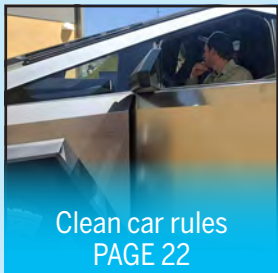

# Take a look at Las Cruces' community gardens

**G**race Foster has been selling her produce at the Las Cruces Farmers and Crafts Market for four years, setting up her table with Jerusalem artichokes, jujubes and other greens. She is a popular fixture at the market, offering unique products customers cannot always find at other produce stands.

Foster has over 80 jujube trees at her home, but the soil in her yard isn't conducive to growing some of the other vegetables she is interested in. As a solution, she rents community garden plots from the city.

Las Cruces' parks and recreation department manages four community gardens and has a waitlist for available plots. The gardens include the Sage, Las Esperanzas and Tony Gomez gardens. Russ Boor Community Garden at Munson Senior Center is also overseen by the city, but is largely cultivated by volunteers and provides fresh food to the senior center's kitchen.

Community gardens first

popped up in town around 2007, according to Franco Granillo, deputy director of the parks department. Las Esperanzas was the first, located on Picacho.

"There was interest between community gardeners, novice gardeners and people who just wanted to do something different in the community,"

Granillo said.

Community members who live in apartments, who do not have a backyard or who do not want

to plant in their own yard are among those who rent plots. He added that a similar mix of experienced gardeners and beginners, including children and parents, rent a plot from the department each year.

He said some people grow for fun and others to sell what they harvest, like Foster.

Orlando Flores, community forester for the city, oversees the

# Las Cruces man convicted in 2020 killing

## BULLETIN REPORT

A jury convicted a Las Cruces man last week, nearly four years after a shooting took the life of an 18-year-old.

Jeremiah Peña-Nieto, 21, was convicted of two tampering with evidence counts and conspiracy to commit tampering with evidence. The jury declined to convict Peña-Nieto of first-degree murder but did find he committed second-degree murder.

Police said that Peña-Nieto killed 18-year-old Jacob Daniel Becerra on Aug. 6, 2020. Peña-Nieto was 17 years old at the time.

According to court records, police discovered Becerra in a 2018 Kia Forte crashed against a light pole on E. Farney Lane near W. Park Drive. Further examination revealed Becerra had been shot.

After being held in jail for two years, Peña-Nieto was able to go to trial in May 2022. That trial ended in a mistrial after questions arose when prosecutors were unable to produce a toxicology report. At the time, the district attorney's office said they never received the report from the Las Cruces Police Department.

The trial was declared a mistrial, and Peña-Nieto

was allowed to leave jail on a \$20,000 bond.

Two years later, a jury found Peña-Nieto guilty of the shooting. Jail records show he's currently in the Doña Ana County Detention Center. A sentencing hearing has not yet been scheduled.

The Bulletin reached out to Peña-Nieto's attorney, Jeffrey Lahann, for comment on the trial and is awaiting a response.

# County appoints interim manager

Stephen Lopez, a county official who has overseen the area's emergency response to Covid-19 and the 2019 migrant crisis, was appointed as the interim county manager on April 23.

Fernando Macias, who served as county manager for six years,

leaves the job on April 30. Macias and the Board of County Commissioners failed to find common ground when negotiating the evaluation process for Macias' yearly review in February.

The vote to approve Lopez for the interim

position was unanimous. "(Lopez) is a level-headed, honest, transparent individual," said commissioner Susana Chaparro.

Lopez's appointment is effective May 1. He'll receive a yearly salary of \$162,000.

# Budget hike would add Las Cruces city staff

The Las Cruces City Manager's office presented a proposed budget with a \$14.9 million increase, mainly to hire new positions in the fire department and police department. New positions include three park rangers for the Las Cruces Police Department and two support staff for the fire department.

According to LCPD, the park rangers will patrol

the parks with similar authority to animal control and code officers. For the Las Cruces Fire Department, the positions include a social worker to join the Mobile Integrated Health Unit, which contains Project LIGHT.

The proposed hike would also pay for specialists in the human resources, sustainability, transit, IT and finance departments. Other positions include a new park maintenance worker and two custodians.

The expenditure increases, stemming from an increase in revenue, were presented at a budget work session on April 22. Overall, the general fund,

as presented, totaled \$166.7 million, a \$14.9 million increase from last budget's \$151.8 general fund.

Most of the general fund's revenue comes from gross receipts taxes on goods or services.

According to budget documents, about \$110 million (76 percent) of the general fund comes from gross receipts tax. The

Granillo added that Sage Community Garden on the east mesa will be relocating in the next year. The garden sits next to Sage Cafe senior center, which is in the process of expanding. He said a location is still being determined for the garden, but it will remain close to the senior center.

Applications for a garden plot open around February each year. Applicants must be residents of Las Cruces and pay a \$25 rental fee. After that, the plot is theirs, and can be decorated or customized to what the gardener is growing.

have a mind of their own. "You just harvest them right? Next year, they come back by themselves. I don't know where they come from, so (I) lost control," Foster laughed.

Flores said there are a few limitations on what gardeners can grow – nothing illicit and no perennials. He also said the department tries to maintain organic care in the garden, with the use of chemicals in some situations as a last resort.

As for the benefits of community gardens, they are numerous. Flores said aside from the benefits derived from what is actually grown in the gardens, people benefit from the community they find among fellow gardeners. Gardening is also a form of physical activity and gets people to spend some time outside, "getting their hands dirty" and playing "with Mother Nature a little bit," which can

garden program. He explained that there are 52 plots between the three gardens, which are typically at 100 percent occupancy. The waiting list has expanded in recent years, and Flores said that could lead to establishing more garden space in the future: "That may come down the road, we don't know yet."

Foster grows Jerusalem artichokes in her plots at the Tony Gomez Community Garden. The root vegetable is similar in appearance to ginger and has many nutritional benefits. Foster explained that the plant does better in the garden's more "sandy" soil rather than the clay soil at her home.

And after a few years of trial and error, she has her system of growing the vegetables down pat. Though she added that the plants

rate changes. \$1 million would also go to 16 new vehicles – six of which would be hybrid or electric – for seven departments.

The city's budget allocates funding for nearly all operations. The general fund supplies cash for most city services.

City staff prepare a budget that aligns with the mayor's and six councilors' synthesized wishes. The council then approves the budget via vote or sends it back to staff for revisions.

The budget goes into effect July 1 – the start of the fiscal year – and lasts until June 30 next year. Staff expect the council to approve the budget in May.

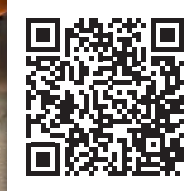

# City staff propose tax increase; decision could go to the voters in November

It's no secret. Las Cruces has infrastructure problems.

Some feel the parks need a facelift. Others want to see the police department increase capacity. Still, others point to numerous public works projects on the "to-do list" as a top priority. During a presentation about Las Cruces' budget on March 22, city staff outlined many of these problems

before proposing an ambitious two-part solution.

First, the plan would be to spend about \$22 million of the city's "Telshor fund." That would get the ball rolling, they said. But this fund is not recurring. Once the money is gone, it's gone.

Second, the city would launch a campaign to increase gross receipts taxes. This way, they argued, Las Cruces would have a recurring source of money to fund those sorts of initiatives.

The maximum increase would require a referendum by voters. If passed, Las Cruces would be unable to raise GRT rates again unless changes occurred at the state level. At its highest, the proposed increase would mean spending an additional .56 cents for every \$100 spent.

"We're just behind, and we need to get caught up with a lot of things. We need to spend some money for our public safety and for the greater good of our

scope, however. According to the agreement, it can only be spent on improving community health and safety. Barbara Bencomo, the city's chief administrative officer, said the city has allocated about \$5.4 million to six projects in the past.

Most of those projects were related to affordable housing. Others include efforts to alleviate homelessness in Las Cruces.

The fund is also restricted so that only the council can allocate the money. The city has maintained conservative spending on the fund. The lower the fund's value, the less the city can invest. Fear of losing out on investment return kept previous councils from spending down the fund.

If the council follows the staff's proposed plan, the fund's value will decrease drastically, from about \$42 million to an estimated \$14 million.

But, as staff argued, it could significantly impact poverty, infrastructure and safety.

"What I'm in favor of is, we spend the Telshor fund to get caught up on a lot of things that have been neglected, such as our parks," Mayor Enriquez said.

## What are the options?

Chris Faivre, the deputy

economic development director, also outlines other options for increasing Las Cruces' revenue. He highlights the challenges of each alternative while touting a GRT increase.

"We need to consider bold options for Las Cruces' future success," Faivre said.

The city relies on capital outlay for brick-and-mortar projects such as remodeling a recreational center. The money comes from state legislators. The problem with relaying that, Faivre said, is that it's subjected to the whims of legislators and limited in scope.

Faivre also noted a property tax increase would not distribute the share of the burden on non-residents, such as tourists who visit Las Cruces.

A general obligation bond was another option. Faivre said the challenge was that GO bonds are only available to Las Cruces every four years.

Cannabis excise tax money would likely not be enough. Besides, Faivre and other staff said they'd like to use that money to support economic development on S. Solano Drive, El Paseo Road and W. Picacho Avenue.

That leaves a GRT increase.

Faivre estimated that two changes could secure revenue of as much as \$20 million. Doing so requires two actions — one by the city council and one via voter referendum.

The city council could raise GRT by 0.2375

community," Mayor Eric Enriquez said.

## Needs the city seeks to address

Staff identified about \$20 million worth of needs in Las Cruces. They said:

- Legacy parks needed about \$2.55 million.
- Playground replacement efforts needed about \$1.5 million.
- Park construction and enhancement needed about \$400,000.
- Facility maintenance needed about \$1 million.
- The police real-time crime center needed about \$1.1 million.
- Fire Station 9 needed about \$2 million.
- Well monitoring needed about \$275,000.
- Affordable housing efforts needed about \$14 million.

Each department head also spoke about the specific needs of their area.

## The Telshor fund

When the city leased land along Telshor Boulevard, they received about \$26 million in 2004. That money has since been invested and grown. The fund contains about \$43 million today.

The money has a limited

percent through an ordinance. The increase would grow revenues by \$9 million per year. A referendum would increase GRT by \$11 million with a 0.3250 percent increase.

Faivre said that moving quickly on the latter option would allow the issue to get onto the ballot in November.

“Part of what you (Faivre) said is that these are bold options,” District 4 Councilor Johana Bencomo said. “Bold can sometimes be scary. I think we’re in a time – coming out of Covid; inflation is high – there are important considerations to be made and to have conversations with the public about just how expensive everything is right now.”

As that applies to household budgets, so, too, does it apply to the city, Bencomo said.

### Council’s response

The council mostly reserved comments on the proposed increase while acknowledging the issues involved and saying more conversations with Las Cruces residents need to happen.

“For this conversation to move forward, it’s really important that we do town halls and community outreach meetings,” Bencomo said. “Is that something that staff has talked about?”

Faivre said there’s been discussion about bringing the tax increase back to council in another work session, which could be in early June.

“There is a timeline that we need to adhere to if

we’re going to get this on the ballot in November,” Faivre said. “Which means we’d have to have consensus by early August.”

“If we do a work session on GRT, I’d love to understand all of our options,” Bencomo said, referring to property tax increases as one example.

### What is GRT, and where does Las Cruces stack up?

When things or services exchange hands, the government takes a small slice.

Technically, the tax is imposed on businesses, but nearly all businesses pass the tax along to the purchaser. GRT also varies throughout the state, since municipalities set different rates.

According to the state Taxation and Revenue Department, the range is between about 5.125 and 8.6875 percent, depending on the business’s location and what taxes it’s subjected to.

However, data presented by the city suggested some rates are higher. Staff presented 10 municipalities with a range of 7.6215 percent to over 9 percent. The breakdown was:

- Toas and Red River at 9 percent
- Santa Fe, Ruidoso, Sunland Park and Farmington at 8.1875 percent
- Anthony, New Mexico, at 8.125 percent
- Albuquerque at 7.6215 percent,
- Rio Rancho at 7.875 percent.

Las Cruces sits at 8.0625 percent, according to the presentation.

As the days heat up, you may be thinking about how to use water to keep cool in the coming months. As a reminder, spring and summer water restrictions in Las Cruces began April 1, 2024.

The annual restrictions prohibit the watering of outside vegetation between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

A watering schedule allows customers with even-numbered addresses within the city limits to water outside vegetation every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. Customers with odd-numbered



addresses are allowed to water their vegetation every Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday. No watering is allowed on Monday.

The Las Cruces Utilities Water Conservation Program has a recorded voicemail

Hotline, (575) 528-4444 and is available 24-hours to report water waste that includes:

- Watering on the wrong day or time.
- Water leaving the property or ponding on the property.
- Not using a

bucket and shut-off nozzle to wash vehicles or pavement.

When calling the Hotline provide the day, time, location, or address.

Las Cruces Utilities encourages residents to use water wisely to conserve for future demand.

# Local officials address threats against them

*This is the second of two parts of an in-depth look into intimidation of elected officials in New Mexico's two largest cities.*

Las Cruces City Council Johana Bencomo has been the target of harassment multiple times since taking office in 2017. As an elected official and, before that, as a community organizer advocating for poor and marginalized groups, she has been the focus of ire among some who oppose her approach to affecting change, her values and her beliefs about what government should do.

In March, as reported in part one of this story, she received a death threat in a voicemail message.

While Bencomo's experience was acute, another city councilor's experience has been a protracted ordeal.

Becki Graham, a councilor since 2021, told the Bulletin she's had a politically motivated stalker for three years. This wasn't

a surprise, as she was warned about them after she was elected.

"I would say that this person is very committed to making sure that I know they are watching me; they've got eyes on me at all times," Graham said. "Not just in the typical government watchdog way, but I've received messages that let me know just small things alluding to details of my house, making sure that they know where I live."

At times, Graham has seen the person driving by her house. On other occasions, the person sat near Graham's driveway and drove away upon discovery.

Graham and Bencomo said they've taken steps to protect themselves and their families. But their experiences have also forced them to choose between yielding to intimidation and persistence.

"I've been doing so much internal wrestling the last few days that now I'm angry about it," Bencomo said. "You will not intimidate me. I will keep doing the work that I have

chosen to do."

The experience has caused Bencomo to reevaluate her values. And she comes out with stronger beliefs.

"I'm now a victim, and I've definitely been (asking) do I believe justice is him being incarcerated? No, I don't," she said. "Do I believe nothing should happen? I also don't."

For Graham, the experience sparked questions about the long-term effects on democracy.

"Getting death threats, people are following me

home, it's just a huge loss in knowledge and dedication and experience in the whole democratic process," Graham said. "This is something with local relevance. And whether you like your current elected official or whether you don't, it's something that you should be concerned about if it's going to fundamentally affect the quality of government."

## Attacking democracy

The most well-known example of political vio-

lence against elected officials occurred up north.

Solomon Peña, 40, ran for an Albuquerque-area seat in the New Mexico House of Representatives during the November 2022 midterm elections. After his defeat, police said Peña organized four shootings at the homes of two Bernalillo County Commissioners and two state legislators.

Police also believe that Peña wanted the election he'd lost overturned. He believed it had been rigged, ensuring his

loss. In reality, Peña suffered defeat to Bernalillo County Democrat Miguel Garcia by more than 3,500 votes.

Peña's alleged violence struck a chord across the state, but it was felt uniquely by Doña Ana County Clerk Amanda López Askin. Before his arrest, Peña called for López Askin to be hanged on a fringe social media site.

"This man is alleged to have done this to these elected officials that he did not care for or you felt strongly about. And I just happen to live way south," López Askin said.

López Askin said she's been fielding intimidation against her and her office for six years. She became clerk in 2018, in one of the more memorable elections in southern New Mexico's history.

That year, Republican Yvette Herrell narrowly

lost to Democrat Xochitl Torres Small. A Democrat hadn't held the seat in a generation. For New Mexico Democrats, the win was monumental. But the unusual flip, combined with a delayed result due to a historic number of absentee ballots, fed unsubstantiated rumors of something more sinister.

"That caused the whole storm of misinformation and malinformation. And unfortunately, I continue to combat that specific election to this day," López Askin said.

Like other elected officials mentioned in the Brennan Center report, López Askin stepped away from social media as harassment online intensified. They poked fun at her appearance and called her names. It didn't matter how she responded or what she did, López Askin said. The accusations against her often had no basis in reality. They were just things made up, put online and regurgitated by a mindless algorithm.

The posters crossed a line, she said, when they used photos of her family and children to create memes at her expense.

"That was a very, very

tough professional time for me. It was really the point where I'd had to decide whether I was going to do this or not. And, obviously, I decided to," López Askin said. "But I wouldn't put my worst enemy in that position. It was really, really difficult."

López Askin was, as she put it, new to elected office at the time. While she had held a position on the New Mexico State University Board of Regents as a student, the county clerk was something new. As part of that, she dove deeper into the history of elections and the election code.

The deeper she researched that history, the more righteous she felt about her office's work regarding elections, aiming to impart this message and mission through her work.

"We cannot stop. They say there are no tears in baseball, but there is no relaxation in elections," she said.

### District Attorney under threat

For Doña Ana County District Attorney Gerald Byers, the question of threats and violence against political officials is a question of justice.

Byers was also the victim of a death threat. In 2023, an Ohio man left a racist voicemail calling for him to be killed. According to the FBI, the Ohio man believed that he had

every right to threaten Byers' life. That case also led to minor charges and remains pending.

Byers said local law enforcement sprung into action when the threats were delivered. He received police surveillance at his work and at home, for both him and his family.

"It is not common, it's not usual, and it is not considered part and parcel of being an elected official," he said.

But Byers, who also served in the U.S. Navy, said the experience has fortified his belief about public service.

"If I was going to quit just because somebody threatened my life, just because I'm an elected district attorney, then I would have had ample opportunity to quit for the last 26 years when I've

been a prosecutor," Byers said. "You don't let that deter you."

In some ways, Byers said the experience allowed him to step into the shoes of the crime victims who come through the prosecutor's office. It provides a point of empathy, he said. But Byers also said he thinks the legislature play a role in protecting public officials and public servants.

"I believe that it's important for the stability of our society and the state of New Mexico, for this matter to be brought before the legislature so that laws can be created that reflect the necessity of public safety for these times. The fact that so many public officials have been placed under threat speaks to that, and it speaks volumes," he said.

## Former deputy pleads guilty to sexual assault of arrestee

A former Doña Ana County Sheriff's deputy faces a decade in prison after federal investigators said he sexually assaulted a woman he was arresting.

Michael Martinez, 34, pleaded guilty today to violating the civil rights of a female arrestee by sexually assaulting her inside his patrol car and to obstructing justice by attempting to destroy his patrol car's in-unit cam-

era, according to a news release.

"Civil rights violations, particularly when they involve a member of law enforcement, are of tremendous concern," said Special Agent Raul Bujanda of the FBI Albuquerque Field Office in the news release. "The entire law enforcement profession is tarnished when an officer betrays the oath to protect and serve. The FBI will vigorously investigate any officer or agent of the law who is breaking the rules that he or she is sworn to uphold or is violating the civil rights of others."

According to court records, Martinez sexu-

ally assaulted a woman on April 30, 2023, while investigating a possible DWI. Federal investigators said he handcuffed her inside his DASO vehicle before sexually assaulting her. Later, police said Martinez attempted to destroy the camera inside his DASO unit because the camera captured footage of his assault.

A sentencing hearing has not yet been scheduled. Martinez faces a decade in prison, according to the news release. Martinez must pay restitution to the woman and, upon release, adhere to state and federal sex offender registration requirements.

## Competing against competition

Although the Federal Trade Commission voted to ban non-compete agreements nationwide this week, the argument is far from over.

The commissioners voted 3-2 Tuesday to strike down most non-competes in the interest of “protecting the fundamental freedom of workers to change jobs, increasing innovation, and fostering new business formation.”

The action is headed to court, with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce and other business orga-

nizations ready to go; and a judge might very well rule that the FTC got ahead of itself by acting without a directive from Congress.

The FTC says 18 percent of workers, or 30 million people, are covered by non-competes, depressing wages and startups. It also estimates that new patents would increase under the new rule, from 17,000 to 29,000 per year on average, presumably

because companies will look to patents to protect proprietary technology and design rather than curbing the mobility of their talent.

A federal study last year found that 98 percent of private companies in the U.S. require executives and managers to sign these agreements, but NCA use has expanded to include even some hourly workers. It also holds down wages and leads to hires of less

experienced workers, with deleterious salary affects suffered by women and people of color in particular.

The plaintiffs in the coming lawsuit may well prevail on their process argument, and by keeping the debate in the arena of congressional politics they could fend off NCA reform indefinitely. Bipartisan efforts in Washington have, after all, fallen one after another. About a dozen states have acted to prevent non-competes for low-wage workers while

three have banned them altogether.

Technologies exist to protect proprietary information and business thrives even in states that have barred non-competes. Non-disclosure agreements and other means of protecting confidentiality and client relationships are not endangered.

Large private employers have simply grown accustomed to disciplining the workforce instead, and they won't surrender that policy without a fight.

## Law must be able to hold all accountable

While mental illness isn't a crime, it's also not a permission slip to excuse crimes.

Yet that's what happens in New Mexico once a defendant has been found by the court to be mentally incompetent to stand trial. It's a “get out of jail free” card for future crimes. That freedom from accountability has allowed a small number of offenders to act with increasing brazenness against both property owners and police.

“We deal with them all day, every day,” Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story said during a recent community radio interview. “If there is one

thing that would have the biggest effect, it's dealing with competency. District Court had 141 cases in three years. Those are all crimes. So, where there are no consequences, just dismissed and that's it ...

of course we're going to continue to see this.” Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham has called for a special session starting July 18 to address the problem. She wants judges to have the authority to order those unable to stand trial into mandatory treatment programs.

Legislation was intro-

duced during the regular session that would have required the court to conduct a same-day hearing on competency and dangerousness within 30 days after an initial finding that a defendant is not competent

to stand trial. Those found competent would go to trial. If the finding is incompetent but not dangerous, charges would be dismissed but could be filed again later. Those found to be both incompetent and dangerous would be eligible for involuntary civil commitment to a treatment center.

Bills were filed in both the House and Senate, but neither made it through the committee process.

There are serious civil liberties issues any time the government is considering new laws to enhance its power to take away the freedom of its citizens. As I noted in the first line of this column, mental illness is not a crime. Those unable to speak for themselves must be well represented to ensure their rights are protected.

Successful implementation of this new strategy will require a substantial investment in mental health treatment that reaches all corners of

our state. We've got to do more than just keep dangerous people off the street for 30 days at a time.

There's a lot to work out in a special session that the governor hopes to wrap up in a few days. Especially given that she also wants to address panhandling laws and enhanced penalties for felons in possession of a gun.

Special sessions are not conducive to thoughtful, deliberate debate on complicated issues. Our unpaid legislators don't want to be there. Even Democrats who agree

# A tribute to my homeland, the Gila Wilderness

Everyone has a homeland. Mine is the Gila National Forest and Wilderness Area. The Chihéne Ndé or Gila Apache and the Leyva surname go back hundreds of years. Spaniards called us Gileño and Mimbrenño Apaches of the Gila and Mimbres Rivers in New Mexico.

You may have never been able to visit the Gila Wilderness; however, spiritual healing awaits if you come. You will leave with a profound appreciation for life. The sights, smells and sounds of the Gila grasslands, pine forests and wildlife are in Catron and Grant County.

This year, we mark the centennial of the Gila Wilderness, the first designated wilderness on Earth. It's a place of profound historical significance to me. This year also commemorates 150 years since the closure of the Southern Apache Indian Agency in the Tularosa River Valley.

The Gila Apache, whose identity gave the wilder-

ness its name, have a rich history. In 1626, the Spanish missionary Fray Alonso de Benavides chronicled his relationship with our leader, Captain Sanaba, and our people as Apaches de Xila, later spelled Gila. As natural stewards of the land, we sustained ourselves through small-scale farming, hunting and gathering.

Before the U.S. occupied the New Mexico Territory, Spain and Mexico had participated in peace agreements with the Gila Apache and acknowledged the tribe's territory in treaties. My ancestors had semi-annual gathering locations, and subsistence patterns spanned hundreds of miles south. By the late 1700s, Spanish officials had established presidios from Arizona to Texas near today's international border. They created peace reserves where some of my family resided and served as scouts and liaisons for the Spanish military.

In 1804, the Spanish established a military garrison at El Cobre copper mine less than 20 miles

from present-day Silver City. Encroachment by the Spanish military brought tension, while Mexican desires for independence from Spain became definite. In 1832, the Gila Apache worked plots of land on the Mimbres River, growing corn and other vegetables like beans, squash, and melons. Family members living near presidios returned to the Gila and Mimbres River communities when the Mexican republic defaulted on promises to provide Apaches with provisions.

In 1882, the U.S. General Land Office returned set aside lands for the Gila Apache to the public domain. The 1885 Report to the Board of Indian Commissioners by Merrill E. Gates describes the outcome of the Leyva Ranch on the Tularosa Valley Indian Reservation at Apache Creek. Gates asserted an agent informed him, "I knew a most deserving Indian who selected a ranch 100 miles from the reservation twelve years ago. He has lived there since quietly, raised seven children,

and built a house and a corral. Four years ago, he went to Santa Fé to get a title to his land. He paid some scoundrel \$160 for a worthless paper, the man representing himself as the United States land agent."

Today, we find ourselves in southwest New Mexico, still without the

permanent reservation promised in Governor David Meriweather's treaty. Our tribal elders adamantly reject the 1941 decision to remove the Gila Apache from the national list of Indian tribes. The Indian Affairs Office's unilateral removal of our name without consent is a stark reminder

of the ongoing struggle for recognition. In 2024, the Chihéne Ndé Nation of New Mexico took a significant step by petitioning the Department of the Interior's Office for Federal acknowledgment. Once approved, the tribe desires to purchase private land for traditional ceremonies.

with the governor want to get back home as soon as possible. Negotiations take place behind closed doors, and the public comment is typically restricted and irrelevant.

And so, while the

governor has correctly identified the problem, it remains to be seen what solution, if any, will come from this special session.

What is clear is that something needs to change. Police need to be able to do their jobs. Business owners and their customers need to be

able to operate safely and without harassment. And those who break the law and violate the security of others need to understand that they will be held responsible for their actions.

## 'In the Next Room' offers good vibes at Black Box

Few plays brilliantly tie together multiple thought-provoking themes. Fewer illicit consistent laughter. No Strings Theatre Company's

production of Sarah Ruhl's "In the Next Room, or the Vibrator Play" does both.

How do we reconcile our own needs with another's needs? How does technology alter human behavior? Can one person be expected to be everything

to us? How can we be swirling in such profound thoughts while also swept up in laughter?

Though I've seen this play in multiple productions in multiple cities, I still found myself leaning forward in my seat with excitement over how these characters' wants collide.

Don't be put off by the title.

While the plot centers on a doctor treating women with hysteria via a vibrator in the 1880s, it's no more scandalous than Meg Ryan's famous faked climax in a deli (in the film "When Harry Met Sally"). Director Joshua Taulbee wisely managed staging and designs that are suggestive

but not quite realistic.

While this play presents many challenges that intimidate professional directors and theater companies, this team manages them well. An actor plays piano effectively enough. The demands of the period set, costumes and props are met with obvious care. The set is quite beautiful and each new costume was a delight as the play progressed. The required interplay between ongoing action in both the doctor's office and parlor is remarkably timed. I often found myself appropriately forgetting one side of the action was occurring because I was so entranced by the other.

The ensemble is fantastic. Each of the seven cast members explores the complexities of the story respectfully.

As Dr. Givings, a specialist in gynecological concerns, William Harrold is appropriately serious, stiff and, though oblivious, not uncaring. As his troubled wife, Rachel Thomas-Chappell's training is obvious as she embodies curiosity, frustration, playfulness, flirtation,

yearning and so much more.

The contradictions within every character are scripted exquisitely, and they were brilliantly inhabited by three actors in particular. Rachel Maze plays Leo with a Jack Sparrow-ian charm and unpredictability. Lisa Taylor's Elizabeth is warm but remains business-like until she cracks open with a sensational, unforgettable monologue. Cassandra Galban is perfection as Mrs. Daldry, an overwrought patient. She imbues each word with incredible sincerity and every movement with a mix of honest awkwardness and grace. Interplay between the wives was positively delectable.

While it isn't uncommon that the performers frequent a certain stage in any town, it is notable that the properties designer, scenic artist, board operators and lighting designer take evident pride in their creative tasks on show after show at this theater.

It is remarkable that the

# 'Addams Family' a creepy, kooky crowd-pleaser

Something spook-tacular is brewing at the ASNMSU Center for the Arts, but only for a limited time. The latest production by the American Southwest Theatre Company and the New Mexico State University Theatre Arts department, "The Addams Family," a musical comedy, has reconnected us to one of our collective guilty pleasures. Yes, that's right, the creepy, kooky, all-American family, based on Charles Addams' beloved cartoons, have brought their special brand of spooky to the stage in a spirited song and dance

fest.

These are not usually the kinds of words one associates with The Addams Family, but the 2010 Broadway hit – which ran for 722 performances and earned two Tony nominations, including best original score – is a finger-snapping sensation. Expertly directed by Lisa Hermanson, with musical direction of an occasionally cacophonous pit orchestra by Peyton Womble, the cast of young performers ably step into the well-worn shoes of the iconic characters with an enthusiasm that is infectious.

In the original, if somewhat familiar story, the popular characters find

themselves facing a new challenge. Wednesday is all grown up and ready for love. Unfortunately, the love she's found is with "so normal, he's from Ohio," letter-jacket-wearing Lucas Beneke. To make matters worse, Wednesday has decided to bring the two families together for one unforgettable evening. The result is almost disastrous, and therein lies the tale.

In the key roles of Gomez and Morticia Addams, Mario Montiel and Mattie Ruminer are delightful in their romantically entwined roles as patriarch and matriarch of a rowdy, unconventional family. Eva Cullen as Wednesday Addams,

and Delaney Dwyer as Lucas Beneke make the most of their central love story, with a cuteness factor that literally makes young Pugsly Addams, played with mopey verve by Julian Castro, retch. Benjamin Ramsey and Greta Greenblatt hit all the right notes as the frightfully normal Ohio parental figures whose world is turned upside down.

Standouts of this production are not unexpected. Carlos Huereca as the rhapsodic lunatic

Uncle Fester, who darts around the stage with a vitality and delivery that rivals most depictions of the character, is a crowd pleaser. Making the most of smaller parts with memorable moments are Emma Kenney as Grandma Addams, and Camren Vugteveen as the shambling dogsbody, Lurch. The final ingredients – physical comedy, dead-on script, and delightful dance numbers – make for an enjoyably energetic evening.



A simple, yet effective set by Aaron Krohn, and uncommonly glitzy costumes by Heather Striebel, round out the eerie composition. The only thing missing from this production are the puppets which, apparently, gave an added texture to the Broadway version and are, thus, a disappointing omission. Even so, as the opening night's multi-generational crowd will attest, there is something for everybody and laughs aplenty. You might even find yourself humming a few of the toe-tapping tunes long after the fact.

"The Addams Family" has its final weekend run April 26 – 28, 2024, at the ASNMSU Center for the Arts on the New Mexico State University campus. More information is available online at Theatre.NMSU.edu.

production was so well rehearsed considering that Taulbee, as director and set designer, also had to step into a role during tech week. It was just another challenge he managed admirably.

Whether you attend theatre regularly or not, if you've read this far, I

urge you to make it to this play. Take a friend whose thoughts you want to investigate. Plan for pie and a discussion afterwards. When I commended producers Ceil and Peter Herman for choosing to take a risk with this work, she said, "It shouldn't be a risk. It's a great play." And yet, attending even great plays is often a risk in community theaters.

Please take that risk with this one.

# Raising voices, bringing classical style to the borderlands

When Jorge Martinez-Rios started with music as a child, he had no use for opera. But then, as a musician, he started hearing it.

“As soon as I started listening – one aria and another one – then seeing a full opera and then I thought, how can you not like it?” he said.

Now, as a sought-after musician himself and maestro, conducting for a number of area orchestras, he has a dream of introducing the people of the borderlands to some professional opera experiences.

Martinez-Rios and Erik Maese, CEO of Borderland Arts Foundation, have created an organization to expand the music experience in Las Cruces and surroundings. And on May

3 and 5 they will present a full-blown concert version of Puccini’s tragic opera, *La Bohème*.

Among the guest performers are Santa Fe Opera apprentice artist, soprano Adia Evans; tenor Jehú Otero, a 2022-23 resident artist at Utah Opera; soprano Emily Michiko Jensen of the Boston Lyric Opera; and baritone Brandon Bell, resident artist at Pittsburgh Opera.

“This is a great collaboration with professional musicians from the region, the NMSU Philharmonic Orchestra, NMSU Opera Workshop, Centennial High School Choir and singers from the Santa Fe Opera,” Martinez-Rios said. “It’s going to be a really amazing production.”

The idea, he said, is to bring opera to Las Cruces, a taste of what happens in Santa Fe with an educational component for

the children in our community.

On Thursday, May 2, Borderland Arts, La Frontera Opera is also hosting “Student Night at the Opera,” bringing in 500 area students to experience a sample of opera. They will hear arias from different voices and stories of opera and plot.

“I think what we are doing is key,” Martinez-Rios said. “Just a little taste and maybe one student will hear the soprano or the tenor or the bass and be like, that’s amazing, I want to do that, I think I can sing, and they will start singing and maybe they will have the concentration to

hear a full opera.

“So, I think the most important thing for us leaders is to blend the seed of arts. Give them the right tools so they grow, doing productive things in life.”

Maese said the goal of La Frontera Opera includes trying to provide more arts opportunities in southern New Mexico: “Part of our mission is to not just be focused on Las Cruces, but to truly be a regional orchestra where we can go to smaller communities where they don’t have opportunities for symphonic works or opera. That’s why it’s called borderlands.”

It has been a little over a year since Borderland Arts Foundation was incorporated and “in that short period of time you can just see the need for it in the community because so many people are interested,” he said.

“We have so much potential down here,” Maese said. “People shouldn’t have to drive all the way to Santa Fe to get good opera. We want to be the second institution in New Mexico where these really good up-and-coming singers can really come and sing.”

## ‘Flowering of Precious Knowledge’ opens at the Branigan Cultural Center

The Branigan Cultural Center is excited to announce a new exhibit, Tlazoh Amoxochitl: Florecimiento del Conocimiento Preciosos: Flowering of Precious Knowledge, featuring artwork that investigates pre-Hispanic Mesoamerican cultural traditions painted by K-5 students at the Raices del Saber Xinachtli Community School. The exhibit opens on May 3 and runs through June 22. There is an opening reception scheduled from 5-7 p.m. on Friday, May 3. Students and teachers from the Raices del Saber Xinachtli Community School will be in attendance. An Aztec dancing group will perform during the reception.

This exhibit presents 43 paintings that represent the young students’ interpretations of pre-Hispanic stories

and legends of Mesoamerica. Drawing from oral traditions, the students were exposed to stories in school about how corn was created, how a girl and a monster produced the cacao tree and the symbolism of death and resurrection found in the change of caterpillars to butterflies. From these stories, the K-5 students created a wide range of artwork. Objects that are used to process corn and cacao beans are part of the exhibition.

The Raices del Saber Xinachtli Community School offers a multicultural and bilingual curriculum that infuses indigenous Mesoamerican teachings and traditions in a child-centered dynamic. The artwork presented in the exhibit was created in an afterschool program that was taught by teacher Diana Ginez during the spring 2024 semester.

**Q:** During the recent tribute night to Ryan O'Neal on Turner Classic Movies, several mentions of "Peyton Place" were made. Can you tell me what that was?

**A:** It was a television series that brought initial fame to O'Neal before his 1970 movie performance as Oliver Barrett IV in "Love Story" took his popularity to an even higher level. Based on a best-selling novel by Grace Metalious about a scandal-ridden town, "Peyton Place" had been made into a 1957 movie first, then it was turned into a prime-time serial that ABC aired several times weekly for a while. It started in 1964 with two new episodes per week, then went to three episodes in 1965 and then back to two, until it ultimately was reduced to one episode weekly toward the end of its run in 1969.

O'Neal was cast as Rodney Harrington, whose romance with Allison MacKenzie (Mia Farrow) helped make O'Neal a darling of fan magazines. Rodney already had a girlfriend in Betty Anderson (Barbara Parkins), generating a love triangle that certainly captured public interest. Farrow left the show after a couple of seasons to pursue a film career that notably included the 1968 thriller "Rosemary's Baby."

For O'Neal, "Peyton Place" was a longer job, and he stayed just about until the end of its run. He had made the movie "The Big Bounce" (1968) with fellow "Peyton Place" co-star — and, for several years, wife — Leigh Taylor-Young while he was still on the show, but his subsequent film "The Games" (1970) had even bigger significance to his career. It was written by Erich Segal, also the writer of "Love Story"; he suggested O'Neal for the latter picture, which couldn't have hurt in terms of the actor landing the Oliver role.

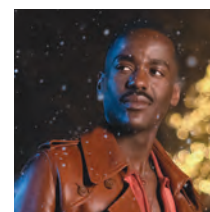

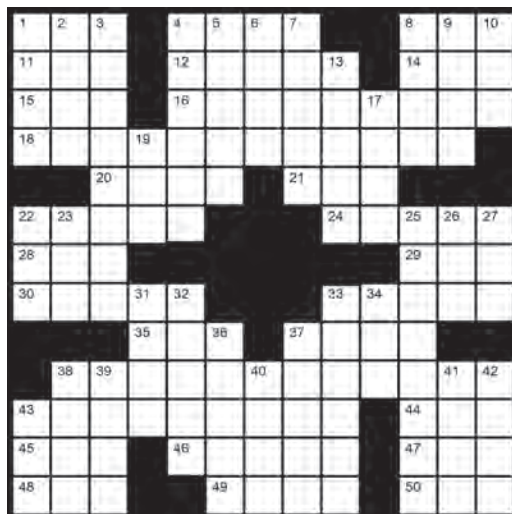

### "MEAN GIRLS"

Timed to the 20th anniversary of the original movie, this recent remake stays pretty close to the approach of the first version, though it also adopts the stage musical that was derived from the Tina Fey-created tale. A school newcomer (played by Angourie Rice) finds herself embraced by the ruling female clique that's tellingly known as "The Plastics," until she takes an interest in the leader's (Renee Rapp) ex-beau, leading to a major falling-out — and a payback scheme for the ages. This was a reasonable box-office success, though the original is one of those movies that never will be displaced by those who love it feverishly — and there are a lot of those people. Auli'i Cravalho ("Moana"), Busy Philipps and Jenna Fischer ("The Office") also appear, with Fey and Tim Meadows returning from the first film's cast. # Grupo Control headlines second annual ¡Mira! Las Cruces April 27

Visit Las Cruces' annual ¡Mira! Las Cruces fest kicks-off its second year with an expanded presence in the heart of downtown and an all-new live performance lineup. The event is designed to highlight the city's art and culture, cuisine, outdoor recreation, sights and sounds.

# April a month to remember Shakespeare

For poet and playwright William Shakespeare, a giant of English-language literature even 400 years after his death, April seems to be a central month.

While his precise birth date is unknown, he was baptized in Stratford-upon-Avon on April 26, 1564. Some observe his birthday on April 23, which matches the date of his death in 1616. Little is known about how he died at age 52, though the records that exist suggest it was sudden. One contemporary account suggests he suffered a fever from a condition that remains obscure.

The lack of historical documents only contributes to the speculation about his existence and the authorship of his works – but no one speculates that it is actually Francis Bacon who lies in Shakespeare’s grave.

April was the setting of Shakespeare’s Sonnet 98, where the ferocity of spring offers little consolation for the pain of separation from the poet’s beloved.

*From you have I been absent in the spring,  
When proud-pied April, dressed in all his  
trim,  
Hath put a spirit of youth in everything,  
That heavy Saturn laughed and leaped  
with him.  
Yet nor the lays of birds, nor the sweet smell  
Of different flowers in odour and in hue,  
Could make me any summer’s story tell,*

*Or from their proud lap pluck them where  
they grew:  
Nor did I wonder at the lily’s white,  
Nor praise the deep vermilion in the rose;  
They were but sweet, but figures of delight  
Drawn after you, – you pattern of all those.  
Yet seem’d it winter still, and, you away,  
As with your shadow I with these did play.*

## Clean car rules will move ahead despite dealers asking for pause

The Environmental Improvement Board and the Albuquerque-Bernalillo County Air Quality Control Board shot down an attempt to delay the implementation of the clean car rule earlier this month.

The decision came after various auto dealers appealed the rule that the entities adopted in November and asked for a delay pending a court ruling.

The EIB voted 4-1 to reject the request to pause implementation pending a court ruling. Meanwhile the air quality control board unanimously rejected the request.

EIB Member William Honker recused himself from the vote, stating that he had not been able to participate in the

hearing leading up to the vote. J. Barry Bitzer cast the sole dissenting vote.

Auto dealers argued during a hearing leading up to the decision that the clean car rule will drive up costs of used ve-

hicles and burden the sellers with new electric vehicles that they would be unable to sell because of low demand.

But proponents of the rule say that it will increase availability of electric vehicles for people who currently are going out of state to buy them and will lead to reduced air pollution from the transportation sector.

“The new rules will generate millions of dollars in health and economic benefits by transitioning to clean transportation and energy generation,” Ona Porter of Prosperity Works said in a press release following the decision.

“Transportation is the second highest climate-polluting sector in the state, behind oil and gas extraction, so bringing more zero-emission vehicles to the state can cut tailpipe pollution at the source.”

Additionally, proponents say the rule will give New Mexico an advantage in the transition to electric vehicles.

“We applaud the Environmental Improvement Board for reinforcing their earlier ruling in support of cleaner air for everyday New Mexicans,” Samantha Kao, the climate and energy director for Conservation Voters New Mexico, said in a statement. “The major automakers have repeatedly committed to all new cars being electric by the mid-2030s. The clean cars rules let New Mexicans get a

jump start on vehicle competition, lower costs and healthier air for their communities.”

The rule will not require people to purchase electric vehicles, as some of the opponents have claimed. Nor is it solely focused on electric vehicles. Manufacturers can also meet the requirements by delivering other zero-emission vehicles such as those powered using hydrogen fuel cells or some plug-in electric hybrids.

Nor will it require the dealerships in rural parts of the state to sell higher numbers of electric vehicles.

Instead, the rule requires manufacturers to deliver more new electric vehicles to New Mexico starting in calendar year 2026 and increasing in subsequent years. The bulk of those vehicles could, in theory, be sold at dealerships in urban areas such as Albuquerque or Santa Fe, where there is more demand for electric transportation and more access to charging infrastructure.

Additionally, people who live in the Public Service Company of New Mexico’s service territory may be able to participate in the Whole House Electric Vehicle pilot rate that can significantly reduce the cost to charge a vehicle at home.

During its deliberations, the EIB considered factors such as whether the auto dealers would face substantial harm and if they are likely to succeed in getting the rule overturned through the court appeal.

The deliberations took place in closed session and the EIB voted in open session immediately afterward.

# New Mexico awarded \$156M for solar program

The federal Environmental Protection Agency announced Monday that New Mexico will receive \$156 million from a \$7 billion program allocated to statewide “Solar for All” programs, mostly investing in shared energy systems accessible by multiple households. The announcement came on “Earth Day,” observed on April 22.

New Mexico aims to assist nearly 21,000 households that might not otherwise be able to install solar energy systems.

Nationwide, per the EPA, the program will bring shared solar energy infrastructure to 900,000 households in low-income communities.

“Collectively, these programs will deliver on the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund’s objectives by reducing greenhouse gas emissions and other air pollution, delivering cost savings on electric bills for overburdened households, and unlocking new markets for distributed solar in 25 states and territories that have never had a statewide low-income solar program before,” the EPA states on its website.

New Mexico’s program will be administered by the state Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, per a news release. The departments Energy Conservation and



Management Division estimated the program will save households over \$299 million over 20 years in energy costs and prevent the release of 116,628 tons of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere, while producing an estimated 8.1 megawatt hours for stored energy when sunlight is insufficient.

The infrastructure will consist of shared solar access projects, according to the EPA, which will allow multiple households including multifamily units, such as apartment houses, to draw power generated from solar energy. Additionally, EMNRD says it plans to coordinate local utility infrastructure upgrades with the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission to assure the community solar systems will function properly. The first installations under the program are expected to begin in 2025.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham called the EPA competitions “an unprecedented investment in clean, affordable renewable energy for low-income

communities across the country” in a statement.

The governor’s office said additional grants will support roof repairs for solar panel installation and installations in areas where community solar power is not feasible, such as those with households not connected to a power grid but who could be served with battery backup power.

ECMD Division Director Rebecca “Puck” Stair stated in a news release that an Environmental Justice Advisory Committee would be working with state agencies to help ensure the program benefits low-income residents.

The environmental justice aspect aligns with a Biden Administration policy goal of assuring 40 percent of federal investments in cleaner energy and affordable housing, among other priorities, benefit disadvantaged communities often inequitably burdened by pollution and lack of development; as well as a federal goal of reaching net-zero emissions by 2050.

# State issues notice of breach to Alma d'Arte

The state Public Education Commission voted unanimously on Friday that Alma d'Arte Charter High School was in breach of its charter, following a lengthy meeting addressing numerous concerns with respect to governance, financial oversight,

academic performance (particularly in math and science), poor attendance and the school's relations with students and their families.

All seven members present approved the resolution for a notice of breach of contract to Alma d'Arte, calling on its leadership "to re-establish a respectful, safe and ef-

fective learning environment at the school."

The notice of breach is a formal step in an intervention process to assist struggling charter schools and keep them on track for renewal of their authorizations.

The school's principal, Adam Amador, sat next to the school's board president, Richelle Peugh-Swafford, in front of the commissioners over an hours-long discussion in Santa Fe. The PEC is a 10-member elected body authorizing and overseeing state-chartered public schools.

Alma d'Arte, founded in 2004, was founded as an arts-integration secondary school, housed on the former Court Junior High School campus near downtown Las Cruces. Its current charter is in effect through 2027.

The meeting examined the school's annual report by the Charter Schools Division and an array of past concerns and corrective actions by the school pertaining to financial audit findings, policies and procedures, chronic absenteeism, special education and other services.

The school's communication with families and lack of a current grievance policy ensuring their right to raise concerns and enter complaints, was also a topic of discussion, including a recent decision to end public comment at public meetings of its governance council.

Amador, in his first year

as principal – its third in as many years – said he inherited disorder with important policies outdated, financial disarray and chronic absenteeism while some students who did attend were focused on art and not on academics. He pledged transparency in his efforts to turn around the school's academic performance, push for updated policies and bring the school into consistent compliance with its charter and state requirements.

Friday's process was not sudden: The Charter School Division as well as the Public Education Department had engaged with the school over a number of issues, and much of the meeting detailed responses the school had made, including progress in some areas and some areas where more or clearer

documentation of its actions was desired.

"My priorities are getting the ship righted right now," Amador told the commissioners, "and it's a lot of work that we don't have staff for, so we're doing it one piece at a time as quickly as we can."

Adding to the stress on the school community has been rapid turnover of the school's governing board, which assumes the responsibilities of a school board for the charter school and supervises its head administrator. At its April 15 meeting, they accepted the latest in a string of resignations from the board, this time by Ron Fitzherbert. Three of the board's current six members joined the board just last month.

Commissioners also noted staff dismissals during the school year as a factor in the current tur-

moil on campus.

Commissioner Timothy Beck of Santa Fe wondered whether student absenteeism was a message.

"It appears the kids don't want to come to school ... there's got to be a reason they don't want to come."

Meanwhile, the PEC's chair, Patricia Gipson of Las Cruces, said the school had not provided documentation it had promised to show the steps they took prior to disenrolling students. Additionally, the CSD recommended a financial corrective action plan as a way to watch the process and assure follow-through by the school.

## Public input and community relations

Gipson directed some of her criticism to the

school’s governing board, arguing that a practice of reviewing and updating policies on a regular basis should have been in effect and the failure to do so was now falling on Amador: “It’s not his job to be working on this. It was the job of the board to already have that.”

In particular, Gipson faulted the school’s lack of a grievance policy for students and families that assured their rights: “This is people’s voices that aren’t being heard. They’re being dismissed. I don’t care if it’s one parent or 100 parents — but everyone has as right to be acknowledged and to be responded to.”

Commissioner Alan Lee Brauer Jr. of Santa Fe noted public input at the start of Friday’s meeting from parents who had traveled from Las Cruces to address commissioners with concerns about the school’s leadership, as well as the formation of a local “Save Alma” group.

Brauer suggested Amador should be seeking meetings with the group and to improve relationships with the community: “It’s not about being right, it’s about problem-solving. It’s about hearing somebody and addressing the need before it gets on fire.”

Alma d’Arte’s recent decision to end public comments at governance council meetings was mentioned by a few commissioners. The action

followed a meeting in March where a former student used an expletive and insulted Amador from the podium, prompting the principal’s wife to call police.

The next meeting, on April 15, excluded public comment from the agenda, a move that was protested by some members of the audience, who stomped on the floor during Amador’s presentation. The meeting also introduced the presence of private security guards who insisted members of the public sign in with their names to be admitted.

The Open Meetings Act does not require a forum for public comment, but Gipson said allowing some venue for community input – even if it was separate from the business meetings, perhaps online – made for “better informed” policy.

“That goes back to respect,” Beck added. “Respect for other people’s opinions, other people’s voices, other people’s ideas.”

Amador countered by saying some ideas and voices were being suppressed by bad behavior and bullying and that the board needed to establish rules of decorum at business meetings. “I’ve asked the board, do not put open comment until a time that the public can behave in a manner becoming of an educational setting,” he said.

Even so, Commissioner Michael Taylor of Roswell asked Amador, “What message does that send? ... How are you handling

the messaging and communication to those who serve and the people of the community? That’s what I think you need to do better, honestly.”

Acknowledging that Amador inherited a large number of outstanding problems, Taylor urged him to engage with community members upset about the state of the school and exhibit “an earnest desire and respect for the people we serve.”

## School to report to PEC in June

The resolution to issue a notice of breach encompassed a list of charter provisions and other concerns pertaining to academic progress, governance and financial oversight, plans for handling student and parent complaints, admission and enrollment policies, and compliance with legal requirements for special education services and attendance.

The resolution also calls on the school to report to the PEC’s June meeting on its academic progress.

Just before the vote, Commissioner Steven Carrillo of Santa Fe echoed some of his colleagues in saying the action was about serving youth.

“We’re ensuring that any child and family that attends Alma has a certain culture at the school that they need: It’s safe, and then they can learn. Everything is set up for them to learn on every level. That’s what we’re doing for kids today.”

# Know what's below. Call before you dig.

## Digging: Your Rights & Responsibilities

New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator (a person using a mechanical digging device) for preventing damage to underground facilities. The law provides for a one-call system that the excavator can use free of charge to arrange to have underground facilities located and marked before an excavation occurs.

### State law requires excavators to:

1. Plan your excavation.
2. Mark the excavation area in white.
3. Call before you dig.
4. Determine the location of any underground facilities.
5. Call the one call center if any facility is not marked to determine if it is “clear.”
6. Preserve line location markings or provide offsets.
7. Expose any conflicts and maintain at least 18 inches of clearance from the horizontal mark and the edge of the mechanical digging device.
8. Support underground facilities during excavation as necessary.
9. Backfill in a careful manner.
10. Notify facility owners and 811 of any damage immediately.
11. Standard locate tickets are valid for 15 working days.

### What happens when you call?

Once you provide the necessary information, the one call operator will confirm all pertinent details. It is your responsibility to ensure the information was properly recorded on the request. Likewise, faxed or on-line requests will be returned to you as confirmation, and it is your responsibility to immediately confirm the information is correct.

1. Planeé su excavación.
2. Llamen antes de excavar.
3. Marcar el área de excavación en color blanco.
4. Determine la ubicación de cualquiera de las instalaciones existentes bajo tierra.
5. Llame al centro de “una llamada” si alguna de las instalaciones no está marcada para determinar si es seguro “proseguir”.
6. Conserve la ubicación de las líneas o proporcione la distancia / desvíu.
7. Avise de cualquier conflicto y manténgase al menos 18 pulgadas al margen y de la orilla de algún artefacto mecánico para escarbar.
8. Apoye/ preserve las instalaciones bajo tierra según sea necesario cuando este excavando.
9. Rellene con cuidado.
10. Avise a los dueños de las instalaciones y marque al 811 inmediatamente para reportar cualquier daño.
11. Las peticiones estándar (ticket) son válidos durante 15 días hábiles solamente.

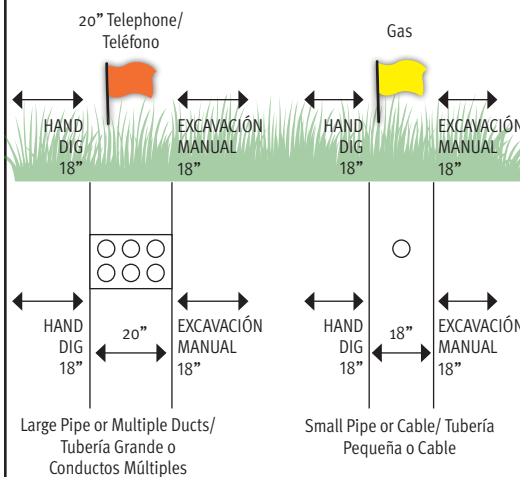

# Organ Mountain cheer squad takes crown

The Organ Mountain Cheer squad was crowned the 2024 Class 5A Co-Ed State Champions on April 6 – the school’s first cheer state title since 2018.

Head coach Jordan Sanchez said her goal for her team during the state competition was just to have her team feel great after their two performances. She didn’t want them to worry about the points or what place they were in, but to just feel confident after their rou-

tines.

Cheer captains Naomi Madrid and Nevaeh Holguin said when the second place team was announced they had almost lost hope that they would be state champions. Both said they saw Albuquerque High get excited and ready to run out onto the mat to accept the state champion trophy. Madrid said some of their teammates even started packing up, thinking that their team didn’t place.

“...and they called us, and we all started crying and it was the best feel-

ing ever and something we won’t forget,” Holguin said.

In years past at state, teams would perform both routines (game day and cheer with music) in a span of two days – known as the day one routine and day two routine. Since the covid year of 2020, the NMAA decided that teams would now perform both routines in one day with a break in between.

Before the state competition, the Knights competed in four other cheer events, placing

first in both routines in three of those and finishing second in the other. Their competition season accolades included six first-place trophies, two runner-up trophies and collecting three grand champions.

In Sanchez’s first three seasons as head coach, her teams placed first in all of their competitions minus the state competitions. This season was the first time a team of hers placed second in an event that wasn’t state.

Madrid and Holguin said that adversity of getting second place for the first time in four years pushed them to be better, saying that during practices they put the second-place trophy in front of them to motivate themselves to not finish second again.

They also said that this year’s team was disci-

plined when it came to their individual and team goals. Holguin said in past years they would choreograph a difficult routine and “water it down” to make it easier, this year they stuck with the original routine and cleaned up areas where they needed improvement.

Both captains and Sanchez said most people aren’t familiar with cheer, or the wear and tear it has physically and mentally on the athletes.

“I guess one stereotype is that they don’t believe that we’re a sport, but these kids really do put their bodies through hell,” Sanchez said. “Doing things that other people can’t do. They do the unthinkable. They do the impossible.”

The head coach noted that cheer is a year-round sport. Summer consists of practices ahead of

football season and sometimes cheer camps. They cheer at football and basketball games and finally, when competition season arrives, they practice four days a week to prepare for that. Weekends are usually busy as well, with games or community events where they occasionally perform.

Nevertheless, they still do all they can to prepare and refuel themselves. Some of those activities include a ton of stretching and warming up, icing their body parts, even physical therapy.

This year’s Knights’ competition team consisted of three freshmen, five sophomores, 13 juniors and five seniors.

The 2024 Organ Mountain co-ed cheer team made history this season, carving their names into the lists of state championships in New Mexico. The athletes and coaching staff will have a well deserved break after this weekend.

Organ Mountain High School will have one more performance open to the public on Saturday, at the Las Cruces downtown plaza during the ¡Mira! Las Cruces festival at 2 p.m.

Sanchez said the team will then have a month off before getting back at it, looking to repeat as state champions.

# 88th Masters tournament did not disappoint

April in our desert means temperatures are warming and flowers are blooming, but the winds continue. More importantly, Masters week has finally arrived for the 88th time. (The Masters was first played in 1934, but was not held in 1943-44-45 due to World War II.)

While Augusta National golf course appeared to be as pristine, beautiful and intimidating as usual, the weather was difficult. There was a two-hour rain delay on Thursday morning for the opening round, requiring a number of players to complete their rounds in the early morning chill on Friday. Tiger Woods ended up playing 23 holes on Friday, which

took a physical toll, but he still played well enough to set the record at 24 for consecutive cuts made at the Masters. By mid-morning on Friday the predicted winds became even stronger than anticipated, with gusts over 45 mph. The snow-white sand in the front bunker on hole no. 18 blew out in a blinding storm, almost covering the bunker cam. One past champion labeled the conditions "borderline almost unplayable."

Golfing the ball was harder in the second round even for the best players in the world. Among the golfers who

would have liked a muligan in round two was 39 year-old Dustin Johnson, who was the 2020 Masters winner with a record score of 268, but finished his second round at 13 over par, allowing him to pack his bags early for home and another

LIV tournament. Then there was Norwegian Victor Hovland, No. 6 in the world, who three-putted the par 5 15th hole from 5 feet, stabbing at a 3 inch second putt to miss it, and falling short of the cut by two shots.

One of the things I love about the Masters tournament is the polite behav-

ior of the patrons who patiently sit or stand and applaud great play, while rarely blabbing "get in the hole." In addition there are no cell phones permitted on the premises. That means fans who came to watch golf did actually watch golf, instead of addictively looking at their phones. And the concession menu for food and drinks has not changed in price or quality for many decades, seeming impervious to inflation.

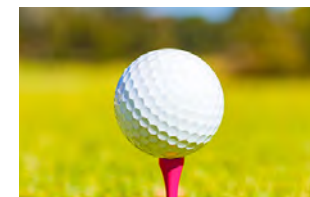
The weather for Sunday's final round at Augusta national was nothing short of ideal for both patrons and golfers. After making bogey on the first hole, Scottie Scheffler proceeded to

take control on the back nine. His final round of 68 gave him a four-shot victory and his second green jacket. While others, like Morikawa, Aberg and Homa, stumbled with crushing double bogeys, Scheffler did not make any serious mistakes. "Amen Corner" (holes 11, 12 and 13) was the undoing for the pretenders. Scheffler handled his golf club like a precision instrument in his hands.

For me, the best description of Scheffler in the heat of battle is calm, cool, collected, calculating and a cold-blooded golfing killer. With his wife, Meredith, expecting their first child within a week or two, Scheffler was longing

to be home in Dallas, he said after Sunday's win: "I feel like professional golf is an endless not-satisfying career." The number one golfer in the world is never satisfied and always wants to do better, but everyone else has lots of work to do.

Finally, Vern Lundquist is signing off after 40 Masters CBS broadcasts. He is best remembered for two calls: "In your life," on Woods' 2005 chip in on 16, and "Yes, sir," on Nicklaus' winning 1986 putt.
