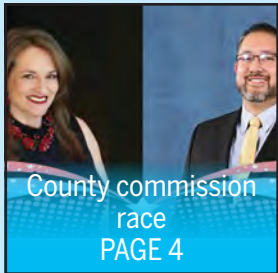


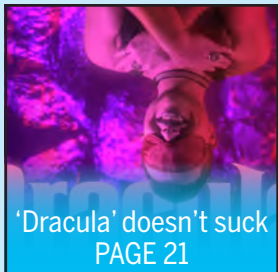

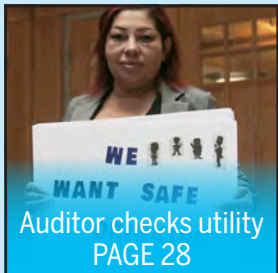

CANCER WARRIOR WEEK

to raise awareness

Cancer Warrior Week, which begins Saturday, Oct. 12, and continues with nearly a dozen events through Saturday, Oct. 19 in Las Cruces, is all about raising money and raising awareness to help women in the battle against cancer.

“We’re super excited” about the second annual Cancer Warriors Week, founder and coordinator Marci Dickerson said. “With tremendous community support, we raise money to provide goods and services to help women dealing with breast, ovarian and uterine cancer.”

Early detection to help relieve fear and anxiety and to prevent breast cancer and other women’s cancers or to help catch them in their early stages is “a challenge we are currently facing and Can-

cer Warriors is trying to solve,” she said.

Cancer Warriors’ mission is to provide “support for women to

of chemotherapy in April 2023 and is cancer-free.

Dickerson’s personal goal for Cancer Warriors

is to make the journey faster and easier for every woman dealing with cancer. Some of the money raised pays for “warrior boxes” filled with gift cards and items for women receiving chemotherapy. The box includes a blanket, socks, personal hygiene items and nausea drops, plus a \$50 amazon.com card; with surgery, the box includes a \$150 gift card and a shopping list for things like a seatbelt pillow, drain shirt, drain slings and a front-zip bra; and with radiation treatment, the box includes a \$50 gift card, skin-care products and an Aloe Vera drink to help stay

Doña Ana County sample ballots available for voters

Everyone agrees – the best voter is a well-informed voter. And what better way to be well-informed than to know what’s on your ballot before you vote?

While local attention is honed in on the top of the ballot – the race between Vice President Kamala Harris and former President Donald Trump – a slew of local races and ballot questions will have a great impact on the daily lives of Las Cruces residents.

Sample ballots, registration status, polling location and voting history can be found at the Secretary of State’s voter information portal, NMvote.org.

From there, scroll down to the blue boxes and find the box on the left labeled

“Find My Registration and Election Information.” The box lists all the information you’ll see once you click the title and get redirected to another page. If you want to request a sample ballot, scroll a little further and you will see the link.

Back on the voter information page, you’ll need to enter your name, date of birth and the county in which you reside. Confirm you are not a robot and you’ll be taken to another page listing all the elections in which you can vote.

This is good information, but it doesn’t include any of the ballot questions, such as tax hike proposals or constitutional amendments you’ll be voting on.

To see that information, you’ll need to click “My Sample Ballot” in the gray box to the upper left of the



page.

From there, click “View Sample Ballot,” and a PDF of your sample ballot will download.

County election dates and voting locations

This year’s election will conclude on Nov. 5. at 7 p.m.

Teague mounts write-in challenge to Commissioner Sanchez

For a moment, the District 5 Doña Ana County Commission seat was the most unstable office on this side of the Rio Grande.

In February 2018, Commissioner John Vasquez resigned after allegations of sexual misconduct surfaced. Kim Hakes, a Republican appointed to finish the term, could not withstand an electoral challenge from Democrat Karen Trujillo; yet Trujillo held the office for just 29 days, leaving to become the state education secretary in 2019.

Then came Manuel Sanchez. Appointed to replace Trujillo in 2019, Sanchez

withstood a challenge from Republican Robert Bruce Flora in 2020, pulling about 56 percent of the 16,352 votes. Since then, Sanchez has taken a prominent role in county governance, serving as board chair and participating in the removal and replacement of the former county manager.

And at the start of this election season, it seemed Sanchez would coast into a second full term unopposed. But after the filing date, Republican Marcy Teague announced she would challenge Sanchez as a write-in candidate.

Teague, who hails from Phoenix, Ariz., and owns a business in Doña Ana County, faces an uphill battle. Aside from the

added difficulties of being a write-in candidate, Teague is running in a district that favors Democrats. A review of election results shows that no Republican has won this seat in 20 years.

Geographically, the district includes the northwestern communities of the county: Hatch, Rincon, Garfield, Radium

Springs, and Doña Ana join the northernmost parts of Las Cruces to make up this district.

The Bulletin asked Teague and Sanchez to answer six questions about their backgrounds and positions heading into the election. The answers were written by the candidates and have been lightly edited for

grammatical correctness or style.

Please provide relevant experience or background information about yourself that readers should know.

Sanchez: Both sides of my family immigrated from Mexico to work the fields and farms of the Mesilla Valley. I grew up in Anthony and El Paso, where my family instilled in me the value of hard work. I was able to attend MIT, where I received my Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering.

I currently work as a sales manager with GE Vernova, where I've worked for over 23 years in various leadership roles. These experiences have helped me serve the residents of District 5 as commissioner since 2019, where I've worked to ensure our colonias are not forgotten.

Teague: Raised to appreciate the value of each hard-earned dollar, to work harder every day, and to do the right thing always, living in Querétaro, México during my youth helped to mold my views on family, business and belonging.

Taking advantage of my past opportunities and developing necessary skills that have supported me throughout my career in international business, I want to help influence the direction of our community through maximizing partnerships and nurturing entrepreneurship

throughout, supporting our residents and helping to improve their quality of life, from our young future leaders to the generations that have paved our way forward.

Why are you running for this position?

Teague: I am a business owner, wife, mother and proud American. I will stand firm in my core values of faith, family and freedom when you elect me to do the job and be your voice.

We need positive energy, availability, honesty and integrity in our commission, and I vow to bring in these qualities and work with any willing person that shares the desire to improve our community for all residents of Doña Ana.

Sanchez: I'm running to continue the efforts I've started. I championed the county's five-year strategic plan that was approved in November 2023 that creates metrics for each county department that are tied to improving quality of life of our residents and will drive our budget priorities in a way that residents can track.

I've also advocated for infrastructure projects, including flood control, sidewalks, lighting and energy efficiency projects. In 2024, we hired our first economic development administrator to plan our strategy to ensure our county continues to establish our plans for long-

term growth.

What will you do to address homelessness in Doña Ana County?

Sanchez: The county has worked with Tierra Del Sol to increase low-income housing with various projects. We need to work with our municipalities and other partners to identify new projects. In 2023, the county provided \$1.5 million partnering with Las Cruces in funding the Peachtree Canyon housing project.

We are also in the process of building our emergency housing project near the government center that will help people released from the detention center. Our Crisis Triage Center is close to resuming operations with a local provider that will be better positioned to connect visitors to other behavioral health services they may need.

Teague: I deeply desire comprehensive and compassionate tactics to address the homeless crisis in our community. We must work together, state, city and county, with a multi-faceted approach to effectively impact the lives of those affected.

While we can't force help on those who don't want to be helped, supportive services, crisis intervention, community involvement and education need to be available to tackle homelessness. The path forward requires immediate, mid-term and long-term strategies to

address root causes and symptoms but again, the desire for help and to improve one's current situation must exist.

What will you do to improve the finances of Doña Ana County residents?

Teague: We can be a small-business incubator by supporting local entrepreneurs and providing services to encourage their growth while also attracting large, long-term businesses through bolstering our infrastructure and ensuring that necessary utilities and services are available to support incoming commerce.

We need to focus on areas where more services are needed and/or desired by the community residents. We must nurture unique individual colonias by providing better infrastructure, ensure solid education and improved healthcare services to build enhanced opportunities for them presently, and for future generations.

Sanchez: We can help by increasing opportunities for higher wages, bringing services closer to where residents live and improving infrastructure that reduces costs. We are working on economic development by investing in infrastructure and marketing the advantages for businesses to move and grow in Doña Ana County.

We are exploring opportunities to bring specialty healthcare providers so residents don't have to travel outside the county. We are developing plans to use modular office space

within our communities to connect residents with county service. We have paved more roads that reduce wear on vehicles and allow emergency services faster response times that may reduce insurance premiums.

What will you do to improve the quality of drinking water for rural water systems in the county?

Sanchez: There are numerous water associations and systems across the county, making it a challenge for the NM Environmental Department to monitor them all. I believe we need to review the possibility of the county taking ownership of water associations to standardize services across the county.

By reducing the number of providers, we can ensure we're bringing clean water to all our residents and working to reduce the number of septic systems being utilized. This will also allow us to install more fire hydrants, giving our fire department easier access to a water supply when responding to emergencies.

Teague: We must work closely with our current providers to ensure our rural water systems operate and maintain high level quality for residents and promote sustainable water use. Treatment solutions, source protection, infrastructure maintenance, regular water testing/monitoring are steps that can be taken to improve water quality in our

“Myself and the Cancer Warriors board of directors are honored to pick up the baton and continue the great work that ‘Tough Enough to Wear Pink’ has done to change how we deal with cancer in Las Cruces,” Dickerson said.

Cancer Warriors’ very first event, in March 2023, raised more than \$200,000, and Dickerson and the Cancer Warriors board are already well on their way to reaching that total and beyond this year. Dickerson said 100 percent of the money raised for Cancer Warriors stays in Doña Ana County.

LC residents urged to return shopping carts

The Las Cruces Police Department announced a shopping cart take-back day planned for later this month.

LCPD said in a news release they will not enforce any penalties for shopping cart possession during the take-back days on Oct. 10 and Oct. 15 at Community of Hope and a parking lot at the 2200 block of East Lohman Avenue near South Walnut Street.

“Officers will be at both sites from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 10, and on Tuesday, Oct.

15. Shopping carts can be relinquished at either site, on either day,” the news release said.

The Las Cruces City Council voted 4-3 on Aug. 5 to ban shopping cart use outside of businesses. Supporters of the ban, including LCPD, said the move would improve public safety. Opponents say the ordinance is inhumane as it targets un-housed residents who use the carts to ferry belongings around town.

“The Shopping Cart Collection Initiative is an opportunity for

anyone who has possession of a shopping cart to relinquish it without consequences. Officers will accept the shopping carts, and they will not take any enforcement action during the initiative,” the news release said.

Those found possessing a shopping cart could face a fine or jail time, although the police department and city attorney’s office have said they intend to use the crime to funnel people into services.

Full enforcement of the ordinance begins Oct. 16.

Sanchez: Dr. Andrews will bring a wealth of economic development experience to Doña Ana County that will bring new approaches and ideas to maximize our opportunities. During his interview process, Dr. Andrews showed particular interest in engaging the public, particularly the youth, in community services and creating a talent pipeline for Doña Ana County.

He also showed a passion for finding ways to connect county services to communities, such as the colonias, that may have difficulties reaching them. I absolutely support Dr. Andrews and look forward to him joining the county.

Voters to decide fate of three district judges

The Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission recommended retaining all three district judges up for retention votes this November.

Richard Jacquez, James Martin and Conrad Perea received “retain” nods from the commission,

which evaluates judges in New Mexico based on legal ability, fairness, communication skills, preparation, attentiveness, temperament and control over proceedings.

District judges appear periodically on ballots to allow voters to vote for or against retention. The judge must receive more than 57 percent of the vote

and if a judge loses that retention vote, they must face a candidate in the next general election to remain on the bench.

JPEC surveys court staff, attorneys, police, volunteers, interpreters, jurors and other court personnel. The answers and responses are synthesized into reports and include recommendations on whether to retain or reject a judge.

Jacquez became a district judge in 2020 after winning an election. Before that, he worked as a district attorney and magistrate judge. He graduated from the University of New Mexico in 1999 and obtained his law degree. He handles many of the county’s criminal cases.

Jacquez received very high scores from court staff, resource staff and jurors. Court staff commended his respect for the courthouse workers regardless of position and said Jacquez encourages them to respect the court.

Resource staff, such as police and parole officers, said Jacquez is attentive and promptly schedules

hearings. Attorneys rated Jacquez slightly lower when it comes to scheduling.

“Judge Jacquez recognized these slightly lower scores, discussed changes he had already made to improve these areas, and stated he is committed to improvement,” the report said.

Martin became a district judge in 2005 after being appointed by former Gov. Bill Richardson and held his seat in the 2006 election. He graduated from New Mexico State University in 1986 and received his law degree from the University of New Mexico School of Law in 1991. Martin primarily handles civil cases.

According to the report, Martin received high marks from all groups surveyed by JPEC.

For example, attorneys rated him highly for being attentive to the proceedings, being punctual and ensuring his staff is professional, productive and knowledgeable of court policies and procedures.

The report did not note that Martin was censured in 2023 after the Supreme Court found he pressured prosecutors to pursue stiffer charges for a man who allegedly pointed a gun at his daughter.

Perea became a district judge in 2017 after former governor and Las Cruces prosecutor Susana Martinez nominated him. Before

the appointment, Perea was a Doña Ana County Magistrate Court judge. He’s also an NMSU graduate and received his law degree from Sturm College of Law at the University of Denver. He primarily handles criminal cases.

The JPEC report found Perea received very positive ratings from attorneys who said Perea is “courteous to all participants, demonstrating appropriate demeanor on the bench, being attentive to the proceedings and for ruling on motions or cases in a timely manner.”

The report said court staff and jurors echoed that sentiment, adding that they gave Perea perfect scores in some categories.

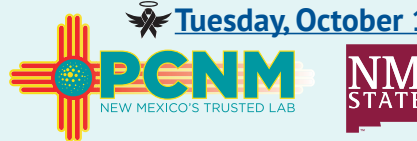

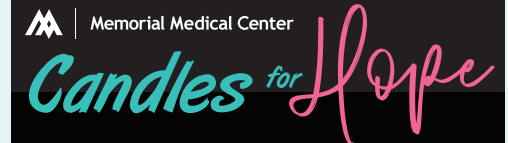

State regulators approve carbon limit rule for PNM

State regulators have outlined what the largest electric utility in New Mexico must do to comply with a section of the Energy Transition Act.

The New Mexico Public Regulation Commission issued a final order in September, in a docket

outlining compliance with an emissions requirement in the ETA that applies only to the Public Service Company of New Mexico (commonly known as PNM).

The commission approved the final order on a vote of 2-1, with Commission Chairman Pat O'Connell casting the dissenting vote. He supported

a one-year compliance period rather than the three-year timeframe that made it into the final rule.

PNM is the only utility that has used the financing provisions of the ETA to shut down a coal-fired power plant. Because of that, PNM is limited in how much carbon dioxide it can emit per megawatt hour. This limit of 400 pounds per megawatt-hour went into effect on Jan. 1, 2023.

While PNM may not currently be meeting that emissions limit, compliance is measured on a three-year basis and is based on average emissions over those three years. This allows greater flexibility for the utility, as PNM could face higher emissions one year due to factors outside of its control such as extreme weather or project delays. PNM has faced various solar project delays in part due to supply chain constraints.

O'Connell said during last week's meeting that he supported having one-year compliance because, using the average over three years, could allow the utility to emit high levels for two years and then a low amount of carbon dioxide the third year to meet the 400 pounds per megawatt hour requirements. This level will reduce in 2032.

Other commissioners felt that the ETA language indicates there will be a three-year compliance period.

O'Connell said that the ETA is ultimately about climate change.

"Rather than trying to craft a rule around how people might appeal (the rule to the courts), we should put ourselves in the shoes of trying to create the best climate rule we can," he said.

He argued that the best rule for the climate would have an annual compliance period.

But Commissioner

Gabriel Aguilera said his decision was not based on the fear of an appeal. Instead, he said it is based

on how he interprets the language in the ETA.

O’Connell argued that the language in the ETA is ambiguous and that a one-year compliance time frame would better align with other state statutes.

“On the ambiguity, there is some,” Aguilera said. “However, I think that the text more clearly reads in favor of a triennial compliance period.”

He agreed with O’Connell that the ETA is about climate.

“It’s also about a deal that was offered to the utility and the utility took up that deal,” Aguilera said.

PNM was involved in drafting the ETA after it announced plans to close the San Juan Generating Station.

While the new rule implements a three-year compliance time period, it also requires annual reporting.

While Aguilera said that the information O’Connell would be seeking with an annual compliance period will likely be provided through the annual reporting.

But O’Connell said he is unconvinced.

“I think that addressing climate requires being bold,” he said.

Ideally, the PRC would have had a rule in place prior to the new limit going into effect. In the final order, the PRC states

that it is “unfortunate and regrettable that this rulemaking could not be completed prior to January 1, 2023.”

The reasons given for that delay include lack of available personnel and that “no other stakeholder took initiative to petition the Commission to begin the rulemaking.”

This delay does have consequences. The order states that the delay complicates “the implementation of the first three-year period for purposes of compliance, measurement, and verification.”

Should PNM fail to comply with this part of the ETA, it could face sanctions. Exactly what those consequences might look like has not yet been determined. The commission discussed the possibility that such sanctions benefit communities impacted by the closure of the San Juan Generating Station rather than going into the state’s general fund.

Using sanctions to help the impacted community was something O’Connell supported.

“Instead of just forking money over [to] the general fund, there might be better things that can be done with that money,” he said.

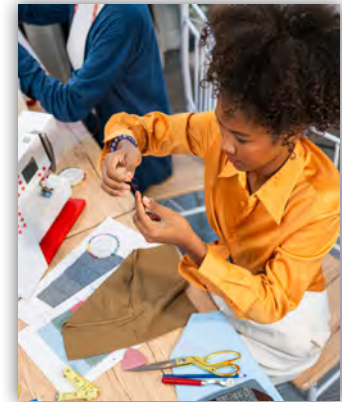

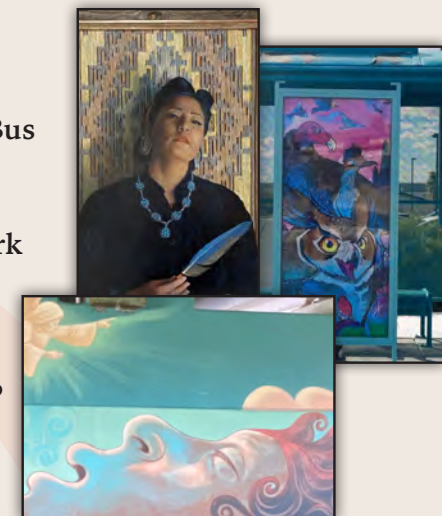

Online stupidity never goes away

Is there a statute of limitations on horribly offensive racist and homophobic comments posted online?

Every situation is unique. If you are running to be the governor of North Carolina and posted the comments as an adult, that is probably something voters are going to consider when making their decision. But what about an assistant football coach who made the posts when he was in college?

It was recently reported that NMSU offensive coordinator Tyler Wright has posts from more than 10 years ago on his social media account that are absolutely indefensible. They were posted when he was a football player attending Tarleton State.

The hateful posts stopped when he took his first coaching job, but he never took them down.

Wright was not with the team for its game Saturday, and his situation is currently under review.

I've never met him, and have no way of judging if those posts are in any way a reflection of the man he is today. If they are, then it's an easy decision. He has to go.

But if they aren't, and he truly is a different man today, then it's a tougher decision. Athletics Director Mario Moccia said he didn't know about the posts when Wright was hired. If Wright had disclosed them at that time, Moccia could have

made an informed decision. And so, termination would be justified.

There are other factors that will influence the decision I can't assess, such as Wright's relationship with NMSU players and how that will be impacted by this disclosure. I will trust Moccia to consider all relevant factors and make the right decision.

But this is an issue that is bigger than one assistant football coach.

When I was a college student, I was absolutely certain that I knew more about everything than anyone else in the room, and I was not at all shy about sharing my opinions. There was nothing

like this, but I'm sure it would be embarrassing if all my half-baked proclamations were saved for posterity.

Fortunately, my generation wasn't big on writing things down. We thought letters were passé and we were just being introduced to the concept of a word processor.

Wright came of age during a generation where every thought or impulse had to be shared with the world. The internet gave people the illusion of power. In theory, their angry screed could be read by millions of people, change all of their hearts and significantly transform the world. In reality, the angry screed will never go away. And it may come up in job inter-

views 20 years later.

If Wright had merely said the things he posted, they would still have been equally offensive and hateful, but they would have soon been forgotten.

I don't know what is the best decision for NMSU. Maybe a fresh start would be best for both sides. But I don't think opinions expressed in college should mean that Wright never works again, if he no longer holds those beliefs.

I understand that it's easy for me to show grace when I'm not a member of the groups that were disparaged. But we have to allow people to grow and to learn from their mistakes.

On practical international travel

Dear editor,

My personal 50-year experience of industrial work in Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Middle East has taught me there is no option for violating the World Health Organization, foreign customs and immigration or flight restrictions of any airline company. I have had to renew my U.S. passport five times in U.S. embassies: once in Mexico City, once in Lagos, Nigeria and three times in London, England. In fact, it has been necessary to have extra pages attached to my passport because of my frequent international travel.

At every airline company and every customs and immigration checkpoint I was asked, "Do you have a valid passport, and

what is the purpose of your journey?" Destination nations will give you permission for a finite time to remain. You will be asked if you plan to work. If so, you will need to present a visa of permission from the destination government showing details of an official contract.

Evidence obtained by U.S. authorities at our border indicates human trafficking on a level unknown in history. Logistically this mechanism is based in our closest neighbor, Mexico, and the only solution is to first accept the reality of our predicament. Unfortunately, the current policy of tolerance is a failure, and we are now faced with the burden of engineering a solution which excludes negotiation. The two ob-

stacles to diplomacy now are the lack of morality, and profits gained by the perpetrators. This includes every criminal cartel and the Mexican government.

We cannot expect to efficiently negotiate change or influence human morality. Our international reputation would be damaged by any military intervention against a foreign Cartel. So, the most viable option for defending our country must be sanctions on international monetary funds. Starting with the airline industry, followed by restrictions of any kind with countries allowing unauthorized travel.

City pedals forward on bike, pedestrian lanes

BULLETIN REPORT

The Las Cruces City Council unanimously accepted a \$350,000 state grant to help pave the way for the development of active transportation pathways such as bike lanes and walking trails.

Grant specialist Crystal Silva, who presented the New Mexico Department of Transportation grant to the council on Sept. 16, said the grant's purpose was to "acquire property and rights of way and to plan, design, construct, and improve, including bicycle and pedestrian routes and networks in Las Cruces."

Silva said the money will be spent on projects already identified in Las Cruces's 2018 Active Transportation Plan. The plan calls on Las Cruces to develop 98 miles of new bike paths, enhancing their safety by locating

them away from vehicle traffic, improving bike path surfaces, and increasing bike parking and bicycle-related signage.

The ATP also calls on the city to build 31 miles of sidewalks to eliminate gaps, add 128 miles of new sidewalks, and recommends improving pedestrian street crossings to make them safer.

Silva identified a multi-use trail bordering Valley View Park, construction

of pedestrian improvements on Ethel Avenue and growing bike lanes on E. Madrid Avenue as three projects the money will fund.

According to documents provided to the council, the multi-use trail is the top priority, followed by the pedestrian improvements and the bike lanes. The same documents also said the money would revert to the state if the city failed to spend it by June 30, 2028.

Symphony delivers dramatic, colorful season opener

From the moment conductor Ming Luke pounced onto the podium at the New Mexico State's Atkinson Recital Hall, the Las Cruces Symphony Orchestra burst into their 2024-25 season with great fanfare. This promise of athleticism and vitality was fulfilled by a dramatic, colorful evening of music by three of the most celebrated Russian composers.

It set a joyous tone to begin with Dmitri Shostakovich's oft-performed Festive Overture, Op. 96. The piece has been aptly described by musicologist Lev Lebedinsky as "uncorked champagne" with its lightning-fast melodies and celebratory feel. The sizable orchestra's skillful opener was met with enthusiastic cheering from the modest crowd.

The least common piece of the orchestral program was Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky's Francesca da Rimini, Op. 32. After the concert, I was not surprised to read that conductor Luke has been described as having "energy, creativity and charisma not seen since Leonard Bernstein." He set the stage for Tchaikovsky's tone poem with an enticingly dramatic description of the true story that inspired it. He recounted the tale of a woman murdered by her husband after

her affair with his brother, and how it was captured in Dante's Inferno. Luke's description of how the music communicates the imagery of Dante's work made the half-hour orchestral piece feel like a titillating modern film score. While the stormy opening and closing of this selection were effective, the middle section depicting the doomed romance was particularly moving. Madelyn Moore's clarinet solo evoked a sort of miserable happiness that was a highlight of the evening.

After intermission, the program concluded with Modest Mussorgsky's "Pic-

tures at an Exhibition" as orchestrated by Maurice Ravel. While there are many settings of Mussorgsky's original piano work, this is the most famous. As with most LCSO classics concerts, this piece includes passages most music lovers will recognize. Originally composed after Mussorgsky attended a memorial exhibition of paintings by Viktor Hartmann, the piece conveys the audience through a gallery and focuses on ten images. Once again, the woodwinds excelled, particularly in the playful "Tuileries" and "Ballet of the Unhatched Chicks," and in the rare symphonic appearance



of a sax solo in "The Old Castle," offered by Rhonda Taylor. The strings presented lush, versatile sound throughout the evening.

Fittingly, the concert organizers invited the southern chapter of the New Mexico Watercolor Society to create paintings tied to each of the movements of the Mussorgsky work. The audience was encouraged to vote for the painting that they most enjoyed. This smart outreach not only enticed area artists to attend the symphony, but also prompted the audience to envision the paintings during the concert and converse about the work as they evaluated the paintings afterward. It might have made more sense to offer this work before the intermission, allowing more time for interaction.

This watercolor exhibition was one of many thoughtful touches of the evening. Thorough program notes on each of the composers and Ravel as orchestrator also added to my enjoyment of the concert.

Las Cruces Symphony Association President Michael Chang mentioned the

BRINGING MUSIC TO THE MASSES

The MV Jazz & Blues Society prepare for their signature festival

There was a time when one didn't equate Las Cruces with Jazz and Blues music. That is no longer true. The Mesilla Valley Jazz & Blues Society (MVJBS) has been working diligently for the past 24 years to bring the best in one of America's most valued artforms to the area. A mission that has been responsible in part for the blossoming of those artforms throughout not only Las Cruces, but El Paso as well.

Begun in 2000 by local musician and scholar Bob Burns, the MVJBS started as a jam session for those who loved the music. It quickly evolved into something more. President of the MVJBS and former music professor at

NMSU Pancho Romero remembers those days.

"Bob was very instrumental in putting the Mesilla Valley Jazz and Blues Society together," he said. "He got a bunch of local jazz aficionados and musicians together in the early part of this century and formed a society that would encourage and promote jazz and blues education in the area."

For several years now, the MVJBS has been continuing that mission by conducting clinics and workshops for school children, and giving out scholarships to young students eager to pursue study in jazz education. They have also partnered with NMSU and UTEP to match the scholarship for any student who wants to be a music major at the institutions.

"We feel it encourages students to come to school in the area," Pancho said. "We've handed out over the last three years about \$10,000 in schol-

arships. We also sponsor the NMSU Jazz Festival, and the Organ Mountain Jazz Festival, offering financial support and also helping with the education

part of it."

The result of all this effort has been a growth in appreciation of both jazz and blues music. It helps that Las Cruces has become a popular retirement area for people looking to escape the adverse weather and congestion of other parts of the country. Many of those are professional musicians who are drawn by the flourishing art scene.

"We do have world class musicians in this area," Pancho said. "We have a bass player who came from the New York area that used to play with the Jazz Messengers. We have a saxophone player who used to play with Elvis, Wayne Newton and Frank Sinatra. We have musi-

Q: I was surprised to read that Gina Rodriguez will be joining "Will Trent" for its new season. Does that mean she won't be doing the game show "Lucky 13" anymore?

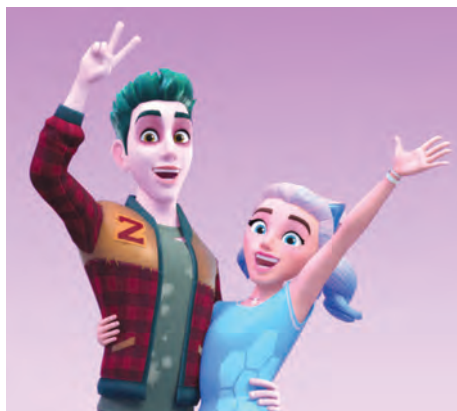

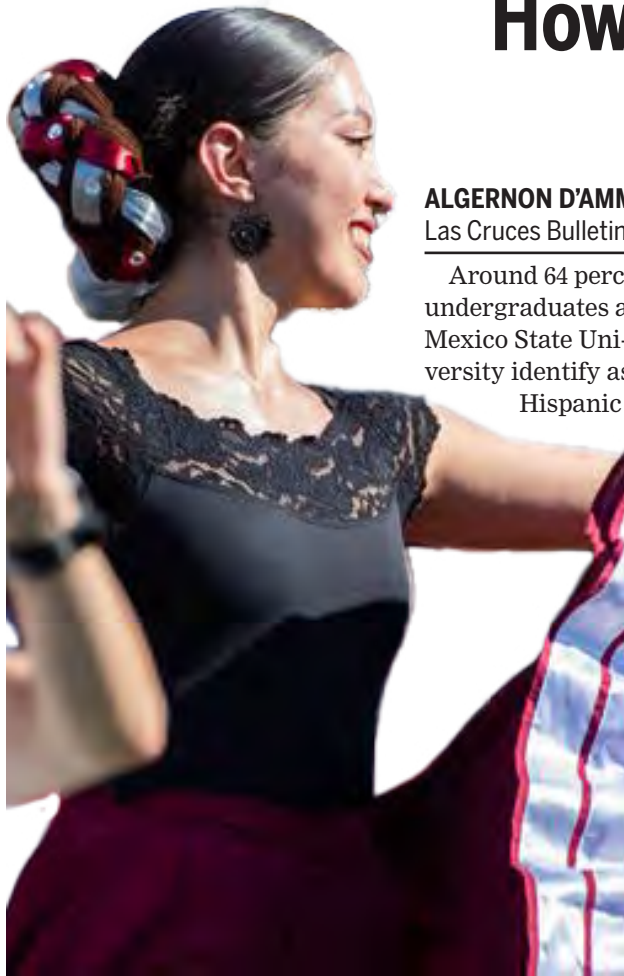

How Hispanic-serving institutions serve students, community

Around 64 percent of undergraduates at New Mexico State University identify as Hispanic

or of Spanish-speaking heritage. But among graduate students, that number drops significantly, to about 35 percent, according to Teresa Maria Linda Scholz, NMSU's vice president for equity, inclusion and diversity.

The number of federally designated Hispanic-serving institutions in U.S. higher education has grown rapidly, topping 600 this year, with NMSU among them. The criterion is simple enough: The institution must be a nonprofit college or university with at least 25 percent of its full-time undergraduates "identifies as Hispanic, Latine, Latino, Latina, Latinx," as Scholz explained in an interview.

The term Hispanic refers to language, while "Latino" and its distinctions refers to geography. Referring to her own background as a Guatemalan and the first generation from her family to graduate from college, she said, "My lens is very much from having lived in a country at the height of human rights violations. I'm a first-gen college (student). And so for me, as a Latina, as a Guatemalan U.S. American, serving at

an HSI is really important to me, personally and professionally."

The designation makes institutions eligible for grants. Last month, the U.S. Department of Education announced a round of HSI grants totaling nearly \$50 million, including programs to expand graduate opportunities, prepare elementary and secondary school teachers of diverse backgrounds and increase science and engineering career opportunities for underrepresented population groups.

"If we're Hispanic-serving, we should be serving our students, not just counting our students," Scholz said.

Latinos constitute a rapidly growing demographic - nearly three-quarters of U.S.

I am with my ancestors

In Doña Ana, a former saloon holds community's history

The De La O visitors center, an adobe-made historical site built in the 1840s, was slated to become a parking lot in the mid 1990s.

When the Doña Ana Village Historic Preservation Committee got word of it, the group joined with the late New Mexico state senator Mary Jane Garcia to secure capital outlay sufficient to purchase the site.

Today, the De La O visitors center is surrounded by other historical places like the Doña Ana Plaza and Nuestra Señora de la Candelaria. The community center sits on El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro National Historic Trail on Cristo Rey Street.

Committee members still push to keep the building a historical topic of conversation. DeAngelo Nieves, treasurer of the committee, said they continue to keep up with everyday necessities that allow visitors to enjoy the value of this amazing piece of history. He said he worked on the

restoration project for Nuestra Señora de la Candelaria during the 1990s.

Nieves said toward the completion of the project, the committee learned the Catholic Diocese of Las Cruces planned to knock down the building to build the parking lot for the church.

“Our committee founder and state senator at the time, Mary Jane Garcia, was able to secure the New Mexico capital outlay funds for Doña Ana County Government to purchase the buildings,” he said.

“While Mary Jane was able to secure funds for the purchase and start of work on the center, it wasn’t nearly enough money to complete the De La O visitors center project. In January of 2011, a ribbon cutting ceremony was held for the grand opening of a partially completed De La O visitors center.”

The community center is owned and operated by the Facilities and Parks Department of Doña Ana County.

“Our community and committee have been pushing for funds to complete the center and

state Senator Jeff Steinborn has been able to secure more capital outlay funds for more work on the center,” Nieves said.

Robert Herrera, director of the Facilities and Parks Department, began his position in April 2023 and since, Nieves said Herrera has been open and willing to work on the center.

As the property and buildings continue restoration, Nieves wants community members to indulge in the history the area has to offer.

“In December of 1846, the U.S. military arrived in Doña Ana during the Mexican/American war. Based on the descriptions of the village by the U.S. military, we believe the buildings were constructed by the time the U.S. military arrived in Doña Ana,” Nieves said.

“The building that currently houses what is the only finished building of the De La O visitors center began as a family home before being used to house various businesses.”

Between the late 1800s and early 1900s, the building was home to the Doña Ana Saloon. This property was owned and operated by Roman and Guadalupe De La O.

One other neighboring building, known as the Wertheim building, was owned and operated as a general store for over 50 years by German immigrant Herman Wertheim from 1875. This building later

served as a post office.

The De La O visitor center today hosts events for community members but most importantly, committee members host field trips for Las Cruces Public School students here, as a venue for teaching about the area and region.

According to Yvonne De La O-Jasso, a committee board member and direct descendent of the De La O family, the center will host events for days like Día de los Muertos or celebrations such as luminarias displays. It will be the center’s fourth celebration of Día de los Muertos, from 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Nov. 2 with vendors and food trucks, she said.

“We will also have our luminarias event on Dec. 7. It is such a beautiful event. We don’t have any times right now but will release those later.”

De La O-Jasso said that as a descendent she takes much pride in this historical site.

“We have been there for decades and I myself feel that my

roots are very strong in this community. Much of the families in this community take pride in their ancestors because it’s almost as though we have built this area up,” she said.

“Building the church, digging the ditches, those were things that they valued as they were trying to build any type of homes. Eventually, the shelters and buildings were built, and one came about to be the De La O saloon.”

As the area evolved, she said she believed the sense of community never left this place.

“There is a pride to what the community could accomplish and from much of the help from former senator Mary Jane Garcia,” she said. “Just walking through it, I feel like I am with my ancestors. It is a place that can be used for so much. Tours for schools, community members can host weddings, family reunions, community projects and presentations. It’s a very valuable building.”

November 8th ballot - Increasing the gross receipts tax

As you might be aware, the City of Las Cruces has a measure on the November 8th ballot regarding increasing the gross receipts tax. Note exact language on ballot:

“Shall the City of Las Cruces impose a municipal gross receipts tax in the amount of three hundred twenty-five thousandths of one percent (0.3250%), the revenues of which shall be used for funding capital improvements and maintenance for public safety, streets, parks, and other public facilities and critical infrastructure?”

After thoughtful consideration & input from our membership, it is the opinion of the Board of Directors the following items:

a) This measure was fast tracked & didn't give ample time for in-depth

research;

b) The wording on the ballot measure is very general in scope & no written guarantee of its use;

c) No proposed budgets presented for explanation of usage, and

d) No clear, concise communication presented to public

While we remain 100% in support of public safety, based on all these elements, it was decided by The Board of Directors to oppose passage of this measure in its current, approved form & wording by voting NO on the November ballot.

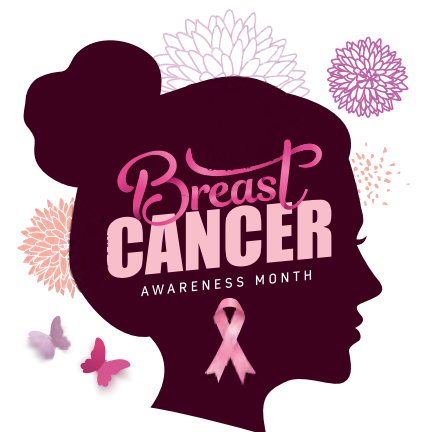
During this

Passion for culture

Gallery manager links art and identity

“Las Cruces holds a special place in my heart. I love the diverse range of artists here in Las Cruces, especially because we're a borderland city,” Natalia Martinez said during a recent interview.

Last June, Martinez was hired as the Doña Ana Arts Council's new gallery manager. A native New Mexican from Santa Fe, Martinez came to Las Cruces to study at New Mexico State University. She received her bachelor's degree in art history and museum conservation in the Spring 2023. During her time as an Aggie, she founded the Honors Art Collective program.

“Part of the reason why I moved down here is to represent those minority artists, or specifically Latinx or BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and other people of color) artists that are engaging with borderland issues and also borderland culture and identity,” she said.

The arts council is a nonprofit located in down-

town Las Cruces. For over 50 years, DAAC has had the vision of a community where the arts thrive. They hold many annual events throughout the year, including the Las Cruces Arts Fair and the Renaissance Arts Faire. The council recently welcomed its new executive director, Karrie Porter, who succeeds

Araceli Solis.

DAAC was originally located in the Rio Grande Theatre, but has changed location a few times in recent years, settling into their current location on Water Street to expand their programming to a broad spectrum that includes cuisine, visual and performing arts and creative writing. Martinez described their location as lively in the midst of the events occurring downtown. This allows them to invite tourists and locals that love wandering downtown into their facility to view the works they have on display.

“Doña Ana Arts Council's goal has always been to serve the community by providing events that support artists and celebrate cultural traditions,” Martinez said.

Currently on display at the gallery is artwork by Cheryl Nelson, a local watercolor painter who began her art career after her retirement. Martinez explained that Nelson uses a very abstract watercolor

population gain per Census data from 2022 to 2023 – and that trend has its parallel in higher education enrollment. Yet nearly a third qualify for Pell grants based on financial need, and other supports may be needed as well to support the success of students from different economic classes and linguistic and ethnic backgrounds.

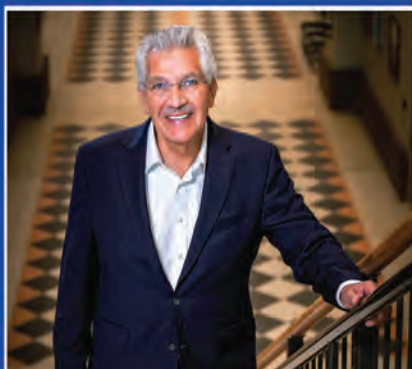
How well an HSI is serving those students, Scholz said, can be indicated in numerous ways. Are learning environments welcoming? Are Spanish-language materials available, or teachers of similar ethnic backgrounds? Is the university addressing Hispanic communities in their recruitment efforts? How are the academic outcomes for Hispanic students, measurable in grades and graduation rates? Are students finishing degrees, going on to graduate work at NMSU or flourishing in careers after college?

Scholz's department oversees not only the office of Latin American programs but also the American Indian program, Black programs, LGBTQ+ programs and the Asian Pacific Islander program. Addressing a common misunderstanding, she emphasized that the purpose of these programs was not to segregate population groups, nor to treat individuals in any of these groups as homogenous, but to support faculty and students and fulfill NMSU's land grant mission to benefit the community through its graduates, and its contributions to the region's development through its research, technology and other services. With extension offices throughout New Mexico's 33 counties, its reach is wide.

“When we're serving our Hispanic, Latine students, which is our largest population, we're also going to be serving our other minoritized students too. We talk a lot about intersectionality,” Scholz said.

“Our community colleges are very beautifully positioned to engage community and workforce development and providing opportunities for associates degrees, and other certificate programs,” she continued. “For me, that's very core to being an HSI in the borderlands region, in the southwest.”

process with recycled material.

Martinez went into detail on what the DAAC looks for in their artists. She expressed they are looking for artists that are pushing the boundaries of their media and their connections with the Las Cruces community and the global art community.

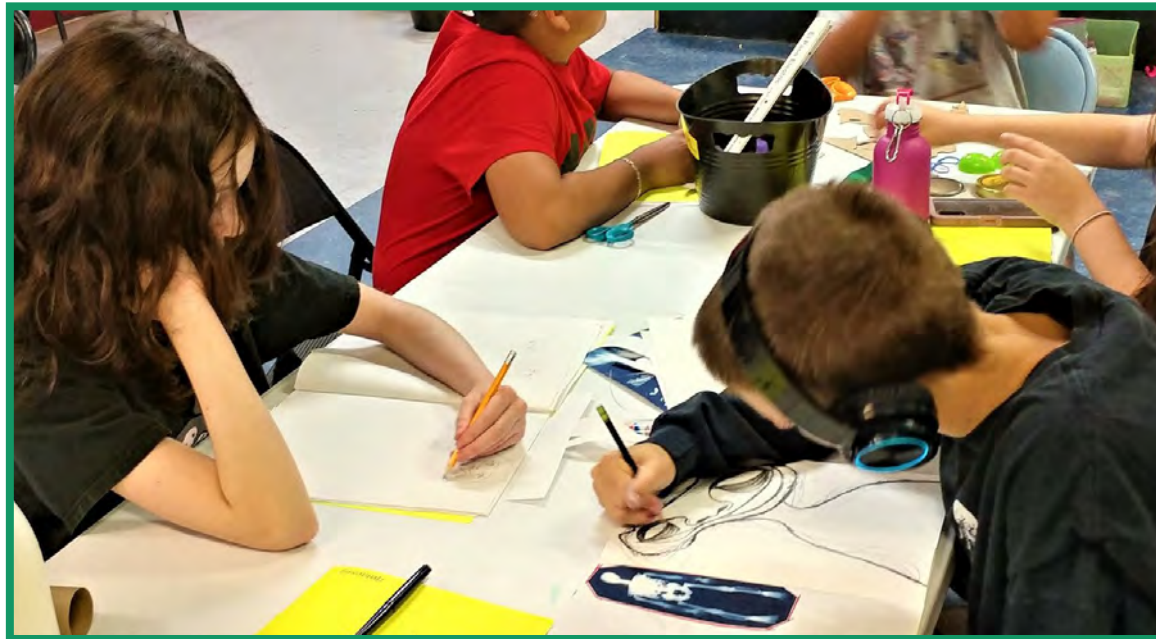
artistic processes, giving them a platform to show the community their creative output and helping them to express who they are.

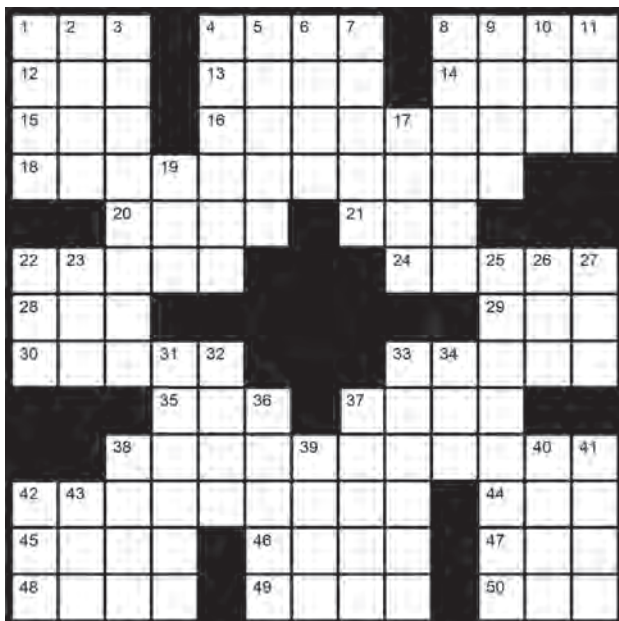

At NMSU, 'Dracula' delivers batty camp

From the moment four actors take their positions by the four wooden crates serving as versatile set pieces throughout the performance, American Southwest Theatre Company's production of "Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors" is an eruption of high-camp, cross-dressing, clownish satire with an ensemble of inspired comic performers juggling multiple roles.

This spoof of Bram Stoker's 1897 novel belongs to a popular genre of anarchic ensemble comedies based on familiar works: Think of "The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (Abridged)," the "Greater Tuna" plays, Patrick Barlow's parody of "The 39 Steps," and similar plays featuring small ensembles taking on an array of characters with lightning-quick costume changes, cross-dressing, simple props and scenic elements and a few puppets to fill out a party scene.

Coincidentally, we recently passed the 40th anniversary of "The Mystery of Irma Vep," the show epitomizing the work of Charles Ludlam's Ridiculous Theatrical Company, drawing from Gothic horror, the films of Alfred Hitchcock and Victorian pulp fiction for inspiration as it explored themes of gender identity, queerness and critique of social hierarchy. These later plays, while mostly in good fun and "safe" to the dominant culture, owe much to Ludlam, too.

At New Mexico State University's resident theatre company, student performers Eliza Phillips, Okalani Ventura, Vance Cook and Carlos Huereca populate the comic antics of "Dracula" writers Gordon Greenberg and Steve Rosen, who first presented this sendup as a radio play in 2020. For all of the slapstick and theatrical jokes (such as actors providing their own ominous mist with spray bottles) the script retains a great deal of satirical dialogue and wry word play at a pace similar to that of the old

Goon Show from BBC radio. The play premiered off-Broadway a year ago and is quickly becoming a favorite of regional and amateur theaters nationwide, lending itself to simple production elements and a small cast.

The demands on the performers are not to be underestimated and generally these students keep up with the breakneck pace and impeccable timing required. Mario Montiel completes the cast as the self-obsessed and insatiable Transylvanian Count Dracula, writhing with unquenchable pan-sexuality that lands like a hurricane on the stuffy, late-Victorian London household of Dr. Westfeldt, his daughters and the nebbishy puddle of traumatized English masculinity that is Lucy's fiancé, Jonathan Harker.

Under the direction of professor

Nichole Hamilton, the clowning is deft enough to allow some sympathy for the characters. Cook wins hearts as the younger sister, Mina, desperate for a suitor until she falls, all too enthusiastically, into a vampire's arms. (Grrrl, here we go again.) Cook emerges from that character into the person of Dr. Jean van Helsing, portraying the iconic vampire hunter as a tough, Teutonic woman riding horseback and hunting the undead in a frock dress, to the consternation and growing curiosity of Phillips' blustering, sexist Dr. Westfeldt.

With no intermission, the hilarity rolls along at breakneck pace to the finish, winking at obvious parallels to

xenophobia and gender norms of our own era. Early in the play, Dracula announces, "I'm a unicorn," and by the end the play we get the message that the boundaries of seriousness and normality keep our authentic passions in a cage, where the soul cries out, like Freddie Mercury, "I want to break free."

"Dracula: A Comedy of Terrors" runs through Oct. 6 at the Mark and Stephanie Medoff Theatre at the ASNMSU Center for the Arts, 1000 E. University Avenue. Ticketing and additional information are available via the box office at 575-646-4515 or online at theatre.nmsu.edu under the "performances and events" tab.

Auditor finds no misuse of funds by CRRUA

The New Mexico Office of the State Auditor released the findings of an investigation into a troubled southern New Mexico utility last week, concluding that there was no evidence of misuse of \$5.3 million in public funds.

The New Mexico Environment Department called for multiple state agencies to take a closer look at the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority in March, alleging

potential “fraud, waste and abuse” of \$5.3 million awarded by the Water Trust Board in 2013.

New Mexico environmental officials requested the investigation after a series of drinking water disasters in late 2023 revealed that the utility had been sending water with “high levels of arsenic” to people living in Sunland Park and Santa Teresa for more than a year, without alerting the public.

The most recent tests show that CRRUA’s drinking water arsenic levels remain within federal lim-

its, but community trust has eroded.

The board granted the funding for the construction and operation of the Santa Teresa Arsenic Community Treatment Plant, and that the allegations were that the money was not spent for the correct purpose, or went unspent entirely.

The auditor’s office reviewed documents provided by the New Mexico Finance authority and the utility, according to a Sept. 24 statement.

All loans and grants related to the \$5.3 million were used for construction and spent between August 2015 and July 2017, the auditor’s findings said.

All the requests to the

finance authority were approved by the environmental agency and there was “no documentation to support misuse by CRRUA of these specific funds,”

according to a statement releasing the findings.

CRRUA did not make anyone available for an interview Tuesday, and instead issued a statement,

with Executive Director Juan Crosby saying he was “gratified” by the outcome.

“We acknowledge that operational issues have resulted in varying degrees of mistrust among some CRRUA customers,” Crosby said in the written statement. “Hopefully, the positive outcome of OSA’s investigation will put many of those concerns to rest and with CRRUA’s continued system improvements help gain customer confidence.”


In the past year, the utility was required to upgrade two filters at arsenic treatment facilities, and raised rates for water after failing to implement an increase over the last five years.

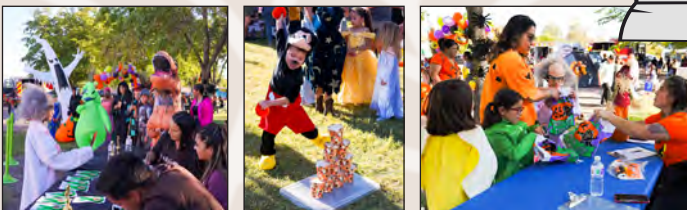

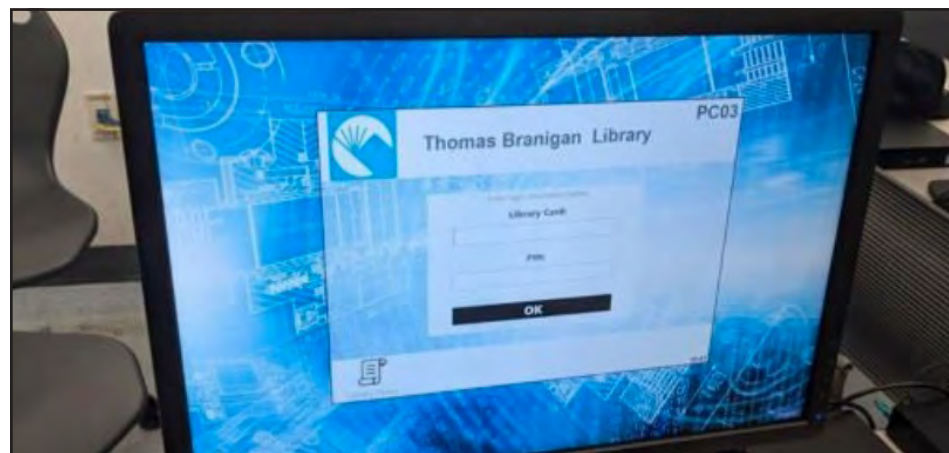

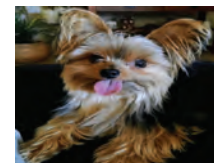

New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission to conduct aerial survey to map subsurface aquifers

Between October 8th and 14th, the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission will conduct an aerial geographical survey using a low-flying helicopter near La Union, Santa Teresa, and Sunland Park as part of its effort to map subsurface aquifers in the area to improve understanding of available groundwater resources. During the geographical survey, instruments suspended below a helicopter, approximately 100 feet above the ground, will collect subsurface measurements along pre-planned flight lines. Measurements are made by creating an electro-

magnetic signal that interacts with the geologic materials beneath the land surface, stimulating a response from those materials and generating a signal that is picked up by receivers. When combined with well data and knowledge of the geology, this geophysical data can produce a three-dimensional picture of the geographic extent of sands, gravels, and clays that make up the aquifers of the regional groundwater system. The survey will take place west of Santa Teresa and east of the Organ Mountains-Desert Peak National Monument-Potrillo Mountains. The helicopter will fly over a flight path designed to get the best available data from the subsurface. The helicopter will not fly over businesses, homes, other inhabitable structures, or confined animal feeding operations. The NMISC is working with a professional surveying company and a helicopter company to conduct the geophysical survey. Experienced pilots specially trained for low-level flying required for geophysical surveys will operate the helicopter and follow the established Federal Aviation Administration rules and regulations in accordance with U.S. law. Aggie athletes join in mental health awareness week

New Mexico State University is among more than 250 schools and organizations taking part in the fifth annual student athlete mental health week, promoting the mental wellbeing of athletes and honoring those whose lives have been lost.

From Oct. 5 to 12, the nonprofit Hilinski's Hope Foundation will take part in activities promoting mental health awareness and resources and rebutting stigmas against seeking help among student

athletes.

The organization was founded in 2018 by Mark and Kym Hilinski in honor of their son, Tyler, who played quarterback for Washington State University who died by suicide after his junior year at the age of 21. Since its inception, the organization reports it has hosted over 315 "Tyler Talks" nationwide, reaching over 78,000 student athletes.

"We miss Tyler every day, but we are grateful to know that our work is making a difference," Kym Hilinski stated in a news release. "Thank

you to each person who has joined us over the last five years, not only for spreading awareness but carrying on Tyler's name and legacy. He will live on through your continued support each time a student athlete takes a field, rink, or track."

This year, the organization is expanding its outreach to marching bands, who it says "hold many of the same pressures of the student athletes, balancing a busy schedule of practices and travel on top of school work. This expansion serves as a message that the mis-

sion of Hilinski's Hope to prioritize mental health stretches beyond the white lines of a college football field and extends to students of all organizations at every level."
