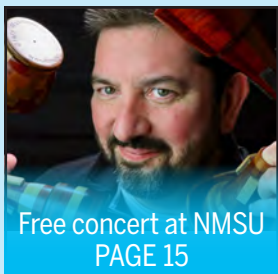

New Mexico rivers top endangered list

The American Rivers conservation group placed all of New Mexico's rivers, collectively, on its annual list of Ameri-

ca's most endangered rivers, released Monday.

All streams and wetlands as well as rivers such as the Rio Grande, Gila, Pecos and San Juan, are seen in the report as

particularly vulnerable to the loss of federal protections subsequent to a 2023 U.S. Supreme Court ruling.

The report also lists 10 other locations in the U.S. and Mexico, with

riverways and wetlands endangered due to pumping, excessive use, pollution, development, conditions related to climate change or outdated management policies.

The report cites the importance of New Mexico's waterways for food production, drinking and outdoor recreation as a major part of its economy, as well as role of the

state's acequia system for local communities as well as Indigenous governments in the state.

Yet New Mexico lacked its own permitting process for monitoring surface water pollution when the nation's high court struck down federal clean water protections, in Sackett v. EPA, last year.

That case involved an Idaho couple seeking to build a home on wetlands

near Priest Lake. The court, ruling in the property owners' favor, scaled back federal Clean Water Act protections in place for decades.

"The court decision scaled back ... safeguards to include protections only for 'relatively permanent' streams, and wetlands with a 'continuous surface connection' to these protected

streams," the American Rivers report states.

It argues that New Mexico's waterways are hit hardest because the majority of its streams and wetlands could lose protections they enjoy from programs administered by two federal agencies: "...Streams that only run during the rainy season or for periods of the year after snowmelt

– which is very typical in this arid state – no longer have federal protections," it writes.

Senator Martin Heinrich, D-N.M., blasted the Sackett ruling in a statement issued with the report's release.

Our state is experiencing some of the worst consequences of climate change, including pro-

longed drought and aridification," he said. "What we didn't need was the Supreme Court's radical majority making it harder to protect our waterways. But they won't get the last word when it comes to our water. I'm committed to ensuring all New Mexicans have ac-

Judge jails defendant in Mesilla murder

Oscar Renee Sandoval will remain in jail until trial on a charge of first-degree murder, after a judge's ruling on April 16.

The judge found that the alleged actions of Sandoval, 57, demonstrated a danger to the public's safety and that no release conditions could ensure his compliance.

Sandoval is charged with first-degree murder. The Mesilla Marshals Office said he gunned down his wife, 39-year-old Sheireen Al Jibury, on April 1 near Zia Middle School. Sandoval was arrested in Ciudad Juárez on April 10. He was sent back to the U.S. to wait for Tuesday's pre-trial detention hearing.

There, prosecutor Melissa Garcia with the 3rd Judicial District Attorney's Office argued Sandoval had proven he was a flight risk.

"We'll never see him again if he's released," Garcia said.

Garcia primarily relied on the information presented in an affidavit. In it, the Marshals said a witness driving along University Avenue near Zia Middle School spotted Al Jibury, wounded and claiming she'd been shot.

As the witness assessed the situation, she saw Sandoval catch up to Al Jibury and unload four shots from a handgun into her. Sandoval then approached the witness, who said she sped away before calling the

police.

"The brazenness is unbelievable," Garcia said.

Garcia also told the judge there was evidence of premeditation. According to the Marshals, Sandoval had recently signed over the deed to his properties to his 19-year-old son.

"This is something that was planned," she said.

But Sandoval's attorney, Tyler McCormick, disputed that. He said changing the deed was merely part of a succession plan in case of tragedy. McCormick also noted that, while "the facts of his arrest are problematic," Sandoval had no criminal convictions and strong ties to his community of Chaparral.

However, Judge Douglas Driggers said the evidence presented by the witness suggested otherwise. He ruled that Sandoval was dangerous and that no release conditions could protect the public.

Mesilla Marshals an-

nounced Sandoval's arrest by federal agents on April 10, which ended a nine-day manhunt. Sandoval was last seen, according to the Marshals, walking away from his car the night of Al Jibury's death after he parked on a residential street in Sunland Park.

Marshal Ben Azcarate expressed pride in the town's law enforcement agency, consisting of eight certified law enforcement officers, who were assisted in the homicide investigation by Doña Ana Sheriff's detective Eddie Flores.

He also addressed prior questions about the crime scene sweep, where evidence was recovered days after the shooting. "The Mesilla Marshals crime scene team and detectives did not go back to the scene three days later," Azcarate said. "The crime scene team and detectives worked the scene extensively since the night of April 1, conducting a crime analysis, searches, diagrams, photography, aerial photography, and searched extensively for any other evidence. ... Sgt. detective Danny Garcia has not slept since the investigation began and has worked, and is still working, countless hours on this case."

Azcarate indicated Sandoval might face federal charges in addition to the state charge of murder, but no criminal complaint had been filed in federal court according to online records Tuesday afternoon.

Public officials grapple with threats, raising questions about local democracy

This is the first of a two-parts of an in-depth look into intimidation of elected officials in New Mexico's two largest cities.

A voicemail ends with a death threat. Racist hate spewed in a phone call. An unknown car parked outside the house. Social media posts calling for summary execution.

Threats of violence like these are well-suited for political thrillers. They evoke the high drama of a fictional character forced to choose between their safety and their beliefs. But it's become something of a reality for public officials in 2024.

Elected officials interviewed by the Las Cruces Bulletin said they face a growing trend of threats and intimidation. The intimidation, which often comes via electronic media, is part of a nationwide drift toward political violence, national data shows. And the tar-

gets are most often against officials from marginalized communities.

With a growing specter of violence, questions about democratic participation emerge as well. Local officials told the Bulletin that the experiences have made them reconsider – or at least reassess – their position in government. The result, however, is a greater resolve and conviction.

“There’s definitely pieces of paranoia that are there,” said Johana Bencomo, a Las Cruces city councilor who recently received a death threat. “But I’m also feeling righteous anger. I’m not going to allow myself to be intimidated – because that’s what the intent is.”

Intimidation as politics in America

A January report by the Brennan Center for Justice, which surveyed elected officials from around the U.S., shed light on the situation nationwide.

Researchers found that threats and intimidation of local officials had risen sharply. The report found that:

- 43 percent of state legislators experienced threats.
- 18 percent of local officeholders experienced threats.
- 38 percent of state legislators reported that the amount of abuse they experience has increased since first taking public office, while only 16 percent reported that it has decreased.
- 29 percent of state legislators reported that the seriousness of the incidents has increased, while only 12 percent reported that it has decreased.

The report also found women and people of color were experiencing more threats compared to their colleagues.

Intimidation and threats – especially against people from marginalized groups – reduce participation in democratic government in both historical and contemporary contexts, academic research shows. The Brennan Center report found that more than 40 percent of officeholders who’d experienced threats or violence were less likely to stay in office.

“For women, the rates of possible attrition are higher, with approximately half saying they were less willing to continue serving,” the report said.

The report also noted the downstream



effects of intimidation. For example, about 20 percent of state officeholders and 40 percent of local officeholders acknowledged they were less willing to work on controversial topics because of fear.

Fifty-three percent of state legislators believed that abuse had deterred their colleagues from taking on controversial topics. About 23 percent of state legislators in the report said they were less likely to hold events in public spaces, limiting crucial public access to their representation.

‘And I will kill you’

This section discusses suicide. Help is available by calling 988 for the 24-hour Suicide and Crisis Lifeline.

Bencomo was targeted by a death threat on March 16. She’s been a Las Cruces city councilor since 2017 and told the Bulletin she’s experienced other forms of harassment before. But this experience was a benchmark.

Bencomo was out of town visiting family when police believe an El Paso man with Las Cruces ties left a death threat via her city hall phone. The voicemail automatically forwarded to her cell phone.

The man gave his name and number. He told Bencomo to “clean up her side of the street,” deployed homophobic slurs, and mentioned a person police said had a protective order against him.

“When you hear it, you can sort of tell he is in distress,” she said.

He then told Bencomo to kill herself. If she didn’t, he said, “And I will kill you,” before ending the voicemail.

Bencomo said the message felt off but didn’t immediately sink in. When she shared it with confidants, they told her she needed to go to the police.

Beleaguered water utility town hall on Friday

Sunland Park and water utility officials are hosting a town hall this Friday as scrutiny over water quality issues from Camino Real Regional Utility Authority have increased.

On Thursday, Sunland Park city clerk Karla Herrera posted a notice that a majority of the six councilors could be present at the town hall.

“The event is not a ‘public meeting’ within the definition of the Open Meetings Act,” the notice read. “No policy will be formulated; nor will any discussion be had for the purpose of taking action.”

In recent months, the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority (CRRUA)

has received multiple citations for violations of water quality from New Mexico environment officials. This includes allegations that water with high levels of arsenic was sent to customers for potentially more than a year.

The meeting is hosted by Sunland Park city councilor Alberto Jaramillo, said Udell Vigil, a spokesperson for the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority.

Jaramillo invited CRRUA interim executive director Juan Carlos Crosby to give a report at the town hall, Vigil said. There’s no agenda for the meeting.

Jaramillo and Sunland Park mayor Javier Perea are also Camino Real Regional Utility Authority board members.

At a city of Sunland Park meeting Tuesday, CBS 4 reported that frustrated community members asked Perea and members of the city council to step down, as state agencies boost scrutiny over the utility’s water quality issues.

Four Las Cruces attorneys have filed a tort claim against Sunland Park, an action that often comes before a lawsuit. The lawyers allege that CRRUA violated residents’ civil rights for failing to tell them about a malfunction which sent water with a high pH to more than 1,000 households. The company waited days to tell the public about the contamination issue.

The utility will not be sharing any additional information at Friday’s

meeting, according to another board member’s social media posts.

According to screenshots of a private Facebook group for Sunland Park residents obtained by Source New Mexico, Raul Telles Jr. the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority board vice chair said the utility’s answers would be limited during the meeting on Friday.

“So you know in advance, no information other than what has been made public, found on the corresponding pages for CRRUA, will be discussed or answered,” Telles posted on the Facebook page.

One of the attorneys representing residents in the tort claim, said that CRRUA was “blaming the attorneys” instead of

fering answers.

“CRRUA continues to finger-point away from itself, and is failing to

take responsibility,” said attorney Israel Chávez, when reached by phone Thursday.

Bencomo has advocated for poor and marginalized groups in Las Cruces as a councilor and in her career as a community organizer. This work has earned her the ire of some who oppose her approach to affecting change, her values and her beliefs about what government should do. The death threat rattled those values.

“I definitely started feeling myself doubt my whole approach,” Bencomo said.

Support from city leadership helped soften the blow, she said.

“I talked to other women in my circle of work who didn’t feel like law enforcement believed them,” Bencomo said.

“And that just has not been my experience at all. Chief (Jeremy) Story took it very seriously.”

Bencomo said that

Story and the detective assigned to the case, Peirce Wilber, reassured her with the investigation and advocacy.

“I’ll never forget what chief said: ‘When our elected officials don’t feel safe, the whole system falls apart,’” she recalled.

The voicemail led to a misdemeanor charge against the man. That case is pending.

In part two of this story, appearing next week, we speak with more local elected officials about threats, harassment, even stalking — and how it affects their view of public service.

cess to clean water and a stable foundation for the future.”

In October, U.S. Rep. Melanie Stansbury, D-N.M., was a lead sponsor of a bill to re-establish federal protections struck down by the Sackett ruling. H.R. 5983, the Clean Water Act of 2023, has been in the committee process since October. Responding to the American Rivers report, Stansbury wrote, “...this isn’t just a local issue but a national

call to action for sustainable water management and environmental stewardship.”

The immediate implication was described in dire terms by Tricia Snyder, director of New Mexico Wild’s rivers and waters program, who stated in a news release: “New Mexico’s waters are threatened like never before.”

Filling gaps in protection

The New Mexico Legislature responded to the Supreme Court’s ruling during the most recent

legislative session, appropriating \$7.6 million to start a state permitting program and expand groundwater monitoring.

Shelly Lemon, surface water quality bureau chief at the New Mexico Environment Department, said in an interview that the state actually began moving forward on its own water protections during the Donald Trump Administration, which established an administrative rule in 2020 that rolled back Clean Water Act protections and deregulated wetlands. The rule

is no longer in place following its replacement in January 2023.

“We knew that this Sackett ruling was coming ... but we started down this path in 2020, and we got a small appropriation in 2022 from the legislative session to really begin the work,” she recalled.

“With this funding, we’re looking at developing a state program to issue permits for similar activities – either direct discharges or discharges

of dredge and fill to surface waters of the state,” she said.

The state’s water quality standards are already in statute, along with regulations protecting surface- and groundwater. Now, New Mexico would build a permitting structure for facilities or people to discharge pollutants and to assure those do not contaminate or impair water systems. The permitting program would require new regulations, and if the state

assumes responsibility for protections scaled back at the EPA, Lemon said legislation would be needed as well.

The federal programs helping New Mexico waterways will continue, she said. “They’re scaled back because the Clean Water Act has been scaled back. What the state of New Mexico is trying to do is fill the gap from what’s been done over the last 50 years (up to) this Supreme Court ruling.”

Las Cruces man killed in El Paso-area crash

El Paso police identified a Las Cruces man as the victim of a crash on Interstate 10 on April 13.

Michael Prendergast, 39, was killed when a semi truck hit his pickup truck. The crash occurred near the Vinton exit at about 8 p.m.

El Paso police said in a news release that Prendergast was headed toward El Paso. At some point, he pulled over. It’s unclear why, police said. He then got onto the eastbound lanes before colliding with the semi truck.

“The truck driver could not stop in time,” police said.

Prendergast died at the scene, the news release

said. Police also identified the semi truck driver as an Arizona man. No changes have been filed as of this article’s publication.

The crash closed both sides of the freeway Saturday night for about 10 hours. All lanes reopened early Sunday morning. The crash remains under investigation.

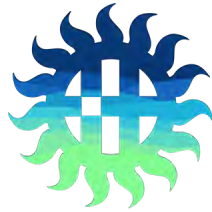


She was a loyal friend, wife and confidant.

According to a 2024 national survey, an estimated 56% of homeowners plan to dig without notifying 811, the “Call Before You Dig” hotline. Will you be one of them?

In 2008, the Common Ground Alliance (CGA), an association dedicated to protecting underground infrastructure, designated April as National Safe Digging Month to raise awareness towards safe digging procedures during a critical time when the temperature increases, and spring digging projects begin. Sixteen years later, Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) continues prioritizing public safety by educating the New Mexico community on proper dig procedures throughout the year.

“National Safe Digging Month is important because it reminds excavators and homeowners about the safe digging processes to help prevent serious injuries and property damage,” said Enrique Arzabal, LCU assistant

supervisor for Locating and Mapping. “In 2024, LCU has distributed over 44,000 mailers to homeowners and contractors and has put ads in local newspapers to further spread the information.”

According to the CGA, the societal cost of damages to underground infrastructure was an estimated \$30 billion in 2021. Most instances could’ve been avoided by using the C.A.R.E. method when digging.

C - Call or click before you dig - Dial 811 or submit a dig ticket on www.NM811.org.

A - Allow required time for marking - Make contact at least three business days before digging.

R - Respect the marks - Lines are marked by technicians with flags.

E - Excavate carefully - Hand dig to determine the exact locations of pipelines.

“Always follow the C.A.R.E. method, it’s free, and you never know what



is below the ground or how deep the pipes are until we go out there,” Arzabal explained. “This applies to all digging projects, even a project as small as gardening. No matter how well you think you know the area, give us a call.”

Shallow digging is the No.1 reason homeowners gave for digging without notifying 811 first. Utilities can be buried just a few inches below the surface, because of this, backhoes contribute to more damage annually than any other digging equipment.

If a utility pipeline is punctured, this can impact the environment. Natural gas can leak into the air, and water and wastewater can leak into the ground. Pipeline rupture also has an impact on the community, including service disruption, possible injury, and the risk of a natural gas ignition.

LCU’s continuous efforts to educate the community in digging safety have proven effective as LCU has not had an ignition in over 20 years.

“We don’t get punctures very often because we’re proactive,” explained Arzabal. “Our locators are constantly looking out for people. If they see anyone digging, they ensure the C.A.R.E. method has been followed. If it was not, our locators educate excavators on the proper procedures. This practice sets us apart and keeps our communities and workers safe.”

Challengers rebuke incumbent as DA race begins

MESILLA — The race for District Attorney is the hottest in Doña Ana County, and it just might be the most important.

A moderator dropped that declarative onto a crowd of about 100 people following a two-hour debate Tuesday evening.

Gathered in the ballroom of Mesilla's Palacio Bar, a faint hint of alcohol and the echo of a hockey

game served as the backdrop to five attorneys pitching their best cases to be the area's top prosecutor.

All the candidates appealed to fears of crime but provided differing solutions. Some argued the office should be open to the public. The Republican even evoked Susana Martinez, who rode her term in the DA's office into the governor's mansion.

But during the debate,

no one took more heat than the incumbent, Gerald Byers. The challengers questioned the high turnover of assistant district attorneys and the long processing time for cases to resolve.

Some accused Byers of overcharging defendants. Others said he undercharged. Byers defended his four years. He gave himself five stars but later acknowledged room for improvement.

"This is very impor-

tant," said moderator and organizer Arturo Uribe. "This is probably the most important, sexiest, hottest race in Doña Ana County."

The 3rd Judicial District Attorney election is the most competitive, that's for certain. Six candidates filed to run in March. A judge disqualified one candidate, leaving four Democrats and one Republican.

In the Democratic primary, Byers faces Las Cruces defense attorneys Shaharazad Booth, Ramona Martinez and County Manager Fernando Macias. The winner of the primary on June 7 then faces defense attorney and Republican Michael Cain on Nov. 7.

What's wrong with the DA's office?

Early in the debate, moderator Kelly O'Connell asked the candidates what they thought was wrong with the office. O'Connell said it was meant to be a lightning-round question. It became one of the night's flashpoints.

"All of us here agree," Cain said. "The amount of staff should be about 30 to 35."

According to Byers, the office has 19 attorneys. He

has funding for 22 but said he keeps three positions open to fund other office functions. Cain then took it a step further.

"There are people who live in this county, who are experienced prosecutors who are commuting every night to Deming and to Alamogordo because they refuse to work in this DA's office," Cain said.

For Martinez, the answer came down to community, a lack of resources and failure to prosecute people who are repeatedly charged. Martinez also offered solutions to the three problems she posed. Because of the lack of community engagement, she said she would open the office to area stakeholders. For resources, Martinez said the DA's office should have a strong presence in recruiting young lawyers at local law schools. For repeat

offenders, she foresaw the DA's office taking a role in addressing root causes like poverty and mental health.

"We can lock them up, but they're going to be coming back into the community. So, unless we're addressing those underlying root causes with behavioral health and mental health services, those issues are not going to be addressed," Martinez said.

Byers spoke next, touting his partnerships. Byers talked about a deal with the U.S. Border Patrol to prosecute people who flee its officers while crossing into the U.S. near Santa Teresa. He also spoke about his office's work securing funding for a new case management system.

"That's how we im-

Border patrol cannabis seizures press industry

The U.S. Border Patrol has seized hundreds of thousands of dollars in legal cannabis at New Mexico checkpoints this year, according to industry officials.

Recent tougher enforcement of federal law over New Mexico law surprised many in the industry, who have taken their situation to media outlets to garner attention on border patrol seizures. And while the enforcement has a painful effect on businesses locked into intense competition, industry leaders say the impact goes beyond dollars and cents.

“It’s just really pushing the entire industry backward,” New Mexico Cannabis Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Ben Lewinger told the Bulletin.

The seizures began in February 2024, years after retailers were given the green light to sell legally in New Mexico in April 2022. According to Lewinger, U.S. Customs and Border Protection agents have seized about \$350,000 from at least 14 businesses in southern New Mexico.

Lewinger said most seizures are reported at the Interstate 25

checkpoint or the checkpoint on U.S. Highway 70 near Alamogordo. However, he’s skeptical of those numbers.

“I’m certain that there’s more. I think this is underreported,” he said. “We’ve come a long way, but the stigma still exists in the industry. The fact is this is still federally illegal, and there’s very real fear about getting fingerprinted and put on a list as a federal criminal.”

CBP said they’re just enforcing the law in a statement sent to the Bulletin.

“Although medical and recreational marijuana may be legal in some U.S. states and Canada, the sale, possession, production, and distribution of marijuana or the facilitation of the aforementioned remain illegal under U.S. federal law, given the classification of marijuana as a Schedule I controlled substance,” said CBP spokesperson Landon Hutchinson.

Marijuana became illegal in the U.S. in 1937. Its current classification leaves it in a category with heroin – despite the somewhat conspicuous difference between the two drugs.

“Consequently, individuals violating the Controlled Substances Act encountered while crossing the border, arriving

at a U.S. port of entry, or a Border Patrol checkpoint may be deemed inadmissible and/or subject to seizure, fines, and/or arrest,” Hutchinson said.

Hutchinson’s statement did not say why CBP has decided to start enforcement now.

Kai Kirk, a partner with Head Space Alchemy, said his business was one of the first to see products seized. On March 14, Kirk said CBP took around \$7,500 worth of product and detained two employees for hours. It was a stark change from years past, he said.

“By turning a blind eye to

this, they’re allowing tax revenues to be stolen from the state,” he said.

Kirk and others said they plan to lobby New Mexico’s federal delegation to intercede on their behalf. However, since CBP is a part of the Department of Homeland Security, the office of the President of the United States must arbitrate on behalf of New Mexico’s cannabis industry.

That’s not unprecedented. Under former President Barack Obama, former Deputy Attorney General James Cole issued a memorandum to fed-

eral law enforcement and prosecutors instructing them not to focus on legal cannabis in 2013. The Cole Memorandum, as it’s known in cannabis industry circles, was rescinded by former President Donald Trump.

In January 2018, United States Attorney General Jeff Sessions told federal prosecutors to resume prosecutions of federally illegal cannabis at their discretion. After Trump, President Joe Biden promised to decriminalize marijuana at the federal level. In 2022, Biden pardoned all federal marijuana convictions. But otherwise, he’s taken no steps toward decriminalizing cannabis.

As a nominee, Attorney General Merrick Garland indicated to Congress that he prefers the Cole memo over the Sessions memo. But he’s taken no public steps to put that into action.

This has left New Mexico’s budding industry in a haze. Industry leaders said a new memo is needed.

“The White House (should) issue a directive to the Department of Homeland Security and Customs and Border Protection to not interfere with interstate operations for legal cannabis businesses,” Lewinger said. “What they’re doing is outside of their scope.”

District Attorney candidate disqualified after judge's ruling

A judge disqualified a district attorney candidate after finding dozens of nominating petition signatures invalid.

The ruling on April 8 means Las Cruces attorney Pedro Pineda won't appear on the 2024 Democratic primary ballot. Pineda's disqualification drops the race from six to five candidates. The district attorney's race is the most competitive in Doña Ana.

Four candidates, including Pineda, challenged first-term District Attorney Gerald Byers in the Democratic primary in June. The winner faces a Republican challenger in November.

The DA supervises a staff of prosecutors, office workers and investigators. Together, the office pro-

secutes state crimes in the 3rd Judicial District. The district's borders overlap with Doña Ana County.

The six candidates submitted nominating petitions to appear on the ballot. The petition must contain at least 246 signatures, per state law. State law also says the signatures must be from voters in the district and of the candidate's political party. The signatures must also be exclusive to one petition.

Luna County judge Jarod Hofacket oversaw Pineda's case. According to court filings, the full slate of 3rd Judicial District Court judges recused themselves from the case.

They did not say why. However, they may have feared a future conflict, given that the race's winner will prosecute crimes in the district court. It's also possible they felt

recusal was necessary because Macias, a former district judge, and Pineda, a practicing attorney, have strong ties to the area's legal community. The recusals led the state Supreme Court to appoint Hofacket.

Fernando Macias, another Democrat in the race, challenged Pineda's signatures on March 22. Doña Ana County Clerk's Elections Bureau supervisor Janice Giron said 142 signatures should be invalidated.

According to court records, Giron tossed most because they were ineligible, did not provide a full name, were not registered Democrats, or the signer signed more than one nominating petition. There were more questions about another 25 signatures. Those were missing addresses but otherwise compliant.

By the end of it, Pineda had 198 valid signatures, short of the required 246.

"In a larger race, this may seem like a small number. However, (Pineda) is nearly 25 percent short of the required

signatures," Hofacket said.

Pineda turned down a phone interview with the Bulletin. Over email, he said he had no plans to challenge Hofacket's ruling, and also criticized

both Macias and Byers though he will not be on the ballot against them.

"There are no grounds on which to file an appeal. Judge Hofacket's decision and written orders are sound," he said.

Judge affirms disqualification of candidate in statehouse race

A judge affirmed a candidate's disqualification Monday after the candidate submitted altered petitions.

The Doña Ana County Clerk's Office disqualified Ronnie Sisneros on March 19. Sisneros filed to run as a Republican for House of Representatives District 37.

A letter provided to the Bulletin alongside arguments in court details the alterations.

New Mexico election code mandates nominating petitions state the office sought. Sisneros did that. However, on five of seven forms, Sisneros crossed out "House of." He replaced it with "State." The altered language read "State Representative," instead of "House of Representatives."

"The candidate's view was that he was making this more formal," Sisneros' attorney, Carter Harrison, said during a hearing.

The election code allows for nominating forms to be invalidated in a few cases. It says the county clerk must invalidate the forms if they are missing the required information, such as the office sought. They can also be voided if information was changed after the voter signed it.

"With or without showing of fraud or a reasonable opportunity for fraud, a nominating petition page, including all signatures on the petition page, shall be invalid if any of the information required...is not listed on the petition before the petition page is signed by a voter or if any of the required information is subsequently changed in any way," the relevant statute reads.

The other two nominating forms were submitted online. They contain no alterations. However, they only in-

clude 11 of the required 32 signatures needed to qualify.

Ultimately, 3rd Judicial District Judge Manuel Arrieta found no

reason to overrule the clerk's office. Arrieta wrote that the crucial question was whether the petition signer had been fully appraised before signing. Nothing presented could determine if voters knew what they were signing in light of Sisneros' alterations, Arrieta said.

The Bulletin attempted multiple times to reach Sisneros, seeking answers about why he made the alterations. He did not respond.

Sisneros's disqualification hands the race to incumbent Democrat Joanne Ferrary.

Sisneros appealed the ruling on April 15 to the state Supreme Court. A hearing in that matter has not been set.

prove," Byers said.

Booth echoed the sentiments of Cain and Martinez. She also noted that local defense attorneys weren't told a new case management system had been implemented.

"Lack of communication is a fundamental problem with this district attorney's office," Booth said. "This lack of com-

munication that's spreading throughout all of it is why we're in front of the courts fighting and screaming, 'Where's my discovery?'"

Outside communication, Booth said she also wants to bring the community into the office.

Macias, however, said the problems that plagued the office were systemic in the criminal justice system. He stopped short of specifying those issues.

"That goes far beyond just the district attorney's office," Macias said. "Every stakeholder in this process has a level of liability and responsibility to improve the system."

Macias added that early intervention would also be critical to stem the flow of people entering the system.

0 brave new weirdness

Imagine being hired by a city to serve as a business liaison, someone charged with providing information to business owners about regulations, laws, programs and services available to them, city codes and the like. Important stuff.

"Thanks for the job," you say, "but I want to make one thing clear: My answers to the public's questions may be incorrect, harmful or biased, and I have limited knowledge of the world beyond local business, which

may impinge on my judgment."

The city says, "No problem!" and keeps you on the job even after you give employers false information about tips and wages, worker protections or consumer and tenant rights — things that can injure people and lead to lawsuits or prosecution.

If you still have your job after all that, you are probably an AI chatbot.

New York City launched its "MyCity chatbot" last fall, powered by Microsoft. Five months later, The Markup reported the software providing bad advice across the board: Sure, bosses can dip into the tip jar; you can fire workers if they complain about sexual harassment; you can discriminate against Section 8 tenants; your store can stop accepting cash

payment. It even told an Associated Press reporter that restaurants could serve cheese with rat bites.

The MyCity chatbot is an outright hooligan, encouraging employers to violate numerous local and federal laws. On the other hand, it's not being paid salary and benefits.

And the city is not taking it down. The site continues to dispense bad advice and even posts a warning about "incorrect, harmful or biased" answers, yet Mayor Eric

Adams said it will stay up so it can "iron out the kinks."

We have been trained to call this technology "artificial intelligence," yet we have not built intelligence. We have built a parrot with access to massive data sets. It can be a useful tool, but we should not be regarding it as intelligent or relying on it as a reasoning entity. We must think clearly and carefully about this, especially when it comes to displacing human advice.

NM voters ahead of Court on abortion

No piece of legislation in the last decade has had as much impact on the New Mexico Legislature as House Bill 51 in 2019, cosponsored by Rep. Joanne Ferrary of Las Cruces. It would have removed an old law still on the books criminalizing abortion that dated back to 1969, and was made unenforceable by the Supreme Court's 1973 decision in Roe v. Wade.

HB 51 passed 40-29 in the House, but was defeated 18-24 in the Senate, which at that time was much older and more conservative. Democrats Mary Kay Papen, John Arthur Smith, Pete Campos, Carlos Cisneros, Richard Martinez,

Gabriel Ramos, George Muñoz and Clemente Sanchez all voted against it.

Then the voters had their say.

In the 2020 Democratic primary election, Papen lost to Carrie Hamblen, Smith lost to Neomi Martinez Para (who then lost to Crystal Diamond in the general election), Martinez lost to Leo Jaramillo, Ramos lost to Siah Correa Hemplill and Sanchez lost to Pamela Cordova. Cisneros died of a heart attack in 2019. Only Campos and Muñoz are still serving.

Among them, the five defeated senators had

served for 80 years in the Senate. Papen had been president pro tempore. Smith had been chairman of the powerful Finance Committee. Martinez had been chairman of the equally powerful Judiciary Committee.

Under the 1969 law, doctors found guilty of performing an abortion in New Mexico faced a fourth-degree felony charge. If the woman died during the procedure, the charge could be enhanced to a second-degree felony.

Opponents of the bill argued that it wasn't

needed. Roe v. Wade was the law of the land, Sen. Sanchez said, and that wasn't likely to change.

"When it does, then we'll worry about it," he said. Kind of like they did in Arizona.

That state also had an old law on the books that had been made invalid by Roe v. Wade, but they decided it wasn't worth going through all the trouble to repeal it. Their law dated all the way back to 1864, a time when Arizona was still a territory and women had not yet been granted the right to vote.

The Arizona Supreme Court ruled last week that the 1864 law is now valid again. It outlaws

abortion even in cases or rape and incest, with doctors facing up to five years in prison if found guilty.

The court put a two-week hold on its ruling, and both the governor and attorney general have said they would not enforce the new law. But that will do little to reassure doctors risking five years in prison. And Arizona's Republican-controlled state Legislature has blocked efforts to bring the issue up for a new vote in light of the court ruling.

In New Mexico, the new, younger senate passed a bill repealing

New Mexico State University provides a wide range of opportunities for students to enhance their disciplinary knowledge and transferable skills in graduate education through graduate certificates, masters, specialist and doctoral degrees from the five academic colleges. and teaching. HEST graduate programs provide a pipeline of skilled individuals to meet the critical work force shortages in education, health and social work disciplines.

The HEST College is also home to a unique dual public health and social work graduate program. This dual program is only among the two along the United States-Mexico border, attracting students particularly interested in career opportunities in community outreach and international services. Such inter-professional training embedded in dual programs equip the students with disciplinary knowledge to address health disparities prevalent in New Mexico.

the old law in 2021 on a 25-17 vote. Campos and Muñoz still voted against

it, but this time it didn't matter. And in 2023 they passed a separate bill to prevent local governments from trying to stop abortions.

While other states are now scrambling to adjust to the U.S. Supreme Court's Dobbs ruling, New Mexico was prepared thanks to voters

who saw this coming and demanded change.

SHEARER ENERGY At NMSU, trio debuts new musical works

Modern music with a local vibe will once again fill NMSU's music halls this weekend.

As middle and high school students from all across the country gather for a weekend of high intensity learning, Las Cruces' own musical couple, Jim and Celeste Shearer, will take the stage for a free tuba, french horn and piano concert at Atkinson Recital Hall on Sunday, April 21.

Joining them for this performance will be NMSU pianist-in-residence Laura Spitzer, with works including the world premiere of a new piece commissioned by the Shearers – "Two Suite," by Memphis composer Tom Clary.

Also included will be an encore performance of another commissioned piece – "Suite for Horn,

Tuba, and Piano," by noted Arkansas composer Lester Pack, which originally appeared on the "Haunted America Suite" album released in 2015. Both composers will be in attendance as part of a weekend of events with NMSU students and faculty.

Tom Clary's "Two Suite" is an extension of a previous piece titled "Two Lovers Dream," which the Shearers and Spitzer recorded and released last year on Summit Records. How that extension came about is a story unto itself.

"Tom wrote 'Two Lovers Dream' a couple years ago and we recorded it at the same time we did Celeste's solo album, 'Sultry and Eccentric,'" Jim explained. That might have been the end of the story, but then, while on sabbatical in Pittsburgh last fall, the Shearers were at one of their favorite taverns when they were intro-

duced to a drink called the Fallen Angel.

So taken were they by this drink that they immediately texted Tom to tell him about it. As the night wore on, and the texts mounted, the creative bug struck. "That's how we came up with 'Two Fallen Angels (A Night at the Bar),' and 'Two As One,'" Jim explains. "Tom ended up writing two more movements, and now it's a three-movement suite."

The other suite in the program, "Suite for Horn, Tuba, and Piano," is the first of two commissions of the Shearers by Lester Pack, who is currently on the music faculty of the University of Arkansas-Monticello. The movements within that suite are "Chaconne Mulata," "Hope is the Thing..." "Santa Fe Fantasy" and "March."

"Lester's piece started with the 'Haunted America Suite,'" Jim said. "We were commissioning pieces to flesh out the album, and I've known Lester for years. We've done several gigs together, and he wrote a piece for the 'Tuba Strings Quartet' album, too. These are all really deep cuts, man. Both Tom and Lester are buddies of mine I've known since my college days."

The final two pieces

rounding out this performance are "Perpetual Providence," by Joseph T. Spaniola, and "Big Sky," by Frank Gulino, both living composers. They also happen to be friends of the Shearers.

"Joseph's piece was actually written for euphonium, tuba, and piano," Jim said. "When we started putting this program together, I contacted him and asked if he would consider a French horn, tuba, piano version. Literally a day later, he had a French horn part arranged and in my email for Celeste. So, that's our opener."

"Frank Gulino, same thing," he continued. "He's written several pieces for various instruments and tuba, with piano. We used to do a French horn, trombone, piano piece for which I reworked the trombone parts for tuba. This one we're doing over the weekend, 'Big Sky,' was originally written for another group called Eastern Standard, which is another horn, tuba, piano trio."

"I don't know either one of those guys in person, but we know each other pretty well because we spend a lot of time emailing back and forth, and

Mobile children's museum hits the road

Vamos Niños - Play to Learn Mobile Children's Museum is hitting the road with a focus on serving rural and remote communities. The museum is set to make a lasting impact on childhood education throughout the region and our most rural communities.

"It's been a long time coming," Communications Coordinator Sommer Mitchell said. "The museum that we have now has exceeded all of our initial expectations."

The mobile museum started rolling April 6 in Anthony and is launching in Las Cruces 4-7 p.m. Friday, April 19 at Young Park, 850 S. Walnut St. The museum is a product

of Ngage New Mexico and the Success Partnership starting from a seed question: "How do we get resources to the families in the rural parts of Doña Ana County?"

Mitchell said Ngage New Mexico has several focuses in its broad mission to build capacity for non-profits and be a catalyst for change.

"Education needs to be thought of in a holistic point of view as far as the health of the family, including mental health, early child education and physical health," she said. "Whatever is happening, children can't learn in fight-or-flight mode. So, it was like we should do a museum and it has got to be accessible in to people in rural communities."

Thus, the mobile chil-

dren's museum emerged and there is a resource center inside of it, she said. The idea is to take a caravan of services to locations where families can engage with their children in meaningful ways as well as gain access to the early childhood development.

How to be a disagreeable companion

BENJAMIN FRANKLIN
Pennsylvania Gazette

The following "rules for making oneself a disagreeable companion" appeared, unsigned, in the Pennsylvania Gazette on Nov. 15, 1750.

Your Business is to shine; therefore you must by all means prevent the shining of others, for their Brightness may make yours the less distinguish'd. To this End,

1. If possible engross the whole Discourse; and when other Matter fails,

talk much of yourself, your Education, your Knowledge, your Circumstances, your Successes in Business, your Victories in Disputes, your own wise Sayings and Observations on particular Occasions, &c. &c. &c.

2. If when you are out of Breath, one of the Company should seize the Opportunity of saying something; watch his Words, and, if possible, find somewhat either in his Sentiment or Expression, immediately to contradict and raise a Dispute upon. Rather than fail, criticise even his Grammar.

3. If another should be saying an

indisputably good Thing; either give no Attention to it; or interrupt him; or draw away the Attention of others; or, if you can guess what he would be at, be quick and say it before him; or, if he gets it said, and you perceive the Company pleas'd with it, own it to be a good Thing, and withal remark that it had been said by Bacon, Locke, Bayle, or some other eminent Writer: thus you deprive him of the Reputation he might have gain'd by it, and gain some yourself, as you hereby show your great Reading and Memory.

4. When modest Men have been

thus treated by you a few times, they will choose ever after to be silent in your Company; then you may shine on without Fear of a Rival; rallying them at the same time for their Dullness, which will be to you a new Fund of Wit.

Thus you will be sure to please yourself. The polite Man aims at pleasing others, but you shall go beyond him even in that. A Man can be present only in one Company, but may at the same time be absent in twenty. He can please only where he is, you wherever you are not.

City receives federal dollars for clean energy plans

A new sustainability effort from the city of Las Cruces was recently awarded an over \$400,000 federal grant to support a clean energy workforce, mitigate future extreme heat events and promote efforts to lower energy costs for residents.

The Plugged in for Good (PIFG) Energy Alliance project, stemming from the City of Las Cruces' Sustainability Office, has been in the works for several years, though orga-

nized planning officially started last year.

City Sustainability Officer Lisa LaRocque explained that the alliance is made up of local stakeholders including city administration and various members of the community. The goal is to establish policies and programs to make sustainable energy and professional development more attainable.

"The three key issues that we're dealing with are energy efficiency, energy affordability and also health and safety, es-

pecially when it comes to extreme weather events," LaRocque said.

She explained that about 20 community members from different industries, political affiliation, views and values gathered in 2023 to discuss the expansive topic.

"We spent a whole year just looking at all the different dimensions of this issue – about low income, moderate-income housing, the housing stock, the costs that people were having to pay for their utilities, the age of their houses and then what op-

tions that people had to be able to get their house upgraded or retrofitted. And what were some of the barriers to doing that," she said.

LaRocque acknowledged that there are already programs in place to address these issues through agencies such as state and federal departments of energy or departments of housing and urban development, but the process of qualifying for home upgrades can take a long time or require people to "go through a lot of hoops." Only a small number of homes are upgraded per year.

She said the alliance's goal is to make upgrades

or retrofitting more easily accessible. This includes reducing energy burden by promoting clean energy in cooling, heating and water systems.

LaRocque also explained that the alliance took a look at how many people in Las Cruces are energy burdened, or who devoted over 6 percent of their wage to energy costs. She said some people were up to 14 percent while other people of means were as low as 3 to 2 percent.

The alliance also plans to make workforce education and training in sustainable retrofitting more accessible by covering training costs, registered

apprenticeships and getting professional development recognized as paid time.

The strategies and funding for the alliance's vision are still in the planning phase. However, action is already being taken to retrofit older houses in the city with sustainable home energy systems. Ultimately, the replacement will lower energy costs for Las Cruces, assisting low-income families in particular while also reducing the city's energy burden.

Other aspects of the alliance involve providing workforce sustainability

NMSU offers Ph.D for early childhood professionals

SUCCESS PARTNERSHIP For the Bulletin

New Mexico is one of only a few states to have a state department of early childhood education separate from the Public Education Department, and the New Mexico Early Childhood Education and Care Department is making a big impact in

the state.

One support the ECECD has offered is tuition scholarships for New Mexico early childhood care and education professionals to obtain associate, bachelor, and graduate degrees. These scholarships, along with robust offerings from the university, have led to doubled enrollment in



early childhood programs at New Mexico State University.

Rhianna Thomas, Ph.D. coordinates the scholarly non-licensure master's program in early childhood education. She has seen a three-fold increase in enrollment in the program. Spending time at conferences and gatherings around the state, she heard many requests for a doctoral program focused on early childhood education. Such a program

would increase expertise in the field as well as grow the number of New Mexicans qualified to teach early childhood courses at the university.

Thomas worked with the Department of Teacher Preparation Administration and Leadership at NMSU and the ECECD to develop a doctoral program for New Mexico early childhood professionals. The program is set to begin in summer 2024, with those

qualifying for the scholarship receiving 80 percent of their tuition costs from the early childhood education department.

To meet the needs of doctoral students across the state, the program will be offered online with face-to-face components for the summer. The research component of the Ph.D will focus on community-engaged research to benefit New Mexico's children and families. The goals of the Ph.D program align with those of the Success Partnership. Thomas is co-ambassador of the Early Childhood Workforce is Supported Action Network within

the Success Partnership, and the coalition informs the program goals and format.

Thomas reports she had received 26 letters of interest from early childhood professionals across the state as of the January 19 deadline. For information about the program, please email her at thomask@nmsu.edu.

training, which will provide job security down the line as industries move toward more environmentally sustainable futures.

The group of stakeholders shared ideas of how to get the work done and, once agreements were reached, grants were applied for.

The PIFG alliance has received several grants so far to support its mission, including \$470,000 from the U.S. Department of Energy through its Energy Futures Grants program.

"This grant award will be a tremendous boost for some of our residents, particularly those who live in Las Cruces' older, more established neighborhoods," said Las Cruces Mayor Eric En-

riquez in a news release. "This grant is designed to help them retrofit and modernize the homes they have worked so hard to own. The improvements to their homes will make them more energy efficient and will improve the quality of life for their families."

According to a news release from the DOE, \$27 million in financial and technical grants was awarded to 40 projects run by state, local and tribal governments throughout the country.

"Energy Future Grants fosters out-the-box thinking and collaboration to help develop solutions to encourage and facilitate successful clean energy projects (benefiting) disadvantaged communities," according to the news release.

The first grant awarded to the PIFG was \$400,000

from the Buildings Upgrade Prize through the U.S. Office of Energy Efficiency & Renewable Energy. LaRocque said the guidance from grant organizers is to plan and test this year and then implement housing retrofitting in 2025. She said the alliance will likely retrofit 30 to 40 houses next year.

"There's a lot of money and interest going into the energy transition that we have to change because of climate change," LaRocque said. "Our goal ... it's not one thing, it's everything. We're really challenging ourselves to see how we can change the system; so it's a real transition that's a win-win."

Supreme Court puts Santa Teresa annexation on pause

A group of Santa Teresa residents seeking to establish Santa Teresa as a city in its own right won a procedural victory in Santa Fe last week.

The New Mexico Supreme Court ruled unanimously that a dispute over annexed land in Santa Teresa must wait until litigation over the petition for Santa Teresa to become a municipality is finished.

The dispute, tied up in court for several years, involves a citizens' group backing incorporation, the city of Sunland Park, Doña Ana County and a private company, Socorro Partners, that has petitioned Sunland Park to annex land for development — a move the city approved in 2016.

The census-designated place at the southern end of the county is home to over 6,000 residents, per U.S. Census data, and located near the crucial Santa Teresa Port of Entry and neighboring El Paso, Texas.

Mary Gonzalez spearheaded a petition to Doña Ana County in 2015 to incorporate part of the territory as its own municipality, which the county denied.

The nonprofit Provisional Government of Santa Teresa lost an appeal of that decision in district court, but in 2018 the Court of Appeals kicked it back to the county, which again denied the petition. The matter is still working its way through the appeals process.

Meanwhile, Sunland Park city councilors voted to annex land within the Santa Teresa territory — including part of the proposed municipality — for private development. Construction work began on new housing in the area. This also ended up in court after the residents and the county both appealed the annexation. After district court affirmed the annexation, it was overruled on appeal, with the Court of Appeals ruling that the incorporation petition was still in

litigation and took priority over the annexation.

The state Supreme Court agreed, citing the legal doctrine of prior jurisdiction. In short, the incorporation petition was filed first and that litigation must be resolved first, per the opinion.

The state's high court also brushed aside an argument that the Santa Teresa residents and the county did not have standing to appeal the annexation, stating in its opinion, "...PGST and the Doña Ana Board suffered injury that was caused

by the annexation that is 'likely to be redressed by a favorable decision,'" citing case law.

The opinion orders that the annexation proceedings be stayed in district court, essentially waiting until the incorporation case, including all appeals,

is complete.

Doña Ana County attorney Nelson Goodin said he didn't have much to say about the development, but suggested it might take years to untangle the overlapping cases.

Noting that the dispute has continued for nearly a decade already — almost as long as he has worked for the county — Goodin said, "If you had told me this would still be going on nine years later, I would have said you were nuts."

Gonzalez said in a written statement that her organization "remains committed to representing the interests of Santa Teresa's residents and ensuring a transparent, lawful process in its efforts to achieve municipal status.

"The recent legal ruling reaffirms PGST's position and sets a precedent for prioritizing community-driven initiatives in matters of municipal governance."

The Bulletin reached out to Socorro Partners' attorney, who did not respond.

Digging: Your Rights & Responsibilities

New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator (a person using a mechanical digging device) for preventing damage to underground facilities. The law provides for a one-call system that the excavator can use free of charge to arrange to have underground facilities located and marked before an excavation occurs.

State law requires excavators to:

1. Plan your excavation.
2. Mark the excavation area in white.
3. Call before you dig.
4. Determine the location of any underground facilities.
5. Call the one call center if any facility is not marked to determine if it is "clear."
6. Preserve line location markings or provide offsets.
7. Expose any conflicts and maintain at least 18 inches of clearance from the horizontal mark and the edge of the mechanical digging device.
8. Support underground facilities during excavation as necessary.
9. Backfill in a careful manner.
10. Notify facility owners and 811 of any damage immediately.
11. Standard locate tickets are valid for 15 working days.

What happens when you call?

Once you provide the necessary information, the one call operator will confirm all pertinent details. It is your responsibility to ensure the information was properly recorded on the request. Likewise, faxed or on-line requests will be returned to you as confirmation, and it is your responsibility to immediately confirm the information is correct.

Escarbar: Sus Derechos y Responsabilidades

La ley de excavación de Nuevo México impone ciertas responsabilidades al excavador (Es una persona que utiliza un artefacto mecánico para escarbar) para prevenir daños a las instalaciones bajo tierra. La ley provee un sistema de "una llamada" que el excavador puede utilizar sin costo para hacer arreglos para que le localicen las instalaciones bajo tierra y que estas sean marcadas antes de que la excavación ocurra.

La ley requiere que los excavadores hagan lo siguiente:

1. Planeé su excavación.
2. Llamen antes de excavar.
3. Marcar el área de excavación en color blanco.
4. Determine la ubicación de cualquiera de las instalaciones existentes bajo tierra.
5. Llame al centro de "una llamada" si alguna de las instalaciones no está marcada para determinar si es seguro "proseguir".
6. Conserve la ubicación de las líneas o proporcione la distancia / desvió.
7. Avise de cualquier conflicto y manténgase al menos 18 pulgadas al margen y de la orilla de algún artefacto mecánico para escarbar.
8. Apoye/preserve las instalaciones bajo tierra según sea necesario cuando este excavando.
9. Rellene con cuidado.
10. Avise a los dueños de las instalaciones y marque al 811 inmediatamente para reportar cualquier daño.
11. Las peticiones estándar (ticket) son válidos durante 15 días hábiles solamente.

¿Qué pasa cuando usted llama?

Una vez que usted proporcione la información necesaria, la operadora de "una llamada" le confirmará acerca de los detalles pertinentes. Es su responsabilidad asegurarse de que la información sea registrada adecuadamente en el documento de la petición. Así mismo, mande por fax o por Internet su petición, se le mandara una confirmación, y es su responsabilidad corroborar de inmediato que la información es correcta.

Governor calls special session

In a move that had been anticipated, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham formally called a special session of the New Mexico Legislature Wednesday morning, to convene July 18, to take up public safety bills. It will be the fifth special session since Lujan Grisham first took office in 2019.

Lujan Grisham said the session was needed for lawmakers to continue work that was abbreviated during this year's 30-day session. New Mexico's legislative body is part-time and unsalaried, meeting for 30 days in even-numbered years and 60 days other years. The shorter sessions are intended to

focus on budgetary matters.

The special session was anticipated to call lawmakers back to Santa Fe for "several days," according to the governor's office.

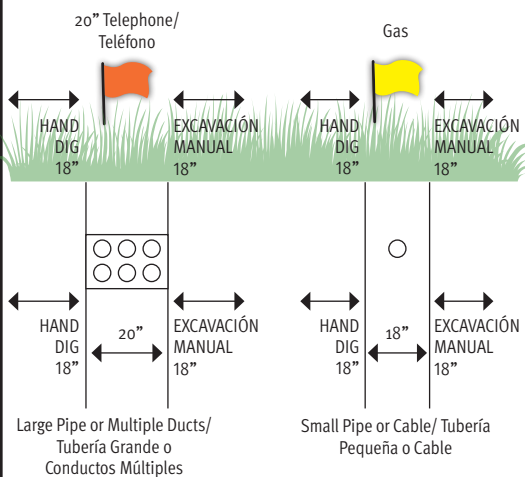
"While we made some progress toward a safer New Mexico during the 30-day session, we agree that we must do more,"

the governor stated in a news release. "The special session in July will enable us to deliver additional statutory changes that reduce the danger and risk new Mexico communities face every day. The best proposals for making our state safer will be under consideration, and I welcome input from my colleagues in the legislature."

Change can do you good – if you want to change

On my first day working at a psychiatric hospital, the head doctor compulsively laid this cutie on me: “Do you know how many California shrinks it takes to change a light bulb?” “Why, no,” I said. “Only one. But the light bulb really has to want to change.” Clever, I thought, as I faked a smile out of obligation.

Perhaps you’ve been vaguely contemplating a golf swing change. If so, you really have to want to change. If you’re like most golfers, you feel a lot of trepidation about doing this, particularly as it strikes you that you’re probably going to play worse before you play better for some time after a

major swing change. Plus, you’ll be looking at hitting 500 to 1,000 practice balls before the alteration becomes a fixed habit that you don’t have to think about. Any complicated change in your golf game, even new equipment, proves an arduous and troublesome task.

The very first thing I want you to ask yourself is: “What makes you think that you can do something about your present situation?” A typical response might be, “Well, my game has been slipping downhill for some time now and I’m feeling helpless. I’m a terrible golfer and

I need to do something different.” In other words your game stinks, you’re unhappy and it worries you, I reflect.

Next, I might inquire: “In what ways do your unacceptable golf scores thwart you from becoming the golfer you want to be?” A bit taken back, you answer, “I’ve always thought of myself as a pretty good golfer and a tough competitor. Now I suck, and I hate losing all the time. I’ve got to do something, anything.” That anguish is called “cognitive dissonance,” where there is a big discrepancy between our

perceived self-image and what reality tells us. It can be quite discouraging but also quite motivating.

Now I’d like you, my golf student, to tell me exactly how you see things being different with your new golf game, if you go ahead and make the major swing change you’re interested in. You will need to visualize yourself being successful – perhaps winning again – and feeling better about yourself as a result. This is a biggie. Change is hard, in golf and in life. But the rewards are most often worth the effort.

Continuing on, I’d like you to articulate the ways that you are encouraged and confident that you

can, and actually will, transform your golf swing into a wonderful model of solid fundamental moves. That is, understanding you want to do this, like a knee replacement.

Lastly, I’d like you to share with me your real intentions about revamping your golf swing. “Well, I think I want to,” you hedge. I’ve heard that before. Folks want to do better at golf and in business and in life, but they are afraid to make a commitment that might involve great sacrifice, major effort and personal transformation. Our safe comfort zone – the status quo – may not be the best, but in our soul we fear leaving it for the frightful and

complicated unknown.

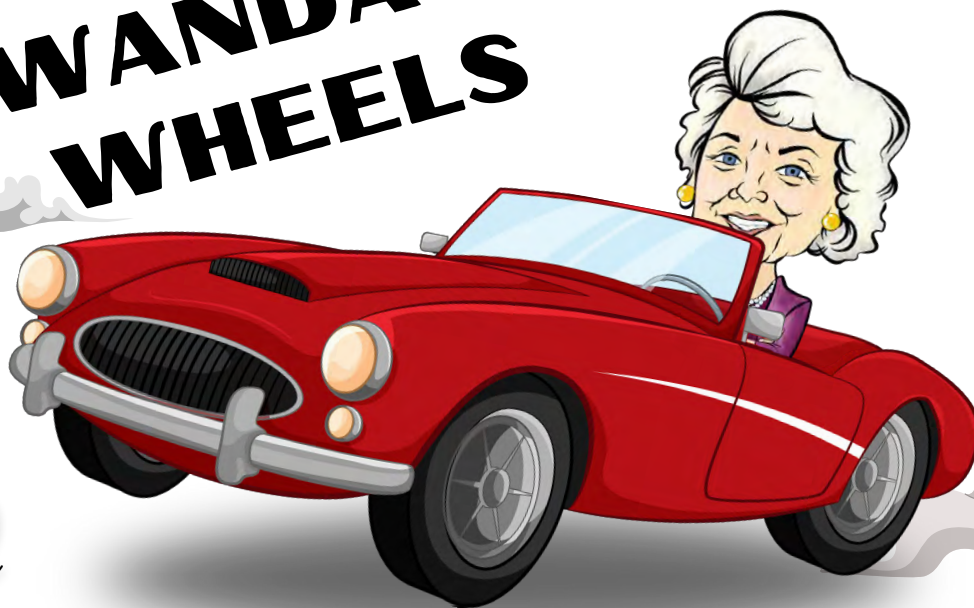
If you truly desire to make a quantum leap in your performance level, in anything, you absolutely must commit to making extensive changes in how you do things.

Changing a golf swing is a big deal for one’s golf game, but it’s not the only thing. Sometimes we need to change the way we hit our irons, how we putt, how we manage our self around the golf course and maybe our attitude. We can do that best with the help of a coach and teacher.
