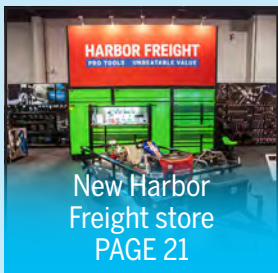

Search for next county manager gets underway

The Doña Ana County Board of County Commissioners took a step toward filling the soon-to-be vacant county manager position this week.

As part of a seven-hour meeting on April 9, the board accepted a presentation from a search firm hired in February to find candidates for a new county manager.

The board voted in December to end Fernando Macias' contract one year early, after Macias and the board failed to agree on terms to evaluate his performance. The board wanted to allow other elected officials, such as the sheriff and county clerk, to give input about Macias' performance. He did not.

The county manager is the sole employee managed by the elected commissioners.

In February, the board hired Robert E. Slavin Inc. to launch

a national search for Macias' successor. The board suggested it would pay Slavin about \$25,000 at the meeting. Board chair Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez told the Bulletin that lots had been happening in the week leading up to Tuesday's meeting.

"I know that it feels like we're

a little behind the ball on this, but to be honest... we've been working diligently to have these in-person meetings with Slavin. I thought that they were so important," Schaljo-Hernandez said.

Schaljo-Hernandez said the Slavin Firm spent March meeting with the board members, assistant

county managers, elected officials and others. Slavin was developing a job profile, which was presented to the board on Tuesday.

Next, Schaljo-Hernandez said the board expects Slavin to have the job description and posting up before mid-April. The posting will remain open for 30 days. After that, Slavin will weed out candidates who don't meet the basic qualifications. Then they'll present the board with the first candidate list before the end of May.

Schaljo-Hernandez said he expects the board will interview candidates in June.

With Macias' contract expiring on April 30, the board will also have to appoint an interim county manager. Schaljo-Hernandez said that was being handled by another consulting firm, Incite Network. Schaljo-Hernandez said the firm would supply the board with a list of interim candidates by the end of April.

Mobile Home Owners

Las Cruces assures residents water is safe

Recent public attention to problems with municipal water supplied by the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority in southern Doña Ana County prompted the city of Las Cruces to issue a notice assuring city residents the city's water supply is safe and in compliance with state and federal protocols.

CRRUA, which supplies water for customers in Sunland Park and Santa Teresa, has come under scrutiny for water safety failures since November, when water supplied to about 1,000 households showed unsafe pH levels, followed by delayed "do not drink" emergency order. Since then, regulators have identified dozens of management failures and safety concerns including issues with arsenic treatment facilities that have allowed "high levels of arsenic" on occasion. A surprise arsenic test last month by the state Environment Department found excessive arsenic levels in water from an industrial area of Santa Teresa, where people work and consume water.

"...there is a misperception that Las Cruces and Sunland Park share the same water and arsenic exists in our drinking water," Las Cruces Utilities stated in a news release. "This is not the case, as Las Cruces pumps from the Mesilla and Jornada del Muerto bolsons (aquifers)."

Although Sunland Park supplies some of its water from the Mesilla bolson as well, the city continued, "pumping regimes and water quality are very different further south, and toward the bottom of the bolson."

Las Cruces' water system is "strictly a groundwater system," the city explained, adding that it does not use surface water or blend its supply with other sources, as might be the case in other municipalities.

The city also pointed to regulatory requirements under state and federal law, under which the water quality is monitored with strict reporting requirements if contaminants exceed levels deemed safe by the Environmental Protection Agency and the New Mexico Environment Department.

"...if any contaminant in drinking water exceeds its maximum contaminant level, which is a federal- and state-mandated level, Las Cruces Utilities Department, as a water provider, must report the exceedance to our customers and users. This would require official paperwork and notification that would result in further violations and fines if we fail to report."

The city publishes an annual Consumer Confidence Report on its LasCruces.gov web site, a requirement of the Safe Drinking Water Act, which details how the city sources its water, what's in

it and its compliance with safety standards.

Contaminants are typically found in drinking water but are subject to specific limits for each contaminant. Low levels of arsenic are commonly present. As the most recent report states: "EPA's standard balances the current understanding of arsenic's possible health effects against the costs of removing arsenic from drinking water. EPA continues to research the health effects of low levels of arsenic which is a mineral known to cause cancer in humans at high concentrations and is linked to other health effects such as skin damage and circulatory problems."

The city stated: "Las Cruces' water quality is well below the maximum level for arsenic. Therefore, we do not have anything to report to our customers nor are we facing violations or fines from the NMED and EPA."

Las Cruces in Santa Fe: Lobbyist talks 2024 legislative session

A lobbyist who advocates for the city of Las Cruces discussed trends and a slew of changes coming down from Santa Fe after the 2024 legislative session. Those items include new gun control laws, money for brick-and-mortar projects, changes to economic development tools and a phase-out of a tax fee.

Larry Horan, a lobbyist employed by the city of Las Cruces, said this session actually saw fewer bills than others. During a work session, Horan presented updates about relevant legislation to the Las Cruces City Council on Apr. 8.

Horan noted that the 2024 session was a “short

session,” or 30-day session. In even-numbered years, the state legislature meets for 30 days. The main goal of the shorter sessions is to pass a budget. The legislature can also discuss, debate and pass bills that pertain to topics deemed germane or called for by the governor.

They meet for 60 days in odd-numbered years. Sixty-day sessions are more flexible regarding what bills the legislature can entertain.

From Jan. 16 to Feb. 15, legislators brought forth 658 bills.

“It sounds like a lot,” Horan said, “but when you factor in the \$3.5 billion in excess revenue and include bills called dummy bills that are really placeholder

ers, that’s not a significant amount of legislation.”

Horan said a robust 30-day session sees about 1,200 bills. Horan and the city of Las Cruces tracked 91 of those bills as significant to Las Cruces.

Horan also noted the rev-

enue forecast. For the first time in New Mexico’s history, oil and gas revenues made up over half of the state’s income this year. That boom was due largely to drilling and extraction in the Permian Basin.

Drilling and extraction are significant drivers of state revenue. It’s also a source of air and water pollution. According to a 2017 white paper published by the University of New Mexico’s Department of Economics, 638 premature deaths resulted from Permian Basin pollutants.

“With a lot of relatively new legislators, the balance is, how do you sock away \$3.5 billion and have a budget that is responsible and acknowledging that, with a dependence on oil, we’re going to have another downturn,” Horan said.

Horan also mentioned a tax reform package. It’s a watered-down version of a package that passed the legislature last year but was vetoed by the governor, Horan said. The new bill included changes

to corporate income tax rates.

House Bill 2, which contains the state’s budget, also sent millions for issues important to Las Cruces, Horan said. Those include:

- \$25 million for Fire-fighter and EMS recruitment
- \$25 million for local law enforcement agencies
- \$50 million for water project fund
- \$50 million for water trust fund
- \$60.7 million for deficit in employee group benefits plan

Capital outlay is another primary source of money for Las Cruces. Each legislator is given a pool of cash to dole out to brick-and-mortar projects, typically in their districts. The amount of money depends on seniority.

Barbara Bencomo, Las Cruces’ chief administrative officer, said Las Cruces courts capital outlay by aligning projects the city wants funded with the types of things legislators wish to fund. This year, Bencomo said the city received about \$11.75 million. That breaks down as follows:

- \$5.98 million for Amador Crossing Health Center
- \$2.55 million for the Mobile Integrated Health Building
- \$1.15 million for Mesilla Valley Community of Hope Distribution Center
- \$650,000 for a Real-Time Crime Center
- \$580,000 for domestic violence shelter

• \$350,000 for active transportation improvements (i.e., bike lanes and walking paths)

- \$300,000 for the East Mesa Public Recreation Center
- \$100,000 for Fire Station 9
- \$100,000 for Lift Up Las Cruces

“The amount is similar to what was received last year, but it’s more concentrated on fewer projects,” Bencomo said. In many ways... that’s more advantageous because it really allows us to complete these projects and get piecemeal funding.”

Bencomo also said several previously funded projects had been renewed since the money had gone unspent.

But gun control talk took up a lot of legislative time. Several proposals were made, but just two bills made it to the finish line. The legislature passed a 7-day waiting period to buy a gun and a law that prohibits guns at polling places.

Another bill that received a lot of press was another failed attempt to create paid family leave for New Mexico workers. Like the federally mandated Family Medical Leave Act, the state law would guarantee time off for qualifying reasons. That time off is separate from paid vacation or sick time.

This is the second time a paid family bill has gone to the legislature and

Police seek information in Jose Antonio Juarez killing, offer reward

The Las Cruces Police Department asked the public for assistance finding a person of interest in an unsolved murder as Crime Stoppers of Las Cruces-Doña Ana County offered a \$1,000 reward for information.

Jose "Joey" Antonio Juarez III, 29, was fatally shot on February 15 at a home on the 900 block of Graham Street. Police said that Juarez's companion, a 34-year-old man,

got into an altercation with the person of interest. Police have not said what may have motivated the incident.

"During the altercation, at least one round was discharged, striking Juarez, who succumbed to his injuries on scene," police said in a news release.

The person of interest, who arrived in a vehicle, fled on foot.

"Since they arrived at the home together, it's presumed that Juarez and the person of interest

were friends," police said.

Police asked anyone with information to call Crime Stoppers of Las Cruces-Doña Ana County. Tipsters can provide Crime Stoppers information anonymously. Anyone with information that can help in this case is asked to call Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477.

Tips can also be provided through the Las Cruces Crime Stoppers app, "P3 TIPS." The app is available through the App Store on most devices.

failed. The first time, it failed to pass by one vote in committee, and the second time, it failed by two votes in a House vote.

Horan also discussed a bill that would've amended how New Mexico courts handle people accused of crimes but found incompetent to stand trial. Civil rights advocates criticized the bill for not being thor-

oughly prepared. The same groups said the bill's goals were critical, and they hoped to see a better version presented to the legislature in future sessions.

"It's going to be back, we know that for sure," Horan said. "It may be back in the 60-day session, or it could be sooner."

During an interview on New Mexico PBS, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham floated the idea of calling for a special session over

the summer. She said the special session would deal with crime and public safety issues across the state. That might be the venue from which competency reform occurs.

"The governor said it's about an 80 percent possibility for calling a special session. The legislators, I don't think, are as inclined to go to a special session this year. The reason being is that they're all up for reelection this year," Horan said.

Oscar Sandoval charged in Mesilla homicide

Mesilla Marshals continue to investigate an April 1 homicide near the edge of town, where a woman was killed. Her husband, Oscar Renee Sandoval, has been charged with first-degree murder and remains at large.

It has been a few years since the town has seen a homicide, and at a Saturday morning press conference Mayor Russell Hernandez affirmed that town marshals were leading the investigation with the support of Doña Ana Sheriff's detective Eddie Flores, who is temporarily assigned to the town's law

enforcement agency.

Marshals provided a few new details about the investigation and appealed for tips as to the whereabouts of Sandoval, 57, accused of killing 39-year-old Sheireen Al Jibury, identified in charging documents as his spouse.

Marshals responded to an eyewitness report of a woman being shot on University Avenue and Stanford Street the night of April 1, arriving at about 8:22 p.m. Al Jibury was found unresponsive and, according to court filings, died at the scene despite attempts to revive her.

Details of her injuries, including how many gunshot wounds she sustained, have not been avail-

able pending an autopsy report.

The eyewitness who was driving nearby reported seeing the Ford stop in the westbound lane of Uni-

versity Avenue when Al Jibury left the vehicle and ran toward the witness, saying, "I've been shot."

The witness then observed a man, whom she later identified from a photo lineup as Sandoval, emerge from the car, chase the victim and fire four shots at her with a handgun, striking her at least once. The witness then drove her own car away from the gunman in reverse and called 911. The gunman, meanwhile, drove away from the scene heading west toward town, at which point the witness began to render first aid to the victim, according to charging documents.

On Saturday, acting Sgt. and public information officer Lourdes Hernandez said a Ford Explorer belonging to Sandoval, located in Sunland Park by sheriff's deputies, was still being processed and that a bullet hole on the passenger side of the vehicle had been discovered.

Court filings state that the vehicle was found on local camera footage heading south on Avenida de Mesilla minutes later. The license plate number confirmed that Sandoval is the registered owner.

Meanwhile, the couple's adult children had contacted police early in the morning on April 2, concerned after not hearing from either of their parents.

Per the court document, family members used cell phone data to locate the vehicle parked on a residential street in Sunland Park on April 2, and neighborhood security cameras captured footage of a man identified as Sandoval leaving the vehicle wearing shorts and a dark-colored hoodie sweatshirt and walking away.

The car was towed to Mesilla for a court-authorized search which, according to the court filing, uncovered the bullet hole, minus a bullet; a 9mm casing on the passenger-side front floor mat matching casings found on University Avenue; an unspent bullet sitting in a console cup holder; and a wallet containing Sandoval's driver's license and credit cards. Earlier described as a Chaparral resident, it appears Sandoval had a Texas license and an address in El Paso. The complaint states he is 57, not 59 as initially reported.

Sgt. Hernandez said marshals continued to search the crime scene for evidence on April 4 and 5,

and located a spent bullet on the ground that was collected and sent for forensic examination in Santa Fe.

Asked why the walk-through was conducted several days after the murder, Sgt. Hernandez said, "This is a normal procedure and has been going on since day one, and will continue."

No information about Sandoval's whereabouts was disclosed, if known. Sgt. Hernandez said the department welcomed any information about the suspect, now a defendant, and invited tips to be addressed to crime scene investigator Danny Garcia at 575-526-4138 or by email at dannyg@mesillanm.gov.

Mayor Hernandez confirmed that marshals were the lead agency for the investigation, and despite the comparative rarity of homicide investigations for Mesilla, he said Garcia "has several, several years of experience is very qualified."

Per an affidavit filed in court, Garcia has previously worked for the Las Cruces Police Department, Drug Enforcement Administration, the El Paso Sheriff's Office and El Paso Intelligence Center over a 45-year law enforcement career.

The mayor continued, "Our department as well as other supporting departments have been handling this case very tightly very closely, and ensuring that everything is secure and our community is completely secure."

Details emerge in Lester Avenue shooting that left 24-year-old dead

A Las Cruces man faces murder charges after police said he shot and killed a man on April 3.

Bernardo Hernandez Jr., 22, was charged with first-degree murder and tampering with evidence. Police said he fatally shot Elijah Daniel Venegas, 24, following an altercation. Hernandez has also been charged with tampering with evidence.

The shooting occurred at the 2100 block of Lester Avenue just south of Lynn Middle School. Police believe that the two men fought, first verbally and then physically, before escalating the incident into a deadly shooting. Hernandez confessed to the killing, saying he feared he would be shot if he didn't shoot first.

According to a news release from the city of Las Cruces,

police believe that Venegas and Hernandez had a verbal argument that turned physical after Venegas' girlfriend called Hernandez around 6 a.m. on April 3. According to a statement the girlfriend provided to police, she called Hernandez for a ride.

A statement of facts filed in district court said that Hernandez and the girlfriend began to argue upon his arrival. Venegas then began to argue with Hernandez. The altercation escalated into a fistfight as Venegas climbed into the back seat of Hernandez's SUV.

The girlfriend said she then got Venegas out of the SUV and was trying to calm him down. Meanwhile, Hernandez moved to the back of his SUV and pulled out a handgun.

The girlfriend told police Hernandez began firing at Venegas. Another witness told police

Hernandez fired twice, missing Venegas. Venegas then ran down the street as Hernandez continued firing. This time, he was struck in the head.

The girlfriend then watched as Hernandez fumbled around his SUV for his keys. He couldn't find them, she said, leading him to take off into the area's neighborhood. At one point, he passed onto the Lynn Middle School grounds where police recovered

the firearm, a Taurus 9mm handgun, in a fanny pack alongside Hernandez' jacket.

Hernandez admitted to shooting Venegas and ditching the gun, according to court records. But he told police he feared Venegas would shoot him first. Hernandez said Venegas often carried pistols. And, during the fight in the SUV, Hernandez said he saw Venegas reaching for his waist. He told police that a camera located in the SUV likely recorded part of the incident.

No court records indicated that police recovered any weapons that might've been on Venegas' person during the altercation.

The search and subsequent investigation led Lynn Middle School to lockdown on April 3.

Hernandez is awaiting a hearing in the Doña Ana County

Detention Center. He's currently held without bond. A spokesperson with the 3rd Judicial District Attorney's office told the Las Cruces Bulletin that the office would pursue pretrial detention.

New Mexico has no cash bail. Instead, prosecutors must argue that a defendant is dangerous and that no conditions of release – such as a surety bond or ankle monitor – could ensure the public's safety. Defendants charged with first degree murder are often held with bond by the 3rd Judicial District Court.

A pretrial detention hearing has not been scheduled since this article's publication online and Hernandez did not appear to have legal representation yet. Hernandez was due to appear for a first appearance in the Doña Ana County Magistrate Court on April 4.

Jardin de los Niños, Blue Cross partner on child services

The nonprofit Jardin de los Niños was awarded a \$25,000 grant from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of New Mexico to provide child care and therapeutic early intervention services to children without housing or suffering abuse.

Founded in 1995, Jardin operates a designated trauma-informed care center and provides early childhood education, therapeutic intervention and comprehensive services to children who are homeless or close to it, from the ages of six weeks to 10 years as

well as their families.

The grant comes through BCBS-NM's Blue Impact initiative, which awards grants between \$20,000 and \$100,000 to New Mexico nonprofits

working in certain focus areas addressing social determinants of health, per its website.

Janice Torrez, president of BCBS-NM, said Jardin de los Niños "is making a significant difference in the lives of those children and their families experiencing homelessness and near-homelessness," in a news release.

Jardin's CEO, Michelle Adames, said, "The Blue Impact grant provides Jardin de los Niños with support to address poverty and the wellbeing of infants and toddlers," in a written statement.

At film festival, art of conversation makes a cameo

During the Las Cruces International Film Festival, I missed out on shaking Ron Perlman's hand because I was carried away in conversation.

It is rare to encounter a capable conversationalist, much less an inspired one, in our age. The art requires a love of language, skills in observation and etiquette, plus a soupçon of knowledge of many topics.

At the Double Eagle, during a luncheon for guests and sponsors of the festival, I found myself seated with people

I had never met, except for a fellow Bulletin staff member: A business owner, a financial consultant who was also an entrepreneur and a television writer and producer visiting from Los Angeles.

What might have been an awkward hour of polite murmurs between courses of food was, instead, a relaxed and lively pro-time where everyone at the table contributed sto-

ries, compared differing opinions, laughed often and questioned one other at just the right intensity for the occasion.

Good conversation is a collaboration, and we all took part; but we were assisted greatly by Don Foster.

Initially he shared only that he grew up in Alamogordo, graduated from NMSU and now lived in L.A. as a producer, writer and creative consultant. (He wrote epi-

sodes of "Roseanne," was a producer on "Dharma and Greg" and "Two and a Half Men," and an executive consultant for four seasons of "The Big Bang Theory," a show that coincidentally has been streamed nightly in my home since my teenage son discovered it.)

With curiosity, wit and generosity, Foster kept the table talking, seeing to it that each one of us had an opportunity to talk about something of interest and contribute to the conversation without overtly moderating us.

Foster is a local entertainment industry success story, for sure. He is also the kind of person you want at your dinner party, and certainly who you want to land at your table in a crowded luncheon with people you don't know.

No Labels, no candidate, no chance

Everybody wants to start at the top.

And so, of course the deep-pocketed investors behind the attempt to build a centrist third party under the No Labels banner started with a presidential election. And not just any presidential election, but one in which the Republican nominee is a former president who is facing 88 felony indictments in four separate cases and is vowing vengeance if he wins.

Democratic voters with sour memories of Ralph Nader and Jill Stein still haunting them greeted the No Labels effort with fear and hostility. That made it impossible to re-

cruit a candidate, despite the tens of millions of dollars raised in undisclosed campaign donations. And so, last week the group announced that it was giving up.

The last time a third-party candidate claimed any electoral votes was in 1968 when the Democratic Party in the south was still breaking away from its racist past, and George Wallace won five southern states.

The closest thing we have to a viable third party now is either the Green Party or the Libertarians, and they both

cater to the extremes. There's nothing for centrists who no longer feel well represented by either party.

Nothing, except the disorganized status of being an independent, and those ranks are growing. A recent Gallup poll showed that 49 percent of voters now identify as independent, giving them numbers that dwarf both the Republican and Democratic parties.

New Mexico does all it can to discourage voters from leaving the parties. We have closed primaries, where only registered Re-

publicans and Democrats can vote. The winner gets an automatic spot on the ballot. The path for any candidate not affiliated with one of the two major parties is much more difficult and expensive.

And so, it's not surprising that we have a smaller percentage of independent voters than the national average. But the number has increased from 5 percent in 1990 to 23 percent now.

I was registered as an independent throughout most of my career in journalism. I switched several years ago to vote in the Democratic primary, and am too lazy to switch back and forth for

every election. So, my official registration doesn't really reflect how I feel.

The registration data clearly show that independent voters represent the greatest potential political force in the nation. But realizing that potential will require a level of organization and coordination that starts at the grassroots level, with candidates for city council, county commission and school board.

And, it will require a passion for compromise. That's a tough sale, especially when Republicans and Democrats are making campaign promises

Parents, students have opportunity to help choose graduation requirements

With the governor's signing of a new law updating the state's high school curriculum, New Mexico families now have a prime opportunity to shape local high school course requirements in a way that will reflect your community's values while ensuring that your graduates are college- and career-ready.

While high school students still must complete 24 credits to graduate, two of those credits will now be determined locally in each district.

Think New Mexico, a nonpartisan, results-oriented think tank, has researched courses that would be engaging and provide students with relevant, lifelong skills, as we

detailed in our report, "A Roadmap for Rethinking Public Education in New Mexico." We encourage parents and students to reach out to school board members and urge them to select two local course requirements that will provide a well-rounded school experience. We hope that you might advocate for some of the following options:

- Financial literacy is currently an elective, but only about 11 percent of students take this class despite 100 percent of them needing it, especially in a state that ranks 49th in financial literacy. Currently, 25 states covering 53 percent of students nationwide require students to complete a standalone financial literacy course. A 2022 poll of 751 likely New Mexico voters found

that 84 percent believe it is very important for students to learn personal finance in high school.

- Career and technical education can benefit all students. They can explore their interests and talents and learn lifelong skills from courses such as journalism, healthcare, teaching or culinary arts. Internships and work-based learning also offer hands-on experience that keeps school relevant and engaging.

- A language other than English, because multilingualism can positively affect memory, problem solving and critical thinking skills. Studies show that second language learners perform better across a range of academic subjects than students who don't study a second language.

- Computer science skills are increasingly essential in most careers. According to Education Week, in 2023 U.S. schools expanded foundational computer science classes at the fastest rate in the last five years. Currently, Hispanic students are 1.4 times less likely than white and Asian peers to enroll in computer science, while female participation in computer science nationally has been stuck at around 31 percent.

- Health: Currently, one semester of health education is required, but adding another semester would provide students with more in-depth knowledge of how to lead healthy lives. Virtually all leading causes of premature death are rooted in unhealthy behaviors

that are largely preventable. New Mexico's youth obesity rate (23.9 percent) significantly exceeds the national rate (17 percent) and our overall suicide rate ranked fourth in the nation in 2021.

- Art helps students explore their creative capabilities while building social-emotional and communication skills, critical thinking and problem-solving skills, as well as resilience and a growth mindset. A National Endowment for the Arts analysis found that students highly involved in arts had more positive outcomes in graduation rates and civic participation.

- Career planning: Students need guidance as they transition to high school and begin thinking about their path forward.

With often limited access to counselors, freshmen could benefit from a class to help with career exploration as well as teach them soft skills like time management. While the American School Counselor Association recommends a counselor-to-student ratio of 1:250, New Mexico's ratio in the 2022-2023 school year was 1:448.

that tell the voters whatever they want to hear.

Maybe it's a pipe dream. Our system is set up to have two competing points

of view. And, while they will argue about everything else, both parties are united in defending that system.

Breaking that grip of power will be slow and hard. It won't come in the flash of a presidential

election. It will require a movement.

There is no foundation for any third-party candidate to win this year, regardless of how unpopular the major-party nominees are. The only role they can play is

spoiler.

It's tough to inspire a movement behind a spoiler.

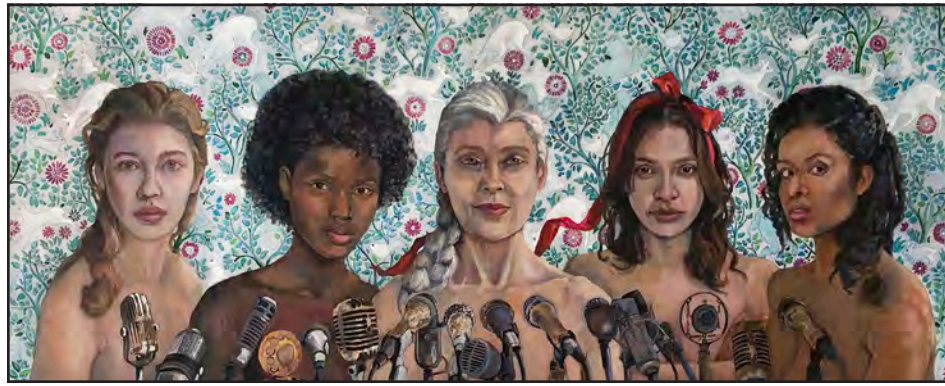

Fest's opening film addresses suicide

Sheridan O'Donnell once did a road trip with his younger brother from Las Cruces to Los Angeles and then up the Pacific coast. "On a trip that long you get to the bottom of everything," he recalled.

His film "Little Brother" opened the 2024 Las Cruces International Film Festival on Wednesday, April 3, screening four times in that night, one overlapping the other, with some cast and crew members on hand to answer questions from the audience following the movie showings.

O'Donnell is writer, director and producer of the film and talked about the process of creating an effective, human movie.

"The film was inspired by personal experiences," he said. "When I was 24, one of my very good friends died by suicide. A couple of years later I had an immediate family member attempt suicide and diagnosed bipolar. So (the film) was a dedication to them and trying to understand their point of view

on things."

O'Donnell felt like he had never seen a movie that explored where that suicidal ideation lives and the things people struggle with when contemplating taking their lives.

The film, which took about five years to create and complete, focuses on Jake and Pete, brothers who embark on a road trip together from Albuquerque to Seattle. Jake is tasked by his father with driving Pete, who recently discharged himself from a facility where he was recovering after a suicide attempt.

"Research-wise, it was a lot of speaking to my family member," he said. "I also spoke to psychiatrists, psychologists, medical consultants – the whole aim of the film is to do it as authentically as possible."

Mental health is a topic not often taken up in mainstream filmmaking, in part because, particularly in America, "people don't want to think about death," O'Donnell said.

"We don't want to think about the darker side of things," he continued. "The goal for me was to try to make a film that just

showed the human aspect of it (suicide) – the family aspect of it."

Philip Ettinger who played the part of Pete, the older brother who attempted suicide, said when he read the script it felt like a story that had to be told. He had never been in a movie with family members or two people talking around this topic without having judgement.

People don't want to approach the topic of the movie because, he said, vulnerability is really scary and people are afraid to be vulnerable.

"It's such a beautiful thing that I get to do to be a part of something to reclaim something like pain and make something out of it," he said. "I have been touched in some way by mental illness. I always wanted to get on board with something that feels deeply rife with purpose and meaning that I can put something into the collective energy to make us all feel less alone."

"Human life is difficult and beautiful," Ettinger continued. "I find it so lucky to be able to use my own feelings to create something as truthful as I can be so that you guys can watch it and I can feel less alone."

The actor said making "Little Brother" was akin to catharsis.

"It's so physically and mentally exhausting," he said. "It (making the film) has to be a safe environment. We have to be a tight knit crew and (the man) who shot the movie held the camera the whole time and was right there. I felt like it was such

a safe space to go deep and go into those scary places."

O'Donnell said he was in tears writing, shooting and editing the film, and that was why he did not watch the movie as it screened.

"My emotional preparation was just childhood," he said. "I didn't even think about it, but as somebody who has struggled with my own mental health, cinema and movies have made me feel seen and think about who I am and how I fit into this world."

He said he hopes people come away from the film feeling it isn't a movie about mental health but simply about people.

"I think a lot of times people kind of get it (the perception of mental illness) wrong and sensationalize it," O'Donnell said. "I definitely wanted to do something that was different than that."

Rio Grande plays main character in film fest screenings

“Drought has plagued me,” said the Rio Grande.

These were just four of the words spoken by the character of the river during the short film, “Echoes of the Rio,” which screened during the ninth annual Las Cruces International Film Festival last week.

The Rio Grande was the topic of several films over the five-day festival, including both documentary and narrative storytelling.

“Echoes of the Rio” was written, directed and produced by El Paso filmmaker Jackie Barragan. She invoked images and visuals of her Indigenous and Mexican ancestors throughout the nearly eight-minute film, while the river spoke of its maj-

esty in the past and the degradation of today.

“I am called to tell stories that tend to lay in the shadows of society, stories that are honest and inspiring while being rooted in the multi-dimensional human experience,” Barragan said in an online director’s statement. “My intention is to create space to reveal the complicated realities that expand beyond the realm of the media and conventional, biased filmmaking that often takes place in border storytelling.”

Sounds and images of water running through the riverbed, children playing in the water and people collecting the water overlaid images of the dry riverbed of today for a majority of months out of the year in the borderland.

The film ended the weekend

winning best local short.

New England filmmaker Mary Patierno also chose to focus on the Rio Grande in her documentary film, “Requiem for a River.” The film spot-

lighted people with knowledge of water distribution and experience living or working by the river to tell its story.

She acknowledged that it was “a little strange for (her)

to be so enthralled with the Rio Grande,” but she lived in Albuquerque part-time from 2016 until the Covid-19 pandemic. She said she “fell in love” with the “magic” of the river during her time in the state.

Patierno explained that she was initially going to make the film about the entire Rio Grande, stretching from Colorado to Texas and south. However, she said the “topic was way too sprawling” and decided to focus on the New Mexico portion.

“Largely because I think the New Mexico stretch of the river is the most interesting,” she said, noting that the Indigenous cultural influence on the approach to the river and the acequia system in the state are

Q: Someone told me that Ryan Gosling was a child star on television. Is that true?

A: It is, though he ultimately limited his home-screen career so that he would be considered for dramatic roles in movies, which he feared his TV fame was interfering with. He tried out for a mid-1990s version of "The Mickey Mouse Club" and landed the job, being cast along with Justin Timberlake (who reportedly became a good friend of his at the time), Britney Spears and Christina Aguilera. He relocated from his native Canada to Orlando, Fla., for that two-year gig.

After that ended, Gosling went back to Canada and found work on such shows as "Are You Afraid of the Dark?" and "Goosebumps," and he had a leading role in the comedy-drama series "Breaker High." He then went to New Zealand for the title part in the show "Young Hercules," which was the project that made him decide to pursue a different direction with his career, largely since he wanted to play a variety of roles. Gosling's agent parted ways with him, but the actor still secured parts in such movies as "Remember the Titans" (2000), "The Believer" (2001), "Murder by Numbers" (2002) and "The United States of Leland" (2003). He really cemented his place as a film star with the 2004 hit "The Notebook," which teamed him with Rachel McAdams (with whom he had a personal relationship after the filming). After that, Gosling continued to focus on feature films almost exclusively. Somewhat ironically, his next one is a reboot of a TV series, "The Fall Guy"; it's slated to be in theaters in early May.

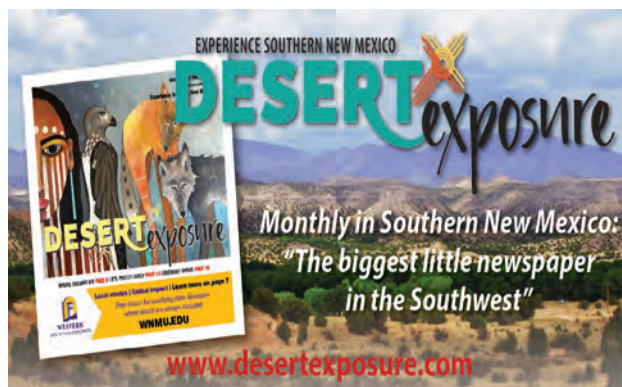

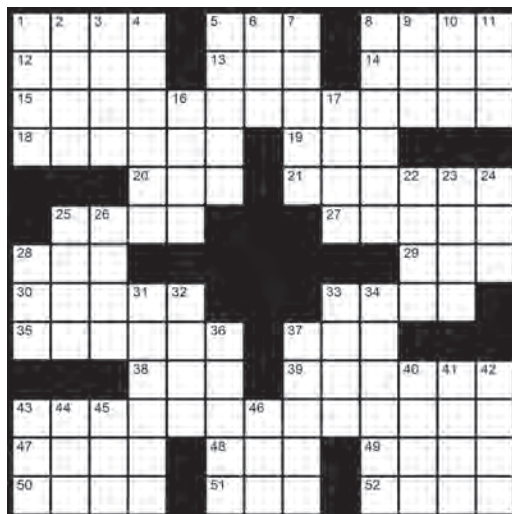

Artist Bob Diven brings to life 'John Singer Sargent: Painting Madame X'

A Still Small Voice, in partnership with

the Doña Ana Arts Council, brings a performance of artist Bob Diven's original one-man show "John Singer Sargent: Painting Madame X" on April 19. Sargent's Portrait of Madame X hangs in the Metropolitan Museum in New York City and was recently featured on the cover of Artists Magazine as one of the top 10 portraits of all time.

Sargent, a child of expatriate Americans, was a rising young star of the Parisian art world at the age of 27 when he began the painting that would become the center of a scandal at the annual Salon of 1884. Deeply wounded by the criticism, he moved to London at the urging of Henry James. Sargent went on to become the most famous portrait painter of his time, and the once scandalous "Portrait of Madame X" became, in the end, his most famous and enduring image.

Several years ago, Bob Diven, with the help of playwright Mark Medoff, created a dramatic portrayal of the January evening in 1916 when (an older) John Sargent decides to sell this portrait he kept from public view for over 20 years.

Written and performed by Diven this is a densely-packed 40 minutes of theater in which Sargent reveals the little-known story of his "Portrait of Madame X". Immediately followed by a discussion (led by the performer/playwright) the entire program lasts one hour.

The show is 6-7:15 p.m., doors open at 5:30 p.m. The Doña Ana Arts Council, 230 S. Water St. Las Cruces. Ticket Prices: \$25 non-member, \$20 member. We have limited seating. 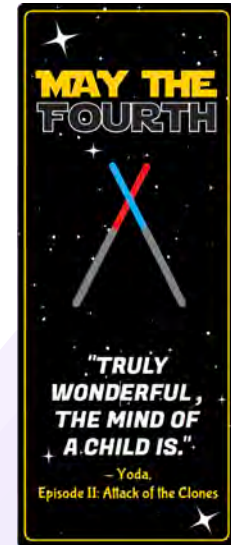

ALMANAC

April 15 isn't all bad

Readers of day books and almanacs can appreciate that any particular day marks harrowing historical events, birthdays of noxious people and death anniversaries of beloved figures. Michael Farquhar even wrote a book for National Geographic in 2015, "Bad Days in History," that recounts "misfortune, mayhem, and misery for every day of the year."

In the United States it is popular to hate April 15, commonly understood as the deadline for filing income taxes, but that's low on the list of horrors associated with the day, Farquhar writes:

"What's done is done on this truly dreadful day: Abraham Lincoln succumbed to the wounds inflicted by his

assassin in 1865; the Titanic sank in 1912; the Great Mississippi Flood of 1927, the worst in U.S. history, began; and the Boston Marathon bombers committed their dastardly act of terror in 2013. But just to keep the spirit of April 15 alive and relevant, the government would like to remind you that taxes are due in the mail by midnight."

However, just as any day on the calendar may be associated with coinciding unhappy events, any day can be reconciled with positive anniversaries to suit any temperament.

April 15 is, after all, the date that insulin was introduced to the public for treatment of diabetes in 1923, a pivotal development in public health.

Jackie Robinson played his first major league game on this date in 1947, for the Dodgers – and the Dodgers were still in Brooklyn.

Ray Kroc opened the first McDonald's franchise in Illinois in 1955, surely a welcome anniversary to those who like a Happy Meal or Big Mac from time to time.

And President Bill Clinton designated

the Giant Sequoia National Monument on April 15, 2000, on 328,000 acres of land in the Sierra Nevada mountain range of California, including nearly every grove of giant sequoia trees in the Sequoia National Forest. That includes one of the largest trees in the world, the Boole tree: 269 feet high and over 2,000 years old.

So there is surely something to celebrate on April 15. If nothing else, Americans can rejoice at being done with their taxes.

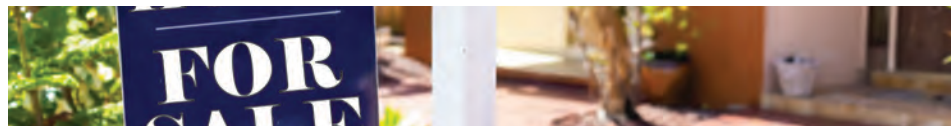

March takes positive step for buyers and sellers

As the first quarter came to a close, the Las Cruces housing market brought a boost in closed sales and closing prices, giving some great optimism for our spring buyer season. Even with interest rates hovering around the 6 percent range, buyers are still snapping up listings, many within a few days after the “for sale”

sign is up.

Active inventory is up by 30 percent compared to last year and new listings were up 16 percent from last month. This month’s report shows many encouraging signs of stability, competitive pricing and more options for homebuyers, especially many who are entering the market for the first time.

Harbor Freight to open location in Deming

Harbor Freight, the national tool store chain, is about to open its 19th New Mexico location in Deming — and they are hiring.

The California-based company did not announce an opening date, but said it would be in the spring.

Work on the new location is ongoing as part of a commercial building repurposing project. In 2020, the city of Deming purchased a 95,000-square-foot former Kmart building, which had been empty for four

years, on the main commercial loop through town for \$1.8 million. One end of the building is home to a new city hall while the other end was renovated for retail space. At a city council meeting last July, Deming city manager Aaron Sera said the city hoped the project would lead to 120 retail jobs at the site.

“We’ve been looking to open a location in Deming for a number of years so that we can provide the tools and equipment at tremendous values to the community,” Harbor Freight senior vice president Trey Feiler stated in

a news release. The company said it anticipates 25 to 30 jobs for sales and logistics managers, sales associates and other staff including seasonal hires.

Among more than 1,500 locations across the U.S., Harbor Freight operates 18 stores in New Mexico, including three in Albuquerque and one in Las Cruces.

Touting a “competitive starting rate along with a best-in-class retail benefits package,” Harbor Freight pointed to HarborFreightJobs.com/retail for candidates to apply for jobs at the Deming store.

highly unique.

Patierno spoke with people from elders of northern New Mexico pueblos, water experts throughout the state, farmers and U.S. Rep. Melanie Stansbury, D-N.M. These characters painted a generalized historical picture of the river and detailed how industry's approach to the water has changed up

to today.

Patierno added that

Every year, the residents of Las Cruces line the banks of the river to celebrate when the river is "turned on."

while the film centers on the Rio Grande in New Mexico, it really is a cautionary tale for the "waters of the west" amidst climate change and other threats.

"The one thing that's been really gratifying for me is that people in New Mexico seem to really like it," she said of the film.

Aside from Las Cruces, "Requiem for a River" has been screened in festivals in Colorado, Arizona and Iowa. Patierno said she wants to get the film "out in the world" and is hoping to schedule several screenings in Las Cruces and El Paso in the near future.

A three-part series looking at the rest of the Rio Grande in the U.S. is also something she hopes will come to fruition in the future.

Future is bright for LCHS' Zakye Hawkins

Las Cruces High's Zakye Hawkins is wrapping up his high school baseball career, but knows there is plenty to look forward to in his future.

The 18-year-old senior announced he had committed to the University of Utah back in October of 2022, later signing his letter of intent to play with the Utes baseball team on November 11, 2023.

While on his visit to Salt Lake City he said the clean fresh air and the aura of the city attracted him right away. But talking with the Utah baseball coaching staff and hearing their knowledge and love for the game attracted him even more.

"Todd Guilliams is our hitting coach

out there. They call him the 'guru' and I agree with them," Hawkins said. "For two hours on our visit we just talked, me, my dad and my mom, went in his office and talked about hitting and I did not want to leave at all because I'm fascinated with hitting."

Hawkins said coach Guilliams played a large role in his decision after their discussion about hitting. The young man understands he needs to continue to develop his game and after his visit, he felt Utah was just the place for that.

Utah wasn't the only Division I school fighting to get Hawkins on their squad. In fact, there was a whole list of teams intrigued by the 6-foot-1 shortstop. At the time New Mexico State, University of New Mexico, Utah Valley, Air Force, Grand Canyon University, Arizona State

University and Utah were all looking at him.

He said Utah is hoping to use him at either shortstop, third base or second base – but he's willing to play wherever they need him. As of right now, Hawkins is posted up as the Bulldogs' standout shortstop and pitches as well.

That's not all that's happening for Hawkins. He's also gained interest from several MLB organizations who are hoping to add his talent to their respected teams in this year's draft or later down the road.

Some of those teams include the New York Yankees, Toronto Blue Jays, San Diego Padres, San Francisco Giants, Oakland Athletics and New York Mets.

"They're good people, they say, 'Text me if you need anything, if you need any knowledge' stuff like that, they're good people," Hawkins said about his conversations with pro scouts.

Hawkins played varsity football for LCHS as well, before making the tough decision to focus solely on baseball. He said having that conversation going into his junior year of high school with Coach Mark Lopez, the head football coach, was hard but at the end of the day he's always dreamed about becoming a professional baseball player.

"Those two days after I went in there and talked to him (Coach Lopez) about it, I was crying, I got really emotional just because I felt like I was leaving my brothers that I built a huge relationship with," Hawkins said.

Hawkins comes from a talented athletic family. The legendary Bulldawg and NM State basketball player Gordo Castillo is his uncle. Hawkins called him his role model.

"Just him being there is a really big help for me and the legacy he's left in this town made me want to be the next person to leave a legacy and show people that Cruces is a place where a lot of ball-players can come out of," Hawkins said.

As his high school baseball career approaches its end, Hawkins has a batting average of .485, with 10 RBI's, four doubles, one triple and one home run. He's also superb on the defensive side, with a .945 fielding percentage.

And it is possible Las Cruces may soon have a young athlete representing the city and state not only at the college level, but even one day at the pro level.

On the 'chipping yips' and how to conquer them

When we talk about someone having the "yips," we normally are referring to putting. Putting is one of a very few fine motor skills in the game of golf that demands precision touch, feel and movement. Another is chipping, which does not require brute strength, but rather limited motor transition.

Many golfers suffer chipping yips. Some folks dismiss them as purely mental lapses, but it is far more than that. The yips mostly involve involuntary muscle contractions or spasms of the arm, wrist and hand when attempting the delicate act of chipping or putting. The most common symptom associated with the

chipping or putting yips is uncontrolled, sudden muscle jerk, which may be accompanied by tremors, twitches or freezing.

The term, "yips," was originally coined by the late, great tour pro Tommy Armour, who once carded a 23 on a hole at the 1927 Shawnee Open.

Chipping yips are characterized by a jittery jab or weak prod typically from greenside rough or fringe, close enough to the hole that a player can often use his putter. The result can be thin, "fat," bladed or topped shots, which can send the ball well away from the target

or barely move the ball at all. My research has led me to observe that chipping yips are a function of combined poor stroke technique, lack of understanding of fundamentals and mental nervous tension.

One teaching pro, Nick Foy, claims that "chipping is about finesse and touch, which is why the most common form of the yips is the chipping yips." One short game guru suggests that personality types may be relevant, with perfectionists being more susceptible. A player may be investing too much thought into his movements and the

process of executing the swing, leading to a brain yip.

I vividly remember Herb Wimberly telling our Performance Golf School students: "We have to think of the chipping swing and the short pitching swing as the full swing in miniature." He emphasized tempo and follow-through.

The main fundamentals for greenside chipping are to set up with the feet fairly close together, the ball centered or slightly in the back of your stance and weight favoring your lead foot. Your grip pressure should be moderate. Your hands need to be slightly ahead of the ball with the shaft leaning toward the

target. For long chips, you need to size up the speed and break like you would do for a putt; for short chips, be careful of how the ball will roll out to the hole.

Once we have confidence in the setup and stroke, we can focus on finesse. I have found that picking a spot on the green where we want the ball to land, and visualizing how it will roll to the hole, is absolutely critical in getting chips close.

There are two ways to deal with chipping yips and miscues, suitable for pros and recreational golfers alike.

One is a "reverse" grip similar to a reverse putting grip with the left hand low for right hand-

ers. This method removes much of the stress involved with the tendency to "flip" your hands and wrists on chip shots. The second strategy is the one-handed method, with either your right hand or your left hand. I have played with fellows who have struggled with chipping and have gone one-handed and mastered it. Think of which chipping club is best for you at which distance; don't be afraid of plenty of practice.

And don't be afraid of fear. Fear of hitting a bad shot, fear of embarrassment, fear of losing. Fear and trying to over-control will get in the way of the most technically sound stroke.
