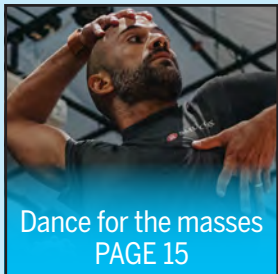

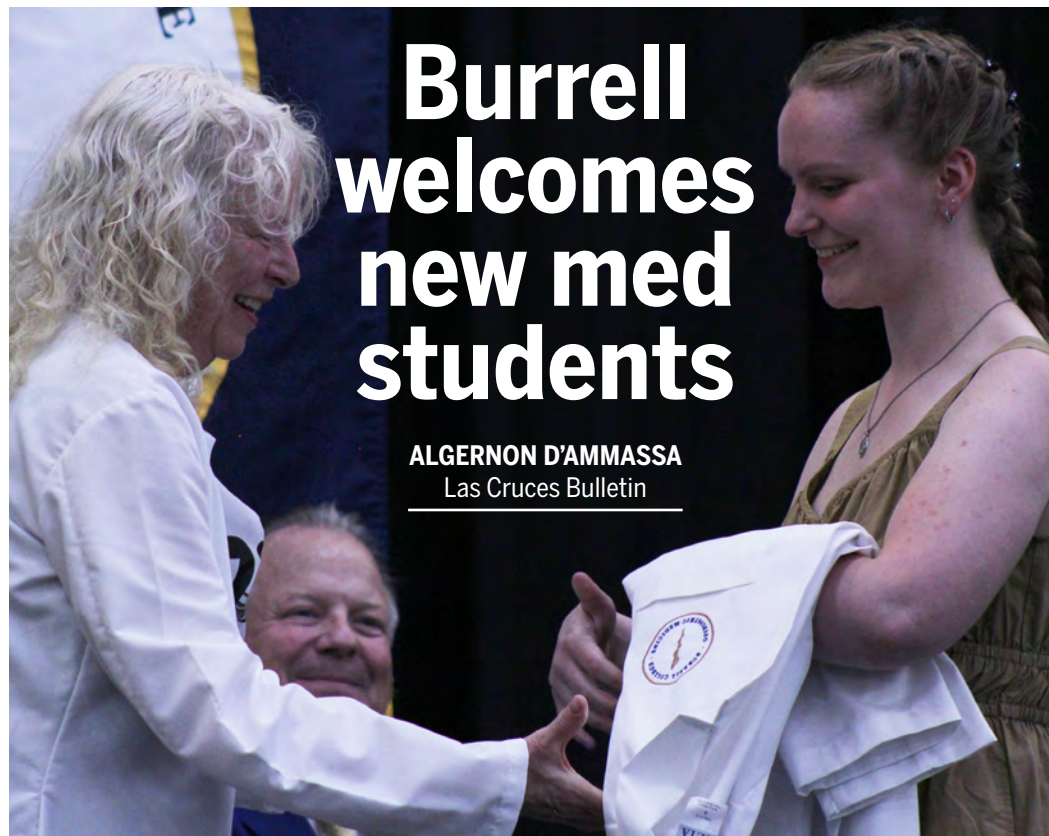

Burrell welcomes new med students

The bleachers in the gymnasium at Centennial High School were packed and the shouts and cheers, at times, were as loud as any you would hear at a rivalry game. But the jubilant ruckus on this night was not over basketball. The court was full of folding chairs and a stage where over 200 young

people formally began med school last week.

The Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine welcomed 207 first-year students on July 19 for its ninth white coat ceremony welcoming an incoming class at the start of students' medical careers. The school was founded in 2013 and welcomed its first class of students

in 2016, who graduated in 2020. The school has a campus in Las Cruces adjacent to New Mexico State University, as well as a location in Melbourne, Fla.

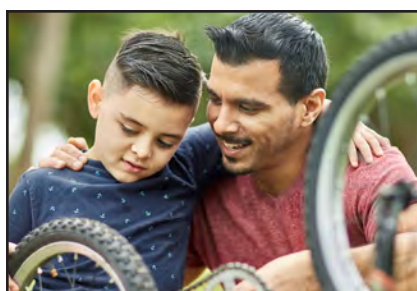
"We are deeply committed to addressing the pressing need for medical professionals in underserved and rural communities," Burrell's cofounder and CEO, John Hummer, said during the ceremony. "Our students are not only embarking on a journey of personal development; they are also filling a crucial medical void bringing quality health care to the areas that need it the most."

The speeches were brief, and most of the ceremony was devoted to inviting each new student to walk across the platform and receive a personally embroidered white physician's coat as loved ones, many visiting Las Cruces for the first time, celebrated with applause, cheers and shouts.

The college's dean and executive vice president of academic services, Dr. Bill Pieratt, said, "The white coat is more than just an accessory or a piece of clothing. It's a symbol that represents the purity of purpose and a commitment to compassionate care and the high standards of the osteopathic medical profession."

The ceremony also included a recitation of the osteopathic oath, consisting of professional vows that underscore patient confidentiality, medical ethics and community service. The oath also disavows euthanasia: "I will give no drugs for deadly purposes to any person, though it be asked of me."

Enraged governor blisters Legislature for five-hour special session

One can measure Thursday's one-day special legislative session by the numbers.

Five: The number of hours it took the Legislature to gavel into session, pass a bill and adjourn.

One hundred and three million: The dollars the Legislature appropriated to take care of fire-scarred, flood-vulnerable areas around New Mexico, fund outpatient treatment and competency diversion pilot programs and to pay for Thursday's one-day session.

95-7: The number of state lawmakers in the House (57-7) and Senate (38-0) who supported the \$103 million piece of legislation versus those who opposed it.

One scorcher of a statement from Democratic Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham.

An hour and a half after state lawmakers adjourned Thursday without considering any of the public safety legislation she had spent months demanding they take up, Lujan Grisham blistered her fellow Democrats with a one-page denunciation.

The Democratically controlled Legislature "should be embarrassed at their inability to summon even an ounce of courage to adopt common-sense legislation to make New Mexicans safer," her statement read. "This was one of the most disappointing days of my

career, and the public should be outraged."

In a switch, Lujan Grisham, a second-term Democrat who early in her tenure worked closely with the Legislature's Democratic majorities, praised Republican lawmakers, a majority of whom, she said, "would have passed many or all of these bills."

It was a gift to GOP lawmakers who are likely to frame their Democratic colleagues as soft on crime in the months leading up to November's general election.

House Republican Rep. Rod Montoya of Farmington, in fact, appeared already to be trying out campaign-worthy lines Thursday afternoon. Any New Mexicans concerned about crime and public safety should consider voting Republican in the November election, he quipped to news reporters.

Democratic leaders of the House and Senate were more conciliatory than the chief executive in their remarks after Thursday's session ended.

Asked if Thursday's five-hour session had further eroded the Democratic legislative leaders' relationship with the governor who is in office through 2026, Sen. President Pro Tem Mimi Stewart, D-Albuquerque, started with "That's a big question ...," then recalibrated. "I'll just say I'm a little worried about it. But you know we appreciate her bringing forward

these ideas and her sense of urgency."

Sen. Majority Leader Peter Wirth, D-Santa Fe, chose a diplomatic tone.

"There is no question we were in a spot here," he said. "We certainly look forward to working with Governor Michelle

Lujan Grisham. We have done some terrific work together. And I hope we can continue to do that work."

House Speaker Javier Martínez, D-Albuquerque, was measured, too.

"Nothing is personal in politics," Martínez said, adding that the Legislature had spent hundreds of millions of dollars on ensuring public safety in previous years. "I mean, this is how it works. We are equal branches of the government."

Martínez, Stewart, Wirth and other Democratic state lawmakers had repeatedly said in the runup to Thursday that they believed a special session was not the correct forum to pass Lujan

Grisham's priorities. It didn't help matters that Lujan Grisham and legislative leaders hadn't reached a deal. Special sessions, which are short and focused, usually work only when such agreements are in place beforehand.

The governor set out an ambitious agenda for state lawmakers going into Thursday: Change the state's criminal competency laws, restrict panhandling to certain areas near roadways and increase penalties for violent felons in possession of a firearm. She also wanted lawmakers to increase the penalty for crimes involving the pos-

Governor hosts Las Cruces town hall Thursday

This article went to press on July 24. Check out the Bulletin's website on Friday for coverage of the town hall.

It's a confusing time to be an elected Democrat in New Mexico.

A stunted special session last week highlighted a divide between the governor and her fellow party members in the legisla-

ture. Democrats quashed several public safety proposals lauded by New Mexico Republicans and spurned by civil rights organizations.

On Thursday, the intra-party quarrel comes to Las Cruces. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham will convene a town hall and listening session at the Las Cruces Convention Center at 5:30 p.m.

"Ensuring the safety and security of every New Mexican remains

my top priority," Lujan Grisham said in a news release. "The town hall in Las Cruces this Thursday is an opportunity to hear directly from New Mexicans grappling with the state's crime problem and collaborate as a community on effective strategies to enhance public safety statewide."

But as the governor clamors for New Mexicans to voice their frustration about crime, local legislators again express

frustration at the governor.

"I'm confused as to why she is doing this," state Rep. Angelica Rubio, D-Las Cruces, said in an interview, arguing the governor has abandoned the Democratic Party's values and treated her party colleagues as obstacles.

"What's been happening the last couple of years is that, rather than seeing the legislature as a partner, it's been the complete opposite," Rubio said.

"I think, at this point, it's no longer about her wanting to address public safety," Rubio said. "I think it's personal now. It's her trying to win. And in the meantime, our communities are the ones being impacted."

Lujan Grisham called a special session that started and ended on July

18, lasting just five hours.

The governor sought bills that would have made it easier for judges to jail people accused of crimes in cases where competency is in question; banned panhandling in street medians – something the Las Cruces City Council will consider on Aug. 5; obligating police departments to provide better crime statistics; toughen racketeering laws; and increase penalties for selling fentanyl.

"These proposals have changed month to month, week to week, hour to hour," state Sen. Joe Cervantes, D-Las Cruces, said during the session in Santa Fe. "In the last 24 hours, we're seeing new proposals that were never presented, never contemplated for this special session."

Lawmakers approved

relief packages for people affected by the Salt and South Fork Fires and funds for outpatient treatment programs and competency diversion pilot programs in local courts, and then adjourned.

Lujan Grisham rebuked lawmakers, arguing that "a majority of Republicans would have passed many or all of these bills, and continuing: "The legislature should be embarrassed at their inability to summon even an ounce of courage to adopt common-sense legislation to make New Mexicans safer. For those of you who go home to the sound of gunshots, who see hypodermic needles in your parks, and the families desperate to get a loved one living on the street the help they deserve, I'm sorry that most

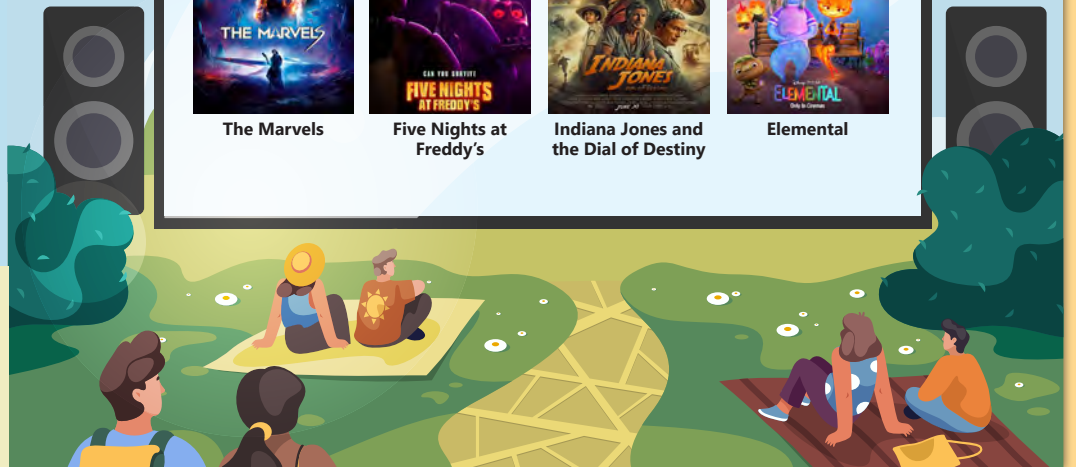

City unveils dashboard showing self-reported progress on goals

The city of Las Cruces showcased a dashboard during a work session Monday meant to provide the public with updates around several policy areas and strategic goals.

The Strategic Plan Public Dashboard gathers self-reported information from city staff and is meant to provide more transparency about projects and initiatives launched by the city. In a news release, the city touted the dashboard as having “nearly 500 related actions from the City’s overarching policy document, Elevate Las Cruces Comprehensive Plan.”

“Part of the frustration in planning for years, for people who come to our meetings, who provide input, is that they don’t necessarily see – and we don’t necessarily as staff see – the

implementation happening quickly and effectively,” said Srijana Basnyat, the city’s innovation and strategy manager. “Something gets lost in translation.”

The dashboard contains categories such as community prosperity, education and community services, environmental sustainability, capital improvement and infrastructure and public safety.

According to Senior Urban Planner Mark Miller, the dashboard can be expanded to include more detailed information about specific projects.

“This allows us to get into the nitty-gritty details of specific projects. And then we can really see how one action contributes to an entire goal,” Miller said. “I think making that connection and seeing that in real time is really valuable.”

The dashboard, which a Ca-

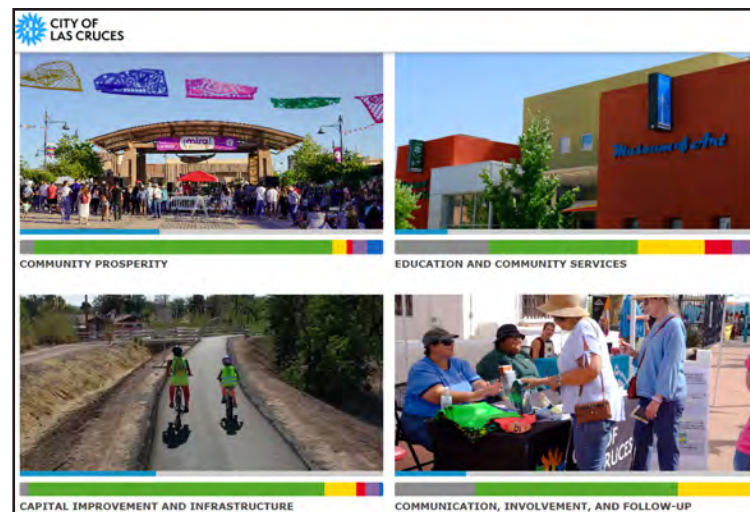

nadian firm called Envisio Solutions produces, was announced in a news release on July 22. Miller and Basnyat presented it to the council the same day.

City Councilor Bill Mattiace called the program great and asked Miller if the city would be interested in putting it in front of high school students.



“I think this would be an exciting feature to go through all the schools. My grandson would just love to go through this,” Mattiace said.

Miller said the city had not considered it, but would.

City Councilor Becky Corran asked if the city could implement budgetary information

related to each policy area. She said that would help the council and public move projects forward.

“I know that’s a lot of information, and we don’t have that information in lots of cases, but if it could be a part of it, it could be really helpful,” Corran said.

Alexis Boundas said she envisioned being a doctor from early childhood in the Chicago area, watching her younger sibling receiving ongoing care for a neurological disorder.

Following the ceremony, as the students made their way toward a group photo as the class of 2028, Hummer remained on the floor, chatting with students but even more so with visiting parents and family members.

“What you sense is just

a lot of love and pride, of accomplishment,” he said. “We have a fair number of first-generation college graduates. You can just imagine, not only being a first-generation college graduate, but going into medical school – just tremendous pride.”

Arts Council director steps down

The Doña Ana Arts Council announced the departure of executive director Araceli Solis Wednesday in a news release inviting applications for an interim leader.

Solis “will be transitioning from our organization to pursue personal professional endeavors,” the nonprofit stated in a news release. A former art teacher at Sierra Middle School and 20-year educator, Solis had held the position since February 2023, when she succeeded Greg Smith as executive director.

Solis did not elaborate on her plans in her own statement, which focused on her 17 months at DAAC. During that time the center became the first participant of the National Hispanic Cultural Center’s cultural ambassador program and adopted an “Arts for All” approach aiming to make the community “the arts hub of southern New Mexico.”

of our elected officials didn’t even try.”

Other local legislators who agreed to interviews with the Bulletin faulted the governor for poor communications with legislators, prioritizing media coverage over sound policy and elevating herself over the party and communities affected by swollen crime rates.

“As the legislature, we showed up all summer ready to be in that space and doing right by our voters and constituents,” said Micaela Lara Cadena, D-Mesilla, “and then here we are.”

Lara Cadena, who sits on the Courts, Corrections, and Justice Committee, said she felt the governor chose to air her interests and desires via news conferences and press releases.

According to Lara Cadena, many legisla-

tors first learned of the special session through a televised interview with the governor. They then learned what would be germane for consideration through a news release.

“I mean, here we are in Santa Fe trying to be professionals, trying to be political actors ready to engage in respectful policy conversations,” Lara Cadena said. “And instead, we had a week of dueling press conferences.”

A report presented by policy researchers at the legislature suggested that crime rates in New Mexico are largely driven by Bernalillo County. Las Cruces is a fifth the size of Albuquerque. It is also a border community adjoined to a different metropolitan area. Reported crime statistics reflect these differences.

In July, Las Cruces set a 40-year record for most homicides in a single year. Eleven people, in-

cluding a police officer, have been killed in Las Cruces. Typically, the city sees around seven or eight homicides a year.

Aggravated assaults – a large category encompassing events like fights and non-fatal stabbings or shootings – have also risen dramatically in recent years. In 2014, Las Cruces police reported 173 aggravated assaults; so far this year, LCPD has reported 442. Other violent crime reports have remained steady over the last decade, including robbery and sexual assault. Overall, violent crime rates grew consistently, starting in 2018, until falling in 2023.

But in Las Cruces, rates of property crime have largely driven public outcry from conservative activists and small business owners. Groups like Coalition of Conservatives in Action and Businesses for a Safer Las Cruces point out that property crime

Bicyclist injured in collision

A suspected hit-and-run crash injured a bicyclist on Tuesday morning, Las Cruces police said.

In a news release, the Las Cruces Police Department said police and fire personnel responded shortly before

5 a.m. on July 23 to the TA Travel Center near intersection of Amador Avenue and Motel Boulevard, where passers-by had found a 59-year-old man lying unconscious in the road with a bicycle nearby.

The man, who was not identified, suffered head trauma and, after being

seen at a local hospital, was taken to University Medical Center in El Paso where he was listed in critical condition.

Investigators were seeking further details about the circumstances leading to the injuries. Anyone with information is asked to contact police at 575-526-0795.

has also risen. Property crime reports have nearly doubled since 2017 (when reported property crime reached a ten-year low). Data shows that burglaries, larceny, and motor vehicle theft are the primary drivers of this trend.

For Lara Cadena and

Rubio – neither of whom face Republican opponents in the November general election – the governor’s appearance in Las Cruces is another example of prioritizing screen time over policy production.

“I definitely think Thursday night is going

to be performative for her,” Rubio said. “It’s going to be an opportunity for her to take up space.”

The Bulletin also contacted elected officials in competitive races this November. They did not respond to interview requests.

Court: Insurer off the hook for advance wildfire relief

Part of an emergency order from the state's insurance superintendent, aiming to help homeowners recover from South Fork and Salt Fires in Lincoln County, received pushback in Santa Fe District Court Tuesday.

At issue was a provision in the order requiring insurance companies with property insurance policies covering additional living expenses to make advance payments of \$5,000 to policyholders affected by the June wildfires.



After a hearing on Monday, First District Judge Matthew Wilson ruled State Farm and Casualty Co. did not have to comply with the emergency order.

The New Mexico Office of the Superintendent of Insurance had sought a court order earlier this month requiring the insurance company to pay

after receiving a reported 64 complaints that State Farm was not fulfilling the advance payments.

Superintendent Alice Kane issued a statement disagreeing with the ruling but did not specify

whether the office would appeal the ruling, stating that "OSI is reviewing its legal options and will continue to advocate on behalf of the evacuees of the South Fork and Salt Fires."

"The circumstances on the ground in Ruidoso were and continue to be dire," Kane said in her statement. "The New Mexico State Legislature delegated emergency powers to OSI to protect policyholders so that this Office could be respon-

sible to natural disasters. When an insurance policy covers Additional Living Expenses (ALEs), evacuees who had paid insurance premiums for decades needed help accessing basic necessities like a place to stay and meals, which ALEs cover. Evacuees didn't need funds to cover these kinds of expenses weeks or months later – they needed them immediately, when forced to evacuate and leave behind nearly all their belongings to escape to safety."

Her statement also noted that "the vast majority of companies" complied with the emergency order in full.

session or trafficking of fentanyl.

The House and the Senate didn't consider any of that, although Republican House Rep. John Block of Alamogordo did try to amend the \$103 million bill with \$10 million for security at the New Mexico border with Mexico. But it was shot down by the House Democratic majority.

It was unclear Thursday evening what Lujan Grisham plans to do: Sign the bill that passed or use her line-item veto authority to eliminate portions of it. Governors can employ their veto pen on sections of bills that appropriate money, which the \$103 million legisla-

tion does. Wirth implored her not to do that.

"That would help rebuild the collaborative relationship that needs to happen between the three branches," Wirth said.

Another option is for Lujan Grisham to call the Legislature back into session to take up the public safety measures.

The governor's office would not say Thursday evening what she plans to do.

Here is a quick breakdown of what is in House Bill 1, which the Legislature passed Thursday.

- \$10 million to the Mesalero Tribe to address damages caused by the South Fork and Salt fires.
- \$10 million for wildfire mitigation; watershed restoration, slope stabilization, erosion control around the state.

- \$10 million for individuals and businesses applying for or in the claims process to receive public assistance funding from the federal emergency management agency for damages caused by flooding or a fire.

- \$70 million to the State Board of Finance to provide zero-interest reimbursable loans to political subdivisions that have been approved for federal assistance to replace or repair public infrastructure damaged by the Salt and South Fork fires, including damages from flooding.

- \$3 million to the Administrative Office of the Courts to fund assisted outpatient treatment programs and competency diversion pilot programs

- \$211,900 to pay for the special session.

NMSU approves development deal for \$15M soundstage

New Mexico State University regents unanimously approved a 12-year agreement to develop a soundstage for film and TV production at the Arrowhead Center, the university's business and technology arm.

The regents met at DACC's East Mesa campus on June 28.

The \$15 million complex is funded by the New Mexico Economic Development Department and would be leased by the university to production companies. The planned facilities include a 20,800 square foot soundstage, a 10,400 square foot

production building, and an additional equipment storage building.

Soundstages are large buildings designed for shooting footage with live audio and built to accommodate scenery or green screen technology as well as needed space for equipment and crew members to operate.

The project represents another investment in movie and TV production for the Las Cruces area, independent of the facilities planned for construction by California-based company 828 Productions.

"We know there's a lot of film stuff going up in northern New Mexico, in Santa Fe and the sur-



rounding areas, and so it's an opportunity to get that same industry down in the southern part of the state," Regent Deborah Romero

said during the meeting.

The plans at Arrowhead include the state Higher Education Department in a workforce development

project with paid internships for NMSU and Doña Ana Community College students working on film and television productions,

as a way to nourish careers locally and draw more production to the region.

A presentation for the regents stated that Arrowhead anticipates up to \$500,000 in annual revenue from leasing the facilities on top of building a media arts collaborative that affords educational oppor-

New Mexico's federal delegation endorses Harris

All five federal delegates of New Mexico, combined with several state officials, endorsed Vice President Kamala Harris in the hours after President Joe Biden announced his withdrawal from the U.S. presidential contest.

Biden announced Sunday he would not run for a second term as president, a few weeks before he had planned to accept the Democratic Party nomination at the party's convention in Chicago. The announcement came after weeks of debate within the party over Biden's prospects for defeating Republican candidate, and former president, Donald Trump, following a weak debate performance and concerns about fundraising and his position in opinion polls. Biden, who at 81 is the oldest person

to serve as president, has endorsed Harris, 59, as the nominee.

U.S. Rep. Gabe Vasquez of New Mexico's 2nd Congressional District, who is running for a second term in November, joined northern New Mexico Representatives Melanie Stansbury and Teresa Leger Fernández in endorsing Harris, as did Senators Ben Ray Luján and Martin Heinrich (who is also seeking reelection in November). The delegation is comprised entirely of Democrats.

"President Biden gave a lifetime of distinguished service to the country we love. I commend the President for the decades of serving working Americans and service people, not CEOs and corporations. I commend his decision to step out of the race and put his country first," Vasquez said in a statement.

The New Mexico endorsements follow a larger trend of most, but not all, elected Democrats supporting Harris ahead of the Democratic National Convention on Aug. 22, when the party will officially nominate a candidate to challenge Trump, who is seeking a return to office after serving from 2017 to 2021.

Vasquez's statement took a shot at Trump and his allies, referring to them as "MAGA extremists" under Trump's signature slogan, "Make American great again." His targets included his own Republican opponent, Yvette Herrell, who previously represented southern New Mexico and his running in a rematch

election against Vasquez. The congressman then returned to Harris as an alternative to Trump, writing, "Vice President Kamala Harris is the leader who can bridge the divide in our county and move our nation forward."

Herrell, for her part, called for Biden to resign from office altogether, echoing a sentiment voiced by congressional Republicans. "If Joe Biden is unfit to run for president, he is most certainly not fit to BE president," she wrote on X.

Vasquez and Heinrich were the only federal elected officials in New Mexico to call on Biden to step down before Sunday's announcement.

"History will remember President Joe Biden as one of the most effective, accomplished, and successful leaders America ever had. With his decision today to put country

over self, the President had secured his legacy. I commend him for his selflessness, honor, and integrity," Heinrich said.

Biden had resisted calls from Heinrich, Vasquez, and others to step down as late as July 19, three days before reversing course.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham was, per reporting from the New York Times, among the Democratic governors communicating concerns about the 2024 election outcomes for their own states in a conference call with Biden three weeks ago.

Lujan Grisham has not commented about her participation in that call, but released a statement Sunday praising his leadership and saying his decision to withdraw was "in the best interest of the Democratic Party and the nation."

tunity and professional experience. Arrowhead also cited local economic boosts when productions visit the region.

The presentation also reported that New Mexico is turning away production opportunities because its existing facilities are in high demand.

Arrowhead projected that the basic costs of owning and operating the soundstage would be recovered at 30 percent

lease occupancy, and that excess revenues would be allocated to an operations reserve fund, another reserve fund for maintenance and upgrades and to student support initiatives. Annual maintenance was projected to cost \$40,000.

The 12 years include three years for development and 10 for operations, after which the university would be free to convert the facility for other purposes if it wished, per terms with the EDD, which provides the funding for the development.

Don't blame ag for water loss

Dear editor,

"The hard decisions are going to have to come where the water is being used, and that's in agriculture," wrote columnist Walt Rubel ("Overdue plan for state's water future," July 5). That could be a

true statement. Consider this: Water loss to evaporation from Caballo and Elephant Butte dams can be reduced with the use of solar panels. The same can be done on some acequias. There are miles of these canals.

The Rio Grande in Doña Ana County can

have temporary dirt dams made from its dirt, clay, sand and gravel. These dams will slow any water traveling south in the winter. The water held back by the dams can start percolating into our aquifers. The dams will have to be remade every time the water is

shut off for the winter. The drainage ditches can be set up to collect water when it rains. I have witnessed the dry drainage canals during heavy rainfall. These canals can be set up to hold the rainwater so that the water can feed the aquifers. The trees

that use flood irrigation shed shadows that slow evaporation while allowing water to seep to the aquifers.

Agriculture should not be singled out as the primary cause of water loss.

Telshor Fund has come at a high cost

The Telshor Fund was created by the city in 2004 to bank its share of the revenue from the 40-year lease on Memorial Medical Center to Lifepoint Health, a corporation with 62 hospitals in 16 states.

Net proceeds to the city were \$26.1 million, with another \$4.2 million in additional escrow funds for a total of \$30.3 million, according to the city's website.

It's been used since then for many worthy programs including \$1.5 million a year for The Boys and Girls Club; funding for La Piñon's Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner program and a new building to expand child abuse treatment services; support for both El Crucero and My Friends Place; expansion of Casa de Peregrinos food distribution ser-

vices, along with \$1.2 million for the Roadrunner Food Bank's Childhood Hunger Initiative; and creation of a new veterans' treatment court in the Third Judicial District.

Given that the hospital was deeply in debt at the time of the transfer, things have worked out pretty well for both the city and county governments, who split the proceeds. The same cannot be said for residents in need of health care.

Recent reporting by NBC News found that MMC routinely denies care or demands up-front payments from indigent or low-income patients. That has been especially devastating to cancer patients, who have no other options in Las Cruces.

The NBC story focused on Barbara Quarrell, who had worked for years as a nurse at MMC. When she was diagnosed with cancer, Quarrell was told by MMC that the True Health

New Mexico insurance plan she had paid \$800 a month for was insufficient, and she was denied treatment. She and her husband have moved to Albuquerque to get the care she needs.

If the allegations from both patients and doctors are true, MMC is in violation of both its lease and state law. The New Mexico Public Assistance Act requires qualifying hospitals to "accept every indigent patient who seeks health care services."

That's where state

Attorney General Raúl Torrez enters the picture. At a press conference announcing an investigation into MMC, the AG alleged it had improperly denied care; engaged in questionable billing practices; and created a culture of fear and intimidation to silence critics.

Torrez said they will also be looking into whether MMC has violated the Patients Debt Collection Protection Act, which requires hospitals to screen patients for financial assistance. MMC faces potential fines, and Torrez said whatever evidence his office collects will be turned over to federal authorities.

While the AG can't force Lifepoint out, the city and the county can. The probe is likely to produce clear and convincing evidence that the company is in violation

of its lease.

That would, of course, bring the inevitable question of what comes next. Ours isn't the only rural hospital to have fallen into the clutches of a private equity firm. Since 1981, 1,219 community hospitals made the switch to for-profit, according to the American Hospital Association.

There aren't a lot of great options. Health care has never fit well with our free-market economy, which is why Republicans in Congress tied themselves in knots trying to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act. They could never agree on the "replace" part.

But surely we can improve on what we have now.

Energy transition weighs on rural school district

A school district in San Juan County – small in student population, huge in land area – says it is in a precarious financial position as the Public Service Company of New Mexico transitions from coal-fired power to renewable energy.

Lawmakers and officials with the Central Consolidated School District are calling on the state’s biggest utility to live up to the promises of a “just transition” promised in the Energy Transition Act of 2018. The legislation promised replacement power generation to be developed within boundaries of the school district as PNM moved away from coal, long a key economic driver in the area.

The school district, consisting of 15 schools, a technical center and several preschools spread over nearly 3,000 square miles in northwest New Mexico, have complained about funding shortfalls following the closure of San Juan Generating Station, and worry about a future closure of the nearby Four Corners Power Plant. Both have been critical contributors to the school district’s tax base.

The district serves about 5,000 students; more than 90 percent are Native American.

Steve Carlson, the school district’s superin-

tendent, recently painted a bleak picture of his district’s financial outlook in a sworn statement submitted to the Public Regulation Commission.

“As we strive to rectify disadvantages and to give our students the opportunities that the students of other districts enjoy, we see ourselves facing an uphill battle because we end up using all of our scant resources, including our minimal and dwindling tax revenues and a few years’ worth of long overdue impact aid, just to level the playing field,” Carlson wrote.

The school district’s tax base is inadequate for its size and needs, he wrote, and administrators are forced to spend state funding to maintain “deteriorating facilities.”

About 80 percent of the district’s property tax revenue was generated by a combination of San Juan Generating Station, Four Corners Power Plant and related coal mines, according to his statement, and the district has seen a 700 percent increase in student homelessness rates since the San Juan plant shut down in 2022.

State Rep. Rod Montoya, R-Farmington, said Central Consolidated’s revenue has relied on the coal plants for decades, including for bonding capacity.

“With one of the power plants and one of the coal mines gone, their taxable income is almost nothing,” Montoya said. “No

other school district in the state has that problem.”

Montoya is part of a group of state lawmakers attempting overturn a recent decision by the state’s Public Regulation Commission, which they believe allows PNM to skirt a requirement in the 2019 Energy Transition Act to locate replacement power projects within the area served by the school district. The decision, they contend, allows the utility’s projects to be built elsewhere.

Earlier this month, 15 legislators asked the state Supreme Court to order the commission to enforce provisions of the legislation.

A spokesman for the

state agency declined to comment on the challenge to the commission’s decision.

In an email, PNM spokeswoman Kelly-Renae Huber wrote PNM “remains fully supportive and compliant with the Energy Transition Act.”

“The third-party projects selected through the [Public Regulation Commission] process for San Juan replacement power contained projects located within the [Central Consolidated School District] as well as elsewhere; one of the projects slated for the area subsequently defaulted and the contract was terminated,” Huber wrote. “We filed notice of this event with the

200 megawatts of solar and 100 megawatts of battery storage in San Juan County, both of which are scheduled to come online in August, according to information provided by Huber.

Some legislators who signed on to the Supreme Court challenge – such as Joanne Ferrary, D-Las Cruces – supported the 2019 legislation. But Ferrary said concerns about the company’s actions since the Energy Transition Act was passed prompted her to act.

“We had no choice but to file for the writ of mandamus, since the PRC has failed to hold PNM accountable,” Ferrary said in a recent interview.

Huber wrote the utility has committed to include “a CCSD-located [Central Consolidated School District] project in our upcoming resource filing later this year, even if it doesn’t meet the criteria for a lowest-cost portfolio.”

Attorneys for San Juan County government echoed the district’s concerns, arguing before the commission the utility holds a significant presence in San Juan County.

“PNM’s replacement resources for the [San Juan Generating Station] impact the employment of thousands of San Juan County residents and the County’s local economy,” the county’s officials wrote in a request to commissioners to challenge PNM’s plan.

PRC in January 2023 and discussed it in our ongoing biweekly stakeholder meetings.”

In late May, the commission approved the utility’s coming power resources, which included solar and battery projects in Bernalillo and Valencia counties, but none in San Juan County, where the 130-megawatt Rockmont solar and storage project was scheduled to be developed.

The utility agreed to develop 430 megawatts of power capacity within school district boundaries to replace the San Juan Generating Station, during negotiations for the Energy Transition Act. So far PNM has developed



Q: It was nice to see Jonathan Groff win a Tony Award recently. Can you remind me of the character he played on "Glee"?

A: He was in the Fox series from the start when it began in 2009, and he already was a Broadway veteran by that time, having gotten particular notice for "Spring Awakening" ... which also brought him a Tony nomination, and which teamed him with Lea Michele, with whom he would work again in "Glee."

His character in that show, Jesse St. James, was a principal performer in the singing group Vocal Adrenaline — rivals of New Directions, the group that included Rachel Berry (played by Michele). Jesse was dispatched to woo the hugely talented Rachel, the aim being to throw her off her game when it came to competition between the groups. However, things changed when he truly fell for her, and when he learned the secret that the coach of Vocal Adrenaline (played by Idina Menzel) was Rachel's biological mother.

Though Groff had a reasonably sizable presence during the first season of "Glee," he became a recurring player as the show went along, appearing only occasionally. His return in the series finale seems even more prophetic now where Groff is concerned, since Jesse and Rachel went to the Tony Awards as a married couple, with Jesse already being a Tony winner who was directing a Broadway production that Rachel was in.

Just before "Glee" ended, Groff returned to the New York stage by playing King George III in "Hamilton: An American Musical," and he followed that Off-Broadway job with two stints in the role during the show's Broadway run. He earned another Tony nomination for his performance, and he finally got the award last month for a revival of the Stephen Sondheim-composed "Merrily We Roll Along."

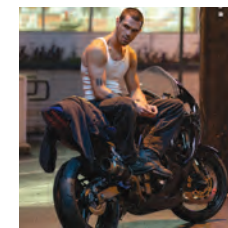

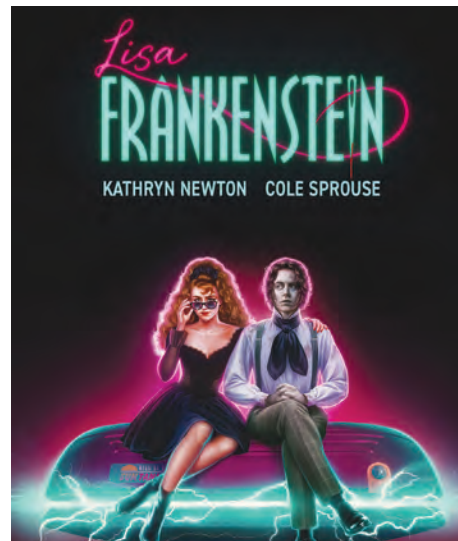

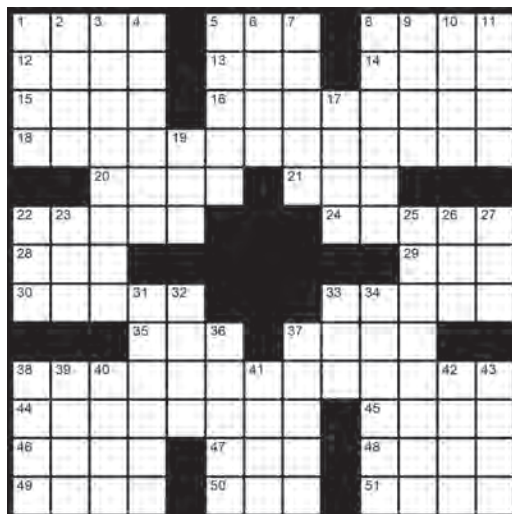

'Taylor Talks' highlight southern New Mexico history

BULLETIN REPORT

It may not be open yet, but the Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site has been generating a lot of buzz as the dates grow closer to the projected opening of the Visitor Center in the fall of this year. A grand opening will follow in the Fall of 2025. To keep the public informed on the site's progress, a four-part lecture series will kick off at 2 p.m. on Saturday, July 27.

Called "Taylor Talks," the series will bring in guest speakers to discuss the history of Mesilla and southern New Mexico as it relates to the site. Attendees will learn how the property – consisting

of two store fronts on the Mesilla Plaza and the former residence of the late J. Paul and Mary Daniel Taylor in the rear – came to be the state's latest monument to New Mexican history and culture.

The first of the free talks will be presented by Taylor-Mesilla's Instructional Coordinator Supervisor Alexandra McKinney. She explains that her portion of the series will cover "what the Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site is, how it became a state historic site, what the purpose of the historic site will be, and an overview of what the state is currently doing to prepare it for opening."

Though no dates have

yet been set for the other three lectures, McKinney has shared her vision for it. Part two "will cover the Taylor family home, the architecture of the home, and some of the preservation the Taylor Family has done as well as how the

state will use the collection going forward," she said.

According to the website, "the Taylors were life-long collectors of furnishings, art, and artifacts which provide exceptional educational opportunities to bring New Mexico's

culture and traditions to life." Having lived in the home for more than 60 years, it is a classic example of the values, lifestyle and architecture of New Mexico throughout the 20th century and beyond, as seen through the eyes of a multicultural family dedicated to education and history.

In part three of the series, the discussion will be about the Paul and Mary Daniels Taylor archival materials at the Rio Grande Historical Collections. According to McKinney, it will cover "Mary's efforts as a historian and photographer and how her work has come to influence Southern New Mexican histori-

cal research."

The fourth and final part will cover the Taylor family itself, including a history of the family directly from the source, via a presentation from Mike Taylor.

Presented by the Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site and the Friends of Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site, the first lecture of the Taylor Talks series will take place at the Mesilla Community Center auditorium at 2251 Calle de Santiago, in Mesilla. The talks are free and open to the public. More information on the series and other aspects of the Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site are available online at NMHistoricSites.org/Taylor-Mesilla.

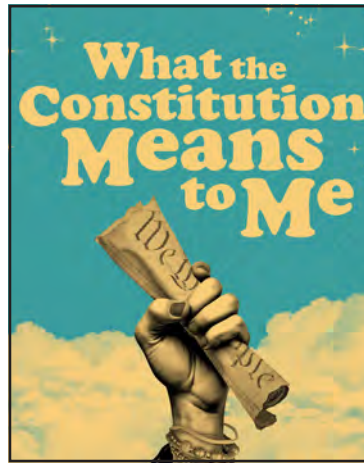

Socrates Café returns Saturday

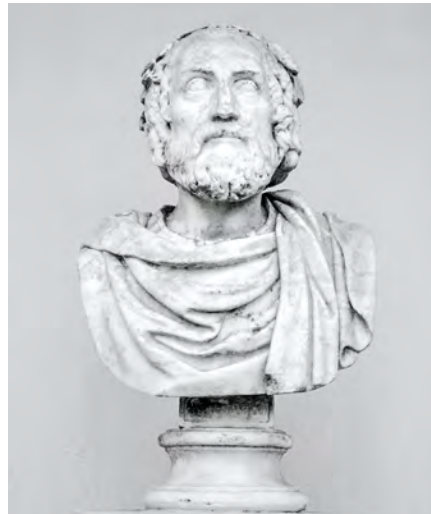

most famous popular ballets, as well as works that have been commissioned by him. So, they get the opportunity to learn repertory, but also to take part in this process to create a brand-new work of art.”

All of that work happening behind the scenes culminates in two free performances for the public, Saturday, August 3, on the Plaza de Las Cruces mainstage, during the Saturday Farmers and Crafts Market of Las Cruces. This is made possible partly by a grant from the Devasthali Family Foundation Fund, awarded with assistance from the Community Foundation

of Southern New Mexico. A partnership with the NMSU Department of Kinesiology and Dance additionally supports Arts Lab Desert Peaks.

According to the release, Arts Lab Desert Peaks is not just about art, “it’s about injecting vibrancy into our local economy. The artists reside in Las Cruces for the two-week process, supporting our local businesses. The culminating performances, held in a shared community space, transcend language and cultural barriers, proving the universality of movement. The unifying power of dance will inspire audiences.”

“One of the things we push against is the stiffness of dance as a formal art form,” El-Khoury

explains. “Dance is for everyone, regardless of whether you have training, so our target audience is not a dance audience. Our target audience is people who don’t normally have access to this art form. We want people to hear the music and walk up to have an experience they wouldn’t get otherwise.”

The performance will take place on the Plaza de Las Cruces on Saturday, August 3, when the Arts Lab Desert Peaks dancers will give their world premiere performance at 9 a.m., followed by an encore at 10 a.m.

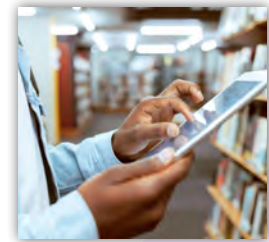

State seeks input on Clean Car Tax Credit rules

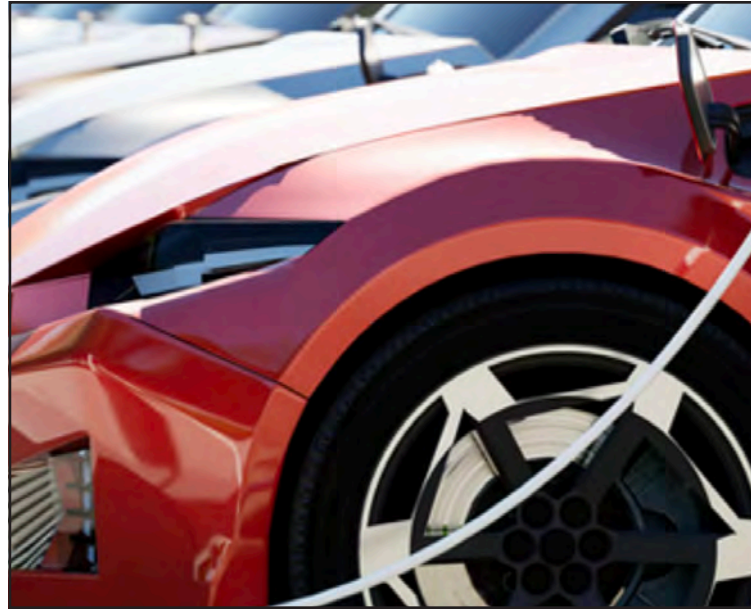
New Mexico's Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department put out a call for public input on proposed rules for the state's Clean Car Tax Credit program.

Part of the tax bill signed by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham in March, the program provides tax credits to the purchase or lease of electric-powered vehicles including hybrid, plug-in and fuel cell cars. Incentives are also available for the installation of charging equipment for those vehicles. Personal and business income tax credits are

both available. The program is administered under the EMNRD.

Qualifying new vehicles must carry a suggested retail price of \$55,000 or less, while used vehicles must have a market value of \$25,000 or less and carry a one-year warranty against defects and repairs. The credits apply to purchases or leases of at least three years obtained between May 15 of this year and Dec. 31, 2029.

"The public comment period and rulemaking will clarify eligibility and requirements for other cars," Energy Conservation and Management Division

director Rebecca "Puck" Stair said in a news release.

Following the 30-day comment period, the department will incorporate the feedback into the final rules ahead of processing the first tax credit applications. A web page with more information about the program and a link to offer input can be found at clean.energy.nm.gov.

Cannabis, as you may already know, has been around forever. It has been known as a sacred and medicinal herb. There was a time, before joints, pre-rolls, pipes and bong, when the herb was used in tea, topicals and food. Smoking was also used, but not as much as today.

There is evidence of medicinal use in most cultures for thousands of years; however, recreational use is more recent. The percentage of the psychoactive compound THC is always a question. There are thousands of cannabis strains and testing results for THC may vary from 14 percent to 30 percent.

The saying that the cannabis today is not the cannabis of the 60's is true. THC percentages back then were in the 5- to 10 percent area. Today percentages can be as high as 30 percent for flower and 99 percent in concentrates.

Many of you ask, "Do I need high percentages of THC?"

The answer is deep and broad. There

are many other factors that are important when it comes to cannabis use. More and more growers are breeding for high percentages of THC, and other factors include allowing plants to mature longer before harvest time and using exposure to light for greater potency.

Other factors include whether pesticides are used, growing indoors vs. outdoors, commercial farming vs. craft farming, the growers' expertise and whether they are reputable, and aesthetics – how the flower looks.

Other considerations include color, texture, looseness vs. tightness, density and whether trichomes are visible. Trichome density is essential, as this is where cannabinoids and terpenes create

the medicinal effect. A lack of trichomes means the plant is immature and not as potent. Terpene profiles must be loud and clearly defined. Has drying and curing been done correctly? Smokers should experience smooth flavor. If cannabis has not been processed properly, the smoke will be harsh have poor burnability, which is crucial for maximum effect. Finally, there is the "entourage effect." Cannabis includes over 400 cannabinoids, terpenes and flavonoids. It is best to maximize the full spectrum to benefit from it all.

In assessing your overall experience, ask yourself: Did it taste good? Did it burn well? Did it make you feel the way you wanted to feel? Is it worth telling others about?

It's time to speak up and acknowledge that cannabis is medicine. Search online for information on strains that meet your needs, and ask questions

at the dispensaries; also, keep a journal recording your use and experience.

Using cannabis comes with a learning curve. Every user may experience different results. Be a mindful and responsible user.

Las Cruces cannabis company receives \$50k from the state

Higher Cultures LLC, a cannabis dispensary and producer based in Oregon with manufacturing facilities in Las Cruces, received a \$50,130 grant for job training, according to an announcement from the New Mexico Economic Development Department on July 17.

The grant is meant to train up to seven new employees with \$21 per hour wages, according to NMEDD. The money is part of a million-dollar

fund to stimulate job training efforts across New Mexico.

"Higher Cultures aims to provide the best quality cannabis products in New Mexico, to run a responsible and profitable business, and to create quality jobs in the communities in which they operated," NMEDD said in a news release. "Higher Cultures New Mexico is focused on manufacturing, the area the company has most experience in."

According to Higher Cultures' website, they

manufacture resin cartridges for vaping and extracts in Las Cruces.

Cannabis was legalized for non-medical use by adults in 2021, with production and sales regulated by the state Cannabis Control Division since 2022. Since then, the state has reported over \$1.2 billion in total sales, including medical and non-medical products, from over 1,000 dispensaries in the state. Monthly reported sales of adult-use cannabis peaked in March 2024, with \$39.5

million statewide, while medical cannabis sales declined to \$11.5 million in June.

During 2024, southern New Mexico producers have contended with a highly saturated retail market as well as a crackdown by U.S. Border Patrol on cannabis products moving through checkpoints. Despite the plant's legalization in New Mexico, cannabis remains prohibited under federal law and is subject to confiscation at federal checkpoints.

Andre Seldon Jr., who played corner for the New Mexico State University Aggies last year, died last weekend by apparent drowning, officials said.

“The Aggie community is devastated to hear the news of the passing of Andre Seldon Jr.,” NMSU said in a social media post. “Our thoughts and prayers are with his family and friends.”

According to the Cache

County Sheriff’s Office, Seldon, 22, was last seen cliff diving at Porcupine Reservoir in Utah before being recovered by a dive team.

“Our investigation leads us to believe this is a tragic accident as multiple witnesses recount the same information,” Cache County Sheriff’s Office said in a statement.

Seldon transferred to Utah State earlier this year after two seasons at NMSU. He followed his NMSU defensive coordina-

tor, Nate Dreiling, to the Beehive State. Dreiling is now Utah State’s interim head coach.

“Our football program is heartbroken to have to endure the loss of one of our own,” Dreiling said in a statement released by the school. “Having had a previous relationship with Andre during our time

together at New Mexico State, I can tell you he was an incredible person and teammate. Our condolences and prayers go out to Andre’s family as we grieve with them over this tremendous loss.”

According to ESPN, Seldon was a team captain at NMSU and played 28 games with the Aggies, recording 98 tackles and two interceptions. Before coming to Las Cruces, Seldon attended Belleville High School in Michigan.

In another blow to Ruidoso following wildfires and subsequent flooding this summer, the Ruidoso Downs Race Track and Casino announced that the remainder of the horse racing season will move to Albuquerque Downs.

“We’ve got to keep the wheels on the bus and we’ve got to proceed,”

General Manager Rick Baugh stated on the Ruidoso Downs website. “We’ll run our Triple Crowns and we’ll get the rest of our stakes schedule. It’s safety and we’ve got to look after the safety aspect of it.”

The South Fork and Salt fires ignited on June 17 and burned a combined total of 24,754 acres in Lincoln County, according to the village of Ruidoso. Subsequent

heavy rains and flooding hit the community hard and damaged the track and other facilities at Ruidoso Downs.

Baugh told the El Paso Times the Rainbow Derby and Rainbow Oaks and other missed races would be rescheduled as well, and that Albuquerque was selected because it was closest to being ready, with horses already training there.

Aggies make preseason watch list

Conference USA’s preseason watch list selects five players from each institution as athletes to watch this football season, selected by the league’s head coaches.

The five Aggies to watch, NMSU reported, were offensive players Canaan Yarro, Monte Watkins and Kordell David, plus defensive player Buddha Peleti and punt returner Jordan Smith.

The five athletes are among the 28 letter-winners returning from last year’s 10-win team, NMSU reported. Yarro

returns to an offense that achieved the 14th-ranked rushing attack last season. Watkins returns after a sophomore year running 9.7 yards per carry. David returns as the Aggie’s leading returning receiver, and Peleti as a defensive leader with 4.5 sacks last season. And Jordan returns following an injury that sidelined him for much of the final 11 games last season.

NMSU opens the 2024 campaign at Aggie Memorial Stadium on Aug. 31, hosting Southeast Missouri. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.



What I've learned after decades of golf

As I approach my 82nd year, I find myself looking back a lot. I take the most pride in sport for the Charles Blanchard Award established by the University of Notre Dame in 1965 for excellence and leadership in men's swimming. In April I personally presented the 60th Blanchard Award. I think my strongest performance in golf was in 1997 when I passed the 36-hole Playing Ability Test, a requirement of the PGA of America for anyone aspiring to be a PGA teaching pro. And the proclamation by the State of New Mexico in 2023 by Lieutenant Governor Howie Morales naming me the "Doctor of Golf" for New Mexico stands out

as the top form of recognition for me in golf. I have played golf for over 73 years; 15 of those were teaching golf with the late Herb Wimberly. This is some of what I learned along the way.

I've learned to recover from setbacks and come back even stronger. In 2011 I had a near fatal fall which put me in a coma for a few days, and then months of rehab. I recovered and worked hard and got back to playing better golf than ever. The latest setback is a severely fractured left wrist that will keep me out for several months. I have learned to

appreciate the opportunity to write this column, and hear remarks from our readers, as I am soon to approach 1000 articles. Since 2006 my golf writing for the Bulletin has been a labor of love. Golf does not owe me a thing; I am happy to give back. I have always realized how fortunate I had been to be a teaching partner with Mr. Wimberly in our Performance Golf Schools. I believe I learned more about golf through teaching than any other way.

As far as playing masterful golf itself, I found that mental toughness is

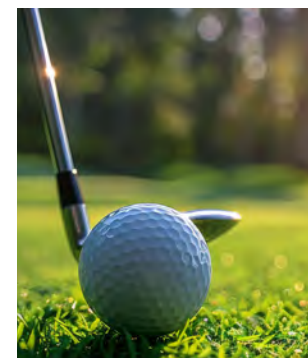
an absolute must. Along with that, remaining in full emotional control is critical. I'm what they call a "flat liner" since I don't typically demonstrate much either way, up or down or high or low. I don't see how going crazy after making a 30 foot putt helps much. It's what you practice to do.

If you are an avid, serious golfer you understand that golf is forever a work in progress. Regardless of how many years we have been playing golf or how old we are, there is always something new to learn and always room for improvement. I have found that you might be full of confidence and take pride in your golf game, but you

better not allow your ego to diminish concentration or decision making. As for pride, it's best to not be afraid of losing. As long as I play well, win or lose, it's OK. Here's what I believe: don't excuse; don't explain; don't blame; don't complain; just accept responsibility. It's you, your clubs, a ball and the golf course. Go play golf.

From the time I was a kid riding my bicycle a couple of miles to meet my buddies to play at our local nine-hole golf course in Lyndhurst, Ohio, I have always considered my golfing friends the most important aspect of golf, as I do now. I developed my love of golf from my father and my grandfa-

ther, both of whom were skilled gofers. In 1934, my dad made a hole-in-one on a 250-yard par 4 hole in Cleveland. As a youth I learned to have great respect and admiration for tour pros and teaching pros. Dad claimed that they had the closely held "secret" to the golf swing as part of their trade. They didn't.
