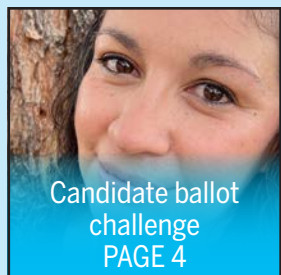

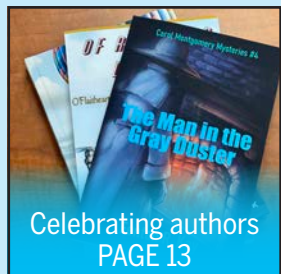
NMSU regents to choose president

New Mexico State's board of regents is expected to announce its pick for the university's president this week, and as early as Thursday. The Las Cruces Bulletin will continue coverage of this developing story at LasCrucesBulletin.com.

This is the story of the four finalists who visited campus last week to introduce them-

selves to the community even as the selection process drew scrutiny from Santa Fe.

The next president will be NMSU's first permanent leader since April 2023, when Chancellor Dan Arvizu left two months before the end of his contract, his five-year tenure ending in the midst of administrative turnover, scandals involving the men's basketball team and widespread discontent over the university's leadership.

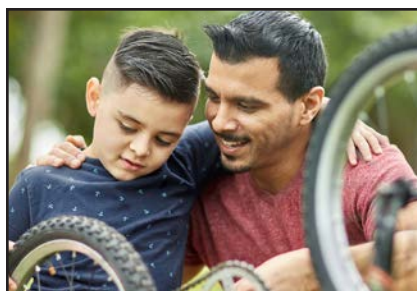
Regents scuttled its first slate of finalists in March, when regent chair Ammu Devasthali stated, "I do not believe that any of the current finalists fully meet the needs of New Mexico State University at this critical juncture."

After a renewed search, and the appointment of Mónica Torres as the university's second consecutive interim

president, the regents picked new finalists this summer. One candidate, Augusta University provost Neil MacKinnon, withdrew from consideration. The remaining four headlined a series of public meetings on and off campus.

The Las Cruces Bulletin attended several of those sessions last week and prepared the following reports.

City touts new pickleball courts, fire station groundbreaking

The city of Las Cruces held events for two projects funded by the 2022 general obligation bond last week as work on the projects came to fruition.

Staff and officials held a ribbon cutting for eight pickleball courts at the East Mesa Recreational Complex on Sept. 13 and a groundbreaking for a new fire station on Las Cruces' far-north end on Sept. 17.

Both projects were a part of the \$23 million GO Bonds approved in 2022.

Voters approved the East Mesa Recreational Complex bond, with 19,389 in favor (63 percent) and 11,396 against (37 percent).

The vote sent \$5 million to further construction of the complex, adding to the first bond of \$7.8 million from a 2018 vote.

"This facility doesn't come without the support of voters," said Parks and Recreation Department Director Steven Bingham.

Mayor Eric Enriquez said the process of building the complex really began in 2012, when the city agreed to lease the land from the Bureau of Land Management. Two years later, the lease was approved.

The 10-acre park features pickleball courts and two multi-sport fields. The area's yet-to-be-completed amenities include a stake park, basketball court, sand volleyball courts and public art.

"What makes a com-

munity special and what makes it easier to recruit business is a great quality of life," said Greater Las Cruces Chamber of Commerce President and CEO Debbi Moore during the ribbon cutting.

"This is a place that we can count on that's going to draw people," Moore said.

Voters approved the Fire Station 9 bond, with 22,974 voters in favor (77 percent) and 7,900 against (26 percent).

The vote sent \$10 million to construct a new fire station in Las Cruces' East Mesa-North Sonoma Ranch area. The region is one of the fastest growing corners of Las Cruces and home to under-construction Metro Verde development.

The goal of the new fire station is to reduce response times across Las Cruces and provide the service to new residents as development continues.

"On a larger scale, I also thank our community because they're the ones who made this possible by voting yes in our last general obligation bond," said city communications director Mandy Guss during the groundbreaking.

City Councilor Becky Corran, in whose district the fire station rests, said the residents were excited about the first fire station located north of Highway 70.

"This building will be all-electric, in the style of the Metro Verde Community," Corran said.

Jason Smith, the Las Cruces Fire Department chief, said the new station represented an investment in the whole city.

"As we break ground today, we're not just building a fire station; we're strengthening our city's safety, investing in our firefighters, and reinforcing our promise to protect this community," Smith said.

Adventures with A.C.E.S.

It's been a busy 2023-24 for Doña Ana County ACO * Codes Enforcement, aka "A.C.E.S."

A.C.E.S. ventures took them all over, traveling many of the 3,814 square miles that make up the county.

Their travels took them to Tortugas, Berino, Rodey, Anthony, Chamberino and Organ, where A.C.E.S. experts educated citizens on the jobs, duties and responsibilities of animal control and codes. They also spread the word about illegal dumping and the ways it can be reported. (For the record, you can get the "No Throw" app, or call 877-NO-THROW.)

In those

communities, A.C.E.S. visited 452 homes, talking with citizens about violations and following up on previous visits.

A.C.E.S. got involved with the area's Spay and Neuter Action Program (SNAP), to help reduce the number of stray and unwanted animals in the county.

A.C.E.S. issued 1,199 vouchers, from which 770 spay/neuter procedures were performed. In case you're wondering about the breakdown, it was 486 dogs and 284 cats.

In addition, 242 microchips were provided, greatly improving the chances of finding a lost pet.

Perhaps A.C.E.S. biggest haul came with efforts for Clean-up with Carlos Days.

In this project, the focus was on getting rid of unwanted trash and old tires. Old tires can be breeding grounds for pesky, and sometimes dangerous, mosquitoes. So, for every old tire collected, many colonies of mosquitoes are eliminated.

Pound by pound, here is the community breakdown on what was collected:

- Tortugas – 7,120 lbs. of trash; 3,800 lbs. of tires
- Berino – 8,380 lbs. of trash; 6,260 lbs. of tires
- Rodey – 10,120 lbs. of trash; 5,400 lbs. of tires
- Anthony – 8,746 lbs. of trash; 5,560 lbs. of tires
- Chamberino – 7,980 lbs. of trash
- Organ – 4,860 lbs. of trash; 1,980 lbs. of tires

That's a grand total for all events of 80,066 pounds of trash and 39,720 pounds of tires.



Silva remains on the ballot after challenge

A district judge ruled that a Democrat running for office who filed some of her paperwork late can remain on the ballot despite arguments from Republicans that she should be disqualified.

The ruling on Sept. 11 came after a hearing considering Sarah Silva's disqualification as the Democratic nominee for the state House of Representatives District 53 race in eastern Las Cruces and Doña Ana County. It follows other procedural issues that have clouded the race for the Democrats.

In court records and an interview with the Las Cruces Bulletin, Silva acknowledged that she filed her financial disclosure statement—a document revealing the financial interests of state lawmakers and officials, such as income sources and landholdings—two days after the deadline.

It's a common mistake, according to Secretary of State General Counsel Peter Auh. Auh said that about 200 of the 712 officials required to file failed to file financial disclosure statements on time. Most come into compliance after being contacted, Auh said.

"That is the legislative intent behind the Financial Disclosure Act," Auh said. "Education and vol-

untary compliance are the hallmarks of the (law)." He said that since filing, Silva was considered to be in compliance and that, in the view of the Secretary of State's office, "there hasn't been the kind of violation as alleged by the plaintiff."

While it might be a common mistake, Silva's late filing came well after a deadline meant to be the final opportunity to comply with the law.

District Judge Manuel Arrieta did not rule on whether Silva should be disqualified based on the law. Instead, he found that the plaintiff, a Republican voter and party operative in District 53, did not have standing to sue Silva. Standing, in the context of a civil lawsuit, means the plaintiff has some identifiable injury that the court can correct.

"It has to be a genuine and legitimate interest, not something broad and simple, such as general interest in the enforcement

of financial disclosure laws or other statutes, and that is essentially what the plaintiff has brought here today," said Mark Standridge, who represented Silva in the hearing.

Carter Harrison, an Albuquerque attorney who often represents Republicans in election code disputes, argued that the code allows voters to bring qualification challenges forward and that the court was empowered to disqualify Silva based on the voter's complaint.

Judge Arrieta said the Financial Disclosure Act clearly states a person who fails to file paperwork before the deadline should be disqualified. The law provides candidates with a grace period to submit their reports; however, because Silva became a candidate so late in the process, she had no such period, Arrieta noted.

Aside from that, Arrieta said it's the responsibility of the State Ethics Commission to bring a lawsuit, not a voter.

Irregular process

Silva was not a candidate in the March Democratic primary. Jon Hill, an education professional, beat incumbent Rep. Willie Madrid in the election and was set to face Republican Elizabeth Winterrowd in November, but he

withdrew from the race in August after falling ill. He died two weeks later.

Silva, a long-time Las Cruces community organizer, was one of three people who volunteered to fill the vacancy. With Hill's endorsement, Silva won the nomination by a party committee vote on Aug. 24.

To qualify as a candidate, Silva must provide the New Mexico Secretary of State's office with certification from her party that she won the post-primary nomination, a declaration of her candidacy and the financial disclosure statement via an online portal.

Silva said she submitted most of the documentation on Aug. 26, a Monday,

but got hung up on the financial disclosure form because of a technical issue with the website. When she asked Democratic Party officials about it, she said they suggested that she had more time to fill it out. But after the deadline passed, the party officials expressed alarm.

According to the form's timestamp, Silva submitted the statement on Aug. 29 just after 9 a.m.

The statement lists her occupation as a consultant "specializing in organizational development, community organizing, mediation and generative conflict," and some landholding in Sierra County.

However, the Financial Disclosure Act says the candidate should be disqualified if the statement is not submitted 70 days before the election (Aug.

27). Silva's submission came in after that deadline.

Voter argues for disqualification

District 53 voter Megan Rupp and a local Republican Party official filed the lawsuit, arguing that Silva's missed deadline was grounds for disqualification.

Rupp, who participates in voter turnout efforts and party governance for the county Republicans, said her lawsuit was about consistent enforcement of election rules, adding that she doesn't feel like those rules are applied the same for Democrats and Republicans.

Rupp referred to the earlier disqualification of Republican state House candidate Ronnie Sisneros in District 37. Sisneros

was disqualified because he altered his nominating petitions, changing the top of some of his forms from "House of Representatives" to "Statehouse."

"If it is going to be required that a GOP member not even be allowed to be on the ballot based on paperwork, based on the clerk, then I just didn't think it was fair that (Silva) be given a dispensation," Rupp said.

Doña Ana County Amanda López Askin denied that claim and pointed to her disqualification of both Democrats and Republicans at the start of this year's election cycle.

"It doesn't do anything for us to keep people off the ballot," López Askin said, adding that her office is not involved in any campaign finance processes,

such as financial disclosure statements.

As the Bulletin previously reported, López Askin's office found that the disqualified candidates either lacked signatures or, as in Sisneros' case, they altered paperwork that state law explicitly holds cannot be altered.

She told the Bulletin that her office thoroughly reviews each case and looks for ways not to disqualify any candidate, regardless of party affiliation. That process involves layers of review before a disqualification is made.

"They will see an issue and I have to make the final decision," López Askin said. "So, if there's anything in a gray area, they'll come and they'll say, 'Hey, we noticed this.'"

López Askin, who has

been county clerk since 2018, also pointed out that her judgement on disqualifications has been upheld in court.

"I do my best to make decisions that are fair and impartial and always benefit the voter," López Askin said.

She also pointed out that, in a society rife with misinformation about election integrity, news articles about lawsuits that go nowhere can give credence to false claims of fraudulent elections.

"And so, whether this was just a very administrative process in which they filed, or they didn't file – it doesn't matter, because there's going to be a story that's going to say the county clerk is biased, and then that feeds that narrative of doubts in our elections," she said.

Lawmakers prepped to hire district staff

About 16 percent of lawmakers have taken the required training to build field offices and hire staff to work in the places they represent across the state.

Lawmakers can choose whether to hire a district legislative aide. If they do, they must go through human resources training, according to policy adopted in June by the Legislative Council, the committee made up of representatives and senators that oversees all lawmaking between sessions.

Eighteen lawmakers have gone through the training so far, newly appointed Legislative Council Director Shawna Casebier said at a virtual meeting on Sept 16. There are 112 total seats in the House and Senate.

Fourteen district legislative aides have been hired, along with one district office manager, Casebier said. She did not specify which lawmakers hired them.

According to the policy, district legislative aides will be responsible for correspondence, sched-

uling, policy research, local constituent services, organization of nonpartisan town halls and other duties assigned by the lawmaker as appropriate. Aides are explicitly prohibited from any election or campaign-related work.

Any lawmaker without opposition in the upcoming elections, became eligible on Sept. 1 to hire district legislative aides, said outgoing Legislative Council Service director Raúl Burciaga during a previous meeting.

If the incumbent in a contested race wins in November, they can start hiring staff Dec. 1. Newly elected members will be able to hire in April 2025, Burciaga said.

A working group made up of Legislative Council Service staff is meeting to address questions that have come up in the roll-out of lawmakers' district offices, Casebier said. The group is considering potential revisions to the legislative district office policy, she said.

The Legislative Council's next meeting is tentatively scheduled for Oct. 25. Casebier said she intends to have some

recommendations for the Council then.

Sen. Antoinette Sedillo-Lopez, D-Albuquerque, said she wanted lawmakers to be able to use their district staff when the legislature is in session as a legislative aide in Santa Fe, as well.

"I understand that's not allowed, and I see that's a real problem," Sedillo-Lopez said. "Since I'm working with that individual on legislation, the idea of training a new person during the session seems kind of silly."

Casebier said the working group is looking at the issue. Session staff are supposed to be hired by the chief clerks of the House and Senate, she said, and there is limited office space in the Roundhouse.

"To date, we have discussed that (district legislative aides) will not be working as session staff, in particular, that the position is focused on work in the district, but it's certainly an ongoing discussion as part of those working group discussions," Casebier said.

Social media threats lead to arrests

Three Las Cruces students face criminal charges after police say they made threats on social media to carry out shootings at Las Cruces schools.

Two students, who Las Cruces Police Department did not name because the defendants are minors, were arrested on Sept. 13 and Sept. 16, according to a news release. On Monday afternoon, the city followed up to announce a third incident and arrest.

"Although students and staff were not under an immediate threat, the incident falls into a pattern of threats spread on social media that caused school security to be tightening last week," the news release said.

The first student was identified as a 13-year-old boy who allegedly threatened to shoot at Camino Middle School. The second student was identified as a 15-year-old girl who police said threatened a shooting at Centennial High School.

Both of those students are charged with unlawful threats toward a school, the news release said.

"LCPD will continue to

collaborate with public school officials to monitor schools and ensure the safety and security of students, faculty and staff," the news release said, adding that the investigation into the two incidents is ongoing.

"Anyone who sees or receives a threatening post is asked to refrain from forwarding it to others, or re-posting it, as doing so may cause unnecessary fear and widespread panic. Police encourage anyone who sees or receives information that is believed to be threatening to screen-save the content and immediately alert law enforcement by calling 911."

In the third instance, an 11-year old girl was is-

sued a juvenile citation for allegedly threatening a school shooting via social media at Sierra Middle School. The threat was forwarded to Las Cruces police by Meta, the corporation that owns Facebook and Instagram, with account information and an IP address. Staff at the school assisted police in identifying and interviewing the girl, who allegedly admitted to making the post. Police said a search of the student's backpack did not turn up firearms or other weapons.

Due to her age, the child was not held in custody, police said, and was released to her parents with the juvenile equivalent of a criminal citation.

Deputy sentenced to nine years in prison

A Doña Ana County Sheriff's deputy who pleaded guilty to sexually assaulting a woman he had detained received a nine-year prison sentence this month.

Micheal Andrew Martinez, 34, pleaded guilty to two charges, including deprivation of rights by a law

enforcement officer and destroying evidence. He was sentenced in federal court on Sept. 4.

Martinez admitted to sexually assaulting a woman he had detained while responding to a car crash in 2023. The assault was captured on Martinez's in-unit camera and body camera, according to court

records. He later admitted to trying to destroy the camera before investigators could view the footage.

Following his prison sentence, Martinez will have to serve three years of probation.

Court records also show that Martinez has appealed the sentence to the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals.

Courts to hold 'safe surrender' warrant event

A "fresh start" is available for people with outstanding bench warrants at New Mexico magistrate courts, the state Administrative Office of the Courts announced Monday.

On Friday or Saturday, individuals with a warrant in any magistrate court in the state can surrender at the Doña Ana County

Magistrate Court, 110 Calle Alegra in Las Cruces, and make an appearance before a judge without going to jail, the office stated in a news release.

Bench warrants may be issued when a defendant fails to appear in court for a hearing or fails to follow other orders from a judge. Individuals who think they may have a warrant but are not sure may call a toll-

free warrant hotline at 855-268-7804 or look up their name on NMcourts.gov.

"At the time of surrender, anyone who appears voluntarily will receive favorable consideration when requesting a new court date, payment plan, or any other option require to comply with the court order," the office stated in the release.

The programs also reduce backlogs, as the office stated that safe surrender events from 2023 to 2024 resolved warrants in 2,022 cases, and a single event in Santa Fe cleared warrants in 626 cases.

The event runs from 1-7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 20, and 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21.

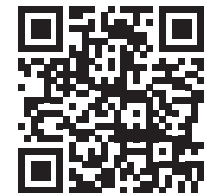

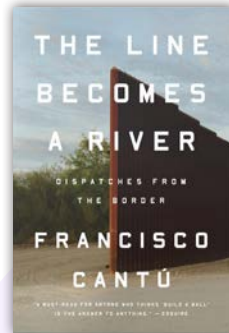
Social Justice Reading Group U.S. Mexico Border

State releases draft study for water plan

The New Mexico Environment Department released a draft feasibility study for a controversial water proposal on Tuesday.

The study looks at using treated brackish and produced water, which is a byproduct of oil and gas extraction, for industrial purposes in an effort to reduce demands on freshwater supplies. That proposal is known as the Strategic Water Supply. Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham announced plans to pursue this effort last year.

Climate change is reducing the amount of water available in the state and officials estimate there will be 25 percent less water available in rivers and aquifers by 2072. At the same time, demand for that water is increasing, particularly in the San Juan Basin region and the Middle Rio Grande area.

Meanwhile, there are untapped reserves of brackish underground water as well as wastewater from the oil and gas industry. The state officials hope these can help reduce demands on freshwater resources, though they

say adequate regulatory controls are needed to protect both environment and human health.

Critics point to the expensive nature of desalination as well as various unknowns, including questions about how much brackish water is actually present in the aquifers and whether produced water can safely be treated for beneficial use.

According to the draft study, some of the important factors to consider when weighing treatment projects include location, water source, labor force, end users and infrastructure.

The draft study also states that more information is needed about the chemical composition of produced water in New Mexico. It also states that desalination, which is needed for both brackish and produced water treatment, is an energy-intensive process and that support for desalination projects should “be considered within the context of the State’s decarbonization goals.”

When looking at brackish water, the draft study states that there may be three basins in New Mexico where the saline aquifers could provide an alternative water supply. Those include the Española Basin near Santa Fe,

the Mesilla Basin south of Las Cruces and the Albuquerque Basin.

“Though there are data that suggest areas that may be most promising for developing brackish water resources...full characterization of these resources at the localized level is needed to site the well and understand the treatment processes required to treat the brackish water to the desired water quality of the end user,” the study states.

Some of the concerns the study highlights around use of brackish water include land subsidence, saltwater intrusion into freshwater aquifers, decreased surface water flows, energy demands

and disposal of residual constituents.

The draft study also looks at potential end uses for the treated water including green hydrogen production, data centers, semiconductor manufacturing, solar panel manufacturing, electric vehicle manufacturing, pumped hydro energy storage and cement or concrete production.

In terms of costs, produced water projects in the San Juan Basin could cost between \$13 million and \$191 million and, in the Permian Basin, those costs could be between \$38 million and \$667 million. Brackish water projects could cost between \$3 million and \$107 million.

Sedillo-Lopez said it does not make sense to hire one legislative aide at the district level and hire a second one for the session.

“One idea that was thrown out was to have the staff resign from this position and then get hired on – which again, seems kind of silly to me,” Sedillo-Lopez said.

The Legislative Council Service has hired new staff to support current operations and additional support needed for district offices and district legislative aides, Casebier said.

The new hires include a

web developer, a network administrator, two computer specialists and four new human resources workers, she said. The Legislative Council Service wants to hire two additional accounting staffers this fall, she said.

Rep. Dayan Hochman-Vigil, D-Albuquerque, asked when there will be guidelines to rent and furnish district offices.

Casebier said there isn’t a specific guide, but one is in the works.

She said current policies require the Legislative Council Service to approve leases and ensure any furniture is properly purchased or leased under the state’s procurement code.

The policy lets lawmakers pick where their district office will be, but requires them to consider public spaces before they seek out a space in the private market.

House Speaker Javier Martinez, who chairs the council, encouraged lawmakers to look for places they can rent for free like community centers, senior centers, universities or colleges, especially those representing urban areas.

“That’s not an official policy necessarily but I would certainly encourage us all to look for those options before we enter into any type of expensive lease agreement,” he said.

Improving education not about 'moonshots'

When new Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham fired her first education secretary, Karen Trujillo, in July, 2019 after just six months on the job, I thought it was a rash decision.

But to be fair, I was biased. Like many people in Las Cruces, I knew Karen a little bit, and liked her. Still, the governor's explanation seemed weak.

"It is absolutely imperative that we genuinely transform public education in this state," she said. "We must identify a vibrant and ambitious new leader for the Public Education Department as soon as we can."

"She just didn't have the leadership qualities for us to deliver on the governor's 'moonshot,'" spokesman Tripp Stelnicki told the Albuquerque Journal.

Trujillo returned to Las Cruces, where she became

one of the most respected and well-liked superintendents ever to serve the Las Cruces school district before her tragic death from a car-pedestrian accident in February 2021.

Six years and four education secretaries later, Gov. Lujan Grisham is still looking for that magical leader as she enters the lame duck portion of her eight-year term. Last week, she announced that Mariana Padilla will be the next education secretary expected to transform a system that consistently scores at or near the bottom on national standardized tests. Padilla will be the fifth person hired by Lujan Grisham to complete the task.

Trujillo was replaced by Ryan Stewart, who

held the job from 2019 to 2021. Stewart was replaced by Kurt Steinhaus, who lasted from 2021 to 2023. Steinhaus was then replaced by Arsenio Romero, who only lasted from 2023 to this year. Now, it's

Padilla's turn. Not surprisingly, changing leaders every two years has not produced the "moonshot" that the governor once envisioned. But the sad truth is, there never was a moonshot to be had.

That was the dream then-Gov. Bill Richardson sold to us in 2003 when he convinced voters, myself included, to scrap the old state Board of Education in favor of an education secretary.

If we could put one person in charge, he said, that would change everything.

We just need to find that magical leader who will turn things around.

There is no magical leader and our education system won't be transformed by a moonshot. Improving our schools is a long, hard slog where progress comes incrementally and often far too slowly. And a school year lost to the Covid-19 pandemic certainly has not helped current students.

Progress is possible. But it will require consistent, uniform dedication to a set of principles that remains the same from the time a child enters first grade until they graduate from high school. And that simply can't happen in a system where every new governor is looking to impose their own solution to fix the problem by the end of their term.

Sen. Bill Soules, who is

chairman of the Education Committee, introduced legislation this year to go back to the voters and ask for a return to the school board system. It passed 36-1 in the Senate, but didn't get put to a vote in the House.

Soules said during a recent community radio interview that he would work to increase support in the House and bring the legislation back for another try. He is running uncontested in this year's election.

That change alone won't fix anything. But it would create a stable, long-term leadership that could take a more far-sighted view, instead of always looking for a mythical moonshot that never comes.

'Celebration of Authors' lifts up local writers

Sometimes people pick up the figurative pen and start writing stories, memoirs, flights of fancy or journalism early in life. Others start later, either because of changes in daily obligations or shifting interests.

The members of the Las Cruces Writers group have individual stories about how they came to be writers. Fenton Kay, a retired biologist who writes mystery novels, said the group has approximately 30 members who gather to read and critique their work, with occasional seminars on writing and publishing. The group includes professional authors as well as newcomers to the craft.

"Our mantra is, 'writers helping writers,'" Kay said in an interview.

He had shown an interest in writing in high school, studying and practicing writing in college, producing poems and stories. He later completed a Ph.D. in biology at New Mexico State University and worked as a biological consultant. He has produced a string of murder mysteries involving science and engineering professionals, with Las Cruces among the settings. After self-publishing his works, Kay's latest has been published by Borderlands Media, a local outfit.

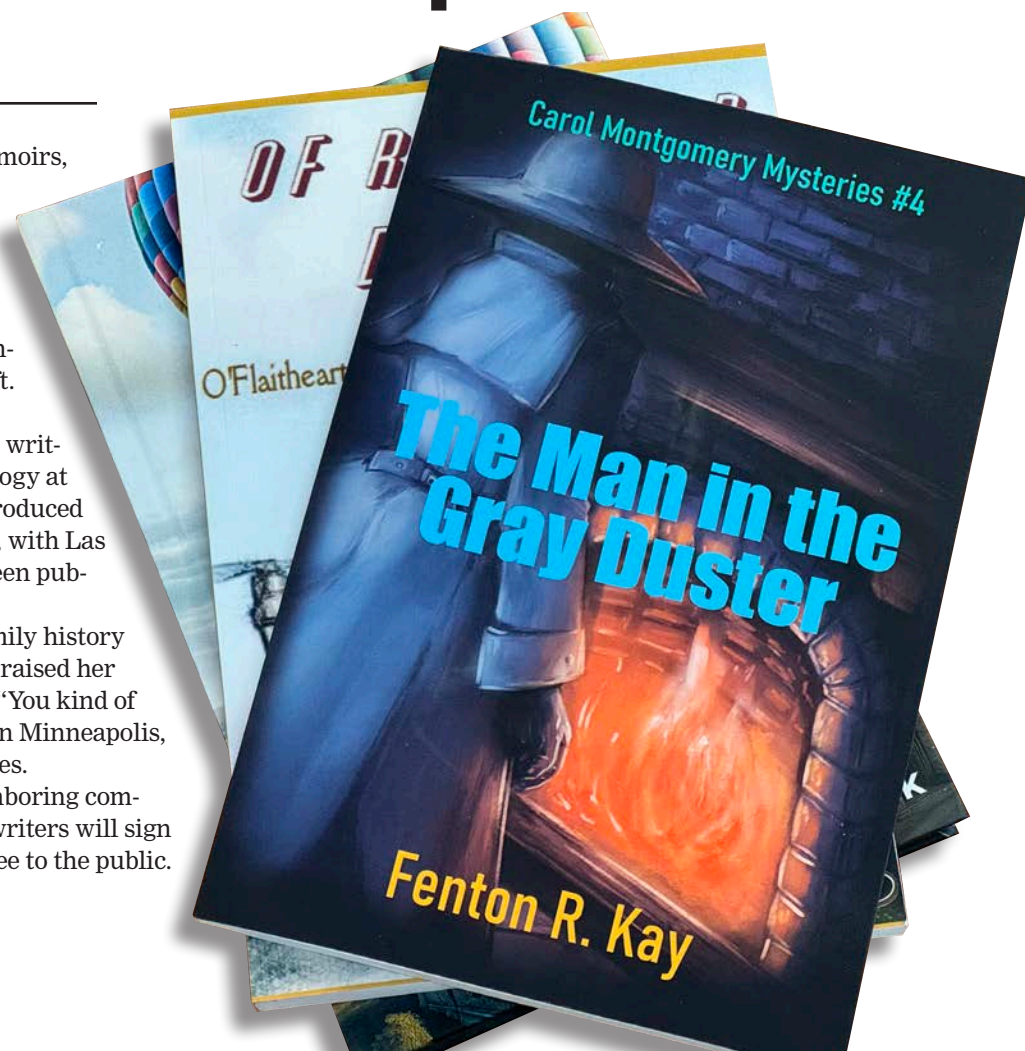
Rosemary Matos, another member, has produced memoirs based on her family history and her own travels in Cuba. She said that teachers in secondary school had praised her writing and encouraged her to pursue it, but life took her in other directions: "You kind of get interfered with, you know, with family and stuff like that." After retiring in Minneapolis, Minn., she facilitated a writing class for seniors prior to her move to Las Cruces.

This weekend, the group will welcome writers from El Paso and other neighboring communities as well as the public to a day-long "Celebration of Authors," where writers will sign their books and participate in several workshops. Admission to the event is free to the public.

The scheduled presentations, each lasting 45 minutes to an hour, consist of:

- 10:30 a.m.: Publishing dos and don'ts
- 11:30 a.m.: Judging a book by its cover
- 12:30 p.m.: Branding for profit
- 1:30 p.m.: Writing the "hero's journey"
- 2:30 p.m.: Jumpstart your memoir

The Celebration of Authors will run from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21, at the Elks Lodge, 3000 Elks Drive. Admission is free, and food will be available via the Elks Lodge.

NMSU Art Museum reveals new exhibitions

The University Art Museum on the New Mexico State University campus will debut three new exhibitions opening Friday, Sept. 27. Included are a group exhibition showcasing artwork by Andy Warhol and his contemporaries, and solo exhibitions by New York-based artist and educator Carlos Rosales-Silva and New York-based sculptor Carolyn Salas.

“Warhol & Friends” highlights significant artists such as Jasper Johns, Roy Lichtenstein, Sol Lewitt and Fritz Scholder along with pop culture

giant Andy Warhol. This group exhibition examines “popular art” as a visual and material investigation of themes related to artistic authorship, repetition, representation, appropriation and collaboration. At the Bunny Conlon Modern and Contemporary Art Gallery, the exhibit invites viewers to contemplate the relationship of images and the everyday world. This exhibition is curated by Jess Ziegenfuss in collaboration with NMSU Art Museum Collections Curator Courtney Uldrich, with curatorial support from NMSU undergraduate student MJ Yurcic.

“Border Destroyer” is a monumental mural project installed in the Mullennix Bridge Gallery, in which El Paso-born Carlos

Rosales-Silva transforms two 60-foot gallery walls in the museum with a two-part mural critiquing unjust land boundaries


and border control while depicting the liberating force of art and education. Drawing from modernism’s roots in Indigenous design and traditional Mexican material culture, Rosales-Silva connects varied cultural and ecological iconography from the border region within this textured mural, blurring the lines between architecture, landscape painting and abstract art.

“I grew up in a family of creative individuals: builders, welders, party planners, musicians, and poets,” the artist stated in a news release. “They laid a strong foundation for me early on, but my

surroundings also played a significant role. The specific architecture of my hometown, filled with painted walls, community murals, and sign paintings—the michoacanas, panaderias, memorial murals, decoration at quinceañeras—greatly inspired my work.”


“Night Vision” is a solo exhibition showcasing the sculptures of artist Carolyn Salas. In her site-specific exhibition, the museum explained in a release, Salas crafts multidimensional chromatic objects that oscillate between geometric

abstraction and figuration. Inspired by research on healing therapies and dream analysis, Salas' compositions make references to ritual, female strength and resilience, mental health and art history.

Further, Salas uses the walls and floors of the gallery as sculptural elements, carving human size shapes into protruding pieces of drywall and inviting viewers to sit on geometric benches that grow out of the cement. This museum described the installation as "a vision that transforms viewers' conceptions of space,

place, and their relationships to objects, form, and materialism."

"Warhol & Friends" will be on view from Sept. 27, 2024 through July 19th, 2025. "Border Destroyer" and "Night Vision" will run from Sept. 27, 2024 through March 8, 2025. An opening reception will be held for all three at the University Art Museum from 5:30-7:30 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 27.

An artist lecture by Carolyn Salas will take place at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 26, in the Department of Art Bleachers in collaboration with the Lilian Steinman Visiting Artists & Scholars Lecture Series. An artist talk with Carlos Rosales-Silva will be held at 5:30 p.m. on

Oct. 3.

"Legacies of Pop" a virtual panel discussion with curator Dr. Ziegenfuss and artists Carolyn Salas and Carlos Rosales-Silva will take place via Zoom at 5:30 p.m., on Oct. 29. A screen printing workshop will take place at 1 p.m. on Nov. 2 at the University Art Museum. "Murals 101", a guide to creating murals with Carlos Rosales-Silva and local artists will take place on Nov. 14.

Balloons take flight over White Sands National Park

The skies over White Sands National Park will bloom with color when the 31st annual White Sands Balloon Invitational launches its two-day celebration on Saturday, Sept. 21, followed by another launch from the Ed Brabson Balloon Park in Alamogordo on Sunday, Sept. 22. Thousands of spectators will be there as skilled pilots rise up into the morning skies to hover in a delicate dance, making it one of the most photographed events of the year.

It all started in 1992, when air park namesake Ed Brabson oversaw the very first liftoff of 18 balloons from a lot outside of Alamogordo. Since then, the annual invitational has grown

to include more than 40 hot air balloons, with sponsorships from the city of Alamogordo, the business community and the New Mexico tourism department. Balloonists from throughout the southwest take part, and visitors come from far and wide to enjoy the family-friendly event.

This year, the fun begins with a mass ascension from White Sands National Park, Hwy US-70 between mile markers 199-200, at 7:15 a.m. Saturday, depending on weather conditions, of course. Lineup begins at 5 a.m., and the park itself opens at 6 a.m. to allow visitors to arrive early and settle in before the spectacle begins. A word of warning to the uninitiated: Bring water and sunscreen, as the reflec-



tive properties of the gypsum sand have been known to cause severe sunburns in the most unlikely of places. Hats are also recommended.

From there, the activities shift to the Ed Brabson Balloon Park, 700 Lavelle Road in Alamogordo, where at 7 p.m. that same Saturday, the Balloon

Glow transforms the area into a luminous wonderland backlit by the beautiful New Mexican star-filled skies. Included in the event will be a full evening of performances, live music, vendors and activities for the kids. On Sunday, the second mass ascension lifts off from the Balloon Park at 7 a.m., again, weather permitting.

Entrance to the White Sands National Park is \$25 per private vehicle, \$20 per motorcycle, or \$15 per person on foot or bicycle. Entrance to Ed Brabson Balloon Park is free. More information is available at WhiteSandsInvitational.com.

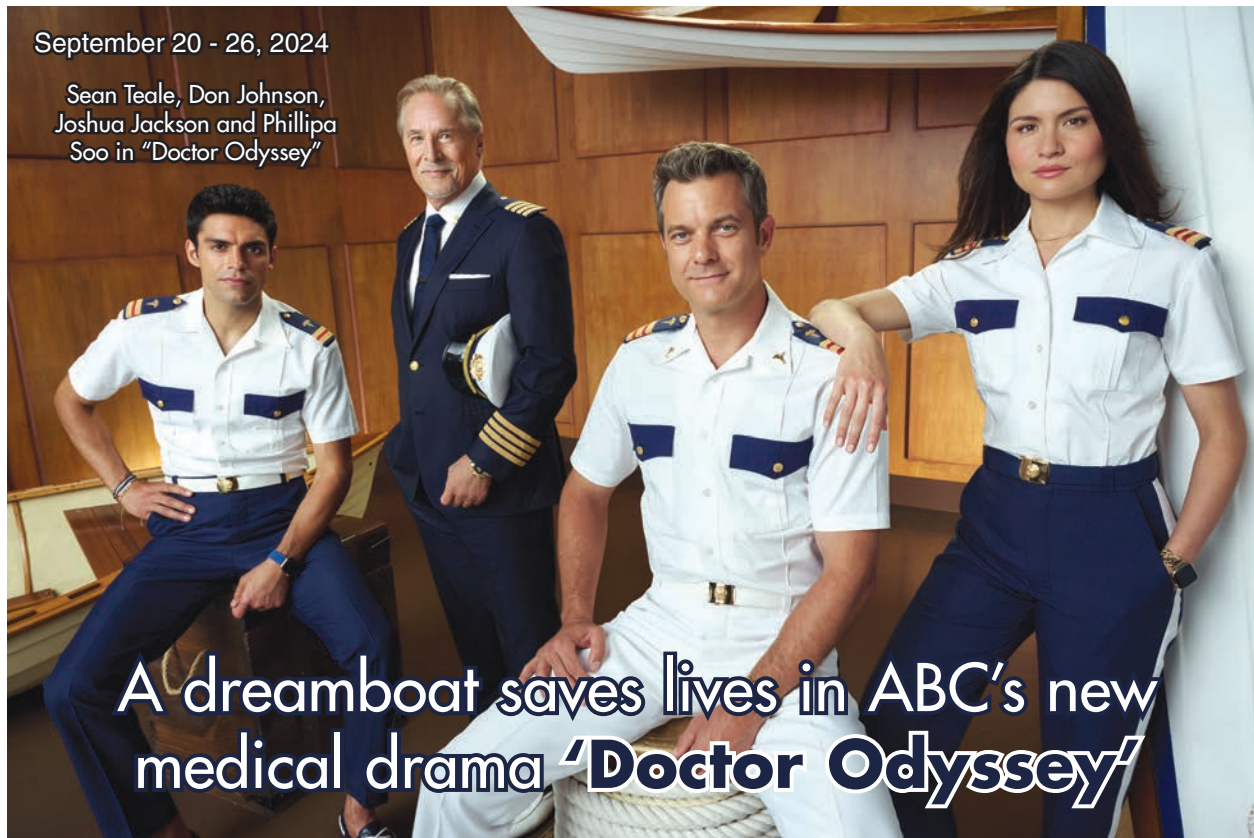

Q: When did Carrie Preston first appear on "The Good Wife" as the character Elsbeth?

A: Carrie Preston first stepped into "The Good Wife" in 2010, toward the end of the first season of that CBS show. Quirky attorney Elsbeth Tascioni hadn't been conceived to be a recurring character, but Preston – who

had a good amount of television work under her belt by that time, encompassing "True Blood," "Sex and the City" and shows in the "Law & Order" franchise – quickly made her mark in the role, eventually winning a Prime-time Emmy Award as a guest performer for that portrayal.

When the sequel series "The Good Fight" was spun off for the then-CBS All Access (now Paramount+) from "The Good Wife" in 2017, it was a logical question whether Preston would resurface as Elsbeth. Not only did that happen in five episodes, but Preston also directed two episodes of the show. (She also directed a couple of episodes of another series on which he was a regular cast member, TNT's "Claws.")

Now, of course, Preston has another showcase as Elsbeth in the logically titled "Elsbeth," set to begin its second season Oct. 17 on CBS and Paramount+. She and executive producers Robert and Michelle King have confirmed that "Columbo" was an inspiration for the current show, with Elsbeth – now relocated from Chicago to work with New York Police Department – using her unique insights and observations to get the goods on criminals, similar to the approach of Peter Falk's Lt. Columbo.

As with "Columbo," "Elsbeth" has been notable for its casting of guest "suspects." Among those featured in the first season were Jane Krakowski, Blair Underwood and (Preston's fellow "True Blood" alum Stephen Moyer.

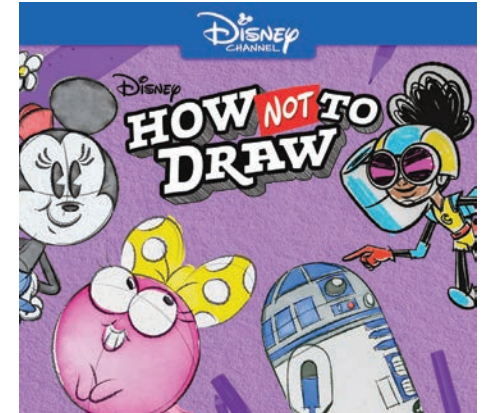

Independence and heritage Scenes from 'Diez y Seis' in Mesilla

Mesilleros and visitors packed the historic Mesilla plaza last Saturday for the annual parade and fiesta marking the Diez y Seis de Septiembre, undaunted by harsh sun and

temperatures north of 90 degrees.

Audiences found every inch of shade on the plaza to take in the festivities, while many braved the aluminum bleachers facing the bandstand and performance area. Umbrellas provided many spectators with shelter

from the sun, but could not prevent the metal from heating up underneath them. Children ran and played throughout the plaza, while some student dancers, waiting in costume on the sidelines, passed the time practicing songs or trying to tie knots in lengths of ribbon with feet clad in traditional dance shoes.

The celebration marks a traditional date of Mexican independence from Spanish rule as well as Mesilla's ancestral heritage. On Sept. 16, 1810, Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, a Catholic priest, gave a speech

in the city of Dolores, Mexico, urging the people to throw off the shackles of servitude to the Spanish Empire. Leading a ragtag group of untrained men, women and children who were quickly defeated, Father Hidalgo led what would eventually become known as the

start of the battle for Mexican independence – a dispute that wouldn't be finalized until Sept. 27, 1821.

For those of Mexican descent, Diez y Seis de Septiembre is the equivalent of the Fourth of July, conjuring up a deep

sense of pride and patriotism.

The village of Mesilla was established in 1848, when the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo moved the U.S.-Mexico border south of the village of Doña Ana. Five years later, in 1853, the Gadsden Purchase placed Mesilla once again within the boundaries of the United States. Though the village would henceforth be recognized as an American colony, it held fast to its ancestral Mexican pride, continuing to celebrate Mexican holidays and honoring its binational beginnings. Diez y Seis de Septiembre, being one of the most important of those holidays, continues to be celebrated to this day in the village of Mesilla.

The parade made its way down Avenida de Mesilla from Calle de Mercado to Union Street, followed by an all-day party at the plaza featuring mariachi and ballet folklórico performances, in a program emceed by KRWG host Emily Guerra, with vendors ringing the plaza and the shops open for business as the Basilica of San Albino, one of the oldest churches in the region, stood over the canopies and food trucks.

La Posta de Mesilla marks 85 years on 'Diez y Seis'

Quotes in Spanish have been translated to English by the reporter.

Just two miles from Las Cruces, La Posta de Mesilla – found at 2410 Calle De San Albino in Mesilla – is known for its rich menu, but their food is only the appetizer. The entrée you find is written in its long history.

La Posta was established in 1939 by Katy Griggs-Camuñez, who owned a small portion of the restaurant at the time. The restaurant was an 800-square-foot chile joint before becoming the historic adobe compound it is today, according to co-owner Tom Hutchinson.

Hutchinson is married to Jer-ean Camuñez Hutchinson, the founder's great niece. The pair acquired La Posta in 1996, keeping the enterprise in the family.

The restaurant has been featured in USA Today as a Top 10 Great Mexican Food Restaurant in 2013 and on the program America's Best Restaurant Roadshow. It also had the honor of passing down its name to the USS New Mexico SSN 779 submarine's galley, La Posta Abajo de Mar – La Posta under the sea.

"I'm sure it was an anomaly to have this little taco joint back in the late 1930s because none of the streets were in place, just dirt roads. The little town lost much of its prominence to El Paso and Las Cruces," Hutchinson said. "In the 1800s it was not known as the La Posta. The Foreign Exchange Hotel owned much of this property. In time we started to own more of the buildings around us that you know as La Posta

today which you see on the walls."

Hutchinson said that much of the art and signs of heritage within La Posta were the work of Griggs-Camuñez because of her love for travel. He added that the menu was also inspired and based down through generations by Mescalero families.

"I think what distinguishes us from other restaurants is the historical establishments - the ceilings, the adobe walls have been here for over 150 years," Hutchinson said.

La Posta celebrates its anniversary every five years, with each celebration being a little more elaborate than the year before.

"We try to change it up every time, but it usually runs around the last three to four months of the year because our

anniversary is actually on the 16th of September, which aligns with the Mexican Independence Day celebration,” Hutchinson noted.

La Posta participates in Mesilla’s annual September 16 parade where the entire staff attends, and the mayor recognizes La Posta’s anniversary. This year, La Posta gave out 300 cupcakes at the celebration. La Posta also hosts a large fiesta every night on September 16.

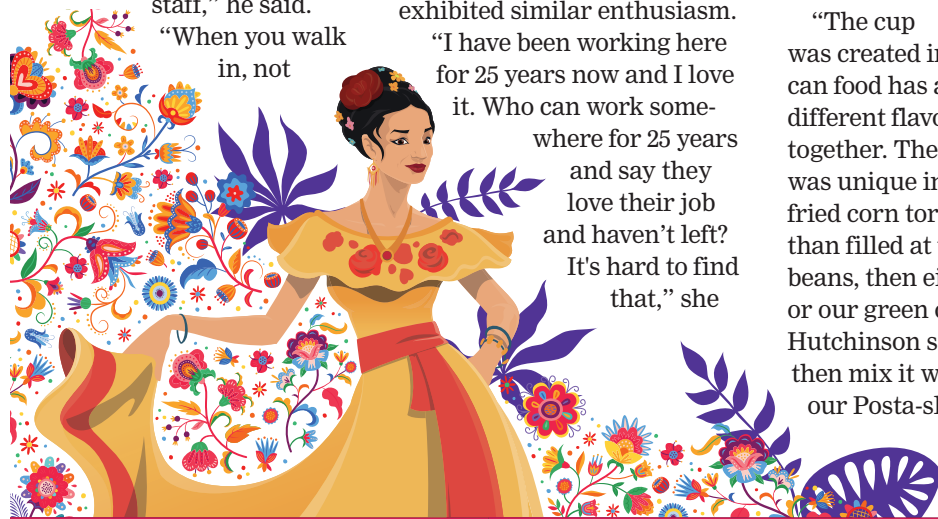
Every five years, La Posta sells tickets to attend the celebration for \$19.39, commemorating the year La Posta opened its restaurant. The kickoff event sold out this year with 300 tickets sold.

To continue the Mexican Heritage celebration, La Posta partnered with the Mesilla Valley Film Society to show 1939 vintage films for five days right inside the restaurant.

Aside from the history, Hutchinson takes pride in his long-lasting staff.

“We have a staff of about 115 right now. When we first acquired La Posta in 1996, we were only at 50. You don’t last 85 years without a wonderful staff,” he said.

“When you walk in, not

only are you going to get a taste of tradition, but a taste of history through our staff as well.” He added that some employees had worked there for decades, participating in some of the history documented on a wall labeled “Legends of La Posta.”

Bertha Sierra and Vicky Emiliano are two examples.

Bertha Sierra has been a line cook for 19 years and she said she wouldn’t change her job for the world.

“I am so happy because, I mean, I haven’t left, right?” she chuckled. “The owners take really good care of me. I work a lot because I ask for it and they allow me to.”

Vicky Emiliano has been a taco cook for 25 years and she exhibited similar enthusiasm.

“I have been working here for 25 years now and I love it. Who can work somewhere for 25 years and say they love their job and haven’t left? It’s hard to find that,” she

explained. “But I love it here, I’m treated right and that’s why I stay.”

The food

Hutchinson describes La Posta’s menu as authentic but with an item for everyone.

“Back in the day the menu only had about eight or nine items, but now it is much larger,” he said. “We continue to follow old recipes to this day. Our salsa has been the same recipe for 85 years now.

“Our red enchiladas are probably our go to dish but our red chile is what were known for. Anything red is usually a requested dish in this restaurant. Our sour cream green enchiladas are a big one.”

Hutchinson said one of his favorite dishes is the original creation of Griggs-Camuñez’ compuesta cup.



“The cup was created in 1939. Most Mexican food has a combination of different flavors that ties it all together. The compuesta cup was unique in that you had this fried corn tortilla cup, which is then filled at the bottom with beans, then either our red carne or our green chile chicken,” Hutchinson said. “She would then mix it with garnish or our Posta-slaw which is then topped with some cheese, which

really makes it a special dish.”

Hutchinson prefers the compuesta cup with red carne himself, but said he also loves their folded tacos.

“Most of our tacos are prepared where the meat is already in the folded tortillas. The meat has been cooked but the tortilla hasn’t been fried yet” he explained. “So, we get a toothpick to hold together the taco, so the meat won’t fall out and when we fry it, what happens is, the flavors from the tortillas and meat tie in good together. Then we’ll open them up and stuff them with whatever the customer wants: lettuce, tomatoes and cheese.”

Another signature dish is the green chile cheeseburger.

“It’s a good half-pound burger, which you can either get the green chile diced or with strips. We can use whatever

cheese the customer would want from cheddar, to asadero to Monterrey, whatever the customer wants.”

With such a large menu, La Posta aims to win fans across the country and make itself a landmark destination for travelers as well as the community.

“A lot of people bring a lot of family and visitors form out of town. When you want to capture the spirit of the village and the ambiance, you’d come here,” Hutchinson said. “You want to go to a place where you get real Mexican food at a very authentic location, and I truly believe that is us.”

Las Cruces parks \$525K into new green space at Metro Verde

The seeds of Las Cruces' newest park are taking root on the East Mesa.

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously on Sept. 16 to reimburse a land developer for park construction as part of a housing development.

The vote sent \$525,000 in park impact fees to Sierra Norte Development as the firm works to build housing for the Metro Verde development on the far north end of Sonoma Ranch Boulevard. The

money covers the design and construction of the neighborhood park.

The park will be called Metro Verde Arcadia Park. It's about 2 acres and located on Starling Lane, east of Red Hawk Road and south of Arroyo Road, according to City Landscape Architect Cathy Mathews.

"Numerous homes will front the park, and raised crosswalks will lead to the park from two directions," Mathews said. "So there will be lots of access to the park."

Mathews said Metro Verde Arcadia Park will



feature picnic tables, shelters, shade, play equipment and a half-basketball court.

Mathews outlined the benefits of parks in housing developments before the vote.

"The National Recreation and Park Association research finds that parks foster positive social

interactions and increase (shared values)," Mathews said. "Park quality is a predictor of overall well-being."

According to a 2017 study by Clemson University and North Dakota State University, more green space is also associated with lower crime rates, something Mathews noted in her presentation.

Finalists for NMSU president visit Las Cruces

With a deadline to name New Mexico State's next president approaching this week – the finalist likely being named after this issue of the Bulletin goes to press – four finalists for the university's top leader were in Las Cruces last week to meet the community. A fifth candidate, Augusta University provost Neil MacKinnon, withdrew to accept a position elsewhere.

The selection process drew criticism from Santa Fe as a series of forums on and off campus were set to begin. State Public Education Secretary Ar-

senio Romero was forced from his job after he was revealed as one of the finalists for the NMSU post. Days later, state Higher Education Secretary Stephanie Rodriguez called on the university's board of regents to scuttle its second slate of candidates, opining that the finalists lacked “the background or experience befitting the unique character and history of NMSU.”

Nonetheless, Romero presented himself at the Corbett Center Student Union on campus Monday, Sept. 9, followed by an early evening forum at the Las Cruces Convention Center in a uniform process followed for all four

candidates.

Romero, the only candidate from New Mexico, a graduate of NMSU and a former regent himself who served with some of the current board, stressed his local roots, connections he had made across the state and his confidence in his ability to negotiate the challenges confronting NMSU.

Romero was already known on campus and throughout the local education community, having served in the administration of four New Mexico school districts, including two superintendent positions, before heading to the PED. He promised a gathering of faculty and staff that he would

remain a decade or longer if selected, following criticism over his frequent changes of position over the past seven years.

Following Romero were three candidates from institutions outside of New Mexico who introduced themselves to the Aggie community as well as the general public, seeking the opportunity to lead New Mexico's land grant university.

Brian Haynes

Brian Haynes was the second candidate to present himself. On Sept. 10 he addressed three public meetings, with prepared questions projected on a screen behind him in a darkened auditorium at

the Corbett Center, leaving him in silhouette. The candidates also took unscripted questions from those in attendance and online.

Haynes has served as vice chancellor for student affairs at the University of California, Riverside since 2018, and holds a Ph.D. in higher education from Ohio University. He introduced himself as a successful product of public higher education institutions (with a Bachelor's from Ohio State University, and Master's and doctoral degrees from OU).

“The mission, vision and values of this institution align with who I am on a personal and profes-

sional level,” Haynes said in front of a small audience of students and some staff.

In an address and question-and-answer session lasting less than one hour, Haynes emphasized the importance of assessing students' needs before they arrive to campus and assuring wraparound services to support them, boosting retention and graduation rates, and maintaining an atmosphere on campus of respect for diversity and inclusion of a range of backgrounds, practices and perspectives.

Haynes was asked about his approach to negotiat-

ing with unionized workers on a campus where graduate workers and faculty have both formed collective bargaining units, as well as his stance toward student protest organizers.

Shortly before graduation this spring, a student protest encampment expressing solidarity with civilians in Gaza briefly occupied space on the Las Cruces campus, calling on NMSU to disclose investments related to Israel and calling for divestment from funds profiting from, or financing, Israeli military operations in Gaza. Protesters, frustrated with negotiations with university administration, later held a sit-in at the Hadley administrative

building, which houses the president's office, for a few hours before police arrested the group.

At UC Riverside, Haynes was part of a team that negotiated with organizers of an encampment that made similar demands and occupied administrative offices there. According to reporting by the Highlander, a campus news outlet, protesters and administrators reached an agreement that ended the encampment with no arrests or dismissals of students.

"We worked with our students on all sides of that conversation," Haynes said Tuesday. "Unlike other peer institutions in the UC, we had zero arrests. None of our students were charged with anything when they took over Hinderaker

(Hall), and we've agreed to ongoing conversations about how we could do a better job improving the overall environment. That's how I would respond."

The UC system negotiates with 15 bargaining units and eight unions on behalf of over 137,000 workers, per its website. Haynes indicated he was used to the bargaining process and a union workforce.

"We do whatever we can to make sure that we do not create an adversarial relationship," Haynes said of his approach to negotiations after he was asked, point blank, if he would authorize legal representation aiming to break unions.

Responding to a question regarding protections for controversial speech

on campus – a flashpoint in national politics, particularly as campus protests over Israel's war in Gaza spread nationwide last spring and raised questions about the line between academic freedom and harassment based on ethnicity, religion or political beliefs – Haynes said he opposed limits on speech. However, in actions he attributed to "outside groups," he said, "We have to find ways to ensure that that free speech does not cross thresholds that negatively impact students, faculty or staff ... One of the things we talk about a lot (in Riverside) is respect for each other."

Monica Lounsbery

On Sept. 12, it was Monica Lounsbery's turn. In a meeting at the Las Cruces

Convention Center, she sought to demonstrate her readiness to start the work of healing and building a team atmosphere at NMSU immediately.

Lounsbery, dean of the College of Health and Human Services at California State University, Long Beach, opened her presentation with pictures of her family and the Wyoming landscape where she was raised. She related her upbringing in an agricultural community and her roots in the southwest, as a segue to her desire to serve at the region's land grant university and steer it through its current challenges.

NMSU has been without a permanent president since 2023, when chancellor Dan Arvizu stepped down before the end of

his contract after regents voted to seek new leadership. Since then, NMSU has had two interim presidents while faculty organized a collective bargaining unit, following the unionization of graduate workers. Meanwhile, the university is seeking designation as an R1 research institution, the highest rank among research universities based on research expenditures and doctorates as rated by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Higher Education. Yet it is also confronting a projected decline in college enrollment in New Mexico, and seeking to turn a page on athletic scandals including alleged sexual assaults within the men's basketball pro-

gram that led to criminal charges against former players and lawsuits, and a fatal 2022 shootout in Albuquerque in which Aggie athlete Mike Peake was wounded.

Lounsbery outlined her approach to leadership to demonstrate how she would begin repairing trust at the top of an institution that has seen high turnover and frayed relations with faculty and other employees. She promised to foster an atmosphere where shared goals were clear and employees felt comfortable disagreeing about how to realize them and hold the organization accountable to a strategic plan.

“We have to learn how to disagree better with

one another,” she said. “We spend time thinking more about whatever the level of disagreement, but there’s usually far more that we agree on than we disagree on.”

Among the top priorities she said needed to be addressed was solutions to staff attrition and subsequent higher workloads, accepting that part of the problem was salary rates that did not compete with peer institutions, including University of New Mexico.

Lounsbery holds a Ph.D. from the University of Nebraska, Lincoln in sport pedagogy and educational research methods. She is the co-author of a children’s book on physical activity, “I Can Move,” which was published during her 15 years at the University of Nevada, Las

Vegas. She has been at Cal State Long Beach since 2016, and served a term on the board of the Long Beach Chamber of Commerce.

She emphasized social mobility and economic development throughout her presentation, telling the room, “You’re changing the stars for the people of New Mexico, and they desperately need you to be their university.”

Valerio Ferme

The fourth and final candidate for New Mexico State University’s presidency described being an Aggie as “punching above your weight, being committed to hard work,” rooted in the region’s agricultural history.

Valerio Ferme, executive vice president for academic affairs and provost

at the University of Cincinnati, appeared on campus on Friday, Sept. 13.

UC’s chief academic officer emphasized his work history in the southwest, including two decades teaching at the University of Colorado Boulder, with leadership posts there and at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff. He moved to the University of Cincinnati as dean of its College of Arts and Sciences in 2019. He holds a Ph.D. in comparative literature from UC Berkeley, following his Bachelor’s in biology and religious studies from Brown University and a Master’s in comparative literature and Italian studies from Indiana University.

Speaking to students, Ferme stressed the need for support programs for NMSU students. He also

pledged to boost graduation rates: “Every student that we get inside the university, we should be graduating. We are not doing that. So how do we get those ratios up? How do we get students to be successful?”

While New Mexico’s Opportunity Scholarship covers tuition and fees for eligible state residents pursuing degrees or professional certificates at public institutions, Ferme outlined needs assessments, mentorship and other supports to assure students stay through graduation, as well as provisions for graduate students and research funding to support their work. He said he had been a staunch advocate for improving pay and covering health insurance for graduate workers at that

institution.

Students provided Ferme with input on the high cost of student housing in Las Cruces and the university’s handling of campus protests over Israel’s war on Gaza at the end of spring semester.

Ferme said he has a practice of meeting with undergraduate and graduate student leaders, even attending sessions of student governments, but admitted that these were the students that were already highly engaged. “How do we get connected with students who are, for example, failing? How do we get connected with students who feel disempowered?”

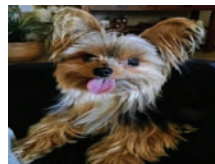

Las Cruces funds park construction through park impact fees. When a house is built and development occurs, the city of Las Cruces collects several fees from the homebuyer because development impacts park use, utilities and public safety.

The current park impact fee, which the council reaffirmed in a separate

vote on Sept. 16, is \$2,600. In the case of Metro Verde Arcadia Park, the city will collect about \$1.5 million from 592 residences.

The city has operated this way since 1995. In 2019, the city council voted to keep park impact fees at \$2,600 per housing lot.

The council had the opportunity to raise or lower the fee this year, as the city code states that the fee should be reevaluated once every five years.

However, Kather-

ine Harrison-Rogers, the city's housing and neighborhood services manager, presented a resolution to keep the fees at \$2,600. The council unanimously agreed to this.

Harrison-Rogers said Realize Las Cruces, a comprehensive rewrite of the city zoning code, will also affect park impact fees.

"Until we know the results of Realize Las Cruces, we really can't proceed," Harrison-Rogers said.

Don't let negative emotions hijack your golf game

Considering all the breakthroughs of mental toughness training, emotional regulation is one of the new frontiers in golf and all competitive sports.

Emotions rule performance even more than thinking. Let's say your prevailing emotions while playing competitive golf are anger and fear. Usually, pessimistic golfers undergo a flux of conflicting feelings as they play, ranging from defeatism to frustration, both of which can have disastrous results. Research demonstrates that negative emotions can have the following consequences: less efficiency in decision-making; less ability to think clearly; reduced coordination; higher car-

diovascular stress.

Negative emotions tend to counter thoughts and efforts aimed at performing well in sports or at work. Below your level of awareness, your central nervous system (your brain directing your body) is getting signals crossed with your autonomic nervous system, which controls organs, glands and hormones. A typical scenario might be excessive worry about the outcome of an event, let's say an approach shot to a green over water with the tournament on the line, perhaps; where we're asking our muscle memory to produce a great shot, but

the sympathetic nervous controls shoot out adrenaline which constricts our motion and flexibility, and the play goes awry. It's like having one foot on the gas and the other foot on the brake.

Theory and research aside, there are several things you can do which will elevate your ability to manage your emotions, resulting in a greater chance of success. One is encouraging yourself to have more positive emotional responses, despite your past tendency to get down and sour. Do positive emotions just happen or are they random? Or can we choose

them ourselves at different times for different reasons? You certainly do not have to be the victim of your past emotional breakdowns and disasters. With determination and practice you can learn to create positive feelings for yourself.

The very first thing you can do is eliminate negative and demeaning self-talk, while detaching yourself from blaming, whining and complaining on the golf course. Most of the time, when we complain about the golf course or conditions or weather or wind – anything – it's just a feeble attempt to wish away our own poor play. Playing emotionally strong golf means accepting respon-

sibility for the outcome which you yourself have created. If you are going to be undaunted by adversity you need to respond positively with self-nurturing thoughts, more focus and better play. This is a tall order, I realize, especially when you must do it while avoiding over-trying, which, of course, is generally counter-productive in golf.

An example of what I'm talking about occurred May 17 at the PGA Championship at Valhalla Golf Club in Louisville, Kentucky, when Scottie Scheffler was trying to maneuver around a traffic snarl on his way to the front gates of the golf course, and was handcuffed and arrested by

a police officer in a law enforcement mess-up. He spent a couple of hours in jail at police headquarters before returning to Valhalla. That would be enough trauma to shake up anyone. Scheffler then went out and shot 5 under par 66. He's my poster child for emotional resilience.

When you're on the golf course, think of yourself as your own caddy. Caddies on tour don't tear their players down – they build them up. Don't be overly critical of yourself; be your own caddy and coach yourself into good decisions, good shots, a serene mind and calm insides. If today didn't go well, there is always tomorrow.
