



Vasquez aims for second term in Congress

It's been an up-and-down October for southern New Mexico's congressional representative.

On the one hand, Democrat Gabe Vasquez has been forced to field questions about his college days, questions about cannabis citations in the 2000s, parking tickets and allegations about statements and behavior during his college years.

"I never expected to be a congressperson," Vasquez told the Bulletin in an interview this month. "I don't come from a family and politicians. And I don't come from a family of wealth."

But he's not letting it bring him down.

"To those negative advertise-

ments and those kinds of things. I say look, my record speaks for itself, both on the city council in Las Cruces and my time serving in Congress as a public servant, and I'm going to continue to be a champion for the people and working for the people," Vasquez said.

"If Yvette Herrell wants to run on my traffic tickets from 20 years ago, I will continue to run for the people of New Mexico, and the voters will ultimately be the judge of who's looking out for them and who's looking out for the wealthy," he said.

And so far, the voters – or at least the polls – are proving that Vasquez's "champion of the people" message is resonating.

Herrell seeks return to former House seat

In 2022, Yvette Herrell was denied a second term in Congress by a narrow vote in New Mexico's 2nd Congressional district. Her challenger, Gabe Vasquez of Las Cruces, overtook her by just 1,350 votes. In an interview with the Las Cruces Bulletin, she described that loss as "a hard pill to swallow."

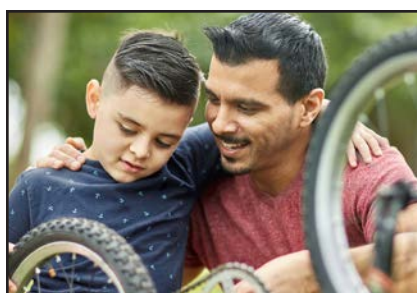
As the lone Republican in the state's delegation to Washington, Herrell added, "New Mexico lost a conservative voice, a different opinion about things or a different way of looking at things." And it wasn't long before she set her sights on returning.

Herrell has run for southern

New Mexico's seat in the House of Representatives in four consecutive elections. In 2018, the former state legislator and real estate broker from Alamogordo narrowly lost her bid for the open seat to Democrat Xochitl Torres Small. In 2020, with President Donald Trump on the ballot, Herrell ousted Torres Small to win her first term in the House.

The district has been represented by Republicans for most of its history, but the district map, redrawn following the 2020 Census, now leans Democratic. Herrell ran for re-election on a map that lost conservative terrain in the east of the state and gained new territory in

Bulletin, Desert Exposure win state press awards

The Las Cruces Bulletin and sister publication Desert Exposure came away with a total of nine awards in the New Mexico Press Association's 2024 Better Newspaper Contest.

The awards were announced during the NM-PA's annual convention in Albuquerque on Saturday, Oct. 26, and covered categories in news reporting, design and typography for print and digital publication. The contest judges were members of the Nevada Press Association.

Staff of Desert Exposure, a monthly publication covering arts, entertainment and culture in southern New Mexico, secured first place for front page design, with judges writing of three editions that were considered, "Outstanding front page designs. High-quality photos, and a really cool illustration of a newly discovered dinosaur species, combine with bold colors, pleasant fonts and smart placement to create three eye-catching covers."

Staff designer Matthew Meerbott also netted a first place award for color ad design for Desert Exposure in the monthly category.

The Las Cruces Bulletin competed in the "weekly class I" category based on its circulation, putting it in competition with papers such as the Taos News, Gallup Sun, Valencia County News-Bulletin and the Rio Grande Sun.

Nearly all of the Bulletin's second place finishes came in behind Taos News, which claimed more than 30 awards including the general excellence award in its class.

One award the Bulletin wrested away from Taos News was the first place award for best web ad. That was for an animated online ad for the Las Cruces International Film Festival designed by Meerbott and featuring cinema curtains opening onto the festival logo, of which judges said, "Love the idea! This was a creative execution that also did not take away from the reading experience nor district readers from your content."

Staff designers Meerbott and Christy Anchondo also claimed second place for design and typography, the duo earning judges' praise for "creative thinking" in making "mundane imagery into something more engaging that it otherwise would be."

Bulletin staff earned a second place nod for best website, with judges calling LasCrucesBulletin.com "clean and well organized. It places a priority on editorial content and has fewer intrusive ads than some other news websites."

Judges also gave the Bulletin second place for best special section published in April for the 40th annual Home and Garden Show in Las Cruces.

and Algernon D'Ammassa won second place for best use of multimedia, for their coverage of a May 9, 2024 protest on the New Mexico State University campus and arrest of 13 people, including live updates on LasCrucesBulletin.com and X (the social media site formerly known as Twitter), reporting the story through print, photography and video. Judges wrote, "Good variety of images and video, good job by the reporter to show the actual scale of the protest and actions taken by police."

Garcia claimed second place for best series, awarded to his two-part story in April covering threats to elected officials in New Mexico.

A story from D'Ammassa featuring an interview with state Sen.

Bill Soules last March about New Mexico's revised graduation requirements won second place in education writing, for which judges cited a "thought-provoking message about the goals of education from a legislative perspective. The writing was clear, quotes were well-chosen, and the focus on expectations for graduation outcomes is a must in the beat."

"I am very proud of our incredible Bulletin

team," Bulletin and DeX publisher Belinda Mills remarked. "Hard work, dedication and an unwavering commitment to excellence is evident in every undertaking throughout the Bulletin organization. We take our responsibility to the Las Cruces community seriously and strive to inform and inspire with truth and style. I am happy we have the opportunity to celebrate our team with the recognition they deserve."

NMSU regents approve president's contract

New Mexico State University's governing board unanimously approved an employment agreement between the university and its incoming president, Valerio Ferme, during a special meeting Oct. 25.

The brief meeting took place by video conference and the only business

item addressed was the agreement. There was no discussion in open session of any terms, such as compensation, length of the contract or a start date. While documents addressed at regular meetings are typically posted on the regents' website, that was not the case for Friday's meeting. The Las Cruces Bulletin is seeking the document.

The regents selected

Ferme on Sept. 19, tapping him to be the university's first permanent leader since April 2023 with the departure of Chancellor Dan Arvizu.

Ferme is executive vice president of academic affairs and provost at the University of Cincinnati. He is the former dean of that university's college of arts and sciences, and previously held leadership positions at Northern

Arizona University and the University of Colorado Boulder.

Regents and top administrators took turns welcoming Ferme and lauding his selection.

Regent chair Ammu Devasthali, reading prepared remarks, said, "The Board of Regents will stand with you side-by-side in true partnership to lead this university, to calm our waters, to bigger and better things that we know we are capable of as NMSU."

She was not the only one to acknowledge a desire to turn the page on a tumultuous period for the university.

The chapter begun by a surprise decision in 2018, by a former board, to hire a president and chancellor

sharing nearly a million dollars in annual compensation, saw positive gains for the university, such as increased enrollment, gains in research funding, building of new educational and research facilities and the football team's entry into Conference USA.

Yet it ended in leadership shifts, fractious relations with a new graduate student worker union, serious blows to the reputation of the athletics program amid explosive stories about the men's basketball program. A shootout in which an Aggie athlete shot and killed a University of New Mexico student in self-defense in 2022, followed by complaints of systematic

sexual assault on the team that led to criminal charges and lawsuits, drew intense scrutiny. The university also settled a lawsuit brought by former Provost Carol Parker, who alleged she was scapegoated for unpopular policies and punished for investigating allegations of racist and sexist pay disparities.

Arvizu assumed full leadership with the departure of President John Floros in 2022.

Regents decided in December 2022 that Arvizu's contract, which would expire in mid-2023, would not be renewed. Arvizu departed that April. Since then, the university has been led by

two consecutive interim presidents: Jay Gogue and, currently, Mónica Torres.

On Friday, Regent Deborah Romero said she was confident Ferme would “bring that peace that we need, that ability to unify people.”

Regent Christopher Saucedo called Ferme’s impending arrival at the job “a new beginning.”

In brief remarks to the meeting, Ferme thanked the regents for his selection, the agreement and the warm welcome that had already been extended to him and his family.

“I do feel the responsibility to be an excellent representative of the university itself, in everything it does,” he said. Later in his address, he added, “There are untapped opportunities that we can really make work on behalf of the university and the state. ... I’m excited to engage the ‘us’ that comes together in our communities, and I think that together we will turn these possibilities into realities and elevate and enhance the pathways already at work in the strategic plan, but well beyond them.”

From the regents’ discussion, it emerged that Ferme will soon move to New Mexico and begin a transition period alongside Torres, the chancellor of NMSU’s community colleges who has been interim president since March.

Contract terms

The university released the contract, with signatures dated Oct. 21, to the Bulletin upon request shortly after Friday’s meeting.

Per the agreement, Ferme’s employment will begin on Nov. 18 as president-designate for a transition period until Jan. 1, when he takes on full responsibility as president. The initial end date of the agreement is Jan. 1, 2030.

He will also join the faculty as a fully tenured professor of English, with the possibility of a faculty teaching position in the event of his departure from the president’s office, depending on the circumstances, at the highest rate of pay NMSU offers to tenured professors. In that event, he would also have the option of taking a one-year sabbatical.

Ferme will be responsible for the whole university system, including its community colleges and extension offices


throughout the state, with the exception of the New Mexico Department of Agriculture, a state agency that is managed independently.


He will be paid a base salary of \$600,000 per year, with incentive pay up to \$50,000 annually and free housing at the official University Center and Residence. Ferme will be eligible for the same benefits as other administrators, business and travel expenses, and moving reimbursements up to \$22,000.

The \$50,000 cap on incentive pay, which would be based on performance goals set by Ferme and the regents, is considerably more modest than incentives offered to Flores and Arvizu when they were hired in 2018, at base salaries of \$500,000 and \$450,000 respectively, with incentives up to 30 and 20 percent of their salaries.

As to severance pay, if Ferme’s agreement is terminated, he could receive as much as 12 months’ pay and accrued benefits, depending on the timing and circumstances. If the agreement ends because of mental or physical incapacity, Ferme would receive his base salary for up to six months through the end of his contract; or 12, if terminated by the regents at their discretion (as opposed to firing him for just cause).

The agreement also states that Ferme has committed to annual charitable contributions to NMSU causes, beginning with \$10,200 to Aggie Cupboard, the campus food pantry.

Advocates push for safe drug use facility at Las Cruces council

A facility built for residents to use drugs without fear of arrest or harassment or overdose may be a difficult sell in the city of Las Cruces.

But should Las Cruces decide to fund an Overdose Prevention Center, advocates told city officials Monday that public safety and public health would improve and that residents using drugs would have more oppor-

tunities to find treatment and assistance.

Kailin See, a director with the California-based Homeless Health Care Los Angeles, made the pitch to four city councilors and several department administrators during a work session meeting on Oct. 28.

That pitch for an Overdose Prevention Center, simply put, is to build a facility where drug users could use drugs indoors safely, without fear of being arrested or



harassed by other people on the street or dying of an overdose, all the while being connected to services.

The ultimate goal, See said, is to save lives.

“OPCs are not a pana-

cea, they’re not the single thing that is going to get us out of this crisis,” See said. “But they are a really critical solution.”

The center would not be unique to Las Cruces. There are dozens of similar facilities across the U.S.

“They’re bright, they’re big, they look like the kind of places that people that use drugs want to hang out,” See said, referring to the centers.

The pitch did seem to resonate with some in the city, especially as officials consider what to do with millions in opioid settlement money while turning away others.

“I’m looking forward to the conversation with the opioid settlement committee on why or why not

something like this should be on the list of recommendations,” said Councilor Johana Bencomo, referring to a committee of residents and experts deputized to provide city and county officials with recommendations about how to spend an estimated \$25 million in settlement money.

“Harm reduction strategies are vitally important at this moment,” Bencomo added. “More and more people are dying, and so we have to interfere as boldly and as best as possible,”

Additionally, two people who identified themselves as residents in recovery from drug use said they were in favor of an overdose prevention center in Las Cruces.

Two others, Juan Garcia and Sarah Smith of

Coalition of Conservatives in Action, expressed skepticism.

“Although my initial reaction to an OPC is no, and I did see the movie ‘Love in the Age of Fentanyl,’ if these centers can be used as a conduit for treatment forced through the judicial system or volunteer, this may be an option to consider,” Garcia said. “And I stress, maybe.”

Garcia’s reference was to a 2023 documentary about a supervised drug consumption site in Vancouver, Canada.


Smith was less open to the idea. She said that a center would communicate to the public that illegal drugs were now legal and lead to more drug use. Smith’s comments also drew criticism from other members of the public who said her logic was flawed and called on her and others to stop using pejorative language about people who use drugs.

As with all work ses-

An Albuquerque Journal/Research & Polling poll released in late October put Vasquez ahead of Herrell, with Vasquez at about 49 percent compared to Herrell at 45 percent.

But now is the home stretch as the race speeds towards the final weeks and days. For Vasquez, it's not just his job in Congress on the line, it's the future of New Mexico and the U.S.

In his interview with the Bulletin, Vasquez explained his belief that his opponent would be a harbinger of a more authoritarian America.

"We have free and fair elections in this country. But right now, MAGA Republicans are trying to change the game. They're trying to give authority

over elections to non-elected election administrators or state legislators who have nothing to do with certifying a federal presidential election. And that is dangerous," Vasquez said.

Vasquez said the number one issue on voters' minds is the economy.

"Lower-class and middle-class families right now are having a really tough time making ends meet.

And so, I think it's just all about raising wages, providing better jobs, supporting an economy that works for the middle class, and without that, it's difficult to really think about anything else," Vasquez said.

Crime, reproductive health access, border security and immigration have been prevailing issues in the campaign. On the latter, Vasquez said he had

a "positive vision" of a reformed immigration system, and that it starts with farm workers.

"When I go visit farmers in conservative areas like Arrey or Derry, and they're telling me that their onions are rotting out in the field, that they don't have the workforce that they need, we found solutions to that," Vasquez said, referring to changes in work visas.

Vasquez added that he'd like to see more money funnel to border agencies to prevent or reduce the amount of fentanyl that travels throughout the U.S. border's ports of entry and has introduced legislation to promote that change.

He also said that he introduced a bill that would have directed money seized from cartels to fund educational programs for youth

who live in border communities such as Santa Teresa and Sunland Park.

"We can have better education for young people to not get involved as mules for the drug trade," Vasquez said. "I've heard directly from police officers in places like Sunland Park and from school administrators that that continues to happen."

Vasquez's desired second term depends entirely on voters from a wide swath of New Mexico. Following the 2020 redistricting, voters from Las Cruces, southern Albuquerque and Carlsbad make up this district.

He beat Herrell in 2022 by 1,350 votes in an election that drew nearly 200,000 votes. Now, those same groups declare the race as a likely Democratic victory.

City resumes planning and zoning livestreams

The city of Las Cruces has resumed livestreaming meetings of the Planning and Zoning Commission as of Oct. 22, after a two-year hiatus.

Mandy Guss, the city's communications director, confirmed the change to how meetings are presented for one of the city's most important bodies. The city charter outlines the duties of the commission, which include reviewing the city's zoning, planning, and platting, investigating any problems in that space

and making recommendations to the city council on development questions.

Guss said the city stopped streaming the meetings in Oct. 2022 when the communications department stopped streaming it because it had low viewership, and her department didn't have the staff capacity to cover it. But Guss said a request from a city councilor and more staff have allowed her department to resume streaming.

The live streams are broadcast on the city's website and YouTube page.

sions of the Las Cruces City Council, no action was taken during the meeting. However, it was also clear that the meeting gave the Opioid Settlement Advisory Council something to consider going forward.

Las Cruces, Doña Ana County, the state of New Mexico and dozens of other states and cities across the U.S. sued several large pharmaceutical companies for playing a role in creating the opioid crisis, which has rocked the social order and led to thousands of deaths. Most of the companies settled with the govern-

ment, sending millions of dollars meant to remediate the impact of years of overprescribing opioid drugs.

Las Cruces, Doña Ana County and other area governments formed a committee of experts to determine how to spend that money.

Athena Huckaby, a public health professional and committee member, told the council that they had not previously considered an overdose prevention center but would discuss it at an upcoming meeting.

"Before we bring a full suite of recommendations to you, we want to understand how to measure the success of those programs," Huckaby said.

Las Cruces moves on \$23 million GO Bonds for housing, parks

General obligation bond projects are well underway, and several projects have expected spring or summer completion dates, according to a presentation to the Las Cruces City Council.

David Sedillo, the city's public works director, updated the council on the progress of four projects during a meeting on Oct. 15. In November 2022, Las Cruces voters approved some \$23 million in bonds for these projects.

New Mexico municipalities use bonds to fund brick-and-mortar capital improvement projects like parks, libraries and other city services. The city uses property tax revenue to pay the bonds back.

Affordable housing

The most untraditional of the lot, a \$6 million bond for affordable housing, was approved by voters with 20,156 voters in the affirmative (65 percent) and 10,872 against (35 percent.)

Officials said this bond would help stimulate affordable housing development. The city estimates that Las Cruces is about 5,600 units short of meeting the housing demand. Academic research shows that higher rent and housing prices negatively affect crime and the local economy.

Still, city officials and the council sat on the bond for about a year before cashing it in. The

affordable housing bond was taxable, since the money does not go to brick-and-mortar projects like other bonds. At the time of approval, officials said they feared taxes and interest rates would gobble up too much of the bond.

However, they ultimately sold the bond, despite the rates, in April 2024.

Natalie Green, the city's housing and neighborhood services administrator, said about half of the bond has been allocated so far. She also gave progress reports on the city's biggest housing efforts, including the Three Sisters Apartment complex, Pedrena and Peachtree Canyon.

Green said Three Sis-

ters, located near Meerscheidt Center on North Walnut Street, is expected to open in June 2025 fully, but portions will be open beforehand. Pedrena, located on El Paseo Road near Las Cruces High School, is scheduled to open in May 2025 and is reserved for seniors. Green also noted that officials held a groundbreaking ceremony for Peachtree Canyon in October.

Fire Station 9

Officials have promised that a new fire station located on the city's far east side in the growing Metro Verde area will improve response times for other east Las Cruces neighborhoods and serve as key public safety infrastruc-

ture).

Sedillo said the city received about \$1.9 million and prioritized revitalizing La Llorona Park, which abuts the Rio Grande at the West Picacho bridge.

As part of this project, the city will upgrade and repair restroom facilities, the area trails, and other amenities. Sedillo said the next steps are finalizing the park's changes with an international organization that oversees development along the Rio Grande.

Sedillo said construction is expected to start in November, with a completion date in September 2025.

Any leftover money will replace equipment at Tellbrook Park on the city's south side. Sedillo said he expects money to be available for this based on the estimated cost of the first project.

ture for the newest part of Las Cruces.

Voters approved the \$10 million bond, with 22,974 voters in favor (74 percent) and 7,900 against (26 percent). That translated into \$9.8 million for the city, Sedillo said. The city also sent \$2 million to the project from the Telshor Fund.

Sedillo said the project is on schedule. Construction is slated to begin on Oct. 28 and is expected to be completed in February 2026.

Park improvements

Voters also sent \$2 million to the parks after the city pitched the bond to improve existing facilities. The bond was approved by 23,074 in favor (74 percent) and 8,077 against (26 per-

East Mesa Recreational Complex

In one of the largest local public works efforts in recent memory, voters in 2022 sent \$5 million to fund the East Mesa Recreational Complex and approved a \$16.9 million bond, much of which went to the same project.

The city held a grand opening for the complex's pickleball courts in September and said much of the project's first phase is complete. Sedillo said the city is still working on acquiring shade structures and designing playground equipment.

Sedillo said eight sand volleyball courts, two basketball courts, an umpire and IT building, restrooms, street furniture and more playground equipment were also set to go out to bid in November.

Cool project keeps getting cooler

The South Central Solid Waste Authority and the Southern New Mexico Correctional Facility have recently struck on a unique win-win partnership project.

Albuquerque. Yet the district still encompasses the state's southern border and New Mexico's bootheel, as well as the southeast where much of the state's petroleum sector is based.

Herrell did not entirely blame redistricting for her 2022 loss, though she suggested it was one factor in lower turnout among Republicans that year, particularly in Otero County. On Nov. 5, 2024, with Donald Trump once again at the top of the Republican ballot, she anticipated more participation and excitement along with inroads she has toiled to establish in the newer parts of her district.

Regarding policy, Herrell said her campaign is squarely based on tougher law enforcement on the border, lower federal spending and reduced regulations, crime and education.

This year, there will be no televised debate between Herrell and Vasquez, after the campaigns could not agree on a date, leaving the campaign discourse mainly to advertisements. The Herrell campaign and outside groups supporting her have attacked Vasquez's voting record on those issues but in the closing

weeks have focused on sowing doubts about his character using police reports from 20 years ago documenting unpaid traffic citations, misdemeanor cannabis violations and complaints alleging he made verbal threats or slurs. Meanwhile, Vasquez and the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee have sought to tie Herrell to Project 2025, an omnibus policy document drafted by supporters of Trump (which Trump has disavowed), and efforts at a national ban on abortion (something Herrell has said she would not support).

In an interview at the Bulletin's offices, Herrell mostly avoided mentioning her opponent and said she wanted to work in a bipartisan manner. "We don't have enough honest conversations because everything gets so divisive," she said, "and I think it plagues the ability for us to come up with some solutions, a different idea — and I think that's sort of the missing piece, especially in Congress."

In past runs, particularly 2018, Herrell has taken a more partisan tone against Democratic governance and highlighted her alignment with Trump on the issues. In her first speech on the House floor, less than a day after the Jan. 6, 2021 attack on the

U.S. Capitol, she argued against certifying electoral college results from Arizona and Pennsylvania in the 2020 presidential election. That led the Las Cruces City Council to pass a resolution condemning her action.

At the time, Vasquez was himself a city councilor representing District 3.

With a recent Albuquerque Journal poll suggesting Vasquez leads the contest by four percentage points and Herrell closing the distance from previous polling, Herrell emphasized bipartisanship over broader ideological battles, saying that face-to-face conversations with voters in newer and more Democratic parts of her district had been productive.

"I think our state could be way more competitive regionally," Herrell said, returning to challenges such as New Mexico's longstanding low marks in education, as well as crime rates and "crazy tax policy" she said makes New Mexico less attractive for private enterprise.

She said, "If we could just come together and work collectively with our elected officials on every level ... and see how we can best help the people of New Mexico and, obviously, the nation, I think we'd be better for it in so many ways."

It's easy for air show viewers to forget dangers

The Air and Space Expo at the Las Cruces International Airport was one of the most entertaining shows I've seen in years.

I hadn't been to an air show since I was a kid, and was surprised to feel the exact same thrill now as I had then watching an airplane nosedive toward the ground, only to pull up at the last second and gracefully loop back into the sky.

There is a mixture of artistry and technical precision that combine to create both an exciting and beautiful viewing experience, even if you do have to spend a lot of time with your head tilted all the way back looking straight up. There really isn't anything else like it.

I left Saturday thinking this could have huge po-

tential for our community in the future. Ours was the only air show in the country this year, according to announcers at the event.

Reno, Nevada has been the hub for air shows and air races ever since the first air races were held there in 1964. Each year, thousands of aviation enthusiasts have flocked to northern Nevada for the event.

But now the Reno Air Racing Association is looking for a new home for the annual event. And, in 2025 the National Championship Air Races will be held in Roswell, which beat finalists Pueblo, Colorado and Casper, Wyoming for

the honor. This could be an economic boon for southern New Mexico, I thought.

Then I read that on Sunday, stunt pilot Chuck

Coleman was killed in a crash while performing a routine he had undoubtedly done hundreds of times before at air shows around the country. Spectators watched in horror as his plane did not pull up at the last second, but instead nosedived into the ground.

Watching two airplanes cross within feet of each other while traveling well over 100 mph is truly impressive the first time you see it. But after a while, it starts to look routine. The music, the festive atmo-

sphere and the expertise of the pilots make it easy to forget about the risk.

Coleman was a pilot and engineer who had logged more than 10,000 hours of flight time and performed in hundreds of air shows. He was one of five engineers who designed and built the first jet-powered aircraft to fly around the world nonstop without refueling.

He was the flight instructor for actors in the movie Top Gun: Maverick, making 140 flights to familiarize them with the Navy F-18 Hornets seen in the movie.

All of which is to say that while the stunts may have seemed routine to me, I'm certain they never did to him.

I'm not sure what this means for the future of

our air show. Crashes happen. There have been 24 pilots killed during the Reno Air Races, including two in 2023. A crash near the stands in 2011 also killed 10 spectators and injured 69. The races have always gone on.

They didn't stop racing cars after Dale Earnhardt crashed. They didn't stop riding bulls after Lane Frost got gored. And they aren't going to stop racing airplanes and performing stunts. I suppose danger is part of the appeal for both spectators and participants.

I'm just glad that we decided to go to the Saturday show and I wasn't there Sunday.

Know their votes before you vote

Our entire state legislature is on the ballot right now. This is a good time to look deeper to see how our Las Cruces area representatives and senators have voted in the Legislature.

Our local representatives currently seeking reelection are Micaela Lara Cadena, Joanne Ferrary, Tara Jaramillo, Jenifer Jones, Angelica Rubio, Raymundo Lara and Nathan Small.

Our local senators who are currently seeking reelection are Joseph Cervantes, Crystal Diamond Brantley, Carrie Hamblen, William Soules and Jeff Steinborn.

Due to greatly increased crime in Las Cruces over the last few years, crime reduction is one of the most important areas our legislators need to address. Repeat offenders are one of the biggest problems in Las Cruces. In court, many repeat offenders are deemed in-

competent to stand trial, so they are just released back onto the streets where they commit crime after crime after crime. For instance, from a public records request, one of the top repeat offenders in Las Cruces has more than 120 charges for aggravated assault, drug dealing (meth), battery, trespassing, shoplifting and more.

Our state senators and representatives had the opportunity to work on crime laws during the governor’s recent special session in July. The governor specifically wanted the legislature to pass laws to stop repeat offenders from being continually released back onto the streets. However, at the special session, only Senator Diamond Brantley and Rep. Jones were willing to work on crime laws. All others refused to work on crime laws at the session. Representatives Cadena, Ferrary, Jaramillo, Lara, Rubio and Small all voted to refuse to allocate \$10 million for border security to stop the flow of

fentanyl into New Mexico. Senators Cervantes, Hamblen and Steinborn all voted to adjourn the special session without hearing any crime laws.

In 2023, the legislature and governor signed into law the requirement that schoolteachers help children access transgender and abortion care with no parental notification and no age restrictions. According to law HB 7, schools can be fined \$5,000 per instance if teachers or nurses “interfere” with access to care by talking to children’s parents about their transgender or abortion procedures. The following representatives and senators voted for this law: Reps. Cadena, Ferrary, Jaramillo, Lara, Rubio and Small; Senators Cervantes, Hamblen, Soules and Steinborn. Only Senator Diamond Brantley and Rep. Jones voted against this law which cuts parents out of these crucial decisions that can affect the rest of their children’s lives.

Earlier this year in 2024,

the legislature passed and the governor signed into law HB 41, which imposes fuel standards that are expected to raise gasoline prices in New Mexico by 50 to 80 cents per gallon. The following representatives and senators voted for HB 41: Reps. Cadena, Ferrary, Lara, Rubio and Small; senators Hamblen, Soules and Steinborn. Senator Cervantes did not vote on this law. Senator Diamond Brantley and Reps. Jaramillo and Jones voted against this law, which will raise gas prices in New Mexico.

These voting records of our legislators matter. With all of our senators and representatives on the ballot, Las Cruces have a chance right now to decide whether they want more of the same, or whether they want to vote for change.

Las Cruces man sentenced for 2022 killing

BULLETIN REPORT

A Las Cruces man was sentenced to seven years in prison after a jury convicted him of manslaughter earlier this year.

Jason Salais, 38, had initially been charged with first-degree murder after police said he killed motorcyclist Jose Gomez, 22, in February 2022.

According to court records, police believed that Salais used a truck to ram Gomez near Knox Street and Uni-

versity Avenue on Feb. 26. Court records also noted that Salais told police after the incident that Gomez flashed a pistol at him during the encounter.

Salais went to trial on May 6, where a jury acquitted him of first-degree murder but found him guilty of the lesser crime of voluntary manslaughter.

Court records show that Conrad Perea handed down a six-year sentence with a one-year enhancement because of past convictions.



DEATH AS A CELEBRATION

DÍA DE LOS MUERTOS

expands its reach beyond Mesilla

Did you know that there are still people living among us who think Día de los Muertos is just a Mexican version of Halloween? Recognized as the time when the border between the spirit realm and the real world dissolve to allow souls of the dead to return so they can eat, drink and dance the night away with their loved ones, Día de los Muertos is seen as a time of celebration and sometimes retribution. To prepare for these visitations, family members build ofrendas, or altars, in their homes or public spaces decorated with candles, flowers, personal items and favorite foods. There's very little candy involved, and it's the adults who wear the elaborately decorated costumes, not the kids. Those who follow these traditions take the ceremonies very seriously. The Calavera Coalition keeps the traditions alive on the Mesilla Plaza every year, during the first weekend in November. What started almost three decades ago has grown to become the largest regional Day of the Dead festival in New Mexico. It is not, however, the only event taking place in the Las Cruces metro area this year. "Day of the Dead is something that is very personal to a lot of people, including me," said Maria Lupe Hernandez-Muñiz, the organizer of Día de los Muertos: Arte, Música y Cultura, the latest addition to the city's event schedule. "The Mesilla festival is such a beautiful event, I wanted to add onto it. We're not looking to replace it, or make people choose. By all means, go to both! We want to keep growing this event in the community, as an extension of the original." To allow this to happen, the Las Cruces celebration will begin at 7 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 2, and run until 11 p.m., at the Grapevine Plaza, 3900 W. Picacho Ave. The Mesilla celebration runs for three days on the Mesilla Plaza on Calle Principal, starting at 2-9 p.m., Friday, Nov. 1; 10 a.m.-9 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 2; and 10 a.m.-3 p.m., Sunday, Nov. 3. Both will feature live musical and dance performances, art vendors and community ofrendas.

As an added treat, the newly opened Taylor-Mesilla Historic Site will present a mini exhibit in the Reynolds Visitor Center called “Spirit Crossing,” that focuses on the traditions of the holiday by explaining the symbolism and meaning of what visitors might see in the community altars set up around the Mesilla Plaza. The hours are 8:30 a.m.-7 p.m., Friday and Saturday; 8:30 a.m.-4 p.m., Sunday.

For many in Mesilla, the highlight of their celebration is the candlelight procession from the Plaza to Mesilla Cemetery at 6:45 p.m. on Saturday. It is a solemn but joyous parade, complete with beautiful costumes and intricate make up. For the Las Cruces event there will be a juried art show with cash prizes.

“One of the things I really wanted to be sure of is that, not only is this a cultural event, but also an opportunity for economic impact,” Hernandez-Muñiz said. “So not only are we having cash prizes for our juried artists, but also for our community altars, as well. That will be determined by community voting. I thought it was very important to add that element.”

In Mesilla, in addition to the traditional fare, there will be a free movie on the Plaza, 7 p.m., Friday. Last year’s presentation of “Coco” was such a success that, this year, they’re doing it again by screening “Book of Life.” Performers will include Grupo Folklorico Valle del Sol, Aztec Dancers and local bands. In Las Cruces, the acts include Blanca Ruiz, Satisfyed and DJ Topo Chico spinning cumbias. Both are family-friendly.

“The idea behind our event

was to make sure we honor our rich traditions, but also offer a fresh perspective to appeal to our younger generations,” Hernandez-Muñiz said. “We want people to bring their children.

That’s where it all starts. That’s how they get introduced to our wonderful culture and traditions and, hopefully, continue them as they get older.”

Both events are free of

charge, except of course for food and drinks, as well as any vendor merchandise that catches your eye. The only difference is that the Las Cruces event is already out of tickets. Not to worry, however, as an onsite registration will be set up for latecomers. “Even if you didn’t get an early ticket, stop by anyway,” said Hernandez-Muñiz. “There will be room for you.”

Which means there are now two viable options available to make the argument against viewing this most sacred of holidays as just another seasonal gimmick. Whether you take part in one or both, you won’t be disappointed. You’ll find yourself thinking about and celebrating those you’ve lost, all the while knowing there’s an entire community that shares in your celebrations. And that, dear friends, is what Día de los Muertos is all about.

WHEN WORLDS COLLIDE

Renaissance ArtsFaire welcomes all time travelers

Over the last few years, the Doña Ana Arts Council has worked diligently to reimagine their 53-year-old Renaissance ArtsFaire as something less, well, dated.

What started out, as all do, with a medieval sensibility that brought back a prosperous period of artistic rejuvenation has slowly morphed into a time traveler's catch-all of times, places and cultures. The result is a literal cornucopia of possibilities for creators of every assortment.

Billed as the largest juried art show in southern New Mexico, attracting over 150 artists, vendors and food booths, the atmosphere is still festive and

the offerings are still diverse. You'll still find original, hand-crafted items, including jewelry, pottery and ceramics, photographs, leather goods, paintings and drawings, sculpture, toys, textiles and wood. These days, however, fantasy and science fiction are every bit as common as historical recreations.

Present still are the wide range of musical performances and acts on the Main Stage, the Royal Courts, the Middle Eastern Village, the Children's Realm, on the Jousting Field and around the lake. You'll still find performances by The Order of Epona, Frosty Locks, Empire Pipes and Drums, Karuna and the New World Drummers and Dancers, the Queen's Court, the Crimson Bear Court and the Society for Creative Anachro-

nism. These days the offerings also include Mermaid Jade, the Cycling Unicorn, Odd Lab, Ballet Folklorico Corazon and one-man-band Daniel Eady.

What's really different,

however, is the audience. In its ongoing crusade to raise attendance, the Arts Council has raised the stakes, by making costumes of every variety not just welcome, but admissible. Good news for the cosplayers among us.

"If you show up in a costume, no matter what you're wearing, it should work," said Doña Ana Arts Council Executive Director Karrie Porter. "There's this funny thing that seems to be happening at Ren Faires all across the country, where people show up wearing Star Trek uniforms or dressed like H.G. Wells' time traveller, with a steampunk look. Some people invest a lot of time, effort and money into these costumes, so we're saying anybody who dresses up in a costume can get

in for the reduced amount of seven dollars."

Though Porter is new to the arts council, having taken over the reins in late August, she has dived right in with gusto. "I attended last year as a citizen," she said. "I had no idea that the position at the arts council was going to open up, or that I was going to apply for it, so I just enjoyed it as an attendee. It was a lot of fun, and now I'm running it."

The new council leader wants everybody to know that despite the change in leadership, she's done her homework and is 100 percent dedicated to making this year's ArtsFaire an event to remember.

"What I discovered is, a lot of

'Good People' showcases brilliant play with some stumbles

Add playwright David Lindsay-Abaire's "Good People" to the list of dozens of sensational scripts that have only made their way to Las Cruces via No Strings Theatre Company.

That list also includes Lindsay-Abaire's Pulitzer-Prize-winning "Rabbit Hole," which they staged in 2010. Both works contain richly complicated characters, compelling themes, unexpected turns, memorable dialogue and a masterful balance of humor and pathos.

From "Southie" (a Boston neighborhood oft-depicted in film and on stage), Lindsay-Abaire has stated that of the many characters he's created in his large body of work, "Good People" is "the most explicit version of the people [he] grew up with."

His work is marked by an obvious affection for the characters he creates, even as he reveals their

flaws. This play asks us to consider what defines a good person, and to evaluate six layered, damaged individuals on their actions within their circumstances.

The centerpiece of the story is Margie Walsh, played by Bekah Taulbee, the show's assistant director and lighting designer, who replaced the production's lead actor the week before opening. Margie is the middle-aged single mother of a significantly developmentally delayed adult daughter. In the first scene of the play, we witness her awkward dismissal from her dollar store cashier job. Her twenty-something boss Stevie (Atticus Sterritt) is the son of one of Margie's life-long friends, but he's forced to fire her because of her frequent tardiness.

Whether over home-brewed coffee or bingo cards, Margie's banter with her closest friend Jean (Karen Buerdsell) and landlord Dottie (Janie Franz) was a highlight.

Jean recently bumped into a brief romantic partner of Margie's early years, and suggests that she reach out to inquire if he has job openings in his reproductive endocrinology office. This sets a riveting series of events into motion.

Margie goes to visit Mike (AJ Tumminaro) at work. Minimizing spoilers, Margie later meets Mike's much younger wife, Kate (Lisa Taylor).

The skeleton of this brilliant play is there. The six actors can be seen, heard, and understood. Director Nikka Ziemer demonstrated in her curtain speech that she had emphasized an exploration of the play's themes with her actors, and that was apparent. With a script of this caliber, perhaps that is plenty.

Given the strength of some of the theatre's recent work, I was dis-



appointed that many opportunities were lost here. The aging makeup intended to aid actors in presenting maturity was amateurish and distracting. Rather than younger performers thinking of 50-year-olds as possessing somewhat less energy than in their youth, it encouraged them to lean into sluggish flatness. Happily, Buerdsell, Franz and Taylor escaped this trap, presenting colorful, life-filled characters.

Joshua Taulbee's scenic design was minimalist, but somehow complicated enough to result in prolonged set changes accompanied by music that was thematically fitting but muddied the storytelling water. If we have cell phones in this setting, why is no music from the 21st century? A well-painted brick wall that remained in every

location was confusing. Was its use in the doctor's office or fancy home intended to demonstrate that the characters' rough backgrounds could not be escaped? Then why is the wall so nice?

Details in such a small theater are crucial; it was distracting to see actors not marking highly visible bingo cards in a way that correlates with the numbers announced.

Still, there is much to be lauded in this theatrical effort, and there four more opportunities to witness it.

"Good People" runs through Nov. 3 at the Black Box Theatre, 430 N. Main Street. Performance times include a 7 p.m. performance on Thursday, Oct. 31; 8 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 1 and Saturday Nov. 2; and 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 3. Admission prices range from \$12-18. Ticketing and further information are available at 575-523-1223 or online at no-strings.org.



Q: I recently watched the movie "Civil War" on HBO, and I was impressed with Kirsten Dunst. I know she was a child actress. When did she begin acting?

A: Kirsten Dunst was six years old at the time she appeared in a "Saturday Night Live" sketch and filmed the Woody Allen-directed segment of the 1989 anthology "New York Stories,"

her first movie, but she had been working in TV commercials since the age of three. She also was in the 1990 film "The Bonfire of the Vanities" as Tom Hanks' daughter and was in a 1993 episode of "Star Trek: The Next Generation," but many people recall the first time they saw her as being in "Interview With the Vampire," the 1994 movie of the Anne Rice novel that teamed Dunst with Tom Cruise and Brad Pitt.

From there, work opportunities continued to flow for her. She played the younger version of March sister Amy in the 1994 version of the much-filmed Louisa May Alcott story "Little Women," she had a considerable hit with the 1995 fantasy-adventure "Jumanji," and she joined the NBC drama "ER" in its third season as a young prostitute pro-

tected by George Clooney's Dr. Doug Ross. "Wag the Dog," "Small Soldiers" and "Drop Dead Gorgeous" were among the movies that rounded out the 1990s for Dunst.

"The Virgin Suicides" (1999) and "Bring It On" (2000) continued to affirm her versatility, and her portrayal of Mary Jane Watson in the Tobey Maguire-led Spider-Man blockbusters during the 2000s put her fame on an even higher plane. After those, more adult roles became her norm, not only in movies — "Marie Antoinette" (2006), "Melancholia" (2011) "Bachelorette" (2012) etc. — but also on television, encompassing " Fargo," in which she starred with her then-husband-to-be Jesse Plemons, and "On Becoming a God in Central Florida."

Las Cruces economic growth continues, cannabis sales remain high

BULLETIN REPORT

The local cannabis market fell slightly this quarter, but data presented to the Las Cruces City Council this week suggested that local sales of cannabis remain high two years after the market opened in 2022.

That information was among a cluster of data points given to the city council on Oct. 28 during a quarterly presentation on the city's economic outlook.

"We expect economic growth to continue," said city economist Monica

Torres, "but at a more moderate pace as compared to recent years."

Torres said that the decline in cannabis sales from July 1 to Aug. 31 stemmed from a decline in medical cannabis sales. Data from the state Taxation and Revenue Department showed that medical sales, which comprise about 30 percent of all sales, fell by about 15 percent.

However, the same data showed that the decline was a minor departure from past quarters.

Since 2022, cannabis has been available for

purchase by adults for non-medical use through a state-regulated framework, from licensed dis-

pensaries, with customers charged a special excise tax. Medical cannabis sales are tax-free, yet enrollment in the state's medical cannabis program has declined since the adult-use marketplace opened.

Torres reported that Las Cruces had collected about \$211,000 from the cannabis excise tax. The city has not yet decided on a use for this revenue.

While the cannabis market contracted, Torres said

that gross receipts taxes increased by about 1.8 percent (about \$500,000), continuing a trend of growing GRT following a dip in 2020, the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic which saw severe restrictions on most businesses and social gatherings.

GRT is a critical source of revenue for nearly all municipalities, and Las Cruces is no exception. An

increase in local GRT is on the ballot before the city's voters on Nov. 5.

In the community, unemployment is about 5.3 percent, an increase from last year's 4.3 percent. Home listings, meanwhile, increased by about 1 percent to about \$353,000.

The city also saw 148 new businesses register during the quarter, city staff reported.

Fundraising events held during Cancer Warriors Week, Oct. 12-19, raised more than \$180,000 in cash along with more than \$50,000 in in-kind sponsorships, according to Cancer Warriors Las Cruces founder Marci Dickerson. She added that 100 percent of the money raised during the week “is spent on our Cancer Warriors program and is only spent in Doña Ana County.”

The Oct. 17 Bras for a Cause dinner at New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum included a live auction of decorated bras and a

painting created during the event by renowned artist and Las Cruces native Abel Garcia.

“What was so amazing and special about this painting,” Dickerson said, is that “not only did Abel

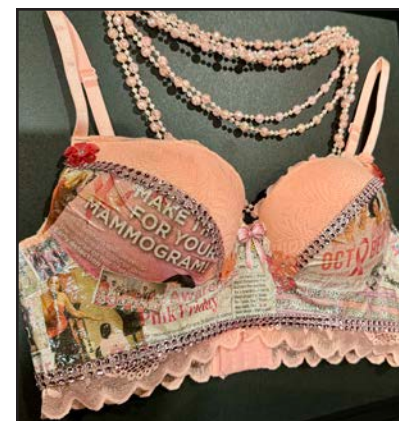

out for the Zumba event” that opened Cancer Warriors Week, Dickerson said, and also for the Oct. 15 NMSU football game that included a Cancer Warriors tailgate event. She said more than 150 people participated in the Cancer Warriors Oct. 19 5K run/walk and there were more than 300 people at Bras for a Cause, including many in costume for the event’s speakeasy theme.

The highlight of the week, Dickerson said, was the introduction of

the Mammo to Answers Expedited Diagnostic Program, a partnership between MMC and Cancer Warriors that will reduce the length of time from mammogram to biopsy, so a woman can learn more quickly if she has breast cancer and needs treatment.

“We are so delighted the community sees the value of our program and we are able to bring real, meaningful changes to the cancer journey in Doña Ana County,” Dickerson said.

District welcomes school-based health centers

Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ignacio Ruiz and school board members joined the leadership of La Clinica de Familia last week to celebrate the opening of three school-based health centers, with more in the works.

A ceremonial ribbon cutting was held on Friday, Oct. 25, outside one such facility on the campus of Picacho Middle School, 1040 N. Motel Boulevard. Located in its own building facing the parking lot, the center includes an examination room, a private office for consultations, a pharmacy and a room for community events or larger meetings.

Similar facilities also opened at Lynn Community Middle School and Mesilla Park Community Elementary School.

“These centers will serve as hubs for both physical and behavioral health care, ensuring that our students, families and

staff have access to the services they need,” school board president Teresa Tenorio said during the ceremony.

Ruiz said the health centers are part of a broader effort across the district to provide “wraparound services” to students and their families, and made reference to the recent opening of a family support center at the district’s central office.

“When we provide these type of supports, when we look at these wraparound supports, it’s going to impact not only the current state of our students and their academic outcomes, but also their future and their families as well,” he said.

Kristin Oreskovich, an adolescent health coordinator with the New Mexico Office of School of Adolescent Health, said 25 percent of students who use school-based health centers do not access health care elsewhere, and cited research from the state Public Education Department that correlates the

health centers with increased school attendance and graduation rates.

The centers are funded with federal COVID-19 relief dollars

as well as a grant La Clinica de Familia was awarded by the state to supply equipment, furnishings and staff to the centers.

La Clinica de Familia’s area practice manager, Ernesto Robles, said efforts to establish the program began in 2022 and that sufficient funding had been secured to support 17 school-based health centers between the Las Cruces Public Schools and the neighboring Gadsden Independent School District.

“We will be following the hub and spoke model, where the hubs are those clinics who will physically house the medical and behavioral health providers, and the spoke sites will be served through telehealth services,” Robles said, mentioning Las Cruces-based Electronic Caregiver as a partner in the program.

“Having healthy children makes our community stronger because they are the future of our state,” Robles continued. “By healthy, I mean that every child in New Mexico should have access to nutritious food, clean water, housing and access to medical and behavioral health services.”

Henson’s name to adorn Boys and Girls Club court

A basketball court at the Boys and Girls Club of Las Cruces’ new facility will be named in honor of longtime supporters Lou and Mary Henson, the club announced in October.

Lou Henson, who passed in 2020 at age 88, was a renowned college basketball coach for the University of Illinois and New Mexico State University. On retirement, he boasted a career record of 779-413. He and his

wife, Mary, were instrumental in organizing the annual fundraising breakfast event that is known today as the Lou and Mary Henson Community Breakfast.

The Henson family also provided \$100,000 in matching funds for the \$10 million capital campaign to renovate and expand the former Video 4 Theater at 1005 El Paseo Road as the Boys and Girls Club’s new home. The facility is planned as a 30,000-square-foot complex that will allow the club to triple

release.

IMPORTANT DATES FOR THE 2024 GENERAL ELECTION:

October 8: Voter registration (by mail or online) closes.

October 8: First day that absentee ballots can be mailed to voters (who have submitted an absentee application), and first day of early voting and same day registration (at the county clerk's office).

October 19: Expanded early voting begins at alternate voting locations. Same day registration is available at all early voting locations.

October 22: Last day to request an absentee ballot.

November 2: Last day of early voting.

November 5: General Election Day, same day registration is available at all locations across the state.

Constitutional Amendment 1:

Proposing an amendment to Article 8, Section 15 of the Constitution of New Mexico to extend a property tax exemption, currently only allowed for one hundred percent disabled veterans and their widows and widowers, to veterans with less than a one hundred percent disability and their widows and widowers and basing the amount of the exemption on a veteran's federal disability rating.

Constitutional Amendment 2:

Proposing an amendment to Article 8, Section 5 of the Constitution of New Mexico to increase a property tax exemption for honorably discharged members of the armed forces and their widows and widowers.

No charges to be filed in Holly Street killing

BULLETIN REPORT

Police confirmed on
Oct. 22 there will be no
charges filed following a
shooting that took the life
of a 33-year-old man on
Oct. 2 along the 800 block
of Holly Street.

Jonathon Garcia was
shot and killed when he
broke into the trailer
home of a woman who
had been granted a re-
straining order against
him, according to a police
report released to the Las
Cruces Bulletin on Oct 22.

The report said that
Garcia showed up to the
home in the evening as the

woman was watching tele-
vision with her son. Gar-
cia, the police report said,
began kicking the trailer
door in. When he got in-
side, she shot him at least
once in the chest. Garcia
was taken to the hospital
where he later died.

The police report noted
that the woman had re-
ceived a restraining order
against Garcia following
an incident in September.
Nothing in the report
obtained by the Bulletin
indicated that Garcia was
armed with a weapon dur-
ing the altercation.

Las Cruces Police De-
partment spokesperson

Carlos Carrillo said police
and the district attorney
determined on Oct. 15
that the killing was con-
sidered a justifiable homi-
cide and that no charges
would be pressed.

3rd Judicial District At-
torney spokesperson Rox-
anne Garcia-McElmell
said the office could not
comment on the matter,
saying, "We do not have
a case for this particular
incident in our office."

Garcia-McElmell did
note that the September
criminal case against
Garcia had been dis-
missed because Garcia
had died.

Text messages telling voters they
aren't registered or haven't voted are
about as legitimate as a call trying to
reach you about your car's extended
warranty, according to the Doña Ana
County Clerk's office.

The messages, often reading some-
thing like, "We have you in our records
as not registered to vote. Check your
registration status and register in 2 min-
utes at (a URL)," are not coming from
the clerk's office and are likely spam, ac-
cording to a news release.

"They are a third-party text that has
no affiliation with the Doña Ana County
Clerk's Office or the New Mexico Secre-
tary of State," the office said in the news
release, noting that they've received
several calls from voters who've received
the messages.

Bulldawgs, Hawks prepare for face-off

When Centennial and Las Cruces High meet in the District 3-6A championship football game Friday night, there will be an abundance of quick, highly skilled playmakers on both sides.

Centennial, which put up 70 points on 5A powerhouse Artesia earlier this season, is averaging nearly 50 points per game. Las Cruces is averaging more than 43. The fireworks are expected to continue in the Nov. 2 district title game. Kickoff

is at 7 p.m. at the Field of Dreams.

Both teams are unbeaten in district play with Centennial 9-0 overall and Las Cruces 7-2. The Hawks are ranked No. 2 in the state behind La Cueva and the Bulldawgs were ranked No. 5 heading into this week.

Centennial Coach Aaron Ocampo said the key to the game comes down to the less flashy part of football.

“We have to stay on blocks (on offense) and beat blocks (on defense),” he said. “It starts up front and our line is doing a

good job.”

Dual-threat senior quarterback Zaiden Davis leads the Hawk offense. He comes into the game with over 1,100 yards rushing and close to 1,000 yards passing. The 6-3, 195-pounder also excels on defense and has given a verbal commitment to attend New Mexico State next fall and play linebacker for the Aggies.

“Zaiden is a big threat to score at anytime,” Ocampo said. He has 12 touchdown passes and 22 touchdown runs this season.

“Their quarterback is



one of the best overall players, not just in the state, but in the entire region,” said LCHS coach Mark Lopez.

Davis is far from the only big-play threat for the Hawks. Leading receiver Jordan Lucas and Rudy Rios (13 rushing touchdowns) lead a group that also includes Dailen

Ramirez, Omar Terrones and Omar Sanchez.

The Bulldawgs had two close losses to Volcano Vista and Cleveland earlier this season and Lopez said his team has learned from the setbacks.

The Bulldawgs are led offensively by a couple of juniors – quarterback Gunnar Guardiola and running back Daniel Amaro. The 6-2 Guardiola has thrown for 16 touchdowns this year and has a completion percentage of 64 percent. Amaro, who is also a receiving and return threat, has rushed for 926 yards and has 18 rushing, receiving and passing touchdowns. Guardiola’s top receiving targets are Nate Libby and Francisco Winnikoff, who are 6-3 and 6-1 respectively.

Ocampo said the Bulldawgs are the most talented team he has studied this season.

“On defense, they’re long and tall everywhere and their scheme is really good,” he said. “Three out of their four defensive linemen are 6-3 or taller, their linebackers are tall and rangy, too. No. 32 (Isaac Gomez) is a lockdown cornerback.

“Their offensive line is big and tall and they have tall receivers,” Ocampo added.

Friday’s clash marks the end of the regular season and both teams will advance to the state playoffs. Last season, Centennial won the regular-season game against Las Cruces, but fell to the Bulldawgs in the playoffs.

Former NMSU athlete takes plea

One of the three former New Mexico State University men’s basketball players accused in a 2023 sexual assault and hazing case agreed to testify against his former teammates in exchange for a plea deal, the Las Cruces Bulletin has confirmed.

Doctor Bradley, who was accused of aiding in the sexual assault of his teammates in 2023,

accepted a plea deal on Oct. 23, 2024 that drops the most serious charges. Bradley, 23, was charged with 16 crimes, including criminal sexual penetration and criminal sexual contact.

According to his plea deal, Bradley agreed to plead guilty to two counts of disorderly conduct. The maximum sentence for petty misdemeanors in New Mexico is six months in jail and a \$500 fine.

A spokesperson for the New Mexico Department of Justice confirmed that Bradley’s deal included testifying against his former teammate.

The Bulletin reached out to Bradley’s attorney, but did not receive a response.

Kim Aiken Jr. and Deshawndre Washington remain scheduled for trial in February 2025. Both have pleaded not guilty. Bradley is set to be sentenced after that trial, in March.

Sale of Ryder Cup tickets ignites firestorm

The 2025 Ryder Cup is less than a year away, but the news and controversy is over the exorbitant ticket prices rather than player selections and captain's picks.

Individual ticket prices to attend the tournament at Bethpage Black Golf Course, a public course on Long Island, are \$255 per ticket for the Tuesday and Wednesday practice rounds, \$423 for Thursday's opening ceremony and celebrity golf and a whopping \$749.51 for each of the three competitive rounds. The cost of a competitive round ticket at the Bethpage Black Ryder Cup is almost seven times as expensive as a ticket at the PGA Championship at

the same host site in 2019, and three times what they were at the most recent U.S. Ryder Cup at Whistling Straits in Wisconsin in 2021.

Ticket sales this year are by lottery, or by a third party after the lottery closes. Ticket prices are all inclusive (no hidden taxes or fees) and include unlimited food and non-alcoholic drinks, but not parking.

Almost immediately after the posting of the ticket prices the uproar began, with good reason, but not all for the same reasons. The PGA of America championship director, Bryan Karns, met

with the media several times soon after the ticket price reveal was public in an attempt to explain the high price. "We view ourselves as a Tier 1 event that's on a par with a World Series, or with an NBA Finals Game 7; that was part of it," Karns told Sirius XM-PGA Tour Radio. He also went on to mention that the "high cost of doing business" in New York City, and accommodating some 50,000 people a day (including volunteers, media and security) were factors. Nevertheless, some savvy opinionated observers noted that

"what the market will bear," price gouging and unbridled greed were clearly involved.

If you've never been a tourist in New York City, you are in for a rude awakening. For patrons coming to the Ryder Cup from out of town, paying for tickets may be the least of their expenses. Hotel rates in NYC range from \$500 to \$3,000 a night and higher. Air fares vary depending on the itinerary but they will be higher for that week of September. The Bethpage Golf Course is 26 miles from midtown Manhattan as the crow flies. If one wants to avoid the subway, there are Uber, Lyft and taxis, all of which are expensive. Then, if

you have a family of four and don't want them to go hungry, and like nice restaurants, it may be \$5,000 for the week. Sightseeing (e.g. top of the Empire State Building, Liberty Island) and shopping are all extra.

To say that the PGA of America depends on the Ryder Cup at home every four years is an understatement.

All told, counting revenue from all sources, including corporate hospitality tents and TV revenue (with the PGA Tour getting a 20 percent cut) the event will take in over \$1 billion. There is no discount for junior golf fans and Karns admits he isn't beholden to everyday

golfing Joe's or whether "growing the game" will suffer because of bloated ticket prices. He says his constituency is the PGA of America members. Translation: The Ryder Cup is a twice-a-decade cash cow.

There are approximately 500,000 names in the queue, as I write this, to purchase Ryder Cup tickets when registration closed on October 22. Of the half-million or so entrants, roughly 10 percent will have the opportunity to buy four tickets.

Given the choice, I would rather spend \$3,000 to watch the Ryder Cup than spend \$3,000 to see Taylor Swift. But I might add, the Americans better win!
