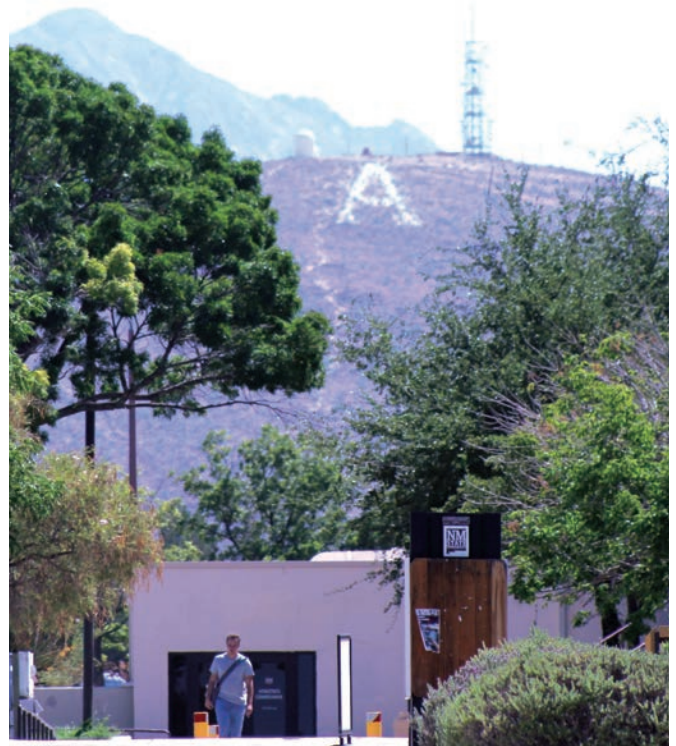

WELCOME TO LAS CRUCES

AGGIE STOMPING GROUNDS

You may have lived in Las Cruces your whole life, or you might just be arriving from somewhere far away. Either way, the city has lots to offer. The weather, and recreational opportunities provide outside activities almost year round in Las Cruces.

The vibrant downtown Las Cruces still has a small-town feel, and new bars, coffee shops and restaurants keep popping up all over. There's also a great bookstore, a comic shop, theaters, museums, galleries and apparel stores along Main Street. It is also a prime spot for festivals, and the stage on the Plaza de Las Cruces hosts many live music and dance events.

Explore the Mesquite Street and Alameda Depot Historic Districts near downtown and walk the Plaza at Old Mesilla, enjoying its shops and entertainment. And if you're the type of person who enjoys the outdoors, you're in the right place. Explore the many peaks and trails of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument or float down the Rio Grande on a kayak or inflatable tube.

Here are some more ideas to help you get started planning your next outing:

LAS CRUCES FARMERS & CRAFTS MARKET

The sights, sounds and people watching at the Las Cruces Farmers & Crafts Market bring a thousand smiles. Food trucks with all kinds of fare gather on Main Street along with artisans offering beard creams and CBD salves, jewelry, art and a wild variety of other crafts. This is the place to find locally sourced meat, a great cup of coffee, music or a card featuring the Organ Mountains to send back home. Local farmers offer the freshest produce from tomatoes, pecans, honey and greens to fresh flowers to brighten your dorm room. The market takes place near the Downtown Plaza every Wednesday and Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. Info: farmersandcraftsmarketoflascruces.com, 575-201-3853.



MESQUITE STREET HISTORIC DISTRICT

For a sense of the town's history without the touristy feel, take a walk through the Mesquite Street Historic District, a colorful neighborhood filled with character. Along these historic streets you'll stumble upon Klein Park and shops, as well as restaurants like La Nueva Casita, Nopalito and some of Las Cruces' oldest buildings.

WATCH THE DRAMA

If your schedule allows for a little drama in your life, Las Cruces is home to numerous theaters where you can test your audition skills or take in a show.

Las Cruces Community Theatre, 311 N. Main St., is located downtown, and offers a student discount on tickets. Visit lcctnm.org to view the full schedule of performances. Black Box Theatre, 430 N. Main St., gives a platform to overlooked and little-known works, as well as a space for local writers to develop their projects. There's also the American Southwest Theatre Company, which hosts productions at the ASNMSU Center for Fine Arts, 1000 E. University Ave.

FILM

The Rio Grande Theatre, 211 N. Main St., is located Downtown. It shows a variety of classic films and hosts national musicians and regional acts. Call 575-541-2290 or visit riograndetheatre.org for more information. Located at 2469 Calle de Guadalupe, in Mesilla, The Fountain Theatre has entertained residents of Mesilla since 1905. Visit this landmark, enjoy the best popcorn in town and take in an Oscar winner or foreign film. Visit mesillavalleyfilm.org for a list of current showings.

Catch popular current films at Allen Theatres' Telshor 12 or the Cineport 10 at Mesilla Valley Mall. See what's playing at allentheatresinc.com/city/las_cruces.

MUSEUMS

Visit Las Cruces' museums for a day of cultural enrichment. Downtown, you will find the Branigan Cultural Center, Museum of Art and the Museum of Nature & Science. Nearby, in the Alameda Depot Historic District, you'll find the Railroad Museum. And closer to campus is the New Mexico Farm & Ranch Heritage Museum, which serves as a venue for special events, ongoing exhibits and some special breeds of livestock. GALLERIES

Las Cruces and neighboring Mesilla offer a thriving and diverse art scene, with dozens of galleries throughout the city, large and small. There is something for every taste across media, in two and three dimensions as well as the digital realm.

For some suggestions to get you started, check out the Visit Las Cruces website at visitlascruces.com/things-to-do/arts-culture/art-galleries/. Also, be sure to check in with the Doña Ana Arts Council at daarts.org.

TAKE A HIKE OR A MOUNTAIN BIKE RIDE

Las Cruces is near several hiking trails and mountains. Try the simple hike of Tortugas (or "A" mountain) near University Avenue and work your way up to Dripping Springs Natural Area or Soledad Canyon. Hike Baylor Pass and end up at Aguirre Spring Campground. For a day trip, cruise south to the beautiful Franklin Mountains of nearby El Paso.

There are 82 miles of mountain-biking trails in and around Las Cruces for both beginners and experts. Many are incorporated into Bureau of Land Management lands or national monument locations that offer riders breathtaking vistas. Some bike trails on BLM land in Doña Ana County include; All-Trails-Lead-to-Gnome, Chutes-n-Ladders, Doña Ana Trail, Greenrock Trail and the Rock Garden. Bike trails



in the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument include: La Maria Trail, various Sierra Vista Trails and the Monumental Loop

ORGAN MOUNTAINS-DESERT PEAKS

A major attraction in Doña Ana County is the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument, immediately east of Las Cruces. The ranges included in the monument are the Robledo Mountains, Sierra de las Uvas and the Doña Ana Mountains. Recreational opportunities within the monument include camping, rock climbing, hiking, mountain biking and much more.

The nonprofit Friends of the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks offers information and organizes or promotes numerous activities involving the monument. More information on their programs and the monument itself are available at organmountainsdesertpeaks.org. Additional information can be found by looking up the monument at BLM.gov.

VISIT NEARBY ATTRACTIONS DAYTRIPPIN'



The getaway you need is just a short drive away when you live in Las Cruces. Explore neighboring El Paso or head north to Hatch, the Green Chile Capital of the World.

Looking for an outdoor adventure? Visit the area's nearby caverns, hot springs or gypsum sands. Check out the Outdoor Center in the Activity Center on campus to rent any camping equipment you might need.

WHITE SANDS NATIONAL PARK

Situated 40 minutes east of Las Cruces, 10 acres of white gypsum shine with haunting beauty under a full moon, a setting sun or a rising sun. Tours are available November through April, and the park regularly has concerts, full-moon hikes, sunset hikes and educational programming. Bring your plastic disc and slide down the tallest dunes. The entry fee is \$25 per vehicle, and annual passes are available.

CARLSBAD CAVERNS, NEW MEXICO

Located in the Chihuahuan Desert, Carlsbad Caverns National Park is only a three-hour drive from Las Cruces if you take U.S. 180. Hike in the underground caves by day and watch the flight of bats at night. The \$15-per-person cavern entrance fee is good for three days and reservations are required.

CLOUDCROFT, NEW MEXICO

480,000 acres of open forest make for great hiking, mountain biking, camping, horseback riding and much more! Cloudcroft has wonderful shops, restaurants and unique businesses to visit and a museum filled with the logging and railroad history. Enjoy cool summer temperatures that typically stay in the cool 70's. Cloudcroft is a quaint mountain village that is perfect for a weekend getaway!

HOT SPRINGS IN TRUTH OR CONSEQUENCES

Truth or Consequences is known for its hot springs. Journey out with your friends for a relaxing, therapeutic soak. You can reserve a time slot to soak in a private pool at most places, or you may choose to take a dip in a community/shared pool. There are more than a dozen different springs resorts of all styles and formats, including some that look right onto the Rio Grande. Search hot springs properties at sierracountynewmexico.info.

ELEPHANT BUTTE LAKE STATE PARK

Located an hour and a half north of Las Cruces along I-25 is the largest lake in the state. If you enjoy camping, fishing, boating, or just being outdoors, Elephant Butte is for you. There is plenty of water and plenty of beach room and Elephant Butte Lake can accommodate watercraft of many styles and sizes. Remember to wear your life jacket. Be boat safe and boat smart. Besides sandy beaches, the state park offers restrooms, picnic areas, playgrounds, and developed sites with electric and water hook-ups for RVs. GILA NATIONAL FOREST

If you enjoy camping, hiking and fishing, visit the Gila National Forest. Located two and a half hours north east of Las Cruces, the Gila National Forest covers 3.3 million acres, making it the largest National Forest in New Mexico. Within the forest resides the Aldo Leopold, Blue Range, and Gila Wilderness Areas. In 1924, the Gila became the world's first designated wilderness, preserved as a primitive area by prohibiting motorized vehicles and other strict regulations. This forest offers hundreds of miles of streams, more than 20 campgrounds, and more than 1,500 miles of trails. Please be sure to follow all outdoor safety and ethics and leave no trace. EL PASO, TEXAS

Less than an hour drive away, take a day to visit the El Paso Zoo or the impressive (and free) El Paso Museum of Art. Stop by the family-friendly Rubiks Arcade Bar for walls of classic and new games. EXERCISE YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE

GET OUT AND VOTE!



Here's what you need to know to register to vote, learn about candidates and cast your ballot.

QUALIFICATIONS

You must be a resident to register to vote in New Mexico. If you're not, check your state of residency for guidelines on how to cast an absentee ballot.

REGISTRATION

You must be registered in order to vote. To learn more about voting registration and deadlines in New Mexico visit vote.gov/register/nm or visit NMVote.org. To find more information on online and in-person registration in Doña Ana County visit donaanacountyelections.com/voter-information.

You must submit your application at least 28 days before an election. You

will need a New Mexico driver's license or New Mexico identification card issued through a motor vehicle division of the taxation and revenue department; any document that contains an address in the county together with a photo ID card; or a current valid student photo identification card from a post-secondary education institution in New Mexico accompanied by a current student fee statement that contains the student's address in the county.

LEARN ABOUT THE CANDIDATES

To see candidates statewide, check the New Mexico State Secretary's candidate portal at sos.state.nm.us. For city elections, check the City of Las Cruces' website at lascruces.gov/government/city-clerks-office/municipal-elections/

WHERE TO VOTE

Once you're registered, you can vote at any voting convenience center (VCC) throughout the county, regardless of district. To vote on campus, visit the VCC at the New Mexico State University Corbett Center Student Union. For a complete list of voting convenience centers and early-voting locations, visit donaanacountyelections.com/locations.

WHAT TO BRING

In Las Cruces, a physical form of identification is required only for first-time New Mexico voters who registered by mail and did not include identification with the registration form. Otherwise, you will be asked to provide a verbal or written statement of identification including your name, year of birth and registered address.

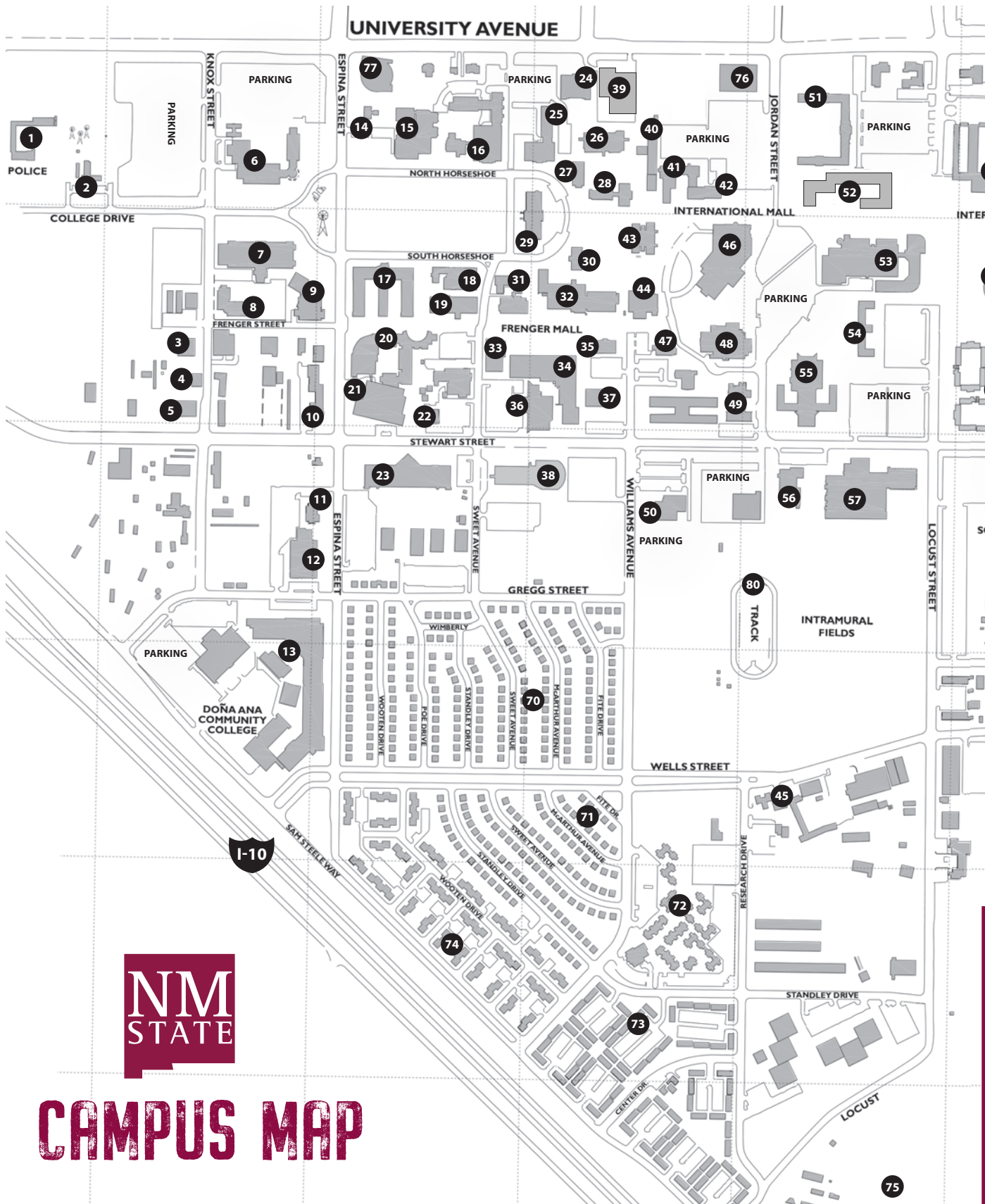

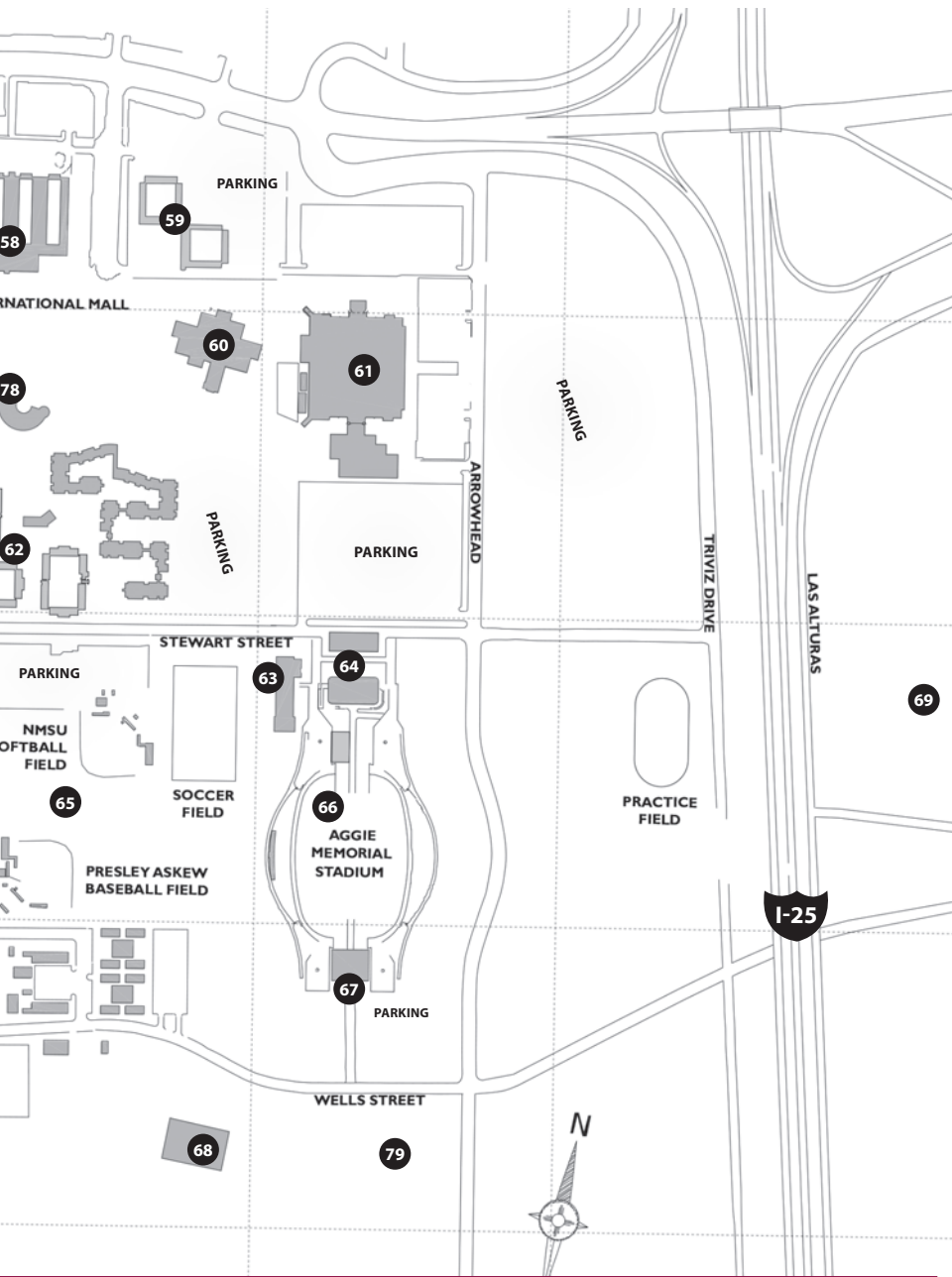

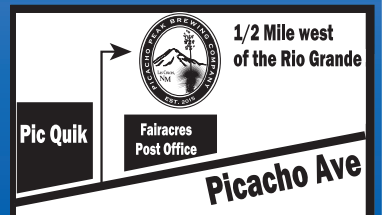

The following activities do not count toward earning account rewards: ATM-processed transactions, transfers between accounts, PIN-based, signature based debit card purchases less than \$5.01, debit card purchases processed by merchants and received by our credit union as ATM transactions, non-retail payment transactions and purchases made with debit cards not issued by our credit union. Transactions bundled together by merchants and received by our institution as a single transaction count as a single transaction for the purpose of earning account rewards. "Monthly Qualification Cycle" means a period beginning one (1) day prior to the first banking day of the current statement cycle through one (1) day prior to the last banking day of the current statement cycle. See our website or contact one of our branch service representatives for specific Monthly Qualification Cycle dates. "Banking Day" means any day on which an office of the credit union is open to the public for the purpose of carrying out substantially all of its banking functions or for processing. "Business Day" means a calendar day other than a Saturday or a Sunday, January 1, the third Monday in January, the third Monday in February, the last Monday in May, June 19, July 4, the first Monday in September, the second Monday in October, November 11, the fourth Thursday in November, or December 25. If January 1, July 4, November 11, or December 25 falls on a Sunday, the next Monday is not a Business Day. "Statement Cycle" means the period of time for which our credit union provides a summary of the financial activities and transactions that post and settle to the accountholder's account. Contact one of our branch service representatives for specific Statement Cycle dates. *Reward Information: When your Kasasa Cash account qualifications are met during a Monthly Qualification Cycle, daily balances up to and including \$15,000 receive an APY of 5.05%, and daily balances over \$15,000 earn a dividend rate of 0.30% on the portion of the daily balance over \$15,000 resulting in a Split rate that ranges from 5.05% to 0.92% APY, depending on the account's total daily balance. You will receive reimbursements up to an aggregate total of \$25.00 (\$4.99 per single transaction) for nationwide ATM withdrawal fees incurred within your Kasasa Cash account during that Monthly Qualification Cycle. We reimburse ATM withdrawal fees based on estimates when the withdrawal information we receive does not identify the ATM withdrawal fee. If you have not received an appropriate reimbursement, we will adjust the reimbursement amount if we receive the transaction receipt within sixty (60) calendar days of the withdrawal transaction. NOTE: ATM fee reimbursements only apply to Kasasa Cash, Kasasa Cash Back, or Kasasa Tunes transactions via ATM. When your Kasasa Cash qualifications are not met, the dividend rate earned on the account's entire daily balance will be 0.05% resulting in an annual percentage yield of 0.05% and ATM withdrawal fees are not refunded. Dividends will be credited to your Kasasa Cash account on the last day of the current statement cycle. Nationwide ATM withdrawal fee reimbursements will be credited to your account on the last day of the current statement cycle. APY = Annual Percentage Yield. APYs accurate as of 9/01/2023. APY calculations are based on an assumed balance of \$15,000 + \$100,000 in your Kasasa Cash account and an assumed statement cycle of thirty-one (31) days. Rates, rewards, and bonuses, if any, are variable and may change after account is opened; rates may change without notice to you. No minimum balance is required to earn or receive the account's rewards. Rewards less than a penny cannot be distributed. Fees may reduce earnings. STOP SEXUAL ASSAULT

RECOGNIZE AND INTERVENE

Campus sexual assault is an uncomfortable topic, but one that must be talked about. One in six women have been a victim of attempted or completed rape in her lifetime and 3 percent of men have been a victim of attempted or completed rape in their lifetime. While in college, a young woman's risk increases to one in four chances of being sexually assaulted.

Sexual assault may consist of sexual harassment, sexual coercion, sexual contact (unwanted fondling/groping), attempted rape and rape.

It is never the victim's fault. Ever. Rape and sexual assault are not crimes of passion and love. Rape and sexual assault is about power and control.

The following are some tips to how you can help intervene and help respond to sexual assault in a safe way.


How to recognize the signs of a potentially harmful situation

- Body language: Is a potential victim leaning or pushing the other party away or just appears uncomfortable?
- Raised voices: Do you hear yelling, screaming or other alarming sounds?
- Intoxication: Is the person stumbling, unable to communicate or unable to consent to what is happening?
- The golden rule: Trust your instincts. If you notice something that doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.

ON-CAMPUS SAFETY TIPS

- Use high-quality “U” locks on all bicycles, locking both the frame and front tire to the rack.
- Roll up windows and lock doors on vehicles and campus residences. Do

not leave property in plain sight from windows, or unattended on campus.

- Be aware of potential scams via phone calls or email. Don't give out personal information over the phone unless you are sure of the source of the request.
- When in an interpersonal relationship, remember that “no” means “no!” If the other person is incapable of giving consent, any sexual contact without consent is a crime. If you are someone you know is the victim of sexual assault, call 575-646-3311 or 575-646-3424 NMSU Police-Victim Services.
- If you see someone else in danger, say something or do something and call 575-646-3311 for help. If you see an unsafe condition like a fallen tree limb or power line and other safety hazards, report it promptly. For emergencies call 911.

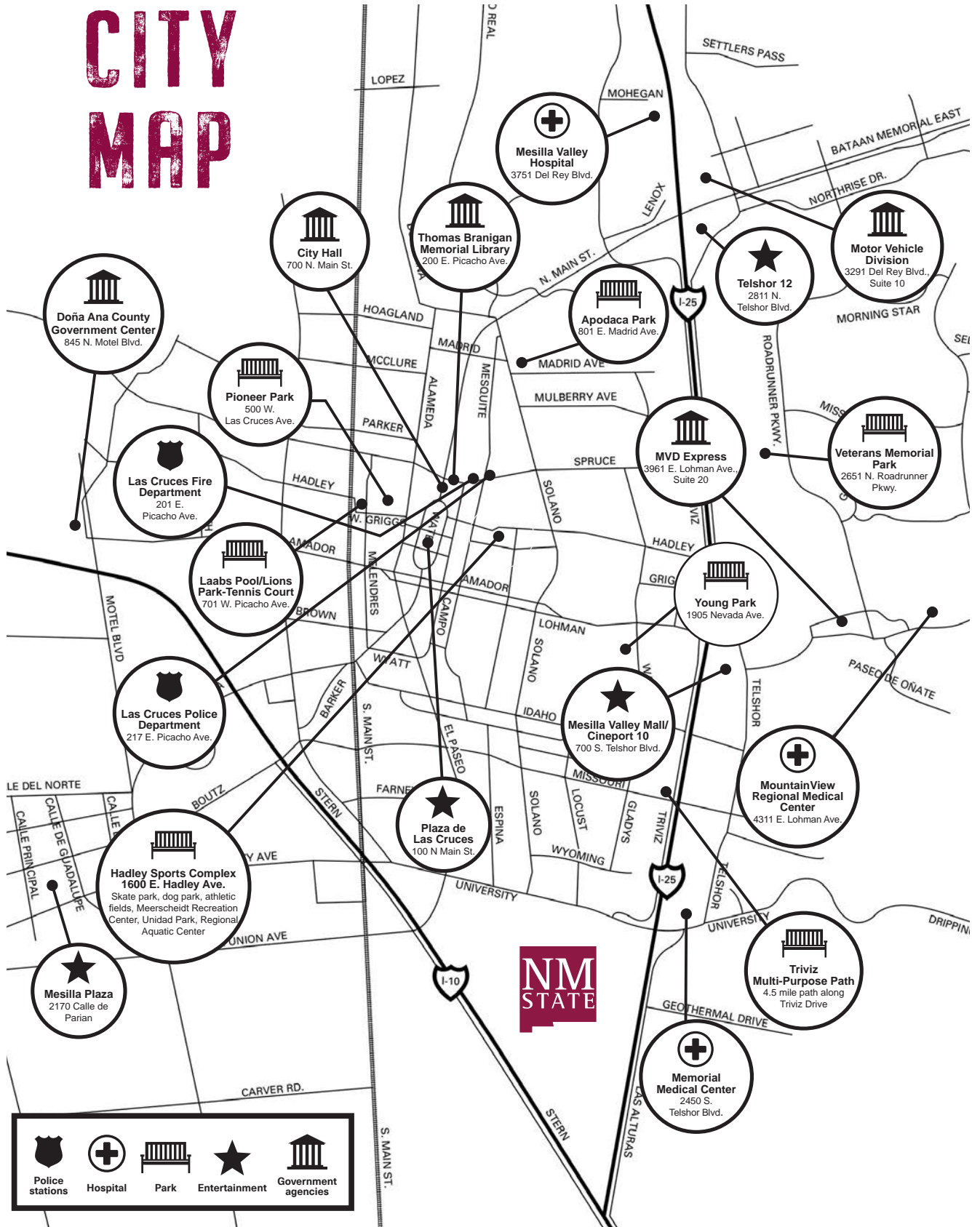

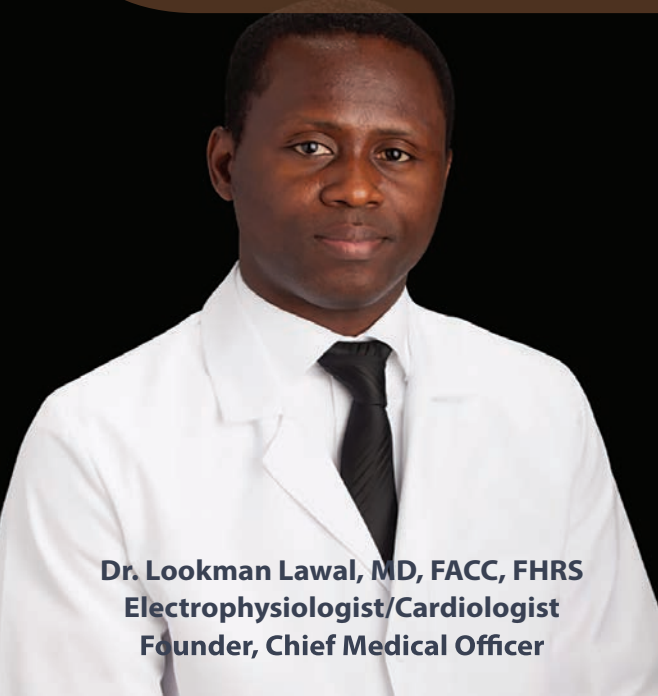
