


Doña Ana County seeks two applicants to serve on the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley Board and will accept applications through June 5.

Fewer people being arrested in mental health calls, says fire department

The number of people arrested following interactions with the Las Cruces mental health response team fell drastically in the second half of 2023 as police officers relied more and more on the service, according to information presented during a meeting on May 13 about Project LIGHT. (Lessen the Incidents of Grief, Harm and Trauma).

Project LIGHT, a fire department team that is sent out to emergency mental health crises, saw just 5 percent of interactions end with the person being arrested. That's down from a reported 20 percent, or one in five, in its first six months of operation.

That's because relying on Project LIGHT has become a regular tool for Las Cruces police, according to the LIGHT's overseer, **Battalion Chief Matthew** Hiles.

"It allows (police) to get back to responding and patrolling and doing what they are meant to do," Hiles said.

The statistics were presented as part of May 13 update during which the Las Cruces Fire Department presented data over LIGHT's first full year

in existence. The team. which includes social workers and paramedics, is unique among emergency response efforts in New Mexico.

Project LIGHT works alongside a cadre of first responders. When someone calls 911 with a crisis. it's up to the 911 dispatcher to call on Project LIGHT or the police officer responsible for securing the scene to request Project LIGHT's presence.

"I think it's a true success. I think what y'all are doing is great," said Mayor Eric Enriquez.

Hiles said LIGHT responded to 455 calls between April 2023 and April 2024. Roughly 40 percent of those calls ended with

transportation to a mental health provider, and about 25 percent ended with LIGHT being able to treat the person in the moment.

"To show up to somebody's crisis and be able to help them right then and there, get them what they need, or help them feel better and de-escalate is very huge." Hiles said.

Still, LIGHT was asked to respond to more calls than it could, something officials said they hope to address in the next year.

LCFD Chief Jason Smith said plans to remodel an old fire station to house LIGHT were about 50 percent complete. He also said he'd like to hire a coordinator to lead the team and assist in taking calls.




OBITUARY LEN LO PRESTO

Len Lo Presto, 81, of Las Cruces, NM, passed away on April 11, 2024, at 1:20 p.m. while in ICU at Memorial Medical Center, with wife Linda and his daughter by his side. He had lung surgery on Feb. 26, with subsequent treatments at different facilities and very recently was diagnosed with mesothelioma.

Len was born August 25, 1942, to Geno and Nancy (Giovenco) Lo Presto in Chicago, IL. He attended Lane Technical High School where he participated in running track, jumping hurdles, and studying a new field in data processing with the early computers. He received a scholarship to the University of Nevada in Las Vegas. He was drafted by the U.S. Marines in 1962, serving in Vietnam, and was medically discharged in 1963 after receiving treatment for a bullet wound. He was awarded a Purple Heart ribbon. He had 17 uncles who served in different branches of the military in different wars. He graduated with his bachelor's degree in May 1966.

He was a computer programmer for a wide variety of businesses all over the world, including installing most of New Mexico counties' first



computers; most recently programming at WSMR. He was an NFL scout for the Chicago Bears so he traveled to all 50 states numerous times each. He was very good at statistics. He also took chef classes in Chicago and was a very good cook. His nickname was "Coach." He supported Aggie football at NMSU. He was also an avid fisherman. studying Ichthyology online, volunteering with NM Game & Fish and occasionally taking disabled veterans out fishing. He was active over the years with different United Methodist congregations.

Len was predeceased by his mother and father. He is survived by his wife Linda; children Gena (Shane) Sluga and Kevin (Jennifer) Lo Presto, both of Phoenix, AZ; sister Nancy (Steve) Slokowski of IN; brother Jim Lo Presto of IN; grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Public calls for addiction treatment as officials mull opioid settlement

The public wants officials to use the \$40 million in settlement money to break the cycle of addiction, according to surveys presented at a joint meeting of the Las Cruces City Council and Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners.

But the specifics of how that money should be spent remain undecided.

Moving closer to answering that question was the goal of a joint meeting of commissioners and councilors on May 13. The two governing bodies gathered at city hall to discuss several community surveys relating to the money and where to spend it.

"I hope that, in addressing these issues, we can prioritize saving lives," said Councilor Becky Corran.

Dozens of states filed lawsuits against pharmaceutical manufacturers and distributors in a historic lawsuit similar to the tobacco settlement of the 1990s. The lawsuits alleged that the companies misled the public about opioids and, ultimately, created the opioid crisis that rocks communities daily. The states and companies settled in 2021, forcing the companies to shell out millions in damages.

Municipalities across Doña Ana County expect to receive \$25 million. About \$9.9 million of that will go to the city of Las Cruces, and about \$14.5 million will go to Doña Ana County.

The Monday presentation also included a tentative timeline for figuring out what to do with the money. Officials plan to present recommendations to the council and commission in August and develop an implementation plan by September.

"I think people are almost expect-

ing us to make a little bit of magic with this money. It's a little daunting. But I think we're up for it," said Councilor Johana Bencomo.

The commission and council came away from the meeting asking for more data. They also reiterated the importance of spending the money in a way that helped people.

"We cannot rush into this," Commissioner Shannon Reynolds said. "We've got to do the right thing."

Calls for education, resources

The surveys, which mainly included people in Las Cruces, polled two groups: people who work in and around response to substance use and people with the lived experience of substance use.

The first group ranked education about stigma, access to services and mental health as the top priority for the money. They also pointed to a centralized facility, sustainable programs for long-term treatment, and transportation as the best uses of the money.

The second group said they

wanted the money to "break the cycle of addiction" and provide more resources for young people, community mental health, and rehabilitation services.

Combined, the two groups said that children and young adults were most at risk of experiencing the negative impacts of opioid abuse and the downstream effects of a family member using.

Where is the money coming from?

The money comes from a massive and historic lawsuit in which dozens of attorneys general across the U.S. sought compensation and damages from big pharmaceutical companies Janssen, Cardinal, McKesson, AmerisourceBergen, Teva, Allergan, CVS, Walgreens and Walmart. Those companies, the attorneys general alleged, caused the opioid epidemic that's rocked America and New Mexico.

The lawsuits said that, beginning in the 1990s, pharmaceutical

distributors and manufacturers used deceptive marketing practices, misrepresented addiction risks, and touted the benefits of opioids without disclosing the risks.

The practices left millions of people addicted to opioids, which doctors had prescribed as a treatment for chronic pain for nearly three decades by this point. As prescriptions ran out and regulations began to tighten in the mid-2010s, people addicted to opioids turned to the booming fentanyl market.

This process has left at least one million people dead between 1990 and 2021, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. It's also created a massive strain on society, felt acutely by families in Las Cruces.

"Increased crime, quality of life issues has a direct link going back to the opioid crisis and the actions of the manufacturers, distributors and the retail pharmacies," Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story said at a council meeting on Sept. 11, 2023. "Those actions that caused the settlements caused a lot of the issues we face today."

This is what the settlement money is meant to remediate.

As settlement cash has poured into local coffers, many governments have shifted the money into their regular budgets rather than toward the settlement's purpose. Na-

tional reporting has found that rural counties—such as Doña Ana County—are especially subject to this reality.

"Payback," a journalism project from the Kaiser Family Foundation (KFF), has revealed the situation.

For example, rural Greene County in north-eastern Tennessee collected about \$2.7 million from settlements. Local news reported that officials used 90 percent of the funds to pay off county debt. According to local reports, officials justified the move by saying the opioid crisis left expensive police and jail services overburdened and underfunded.

New Mexico state law limits how the money can be spent, but does not explicitly prohibit this use.

Fire camp registrations open Friday



operations and "a confidence course and leadership mentoring," per the release. Campers will work with Las Cruces firefighters and will be served breakfast and lunch as well as water and snacks. The program will take place at Fire Station 1, with visits to the LCFD training and logistics facility and the department's "burn building" on Zia Boulevard, with transportation between the latter two facilities provided by the fire department.

How are natural gas leaks detected? You are decades late if you are picturing a canary in a little cage. While the little birds were once used in mining to detect natural gas and other poisonous gases, these birds have long been retired. Today, Las Cruces Utilities (LCU) uses modern technology and surveying to keep the community safe. Greg Valles, LCU Gas Leak Survey Technician, shares all the details about what it takes to discover natural gas leaks.

"It's a systematic process," Valles explains. "We survey every part of the natural gas pipeline system, leaving no stone unturned."

Leak surveying and detection – for your protection.

Natural gas is detected using Infrared Sensors. These sensors use infrared light to detect methane levels of natural gas. Methane in natural gas is detected by these sensors in parts-permillion (PPM), which is how much natural gas is present in the atmospheric air. Monthly calibration ensures their accuracy. Other types of leak detection equipment are mounted on the front bumper of LCU leak detection vehicles. They can safely and reliably detect natural gas when technicians venture out on their daily patrols.

Natural gas pipelines are underground, under the streets, and LCU leak survey technicians divide these streets into organized quadrants.

Technicians drive over these streets methodically, ensuring that the Infrared Sensors capture accurate readings.

Technicians survey the entire service line, from the main line to the meter. Since gas meters are usually located close to buildings, away from the road, the technicians will set off on foot, using a portable leak detector that looks similar to a metal detector. While people use metal detectors to hopefully find treasure, the leak survey technicians hope to find nothing.

If the leak detection equipment picks up the presence of natural gas, the technician will assign the leak a priority level, record the leak's location, and escalate the case to the Construction and Maintenance team, who will conduct repairs. The tiered priority system ensures that any leaks discovered are resolved according to severity.

All the gas lines in the city originate at regulator stations. Regulator stations mediate between the high-pressure gas lines from the gas suppliers and the low-pressure natural gas lines that supply homes and businesses. These stations have numerous pipes and

meters that emerge from the ground and must be evaluated for potential leaks. Since the meters in these stations are made up of numerous fittings, regulators, valves, and risers, the technicians are especially diligent in surveying the stations inch by inch.

In addition to using different types of leak detection equipment to detect natural gas, LCU technicians can detect leaks in ways you can too. These include seeing dead patches of grass near lines and meters, a wavy effect in the air just like when you turn on a propane tank, and of course, smelling the distinct smell of rotten eggs.

"Our main goal is safety. If you see or smell signs of natural gas, be sure to contact us," says Valles. "LCU is dedicated to providing you safe and reliable service, that's what we are here for."

Attorney General sues Las Cruces judge over sexual assault sentence

The New Mexico Department of Justice announced a lawsuit against District Judge Douglas Driggers after accusing him of violating a state law that protects victim's rights during a news conference in Las Cruces on May 10.

Driggers, a judge in the 3rd Judicial District since 2003, was accused of violating legal mandates when he ended Patrick Howard's probation two years early and ignoring the provisions in the Victim's Rights Act that entitled crime victims to be notified of hearings. The 3rd Judicial District Attorney's Office also filed a motion calling on Driggers to reconsider the decision, which was made in March.

"The New Mexico Department of Justice has taken this action not only because we believe the judge acted improperly and in violation of the law, but more importantly, because of the way that the process unfolded," said Attorney General Raúl Torrez.

Torrez filed a writ of prohibition and superintending control calling on the state Supreme Court to intervene and enforce the remaining two years of the sentence.

The AG's lawsuit stems from Howard's 2018 conviction in which the former Las Cruces High School agriculture teacher pleaded guilty to molesting a 15-year-old girl. Howard was charged with three counts of criminal sexual contact of a minor.

The girl, who was not identified in court records, was Howard's student. She said Howard took to slapping her butt, even in front of her peers, and sending her

Andrew Ostic challenges Amanda López Askin for Doña Ana County Clerk in primary

Incumbent Amanda López Askin is looking to fend off a challenger, a former clerk's office employee who also challenged her in 2020, in the race to be county clerk of Doña Ana County. Andrew Ostic, currently a Telstar Networks manager, entered the race in March. Ostic and López Askin will face republican challenger Cheryl De Young in the November general election.

The winner holds an office pivotal in the management of democratic procedures. The clerk's office oversees all elections in Doña Ana County. And as fake conspiracies about election fraud have become common talking points, the public has brought renewed focus on the office.

The clerk's office also records and stores resolutions, ordinances, deeds, and marriage licenses. The office also issues several types of permits and licenses and serves as the clerk of the probate court in handling informational proceedings.

Ostic and López Askin answered questions from the Las Cruces Bulletin about how they see the office. The questions were derived from a survey of more than 100 Bulletin readers.

The candidates' answers were submitted via email. The only edits included those for style and grammar.

What is the biggest issue facing the County Clerk's Office?

López Askin: Choosing one issue is a challenge. Compliance with our statutory requirements will always take precedence in our work. A common misconception about the office is that our only responsibility is elections. Elections may be the most high-profile responsibility we have, but we have a robust recording side of our office. They offer vital services to our business community, including issuing marriage licenses, managing liens and titles and recording documents for the community. Additionally, the county clerk's office has a three-million-dollar budget, 37 full-

time employees and hundreds of election officials.

Our office also has an obligation to the community to work with other county departments and elected officials to provide our essential services. The individual who holds the County Clerk position must have the ability to be an administrator for the office – budget, personnel, policies, collaboration – and support both areas of focus we are responsible for in state statute.

Ostic: The biggest issue facing the County Clerk's Office is low voter turnout and inadequate voter education. There is a lack of community engagement throughout Doña Ana County.

How would you combat misinformation around elections in Doña Ana County?

Ostic: Provide regular, organized and thorough opportunities for voters to have hands-on voting experiences through community engagement. Enhance awareness of the County Clerk's Office's role in serving the public.

López Askin: Misinformation and malinformation continue to be one of the largest challenges our office has connected to elections. In 2018, Doña Ana County was involved in a very highprofile, nationally scrutinized election. The crux was the delay in results as our voters voted through absentee in higher

COUNTY CLERK MATCHUP SIMILAR TO 2020

The candidates running for Doña Ana County Clerk in 2024 also ran in 2020.

Incumbent Amanda López Askin again faces a primary challenge by fellow Democratic Andrew Ostic, a former employee in the county clerk's office. The winner of the primary will face Republican Cheryl DeYoung, who is running unopposed in the GOP primary just as she did in 2020.

In the 2020 Democratic primary, López Askin — who was appointed to the seat in 2018 and sought her first four-year term — defeated Ostic with 84 percent of 15,353 votes cast. Then, in the November general election, López Askin prevailed with 59 percent to DeYoung's 41 percent of 79,801 votes cast, per official election results.

numbers than they ever had before. There was no litigation regarding the validity of the election. Fortunately, or unfortunately, depending on how you look at it, I have been dealing with election deniers and extremists since I started in this position. Initially, I ignored much of it, but in the last several years, I have made a point to combat misinformation and malinformation whenever possible, including during our county commission meetings, on our office's podcast and during community presentations.

I speak openly about the election process, I address some of their extreme

rhetoric head on, and I encourage the public to ask questions; I'm even quoted in the Albuquerque Journal as saying, "The more eyes on the election, the better." Meeting misinformation with facts and data from unbiased sources is one of our most powerful and helpful tools when navigating this challenge.

What steps would you take to ensure clerk staff are safe and competent?

López Askin: Since I have been in office, I have worked diligently to make sure our office is fully staffed and supported. Navigating bureaucracy and budgetary constraints was and will continue to be a chal-

lenge for anyone who is in the Clerk's position. I have advocated for and was able to secure a front office remodel, which supports the safety and wellbeing of staff and customers. I have also supported and facilitated staff training, which includes topics focused on specific statutes for which the clerk's office is responsible. I have enthusiastically sponsored conferences and legislative attendance for staff professional development.

All of these support the administration, professional development, and protection of our staff. We have been able to offer more experiential and accessible training that includes access to training videos created by our of-

fice. I have implemented a post-election debrief where we specifically address both positives and negatives from each polling location in order to confirm best practices and implementation of the law. If there is a problem, it is addressed. It should be noted that I actively participated in supporting Senate Bill 43, making numerous trips to Santa Fe to testify and advocate in person in support of this bill. This bill specifically expanded protection for election officials and was signed into law in 2023.

Ostic: Regularly initiate and review job performance to identify the level of competency in identifying needed training. Provide clerk staff

with the opportunity to participate in performance development plans where they can give their input on job assignments, standards and training necessary to meet or exceed expectations. Staff participation in the process of planning development and periodic review gives them the assurance they need. When there is a safety concern, a record of incident reports should be utilized to assess what factors are needed to prevent any threats to safety.

Do you believe there was fraud in the 2020 election?

Ostic: I do not believe there was fraud in the 2020 election. However, there was failure to provide information to interested parties. If an explanation is not supported by mandated state election code about where to refer person or persons for answers, then suspicion and mistrust are the results, which causes a proliferation of unfounded conspiracy theories.

López Askin: No. I do not. Despite the narrative of claims of fraud, there has been no evidence to support any widespread fraud in the 2020 election. Additionally, almost all litigation claiming so has shown no proof. However, should any concerned individual have specific information about any potential voter fraud, they should immediately report it to authorities for investigation.

unwanted texts. Other girls at LCHS reported similar treatment from Howard.

Howard agreed to plead guilty to one count of criminal sexual contact of a minor and misdemeanor battery. Driggers sentenced him to five years of probation and said Howard did not have to register as a sex offender. Driggers then cut the sentence short by two years in 2021.

A news release from the state Department of Justice characterized the hearing as taking place "in very short order" and said the girls Howard assaulted were not notified of the hearing, in March of this year, on a motion to terminate Howard's probation.

"I felt that it was a slap on the hand," one girl's father told KOAT. Howard also settled a \$44 million lawsuit in federal court with one of the girl's families.

One of the girls, now an adult and a student in the Pacific Northwest, also submitted a statement during the news conference, which her attorney, Shannon Kennedy, read. It acknowledged a previous statement by District Attorney Gerald Byers in which he took responsibility for his office not informing victims of the

hearing on Howard's sentence. However, the writ states that the court filed a notice of the probation hearing only two days in advance and argued that left insufficient time to notify the victims.

"District Attorney Byers, thank you for apologizing and for taking accountability for the situation at hand. We have not had a whole lot of that in the past seven and a half years. I'd like to keep it simple because, honestly, I'm still at a loss for words," the statement said.

The statement went on to call for the Victim's Rights Act to be taken more seriously, a point that Torrez also made.

"This is one of the few areas of law where there are rights but no remedies," Torrez said.

Next, the state Supreme Court will consider hearing the case. It's unclear when that will occur.

In total, NMSU conferred 2,032 degrees, according to a news release.



Doña Ana County deserve coverage that encourages more participation and leads to a more informed electorate."

What are your questions? What seems unclear to you about the process of voting, how ballots are processed and reported, the technologies in use or the auditing of the vote count and the conclusion of the canvass?

Shopping carts aren't the problem

Every time I drive past the construction project on the corner of Farnev and El Paseo, just down from my house, I feel a little bit better about our city's future.

When completed, the Pedrena Apartments will provide 80 units for seniors age 55 and older earning no more than 60 percent of the median income, about \$30,000 a year. It is expected to be fully occupied by December 2025, city officials said.

Pedrena is one of two affordable housing projects now under construction. The Three Sisters Apartments at 130 N. Walnut will provide 70 units for low-income families

with children.

As city and state of-

ficials continue to wrestle with the symptoms of homelessness and mental illness, we must alwavs remember that the solution is affordable housing and ac-

cessible care, not enforcement and incarceration.

The latest attempt to attack the symptoms is a plan by Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story to confiscate shopping carts used by the homeless to keep and move all of their possessions. Story stressed that the homeless would be cited, not

arrested. And he said the fines of up to \$500 against

the homeless could be waived by a judge. Ideally, at that

point the person would be matched with the services he or she needs, and the shopping cart would no lon-

ger be an issue. But that's not what happens. In real life, the person is left with all their belongings and no way to transport them. We haven't solved anything. We've only made life a little harder for those who are already just scraping by.

Story concedes that shopping cart theft isn't

a big problem. In fact, the ordinance proposes that city government place a new burden on businesses to better track their carts. something they could be doing now if they were concerned about their

The problem is aesthetics. It doesn't look good for the city when so many people are rolling shopping carts down the sidewalks.

The shopping cart ban is one of two proposals the police chief has offered to deal with the homeless. The other would address the issue of panhandling, something the city has tried in the past, only to be shot

down by the courts.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham has also made panhandling one of three topics she wants the Legislature to address in an upcoming special session. While private property owners certainly have the right to control what happens in their parking lots, that does not extend to public streets and spaces.

In 2018, an attempt by the city to prohibit panhandling on street corners was challenged by the ACLU and struck down by the Supreme Court. Nothing in the law has changed since then.

Checkpoint seizures put recreational cannabis industry at risk

Recreational-use cannabis was legalized in New Mexico two years ago. Since then, New Mexicans have been enjoying safe and clean cannabis products from legitimate retailers across the state.

However, recent actions by U.S. Customs and Border Patrol put that at risk.

Over the last month, Border Patrol stopped dozens of licensed and legal cannabis businesses and seized over \$340,000 of product. My businesses alone lost \$139,000 worth of product during what was once a routine stop through a Border Patrol checkpoint on the way to Albuquerque from Las Cruces. At one time, my employees taking our products to Albuquerque would state they were U.S. citizens and move on, but that's not the case anymore.

This is problematic in a few ways. Seizing legal cannabis will have a drastic impact on the businesses operating legally in the state. Thankfully, I can absorb the cost at this time, but that's not true for every cannabis business across the state. There are many cannabis owners that are holding on by a thread and a loss of over \$100,000 would put them out of business.

Which leads directly into the second problem: Fewer regulated retailers means that more consumers may turn back to the illicit market where the consumer does not have access to safe, tested cannabis. Not only are consumers rolling the dice

with untested product, but driving sales to the illicit market erodes the tax base we are building with the cannabis industry.

Finally, the policies allowing Border Patrol to make these seizures are antiquated. Cannabis should not be treated like a deadly drug seized at the checkpoints like fentanyl, where policy should be focused. Medical and recreational cannabis is legal in 38 states. Our friends, families, and neighbors rely on cannabis as a medicine and cannot be cut off from a plant that helps their health.

We need reform. My friends and I in the cannabis industry are calling for change at the highest levels of government. A recent Gallup poll found that 70 percent of Americans support legalizing cannabis for adult use. It seems like a no brainer at this point.

Please join my fellow retailers, growers, manufacturers, advocates and patients in urging our elected officials in Washington, D.C. to take action and stop the seizure of legal cannabis in New Mexico. If nothing changes, it will have devastating effects on the industry, but more importantly, New Mexicans will be forced to turn back to the illicit market because retailers won't be able to keep the lights on.

You can get involved by signing our petition to #ProtectThePounds, to tell them that something needs to be done about the legal cannabis that is being seized by Border Patrol in our state. You can sign the petition online or in stores near you coming soon.

Together, we can ensure that everyone has access to safe, regulated cannabis in New Mexico.

'STREET OF TOO MANY STORIES'

Denise Chávez releases new book to the world

"Here's to all literature, the power of women's stories and our ancestors, all those women who have come before our mothers."— Author Denise Chávez

Author Denise Chávez said if there are running motifs in her work, and there are many, they are about mercy, forgiveness, healing of families and looking at the people in our lives that have served us.

In her new book, "Street of Too Many Stories," Chávez has woven the lives of four families intersecting in the New Mexican town Encantada and living on Encantada Street.

"So Encantada Street is about the intersection and healing of families," she said. "And about the people that help serve them - the gardeners; Pasajero, a dog; and Sammy, a cat."

For a hint at the stories inside, the cover of the book holds some powerful images, Chávez said. From "the wedding dress," to "the piñata," and even the dog and the cat can be found there.

"Initially I thought the streets are old and battered," she said. "If you are driving down the streets, they are cracked. You look at the mountains. There is something about the image."

People will see familiar pieces of our lives in the cover, but while they may look like the Organ Mountains, Chávez said. "It's the mountains in the book, but its reminiscent of where we come from because if you drive around here you will see the power of the mountains and of the neighborhoods."

The characters, too, are reflective of the people around us. For example, one of the characters in the book lives shuttered in her house. She's from Mexico. never learned English, never learned how to drive, never bought groceries. Her husband did everything.

"This is reminiscent of my aunt, who never drove, never bought groceries, never did anything herself," Chávez said. "My uncle did everything for her. She sewed, she had a life with her children, she was shuttered."

Chávez said she worked on her first novel, "Face of an Angel," at 600 pages, for seven years. Now, she worked on

ture," she said. "I'm older and it's interesting to see the growth."

She thinks of the process as an evolution of consciousness, she said.


"I really feel this book is a hard book, but it's a powerful and merciful book," she said. "You have this street, these families, but sometimes the street has a voice too. It speaks. It remembers when it was in the antediluvian days, when all of this was under water and this was an ocean. It remembers when the Camino

> Real was here and the carts were going through."

But also sometimes, Chávez said, the ancestors will come out from that place wherever they live and look in the houses to see how the people are doing, checking in on them.

She said there is something of magical realism in this book, but it's also very much a border story. The whole story is told in the introduction itself but not really.

"It's not the real story because you really have to go to the voice," she said. "This book is an opera of sounds and words. It's very theatrical."

She can see it done as an oral theatrical piece because it features voices of the different people: the elderly man and his rented hospital bed; the young people struggling; even the cat has a story.

"It's voice-driven and character-driven, which I really think is my strength," Chávez said. "I think my drama background really helped with voice. There are a lot of interesting characters."

Starting at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 29, a book launch event takes place at Nopalitos Restaurant, 310 S. Mesquite Street, where Chávez will read from and discuss "Street of Too Many Stories." After the reading, the event becomes a pachanga party as everyone is invited to the patio for taquitos, wine and cookies.

Noting that the restaurant formerly housed a Baptist church she said, "It's a great honor for me to read in a place of service a book that deals with women and families and what service is about."

Before the official event, 11 a.m.-4 p.m. on May 29, Chávez and her husband, Daniel Zolinsky, invite everyone to an open house at their bookstore, Casa Camino Real (one street east of the bookstore, as the crow flies. from the restaurant at 314 South Tornillo Street) for art sales, half-price books, coffee and more.

The book is available at Casa Camino Real Bookstore and other book platforms, including Conocimientos Press at ConocimientosPressLLC.

NMSU art professor's work and life evolve through teaching

When Craig Cully started teaching at New Mexico State University, his work consisted of mostly meticulous, small-scale paintings of high realism. Galleries across the United States were exhibiting and selling his work. After earning tenure as an art professor at NMSU, he began to rethink his practice.

"I often ask myself, 'What is the best thing I can do for humanity?' and, over time, I've learned that the answer is teaching art," Cully said.

On the walls of the second-floor hallway in Devasthali Hall, self-portraits of Cully's students hang like family photos in a home. NMSU's art department has been Cully's home for the past 15 years, while sharing his love of painting with NMSU art students from all walks of life.

This year, Cully nominated art student Citlali Delgado for the Yale Norfolk School of Art's Summer Residency Program. Delgado is the first NMSU student to be accepted into the prestigious program.

"I believe having professors who care for student success is critical in academia," Delgado said. "Professor Cully is quick to email me links to resources and artist websites he thinks could be a good influence on my painterly techniques."

While he is encouraging his students to push their limits to expand their experiences and vision as artists, he is also working to stretch his own capacity in the field and evolve his art.

"Part of my allocation of effort every year in order to retain my job is to do my own research and publish it," Cully said. "In the art world, what that means is I need to

study certain techniques and influences and have my work exhibited in museums and galleries every year. So, teaching and being in an institution like this is incredibly beneficial to me as an artist."

During a one-year sabbatical in 2015 in his home state of Pennsylvania, he started investigating the sport of fox hunting, leading to the creation of "Discourse of the Chase."

"I became interested in the constructs of the sport itself and the way the people thought about it and interacted with the land and the animals," Cully said. "It became this new, bombastic body of work on canvases of up to eight feet tall."

His work changed again in 2020, when he and his wife Kelly were confined to their Tucson, Ariz. home for months during the pandemic. Blending Cully's painting style with his wife's graphic design work, the pair created the "Collusions" series, a reflexive study of

collaboration and cooperation.

New incarnations of Cully's vision are still evolving and being exhibited in galleries across the country, most recently at the Louis Carlos Bernal Gallery in Tucson.

Cully was recently a semi-finalist for the 2024 Herbert Freehills Portrait Award, selected from among more than 1,000 submissions. In a collaboration with former art department head Julia Barello, the duo also was among six semi-finalists for an installation at the Albuquerque Sunport.

Cully's work reveals his own inner world, while his teaching helps students to reveal themselves through their art. He recently celebrated his birthday by creating a series of birthday portraits, a tradition he's kept since he turned 40. Visitors will notice the expressive self-portraits hanging on the wall inside his office, mirroring the student self-portraits that line the halls outside his door.



The original version of the Kelsey Grammer sitcom spun off from "Cheers" has been a home-video staple for many years, but this release contains the maiden round season of the current Paramount+ revival, which has gotten a Season 2 order. After winning four of his five Primetime Emmy Awards for playing the title part the first time, Grammer returns as high-minded psychiatrist Frasier Crane, who returns to the Boston setting of "Cheers." Nicholas Lyndhurst also is a regular cast member as a college pal of Frasier who is a professor now. There's also a new rendering of the theme song ("Tossed Salads and Scrambled Eggs") recorded by Grammer, who remains as an executive producer as well. ★★★ (Not rated: AS, P)

Apricots have been harvested for thouands of years the world over. including New Mexico, imbuing glazes, compotes and iams with their distinct. tangy flavor. Diane Ackerman, in her poem, "The Consolation of Apricots," described the flavor thus:

"Somewhere between a peach and a prayer, they taste of well water

and butterscotch and dried apples

and desert simooms and lust."

(A simoom, by the way, is a hot, dry wind that blows dirt - something we know about in southern New Mexico even if we don't use the Arabic name for it.)

For their shape and flaring gold color, as well as their early-summer ripening, it is said the ancient Persians nicknamed

them "sun eggs." Pliny the Elder referred to them as Armenian plums, since they came to Rome by way of Armenia and, like the plums and peaches, they are drupes — fleshy fruits with their seed embedded in the middle, inside a ker-

RECIPE Apricot Preserves

11/2 cups dried apricot halves, coarsely puréed in a food processor 2 cups water

3/4 cup sugar Juice of one lemon 1/2 tsp. almond extract 2 tbs. brandy

Cook all ingredients in a heavy saucepan over medium heat for 30 minutes or until thick. Stir occasionally. Cool and refrigerate in airtight container. It will store for several months. Use as a glaze for tarts or ham, cookie filling, warmed up as a sauce for cake or ice cream and, of course, as a spread for breads.

Alarming diagnosis inspired drinking water business

When Richard Todd's wife, Yolanda, was diagnosed with breast cancer, her doctors suggested she drink alkaline water to support her immune system.

But the options available in Las Cruces were expensive and not easily accessible. Todd said. In El Paso, the couple discovered Water Tree, a company based in Houston that provides various products to customers for purifying their water.

The couple purchased a filtration system, installed it under the sink in their home and soon became proponents of the product. Todd went so far as to open his own Water Tree store in Las Cruces in 2022.

"This is my retirement." Todd said. "Making people happy, helping them have good water - that's what I'm here to do."

Water Tree Las Cruces is located on N. Main Street in an unassuming suite tucked between several other businesses. The store's purpose is given away almost immediately when customers walk up and see the water dispensers outside the entrance.

Inside, customers will find a long sink with six different types of water they can purchase, including pure, premium, magnesium and mineral.

Todd explained that his filtration system, set up in the back of the shop, purifies city tap water. New customers will likely get an electrolyzer demonstration from Todd, showing the impurities in city tap water compared to his alkaline water.

the Water Tree filtration system customers can install in their homes differs from on-the-counter or faucet systems, which likely use electrolysis to increase the pH levels.



Todd also explained that Instead, Water Tree's system purifies the water and then increases pH or adds minerals by filtering the purified water through a mixture of natural materials.

> "Your body is intended to have a certain amount of minerals and food and everything else in order for you to work right," he said. "So as you partake of good water that has good pH, your body's going to go, 'wow.'"

> Since he opened his doors, Todd said people have brought him samples of the tap water they get at home or various bottled waters they drink to test

with the electrolyzer.

"You can buy bottled water of all different kinds with different pH's and everything else, right? The question is, how good really is the water?" Todd asked.

He said only one person had water come out as clear as his, using a similar at-home filtration system.

If people do not wish to install the full system at home, they can purchase the various levels of alkaline water Todd offers at the store. Customers bring their water jugs and fill them with their desired water at a set rate. And on

days the store is closed, customers are welcome to use the taps outside the building.

Todd described himself as self-taught when it comes to building things and working with his hands. He renovated the inside of his shop himself. and custom-rigged the water taps on his own. He credited his architect father, along with the 20 years he spent troubleshooting weapon systems in the U.S. Air Force, for his knowledge.

who is in remission, and others in Las Cruces.

"I'm not going to promise vou a miracle because it's not miracle water. It's here to help. Everyone is different," Todd said. "It's just like some drugs help some people but they don't do a thing for others. It's no different."

High court reverses PRC on utility revenue

The state Supreme Court found that the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission's interpretation of the Efficient Use of Energy Act is "unlawful and unreasonable."

In an opinion issued May 13, the New Mexico Supreme Court overturned a PRC ruling over how utilities collect revenue.

The case centers around a mechanism known as revenue decoupling. Essentially, revenue decoupling provides some separation between the amount of money a utility makes and the amount of electricity its customers consume. This is important because programs like load management and energy efficiency upgrades are necessary to reduce emissions but also result in lower electricity consumption.

The Efficient Use of Energy Act directs the PRC to allow utilities to use revenue decoupling.

The parties in the state Supreme Court case all agreed that the law allows for revenue decoupling.

They disputed what that should look like.

Both PNM and renewable energy advocacy groups like Coalition for Clean Affordable Energy appealed the PRC's ruling, arguing that the law mandates approval of a full revenue decoupling mechanism. Meanwhile, the PRC concluded that the law allows it to approve a partial decoupling mechanism.

Under full decoupling, the utility is able to use the mechanism to ensure it reaches the full amount of revenue that it is allowed to recover. The state Supreme Court gave the example of a utility experiencing a \$2 million shortfall due to lower than projected consumption. A full decoupling mechanism provides a way for the utility to recover that \$2 million from rates.

Under partial decoupling, the utility might be able to recover a por-

tion of that \$2 million shortfall, but not the full amount.

"Thus, unlike full revenue decoupling, partial revenue decoupling insulates only a portion of the utility's collections from revenue losses due to various business risks," the court opinion written by Justice Michael E. Vigil states.

The Public Service Company of New Mexico submitted an application for a shared cost of service rider. The company requested that the rider be applied to residential and small business ratepavers. It contained a full decoupling mechanism which, Vigil wrote, "ensured that the revenue approved in PNM's 2015 general rate case would be recovered by PNM without regard to the quantity of electricity sold."

However, later, as the legal disputes emerged, PNM requested staying that petition. Later it joined other entities, including CCAE and the Renewable Energy Industries Association, in asking the PRC for clarification on legal issues that had been identified during the proceedings.

A hearing examiner issued a recommended decision in 2022 stating that the PRC is not required to allow full revenue decoupling, which the hearing examiner said would sever the connection between sales and revenue regardless of the "the reason for variation in the utility's sales."

The hearing examiner argued that a full revenue decoupling would contradict the PRC's requirement under the Public Utility Act to balance public interests, consumer interests and utility interests.

The PRC then issued an order adopting the recommended decision. That order was overturned this week by the state Supreme Court.

The court found that the EUEA allows for full decoupling.

The language in the law states that when a utility petitions, the PRC shall "remove regulatory disincentives through the adoption of a rate adjustment mechanism that ensures that the revenue per customer approved by the commission in a general rate case proceeding is recovered by the public utility without regard to the quantity of electricity

or natural gas actually sold by the public utility subsequent to the date the rate took effect."

Vigil highlighted the portion that states that the utility can recover the full amount of approved revenue "without regard to the quantity of electricity or natural gas actually sold." The court order states that only full decoupling would achieve this.

"Unlike the Commission, we do not view full revenue decoupling as inconsistent or incompatible with this balancing of interests and the setting of just and reasonable rates," Vigil states in the opinion. "We have repeatedly emphasized that whether a rate is just and reasonable depends on whether the rate falls within the zone of reasonableness between utility confiscation and ratepayer extortion. We have found nothing in the record or regulatory literature cited by the parties which suggests that the Commission or utilities will be unable to meet this standard with a full revenue decoupling mechanism in place. For example, even with the adoption of a full revenue decoupling mechanism, the Commission must still calculate and approve a utility's revenue requirement in a way that balances the interests of ratepayers and the utility's investors and ensures just and reasonable rates."

Jersey Mike's grilled subs arrive in Las Cruces

The Jersey Mike's Subs chain reached Las Cruces this week with a combined grand opening event and charity fundraiser beginning on Wednesday, the day the Las Cruces Bulletin goes to press.

The submarine sandwich chain reports 2,734 locations across the United States, including 11 in New Mexico. Seven of those are in Albuquerque, along with locations in Santa Fe, Los Lunas, Rio Rancho and its new Las Cruces franchise, owned by Shane Jones. The Jersey Mike's website reports a future location is planned in

Roswell, also.

"We are so excited to finally be a part of the Las Cruces community," Jones said in a news release.

The shop is located at 4169 White Sage Arc off of Northrise Drive near Sonoma Ranch Blvd.

From Wednesday through Sunday, customers with coupons are able to exchange a sandwich for a small contribution to Make A Wish New Mexico. The company says its charitable contributions since 2010 top \$135 million, and that it raised \$25 million for over 200 local charities during its annual "month of giving" event in March.

NMSU faces criticism as more details revealed about Hadley Hall occupation

At least eight protestors face criminal charges following a mass arrest at New Mexico State University initiated by school administrators on May 9.

An NMSU spokesperson confirmed that a group of administrators, some of whom were in the building, decided to call police to arrest people staging an occupation of the school's administrative building.

The decision led to criminal charges against students, one protestor becoming briefly hospitalized, the deployment of three police agencies and local criticism of NMSU.

"We condemn the actions of New Mexico State University for escalating tensions by calling city and state police, thereby suppressing the voices of these demonstrators. It is the fundamental right for all individuals to express their First Amendment right to protest and express their grievances, particularly in solidarity with oppressed communities," NM Comunidades en Acción y de Fe (CAFe) said in a statement.

NMSU administration offi-

cially responded to the incident on May 10.

"Much like other universities around the country, we have seen students, faculty, and community members participating in Palestinian solidarity demonstrations on our campus for the past two weeks," interim President Mónica Torres said in a statement, referring to the encampment nearby.

A spokesperson said Torres and interim Provost Lakshmi Reddi were the top administrators involved in the decision to remove protestors by force. The group also involved NMSU police chief Andy Bowen.

"We have said from the beginning that people in the U.S. have a Constitutional right to protest peacefully. People do not, however, have a right to interfere with university operations, damage property, or to spit on or strike police officers," Torres stated.

Torres' statement, released a day after the protest, also failed to correct inaccurate information NMSU had put out during the incident. The statement claimed that 13 people had been arrested, but court records show that 11 people were ar-

rested, not 13.

It's also unclear if all 11 will face charges. The Bulletin could only confirm, as of Tuesday evening, that eight people face charges. The charges are restricted to misdemeanor resisting arrest and trespassing.

One protester faces a felony charge of criminal damage to property for allegedly breaking a window and one felony charge of battery on a peace officer for allegedly spitting on a police officer. That same protester had twice been tackled and tossed around by police officers during the incident before he was detained after the mass arrest, as witnessed by a reporter.

All 11 were released from jail the same night. Those with publicly available court records are set for first appearances at the end of May.

The protest organizers, a local group of students and young people called Las Cruces for Palestine, confirmed that seven of the arrested are enrolled students, two are alums, and two are Las Cruces community members.

"NMSU administration has publicly stated their dedication to 'open dialogue.' We have met twice with administration, and both times were given vague responses, statements designed to 'de-escalate tension' rather than create tangible changes. But as NMSU leadership refuses to take a hard stance against the genocide of Palestinians, over 100,000 Gazans have been killed or badly wounded. The facts of the genocide are not in dispute," read a statement from Las Cruces for Palestine.

The statement went on to say: "The fact is, our so-called 'open dialogue' with the NMSU administration has left us no closer to serious discussion of NMSU's complicity as an academic institution in the ongoing genocide. NMSU has yet to demonstrate genuine commitment to public dialogue with students or divestment; rather, our experience shows an apathy to the genocide and scholasticide in Gaza and a hostility to student speech."

Free Hepatitis C testing open for New Mexico adults

State health officials are encouraging all New Mexico adults to get free diagnostic testing for Hepatitis C in order to prevent it from spreading.

Federal guidelines under the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends Hepatitis C (HCV) testing at least once in a lifetime for everyone aged 18 or older, and for all pregnant people during each pregnancy.

The New Mexico
Department of Health
on Tuesday sent out
information to access
locations about where to
get an HCV test, along
with other public health
services.

An estimated 25,800 people in New Mexico have HCV but do not have treatment, according to the state's HCV elimination plan published in 2022.

State health officials cite CDC guidance, saying more than 90 percent of people infected with HCV can be cured with eight to 12 weeks of oral therapy.

However, a study the CDC published in June found a far smaller proportion of people in the U.S. actually get treatment.

The Daily Montanan reports in the decade after new antiviral treatments were introduced, only about a third of people with an initial HCV diagnosis cleared the virus, either through

treatment or the virus resolving on its own.

Without treatment, HCV infection can lead to severe liver disease, liver cancer, and even death, the health department said in a news release. Symptoms may include fatigue, yellow skin or eyes, brain fog, stomach pain and joint pain, according to state health officials.

Las Cruces defense attorney appointed to municipal court

James DeRossit, a Las Cruces defense attornev and long-time public defender, was appointed on May 6 as the second judge in Las Cruces Municipal

The appointment comes as the city and council refocus attention on the municipal court as a venue to alleviate issues around petty crime. Since the election of Judge Anthony Filosa in 2023, the council and mayor have instructed the municipal court and city attorney's office to hire more attornevs to prosecute and defend cases.

The city council also instructed the court to improve access to diversionary programs, such as a homeless court connecting unhoused people to community resources.

"More than any other court, the municipal court deals directly with pressing quality-of-life issues affecting us in this beautiful city," DeRossit said upon accepting the job. "I pledge to serve this city in that role, treating every person who comes before the court with dignity and respect."

The council approved DeRossit on a 6-1 vote. Bill Mattiace, councilor for District 2, said he voted against the appointment

because he wasn't present the second municipal for the interview.

According to a presentation by Human Resources Assistant Director JC Borrego, seven people applied to be municipal judges. Five were interviewed before DeRossit was selected.

Borrego said DeRossit received his law degree from Washington and Lee University in Virginia. He also holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Memphis and a master's in philosophy from the University of Texas.

DeRossit has been a lawver for 20 years, including as managing attorney at the 11th Judicial District Public Defender's

court judge receive 95 percent of what the court's top judge earns. According to city records, DeRossit's salary will be \$147.909.53.

The same records noted that DeRossit is an active New Mexico State Bar attornev.

The municipal court oversees petty misdemeanor crimes, such as trespassing and vandalism, within city limits. However, it does not have exclusive jurisdiction over these. Police officers often act as prosecutors in these low-level offenses and can choose to take the case to the Doña Ana Magistrate Court.

DeRossitt's appointment lasts until 2026. To keep the seat, he'll have to face an electoral challenge in the 2025 municipal elections.



New Mexico State University reported that the Aggies finished their run at the Conference USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships with strong athletic performances and a third place finish at the Larry K. Durham Track at Kidd Field in El Paso.

Terice Steen won gold in 400m hurdles, Aliyah Logan won silver in 100m hurdles while bronze medals were collected by Cameron Hodges, Thulisile Amon, Mickaliliah Vassell and the 4x400 relay team, per the university.

NMSU finished with 119 points in the final standings, behind UTEP (138 points) and Liberty University (177.7).

Several Aggies are set to compete in the NCAA West first round at the University of Arkansas, May 22-25, per NMSU, with any top 12 finishers advancing to the 2024 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships at the University

of Oregon, June 5-8. The last Crimsonand-White athlete to qualify was identified as Kayli Farmer in 2017.

You have questions. Dr. Golf has answers

Question: I have been puzzled for a long time about the difference between a "golf professional" and a "professional golfer." I thought they were the same.

Dr. Golf: Melissa. vou're not alone with some confusion. A golf professional is a club or a teaching pro, or working in other aspects of the golf industry, and is usually a member of the PGA of America. There are more than 30,000 PGA men and women (ves. women) golf professionals in America, some of whom are graduates of NMSU's Professional Golf Management program. A professional golfer, on the

other hand, is an individual who plays tournament

golf for a living,
notably on the PGA
Tour or other pro
tours. While most
of the competitors
playing the PGA
Championship are
tour professionals,
spots are reserved
for 20 PGA of
America club pros
who have full time jobs
other than practicing and
playing for money.


Question: I know you have written about fear and focusing on the golf course before, but I have a habit of getting nervous, I mean to the point of shaking, when I notice the other folks I'm playing with who are standing

around as an audience. They probably aren't

looking to pass judgement, but it bothers me. Help.

Feeling like you're under a microscope and constantly being evaluated can be a paralyzing fear. And the farther you get out of your comfort zone, the worse it tends to get. Start training yourself to feel like you are standing in your own personal, private space that nobody else can penetrate. One

expert speaks about how stage performers try to stay in their "light" because the stage lights are so bright they can't see the audience. When you're playing golf, try to stick to your pre-shot routine every time, and get lost in that routine every time you hit. You won't notice anything else. I also think it is important to not get too serious on the golf course, and rather enjoy the company of our companions a little more.

Question: I play regularly with eight or 10 players (two groups) at one of the golf courses here in Las Cruces. We are older, middle-aged men who are experienced and all play decent golf. But they're

slow. There is not a lot of money involved, but other folks playing behind us get annoyed. Can you give me any suggestion as to how I might be able to move these guys along faster?

—Jack S., Mesilla Park

Dr. Golf: You have touched a raw nerve with me: slow play. Non-golfers are uninterested in learning to play because "it takes too long." Dawdling golfers have driven some people away from the game. Recreational golf would grow even more if folks would keep up a faster pace of play. As for your buddies, I'll bet most of them wait until it's their turn to start lining up their putts on the

green. Try to explain to them they should be ready to putt (i.e. strike the ball) when it's their turn. Line up your putts when others are putting. Along those lines encourage others to play "ready golf," not waiting until someone hits first. I'll bet your weekly partners have a thousand golf balls in their garage, but they still want to take 10 minutes looking for a ball they can't find. Establish a one-minute rule – past a minute, drop another ball and play. And everyone should have both a GPS watch and a laser rangefinder, so that distance is readily available and quick. No need to be gentle when breaking the news to speed up.
