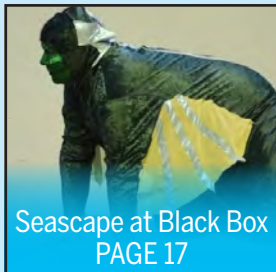

City of Las Cruces says Memorial Medical Center may have violated lease

Notice of breach follows years of patient complaints

We are here now. That was the message that local officials hoped to impart as the city and county sought to escalate pressure on the area's largest hospital.

City of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County officials announced they had notified Memorial Medical Center of a potential breach of its public land lease during a news conference on Aug. 30.

But officials also used the news conference to acknowledge that local government had not adequately handled its

responsibility to oversee MMC, despite dozens of community members sounding the alarm for years that the hospital may not be living up to its legal obligations.

"While we are here to publicly ask MMC to fulfill their obligation to our community, this is also about the city of Las Cruces taking responsi-

bility for our role in this agreement and about recommitting to working side-by-side with our county colleagues to ensure proper and quality access to healthcare," said Las Cruces City Councilor Johana Bencomo.

Memorial Medical Center, a private equity for-profit hospital, has been under sustained scrutiny

following the publication of an NBC News investigation this summer.

NBC News documented dozens of patients and former patients who'd been denied care, sometimes due to a lack of insurance or ability to pay, an alleged violation of MMC's 40-year agreement with Las Cruces and Doña Ana County.

MMC's former CEO, John Harris, spoke to the county commission and city council after the story was published. He denied many of the questions raised by the coverage, and said the story was inaccurate or outright false in its assertions. Harris retired from MMC a few weeks later.

"These concerns were raised by some of the most vulnerable populations in our community. We want you to know that we see

you, we hear you and we take you seriously," City Manager Ikani Taumoepeau said at the news conference.

The hospital sits on public land that its operator, Lifepoint Health, leases from the city and county. Lifepoint is obliged by the lease agreement to provide care to all patients regardless of insurance or ability to pay.

However, city officials stopped short of accusing MMC of violating those provisions outright. Instead, City Attorney Brad Douglas said the city and county were demanding the release of documents that might show MMC had knowingly denied care to patients who would have otherwise been entitled to it. The lease stipulates that MMC is required to pro-

New fire dept. agreement aims to improve response times

Fires, medical emergencies, and disasters don't care about the invisible boundaries between towns and counties. And now, neither do the emergency responders.

Local fire departments signed a landmark agreement on Aug. 27 to eliminate barriers between department jurisdiction and allow the closest firefighting unit to respond. In many cases, the previous system required agencies to request aid on an incident-by-incident basis, potentially delaying response times.

"As a resident or a visitor to Doña Ana County, you're not really looking to see what's the name on the side of the fire truck or the rescue unit that shows up to help you," said Doña Ana County Fire Chief Shannon Cherry.

The automatic aid agreement is between

the county fire department, the New Mexico State University Fire Department, the city of Sunland Park, the city of Las Cruces, the NASA/White Sands Test Facility and the town of Mesilla. It replaces a patchwork system of mutual aid agreements.

Those agreements were between individual departments and are required documents that enable inter-departmental cooperation. But with individual agreements come individual problems.

"There could be some inconsistencies between them when you have so many individual agreements," Cherry said. "Whereas, this way, everyone gets to be on the same sheet of music."

This agreement will relieve burdens on the department for Las Cruces, which has the valley's densest population and highest concentration of service calls, according to LCFD Chief Jason



Smith. He said that's most relevant when the department's resources are already concentrated on a major incident.

Smith referenced a fire about a year ago that required nearly all the department's resources.

"I think it left us with one ambulance and maybe one or two engines left throughout the city," Smith said.

"So under that previous agreement, if we had another structure fire at the same time, or say, we had a bad vehicle accident with multiple people injured, our arriving of-

ficer on scene would have to evaluate everything, make an assessment and then make a request to

Both Smith and Cherry said several factors came together to allow this change. For one, almost all of the fire department chiefs are relatively new to their executive positions. Another factor was the department's new radio system, which channels all calls through the same system.

"It was a synergistic effect where there's enough new people that were like, 'Hey, let's try this other approach,'" Smith said.

Las Cruces nominated as federal judge

President Joe Biden will nominate Sarah Davenport of Las Cruces to serve as the state's newest federal judge, according to a statement from the White House.

If confirmed by the U.S. Senate, Davenport would replace retiring judge William P. Johnson, the state's highest-ranking federal judge. Johnson was appointed in 2001 by President George W. Bush.

Davenport served as an Assistant United States Attorney in the U.S. At-

torney's Office at the Las Cruces location since 2009. Before that, Davenport worked as a Special Assistant U.S. Attorney in Las Cruces from 2008 to 2009 and as a law clerk in the U.S. Attorney's Office in Albuquerque from 2006 to 2008, according to a news release.

Davenport received her law degree from the University of New Mexico School of Law in 2006 and a Bachelor's degree in music from New Mexico State University in 1998.

Davenport's judgeship would be in the Las Cruces Federal Courthouse if she is confirmed.

New Mexico state auditor scrutinizes utility

The New Mexico state auditor's office confirmed it's taking a closer look at the books of a water utility for Sunland Park, Santa Teresa and southern Doña Ana county.

State Auditor Joseph Maestas said the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority was under scrutiny in an Aug. 19 letter to New Mexico Environmental Law Center attorneys requesting further action on behalf of residents.

"The [Office of the State Auditor] already has initiated an investigation of CRRUA regarding the concerns of fraud, waste, and abuse," Maestas wrote in the letter.

Late last year, it came to light that CRRUA had distributed water with high levels of arsenic to customers for more than a year, without telling the public or the New Mexico Environment Department. Arsenic naturally occurs at higher levels in the region's groundwater. High exposure over time contributes to certain kinds of cancers, and is linked to higher rates of diabetes, heart conditions and skin conditions, according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Top environmental officials called on the state auditor's office and the state's top prosecutor to investigate the water utility in March.

That investigation is

ongoing and the state auditor's office is "actively collaborating with other state and federal agencies," said David Peña, a policy director with the New Mexico Auditor.

The office will publish a document at the conclusion of the investigation and after a legal review by state lawyers, which would outline any findings or note the inquiry's closure, Peña said, but the timeline for that is uncertain.

CRRUA officials and staff said the utility has made significant improvements in water quality this year. The latest three tests from the New Mexico Environment Department show CRRUA is now in compliance, with arsenic levels in the utility's water measuring below the federal limit of 10 parts per billion.

In June, CRRUA's voluntary testing found the drinking water in one facility exceeded the federal level for arsenic at 13 parts per billion, but said staff addressed the issue and treated the water to safe standards.

An independent evaluation of CRRUA's operations found the utility's water rates were too small to effectively hire people needed to operate water treatment. The audit also found that the utility's staff were not trained on best practices for some of the chemical treatment procedures, and that significant upgrades and repairs are needed to water



treatment plants.

CRRUA raised its water rates in July, five years after it passed a plan that was never put in place by its staff.

The water utility also announced that it is using \$440,000 to replace a filter in an arsenic treatment plant and that it has addressed 70 percent of the 58 infractions laid out by state regulators after a review in late 2023.

The next public meeting will be Sept. 16.

But one thing residents said was at the top of the list: more public meetings.

José Saldana, an electrical engineer living in Sunland Park, said he was hopeful the investigation would spur state agencies to reckon with continued mistrust of CRRUA.

"People have known we have bad-quality water for years, decades," he said.

Saldana said the company's communication strategy of using social media excludes a lot of the

older residents, and said that recent cancellations of the board's regular meetings and use of special meetings was making it difficult for the commu-

nity to attend.

He wants a broader discussion about the city of Sunland Park and Doña Ana County pausing the rate increases, or finding

a different water company to operate the utility.

"Hire another company to gain the respect and trust again and not increase water bills until they fix the issues," he said.

After Source NM inquiries, the New Mexico Environment Department announced a tentatively scheduled public meeting for Sept. 16 for concerns

State asks city for docs pertaining to city manager selection

BULLETIN REPORT

The New Mexico Department of Justice, which houses the state Attorney General, is investigating possible violations of the state's Open Meetings Act in the process of selecting a city manager after Ifo Pili announced his resignation in February.

The investigation stems from concerns raised by the Las Cruces Bulletin in March, based on the city's news releases and comments from officials suggesting city council members took action on public business outside of open session.

DOJ investigators informed the city in an Aug. 30 letter that "City Council may have decided outside of a public meeting to limit the scope of the city manager search to only internal candidates rather than a national search." Further, the DOJ is looking into evidence the council took action in closed session to select finalists for the job, and then to make its final selection and agree to contract terms in another closed session, while the law requires actions discussed in closed session to be taken before the public.

The DOJ's government counsel and accountability division requested the city provide further documentation about the selection process, copies of internal written communications and meeting notices. It requested a response from the city within seven days.

Responding to queries from the Bulletin, the city has maintained it complied with the Open Meetings Act. The New Mexico Foundation for Open Government and the Bulletin have alleged that a "rolling quorum," in which elected officers discuss business outside of a properly noticed meeting, appeared to take place before the council voted, in open session, to approve Ikani Taumoepeau's selection as city manager on April 1.

vide that documentation.

The city and county outlined their demands in a news release and breach notice sent to MMC. Those demands are:

- Provide all documents related to requests made for expanded care between 2018 and 2024.
- Provide all documents related to Memorial Medical Center's denial of requests for expanded care services in the same timeframe.
- Provide all documents relating to annual capital expenditures concerning the hospital's operation.
- Provide all reports on the costs of expanded care services between 2018 and 2024.
- Develop an annual report describing the fulfillment of the lessee's obligations under the lease by September 30, 2024.
- Provide all annual reports describing the fulfillment of the lessee's obligation under the lease developed for 2018 through 2024.

- Provide a detailed outline of its plan to remedy the defaults identified regarding the denial of expanded care services within 30 days or explain why it cannot do so within 30 days.

When asked how the city and county would respond if MMC disputed the allegations, Douglas said the government was focused on finding common ground with MMC but was willing to pursue more legal action if necessary.

"We're nowhere close to the finish line, but it is an important step forward," Douglas said.

In a statement, the hospital responded: "Memorial Medical Center received the notice of breach from the City of Las Cruces late yesterday. We believe we are compliant and have not breached the terms of the lease and asset purchase agreements and are responding in accordance with the obligations outlined in both. Our hospital is committed to a positive partnership with the City of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County and working together to build a healthier community, today and into the future. We will continue collaborating with the City and County to identify and resolve any areas of concern as quickly as possible."

Yolanda Diaz, founder of CARE Las Cruces, a nonprofit that receives money from the city to help patients pay for care, has been calling for an investigation into MMC for years. She came to the news conference with several other women who raised concerns about MMC.

"Today is a necessary step," Diaz said. "It's a legal step. It's in the lease that they had to get them notice, so they've complied with that, and that's a positive thing."

Why now?

The speakers addressed the question of "why now" in their opening remarks, a question reporters asked three times.

Bencomo said that the government had taken a

"disempowered approach" to MMC.

"Truthfully, at one point it used to feel like, 'what could city council really do about our very broken for-profit healthcare system?' It all felt too big, and I thought that's what this conversation was about. But by disempowering our governing body, we disempowered our community, and we disempowered patients' voices," Bencomo said.

For Diaz, it comes down to new leadership in the county and city.

"We have a new city manager, we had a new interim county manager, we have a new attorney. And I believe that is a very positive move, because we know that the previous leadership all chose to not take the step forward to this," Diaz said.

Manuel Sanchez, a Doña Ana County commissioner, pointed out that smaller steps have been taken since 2019, when MMC sought to revise its lease. But Sanchez also acknowledged that the NBC News article, and the slew of concerned residents who came forward since its publication, broke the dam.

Sanchez also said Harris and MMC's lack of answers in the article's immediate aftermath forced the county and city's hand.

"I believe this action by the city of Las Cruces, and us (the county) in partnership with them, will help get us some of these answers so that we have a better understanding of what's going on with Memorial Medical Center," Sanchez said.

about CRRUA’s water.

“We had not announced that date yet because we generally post such dates closer to the day of the meeting,” said Drew Goretzka, an environment department spokesperson.

Daisy Maldonado, an organizer with nonprofit Empowerment Congress of Doña Ana County, said she understands why the board might be hesitant to hold town hall meetings.

“Essentially, they’re not the folks who are ultimately responsible for past transgressions,” she said. “However, they are tasked to repair what has happened in the past – that’s the reason to show the community that they’re trying to rebuild the trust and reputation of services.”

She said holding meetings in-person is crucial to avoiding rumors and offers the chance for the public to directly ask questions.

Emails, phone calls and a text message requesting comment from CRRUA spokesperson Udell Vigil went unreturned Thurs-

day.

Emails and calls to Mayor of Sunland Park, Javier Perea, who chairs CRRUA’s board, also went unreturned. A city employee said Perea was out of town and would return to the office after the Labor Day weekend on Tuesday, Sept. 3.

Saldana and Vivian Fuller, from Santa Teresa, both spoke at the wide-ranging town hall Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham held on July 25, asking for state agencies to hold informational meetings, and asked for a delay in paying higher rates until people could trust CRRUA’s water quality.

Lujan Grisham said water costs are expected to rise with the scarcity and costs to treat water, and also said it would take time to address the longstanding issues at CRRUA. She promised Sunland Park and Santa Teresa residents that state environment and health agencies would host a public meeting.

“We’ve been out there but we’re not communicating with residents, it’s clear to me that we’re not doing the job we should do,” Lujan Grisham said at the event in July.

Adventures with A.C.E.S.

It's been a busy 2023-24 for Doña Ana County ACO * Codes Enforcement, aka "A.C.E.S."

A.C.E.S. ventures took them all over, traveling many of the 3,814 square miles that make up the county.

Their travels took them to Tortugas, Berino, Rodey, Anthony, Chamberino and Organ, where A.C.E.S. experts educated citizens on the jobs, duties and responsibilities of animal control and codes. They also spread the word about illegal dumping and the ways it can be reported. (For the record, you can get the "No Throw" app, or call 877-NO-THROW.)

In those

communities, A.C.E.S. visited 452 homes, talking with citizens about violations and following up on previous visits.

A.C.E.S. got involved with the area's Spay and Neuter Action Program (SNAP), to help reduce the number of stray and unwanted animals in the county.

A.C.E.S. issued 1,199 vouchers, from which 770 spay/neuter procedures were performed. In case you're wondering about the breakdown, it was 486 dogs and 284 cats.

In addition, 242 microchips were provided, greatly improving the chances of finding a

Perhaps A.C.E.S. biggest haul came with efforts for Clean-up with Carlos Days.

In this project, the focus was on getting rid of unwanted trash and old tires. Old tires can be breeding grounds for pesky, and sometimes dangerous, mosquitoes. So, for every old tire collected, many colonies of mosquitoes are eliminated.

Pound by pound, here is the community breakdown on what was collected:

- Tortugas – **7,120** lbs. of trash; 3,800 lbs. of tires
- Berino – **8,380** lbs. of trash; **6,260** lbs. of tires
- Rodey – **10,120** lbs. of trash; **5,400** lbs. of tires
- Anthony – **8,746** lbs. of trash; **5,560** lbs. of tires
- Chamberino – **7,980** lbs. of trash
- Organ – **4,860** lbs. of trash; **1,980** lbs. of tires

That's a grand total for all events of 80,066 pounds of trash and 39,720 pounds of tires.



NMSU presidential finalists to visit campus

The five finalists for New Mexico State University's presidential search will visit the NMSU campus the week of Sept. 9 for day-long interviews with staff, faculty and the public.

Each finalist will be given a day to meet and greet various groups before the Board of Regents decides to appoint one of them as NMSU's top executive officer later this year.

"The expansion of our forum schedule to include a community forum in the evening is designed to increase your opportunities to hear from each candidate," said regent chair Ammu Devasthali in a news release.

Each candidate will have the following schedule on their designated day.

- Faculty and Staff Forum: 10 to 10:50 a.m., Corbett Center Auditorium

Arsenio Romero resigns from PED to pursue NMSU job

New Mexico's public education secretary, Arsenio Romero, attended the Albuquerque Public Schools' superintendent's "state of the district speech" on Wednesday, posting photographs on social media from his visit including a picture of himself with state lawmaker.

At some point during the same day, he handed Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham his resignation from the cabinet position he has held since February 2023.

A press release from the governor's office linked the resignation to Romero's position as a finalist for the presidency of New Mexico State University, and thanked Romero for his service. The resignation took effect immediately.

The list of five finalists at NMSU had been announced less than two weeks prior, and Romero, a graduate and former

NMSU regent, was the only New Mexico candidate on the list.

The governor's spokesperson, Michael Coleman, confirmed that link when he told the Albuquerque Journal, "Gov. Lujan Grisham gave Secretary Romero a choice to either resign and continue pursuing the NMSU position or stay on the job and withdraw his candidacy at NMSU."

Romero was the fourth education secretary to serve under Lujan Grisham. The Belen native began his education career as a classroom teacher in the Las Cruces Public Schools, moving on to administrative positions at LCPS and the Roswell Independent School District before serving as superintendent of the Deming Public Schools and the Los Lunas Schools. He served on NMSU's board of regents from 2020 to 2023.

NMSU's board of regents are not set to announce their selection for the university's next president until sometime in September. This is the second slate of finalists for the position that has been vacant since April 2023, when Chancellor Dan Arvizu departed. The regents passed on the first list of finalists and restarted the executive search nearly six months ago. Currently, the university is led by interim president Mónica Torres.

County officials provide an update on Crisis Triage Center reopening

The Crisis Triage Center is on track to reopen within a few months if everything goes according to plan, based on a presentation from the Doña Ana County Health and Human Services Department.

The center closed on Jan. 31 after the county parted ways with the service provider, RI International. RI, a nonprofit health care provider, asked the county for more money to cover a gap in funding, but the county denied the request.

Advocates say the Crisis Triage Center is an important piece to providing mental health services to people in crisis by allowing them a safe place to receive treatment.

However, police agencies have

raised concerns about the legality of doing so, especially regarding people who do not want to go to the center. The funding model proposed by RI relied on police agencies bringing people having a crisis to the facility.

After opening in 2021, the CTC could not reach a sustainable number of clients during its first round of operation, according to reports made to the county.

The county promised to reopen the center after it closed.

Jamie Michael, the director of the Doña Ana County Health and Human Services Department, told the Board of County Commissioners on Aug. 27 that work on that is well underway.

“In recent weeks, there’s been some significant progress,” Michael said.

Michael said Summit Behav-

ioral Health, a Tennessee-based firm that owns PEAK Behavioral Health, has taken over as the center’s new operator.

Michael said Summit has hired most of the necessary staff to reopen, including an executive director. She said

Summit had also submitted a request to be licensed by the state Department of Health and was awaiting a response.

“It’s hard to predict if there’s going to be some back and forth,” Michael said referring to the licensing process.

Michael also said she was pleased several of the staff from the last iteration of the Center will be returning when it reopens, and that the Center would rely on the same peer support and “no wrong door” model of behavioral health care.

“We’re going to be back on track to provide the best care,” she said.

The county agreed to pay \$1,401,839 to help the initial start-up and \$2,868,988 yearly to sustain the Crisis Triage Center in the future.

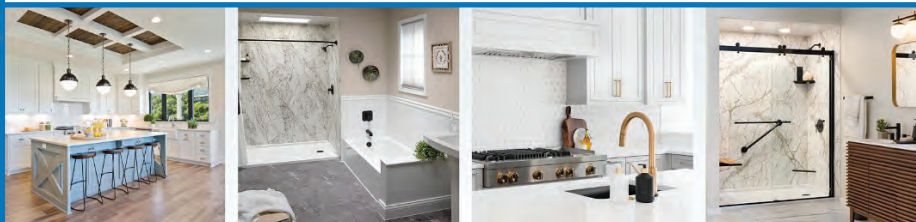

City moves Inspector General position

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously to shuffle the inspector general position so that the office now reports to the city manager instead of the city attorney.

The vote on Sept. 3 empowers the inspector general to be more independent and effective, according to City Attorney Brad Douglas.

“In my opinion, it’s not appropriate that (the inspector general) reports to me,” Douglas said. “I should be advising him and assisting him when requested, but if this passes... he or she will report solely to the city manager.”

The same vote, which required repeal and replacement of an ordinance, also removed

the threat of criminal penalties for not complying with an investigation, added whistleblower protections and defined terms including “fraud” and “waste.”

“The overall goal is to remove ambiguity from the existing ordinance,” Douglas said.

Councilor Johana Bencomo said she was glad that the inspector general would now report to the city manager, but questioned what would happen if the city manager was the investigation’s target.

Douglas acknowledged that a situation like that would create a conflict of interest, and that the city would rely on its ethics enforcement board to conduct the investigation.

The city first hired Charles Tucker as inspector general in 2023 as one of the final reforms

following the publication of an investigation into \$1.7 million in mishandled city funds known as the McHard report, for the accounting firm that conducted the probe.

In 2020, an investigation into Visit Las Cruces, the city’s tourism department, said “there (was) probable cause to believe that criminal violations have occurred” regarding the actions of former economic development director Phil San Filippo, former city manager Stuart Ed and restaurateur and realtor Marci Dickerson.

The report alleged that San Filippo illegally steered city business to Dickerson and made dozens of illegal donations to non-profits and charities. San Filippo, who was fired from his city position, denied all wrongdoing, as did Ed

(who left the city in 2019) and Dickerson. The three also said they had not been involved in the investigation. No criminal charges were filed in connection with the report’s findings.

The report said the city was unable to account for \$1,674,624 in taxpayer money over a four-year period.

Four years later, new city managers, attorneys, economic development staff and others have been hired. The city has also implemented other financial checks to mitigate the chance of a similar incident.

Another significant change to the city included hiring an inspector general, tasked with investigating municipal matters involving elected or appointed officials, city employees, municipal agencies and instrumentalities, contractors,

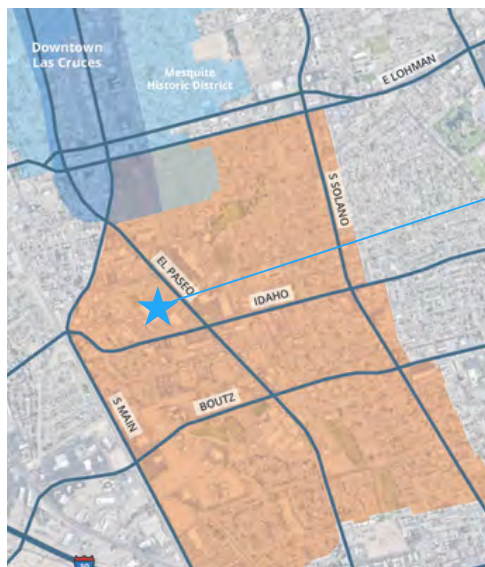
subcontractors and other parties doing business with the city or receiving city funds, according to the city’s ordinances.

The inspector general does not investigate criminal acts but can refer those incidents to the police if discovered.

By ordinance, the city is required to have an inspector general. The same ordinance also reprioritized filling an oversight committee, another piece of Las Cruces’ accountability structure. Most of the council’s questions about the changes focused on this piece.

The oversight committee, staffed by auditing and finance professionals with two city councilors as non-voting members, would receive reports from the inspector general and make recommendations about policy changes.

Police say domestic violence leaves one dead and one jailed

A Las Cruces woman remains in jail after police said she fatally stabbed her partner's brother last week.

Selena Carrillo, 28, is charged with an open count of murder and misdemeanor battery against a household member. Police say she stabbed Michael Mata, 30, to death on Aug. 29 at their home on the 1900 block of Buchanan Avenue at the conclusion of a domestic violence flurry.

According to an affidavit, Carrillo told police that she'd been on a drinking binge for several days when she'd gotten into an argument with her girlfriend the morning of Aug. 29.

The girlfriend confirmed this, according to the affidavit, and added that Carrillo had beaten her at some point that morning. The affidavit noted that she had visible injuries when she spoke with the police.

The girlfriend said that Carrillo left the house they both shared with Mata after the fight but returned a short time later.

Fearing for her safety, the girlfriend hid from Carrillo inside Mata's room with Mata inside, the affidavit continued. She told Mata not to open the door when Carrillo approached. But he did, and a fight between Mata and Carrillo ensued.

When the girlfriend came out, she discovered Mata lying on the floor near a bloody knife and that Carrillo was gone. The girlfriend was later taken to a local hospital to be treated for her wounds.

Police arrested Carrillo a short time later. She was on foot, the affidavit said, wearing a shirt and shoes covered in blood and matching a description provided by a neighbor.

Carrillo did not confess to the killing in the affidavit but did say that she "did something very bad and deserved to rot in jail forever."

The affidavit also notes that Carrillo admitted she

and her girlfriend had gotten into physical fights before and that Mata would intervene. Carrillo did not say whether that was the case this time.

Court records also show one pending case against Carrillo involving domestic violence allegations. Carrillo was on probation at the time of her arrest for a non-domestic violence-related conviction.

Those factors will play a vital role in the pretrial detention hearing to come after prosecutors requested that a judge hold her in jail without bond on Aug. 30. To make that happen, prosecutors must prove that Carrillo is dangerous and that no conditions of release – such as an ankle monitor or cash bond – can protect the public.

That hearing has yet to be scheduled as of this article's writing. Carrillo's attorney could not be reached for comment.

Sunland Park needs new water utility

Residents of Sunland Park and Santa Teresa weren't informed when arsenic treatment plants for their water were shut down, exposing them to dangerous health risks. Now, those same residents are being slammed with outrageous monthly bills by the public utility that allowed the water to become contaminated.

Finally, their calls for help are being heard. Last week, the state auditor's office announced it had started an investigation into the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority, based on concerns raised by residents and the state Environment Department. State Auditor Joseph Maestas said his office is in regular communications with both the Environment Department and

state Justice Department about CRRUA.

"It would be beyond the remit of any agency other than the court to require CRRUA to provide equitable relief, but the OSA will make every effort to audit CRRUA's compliance with all applicable laws and regulations," he said in a letter to residents.

The arsenic levels in the water occur naturally, requiring constant treatment for it to be safe, explained Daisy Maldonado of the Empowerment Congress, which is working with residents to address the problem.

Under state law, a utility gets a three-year reprieve from testing if every test

for a year meets state standards, Maldonado said.

CRRUA met that standard in 2019, just in time for the global pandemic.

Whatever the reason, arsenic treatment plants were shut down without notification to

consumers for more than a year. When CRRUA was required to begin testing again, the water was well over the acceptable levels for arsenic.

Residents noticed the water had become discolored, and some stopped drinking it. But that wasn't an option for many living in the impoverished community. Now, they are dealing with health issues including hair loss, skin problems and cancer.

And to top it all off, CRRUA raised its rates in July so it can now comply with state standards. Residents who had been paying \$80 to \$100 a month were hit with water bills in the thousands of dollars, Maldonado said.

It's the kind of outrage that would not be allowed in more affluent communities. But sadly, it is all too familiar in Sunland Park.

CRRUA was formed in 2009 when the city of Sunland Park signed a joint powers agreement with Doña Ana County to create the new water provider. It was a way for both the city and county to wash their hands of the problem by creating a new governing body that is accountable to – I'm not sure.

The investigation by the

state auditor may be the first time CRRUA is truly held to account. It will be interesting to see what they find. Was this a situation where water rates and other sources of funding simply weren't enough to keep up with needed repairs? Or was there waste, fraud and abuse?

Either way, there is no excuse for not informing residents of the decision to discontinue treatment for arsenic. CRRUA has obliterated the bond of trust it may once have had with consumers, and that will never be restored. The residents of Sunland Park and Santa Teresa need a new water provider who they can rely on.

Righting the ship

Dear Editor,

Let's talk about one of the most impactful legislative actions in New Mexico in the last decade: the constitutional amendment to significantly alter pretrial release conditions of defendants accused of a crime, commonly known as bail reform. It was written under the guise of fair treatment of defendants that may be unable to pay for their bail. It passed in

2016 with overwhelming support from voters.

But the consequences have been catastrophic for our legal system. The amendment made it much more difficult for even felony offenders to be kept in jail awaiting trial for their offenses. Violent criminals are released pending trial, free to victimize others within our community over and over again.

As we saw during the special legislative session in July, attempts to create

additional laws to counteract the negative connotations of the amendment are met with ire and dismissed outright by a majority of legislators. Even simple, thoughtful ordinances like the shopping cart ordinance in Las Cruces, written to help even those that have committed a crime by stealing the cart in the first place, were met with huge opposition and barely passed. If you watch the city council meeting on Aug. 5,

the irrational arguments against the ordinance and others show the complete unwillingness of some to come off of the extreme political stance they feel they must abide by.

The most logical answer to the issues we see with violent and property crimes in our city and state is to repeal the constitutional amendment that was the catalyst. But if even small attempts to right this ship are met with such profound op-

position, how can we ever hope to steer away from this iceberg of extreme political stances, bordering on delusion? We cannot continue to sacrifice the safety and security of law-abiding citizens by taking such an extremely lenient approach to violent criminals who take advantage of our legal system and our blind empathy.

Almost \$6 billion in capital outlay left on table

As we've reported periodically over the years, New Mexico has one of the weirdest ways of dedicating public money toward brick-and-mortar projects. One of the consequences of its almost entirely unique approach to "capital outlay" is a portion of the public dollars sits unspent for years.

The Legislature's budget arm, the Legislative Finance Committee, is out with its latest report tracking how big that unspent pile is. The first sentence of the report sums up the situation: As of June, "outstanding capital outlay balances totaled an estimated

\$5.9 billion across roughly 5,600 projects."

That's a lot of money. To those of us who follow how public dollars are spent — New Mexico In Depth has followed how money is spent on brick-and-mortar projects on and off for nearly a decade — the figure is not surprising. Public dollars sitting unspent is a chronic problem for New Mexico.

To be fair, nearly a quarter of the \$5.9 billion is money authorized during this year's legislative session. It takes time to spend money on big construction projects and other infrastructure. But that still leaves more than \$4.5 billion that's unspent from previous years.

What's most eye-catching in that pot of \$4.5 billion is the list involving projects where, according to the Legislative Finance Committee, there is "no activity, no or minimal reporting ... significant challenges or delays, or significant unspent funds." That list totals \$347 million unspent as of June (out of \$402 million), the Legislative Finance Committee says.

The list of projects with large unspent balances includes \$4.75 million of the \$4.95 million state lawmakers appropriated in 2021 for a sports stadium and multipurpose center in Albuquerque. As you might recall, Albuquerque voters defeated a \$50 million bond

to help pay for a stadium that the city's soccer team, New Mexico United, would use. That killed the need for the state money for the stadium.

But there is a resurrected campaign to build a stadium at the Albuquerque Balloon Fiesta Park. My sense is that the \$4.7 million unspent for an Albuquerque stadium might be appropriated for that project if it is successful.

Following how a state spends money on brick-and-mortar projects might make most people's eyes glaze over. But not me. In a sense, the spending is akin to a hidden budget involving public dollars that most don't think about much.

I was fortunate in that I had already reported on another state's regimen for spending public dollars on brick-and-mortar projects before moving to New Mexico. That state's process wasn't perfect and room for corruption or influence peddling was abundant. But how the state spent money was much more systematic — rational is a word economists might use in this situation. It gave me something to compare New Mexico's process to. And New Mexico's way of spending public dollars on brick-and-mortar projects didn't seem all that well planned or thought out.

As one national expert told us in March 2015, "It

certainly wouldn't be in the textbooks about how to do capital improvement planning. In fact, it would be the illustration about how not to do capital improvement planning."

In the decade since New Mexico In Depth published that particular article, New Mexico state lawmakers have begun disclosing which projects they ask the state to appropriate money for. Who knows? If New Mexico's policy makers keep reforming the way they spend money on brick-and-mortar projects, a decade from now those of us who follow the spending may write that the system is much more systematic or, rational, as economists might say.

At Black Box, 'SEASCAPE'

The No Strings Theatre Company made its debut in 2000 with a production of Edward Albee's "Seascape," a play dear to artistic director Ceil Herman's heart. On the opening night of her new revival, 24 years later, Herman told the audience, "Anyone in a relationship needs to see this play."

Albee's middle plays regularly explore the complex dynamics of erotic entanglement, power struggles, loneliness and disappointment in marriage and aging. This is not, however, reminiscent of the verbal blood-letting in Albee's most famous play, "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?"

"Seascape," which opened on Broadway in 1975, netted the playwright's second Pulitzer and stands up after nearly 50 years thanks to a timeless setting, an allegorical style suggestive of a fable for adults and psychological themes that remain poignant in a time of digital media and climate change. Only the lack of a Kindle or Ins-

tagram selfie dates the scene.

Nancy and Charlie are a couple sitting on a beach as they come to grips with retirement, senior citizenship and a new chapter in their marriage and individual lives. Charlie is doing his best to sink into the warm sand on the side of a dune, his feet clad in outdoor slippers, proclaiming his desire to do nothing; Nancy is barefoot, pacing the shore as she gazes over the horizon longing to explore

more, even suggesting that they become nomads roaming from one seaside to the next.

Played by Conda Douglas and Bruce Demeree, a married couple new to Las Cruces, Nancy and Charlie sort through their past and contemplate their future and feelings for each other with conflicting drives. Yet Demeree's Charlie comes to life, springing to his feet, when he recalls his more adventurous youth, when he would sink

himself and explore life underwater.

These less-experienced actors carry a first act that lives in language, stories and ideas with little physical action and passages of dense text. There is more humor to be found in Charlie's volatility and Nancy's dual affections and grudges. The performance could benefit from a more brisk pace and fuller exploration of the characters' contradictions; but the perform-

swims again

ers' personal charm and Albee's dexterity carry us along to the entrance, at the end of the act, of a second couple who turns things upside down: A pair of human-sized sea creatures venturing onto land for the first time.

In costumes and makeup de-

signed by Robert “Bobcat” Young and Autumn Gieb, Bob Alvarez and Gieb portray a curious, naturally guarded migrant couple who no longer feel they belong in their old habitat, pushing their way into a new environment rather than settling. In a way, they are the true protagonists in a play about the necessity of living and evolving, and it is through their strange eyes we regard Nancy and Charlie’s sometimes confused explanations of human customs and what it means to love.

Since that first production in 2000, No Strings has offered amateur theatre unafraid to tackle unconventional scripts and plays tricky to stage, with simple

set designs, adaptable seating and the richness of our local talent pool. This “Seascape” manages, at least, to open one of Albee’s funnier and more optimistic, yet overlooked plays for us at a time it can be seen in a new light, its pretty scales reflecting our time’s perplexity about adaptation, migration and the fate of the human.

“Seascape” runs through Sept. 15 at the Black Box Theatre, 430 N. Main Street. Performance times include a 7 p.m. performance on Thursday, Sept. 12; 8 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays; and 2:30 p.m. Sunday performances on Sept. 8 and 15. Admission prices range from \$12-18. Ticketing and further information are available at 575-523-1223 or online at no-strings.org.

The Mad Hatter Gallery’s debut exhibit, beginning Sept. 6, will be “Une Vie,” a showing of acid paintings by Salome Ali Jaffe.

Q: Will "The Drew Barrymore Show" be continuing for the new TV season?

A: It is. The syndicated, CBS-distributed weekday talk show actually got an early renewal for a fifth round last January, not long after it began its fourth stanza, which was delayed — as so many programs were — by the writers' and actors' strikes. (Barrymore had been enmeshed in a controversy over that situation, since she had planned to put her program back in

production while the strikes were ongoing, but she reversed those plans, though a couple of her writers ultimately left.) In fact, the show already has been renewed for a sixth year, which will take it through the 2025-26 season.

Though she's sometimes criticized over how close she gets to her guests, literally as well as figuratively, the effusive Barrymore's Daytime Emmy-winning show is a popular stop for celebrities ... particularly those she has a personal connection to, often from her acting and producing careers, such as Adam Sandler, Cameron Diaz and Jimmy Fallon (Fallon's wife, Nancy Juvonen, is Barrymore's partner in the company Flower Films).

In some cases, Barrymore has been landing daytime-exclusive interviews, such as the session she had early this

year with the principal female cast of the FX drama "Feud: Capote vs. The Swans" (which included Naomi Watts, Diane Lane and Demi Moore). The host also had a much-reported on-air conversation with Vice President, and current presidential candidate, Kamala Harris.

Another aspect that has likely helped "The Drew Barrymore Show" is the format it's had since its third season, which gives a station the flexibility to run it as two self-contained half-hours, either adjacent to each other or in different parts of the programming day. That was likely a help to some "Drew"-carrying NBC affiliates during the recent Paris Olympics, when the network's usual weekday schedule was altered and turned local time periods over to stations that normally didn't have those to have to fill.

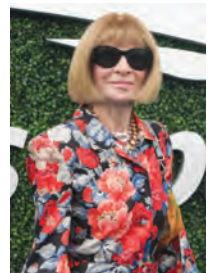
"How to Die Alone" - Season 1 (Sept. 13)

New Mexicans must interview for SNAP food and TANF aid

Anyone who qualifies to receive public food or cash aid will need to plan time for an interview if they want to renew benefits.

As of Sept. 1, the New Mexico Health Care Authority requires people who receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (or SNAP) benefits to complete an interview

in-person or over the phone to continue getting support from the federal food program.

This will also be the same for cash assistance that comes from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), a program cited for helping New Mexicans cover costs for transportation, schools costs and utility payments.

According to a 2022 Legislative Finance Com-

mittee report, more than 60 percent of people in the state who qualified for the cash assistance program did not receive it.

Around 25 percent of the state receives SNAP benefits, the highest rate in the country.

A month later, on Oct. 1, anyone who's looking to start a new application process to get on the cash assistance or food aid programs will also have to

complete an interview.

These changes come in part due to a waiver lifted by the federal government, according to the New Mexico Health Care Authority.

People can renew or apply for new aid without having to go through an interview as a means to help under protections when the U.S. government still had a public health emergency for SARS-

CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19.

The Health Care Authority said people who get food or cash aid should get a text message or letter in the mail 45 days before they need to renew and schedule an appointment.

Interviews can be conducted over the phone or at any Income Support Division Office in the state.

Anyone can check the status of their SNAP now

by visiting their benefits page online or check in at a local office. The Health Care Authority said people can also call 800-283-4465 to set up an interview, check on the status or even apply for new benefits.

The phone line should be open between 7 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., Monday-Friday.

The state must provide interpreters for non-English speakers.

Sacred Garden dispensary closing, cites market saturation

Customers of one of the oldest cannabis dispensaries in Las Cruces were dismayed last week to find signs announcing it was going out of business and holding liquidation sales.

Sacred Garden Las Cruces is closing its doors after Sept. 20, following nearly seven years of operation, along with the parent company founded as a medical cannabis provider in 2010 by Zeke Shortes of Santa Fe.

Sacred Garden is a vertically-integrated operation, “seed to sale,” meaning the company is involved in growing the plant, manufacturing canna-

bis products, distributing and selling them through its seven dispensaries around the state, including one near downtown Las Cruces and one in Sunland Park.

Carla Padilla, manager of the Las Cruces shop, attributed the closure to a crowded marketplace that exploded after New Mexico legalized cannabis for non-medical adult use in 2021, followed by the opening in 2022 of a state-regulated commercial market with no cap on licenses for cannabis producers or retailers.

“Right now, there’s just so much competition, the market is so overly saturated, that we’re just not making money,” Padilla

told the Las Cruces Bulletin.

Padilla started work at Sacred Garden as a budtender in 2018 and worked her way up to store manager, but says she may leave the industry altogether.

In the meantime, the store has already begun reducing staff and cutting hours for those who remain as it begins saying farewell to longtime customers, particularly patients enrolled in New Mexico’s medical cannabis program since before recreational use was legalized in the state.

“We developed this rapport with all of our customers and patients, and we’re really well-known in the community for helping our elderly that are more, you know, medically based,” she said. “Those are the ones that really I fear for, that people aren’t going to give the same compassion and care, and I just hope that they do – that

they find somewhere that treats them good and listens to their needs.”

The Bulletin reached out to the Sacred Garden parent company in Santa Fe, which did not respond by press time.

More retailers share shrinking market

Concerns for protecting access and affordability for medical cannabis patients have been a concern voiced by patients and producers alike since before the legislature approved recreational use during a 2021 special session. Medical cannabis was legalized in 2007 and

administered through a state-operated enrollment program. When New Mexico opened the gates to recreational use, the state's regulatory agency, the Cannabis Control Division, took on the role of reporting revenues for the new industry that had state officials cheering.

Cumulative sales topped \$1 billion in March of this year. Yet prices have remained high compared to the unregulated or "illicit" market, refuting one of the arguments in favor of legalization; and enrollment in the medical program has declined steadily.

According to CCD data, medical sales have slowly trended downward since the opening of the

recreational market, and the trend in monthly Las Cruces sales of medical product mirrors the trend: From \$1.6 million in April 2022 to \$926,000 in July 2024, with more retailers than ever sharing a diminishing market.

"We are definitely seeing more than a handful of businesses struggling in the industry and looking at possible closure due to the vast amount of competition for cannabis retailers," said Nicole Fuchs of the Southwest Cannabis Trade Association.

As a consultant working with new entrants to the industry, Fuchs said the field favors the wealthier operators: "Cannabis businesses, especially retail, require a lot of capital inputs to get through the startup phase

and remain operational." While New Mexico may boast of lower barriers and fees for getting into the market, Fuchs said the costs of operation plus the excise tax for adult-use cannabis make it "a system where it's survival of the ones with the most money."

Ben Lewinger of the New Mexico Cannabis Chamber of Commerce in Albuquerque acknowledged that the high number of entrants to the industry made it highly competitive and that a market correction was inevitable as operators find their revenue simply won't cover the cost of doing business. Even so, he said others, including some smaller locally-held operations, are "doing just fine."

He also pointed to signs

that some of the newer operators had the advantage of viewing what has happened over the first two and a half years of New Mexico's marketplace.

"You have these folks who have seen what's happened with the market, and they're maybe better capitalized, they have a better strategy, a better business model, who are going to open retail while all these other locations are closing – and some of them will be successful."

To the criticism of unlimited licenses for qualifying applicants, Lewinger recalled the process of legalization in 2021. Low barriers to enter the marketplace were viewed by lawmakers and his chamber as an essential measure on social justice

grounds, yet the original version of cannabis bill – which did not survive the regular session – had allowed regulators to temporarily "throttle" new licenses to head off market saturation and maintain equilibrium.

"That language was taken out ... in the special session," Lewinger said. "It's something the (Cannabis Chamber) has tried to add back in each legislative session since then, and it's one of our top priorities still."

Sacred Garden took the state's Taxation and Revenue Department to court to challenge taxation of medical cannabis, leading the state Supreme Court to rule in 2022 that enrolled patients should not have to pay gross receipts taxes on their medicine, since medical prescrip-

tions are shielded from GRT under the law, in a win for medical cannabis providers.

Shortly after that, Sacred Garden was back in court, fighting a claim by state regulators that it had violated public health standards. Ultimately, Shortes would tell the Santa Fe Reporter in 2023, the dispute cost Sacred Garden \$1 million in sales and he predicted it would take "a couple of years to recover."

In Las Cruces, as Padilla greeted customers on Sept. 3, she said it was an untenable competitive market that ultimately brought Sacred Garden down.

"I think that, sadly, a bunch more dispensaries, you'll see go down, because it's just a really tough market."

City claws back economic incentive as \$30 million warehouse folds

BULLETIN REPORT

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously to take back \$600,000 in economic incentives from a cold storage company after the company failed to produce promised jobs.

Artico Cold Management, a Chicago-based warehousing firm, was awarded \$600,000 in Local Economic Development Act dollars in 2022 to

build a 120,000-square-foot cold storage warehouse in Las Cruces.

The state Economic Development Department touted the investment as a potential \$30 million boon to Las Cruces that would bring at least 60 jobs. The facility would have been in the Las Cruces Industrial Park near the municipal airport.

Artico Cold Management received about \$1 million in promised in-

centives from the City of Las Cruces and El Paso Electric.

Documents presented to the council did not specify why Artico could not build its warehouse.

“Due to previously unforeseen financial circumstances, Artico Cold Storage will not be moving forward with their plans for a new facility at the Las Cruces Innovation and Industrial Park and have requested to cancel

the LEDA project,” city records said.

“It was internal in nature and stemmed from a system upgrade that massively disrupted our operations. We are still recovering,” Artico CEO Richard Taveras told the Las Cruces Bulletin in an email.

LEDA allows the government to make public investments in private business. The act allows Las Cruces to promise state funds to private businesses in exchange for job creation or other community benefits. Las Cruces oversees the money and ensures that the business upholds its promises.

City to host meeting on controversial shopping cart ordinance

BULLETIN REPORT

The city of Las Cruces announced a meeting aimed at helping businesses comply with the controversial shopping cart ordinance passed in early August.

The ordinance hopes to force businesses to take better care of shopping carts by requiring them to submit plans to the city. These plans must include what steps the business is taking to ensure carts stay on the property.

The same ordinance also criminalizes using the cart outside of the business's property, an activity often associated with the activities of Las Cruces' unhoused residents.

The ordinance passed on a 4-3 vote of the Las Cruces council on Aug. 5. Proponents said it was a key step in improving public safety outcomes, while op-

ponents said it was ineffective and unjustly targeted unhoused Las Cruces.

After it was passed, police said two Albertsons employees roved Las Cruces collecting shopping carts with the national chain's branding, leading them to reclaim a cart from an unhoused woman and leave her belongings strewn across a parking lot. No criminal charges were filed against the two employees.

The ordinance does not

require businesses to collect their property; they are just required to inform Las Cruces how they plan to protect their carts. Now, the city is looking to curtail that sort of behavior.

The meeting, scheduled for Sept. 10 at city hall, 700 N. Main Street, from 6 to 8 p.m., is meant to educate business owners and operators on their responsibility. It will also be live streamed on the city's YouTube page.

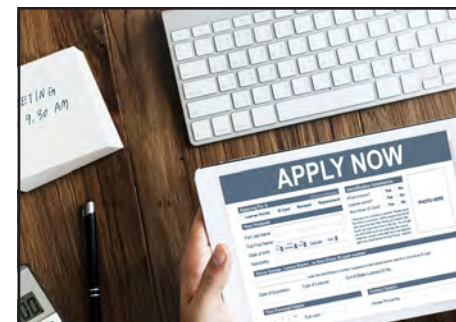
Doña Ana Community College announced a free career fair next week, to which the public is invited.

Details sparse as state police investigate fatal LCPD shooting

BULLETIN REPORT

Las Cruces police confirmed that a SWAT officer is on administrative leave following a deadly shooting in Otero County.

The shooting occurred on Aug. 29 after police said Wallace Gonzales, 41, fled from a New Mexico State Police traffic stop on U.S. Highway 54 near milepost 75. In a news release, police said the state police officer saw "multiple firearms on the dashboard of the vehicle" and that "Gonzales then made threatening statements that he was going to shoot the officer."

A chase ensued, ending at the White Sands Mall parking lot in Alamogordo with Gonzales barricading himself inside his car. For three hours, police said they tried to negotiate with Gonzales but were un-

successful.

At some point, LCPD SWAT became involved in the situation. Chief Jeremy Story told the Bulletin that LCPD SWAT regularly assists NMSP with tactical callouts such as SWAT situations.

"At some point during communication with Gonzales, gunfire was exchanged, and an LCPD SWAT officer fired at least one round from their department-issued rifle," the news release said, noting that police found Gonzales had a gun in each hand. "Once the weapons were secured, paramedics rendered aid, but Gonzales succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased on scene by the Office of the Medical Investigator. No officers were injured during this incident."

NMSP said they would investigate the incident

and refer their report to the 12th Judicial District Attorney once complete.

LCPD has implemented a practice of hosting news conferences following police shootings but elected not to hold one in this case.

"The difference in this case is that the (police shootings) occurred while assisting the NMSP on their callout outside of the city, and they are the sole investigating body," Story told the Bulletin in an email. "A press conference has been done when we are the primary agency (as a part of the Officer Involved Investigative Task Force) investigating the (police shooting), and we can ensure that we do not compromise the investigation. In this case, I do not want to interfere in State Police's investigation in any way."

Aggies recognized by Conference USA

New Mexico State University student athletes continue to win recognition from Conference USA in multiple sports.

Loma McNeese, a graduate student who reigns as 2023 Conference USA Player of the Year in women's soccer, took her third Offensive Player of the Week according to an announcement on Sept. 3. McNeese is the third Aggie to win Offensive Player of the Week in three consecutive weeks.

She recorded her second career brace against Pacific scoring back-to-back goals in the Aggies' 3-1 victory. McNeese also recorded the seventh game-winning goal of her career. McNeese recorded six shots with four on goal in that game. On the week McNeese played in 148 minutes. In her career to date, she has tallied 21 total goals and 14 assists on 63 shots on goal for NMSU.

This is the first time the Aggies have won a Conference USA Player of the

Week in three consecutive weeks, the university reported

Meanwhile, in CUSA's first 2024 volleyball weekly awards, junior Starr Williams was named Offensive Player of the Week after tallying a .560 hitting percentage in back-to-back matches over the weekend at the Georgia Tech Invitational.

"The redshirt junior outside hitter started the weekend with a dominant 14-kill, no-error performance in a win over Coastal Carolina," the

conference stated in a news release. "On Sunday, Williams recorded 16 kills, including a 10-kill third set in a 25-21 set win at No. 14 Georgia Tech. She also posted five blocks across the entire weekend."

NMSU added, "Williams was a CUSA All-Tournament Team and All-CUSA Preseason

NMSU men's basketball hazing leads to two more lawsuits

New Mexico State University faces two more lawsuits from athletes who played for the 2022-23 men's basketball team.

Bol Kuir, a former player, said the coaching staff and the university did nothing when he reported witnessing "fighting on and off the court," inappropriate touching of fellow teammates and players carrying guns.

Kuir also alleged he was kicked off the team and disenrolled from NMSU after visiting his family in

South Sudan.

"Kuir was not given the opportunity to oppose losing his place on the team or his scholarship," the lawsuit states. "He was not allowed to transfer elsewhere because he had been on scholarship with NMSU, and NMSU did little to help him become eligible elsewhere. He lost a year of collegiate play, and his career lost momentum."

A second lawsuit filed anonymously says that another player was assaulted by the same three players accused in other lawsuits.

"Throughout the fall

of 2022, a group of NMSU players led by Kim Aiken, Doctor Bradley, and Deshawndre Washington abused their positions of power and authority by forcibly subjecting other members of the program, including John Doe 3, to unwanted sexual assault and harassment," the lawsuit states.

NMSU has already settled an \$8 million lawsuit involving other players.

A spokesman for the university told the Bulletin, "NMSU does not comment on pending litigation."

Snedeker wins 25th Payne Stewart Award

On Aug. 27, the PGA Tour honored player Brandt Snedeker as the recipient of the Payne Stewart Award, presented by the Southern Company. Snedeker was the 25th recipient of the award founded in 2020. On Oct. 25, 1999 Stewart tragically died in an airplane crash, six months after winning the U.S. Open at Pinehurst No. 2, which was the signature win of his career.

The Payne Stewart Award is presented annually to a professional golfer who best exemplifies the unwavering values that defined Stewart's life: integrity, character, tradition, sportsmanship, commitment, generosity and charity.

Over the course of his 20+ year golfing career, Snedeker demonstrated all of those qualities, especially after 2012. Snedeker grew up in Nashville, Tenn. and attended Vanderbilt University. He turned pro in 2004 and played on what was then the Nationwide Tour and won twice, gaining his PGA tour card in 2007. That year, he was also named Rookie of the Year on the PGA Tour. Overall, Snedeker had nine PGA Tour wins, including his signature win of the FedEx Cup in 2012. Six years later he would shoot a 59 in the first round of the Wyn-

ham Championship en route to a win. He played on two Ryder Cup teams, in 2012 and 2016.

Snedeker's wife, Mandy, recalls, "(Brandt) always said his favorite golfer and the one he admired the most was Payne Stewart,"

even though he never met him. In 2012 Snedeker had his most memorable week at East Lake when he beat Rory McIlroy and Tiger Woods to the Tour Championship and the FedEx Cup. The \$10 million bonus that came with the Cup gave him and his wife the freedom to start The Snedeker

Foundation. The Foundation aids underprivileged children, with a strong emphasis on academic and athletic success. The organization achieves this through scholarship programs and partnering with other nonprofits focused on youth development. Snedeker has also partnered with the Korn Ferry Tour to operate the Simmons Bank Open for the Snedeker Foundation to be played September 12-15. Snedeker spends the week there interacting with the young pros. Due to the combination of his playing and his outgoing personality, Snedeker is universally regarded as one of the most popular players on tour with play-

ers, sponsors and fans.

One of the Snedeker Foundation's primary charities is "Our Kids Center," which has provided 24/7 crisis counseling and medical services to more than 30,000 children who have been victims of sexual abuse. The other primary charity supported by the Snedeker Foundation is the Sneds Tour, the junior golf circuit of the Tennessee Golf Foundation. Snedeker played on the tour as a kid, and he took over as its sponsor from Vince Gill several years ago when membership was in decline. The Sneds Tour now has more than 2,000 members and operates 174 events. Scholarships are part of the

Tour's charitable giving. When speaking of giving back as a golf pro, Snedeker says, "It just feels like it's my responsibility. I don't do it for me. I do it because it's the right thing to do and it's what I should be doing."

When Payne Stewart was on Tour, he wore knickers with long socks and a tam cap, a throwback to the once commonplace golfing "uniform." He had a charismatic personality and was seen as flamboyant and fun-loving. But he was most admired because he had one of the most graceful, fluid and stylish swings in golf. Stewart has always been one of my personal heroes.
