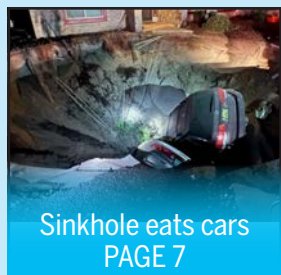

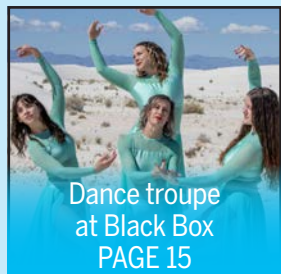

Gaza debate comes to Las Cruces

Solidarity encampment settles on campus

A tide of campus protests nationwide focusing on the devastation in Gaza over the past seven months reached New Mexico State University late in April, when a small encampment was established in a quiet area on campus east of the Corbett Student Union building.

While 16 protesters on the University of New Mexico campus in Albuquerque were being arrested and booked early in the morning on April 30, a smaller group of campers at NMSU were working to dry out supplies, clothing and prayer rugs that got soaked when, according to a spokesperson for the encampment, sprinklers came on to water the lawn during their first night sleeping on the grounds.

The camp was established Monday, April 29, with about a half dozen

tents, a number that more than doubled by the following Friday afternoon. A prominent banner declared the area a "liberated zone" and handwritten signs posted on a tent near the camp's center displayed community rules for the gathering as well as a list of demands the protesters are addressing to NMSU's board of regents.

During its first week,

the camp was a visible if quiet presence, as students walked, skated or scooted freely on concrete passways in clothing – shorts, tank tops, T-shirts – reflecting the warm, sunny weather. At times, not far from the camp, young people sunbathed on blankets spread over the grass. Campus police frequently rolled

Protest stops meeting as city council votes down ceasefire resolution

The Las Cruces City Council removed a resolution condemning the war in Gaza and calling for a permanent ceasefire in Palestine during a council meeting that became a rolling protest before the meeting resumed regular business.

The resolution would not have assigned city resources or directed staff to do anything. Instead, it would have been a statement of belief disseminated to state and federal officials. Still, the resolution brought dozens of residents to voice support or opposition for the resolution and the conflict it would have condemned in one of recent memory's most heated council meetings.

Before the resolution could be brought for a vote, a group of councilors united to kill it. Mayor Eric Enriquez asked for a vote to suspend the rules, allowing the resolution to be removed from the agenda.

Enriquez, four councilors remove resolution

Enriquez told the Bulletin he called for the resolution's removal – instead of allowing it to be heard and voting against it – because he felt the resolution

City attorney out after less than a year

Linda Samples, an El Paso-based attorney who helmed Las Cruces' legal department since July 2023, has left the city government.

Samples became city attorney on July 31, 2023, after the former city manager terminated the previous city attorney, leading to an ongoing lawsuit.

The City Attorney's Office provides "legal, risk, and compliance services to City Council, the City Manager, and all organizational units of the City, and ensure that City government protects valuable resources and operates ethically, effectively, efficiently, and transparently," according to its mission statement.

The office has also been the center of council-driven efforts to change the functionality of Las Cruces Municipal Court amid a surge in concerns

about crime's effect on business owners. According to budget talks in recent weeks, the office was working with the court to explore hiring a public defender and reclassifying positions to address issues in the court.

It's unclear what prompted Samples' departure. Samples did not respond to an emailed request for comment on the matter.

According to a city spokesperson, Samples left the city voluntarily. When asked about why Samples left, the spokesperson said the city does not comment on personnel matters.

An email obtained by the Bulletin shows that she affirmed her resigna-

tion on April 2, and her last day was April 30. However, a spokesperson said in an email that Samples' last day was April 18. "As I disclosed to you earlier today," Samples wrote in an email to the city manager, "I hereby resign effective April 30, 2024. I informed Brad (Douglas) of my resignation and will work with him on a transition."

Douglas was identified during a recent meeting as "acting city attorney."

Court records show that Samples was granted a limited license to practice law in New Mexico when she became city attorney on July 31. The New Mexico Bar Association requested that Samples' limited license expire since she was no longer the city attorney.

However, the same document indicated she sought to remain able to practice law in New Mexico. That process was still underway.

City ups payments to independent police auditor

The Las Cruces City Council unanimously approved a 66 percent increase in yearly payments for the services of an independent police auditor.

OIR Group, a California-based firm, reviews the Las Cruces Police Department's complaint process and recommends changes to department

policy as part of the contract. OIR also presents information and findings to the Las Cruces council semi-annually.

The city signed the original contract with OIR in March 2021. Since then, the city has been sending the company \$75,000 annually. The new contract is worth \$125,000 per year. No other changes were made.

"An increase to the

amount of auditing services requested has resulted in the need to increase the original not-to-exceed contract amount," a document summarizing the change said.

OIR said they would increase their presence in Las Cruces by hosting community events to present information and gather community input. This change came at the council's request.

past, keeping one eye on the camp during a week when crackdowns on student protests at universities in other states became a focus of national news coverage and political commentary.

While confrontations between students and police erupted in Albuquerque and in other states, the NMSU group focused mainly on establishing its base and organizing community education classes – teach-ins and reading groups on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict as well as social organization and art – rather than occupying campus buildings or rallies.

Representatives of the camp agreed to speak to

a reporter under strict conditions to protect the anonymity of the camp's members, requesting no photographs be taken depicting the campers and that interviews be limited to designated media contacts who did not give their full names. Many of the campers wore masks. Although the protest is taking place on public property, the Bulletin agreed to the organizers' terms in order to ask questions about the camp.

"Not everybody here has signed up for the same level of risk factor," a spokesperson who identified himself as "Nobody" explained.

UNM protesters arrested on April 30 have had their names and booking photos reported in news stories, and at some universities – like Colum-

bia University in New York – students have faced threats of suspensions and other disciplinary actions, generally in connection with occupying buildings.

During an interview, curious passers-by stopped to ask questions of their own and were offered bottles of water to visit and discuss the conditions between Israel and Gaza – which the spokespeople argued should not be described as a "war" but rather as genocide.

On a slope to one side of the encampment, a large representation of the Palestinian flag was stretched out on the grass.

On Oct. 7, Hamas – the group that governs the Palestinian territory of Gaza and has pledged to drive Israel from lands between the Jordan River and the Mediterranean

Sea – executed a large-scale offensive against Israel, killing around 1,200 and abducting around 240, to which Israel responded with overwhelming military force. In the months since, nearly 35,000, per calculations by the Gaza Health Ministry, have been reported killed as of May 3 under bombardments and ground offensives in Gaza by Israel. Most of those, from figures reported by the Israeli Defense Forces as well as Gaza, have been noncombatants and children.

The warfare and destruction of civilian life has driven a wedge between President Joe Biden's administration and the Israeli government while becoming a focus of election-year politics. Meanwhile, the International Court of Justice issued an order to Israel to refrain from actions that would violate the Genocide Convention as it considers formal allegations of genocide, which Israel has vehemently denied.

Although the group at NMSU showed no signs of occupying space beyond its small footprint near the student union, a walkout of some students and faculty in solidarity with the Palestinian people took place on May 2; and organizers said they plan to stay until the university agrees to a list of demands.

Those demands, as posted on the "Las Cruces for Palestine" Instagram account and repeated (in different wording) on signs at the camp, are: disclosure of the univer-

sity's investments; divestment from corporations or funds that draw profit from Israel's military actions in Gaza; a call for a ceasefire from the university regents; and a boycott of Israeli educational institutions, including termination of international study agreements, grants, scholarships and similar arrangements.

A spokesperson identified as Sebastian said representatives of the camp had spoken with representatives of the regents, NMSU's office of equity, inclusion and diversity, and campus police. He also said they had spoken with groundskeepers about the sprinkler issue.

In a memo to students and staff on May 1, NMSU's interim president, Mónica Torres, wrote: "We know universities around the country are experiencing similar protests. Constitutionally, people in the U.S. have a right to protest peacefully, and public universities have a duty to respect, facilitate and protect this right. Efforts are being made to ensure First Amendment free speech protections are honored while ensuring the safety of our campus population.

"A team of university leaders met with protesters shortly after they set up camp, and again the following morning. I, along with outgoing Interim President Jay Gogue and Interim Provost Lakshmi Reddi met with this team yesterday afternoon. We encourage open dialogue to ensure all voices are heard at this time."

The university did not comment beyond Torres' statement.

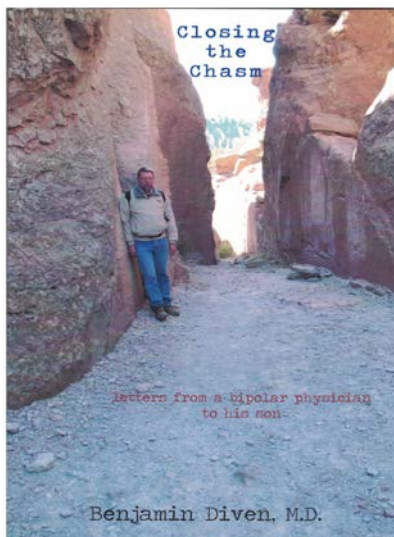
"This is a welcoming space to anybody who wants to learn about the movement," the spokesman going by "Nobody" said. "We do have ground rules, of course. Our camp is a completely sober and dry space: No alcohol (or) drugs of any sort are allowed."

Organizers said they wanted to avoid the appearance of a "party atmosphere" and also to preserve a culture of safety and consensual interactions among those residing at the camp. They also discourage photography and video at the camp, and ask campers to deactivate location service and GPS on mobile phones.

While the university was "accommodating of our presence here," organizers said university leaders mainly seemed interested in how long the camp intended to remain and that there was little indication, during week one, of whether regents would consider acting on any of their demands. A May 5 letter from Torres stating that the university had not identified any "any direct investments in any institutions outside the U.S.," and requesting they consider decamping, was rejected on the Instagram account as "hollow."

The regents were scheduled to meet in special session on Thursday, after this issue of the Bulletin went to press. The protesters' demands did not appear on the agenda for the meeting, nor an opportunity for public comment.

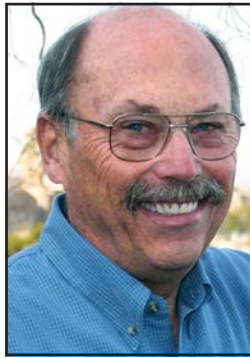

was “one-sided” and that the council would want to make too many amendments.

“The whole goal is to bring a balance, but there were so many amendments,” Enriquez told the Bulletin after the meeting.

Councilors Cassie McClure, Bill Mattiace, Becki Graham and Yvonne Flores sided with Enriquez and removed the ceasefire resolution from the agenda. Becky Corran and Johana Bencomo opposed removing it.

At that point, about two dozen people supporting the resolution got up and began chanting.

“Councilor McClure,” one protestor shouted, singling out the council’s newest member. “We

charge you with genocide.”

For a minute or two, the protesters remained in the council chambers before moving into the lobby. There, they raised their voices, chanting “Viva Palestina.” The chant was loud and grew louder still, echoing in the empty lobby through the corridors of city hall. City employees couldn’t help but stop what they were doing and watch.

After about five minutes, Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story left the meeting to speak with one of the protesters leading the group.

He later told the Bulletin, “I told her that we recognize their First Amendment right to free speech and that they are welcome to protest without interrupting the

operations or business of the city. Their conduct, when I spoke to them, was interrupting city operations and would not be tolerated. She was very reasonable and had them go outside.”

Afterward, the protesters moved outside for another 10 or 15 minutes before petering out.

Those who spoke

Jovany Hernandez, a community organizer at New Mexico Dream Team, led much of the chanting and spoke to reporters as the protest concluded. When asked if he anticipated the removal of the resolution, he said it wasn’t surprising to see the council stand with Israel.

“I think that we see time and time again our politicians bow to Zionist

pressure and stand for genocide. So that was not surprising,” Hernandez said.

About two dozen people inside the chamber spoke against the resolution – many also condemned the councilors for allowing the resolution to get as far as it did. Others thanked them for removing it.

Overall, the anti-resolution crowd said any resolution should have included info about the Oct. 7 attack on Israel by Hamas and that the council has more important and relevant business to attend to.

“The proposed resolution asks for a ceasefire in Gaza without any mention of Hamas,” Rabbi Evette Lutman of Temple Beth-El in Las Cruces said.

Peter Svarzbein, a former El Paso city councilor and the community engagement manager of El Paso Anti-Defamation League, thanked the council for “taking a step back.”

“I think we need to understand that two things can be true at the same time,” Svarzbein said. “Our hearts can and do break for the innocent lives lost in both Israel and Gaza and the humanitarian crisis that is occurring in Gaza. But at the same time, it is vitally important that we can and must hold Hamas accountable.”

Bencomo and Corran – the only councilors who supported the ceasefire resolution – also spoke out at the end of the meeting.

“Bringing that resolution forward,” Corran, who said she pushed for it, said, “came from a place of empathy and care for, in particular, the hundreds of people who signed a petition requesting that we consider bringing it forward, but also (empathy) for a humanitarian crisis in a part of the world where things matter to us.”

Bencomo read a statement. She used the opportunity to call out

the dehumanization of Palestinians, including a moment when someone called the pro-Palestinian protesters “terrorists.”

“Dehumanizing only serves to make us feel better about enacting bad or even dangerous policies that disproportionately impact black and brown folks,” Bencomo said. “I want to see an end to violence, and I want to see my tax dollars stop going to aid the violence.”

What the resolution said – and what it did not

If the resolution had passed, Las Cruces would have joined a list of municipalities that have called for a permanent ceasefire.

The resolution listed San Francisco, Calif.; Minneapolis, Minn.; Seattle, Wash.; St. Louis, Miss.; Detroit, Mich.; Atlanta, Ga.; Akron, Ohio; Wilmington, Del.; Providence, R.I.; and Richmond, Calif. as examples.

The resolution also noted that 34,000 Palestinians had been killed, including 13,000 children, a number backed up by the United Nations. The resolution did not mention Hamas’ attack on Oct. 7, where about 1,200 Israelis died.

The resolution also described the conflict as a genocide.

Sinkhole forces home evacuation

On Regal Ridge Street, in a neighborhood on the east side of Las Cruces, a sinkhole collapsed the front yard of a home on Monday night, forcing the evacuation of three homes, the city reported.

Firefighters were dispatched to the 1700 block of Regal Ridge Street at about 9:30 p.m. on May 6, where they found a sinkhole estimated at 30 feet in both width and depth. Two vehicles that had been parked in a driveway had fallen into the sinkhole which continued to settle while responders were on scene.

No injuries were reported and the evacuation of three homes was undertaken “as a precautionary measure,” the city

said. The affected residents were assisted by the American Red Cross and the street has been closed to traffic to allow engineers and city work crews to determine the cause of the sinkhole and gauge the safety of the road itself. Las Cruces Utilities and El Paso Electric were contacted to inspect service lines and secure utilities.

“Intermittent closure of the road and utility services are anticipated in the coming days when it’s determined how best to backfill the sinkhole,” the city stated in a news release.

Sinkholes occasionally develop beneath yards and roads in Las Cruces, often in response to flooding from weather or burst pipes.

Republican Michael Cain pitches case for DA

Michael Cain, a Las Cruces defense attorney, said his strong sense of right and wrong would guide him as he led the district attorney's office through the epic power the judicial system holds, if Doña Ana County voters elect him in November.

"Prosecutors, and judges in particular, have the ability to ruin people's lives if they are not competent," Cain said. "By charging people who should not be charged, undercharging people who should be appropriately charged, and even overcharging can hurt your chances on the case."

Cain is the lone Republican running to be district attorney. The winner of a four-way primary contest of Democratic nominees in June will face Cain in the Nov. 5 general election.

Anxiety around crime, concerns about dismissals, releases, and repeat

offenders, and questions about the fair execution of justice make this race the county's most competitive of the 2024 primary season.

Cain made his case to be the next DA in a recent interview. Here is how he responded to questions shaped by our readers, in response to surveys seeking to understand what our community wants to hear about from 2024 election candidates. (The Democratic candidates' responses to these questions can be

found in last week's edition and online at LasCrucesBulletin.com.)

Does the district attorney's office have the power to affect societal issues?

Focusing on homelessness, Cain said he'd like to see the office begin the process of creating a major diversionary program. He referenced a program in Miami that connects unhoused people charged with a crime to resources, including housing.

In exchange for a conviction, Cain said defendants might be required "to enroll in serious, maybe even inpatient substance abuse counseling, mental health counseling, treatment, whatever. You've got to work with us."

Cain also said he'd like to see diversion into military service as an alternative to conviction.

"I understand how important that can be to a young person," Cain said, referencing his own military experiences.

The district attorney's office has struggled to retain attorneys in recent years. How would you address this problem?

Cain said he's seen the turnover problem firsthand.

"Half the time, I can't even learn their name before they're gone," Cain said of prosecutors at the Third Judicial District.

The district attorney's office has experienced turnover at a high rate for some years. The causes are many. As incumbent DA Gerald Byers has pointed out, the office cannot compete with salaries at large private firms and the district fishes from the same pool of lawyers as other district attorneys' offices in New Mexico.

But challengers – including Cain – have also said the current administration has forced people out or failed to vigorously recruit replacements. According to Cain, there's a pool of qualified attorneys still in the community willing to fill the role of the prosecutor's office if change at the top occurs.

"We have people who I would call career prosecutors. They're the ones that are there no matter who gets elected; they're just there to prosecute and go home. But they were the backbone of that office. He (Byers) doesn't have anybody like that.

Would you advocate for changes in the law at the state Legislature?

"The answer is absolutely yes," Cain said.

However, Cain did not discuss the matter in detail except to say that he felt bail reform had gone too far. In a previous question, Cain also discussed advocating for increased services around diversion programs.

What role would your district attorney's office play in addressing homelessness in Las Cruces?

Again, Cain referenced his previous answer.

To affect homelessness, Cain said he'd advocate for increasing diversionary programs that dangle a dismissal in front of defendants in exchange for attending mental health programs.

He also said that improving the office's efficiency – by creating clearer chains of command, for example – would allow faster processing.

Would you appear in court to personally prosecute cases? Why or why not?


Cain said he would personally prosecute cases.

"I will lead by example. It's what I do. I understand servant leadership. I will be in that courthouse. At minimum, the district court twice a week," Cain said.

Cain said that gives him the opportunity to not only lead by example but also learn where the holes are and how to support the prosecutors.

He also said he'd go a step further and maintain regular contact with the district court judges.


"I'm not going to be sitting up there

Interim county manager talks priorities as search persists

Four hours into the job, Stephen Lopez has nothing but three flip charts in the corner of the office that just became his.

The charts are blank. Lopez said they'll be filled out later in the day as he garners input from the people who now work for him.

Lopez takes over the job following the departure of Fernando Macias. Macias, county manager for six years, left the county following a contract disagreement with the Board of County Commissioners regarding his yearly evaluation.

Now, the board has launched a national search for its next manager. A board member told the Bulletin in April that they expected to start interviews with finalists over the summer. But in the interim, Lopez, the county's emergency manager, has taken the job.

"I think the biggest challenge is making sure people know their jobs are not threatened,"

Lopez said.

Lopez sat down with the Bulletin for an interview about the new job on his first day, a few hours after officially starting.

"We're not going to be doing anything drastic. This is really an opportunity for (department heads) to share and have some input into this office so that whoever comes on understands where they're trying to go, what they need to get there, and really is able to wrap their arms around this big thing we call Doña Ana County," Lopez said.

Lopez began his career as a police officer with New Mexico State University in 1987. His last eight years, he led the department as its chief.

A news release announcing Lopez' ascension said Lopez holds bachelor's degrees from NMSU in criminal justice and psychology and a master's degree from the University of Washington in strategic planning for critical infrastructures.

Lopez has been a department head in Doña Ana County since 2021. During the COVID-19 pan-

demic, he became emergency manager for the joint county/city Office of Emergency Management. A news release lauded his leadership and said he was instrumental in coordinating emergency response efforts.

"The background isn't as important as the actions we take over the next few months to prepare for the permanent county manager," Lopez said. "And

that's really my number one priority, which is to keep the good things going and get things documented and ready so that as a new county manager is selected, he or she can be given the information to come in and succeed."

The background matters some, Lopez later acknowledged. Having been in the county for a few years, he said

he's developed a good working relationship with the other department heads.

"We've done various projects together and brought in grants together. And that's allowing me to transition for Mr. Macias, who had been here for so long," Lopez said.

When pressed on what changes he'd make during the short stint at the top of the county food chain, Lopez said he wanted to improve communication within the building. That means working to clear up all levels, from the manager's office to the department heads and down.

"We are a big team. I'm not sure if it's a family or not, but definitely a big team," Lopez said. "We all need to be supporting each other and working in similar directions."

The Board of County Commissioners hired Slavin Management Consultants to search for candidates. According to Slavin's job posting, the first review of applications is scheduled for May 17, 2024.

in that office hiding under my desk; I'm going to be out on the move," Cain said.

How would you maintain contact with your constituents during your term?

"I intend to have either myself or my one of my chief deputies attend every

single city council meeting and every single county commissioner meeting. And anything we see that needs to be addressed, from our perspective, we will be in there. I will be talking to the

press," Cain said.

He added that he'd hold regular press conferences for various issues, such as crime statistics or high-profile trials.

Antisemitism bill stigmatizes legitimate speech

The ancient scourge of antisemitism is a real threat, and reports of anti-Jewish harassment and threats have risen since Hamas' Oct. 7 massacre in Israel and its overwhelming military response. Opposing antisemitism while enhancing safety and security for Jewish people throughout society, including college campuses, is important, especially in the context of public anger over civilian devastation in Gaza.

Unfortunately, the bill that passed the House of Representatives last week – with the sup-

port of southern New Mexico's Gabe Vasquez along with most of his fellow Democrats and the Republican majority – overreaches by branding legitimate speech and debate about Israel as antisemitic.

The Antisemitism Awareness Act, if it becomes law, would establish a broad definition of antisemitism for the purposes of enforcing Title VI of the Civil Rights Act, which prohibits discrimination

against protected groups in programs or activities receiving federal funds – such as academic institutions.

Department of Education policy has for decades included Jews among the groups protected by the Act. Antisemitic discrimination is, thus, already pro-

hibited. This bill codifies the definition used by the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance, including its suggestions that antisemitic speech

might include not just Holocaust denial and demonization of Jewish people but also criticism and argument about the state of Israel itself, from its founding to its current actions in Gaza, past warfare and occupation of lands – perhaps even Zionism as a political viewpoint.

For example, “claiming that the existence of a State of Israel is a racist endeavor,” “drawing comparisons of contemporary Israeli policy to that of the Nazis,” “applying double standards” to Israel and not other

nations, and other propositions that might be contested, well or poorly, in an academic environment would, under this law, potentially constitute antisemitism and invite policing of speech or loss of federal funding.

The Anti-Defamation League, for its part, has acknowledged that parts of the IHRA definition are protected speech under the First Amendment. Ironically, Jewish critics of Israel or Zionism could be targeted for censorship under a law said to pro-

Free legislature is no bargain

State Sen. Siah Correa Hemphill, D-Silver City, missed almost as many votes as she cast this past session.

Of the 86 recorded votes on the Senate floor, Hemphill only cast an up or down ballot on 49 of them. She was marked “Excused” on 29 votes and “Absent” on eight votes. And now she has announced that she will not seek re-election in November.

The problem, Correa Hemphill said, is that she simply can't afford the financial burden of serving in the New Mexico Senate. “When I first started, I had money in the bank,”

Correa Hemphill told the corners of the state.

Silver City Daily Press, adding that she also believed she could both serve in the Senate and continue her work as a school psychologist. Four years later, harsh reality has set in.

The \$200 daily stipend legislators receive during the session doesn't cover the costs of living in Santa Fe, more less the loss of employment, Hemphill said. She noted that all lawmakers get the same stipend, whether they live in Santa Fe and go home each night, or in the far

Correa Hemphill was one of five new Democrats elected to the Senate in 2020 after challenging longtime legislators like Mary Kay Papen and John Arthur Smith who were ousted in the primary election after voting against a bill to remove an old abortion law from the books.

Correa Hemphill defeated incumbent Gabriel Ramos in the Democratic primary. Ramos has since switched parties and is running this year as a Republican.

After taking office, Correa Hemphill was named to the prestigious Legislative Finance Committee, which has control over the budget. The appointment immediately provided her with a position of power and influence, something most rural lawmakers take years to acquire. But it also required greater demands on her time when the legislature wasn't in session.

The LFC holds interim meetings throughout the year in all areas of the state to better understand the local needs. For a legislator living in Silver City, that can mean 10- to 12-hour drives each way.

“It's so much work and required so much time away from home, and additional time that I'm not able to do work,” she told the Daily Press. “And ultimately it just wasn't conducive to the life or the work of a school psychologist.”

I doubt if anything Correa Hemphill did as a senator provided the same personal satisfaction she gets from helping troubled students find a sense of peace and stability. But still, the job's pretty important.

There are only 112 members of the New

text them.

The Civil Rights Act protects people from targeted harassment and discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin. Somehow, the House was persuaded this requires prohibitions on criticizing nation-states and political

viewpoints. There is, for instance, a case in process in international court alleging genocidal acts by Israel. Discussing this case in an academic setting might veer toward forbidden comparisons to other historical acts of genocide, putting the discussion off-limits lest the feds investigate.

This novel, and chilling, use of the Civil Rights Act

drifts far from its original purpose. It also seems to be a transparent effort at bringing academic institutions, a prominent project on the political right, to heel. Here, that project seems to have been joined by a majority of House Democrats, like Vasquez, who failed to defend a distinction between threats to people and the policing of ideas.

STATE'S EV MANDATE HURTS DEALERS

As a registered Democrat who lives in southern New Mexico and drives an electric car, I am a strong believer in sustainability. I recharge my car at my solar-powered home, but I have concerns about the state of New Mexico's mandate to have 43 percent of cars sold in our state by 2026. I believe this mandate is not sustainable for consumers or dealerships.

Although my electric vehicle is perfect for driving around the city, I don't feel comfortable taking longer trips due to the lack of convenient charging stations. This is one of the primary reasons why the electric car market hasn't grown as fast as many predicted. In 2023, electric vehicles made up only 7.6 percent of all

cars sold in the United States, and in New Mexico, electric vehicles made up less than 5 percent of the same year. Forcing car dealers to ensure that 43 percent of their inventory will be electric vehicles in less than two years will not suddenly increase demand. Instead, it will only drive business to neighboring states like Texas, Arizona, and Colorado.

Other issues with electric vehicles must also be addressed. For example, there is still uncertainty regarding the lifespan of the batteries in these vehicles, and the costs of replacing these batteries can range between \$6,500 - \$20,000 depending on the pack, size and manufacturer. Furthermore, electric vehicles tend to be heavier than gasoline-powered vehicles, causing

more harm to our roads. Meanwhile, we levy a road tax on gasoline, but electric vehicles do not share in the cost.

Rather than penalizing car dealers, I believe we should extend incentives to dealerships for every electric vehicle sold. We should also provide state incentives to consumers who purchase electric vehicles beyond the \$7,500 offered by the federal government. There are ways to eventually achieve the desired result without causing hardship to local dealers.

Ultimately, building a clean environment must be sustainable for everyone. Positive reinforcement will always go further than forcing consumers and auto dealers.

IDENTIFY, PRESERVE HISTORIC STRUCTURES

An open letter to Las Cruces Mayor Eric Enriquez and the city:

It is with dismay and frustration that many of us have been made aware of the pending demolition of three architecturally and culturally significant buildings on University Avenue. Despite the best efforts of the Las Cruces Historic Preservation Commission, the loss of our city's irreplaceable historic fabric appears to be accelerating.

From my perspective as an architectural historian listed with the New Mexico Historic Preservation Division for nearly 30 years, recent attempts by the city to identify and document potentially significant properties seem half-hearted at best. The city's February 2024 request for proposals focused primarily on the historic Mesquite District. The project funding did not match the scope of work. The proposed schedule was impossibly tight. No cultural resource

specialist could accomplish the task given the payment and scheduling constraints.

I am respectfully requesting a collaboration between the city and New Mexico State University to work with the city's preservation specialist, NMSU faculty, historic preservation professionals and graduate students to survey and inventory every permanent pre-1974 structure within the city's limits. The 2007 student survey mentored by preservationist Marsha Weisiger and architect Steve Newby serves as a good model for such an undertaking. The report's Appendix V is available online via this link.

The result would be the city-wide identification of

buildings potentially eligible for state and national registers. The research would safeguard important buildings from heedless demolition – which appears to be the fate of the three University Avenue buildings currently slated.

The city's historically significant properties (particularly those situated outside designated historic districts) continue to disappear at an alarming rate. Requests for proposals that are team-oriented, properly funded and realistically scoped will be more likely to attract responses from qualified experts eager to assist.

A desert heroine is “fierce and brave – as resilient as life in the Chihuahuan desert. She is a gift to Doña Ana County,” according to DesertHeroines.com.

Desert Heroines is a photo project by NMCO Studio and the Success Partnership that honors and showcases individuals in Doña Ana County who are making moves, creating legacies and uplifting the community around them.

“NMCO just wanted to use what skills they had to uplift women in our community,” said Success Partnership Communications Coordinator Sommer Mitchell. “We got together and combined resources and funds to make the project better. This year’s theme was ‘Women who advocate for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.’”

Tina Ballew, NMCO Studio chief creative officer and creative director of the Desert Heroines project, said after the nominations, the partnership draws five names at random.

“NMCO basically coordinates and directs a unique photo shoot,” she said. “They get to work with a professional makeup artist – be a star for a day. Most people aren’t in a position to do that for themselves. It’s a gift to honor them.”

Ballew said it’s vital to honor women in history and this is an opportunity to honor some of today’s remarkable community members for their time in history as well.

This year, for the second time, the Desert Heroines project invites the public to a photo exhibit and panel discussion with the women. The gallery showing and the panel discussion are at the Mullennix Bridge Gallery at the New Mexico State University Art Museum, 1308 E University Ave. in Las Cruces. The panel is from 5:30-7 p.m. at the gallery.

The partnership gathered nominations and worked together on graphics to inspire the community to nominate women who are doing outstanding work in DEI, Mitchell said.

“We highlight all of them for the entire month of March. This year we got over 30 nominations and five are randomly chosen for the photo shoot,” she said. “We bring in food and bring in all these ladies, work with stylists to tweak their individual look and shoot to their work and their vibe. It’s just a really nice feel-good project that lets us appreciate people in the community. Year after year, it’s about these women who are doing incredible work in the community. How wonderful to be able to say thank you to all of them have this amazing story to tell.”

The Blessing of the Fields at New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum begins at 10 a.m., Friday, May 17. Celebrating a New Mexico tradition with the annual event, everyone is invited to take part in the procession along with members of Tortugas Pueblo.

Bishop Peter Baldacchino of the Diocese of Las Cruces presides over the blessing as participants visit the animals, plants and the acequia, which provides the water of life for farmers and ranchers.

It's the 24th year for the celebration, which focuses on a long and rich history. San Ysidro, the patron saint of farmers, who lived from 1070 to 1130 and worked in the fields for a wealthy landowner, was known for his

devotion to God, his humility and his generosity to those less fortunate than him.

The story of San Ysidro has been passed down through the generations and still inspires many farmers and their families in the Mesilla Valley. For many years, workers in San Miguel would make a pilgrimage each May, stopping at all the villages along the valley.




Q: It's nice to see Wendell Pierce back on TV regularly in "Elsbeth." I also enjoyed him on "The Wire," but hasn't he done other series as well?

A: He certainly has. Most recently before CBS's and Paramount+'s "Elsbeth," the actor was a regular on Prime Video's "Tom Clancy's Jack Ryan" and BBC America's "The Watch," and he also had a recurring part in the third season of "Power Book III: Rising Kanan" on Starz. Prior to that, he also was a recurring player on USA Network's "Suits" and "Unsolved," NBC's "Chicago P.D." and "Third Watch," Showtime's "Ray Donovan," the syndicated "Tyler Perry's "House of Payne," Earlier, Pierce had regular roles on several other series ... and some of them were sitcoms, though he has been known primarily for dramatic work in recent times. Mother's Day and its apostrophe

To be clear, the celebration coming on Sunday is Mother's Day, rather than Mothers Day or Mothers' Day: That point was emphasized by the day's founder, Anna Jarvis.

Americans are expected to spend \$33.5 billion for Mother's Day this Sunday, according to the National Retail Federation. That figure would be second only to the record set in 2023, when \$35.7 billion was

spent.

The emphasis on cards, candies and gifts for mom – and sometimes an opportunity to fundraise for various causes – famously negate Jarvis' intent.

The first Mother's Day celebration was held at her hometown church in 1908, and from there she began to campaign for recognition of a Mother's Day holiday – "Mother's Day," in the singular, as a time for

each son and daughter to celebrate their mother, as Jarvis celebrated hers.

After President Woodrow Wilson established Mother's Day in 1914, Jarvis soon grew publicly dismayed to see the zeal and speed with which it became a retail holiday. In later years, she even sought to undo her work, campaigning to abolish the official holiday. Anna Jarvis died in 1948.

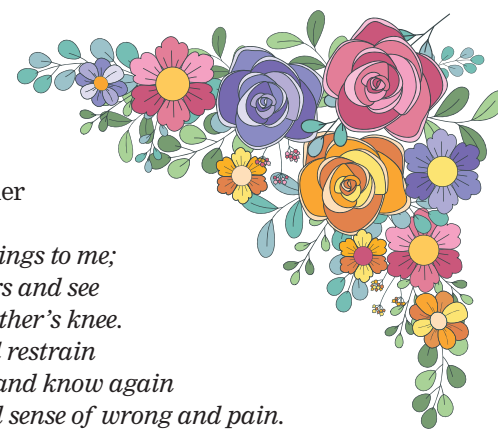

Golden Chile Award applications open

BULLETIN REPORT

Food producers involved in the New Mexico Grown program – a liaison between agricultural businesses and schools, food banks and senior centers – have until May 31 to apply for the Golden Chile Awards, the state Department of Health announced in a statement.

The awards highlight and celebrate programs at preschools, K-12 institutions and senior centers as well as food producers statewide that are part of the coalition.

Last year, 10 senior centers, 17 school districts (including the Las Cruces Public Schools), 18 preschools and 21 food producers were celebrated.

New Mexico Grown promotes nutritious, locally grown foods at New Mexico facilities and local farming economies. The Golden Chile Awards applaud activities such as building edible gardens, serving locally grown foods, gardening and nutrition education and involvement of families and staff in New Mexico Grown programs.

“We are proud ... to recognize the great work of the local farmers, ranchers, food producers,

food hubs, state agencies and food banks that participate in the program,” state Health Secretary Patrick Allen said in a written statement where he said New Mexico Grown “nourishes New Mexico school-age chil-

dren, older adults, and families with fresh, locally produced food.”

The awards are open to the participants in the program as well as institutions, such as schools and senior centers, that serve locally grown food.

Applications are open through May 31 at NewMexicoGrown.org, with separate applications for farmers and ranchers; food hubs, or organizations that facilitate storage, processing, distribution or marketing of local produce; early care and education centers; K-12 schools; and senior centers.

Winners are scheduled to be announced in August, ahead of an in-

person award ceremony on Oct. 24, the health department said.

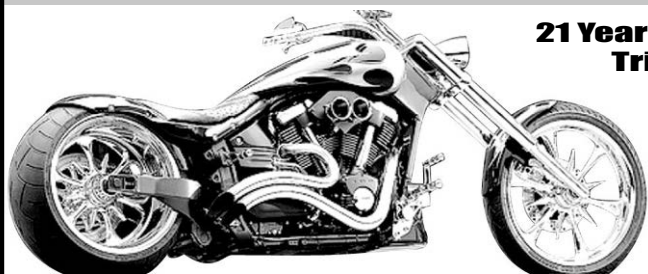
Local food producers honored last year included the Anthony Youth Farm and the Frontier Food Hub in Silver City.

In the “sprout” category, honoring developing programs, the Deming Luna County Commission on Aging was among the recipients for meals at the Deming Senior Center.

On the next highest tier, the “blossom” category, Golden Chiles were awarded to the Bumble Bee Learning Center in Sunland Park, the Silver Consolidated Schools in Silver City, and the Las Cruces Public Schools.

Noodles and Dumplings coming downtown

A flourishing chain of Asian-style restaurants in El Paso has promised to make its Las Cruces debut soon.

The former Denny’s restaurant at 740 S. Main Street, long closed, is currently surrounded by fencing with evidence of work going on at the site. A sign at the entrance announces that Noodles and Dumplings is “coming soon,” ending speculation through local social media channels that the building might house a

cannabis dispensary.

Noodles and Dumplings is a chain of Chinese restaurants that opened its first location in El Paso in 2017 and now has five locations in that city, plus several other locations in Texas: Pecos, Corpus Christi, Houston, Tyler and McAllen.

There was no indication of how soon the Las Cruces restaurant might open. The building has a fresh coat of bright clay-colored paint, but remnants of the former Denny’s linger and there are additional

signs of renovation and upgrades taking place to equipment. The chain’s web site has no information about the location, and the Bulletin was not immediately able to reach the business’ headquarters.

The location is next to the Electronic Caregiver building and across the street from the Las Cruces Public Schools administration building and numerous other offices based at the old Loretto Town Centre, which could mean plenty of lunchtime business for the new arrival.

Boys and Girls Club raising capital for new home

For more than 60 years, the Boys and Girls Club of Las Cruces has been committed to serving the youth in our community. By providing a safe place to learn and grow with life-enhancing programs, character development experiences, hope and opportunity, we have given youth a space of their own.

Since 1965, the club has called the former Presbyterian Church, located at 330 Las Cruces Ave., home. Although the facility has never compromised our ability to deliver our mission, at just over 6,800 square feet, it has continued to limit the number of members we can serve. For years, we have dreamed of welcoming our community's youth to a brand-new,

state-of-the-art facility that provides the technology and tools imperative for young people to achieve 21st-century success.

In January of 2024, our dream began taking shape when we purchased the former Video 4 Theaters property located at 1005 El Paseo Rd. While the listing price was \$1.5 million, the Allen family generously offered an \$800,000 in-kind donation, lowering our purchase price to \$700,000.

While we were able to purchase the property outright, the space will require renovation and expansion which will cost the club approximately \$10 million. The modifications will bring the building to 30,000 square feet and include a STEM lab, a full-sized gymnasium, a separate wing for teens and spaces focused on the arts.

We know that \$10 million



may sound like a lofty goal, but fortunately, many of our community partners and supporters have already answered the call to help build a better future for our club kids. Recently, Rep. Gabe Vasquez advocated for federal community project funding and secured \$1.46 million for our building project. Vasquez, a former club member himself, said, "I first learned to use a computer and develop the skills to be successful thanks to the Boys and Girls Club. Now I'm thrilled to fight for much-needed investments for the Boys and Girls Club of Las Cruces to help our kids reach their full potential."

The club also was a recipient of \$1.388 million in City of Las

Cruces American Rescue Plan Act funding and has received over \$360,000 in private pledges and donations, helping us reach approximately one-third of our goal.

A group of committed community leaders have also stepped up to spearhead the Club's Building Great Futures capital campaign. Abel Covarrubias, chair of the capital campaign committee, said, "It's been incredible to witness the early stages of support for the new Boys and Girls Club building. I am inspired by the generosity of our community and look forward to seeing how the club will help shape future generations of our youth." With their guidance and vision, we hope to welcome club members to their new home by 2026.

When we increase the number of children and teens who

walk through our iconic blue doors, we also increase access to opportunities, experiences and programs that have the potential to change lives, thereby furthering the work of the Success Partnership. Our work has just begun, but we know that by joining forces with our community partners, we can create a foundation for the future and support our collective efforts to help youth with numerous outcomes, including achieving academic success.

The Las Cruces market is showing signs of shifting as we step out of the first quarter of 2024 and make our way into the summer season.

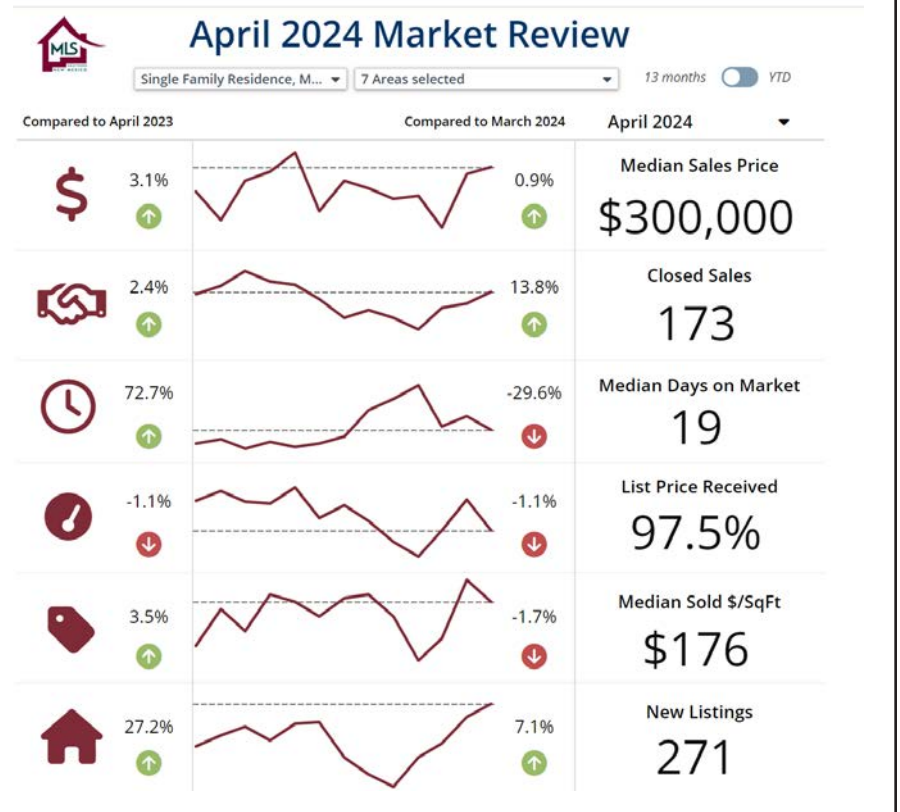
The most notable statistic is a 46 percent increase in inventory compared to April 2023, which includes 23 percent in new listings compared to the prior year.

Sheriff shuts down questions after deputy kills man

The Doña Ana County sheriff declined to take questions during a news conference on May 1 after a deputy killed a man in Chaparral during an arrest.

Sheriff Kim Stewart said she wouldn't answer questions because of how one news article portrayed the situation in which a deputy sought to arrest Jose Adrian Guzman before shooting him to death.

"This was a tragic event that some in the media decided to take my 100-word press release on this matter and alter it to fit another narrative," Stewart said. "A hostile and judgmental narrative."

Stewart's decision broke from years of established expectations following DASO shootings, a model that Las Cruces police adopted following transparency concerns about the fatal shooting of Amelia Baca in 2022.

"I recognize from a lifetime of dealing with media

there are inherent risks in talking to the media and taking that consistent position. I still believe that position is the correct one," Stewart said. "My apologies, deputy, to you and your family for this blatant misrepresentation of your actions. I hope today we have clarified it."

While Stewart did not answer questions from a half dozen reporters, she did show about 15 minutes of body camera video. According to Stewart, the incident began when the deputy responded to a suspicious person and possible burglary call around 2:20 p.m. near Oasis Drive on April 29.

The video – which Stewart stopped short of the moment the deputy killed Guzman – showed a chaotic encounter that began with the deputy stopping Guzman on the neighborhood roadside. The deputy seemed to know Guzman from past encounters.

"I've told you in the past," the deputy, who was not identified, told Guzman. "We've been cool. Just remind me of what your name is."

The deputy asks Guzman a few questions, tells

him he could leave, then runs Guzman through a database. Stewart said the deputy then discovered that Guzman had a warrant.

The video then cuts away. It's unclear if DASO made that edit or if the deputy turned his body camera off and on again. But later, the video shows the deputy confronting Guzman as a fight breaks out. The two men struggle as the deputy tries to pin Guzman against the asphalt, but Guzman scrambles away. As he runs, the deputy fires taser rounds. None seem to hit.

The deputy returns to his unit. Out of breath, the deputy drives up and down Oasis, following Guzman until he leaves his unit, taser drawn. An electric hum grows as the taser charges and the deputy fires. The electric round strikes Guzman, causing his body to lock up, and brings him to the asphalt with a crash.

The two men then struggle on the ground until the deputy gains control and then appears to lose it, allowing Guzman to scramble to his feet. The pin lasts for five minutes before Guzman gets free.

"That's a long time to hold someone and try to contain them," Stewart said, adding that the deputy called for aid but that DASO's radios did not pick it up.

It is unclear from the video, but at some point during the fight, possibly when Guzman col-

lapses when struck by the taser round, Guzman's head becomes bloodied.

As Guzman gets free, he picks up the taser gun and points it at the deputy. According to Stewart, the stun gun was still charged and capable of firing.

The deputy then draws his firearm.

"Drop it," he tells Guzman multiple times. "Drop it now."

"No," Guzman replies, pointing the taser at the deputy and lowering it.

Stewart then ends the video.

"When he pointed it (the taser) at the deputy, it's considered potential lethal force," Stewart said.

Stewart said that Guzman, 35, had a lengthy criminal record and was known to DASO deputies. She brought a six-inch stack of papers, saying they were his criminal records, but she did not provide the prop for inspection to any media

members.

She displayed a list of charges, most of which were over five years old. The most serious was aggravated assault with a deadly weapon in 2019. The list also did not say if any charges resulted in convictions.

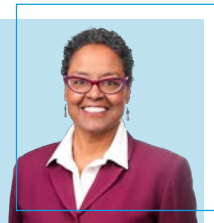
The Bulletin requested an interview with Stewart after the news conference. The Bulletin had questions about DASO's radios—which Stewart has said before work only intermittently in parts of the county—the deputies' decision to allow Guzman to leave before running his name through a warrant database, and edits made to the video.

Stewart denied the request but specified in a text message that she felt a KVIA article misrepresented the situation.

That article, published online before the news conference, states: "Donna Ana County Sheriff Kim Stewart said deputies opened fire on the man. She said the man was unarmed, and she does not know if deputies shot the man purposefully or accidentally."

Like all fatal police shootings, the incident is being investigated for potential criminal charges by a task force composed of local detectives. Those findings are presented to the district attorney's office, who decides whether to press charges. DASO will also investigate the incident for potential policy violations.

Herb Wimberly honored as Aggie legend

On April 24, Herb Wimberly was posthumously honored as an “Aggie Legend” by New Mexico State University with a Founders Day award for his truly remarkable contributions to NMSU golf and the Professional Golf Management program that is part of the College of Business.

Herb was the head coach of men’s golf at NMSU for 31 years, and basically put NMSU on the map across the southwest. In 1961, he opened the NMSU golf course, which took over a year to build. Several of his players went on to play on the PGA Tour, including Rich Beem, who beat Tiger Woods by one

stroke in the 2002 PGA Championship at Hazeltine golf club. Herb had been awarded a total of five career hall of fame awards, with the most recent being on Nov. 8, 2023 with his induction to the PGA of America Hall of Fame. Herb passed on December 30, 2023.

When I first moved to Las Cruces in August of 1988 to start my Ph.D. program in psychology, one of the places I went on my first weekend was the NMSU golf course, and sure enough, I was greeted with a warm smile and a hello by Herb Wimberly. Herb was the

kind of person who welcomed you immediately as a new friend. It was my good fortune to be invited to work as a performance coach with the NMSU men’s golf team by Herb’s successor, Ross Nettles, in 1995. A year later, Herb invited me to join him for six weeks in the summer at the Rocky Mountain Golf School in Gunnison, Colorado. Rather than travel for a long day to western Colorado, Herb and I decided in 1999 to partner in our own golf school to serve New Mexico and El Paso. During the summer months, until early 2014,

Herb and I conducted over 100 golf schools and clinics for recreational golfers and juniors.

I did not play golf on Herb’s NMSU teams, but I was blessed that he provided me enough instruction and encouragement that I brought my handicap down from 12 to a 2 in four years. In 1997 I entered and passed the 36 hole PGA Playing Ability Test, a requirement to become a PGA member. It was a personal credential that Herb appreciated, as he was pleased to have me teaching golf with him.

During those years I listened to many, many stories about Herb’s tournament playing years, his

coaching years and college golfers who played for him. He talked about playing a lot of golf with Lee Trevino, often at NMSU golf course.

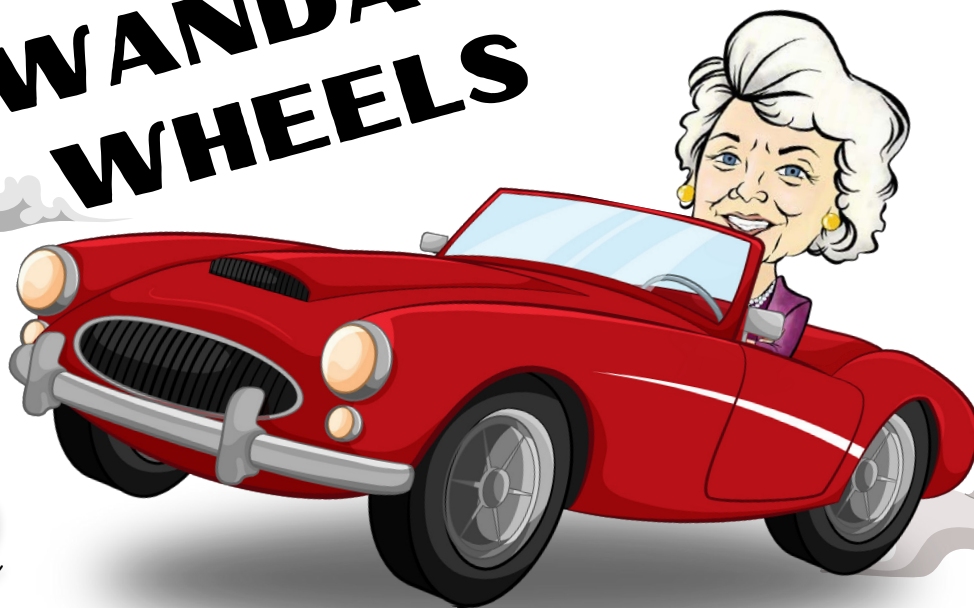
Herb shared a story about how Trevino, whose heritage is Mexican, had desperately wanted to play PGA professional tournaments but he was excluded because of a “Caucasian only” clause in the PGA of America’s bylaws starting in 1934. Herb explained that he and Bill Eschenbrenner, a PGA pro from El Paso, together wrote a letter to the PGA on behalf of Trevino recommending that he be admitted as a member in good standing,

not only because of his superb golfing ability but also because of his outstanding character. That letter was instrumental for the PGA to grant Trevino his membership. On September 11, 1961 the PGA of America voted to eliminate the “Caucasian only” clause from their bylaws.

The professional golf management program at NMSU is in the process of being retitled, with Herb Wimberly’s name in the forefront, but the change process is not without cost. To make a contribution to this worthy new name, please go to NMSUFoundation.org/givenow/herb-wimberly-endowed-fund.
