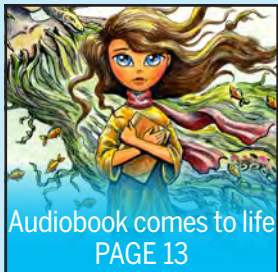

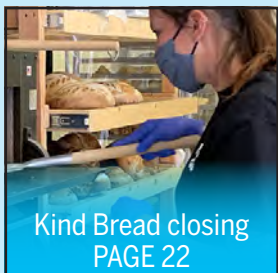

AG investigates Memorial Medical Center complaints

Attorney General Raúl Torrez made clear in a news conference July 16 that he was deeply concerned about Memorial Medical Center's practices as he announced an investigation into southern New Mexico's largest hospital.

Torrez – flanked on the left by public officials critical of the hospital and to the right by former patients who'd spoken out against MMC – told a gaggle of reporters that his office initially believed the investigation would be narrow in scope and limited to claims that MMC denied service.

But just Tuesday morning, as more former patients and hospital staff emerged from the woodwork, Torrez deemed the investigation needed to expand.

He said that his office was primarily investigating whether the hospital had violated any consumer protection laws—all civil violations with monetary penalties—but said he'd be sharing information with federal authorities and refused to rule out the possibility of a criminal

investigation.

But regardless, Torrez and other officials said MMC had morally injured Las Cruces and its patients.

"I can't think of a better way of describing the profound implications of the alleged misconduct that is taking place at the hospital," Torrez said. "And moral injury of that type only occurs when there's been a moral failure."

Overall, Torrez noted claims that MMC refused service to

people who couldn't pay, had questionable billing practices and instituted a culture of fear among its employees. He also warned hospital officials not to interfere with the investigation and said that retaliation against employees would be dealt with severely.

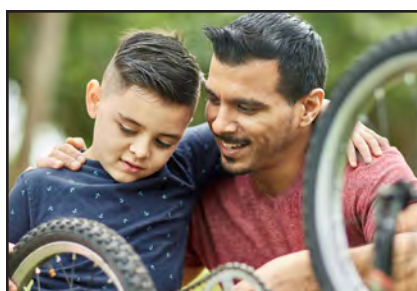
"Make no mistake, anyone engaged in any form of retaliation against patients who speak out or providers who speak out will be dealt with by this office and this agency," Torrez said.

The hospital responded Tuesday afternoon with the following statement: "Memorial Medical Center was surprised to learn of this investigation by Attorney General Torrez during his press conference today. We remain committed to expanding access to care and being a good community partner in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County and will be cooperating fully with this investigation."

MMC fell under increased scrutiny following the publication of an NBC News investigation in June. The article noted a dozen people who said the hospital denied them treatment because they couldn't pay or had insurance the hospital refused to accept.

The article also noted that MMC is a for-profit hospital operated by Lifepoint Health and owned by private equity firm Apollo Global Management. That model, of which New Mexico has a greater proportion than any other state in the U.S., has come under pressure as instances of prioritizing profit over patients

Man accused in toddler death not held

A man accused of killing his five-month-old son will be allowed to leave jail and stay with his family in Arizona after a hearing last Thursday.

Joseph Isaiah Parra, 31, was arrested on July 7 after deputies with the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Office said he killed his son, Apollo Parra, at the family's home north of Las Cruces while intoxicated. Parra has denied the allegation, and his attorney suggested the situation could be a tragic medical episode, not abuse.

During a brief hearing on July 11, a district judge heard arguments from prosecutors who wanted

to keep Parra in jail. Apollo's mother appeared in court ready to testify for the prosecution, but Chief Deputy District Attorney Heather Chavez did not call on her.

Instead, Chavez relied on an affidavit that outlined interviews with Parra, Apollo's grandparents, his mother and medical professionals who treated Apollo before his death.

According to the affidavit, Apollo's mother received a call from Parra around 1:30 p.m. while at work. She said Parra told her that Apollo wasn't breathing. She also said he sounded drunk on the phone and that Parra was hesitant to call 911.

Shortly after, Apollo's maternal grandparents

arrived and whisked Apollo away to the hospital after they said Parra was again hesitant to involve emergency services. The grandparents said Parra didn't want to call because "it would be a

process," Parra allegedly said.

The Parra family lived north of Doña Ana, about 20 minutes from the nearest hospital. Emergency efforts may have been additionally complicated

as EMTs arrived first at Parra's house. According to the affidavit, Parra seemed initially unaware that the grandparents had taken Apollo.

The grandparents, who told deputies they attempted CPR throughout the drive, were intercepted by a deputy who also attempted CPR on Apollo before EMTs caught up to them. Apollo then made it to a Las Cruces hospital before being flown to an El Paso hospital, where he later died.

In the affidavit, investigators noted that Apollo had bruising around his left eye and a mark on the right side of his torso. The mother told investigators those injuries had not been present earlier in the morning.

Parra denied hitting Apollo or causing his death but said the last time he'd seen Apollo was around either 9:30 a.m. or 10:30 a.m., four to three hours before the call between him and the mother.

After changing the diapers of the other children, Parra said he went to change Apollo and noticed he was "lifeless." He said he began tapping on Apollo to get a response but got none. At that point, he called Apollo's mother.

Parra also initially denied drinking but later said he'd taken two drinks of tequila before the incident. Investigators noted in the affidavit they found

Judge orders man held over Circle K stabbing

A Las Cruces judge ordered a man accused of killing an unhoused man to be held in jail after prosecutors argued he presented a threat to other unhoused residents.

At the hearing on July 10, William Clyde Turner, 51, was ordered to remain in jail until the case was resolved, even though his defense attorney suggested that self-defense may be relevant as the case progresses.

Turner is accused of killing Carlos Joseph Lakemper, 30, on July 6 behind the Circle K on Avenida De Mesilla. Turner is

charged with first-degree murder and denied stabbing Lakemper, according to court records.

The central document of Wednesday's hearing was the affidavit filed against Turner. His attorney, Ramona Martinez, questioned why prosecutors were not providing evidence described in the affidavit instead of relying entirely on it.

"I practice in other jurisdictions, and other district attorneys' offices are able to get me basic discovery," she said.

Specifically, Martinez said that prosecutors should have provided her with surveillance video that allegedly showed Turner and Lakemper entering Circle K at different points. She

asked the judge not to consider that evidence, but the judge denied her request.

David McCardle, a prosecutor with the 3rd Judicial District Attorney's Office, reiterated the key points of the affidavit during the hearing's arguments and provided additional information about the case.

According to court records, police believe Turner and Lakemper – both of whom are homeless – encountered each other behind Circle K on Avenida de Mesilla before getting into an argument that turned into a fight.

Turner told police after his arrest that Lakemper came to collect \$60 from Turner, accord-

ing to officers. Turner said he didn't have the money, which caused Lakemper to attack him. Turner told police that Lakemper beat him up and overpowered him until Turner used a lighter to burn Lakemper and flee toward his encampment.

Turner told police he did not stab Lakemper. He also said that he does not carry knives.

However, a witness statement summarized in the affidavit contradicted Turner's account. The witness, also described as homeless in the affidavit, observed the fight from a nearby campsite. The witness said Turner used a black combat knife to stab Lakemper in the back.

The affidavit does not state whether police recovered the knife, and statements made in court suggest they did not.

A short time later, a woman who was with Turner informed Circle K workers about the stabbing. The workers then called 911. Lakemper was taken to a Las Cruces hospital and then an El Paso hospital, where he later died. The affidavit noted that doctors believed Lakemper suffered from a punctured right lung.

Ultimately, Judge Richard Jacquez felt there was enough evidence to show that Turner was dangerous and that no form of bond would protect the public.

See a non-emergency on the street? Report it online

It might not be the most urgent thing in the world – but it still feels off.

Maybe it's a pile of illegally dumped trash, graffiti on the side of a wall or complaints about a rogue dog running amuck in a neighborhood. You don't want to call 911, but somebody should do something, right?

Now, Doña Ana County residents can fill out reports of a non-emergency nature online. The Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Authority, which handles most 911 calls in Doña Ana County, announced the system's deployment earlier this month.

Residents can go to MVRDA's website and

file a form detailing non-emergency incidents.

The form requests users to provide their name, address and details of the event. According to MVRDA Executive Director Jennifer Gorham, the system provides an option for residents to report non-emergency incidents such as lost property, vandalism, minor theft, animal complaints and illegal dumping.

"It's important that the community understands that this is another tool that they're going to have. Oftentimes, we (the community) get so busy, and we want to report something, and we get lost in the mix," Gorham said. "This is something that, later on, they can go to their desktop, or they can

use their phone to report instances as needed."

For MVRDA, Gorham said the system would ideally divert non-emergency calls away from call takers, decreasing stress and workload for a critical

cog in the public safety machine.

"I'm always here to commend our staff for the hard work that they do. And they work very long hours. So we're utilizing this as another tool to assist the community, but also assist our staff in managing the workload," she said.

MVRDA, mainly funded by the city of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County, has struggled with recruitment and retention in recent years.

The stress of the job and a competitive market for call-takers led to high vacancy rates, which were

exacerbated by pandemic-related economic consequences. Fewer call-takers means a heavier workload for those who remain.

Records show that MVRDA has increased its pay for call-takers since then. However, factors outside the Authority's control still challenge retention and recruitment efforts.

Gorham said she hopes this system, for which MVRDA will pay about \$5,000 monthly, will help. Indeed, there's evidence that it could.

The online reporting system is called Alastar and was created by Ad-

vanced Technology International, a South Carolina nonprofit and Department of Defense contractor.

Other municipalities have reported that the system diverted 40 to 50 percent of non-emergency calls away from call takers.

Gorham said getting to that point would be amazing, but it may take time to implement since most Las Cruces are likely unaware of the services.

"We understand it's going to be a ramp-up for success. And any amount of calls that we can get moved to the non-emergency online reporting is going to be a success in our books," Gorham said.

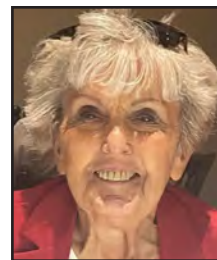

eleven empty bottles of tequila around the house – but it's unclear if that alcohol was consumed that morning.

Prosecutor Chavez argued that the deputy's narrative showed Parra was dangerous, especially to his remaining children.

Chavez also noted that Parra, who'd been charged with battery against a household member two weeks before Apollo's death, violated his release conditions by drinking alcohol. Chavez argued that that painted a picture of a man who could not be trusted and should be held in jail.

Tyler McCormick, Parra's attorney, reminded the court that Parra had merely been charged with domestic violence – not convicted. McCormick noted that Parra had virtually no criminal history other than that pending charge. As for the alleged violation of release conditions by drinking, McCormick said that Parra would stay with his father in Arizona, and the father would keep alcohol away from Parra.

McCormick and Chavez also sparred over the strength of the evidence. McCormick noted that some of the injuries to Apollo may have been caused by any of the people who attempted CPR.

"The big hole in the state's case is that we don't know what caused that child's death," McCormick said, adding that the court did not really know how or when the injuries occurred.

Chavez pushed back, noting the bruising to Apollo's eye, and suggested that further medical tests would show Apollo's death was not random.

"It's not really fair to say that we don't know when these injuries occurred because we know that he was in the care of his father and his father alone," Chavez said.

Ultimately, 3rd Judicial District Judge Douglas Driggers found that Chavez failed to prove the two points required for a no-bond hold. He released Parra on a \$40,000 bond and allowed him to return to Arizona with his father.

Next, prosecutors said they plan to bring the case to a grand jury.

Southern New Mexico officials condemn violence after Trump shooting

Officials from across the political spectrum in southern New Mexico took time over the weekend to condemn political violence following the assassination attempt that came very close to killing former President Donald Trump on July 13.

As of this article's publication on July 15, federal investigators believe that a 20-year-old man fired at least one round that injured Trump's ear but killed volunteer firefighter Corey Comperatore and critically injured two other attendees. The gunman was then killed by law enforcement officers.

"Gun violence has no place on our streets, in politics, or in the democratic discourse," wrote southern New Mexico congressman Gabe Vasquez on X. "As information continues to unfold, let me be clear that I strongly condemn acts of violence against anyone, regardless of political party."

Vasquez's rival from across the aisle, Republican candidate and former congresswoman Yvette Herrell, stated, "I am praying for President Trump, his family, and our nation. No one will divide this nation as long as we are united under God and our freedoms secured."

The shooting reset an already contentious presidential election – in which both candidates have received calls to step down – amid an era of U.S. politics fraught with violence and intimidation in both national and local contexts. The shooting also revealed a cynical public as conspiracy theories erupted online within hours of the televised shooting.

In New Mexico, multiple people in multiple situations have been shot at protests around conquistador statues, and a failed candidate faces charges for allegedly orchestrating shootings at multiple public officials' homes.

A report published in January 2024 by the Bren-

nan Center for Justice, which surveyed elected officials from around the U.S., shed light on the situation nationwide.

Researchers found that threats and intimidation of local officials had risen sharply. The report found that: 43 percent of state legislators and 18 percent of local officeholders experienced threats.

Thirty-eight percent of state legislators reported that the amount of abuse they experience has increased since first taking public office, while only 16 percent reported that it has decreased. Twenty-nine percent of state legislators reported that the seriousness of the incidents has increased, while only 12 percent reported that it has decreased.

The report also found women and people of color were experiencing more threats compared to their colleagues. The Brennan Center report found that more than 40 percent of officeholders who'd experienced threats or violence were less

likely to stay in the office.

Separately, the United States Capitol Police reported that it investigated 8,008 "concerning statements and direct threats" to members of Congress in 2023. That number represented a 6.8 increase over the previous year, while threat assessments reached a recent peak in 2021, with 9,625.

Las Cruces officials confirmed this national trend was present locally across news articles in the Bulletin and elsewhere.

"Women and women of color in elected office have seen serious increases in political threats/violence in the last few years, me included," said Las Cruces councilor Johana Bencomo. "It's worth repeating that political violence has no place in our democracy."

Bencomo added that she's frustrated that threats against local officials receive much less attention and protection.

"It's clear that a new era of politics is here," Bencomo said

became more publicized.

Following the NBC News article, MMC's CEO John Harris denied this allegation during a Las Cruces City Council meeting. He said the story contained "a number of inaccuracies and misinformation."

"What has been published is not reflective of how our hospital cares for patients or how it contributes to our community," Harris told the council on June 11.

One of the key figures in the NBC News story, Barbara Quarrell, spoke to reporters on Tuesday about her experience at MMC. When Quarrell, a former MMC nurse and longtime Las Cruces resident, was diagnosed with cancer in 2022, she said MMC rejected her from treatment almost as soon as she asked for it.

"I wasn't probably even half a mile down the road when the doctor called me and said, 'They're not going to treat you because they don't take your insurance,'" Quarrell said.

Torrez said his office would first and foremost investigate questions about denial of care. MMC could face monetary fines and damages if Torrez proves those allegations.

"We will be reaching out to our federal counterparts to engage in a deeper investigation regarding some of the billing practices that, frankly, I was unaware of until today," Torrez said.

Torrez did not specify what questions his office

had about MMC's billing practices.

Local officials also responded to questions about MMC as the state and potential federal investigation get underway.

Notably, the hospital – a significant economic driver and one of only a few places to receive higher levels of medical treatment in southern New Mexico – is bound to a lease agreement with the city of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County. That lease agreement stipulates that MMC will provide services to indigent patients.

The Bulletin asked the local officials whether the allegations would constitute violations of MMC's contract.

"I think the lease is several hundred pages. And I think that we're really committed to poring over that, understanding what role we have and working with the county to hold MMC accountable to that lease. But that process is ongoing," said Las Cruces City Councilor Becky Corran.

It's unclear how long the AG's investigation will last, but it marks a new chapter in healthcare access in Las Cruces.

"The ultimate objective of an investigation like this, quite frankly, is not to secure necessarily financial penalties, but it's about what the community wants," Torrez said. "And what the community needs is a hospital centered on patient care."

Griffith's former position falls under LCU's Natural Gas and Energy Line of Business - Compliance, Regulation and Training Program, which is responsible for keeping the natural gas and energy team compliant with all

regulatory requirements by providing training and certification.

Although there are a few training courses that everyone in the line of business receives together, most training varies significantly from program to program. Technicians in Pressure & Service receive different training from those in Construction, Maintenance and Corrosion. Training is conducted in both a classroom and practical setting, with some programs conducting more "hands-on" training.

LCU's Construction & Maintenance (C&M) Program's training is frequently hands-on. This program also offers the greatest number of training courses and requires refreshers in shorter intervals of time. By law, C&M welders must refresh their welding certification every six months.

The scenario was filmed, allowing the coordinators to play back the training for the trainees in a classroom setting. Trainees were evaluated on their knowledge, response, and teamwork.

"These mock-incident trainings let us know where our technicians stand in their profession," Molina explains. "This allows us to consistently improve LCU so we can better serve our community."

Ruidoso mayor seeks answers about South Fork fire

Two weeks after a team of investigators issued a brief announcement that a lightning strike ignited the deadly South Fork Fire, calls for a fuller explanation are growing from local officials and members of the public.

Both Ruidoso Mayor Lynn Crawford and Lincoln County Sheriff Michael Wood have, in recent days, called on the Bureau of Indian Affairs to release a report detailing findings from a multi-agency investigation into the fire's cause.

Crawford, in an interview Tuesday with Source New Mexico, said he doesn't think investigators

are necessarily lying or covering anything up. But the lack of detailed information has meant rumors are circulating wildly, along with unfounded accusations directed at the Mescalero Apache Reservation, where the fires began, he said.

"If it is truly a lightning strike, an act of God, and they have satellite imagery, then we need to show the people," Crawford said Tuesday. "So that there's not speculation."

Wood's office posted on Facebook on July 11 that the sheriff had made a "formal request" to "personally review" the investigative reports into the fire origin. The sheriff did not respond to multiple emails and phone calls from

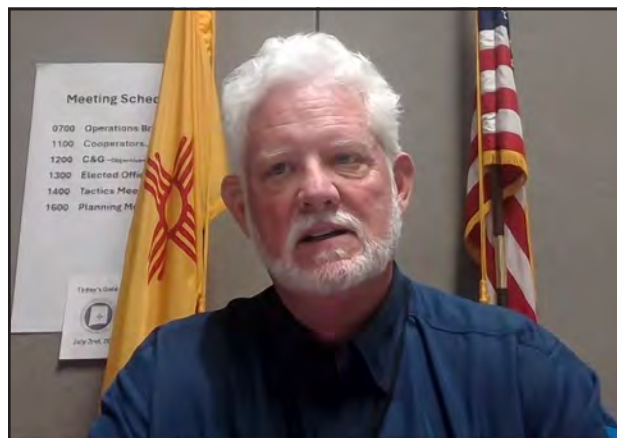
Source NM about why he sought the report findings.

Both fires began June 17 on the northeast corner of the Mescalero Apache Reservation, and high winds and dry conditions carried both fires through the Village of Ruidoso and toward nearby Ruidoso Downs, causing thousands to flee their homes.

Both fires are now defeated, thanks to hundreds of firefighters and early monsoon rains, but the blazes destroyed or damaged at least 1,400 homes, killed two people and burned through an area of more than 30 square miles. The rains also caused additional havoc, creating floods on burn-scarred soil that have stranded drivers, destroyed bridges and swept away homes.

On July 3, the Bureau of Indian Affairs announced that the South Fork Fire's cause was a lightning strike, but provided no additional details of when the strike occurred and where. The same announcement said that an investigation was ongoing into the cause of the Salt Fire, and that the FBI was offering a \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of the "person or persons responsible for starting the Salt Fire."

Robyn Broyles, a spokesperson for the BIA, told Source NM that a report will be released with more information about the South Fork Fire investigation, but she would only say that it would be released "as soon as possible."

The lightning report takes some time to compile, she said Tuesday, because it brings together Light Detection and Ranging data, known as LiDAR, along with lightning data and other sources of information, including field reports.

She did, however, confirm that the lightning strike investigators believe sparked the South Fork Fire occurred prior to June 17 and then "smoldered until very windy conditions spread the fire." She declined to say, even approximately, when and where that lightning strike occurred that provided the spark for what became the 17,500-acre fire.

Broyles acknowledged in a brief phone interview that her office has heard much speculation and distrust about the fires' cause from those still reeling from the fires and floods. She urged them to be patient, and stressed that, just because there were clear, blue skies the days the fire began, that doesn't

mean a lightning strike isn't to blame.

"These are questions the community is asking. They are valid questions. We don't have anything to hide," she said. "People are not fire ecologists. They don't know how a fire could start without lightning" the day the fire takes off.

Lightning data provided to Source NM by Vaisala Xweather, a firm that does lightning analyses for the National Weather Service, shows the last lightning strikes in the area of the South Fork Fire start occurred June 7, 10 days before the fire began. The closest strike was 1.03 miles from the fire's ignition site listed in official reports.

Crawford said he's asked repeatedly for additional proof of lightning being the cause since July 3. He hopes to present all of the findings at a town hall meeting for transparency's sake and to quell rumors. Without more details, his constituents are increas-

ingly angry about the devastating fire and are more inclined to pin the blame on somebody without evidence.

"There's animosity building up," he said. "And it doesn't have to be."

Adding to the vacuum is the disappearance of public dispatch records that provided details about a cluster of small fire starts that occurred around the same time and area of the Salt and South Fork ignition sites.

A Source NM review of Alamogordo Interagency Dispatch records for a story June 20 showed four additional confirmed fire starts discovered between June 16 and 18. All of the fires were between a tenth and a quarter of an acre in size. Those records no longer appear in the dispatch logs.

Those dispatch records were removed as part of ongoing investigations into the causes of those fires, Broyles said. Those investigations had not been previously announced.

Broyles said it is standard practice to remove those records from public view when an investigation commences.

The fires "are part of ongoing wildfire investigations," Broyles said. "Information was removed from website publication as part of the investigations."

The removal of those records, Crawford said, just adds to the haze of uncertainty.

"That's what the public

What to know about New Mexico's special session

The New Mexico Legislature is set to convene in Santa Fe this week for a special session called by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham to address criminal competency, among other issues.

Special sessions called by the governor can last up to 30 days, but typically run only a few days to about a week long.

The New Mexico Constitution requires that special sessions are strictly limited to address what the governor lays out in a proclamation. The proclamation isn't set for release until Thursday morning, July 18, before the session's noon start, according to members of the governor's office.

Unlike regular 60-day or 30-day sessions, bills will not be available ahead of time. Instead, the legislation will be made public on the website as they are being read into the record on Thursday.

Special sessions also throw a wrench during election season. Under state law, legislators cannot accept campaign contributions during the session.

The lead-up to the session has been strained.

Lawmakers from both parties have been skeptical that there's enough time and consensus to address the issues. Just last week, Lujan Grisham rejected the call by 41 advocacy groups to cancel the special session, even as one of the top priorities still has no sponsor.

But special sessions have often inflamed tensions at the Roundhouse, said former legislators and longtime observers.

"Special sessions are usually pretty controversial," said Steve Terrell, a now retired Roundhouse reporter for the Santa Fe New Mexican. "These are so-called citizen legislators and their lives are interrupted by these sessions."

The Senate has a history of adjourning early under previous governors, as recently as 2016 when addressing former Gov. Susana Martinez's budget requests and the death penalty.

"Officially sine die-ing before the governor wants you to is pretty unusual, but



it's happened," Terrell said. (The Latin phrase "sine die" refers to the adjournment of a legislative session.)

Terrell pointed to times during former Gov. Bill Richardson's tenure, where the chambers split at special sessions called in 2003 and 2008. The House – led by then-Speaker Ben Luján, D-Nambé – went to work in the special sessions, but the Senate only met to adjourn.

Leonard Lee Rawson, a Republican state senator representing Las Cruces from 1993 to 2008, said there was a shared mood that the issues could wait until the regular session.

"In 2007, the governor called a special session, and the Senate wasn't really interested in moving that direction," Rawson said. "It was universal – nobody, nobody in the Senate wanted it – didn't matter which party."

Even as the rules required the Senate to convene every three days, "it didn't mean the Senate had to do any work," he said.

Rawson said the built-in tensions between the House and Senate and the executive and legislative branches can worsen when special sessions are perceived to have poor planning.

"Has it really been enough time to bring together the legislature and the governor in terms of what the outcome

needs to be or close to the outcome? If not, we're just wasting people's time, and expenses," he said.

John Arthur Smith, a Democrat who represented Deming from 1989 to 2020,

said special sessions worked best when there was consensus ahead of time on the goals.

"Where there wasn't agreement, then it was chaos," he said, speaking of Richardson's special sessions.

He said his concerns about holding a special session in the middle of July raises concerns for costs during Santa Fe's tourism season. Special sessions cost tens of thousands of dollars, often ball-parked around \$50,000 every day.

Smith said without three-fifths agreement by the chambers to enact the laws right away, called an emergency clause, he said that the laws are then enacted 90 days after their passage.

"If you can't get the emergency clause on, you might as well have just waited if you're going to have it this late in the game," Smith said.

Dear editor,

“We need to save our democracy” is a rallying cry heard increasingly often in these times – from both sides of the political fence. The harsh reality though, is that our society doesn't seem to place much value in participating within that system.

In the June primaries, Doña Ana County only had a 15 percent turnout rate (New Mexico overall was about 23 percent). Voter turnout in prima-

ries is traditionally less than what it is in the general election – and those we get to choose from in November are determined by a thin slice of registered voters. Apathy limits our choices.

In the 2023 election for city council, only 18 percent of voters bothered to make a choice. The 82 percent who didn't show up are stuck with the results one out of five people chose. Go figure.

What is even more disturbing is that a growing number of elected officials have no competition



at all. None. Example: Out of 112 seats up for grabs in the New Mexico Legislature, 41 of them (25 D and 16 R) were decided before the primaries because there was no chal-

lenger – not within their party or from the other side. Choices for voters are limited further, due to a lack of competition.

When there is no competition, is it any wonder

why we get radicals from both sides of the political spectrum making rules that the rest of us have to live with? Elections aren't won by a majority of voters, they are won by the majority of those who chose to participate.

If we're going to save our democracy, we need to start participating. By participating, we can demand better candidates to choose between. If we don't, well, you see what we end up with.

Special sessions show flaws in system

A recent town hall meeting in Las Cruces hosted by the Foundation for Open Government focused on the need for greater transparency at the Legislature during the budget-making process.

There is, perhaps, no process at the Legislature that is more secretive and less transparent than the special session about to begin on Thursday, July 18. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham wants legislation passed dealing with panhandling, criminal defendants judged to be incompetent to stand trial and felons in possession of guns.

Ideally, from her stand-

point, all three issues will have been worked out in closed-door meetings, and legislators will rubber stamp their approval. But that's not how it usually works,

All three bills were introduced in this year's regular 30-day session. The panhandling bill never got a committee hearing. The competency bill was amended and passed through one committee, but died in the second. The felon-in-possession bill was also passed over in its first committee.

Clearly, none of those

bills were a top priority for the Legislature.

We won't know until they are introduced what changes, if any, have been made to make them more palatable this time around.

But we do know that the success rate for special sessions is mixed, at best. And for good reason.

The governor was able to use a special session to pass legislation legalizing cannabis, but that came after several years of hearings on the topic. This year she is attempting to pass a much more diverse set of new laws,

without nearly as much prior debate. And, she will have different supporters and opponents for each.

Republicans are likely to agree with her on the panhandling and competency laws, but will fight tooth and nail against any law to increase penalties for possession of a gun. We will soon see if the governor has been able to move reluctant Democrats who don't see law enforcement as the solution to a panhandling problem that stems from homelessness and poverty.

While there is likely general agreement on the competency issue, a

recent community radio interview with state Supreme Court Justice Brianna Zamora convinced me that the issue is more complicated than I had appreciated.

Legislators come into a special session with different priorities, based on their party affiliation and political beliefs. But there is one goal they all share: getting to sine die and going back home as soon as possible.

It's one more example of the many inadequacies built into our legislative structure. All of these issues could have been addressed in the regular

Priest miscalculates in removing 'Apache Christ'

The Catholic Church stumbled badly.

In the dark of night, Father Peter Chudy Sixtus Simeon-Aguinam and his accomplices removed beloved paintings from St. Joseph Apache Mission on the Mescalero Apache Reservation and spirited them away. When parish staff and volunteers opened the church on June 27, they were shocked to find the sanctuary stripped of the eight-foot "Apache Christ," by Franciscan Friar Robert Lentz, a famed iconographer.

Created in consultation with Apaches, the painting depicts Jesus as a Mescalero medicine man. It has hung behind the altar since 1990. The other painting, by the late Apache artist Gervase Peso, is of Apache spirit dancers.

On the mission's website, volunteer youth minister AnneMarie Brillante posted that those responsible were the pastor, members of the Knights of Columbus and the Catholic Diocese of Las Cruces. Brillante,

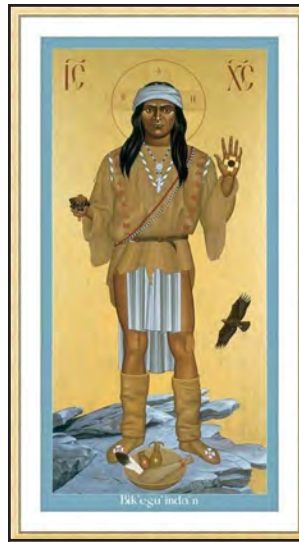
a Mescalero, is a lifelong member of the mission.

The diocese didn't offer a reason, and Father Chudy couldn't be reached for comment, reported OSV News, a wire service that covers Catholic issues. The priest also replaced the parish's sacred vessels – Pueblo pottery and Apache baskets – with brass.

"He did not like anything to do with our Native culture," said a parishioner.

Brillante posted a recording of her call to Deacon John Eric Munson, chief operating officer of the diocese, who told her the paintings were "not stolen, just removed." He said the pastor, the Knights of Columbus and the diocesan property risk manager acted on authority of Bishop Peter Baldacchino. Brillante argued they stole the icon because it belonged to parishioners, but Munson insisted it belonged to the church.

In a statement, Brother Lentz made it clear he gave the icon to the people. That the priest led men from Alamogordo in its removal "only adds to the shame," he said.



The Knights of Columbus said the organization had no official role in the caper and that members were acting on their own.

Father Chudy, who arrived here in December, had signaled his displeasure with the paintings and his Apache parishioners, telling them during a weekday Mass: "God comes first. You cannot be both an Apache and a Catholic. You have to choose. You cannot be both... You have to leave those ways and that way of life behind."

For Mescaleros it was like a time warp throwing them back through the ages, as the priest repeated what they'd been

paying jobs to attend the regular session each year. But they don't plan for a special session. That means an unexpected loss of revenue for as long as they are away.

The governor's impatience is understandable,

given that she only has two more regular sessions to go. We will soon find out if legislators share her sense of urgency.

told from the beginning of European contact. The words coming from a Black Nigerian, whose own people had been oppressed, were all the more disconcerting.

"He thought we were all pagans," said Mary Serna, director of the mission's years-long restoration. "He said it was a church and not a museum, but if you've traveled you know European churches are also museums."

On June 30 parishioners, many in traditional dress, came to church and signed a letter seeking the paintings' return, reported the Las Cruces

Bulletin. They placed play money in the collection plate in protest.

Days later, Deacon Munson came to Mescalero with a U-Haul containing the two paintings. Both were damaged, said Mary Serna; the icon's frame, created by New Mexico artist Roberto Lavadie, was in pieces.

Everyone involved in the removal will be held accountable, she said. They found the missing baskets and pottery in the priest's empty house; he departed without a word.

At this writing the diocese has still not issued a statement or responded

to media calls, including mine. Church leaders are trying to meet with Bishop Baldacchino, who has never visited St. Joseph despite several invitations.

This sorry episode "opened up old, old wounds," writes AnneMarie Brillante.

The Catholic Church has recently taken steps nationally to atone for years of mistreating Native Americans. It can add this epic cultural blunder to the list.

wants to know," he said. "We knew all this before, and then all that's just evaporated."

Speculation and rumors about the fires' causes started soon after the evacuations were announced, including unfounded arson rumors circulated by some elected officials and candidates.

Adding to the speculation were official incident reports approved by incident command that listed, for several days for each fire, the cause of the blazes as "human." The BIA later

told Source NM that the cause listed as "human" was an error resulting from a glitch that automatically converted text in that field entered as "undetermined" to "human."

The day after Source NM's story about the error, the records changed and listed the causes of both fires as "undetermined." Following the July 3 announcement, the South Fork Fire cause was listed as "natural" in subsequent reports.

Crawford said the Forest Service and other agencies have sent "mixed messages" that are fueling confusion and rumor-

mongering, including the single, brief announcement July 3 that deemed lightning as the cause of the South Fork Fire but also offered an FBI reward for information leading to an arrest on the Salt Fire.

The July 3 announcement said that a team of wildland fire investigators and law enforcement officers were involved in the investigation, including those the BIA, FBI, the U.S. Forest Service, the Bureau of Land Management, and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, along with state and tribal officials. The BIA is the lead agency.

Taylor-Mesilla site welcomes new conservator

New Mexico Historic Sites announced the arrival of Yasmine Jahangiri as the new museum technician and conservator of the Taylor-Mesilla and Fort Selden historic sites. Jahangiri is responsible for the collections at both sites, including recordkeeping and documentation for all of their items. She will also assist with interpretive programs and developing exhibitions, the agency stated in a news release.

The Taylor-Mesilla site, located in Old Mesilla, was home to J. Paul and Mary Daniels Taylor for six decades and is slated

to open a visitors center this fall, followed by a grand opening of the location in the fall of 2025.

“We are excited to have Yasmine with us to give excellent care to all the collections at our site as we prepare to open Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site. She is already working diligently to lay the groundwork for excellent collections care,” regional manager Wendi Laws stated in a news release.

Jahangiri hails from Farmington and is a graduate of New Mexico State University, where she completed bachelor’s degrees in theatre and museum conservation. The release said she worked

Departing Desert Exposure editor reflects on two decades of news

It's going to be hard, acknowledged long-time reporter, photographer and editor Elva Österreich, to simply move on from journalism after more than two decades in the craft.

But she decided now was time to move on to a new chapter, leaving the Bulletin and its monthly magazine, Desert Exposure, on July 5.

Across a dozen newspapers and the shifting sands of southern New Mexico, perhaps no one in the industry has been as much of a consistent presence as Österreich. She's had bylines in just about every newspaper from Ruidoso to Las Cruces to Socorro and beyond since she began writing news in 1998.

Österreich even wrote a book chronicling one of the pivotal moments in local (and world) history – the testing and denotation of the atomic bomb – called “Manhattan Project Trinity Test: Witnessing the Bomb in New Mexico.”

On her last day, Österreich sat down for an interview, this time on the other side of the recorder,

to reflect on her time in the news.

What drew you to arts and culture reporting?

“My degree is in creative writing. And so it's always something that I wanted to do. Then, I started writing for this little local newsletter in Alamogordo. I started doing a column before that called ‘About the Critters,’ which was about the animals, and that's how I ended up creating a feature on bugs.”

That bug feature, Österreich said, was one of her first plunges into journalism.

“When the job came open, it just sounded like it was my job because talking to people, assembling things, taking photos, that's what I do.”

What is your favorite story you've told?

“I cannot think of any particular story, but there is the timeline (of stories) around Spaceport (America) because this whole space thing started in the first place at an event held at Holloman Air Force Base. I was there when they did that.”

When asked why the history of the spaceport

was among her favorites, Österreich said, “Because I'm a science fiction nerd. ... The whole ‘new horizons, going into space, brand new world – it's all that.”

You have been around the news in southern New Mexico for more than two decades. What kept you in the business?

“It's just been wonderful and fascinating. And there's the whole feeling of the newsroom trying to get things done. It's all been an exploration.

to stop. I gotta keep doing that. So, it's part of the learning journey.

“And (journalism is) the best way to just keep exploring the world. Every time we turn around, there's a new something. I guess that's why Desert Exposure was so well suited; I got to go to all the communities and learn things about everything.

“There are definitely some things that you just do it again and again over the years. Stuff like elections, that you have to do as a journalist – that becomes old.”

The news industry contracted drastically during your career. How did that affect you?

“It's been interesting. It's, again, part of the journey, but I think it's also been sad for journalism. Things are getting more and more fragmented because of the in-

ternet and because people can put out whatever information they want to put out, whether it's real or not. And that erodes trust. It erodes confidence.

“When people go to look for information, they're more likely to go to information that they put out, which also creates more compartmentalization.”

What advice would you give newcomers to journalism?

“Always go out and learn things. Listen to everything. Don't be afraid to talk to us. To those of us who have been in the business, don't be afraid to walk into the building and say, ‘Hey, can I speak to the reporter.’ And don't be afraid to submit stuff.

“You don't have to be a graduate, or you can come in with a story idea. And somebody would likely say, go for it. Because we always need people to bring new information.”

refers to the project as a very happy and creative experience. “The quality of the material we were reading was really excellent – a great plot with great characters, so it was a lot of fun to work on.”

Q: I've seen ads for Reba McEntire's new show coming this fall. When was her first series originally on the air?

A: Soon to return in the sitcom "Happy's Place" on NBC, the country-music icon has had a place in series television for quite a while, and that started with the 2001 premiere of "Reba" on the then-WB Network. It lasted a total of six seasons (2001-07), the final one airing on The CW, which resulted from the merging of The WB and the former UPN network. Still seen weekdays in repeats on both Hallmark Channel and UPtv, the show also featured Melissa Peterman, who will reunite with McEntire as a co-star of "Happy's Place." qualities an artist's eye can capture.”

The monument encompasses over 496,000 acres of public land including the Robledo, Sierra de las Uvas, Organ, Potrillo and Doña Ana mountain ranges. “The area's unique geological, biological, and cultural resources provide the artist with endless possibilities for self-expression through their lens, painting, sculpture, poetry, music, etc.,” BLM stated, noting

the archaeological and cultural heritage of the area as well.

Artists are provided with housing for the residency and a \$1,000 stipend through the Friends organization. The artist is expected to produce a creative community project; a public event such as a tour, demonstration or workshop; and a completed project used in promoting the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument.

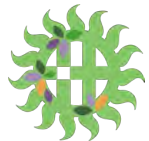

As history relates, Edward VI selected Jane, who was actually fifth in line for the crown, because she was a Protestant while Mary, Edward's half-sister, was Catholic; and the dying king wished for England to remain in the former camp. Support for Jane's claim swiftly dwindled,

however, in favor of the lawful line of succession, while Mary assembled a military force in support of her own claim. Mary I was crowned, ending Lady Jane's reign, which remains the shortest of any English monarch.

Things did not improve much for Lady Jane, who was held in the tower until, months later, she and her husband were beheaded for treason. And Mary Tudor did much as Edward had feared during her five-year reign, seeking a reversal of the Reformation and attempting to restore property that had been taken from the Church

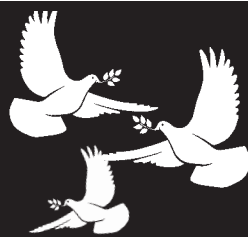

Kind Bread Company to close this month

Kind Bread Company, a four-year-old bakery off S. Solano Drive, recently announced it would close July 27.

Owner and baker Samantha Kindred delivered the news in a video posted to Instagram on July 5. In the video, Kindred said that medical issues will prevent her from being able to focus on the bakery.

“It’s not a decision I made lightly, but to make sure I heal and take care of myself, that’s what has

to happen,” Kindred said.

Kind Bread opened in 2020. It started when Kindred and co-founder Kaleigh Jones rented a kitchen in a local restaurant during off-hours.

Their enterprise survived the COVID-19 pandemic. Per reporting that year from the Las Cruces Bulletin, the business obtained its approvals to operate just two weeks before the public health crisis reached New Mexico and devastated retail food service among other industries.

The disease, which led

retail operation, the Bulletin reported, in addition to producing goods for sale at other eateries and markets.

The business focuses on naturally fermented sourdough bread and other baked goods, without using commercial yeast, and employs about 10 people, according to its website, KindBreadCo.com.

NMSU offers winemaking, marketing class

New Mexico State University's Departments of Agriculture Economics and Agricultural Business and Extension Plant Sciences are offering a beginners' course in winemaking suited for amateurs as well as small commercial operations.

Las Cruces GRT hike goes to voters

Voters already had a ballot packed with consequences this November.

Now, they have one more. During a meeting on July 15, the Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously to put a proposed gross receipts tax hike before voters this fall.

City officials proposed a ballot measure because they say the additional money will be spent to support a slew of public safety and quality-of-life projects. Opponents say Las Cruces businesses and residents remain hampered by the economic downturn following the pandemic and that this will only worsen their situation.

“This is not an easy conversation, and I think that all of us are looking to the voters to consider this,” City Councilor Becky Cor-

ran said.

The ballot measure is part of a two-part plan to provide the city with an estimated \$20 million in recurring revenue. Combined with its 2024-25 budget changes, the city says this effort will lead to better-trained police officers, lower crime rates, more recreational opportunities and support the city’s redevelopment effort. The increase in revenue would also cover the increase in costs the city has sustained post-pandemic.

The specific use of the money is up to the city — something that some commenters lamented. Dolores Lucero, a former city councilor, told the council they should have split up the vote to better inform the public what they wanted to do with the money.

“This is very vague,” Lucero said, referring to the question that voters

will read.

The language, written by city staff, reads:

“Shall the City of Las Cruces impose a municipal gross receipts tax in the amount of three hundred twenty-thousands of one percent (0.3250%), the revenues of which shall be used for funding capital improvements and main-

tenance for public safety, streets, parks, and other public facilities and critical infrastructure?”

Others, including Councilor Bill Mattiace, said the money should be exclusively for police efforts. Mattiace also suggested that the package include a sunset period – meaning the tax would revert to the

old rate after a specific date.

“It’s confusing to me, and it’s confusing to some of my colleagues on how it’s worded. I just wish that it was more simply done,” Mattiace said.

Part of the confusion expressed by the council and some in the public comes from the fact that voters can only approve about half of the proposed increase.

State law allows the city to raise GRT without an election, but only by about \$9 million. Voters can approve another \$11 million via an election. If the voters pass the \$11 million increase, the council has signaled it would pass the \$9 million increase—although that remains an unknowable outcome until after November.

Some members of the public, including representatives from the area’s film industry, spoke in

favor of the tax hike.

Jonathon Sepp, public affairs official for a local film studio, said he supported the increase because he believes it will improve the city.

“This GRT increase will negatively affect me, selfishly, as a resident and business operator,” Sepp said. “But I think it’s a small sacrifice for a healthier and safer community.”

However, perhaps no one favored the increase more than Mayor Eric Enriquez, who gave a brief speech on his view of the package.

“It all comes down to trust, safety, and being better,” he said. “We all want a better Las Cruces.”

Next, the question will be submitted to the Doña Ana County Clerk’s office, which will review it to ensure it doesn’t violate the law.

Then, voters will decide.

Be a good partner: Tips for member-guest events

Member-guest and member-member events are special and memorable tournaments with fine competition, great fun and good times. If you have never played in these types of events, there is some information and conduct you should be aware of.

round that can run into substantial money. Other money opportunities or "games" may take the form of skins, greenies, raffles and individual bets. Bring your wallet and have plenty of cash handy, if for no other reason than being able to pick up a few beverage tabs and generous tips.

There are a few aspects of social etiquette which come into play in most of these partner and member-guest outings. First of all, find out what the preferred and recommended attire is and by all means dress nice, during golf and after golf. Secondly, shut your cell phone off.
