HomeGrown event showcases NM foods

If you're thinking of putting together holiday care packages for family members living outside the Land of Enchantment, or just looking to try something new, you're in for a treat. The 10th annual Home-Grown: A New Mexico Food Show and Gift Market will take place 9 a.m.-4 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 23, and 9 a.m.-3 p.m., Sunday, Nov. 24, at the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum, 4100 Dripping Springs Road in Las Cruces.

A division of the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs, the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum is a 47-acre facility that tells the story of 4,000 years of growing food in New Mexico through a variety of exhibits and demonstrations. HomeGrown is an opportunity to sample and shop for New Mexico's award-winning food products. The two go together like beans and chile.

"What I really love is that you get so many folks that are local and unique to New Mexico," said event vendor Louis Santana of

Santana's Black Label, a Las Cruces company making gourmet jerky. "You get to see items that you don't see at the store. It's hugely different than what you would see at any other market."

The New Mexico Department of Agriculture partners with the museum each year to co-host the show. Attendees can expect about 60 vendors, the majority representing food and beverage companies from around the state, many of which participate in the NMDA's "Taste the Tradition" and "Grown with Tradition" programs.

Each booth offers locally produced products, such as award-winning salsas, nuts, sauces and wine for attendees to sample and purchase. The NMDA food demonstration trailer is also featured at the event and NMDA's Taste

the Tradition Chef Ambassador Jon Young will conduct cooking demonstrations each day.

The show also features crafts, art, and other hand-made products, including Native American pottery and jewelry from northern and central New Mexico. Native American jeweler Jennifer Garcia said she loves bringing

Did you know?



Man shot by police released from jail

Police confirmed last week that an implement wielded by a man shot by police on Nov. 11 was a "replica" gun and not a functional weapon.

Police Chief Jeremy Story confirmed that fact at a Nov. 15 news conference where he provided additional details about the Nov. 11 police shooting at an apartment complex on the 1300 block of S. Espina Street. The shooting left Danny Garcia De Leon, 50, injured and charged with two felonies. The officer who shot him is on administrative leave.

"It's going to end up being a replica firearm, which is obviously very difficult or impossible to tell from looking at," Story said, later pointing out that Garcia De Leon and the officer were about 70 feet apart when the shooting occurred.

Story also used the conference to point out that Garcia De Leon was released from jail shortly after he was processed.

"He was booked at 4:49 a.m. He was released at 4:51 p.m. So, he was in custody for 12 hours and two minutes on two serious felony charges, which, in my opinion, is a significant problem and continues to highlight the issues with our system," Story said.

Subsequently, Doña Ana County District Attorney Gerald Byers provided contradictory statements as to whether prosecutors had received a referral in the case.

Shooting on Nov. 11

According to court records filed against Garcia De Leon, the incident began when a neighbor called 911 to say that Garcia De Leon was harassing him verbally. This had been ongoing for about two years, according to the neighbor's statement to police.

"There was a man over there, and he looked like he had a pistol," the neighbor told dispatchers, as relayed in a 911 call presented at the news conference. "He just like gestured it at me. Like, flashed it at me. He's outside yelling right now."

Two officers arrived shortly after. The body camera presented at the news conference shows that Garcia De Leon dropped the knife as they arrived. The officers also see Garcia De Leon reaching behind his back and spotting the fake gun.

They tell him multiple times "don't be reaching for anything" and "drop the knife," as they confer with each other. The knife in question was a steak knife.

A second video clip shows one of the officers, identified by police in the criminal complaint as Officer Jesse Rogers, asking Garcia De Leon what he is holding and then, talking

times.

to the other officer, asking, "Is that a gun, bro?"

At this point, Rogers and the other officer are about 60 to 70 feet from Garcia De Leon. They're separated by an empty section of the apartment complex's parking lot and waist-high bush. Garcia De Leon re-enters his apartment, closing the door behind him.

"Let me see your hands," Rogers says, his flashlight pointing at Garcia De Leon. "He has a gun, bro."

Rogers then jogs over to a dumpster, presumably for better cover in a potential shootout, and draws his gun.

"Let me see your hands," Rogers says as Garcia De Leon comes back out.

Garcia De Leon responds, but it's unclear what he says.

"Don't be reaching,"

At least one of the rounds struck Garcia De Leon, who was hospitalized with non-life-threatening injuries. Shortly after, he was released from the hospital and sent to jail.

Garcia De Leon is charged with aggravated assault for his alleged actions against his neighbor and aggravated assault against a police officer for allegedly reaching for the fake gun before police shot him.

Confusion over pretrial detention

In New Mexico, all defendants are entitled to be released from jail upon arrest. If someone presents a danger to the community or to a person, prosecutors have the option to file a motion requesting a judge to hold them in jail. From there, something like a mini-trial occurs, where the prosecutors argue that the defendant is dangerous and that no conditions of release can assure public safety.

That did not happen in this case. Court records show no motion was filed requesting to hold Garcia De Leon before his release.

District Attorney Gerald Byers initially responded with a statement

Luna County pays \$7M over toddler killed in crash

Just one year and three days after 14-month-old Wyatt Franzoy's death, Luna County commissioners approved a \$7 million settlement with the child's family.

Franzoy's life was cut short when a Luna County Sheriff's deputy driving a Dodge Durango service vehicle, en route to a reported robbery in progress at high speed, slammed into a car driven by Franzoy's mother. Isabella Hernandez survived, but her child – who had been secured in a car seat – was pronounced dead at Mimbres Memorial Hospital.

The driver, Deputy Paul Garcia, exceeded speeds of 130 miles per hour while heading south on state Highway 11, a two-lane roadway leading from Deming through rural Luna County to the village of Columbus. Per court records and dashboard camera footage, Garcia moved into the northbound lane attempting to pass Hernandez's vehicle as she attempted a left-hand turn, and T-boned her vehicle at 99 miles per hour. The posted speed limit was 55 miles per hour. Per court documents, the Luna County Sheriff's Office policy limited speeds to emergency calls to 20 miles per hour over the limit while lights and si-

rens are in operation.

Garcia was placed on administrative leave and terminated 11 months later. He is awaiting trial on third-degree felony charges of homicide by vehicle and great bodily injury by vehicle, both related to reckless driving. A jury trial is currently scheduled for August 2025, per court records.

The settlement was

unanimously approved by Luna County's three elected commissioners on Nov. 14, and publicized at a news conference in the El Paso office of Hernandez's attorney, Daisy Chaparro-Cavazos.

Luna County Manager Chris Brice told the Las Cruces Bulletin the county would pay \$2 million from its general fund, while the remaining \$5 million would be paid through the New Mexico Counties organization insurance pool.

The family filed the civil suit in April, asking the district court to hold the county liable for the death of their son, personal injury damages, loss of consortium and civil rights

violations. They argued that Luna County is also liable for negligent hiring, training, supervision and retention of Garcia, who pleaded guilty to aggravated DWI in 2016.

"Every day is a reminder of what happened and what I lost," Hernandez said, reading prepared remarks through her grief. "Paul Garcia not only took my son but continues to take from me every day. I'm stuck in a cycle of doctor appointments and medical tests. just to deal with the physical pain left behind. The pain in my body mirrors the pain in my heart – a constant reminder of the

Attorneys organize town hall over water contamination

Three law firms are hosting a town hall meeting in Sunland Park Thursday evening to address arsenic contamination in drinking water and legal rights available to customers of the Camino Real Regional Utility Authority, which supplies water in the Santa Teresa area and part of Sunland Park.

A news release said the firms of Singleton Schreiber LLP, Markowski Ruvalcaba Law Firm LLC and the Law Offices of Israel Chávez will jointly host the gathering, where attorneys will discuss the contamination of the area's drinking water and avenues to seek remedies, and to answer questions from the public in English and Spanish.

Late in 2023, an incident in which the utility delivered drinking water with unsafe pH levels was followed by a notice of violation from the state Environment Department over arsenic treatment plants that had been offline for over a year.

CRRUA has since reported that 16 voluntary arsenic tests by an independent laboratory since January have shown arsenic levels below the federal limit of 10 parts per billion at all three treatment plants.

"It is alleged that CRRUA knowingly

sold water with arsenic levels exceeding legal limits, despite repeated warning from regulatory authorities, with adequately informing the public of the health risks," a news release from the legal firms stated, describing the alleged actions as "a willful, reckless disregard for community safety."

The town hall will run from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 21, at the Doña Ana Community College Center, 3365 McNutt Road in Sunland Park. More information is available, per the release, at 575-468-4602 or online at SingletonSchreiber.com.

day my world shattered forever."

Hernandez's legal counsel said Hernandez suffered nerve damage, bleeding in her liver, and multiple bone fractures, leaving her with chronic back and neck pain and mental fog.

"This was no accident," Chaparro-Cavazos said at the news conference. "This was the result of reckless, dangerous and utterly avoidable actions." She called on Luna County to overhaul its hiring, training and supervisory practices, saying it was necessary for the safety of the public and to bring justice to Wyatt Franzoy's family.

"Luna County wishes to offer its condolences to the Hernandez and Franzoy families for the loss of their loved one," Brice

said in a written statement. "While the settlement ends the litigation in this matter, we fully understand the healing process goes on. We are conducting an extensive review of all policies and procedures related to the Sheriff's Department. This represents a step in our continuing effort to improve how Luna County conducts the business of serving our citizens."

saying his office had not received an intake from the police department, which the Las Cruces Bulletin published in a story online.

Byers subsequently followed up, through his

office's spokesperson, saying the office had received an intake package after all, on Nov. 12 – the date of De Leon's first appearance in magistrate court. Byers said the case was under review and could lead to a motion for pretrial detention.

"Judge Kent Wingenroth denied the state's

motion for additional time for hearing a pretrial detention motion and released the defendant on his own recognizance in accordance with Supreme Court rules," Byers stated. "Pre-trial detention motions may be filed at any time and the case is being reviewed now for that purpose."

City looks to mandatory spay and neuter. But is it effective?

The city of Las Cruces will consider revising its animal control laws requiring residents to spay and neuter companion animals or be charged with a crime.

City officials and animal advocates discussed the proposal during a work session on Nov. 12, and the council seemed split by some of the punitive measures proposed.

The changes involve restricting tethering or trolleys for companion animals and implementing a mandatory spay and neuter program, with some exemptions.

Those who violate this

could be found guilty of a petty misdemeanor. That's the stick.

The package's carrot includes creating a source of funding to help fund spay and neuter efforts around the city and messaging the community about the importance of spaying and neutering.

According to City Attorney Brad Douglas, some less controversial changes would clarify language in the law and add more comprehensive prohibitions on abuse, neglect and abandonment.

Additionally, devocalization would be banned, declawing would be much more limited, and residents found guilty of violating these laws twice

would be prohibited from pet ownership.

Despite the breadth of changes, most of the council's discussions centered around the proposed mandatory spay and neuter.

The situation is bleak for stray animals in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County.

Animals living on the streets deal with other animals on a daily basis, harsh weather conditions and deadly roadways. According to shelter statistics, those deposited into the Animal Services Center of the Mesilla Valley either by animal control officers or their owners have a 25- to 35-percent chance of being put down.

Part of this proposal seeks to address that situation, Douglas said.

But the shelter's director, Clint Thacker, questioned how the city could enforce compliance in a town with a shortage of veterinarian services.

"How are people going to be compliant when we ourselves, ASCMV—we are backlogged ourselves," Thacker said, pointing out that some of the proposed changes would require ASCMV to enforce despite having no power to enforce laws.

Still, on the whole, Thacker said he supported mandatory spaying and neutering.

Councilor Johana Bencomo said she could support much of the proposal, but the punitive enforcement of mandatory spay and neuter was a problem.

For one, she said the city could perform the messaging component without the punitive component. Bencomo also pointed out that nearly all national animal rights and shelter advocate groups have opposed mandatory spay and neutering.

"The ASPCA does not support laws that

mandate spay/neuter of owned animals that come to shelters as stravs as a prerequisite of returning them to their owners. However, provisions that incentivize spay/ neuter in these situations can be an effective strategy that does not create unintended negative consequences, such as preventing low-income owners from reclaiming pets due to inability to pay applicable fees," the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals website states. pointing to research that questions the effectiveness of the idea.

Other groups, including the American Veterinary Medical Association, the National Animal Interest Alliance and Paws4Change, take similar positions.

"The data consistently shows mandatory (spay and neuter) policies do not work and have disproportionate impacts on poor people," Bencomo said.

Scammers can email or call asking you to verify your personal information. Do NOT give them any information, including one-time passcodes. Most reputable companies will not initiate contact to ask for your information.

3. Contact your financial institution immediately

If you've given out your personal information or a one-time passcode, time is of the essence. The sooner you contact your financial institution, the better.

Housing agency to seek \$500M | Constitutional change gives

Members of the state legislature will again ask for half a billion dollars for New Mexico's housing agency this upcoming legislative session, reupping a big request that the agency says is vital to stem the housing affordability crisis here.

If the last session is any indication, it's unlikely the Legislature will fund the request at that amount when lawmakers meet in January.

An interim committee overseeing Housing New Mexico, which until recently was known as the New Mexico Mortgage Finance Authority, unanimously endorsed proposed legislation at its meeting Thursday.

The state lacks at least 32.000 affordable homes statewide, and about 20,000 people experience homelessness in the state over the course of a year. according to recent estimates.

The \$500 million would go to the agency's Housing Affordability Trust Fund, which pays for a variety of programs, including down payment assistance for first-time homebuyers, plus housing development and rehabilitation.

The request will come after the legislature made its biggest one-time investment in housing in state history earlier this year. Lawmakers approved about \$200 million, including \$125 million in loans for workforce housing de-

velopment and affordable housing infrastructure, \$50 million for the trust fund, \$20 million for antihomelessness initiatives and a couple other small programs.

Sen. Nancy Rodriguez, D-Santa Fe, a longtime housing advocate who is retiring at the end of this year after 28 years in the Senate, made the first legislative request for \$500 million for Housing New Mexico during the session earlier this year.

She's introduced bills to bolster the trust fund since as far back as at least 2007, with limited success. The agency got about \$21 million combined for the fund between 2005 and 2021.

New Mexico voters gave county boards more power by enacting a state constitutional amendment allowing county commissions to set the salaries for themselves and other elected county officials.

Unofficial election results show that 520.053 New Mexicans (about 66 percent of the vote) approved the measure, while 271.935 (about 33 percent) opposed it. In Doña Ana County, 51,482 residents voted to approve (about 69 percent), while 22,851 (about 30 percent) voted against.

The New Mexico Constitution now reads: "The legislature shall classify the counties of the state. No county officer shall receive any fees or emoluments other than an annual salary, as established by the board of county commissioners. All fees collected by a county official shall be paid into the treasury of the county."

Arguments presented

in support of the amendment assert that changes would provide more local control and allow counties to recruit better-qualified candidates.

Arguments against the amendment asserted that it could lead to wildly different salaries for sheriffs. clerks and other officials while removing a degree of oversight. Moreover, county commissioners are now totally empowered to set their salaries, which could lead to abuse.

There is some degree of constitutional protection on the latter point.

The state constitution prohibits elected officials from receiving more or less compensation during their term. So, if a county commission wants to raise commissioners' salaries.

those raises would not go into effect until after each official survived an election challenge.

Before this amendment, the state legislature set the salaries of county clerks, commissioners, treasurers and sheriffs, with larger counties with a population paying bet-

According to documents from the New Mexico Legislative Council Service, this system has its roots in the territorial days.

Before statehood, the state paid county officials based on each official action. A clerk might collect fees for each oath of office administered or a sheriff for each warrant served. That changed with the state's first constitution.

Vasquez withdraws support for bill targeting nonprofits

Congressman Gabe
Vasquez promised to vote

as supporting terrorists,
withdrawing his previous
support for the measure.

First introduced in September, H.R. 9495, styled as the Stop Terror-Financing and Tax Penalties on American Hostages Act, came before the House of Representatives on Nov. 12. It failed, despite winning the support of Vasquez and 51 other Democrats, because a

two-thirds majority was needed to clear a procedural hurdle.

Vasquez, who represents New Mexico's southern congressional district, favored a previous version of the bill, which would also prevent the Internal Revenue Service from charging back taxes to overseas hostages.

"The bill ensures that Americans detained or held hostage abroad do not come home to face a tax penalty or fine, potentially amounting to thousands of dollars, because they were unable to make tax payments during such hardship," a spokesperson for Vasquez told the Las Cruces Bulletin, before

the congressman switched his vote.

The bill would postpone

some tax filing deadlines for U.S. nationals and their spouses who are unlawfully or wrongfully detained or held hostage abroad, according to a summary of the bill.

The bill drew intense criticism, however, for a provision allowing the Treasury secretary to terminate the tax-exempt status of nonprofit groups if they believed the group was supporting terrorism.

The congressman, fresh from being re-elected in New Mexico's 2nd Congressional district, indicated that popular criticism led him to change his mind.

"I have heard loud and clear from folks in my district and understood the concerns from my constituents, non-profit leaders, and their staff," Vasquez wrote in a post on X, formerly Twitter. "The incoming administration's cabinet nominations give me little faith that this tool would be used as intended."

In an open letter to Congress, the American Civil Liberties Union said the bill "creates a high risk of politicized and discriminatory enforcement," and continued: "The executive branch already has extensive authority to prohibit transactions with individuals and entities it deems connected to terrorism, and non-profit organizations

Albuquerque weighs shopping cart ordinance

The city council of Albuquerque is mulling an ordinance, similar to one recently enacted in Las Cruces, that would make possession of a shopping cart illegal and penalize businesses that fail to keep carts on their property.

The Las Cruces ordinance was passed in August, making shopping cart possession a crime and forcing businesses to submit plans demonstrating how they would prevent carts from leaving their property.

The ordinance was supported by Las Cruces' business community and panned by civil rights advocates and those who administered homelessness services.

Albuquerque's ordinance would allow the city to take shopping carts, presumably from unhoused residents, and use them to ferry belongings and hold them for up to 30 days. People caught with carts could be guilty of a crime, but a judge could sentence the person to community service. Businesses, per the bill's language, would have seven days to pick up their carts for a \$25 fee and \$5 for every day after.

The ordinance is part of a package that would also ban camping in public parks. It's unclear when the Albuquerque City Council will vote on the ordinances, but they were on the council's agenda for its Nov. 18 meeting.

are already prohibited from providing material support to terrorist organizations. In fact, it would be a federal crime for them to do so."

The bill also drew criticism from local nonprofits.

"Non-profits like NM CAFé are going to be on the front lines of protecting our communities against the worst impulses of the incoming administration. H.R. 9495 could allow the Treasury Secretary to target non-profits that dissent to actions like mass deporta-

tion and family separation," a spokesperson for the community organizing organization told the Bulletin. "We don't know what the future will hold, so we are asking Rep. Vasquez and our entire federal delegation to safeguard our right to dissent by voting no on this bill."

In a statement to the Bulletin, Vasquez's office said they felt the bill had adequate protections. Specifically, the bill would allow groups deemed terrorists to appeal the decision within 30 days of the designation.

But now, if the bill reappears for a vote, it won't have the support of Vasquez.



Las Cruces Utilities offering assistance to customers

The City of Las Cruces Utilities Department has programs to help customers who are struggling to pay their Utilities bills.


"Call us and discuss what's going on," said Steven Valdez, Las Cruces Utilities' (LCU) Billing and Receivables Supervisor, who handles Utilities billing, receivables and collections. "We are here to help," he said.

Here are programs to help customers with LCU bills:

- Payment plan agreement. This can be helpful
 if a customer owes several months of LCU
 bills and needs a payment plan to get back on
 schedule.
- Preferred payment date. This provides a monthly extension for disabled and/or elderly customers, so their LCU-bill date coincides with the arrival of their Social Security and/or disability payments.
- Budget plan. This "bill-leveling" program evens out a customer's monthly LCU bills, keeping them at a constant rate throughout the year.
- The Casa de Peregrinos (CDP) emergency food program, which serves thousands of customers in Las Cruces and Doña Ana County, administers a City fund for LCU customers in financial hardship. A Receivables Representative meets with the customer to complete a referral form. The referral form will be submitted to CDP for processing and in return, will receive a payment voucher.
- Promise to pay. This can be helpful to customers who know they have money coming in but need extra time to pay their LCU bill. It can provide a two-week extension on the billing due date.
- LIHEAP (Low Income Heating Energy Assistance Program). For customers who sign up, this program includes a moratorium on disconnections of natural gas (heating) during cold weather (November 15th-March 15th).

"We want customers to call and ask questions," Valdez said, not only if they are struggling to pay a Utilities bill, but also if there is something on their LCU bill they don't understand.

Calling Accounts Receivable can also help customers avoid a late fee on their LCU bills, and/or a disconnection of services and a fee to reconnect.



Disconnection of services happens only after a delinquent customer has been sent two letters in the mail, and a red door hanger has been placed on the customer's door.

The City understands that people sometimes have problems paying their LCU bills, especially if they have had some kind of medical emergency or if they are elderly or have small children. The important thing is for customers to communicate with the Utilities Billing & Receivables Program before there is a late fee or disconnection.

Valdez and his staff assist commercial customers, including small businesses, who are struggling with paying Utilities bills.

Governor has lost ability to unify party

Public safety will be on the agenda in the upcoming 60-day session, but Gov. Michelle Luian Grisham's attempts to arm-twist lawmakers on the issue last year won't serve her well as she enters the lame duck portion of her eight years in

Lujan Grisham is the second consecutive Democratic governor who likely envisioned resigning early for a much loftier position in the federal government. Bill Richardson had been tapped for Commerce secretary in the Obama administration, which would have made him the first Hispanic to hold the job. That got squelched when his political action committee was caught in a pay-to-play scandal involving state investments.

It's no secret that Lujan Grisham was under consideration for a position in the Harris administration, had the presidential election gone the other way. Now she's stuck here for the next two years.

As governor, Lujan Grisham has the constitutional power to veto any bill passed by the legislature. But she has lost the political power to

direct the agenda for the upcoming 60-day legislative session that starts in January.

That's in large part because she overplayed her hand last year on the public safety issue. After failing to get everything she wanted in the regular 30day session, she called for a special session despite warnings from leaders in her own party that there was no consensus and no

hope for success.



I don't think mass incarceration is the solution, especially with New Mexico's corporate, for-profit prisons where successful rehabilitation programs mean fewer return customers. But there are some issues that need to be addressed: bail reform and protecting communities from repeat offenders who have been found incompetent to stand trial.

My fear is that the governor's maximum pressure campaign will only make legislators more reluctant to pass public safety legislation that is needed.

The election did very little to change the makeup of the state Legislature. That was determined on filing day, months before the start of early voting, when incumbents throughout the state in both parties were given a free pass to re-election without the muss and fuss of having to deal with an opponent.

Only 15 of the 42 seats in the Senate were decided reached at waltrubel@ in the general election.

Democrats won 17 seats and Republicans won 10 on filing day. In the House, only 33 of the 70 seats were decided in races between Republicans and Democrats on election day.

Democrats decided last week to retain their current leaders, with Javier Martinez returning as speaker of the House and Mimi Stewart remaining as Senate president pro tempore.

There's not much time to prepare for a 60-day session, where any legislator can introduce bills on any topic they desire. The challenge is to get lawmakers focused on the most important issues. That's a lot easier to do with strong leadership from the governor's office.

The thin blue line is getting thinner

I've spent the last eight months or so trying to get versed in ways to affect change in my hometown as it relates to the crime taking over our community. I've talked here about the root causes. warring opinions on what needs to be done, legislation to target and other in-depth discussions. But the other day. I realized: none of that matters if

we don't fix, and quickly, a critical shortage in Las Cruces.

The Las Cruces Police Department is allotted 220 commissioned officer positions. The city of Las Cruces has approximately 120,000 residents. If you assume 12-hour shifts,

that's approximately one officer for every 1.000 Las

> Cruces residents at any given time during a regular duty day. When vou consider that a lot of our SWAT and other specialized officers support multiple other jurisdictions throughout southern New

Mexico during high priority or higher risk situations, our police force is stretched very thin. And most people, myself included, probably don't consider immediately the less obvious parts of an officer's job, like filing reports, completing paperwork and attending court sessions. No wonder our neighbors lament increased response times

when they attempt to file police reports for vandalism, theft or damage to property.

Unfortunately, however, Las Cruces doesn't have 220 officers on the force. And it's not a few less, either. No one wants to be a police officer anymore. And who could blame them? In

Public land protectors are ready for a fight

President Donald
Trump's first term was
a disaster for America's
public lands. While the
prospects for his second term are even more
bleak, Westerners across
the political spectrum –
even those who voted for
Trump – stand ready to
oppose attempts to sell off
America's public lands to
the highest bidder.

As for Trump's pick for Interior secretary, North Dakota Governor Doug Burgum: If Burgum tries to turn America's public lands into an even bigger cash cow for the oil and gas industry, or tries to shrink America's parks and national monuments, he'll quickly discover he's on the wrong side of history.

Public lands have strong bipartisan support in the West. The annual Conservation in the West Poll, last released by the Colorado College State of the Rockies Project in February 2024, found that nearly three-quarters of voters – including Republicans – want to protect clean water, air quality and wildlife habitats, while providing opportunities to visit and recreate on public lands.

That's compared to just one-quarter of voters who prefer maximizing the use of public lands available for drilling and mining. According to the poll, which surveyed voters in Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming, 80 percent of Westerners support the national goal of conserving 30 percent of land and waters in America by the vear 2030.

Bipartisan support for more conservation and balanced energy development has been a cornerstone of the poll's findings since it began in 2011. Under the leadership of President Joe Biden and Interior Secretary Deb Haaland, the current administration has made

progress over the past four years in bringing public land management in line with the preferences of Western voters. That includes better protecting the Grand Canyon, increasing accountability for oil and gas companies that operate on public land and putting conservation, at last, on par with drilling and mining on public land.

The president-elect may find it hard to immediately block what Western-

ers want. After Trump took office in 2017 promising to transform public land management, his team was unprepared and used its power to benefit its own interests, ignoring the wishes of the American people.

Trump's first Interior secretary, Ryan Zinke, misused his position to advance his dream of owning a microbrewery in Montana. Trump's second Interior secretary, oil and gas industry lobbyist David Bernhardt, put his finger on the scale in the interest of a former client. Trump's choice to run the Bureau of Land Man-

agement, William Perry Pendley, served illegally without being confirmed by Congress.

We worked hard to shed light on this corruption and defend public lands from Trump's attacks. Still, Trump's Interior department allowed oil and gas companies to lock up millions of acres for bargain basement prices.

In his second term,
Donald Trump will attempt to shrink national
monuments like Bears
Ears in Utah and permit
drilling and mining in
inappropriate areas. The
president-elect has already committed to undoing President Joe Biden's
energy and environmental policies.

Project 2025, the policy handbook written by former Trump officials, clearly lays out a plan to gut the Interior Department and remove environmental safeguards that ensure the health of our public lands.

Project 2025 would give extractive industries nearly unfettered access to public lands, severely restrict the power of the Endangered Species Act, open millions of acres of Alaska wilderness to drilling, mining and logging and roll back protections for spectacular landscapes like Bears Ears and Grand Staircase-Escalante national monuments. It would also remove protections for iconic Western species such as gray wolves and grizzly bears.

What can we do about this assault? The law and public opinion are on our side. Public land protections are stronger today than ever, thanks in large part to the grassroots efforts of Tribes, local community leaders and conservation organizations.

We know much of what's in Trump's public lands playbook, and we will fight back. We'll continue to shine a light on corruption within the Trump administration and hold it accountable.

City utility staff pleads: Don't flush wipes!

They seem convenient and disposable enough, and are sometimes marketed as biodegradable or even flushable; but for decades, disposable wipes flushed down toilets have been leading to destructive and expensive clogs in sewer and septic systems all over the U.S.

Municipalities have been pleading with their users not to flush the nonwoven cloths as they grew in popularity through the 2010s and spiked during the COVID-19 pandemic. Combined with other solids, grease and fat, wipes have also contributed to massive blockages (called fatbergs, a variation on iceberg) while degrading pumps, stuffing lift stations which help move water through treatment systems and coating filtration systems in filthy glue.

A 2020 study by the National Association of Clean Water Agencies estimated the annual cost of wipes to water utilities at \$441 million.

This summer, Michigan became the latest entity to enact a law banning wipes from being marketed as "flushable" and requiring a prominent "do not flush" message on their packaging. In Washington, the House of Representatives passed a bill in June that would do the same under federal law. The bill is currently in the Senate committee pro-

This month, the city of Las Cruces began hanging messages on door knobs in select neighborhoods imploring residents not to flush wipes. The door knobs are in service areas where utility workers have noted buildups of wipes at wastewater lift stations, threatening to create blockages that can damage equipment and cause sewage backups.

"Wipes of all kinds should be thrown in the trash and not flushed down a toilet even though packaging may indicate

they are 'flushable,'" a news release from Las Cruces Utilities stated.

A page on the city's website, labeled "What not to flush," suggests flushing only "the 3 P's: pee, poo, and paper (toilet paper)." Unlike toilet paper, paper products like napkins, paper towels and tissue do not disintegrate in water quickly enough to avoid the risk of clogging - and that goes for wipes labeled biodegradable, too.

Other than bodily waste and fluids and toilet paper, the city urges items to be disposed of in trash receptacles. Wrappers, hygiene products, medicines, condoms or their packaging, oil or grease, or chemicals other than toilet-cleaning solutions should not be flushed down the toilet, the city states.

Doña Ana County certifies 'dang good election'

Doña Ana County Deputy Clerk Caroline Zamora was observing a line of early voters at the county government center when her patience as the neutral overseer of elections faced a test.

Amid the historic turnout in the county, one voter was asked to turn his shirt inside out, wearing a shirt with a candidate's name on it.

It's a common occurrence: State law prevents candidates and their supporters from campaigning within 500 feet of the polls. A shirt or hat with a candidate's name or slogan qualifies as electioneering, even if the supporter thinks of it simply like wearing his favorite player's jersey to a big game.

As is typical, the man complied with the request, Zamora recounted during a Board of County Commissioners meeting on Nov. 15. But as he did, another man standing in line shouted, "White power!"

The story was one of several Zamora shared during the county board meeting. She presented statistics about voter turnout and outlined challenges, including unruly poll watchers and online misinformation spread by a local candidate and allied activists.

Allegations about absentee ballots stemmed from a Facebook post by Republican state senate candidate Samantha Barncastle Salopek accusing the clerk's office of "finding votes" when, in fact, the votes were coming in to be counted by the county all night on election night. The post, which the candidate later clarified, was seized on by those in the community that believe elections are fraudulent.

State law mandates that clerks stop counting absentee ballots at 11 p.m., which led some to believe that all ballots would not be counted after 11 p.m. However, regular votes are counted until the night is over.

Zamora said an unruly poll watcher, whom she did not identify, was removed after the presiding judge tried multiple

times to correct their behavior at a polling site.

"There were also several instances in which challengers, watchers and observers did not have the proper credentials," Zamora said, adding that these individuals receive training and are told what to bring and where to go ahead of their assignment.

On the whole, Zamora told the board and about two dozen election workers that this year's election was a success.

"We ran a dang good election, and county staff and election workers have done a spectacular job," Zamora said as the commissioners voted to certify the election. "We are a department that you all can be proud of."

Certification votes are normally a routine process but have taken on a new focus in the elections after 2020. That year, Republican candidates, party officials and online influencers questioned the validity of the election despite no evidence of widespread voter fraud, following the lead of then-President Donald Trump.

That national trend led two New Mexico counties to vote against election certification. In Doña Ana County, thencommissioners Isabella Solis and Ramon Gonzalez voted against certification.

Doña Ana County elections are also one of many online focal points for election denialism. Since 2018, the county has been targeted in a documentary that falsely reported fraud and articles misrepresenting the clerk's office.

Yet this year, the board did not hesitate to certify the results. Commissioners Shannon Reynolds, Manuel Sanchez, Susana Chaparro and Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez voted in favor of certification, receiving applause from the two dozen or so election workers and supporters of the clerk's office who stuffed the board room. Commissioner Diana Murillo was absent from the vote.

High turnout, same-day registration

Zamora and the other election workers navigated historic voter turnout.

According to Zamora's presentation and the Secretary of State's office, voters cast 85,809 ballots. That is about 61 percent of all eligible voters in the county. There has never been an election in Doña Ana County where more people voted.

Part of the boast stemmed from sameday voter registration, which allows people to register to vote or update their information, such as addresses, the day they cast their ballot. The practice was implemented in New Mexico in 2019.

Zamora said that some 52,000 New Mexicans utilized same-day registration this election, including 4,826 county residents. The heavy use led to long lines on Election Day as some 25,000 state residents and about 2,800 county residents waited to register.

"We could have never envisioned something (like this) happening. Now we know it can happen, so it's a good thing," Secretary of State Maggie Toulouse Oliver said during a legislative hearing one week after the election. "So many people came out and participated, but it did slow the process down."

Next, the State Canvassing Board – consisting of the governor, secretary of state and chief justice of the state Supreme Court – must certify the election.

Q: It was a pleasant surprise to see Mark Harmon in the premiere of "NCIS: Origins." Is he expected to be in many episodes?

A: Not as an on-camera presence. That's the intention, anyway, since the CBS and Paramount+ show's primary Leroy Jethro Gibbs is meant to be the younger incarnation played by Austin Stowell. Mark Harmon has said that he's available for anything the producers — including his son, Sean, who played the younger Gibbs in flashbacks in the parent "NCIS" series — might need from him, but acting appearances by the elder Harmon generally aren't intended to be part of the equation.

However, he's an executive producer of the show himself, as well as its narrator. As a veteran of series television, he certainly knows what a special event on a series can mean for its ratings; if it would help for an older Gibbs to pop up again on "NCIS: Origins," then

viewers shouldn't rule out that possibly happening down the line.

In terms of Gibbs having departed from the original "NCIS," for which he also remains an executive producer, Harmon explained to TV critics in a press conference that "it wasn't so much a decision to leave as it was, maybe, just the right timing to push away a little bit. I was thrilled with the storyline they came up with, and how they handled the character.

"I was always of the opinion that the show would carry on, no matter who left or who joined. The fact that this show now comes out of the grass ... there was just an opportunity there. The idea was Sean's, and it just made sense that there was a different story to tell, a new story to tell."

'Santa's Cousin' showcases Las Cruces talent

When filmmaker Ross Marks drove Oscar-nominated and Golden Globe-winning actor Eric Roberts to the set of "Santa's Cousin" last year and told him more than 30 members of the crew for the feature film shooting in Las Cruces would be Marks' students from the Creative Media Institute at New Mexico State, Roberts was "nervous and a little reluctant." Marks said, and told him, "That will be interesting."

But after three days of filming. Roberts told the crew. "You are one of the best groups in the 700 appearances on film that I've ever had, and I mean that from the bottom of my honest heart."

"Students really had the responsibility of bringing this film to life," said Marks, who directed "Santa's Cousin" and was also one of its producers.

The film set was "a classroom" for his students. Marks said, and more than half of them are now employed in the film industry because of "the major film credit ... the real work experience" they got on the movie.

"I am more proud of 'Santa's Cousin' than any movie I've

ever made." he said. "The student part is the thing that's most rewarding."

Marks said he is also proud that a number of its cast members are from Las Cruces, including Knut Brekke, Natali Jones, Jessica Jimenez and Nick Check. Albuquerque filmmaker Keagan Karnes. a Las Cruces native and CMI graduate, was another of the film's producers. CMI associate professor Mitch Fowler was the cinematographer.

The story of "Santa's Cousin" "revolves around Colton (Jonathan Stoddard), a shy and reluctant cousin of Santa Claus (Eric Roberts), who is assigned a mission to help save the Christmas Jubilee in the small town of Ruidoso, New Mexico," according to a news release from Inspirado Films. NMSU and Heartstrings Media. "Colton feels more at home tending to horses than talking to people but accepts the assignment. Assisted by his sidekick, Gilbert 'The Elf' (Jamey Maurice Clay), Colton soon meets Natalie (Alexandra Harris), a loving but hard-headed woman who is desperate to make this holiday season memorable for her son, Zach (Malcomb Engel). Together, they create Christmas magic to give Ruidoso an

extraordinary miracle... and discover love along the way."

"Santa's Cousin" is the latest in a string of feature film projects for Marks, 57, who received the New Mexico Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts in October and is executive director of the Las Cruces International Film Festival. In

addition to his producing and screenwriting credits, Marks has directed 16 films, including "The Twilight of the Golds," "Homage" and "Walking With Herb." He has worked with Oscar winners Al Pacino, Fave Dunaway and Brendan Frasier and TV star and Grammy award nominee George Lopez.

"Things have really started to come my way as a director and producer," Marks said.

After 37 years in the film industry, "I really understand the medium," he said. "I understand how to get movies made - that's the hardest part of the business. Now, if there is a script I'm excited about, I know I can get it made."

Marks began his film career as an acting student at UCLA. With mentors like his late father-in-law, Tony-winning playwright Mark Medoff, and TV's "Happy Days" creator Garry Marshall, Marks segued into directing. He earned a master's degree from the AFI Conservatory film school in Los Angeles and became a film professor at NMSU in 2012.

Marks said Las Cruces continues to receive attention from filmmakers across the country as a great place to make movies. The support he received for "Santa's Cousin" "made me feel so supported and valued." Marks said. "Everybody always savs 'ves.'"

"Santa's Cousin" premieres Wednesday, Dec. 4, at Allen Theatres Cineport, located at Mesilla Valley Mall. The film will be available on DirecTV, Dish, Apple TV, Amazon, Google Play, Vubiquity and Fandango.

NM broadband office seeks \$70M for satellite expansion

The office responsible for coordinating the expansion of broadband internet service across New Mexico has presented a \$70 million budget request to lawmakers ahead of the 2024 legislative session.

Drew Lovelace, the acting director of the twoyear-old state Office of Broadband Access and Expansion, appeared before the Legislative Finance Committee at a hearing in Santa Fe on Nov. 19. The committee's vice chair is state Rep. Nathan Small, D-Las Cruces.

Lovelace outlined several initiatives and funding requests, including \$35 million to continue an affordable connectivity program that had lost federal funding and \$80 million to support efforts to build broadband infrastructure. In all. Lovelace said \$2 billion would be needed overall for a system including fiberoptic installation, last-mile and middle-mile connectivity and 5G cellular service.

Lovelace said the \$70 million request would fund an initiative dubbed "Accelerate Connect NM,"

seeking to connect households with inadequate internet service, or none, with high-speed satellite internet service.

Lovelace told lawmakers on the committee that the program would connect



He told lawmakers that program would also help households afford the more expensive satellite connections by providing subsidies aiming to bring the monthly cost down to around \$90.

The office considers households with access to 25 megabits-per-second for download and 3mbps for upload speed, or less, as "unserved," and 100mbps and 20 mbps for download and upload speeds, and below, are "underserved," the office explained in a news release. The program would extend as many as 95,000 vouchers for needed hardware in addition to the subsidies for service.

The Accelerate Connect NM funds would be nonrecurring; however, Lovelace urged the lawmakers to think beyond short-term funding measures, since permitting for a project alone can take two years, and an entire project may span five.

"Broadband is infrastructure," Lovelace told the committee. "These are long-term projects that require rights of way, permitting, environmentals – and that can be two years unto itself. My big ask coming out of this is that we no longer get 1- and 2-year appropriations; that we look at 3- to 5-year appropriations, and we make sure that we can do the entire grant cycle and that we don't jeopardize the projects that we're trying (to build)."

Lovelace also presented

on other matters pertaining to the two-year-old office's budget and staffing. The office, which manages \$1 billion in state and federal funding for broadband, is seeking a \$650,000 increase to its current operating budget of \$2,388,700, with the added funding supporting additional staff. The office is organized under New Mexico's Department of Information Technology.

In a written statement, Lovelace said, "All of New Mexico should have high-speed internet. 'Accelerate Connect NM' will be vital to achieving inclusivity for rural homes and businesses. This program ensures New Mexicans are not on the wrong side of the digital divide for the next few years while longer-term projects are built."

New Mexico delegation asks feds to wrap Rio Grande lawsuit

All five members of New Mexico's congressional delegation are urging the federal government to "quickly resolve" a decade-old lawsuit from Texas over water rights from the Rio Grande.

"In times of worsening drought and precipitation out of line with historical patterns, it is imperative that our communities, municipalities, farmers, ranchers, and businesses have as much clarity about their future water supplies as possible," they wrote in a letter dated Thursday. They asked for the case to get across the finish line before the end of the year.

U.S. Sens. Martin Heinrich and Ben Rav Luián and Reps. Melanie Stansbury, Gabe Vasquez and Teresa Leger Fernández, all Democrats, addressed the one-page letter to Interior Secretary Deb Haaland and Attorney General Merrick Gar-

Texas sued New Mexico in 2013, accusing farmers in the southern part of the state of pulling groundwater meant for Texas under the 1938 Rio Grande Compact between those two states plus Colorado, where the river starts in the Rocky Mountains, Colorado agreed to ensure enough water would reach New Mexico, which in turn agreed to pass along

enough to Texas.

The states in 2022 struck a proposed settlement agreement but the federal government

opposed it. The U.S. Supreme Court ruled in June the case could not be settled without the federal government's go-

ahead. A special master overseeing the case has ordered them to resolve the dispute through mediation by Dec. 16.

As of Nov. 7, most of New Mexico was experiencing drought or abnormally dry conditions, and nearly every part of the state had experienced a period of drought in the previous year, the lawmakers wrote.

About 13 million people in the U.S. and Mexico rely on the river and its tributaries for drinking water, while an estimated 1.8 million acres of crops and pastures are irrigated by it, they wrote.

Delaying the lawsuit's end any further "imperils the ability of water users to prepare for more common and more extreme droughts in the Rio Grande Basin," New Mexico's delegation wrote.

HOUSING

While Rodriguez acknowledged Thursday that "we don't always get" the full amount, she requests, she touted the fund as necessary for a range of housing services, and she said it has a return on investment of 17-to-1. That's because it leverages federal and private funding and generates revenue.

Last year, lawmakers ultimately approved \$50 million for the agency, which is on top of about \$38 million the agency has received annually from severance tax bonds since last year.

Lawmakers arrived at \$50 million as they built

a record budget last year. There were dueling requests from Rodriguez. the governor's office and the Legislative Finance Committee, which recommended \$50 million. The governor's office also sought funding and authority for its own housing agency, which lawmakers ultimately denied.

In the last 16 months. Housing New Mexico has received a little more than \$122 million from the legislature, according to a presentation from director Isidoro "Izzy" Hernandez. Of that money, it has awarded 73 percent and spent 21 percent of it. That includes about \$15 million in down payment assistance.

New Mexico State will be back in the pool this weekend as they visit east Texas for a three-day swim meet in Houston. This weekend, the Aggies will compete alongside swimmers from Houston, Rice, Florida Gulf Coast, New Mexico, Nevada, Air Force and San Jose State.

Following a pair of home meets, the Aggie swimmers will compete in a midseason event which will feature 19 events across three days.

In their last meet, the Aggies earned a pair of wins over WAC opponents Northern Arizona and UTRGV – defeating the Lumberjacks 163-137 and the Vaqueros 242-59.

This weekend, there will be five heats for each event, with A-B-C finals being scored. Prelims are scheduled to start at 10 a.m., with finals starting at 4 p.m. MT on Wednesday and Thursday and 3 p.m. MT on Friday.

This weekend's meet will take place at the CRWC Natatorium, where the Aggies will return at the end of February to compete in the 2024-25 WAC Championships.

This year's Aggie roster includes two seniors, 10 juniors, eight sophomores and 11 freshmen. NM State will be led by First Team All-WAC honorees Emily Dobbins, Naomi Slee, Kodi Wiman and

Topgolf re-imagined the "driving range," turning it into a family playground and entertainment center with golf as an excuse. That was the start. We will see hundreds of short courses, lighted at night, and probably short indoor par 3s.

The increased focus on golf's environmental im-

pact is not to be underestimated. A lot of "green" people hate golf and want to do everything they can to eliminate it. Water usage continues to be a big issue, particularly in the West. One pundit noted

that "the days of wall-towall green grass on golf courses may become a thing of the past." The exception, of course, would be the high-end private clubs, PGA tournament player courses and resort courses. All golf courses, public and private, must face the pressure of escalating maintenance

costs, including labor and chemicals. Many will close

The integration of smart technology into golf equipment will be highly sophisticated over the next 20 years, with advanced sensors in clubs and balls. Wearable technology will go far beyond fitness and "steps," and will analyze swing speed, posture and much more. When

integrated with proper apps, they will provide a comprehensive analysis of a player's game and even suggest areas for improvement.

As for the future of golf technology, how much technology does golf need, and how much is enough? How many golf apps on your phone are enough? How much more sophisticated will golf ball shot tracking get? They already know how to arm golf balls with microchips, but will they be legal? Technology and innovation appear to have no end in sight.

When artificial intelligence (AI) starts playing golf for you, the end is near. Just sayin'.
