be able to swing a club again due to his injuries, Mangrum was in the hunt at the 1946 U.S. Open in Cleveland. After tying Byron Nelson and Vic Ghezzi in regulation, the three headed to a 3-hole playoff. They were still tied after 107 holes, when Mangrum drilled a putt to win the Open. Years later, Nelson recalled: "Lloyd's the best player who has been forgotten since I've been playing golf."
