City recommends tighter public records access

A transparency fight is brewing at the state legislature, and Las Cruces may be right in the middle of it.

Local governments, including counties and cities of New Mexico, are looking to convince the legislature that public records need more restrictions to address a spike in Inspection of Public Records Act requests -- something transparency groups staunchly oppose.


While the proposals vary, most revolve around restricting access to police body camera footage and police records – something the legislature has taken up in recent sessions.

New legislative propos-

als won't be filed until January, and it's unclear what will make its way to the Roundhouse for consideration.

But Las Cruces' city clerk, Christine Rivera, outlined the changes she wants to see at a Nov. 12 meeting. She said she wants the legislature to allow the government to create a fee schedule to charge people who receive records electronically; require requestors to provide more specificity on requests for public employee's emails; allow redaction of identities of children from body camera footage and police reports, and also of identities of victims of crime. even after a case has been adjudicated.

The Las Cruces City



Council endorsed the idea as part of its yearly resolution of legislative priorities at a meeting on Dec. 2. The same platform was endorsed by the New Mexico Municipal League, a lobbying and coordinat-

ing body for New Mexico cities.

And while that is a summary of what cities want, the New Mexico Association of Counties has proposed much more sweeping changes, according to a document provided to the Las Cruces Bulletin.

The association's proposed changes included preventing access to jail or prison security footage, eliminating the requirement for a three-day notice, personal information of applicants for fishing and hunting licenses, and dozens more requests.

City clerk makes case for IPRA changes

From January to the end of October, the Las Cruces City Clerk's Office has fielded 2,588 requests – nearly three-quarters of which are police records. Each request requires review and processing before it can be released to the public.

In an interview with the

Bulletin, Rivera said her desire to see the changes stems from the impact records requests have on the city clerk's office.

"The majority of the requests we're getting right now are (police department) related," Rivera said. "It's PD reports, body cam, supplements, audio, pictures, anything related to that."

Police body camera footage is the most timeconsuming, Rivera said, as it requires potentially hours of review, redaction and further review before release. That work all falls on the city clerk's office.

"I wanted people to realize that it is a lot of man hours," Rivera said. "It is also taking away from the

Realize Las Cruces one step closer to implementation

Advocates argued for a handful of changes to a sweeping redesign of Las Cruces' development code during one of the final meetings on the plan known as Realize Las Cruces.

A work session of the Las Cruces City Council on Dec. 9 marked the last public meeting in the years-long effort to modernize and update the city's development codes. Realize Las Cruces includes changes to zoning, the zoning map, subdivisions, drainage, signs, outdoor lighting, roads and rights-ofway, landscaping parks, trails, open space, tree preservation, screening and fencing.

Councilors and community members who spoke at the meeting were, with a few exceptions, happy with the document's placement.

"There are not many items for which we have problems," said John Moscato, a land developer, speaking on behalf of the New Mexico Construction Association, formerly called the Las Cruces Home Builders Association.

Moscato said one change he'd like to see is a simplification for changing zoning and character place. Unlike the current set of codes, Realize Las Cruces will designate areas of town as "urban" or "suburban" on

top of traditional zoning categories like residential or commercial.

Moscato pointed out that, as written, two separate processes are required to request a parcel change. He said he would like to see that simplified.

But parks were his main contention. As written, Moscato said that Realize Las Cruces would lead to fewer parks being built by developers because of a minimum requirement that all developments have at least a 3-acre park. Smaller developments would choose to pay the park impact fee instead, he said.

But the bigger issue was the total impact of fees on housing costs. The city is looking to raise the park impact fee sometime next year. Developers can pay the fee in lieu of building a park, and the city uses the money to build new parks and maintain existing parks.

Moscato said the uncertainty was causing

local developers to chafe.

Judy Berryman, chair of the Historic Preservation Commission, acknowledged that the most recent version of Realize Las Cruces strengthened historic protections. As an example, she pointed to provisions that call for two more historic districts.

Still, Berryman and other HPC members said the document should be revised so that HPC remains a commission and not a committee, the latter implying more authority.

Most city councilors expressed a desire for minor changes but were satisfied overall with the document.

on all roadways, and
Councilor Johana
Bencomo said the
document should improve

development in the city's underserved areas like the corridors of W. Picacho, El Paseo and S. Solano.

"Many, many years ago, decades ago, there was a decision that was made, maybe subconscious or unconscious decision, that was made about where we place our focus in the city which caused a neglect in others," Bencomo said.

The final document will be presented to the council for approval in February 2025.

Amelia Baca shooting gets new attention in appeals court

The 10th Circuit Appeals Court is set to rule on whether a court erred in finding a Las Cruces Police Department officer had legal immunity when he killed 75-year-old Amelia Baca in 2022.

It's unclear when the ruling could come down. Still, the court heard appeal arguments on Nov. 20 from lawyers representing Baca's family in a wrongful death lawsuit against the city of Las Cruces and its police department.

The family has argued since August 2022 that Baca's civil rights were violated when she was shot dead by a police officer at her home in Las Cruces on April 16, 2022. That case was dismissed in October 2023 after a federal judge found the officer's actions constitutional and said he was entitled to qualified immunity. Shortly after the ruling, Baca's family appealed.

The hearing was the latest in the long aftermath of one of the most controversial police shootings in recent memory. It follows a able use-of-force cases. \$2.75 million settlement between the Baca family and the city in state court and the state Attornev General's decision to hold back criminal charges against the officer, Jared Cosper, despite calls for charges from Baca's family and some in the community.

"There are two issues

before the court here, and they are the two prongs of qualified immunity," said Eric Loman, an attorney representing Baca's family, during the Nov. 20 hearing.

Qualified immunity is a legal doctrine that protects government employees from being found personally liable for possible constitutional violations. The doctrine is meant to protect government employees so they can act without fear of constant litigation; but it has also come under scrutiny, as it often shields police and police departments from accountability in question-

In September 2023, federal Judge Robert Brack found Cosper did have immunity.

Long before the call for services that ended her life, Baca had been diagnosed with a form of dementia, according to her family. This left her with memory loss and confusion, and on the evening of Apr. 16, 2022, those symptoms flared.

One of Baca's adult daughters, also acting as her caretaker, called 911 requesting help.

Per the police footage, when Cosper arrives he asks the daughter and grandmother to come out as he stands in a tight nook that abuts Baca's front door. The two women comply, telling Cosper, "Please be very careful with her."

But almost before the women finish saying that, Cosper draws his gun and shouts, "Set it down," seeing that Baca holds kitchen knives in each hand.

Cosper's decision to pull his gun in this narrow space left him hemmed in. The video shows him repeatedly yell at Baca to put the knives down, as the two other women plead

other duties because we're so focused on that."

Rivera added that especially sensitive or graphic body camera footage can have an emotional impact on her staff, too.

"It's heartbreaking at times to see some of the stuff and know that we can't protect those people. That's what hurts the most, especially those children. And then they get upset at us, but it's not us; it's the law," Rivera said.

Transparency hawks unconvinced

As far as staffing time, New Mexico transparency advocates aren't buying it.

"That's literally their job," said Clara Garcia, editor and publisher of the Valencia County News-Bulletin and president of the New Mexico Press Association.

Garcia explained that public records play a key role in journalism. They are the backbone of good reporting, she said, adding that easy access to public records allows for more media independence.

"Everybody talks about being transparent, and this is the exact opposite of being transparent," Garcia said.

Melanie Majors, Executive Director of the New Mexico Foundation for Open Government, said the organization was paying close attention to the proposals.

"Our goal is always to make sure that any excep-

tions to the Inspection of Public Records Act are as narrow as possible," Majors said.

With no bill to scrutinize. Majors said that FOG had met with the New Mexico Municipal League to review their proposed changes. Some of these, such as a proposed fee schedule, she described as non-starters.

"We've already paid for those records," Majors said. "Why do we have to pay the custodian who's holding the records in trust for us in order to get to the records?"

Majors also pointed out that this will be another year in which the government wants to restrict IPRA.

Recent changes to the law allowed police officials to redact visual depictions of dead bodies or great bodily harm unless that harm is suspected to have been caused by a law enforcement officer. The changes also sought to mitigate data ransoming by preventing people from getting public records about IT systems that reveal vulnerabilities.

While officials argue these changes protect the public, Majors and other transparency hawks see it as backsliding.

"I think it's a concentrated effort to keep the public from getting its information. How can the public make informed decisions if they don't have access to information? And transparency and accountability are not a partisan issue. It's important to everybody," Majors

Journalists are not the only people with an interest in public records, something city clerk Rivera and other government officials are quick to point out.

Attorneys use public records for case investigations, large tech companies like LexisNexis file IPRAs to build out their databases, and members of the public use records to expand their understanding of government.

There is also a new form of media that use IPRA requests as their main supplier of content.

Instagram pages like lascruces.shi, which post police body camera videos showing car chases, violent arrests and other dramatic footage are some of the groups driving the increase in IPRA requests.

"When we have, for example, a YouTuber asking for 50 different cases for body cam, that's the kind of stuff that I'd like to address in a fee schedule." Rivera said. "It's not so much the everyday layperson; it's more the people that are maybe taking advantage of the system."

The Bulletin reached out to lascruces.shi for an interview on how they use IPRA and their thoughts on the proposed changes, but the account holder did not respond.

What might be ahead

While there may be a transparency fight in store for this session. there is also some common ground. When asked if she'd seek additional staff to support the review and dissemination of public records. Rivera said that was a main goal.

"My goal has been to get full-time records custodians at (LCPD) because their staff is kind of doing a little bit of everything," Rivera said. "I would love to see them get full-time staff. I think that would help a lot."

Majors said this was law.

"We realize in some cases, maybe it's not the law that needs to change. It's the individuals who are required to comply with the law that needs to commit the resources to the records departments, maybe they need to look at how they process records, and perhaps look at efforts to put more of the information online so

that people do not have to fill out a request for a record," Majors said.

Majors also pointed out that this may have been an avoidable situation.

In 2020, the state legislature mandated that all police officers must wear body cameras, effectively creating thousands of new public records in the form of body camera footage. preferable to changing the In doing so, the legislature did not provide any additional financial support for records processing.

> "That was a part of that law that was missing. And so, the unfunded mandate, part of it fell on the law enforcement officers." Majors said.

> Proposed legislation will be filed ahead of the session from Jan. 2 to Jan. 17. The list of changes will first be outlined there be

fore moving through the legislative process. If a bill gains traction, transparency and press advocates are ready to push back.

"We will fight to the very end," Garcia of the News-Bulletin said. "We will fight at this legislative session to make sure that this does not happen. We will be fighting, not only for our journalism colleagues but for the public's right to know."

Doña Ana County's new manager embraces modernization, optimism

Scott Andrews is, by his own account, "just as corny as advertised."

The new Doña Ana County manager likes to employ "dad jokes" without regard for consequence and compares himself to Ted Lasso.

His disarming persona,

cultivated after two decades in government, stems from an optimistic outlook and an ability to smile through tough times. And tough times are no doubt what he'll face in Doña Ana County as he seeks to remold and revitalize a 172-year-old institution.

"We have healthy reserves, pretty solid commission – good bones, as people would say," Andrews told the Las Cruces Bulletin during an interview in December, his first since taking the position.

After the county commission decided to part ways with Fernando Macias, it selected Andrews at the end of a months-long hiring process. The commission picked Andrews – who hails from Florida – over two other outside candidates and one local.

Andrews' last post was as assistant city manager in Bakersfield, Calif., from 2022 to 2024. Before that, he was city manager of Covington, Ga., from 2019 to 2022 and assistant city manager of Smyrna, Ga., from 2017 to 2019. He earned a doctorate in education from Argosy University in California in 2015.

As county manager,
Andrews' office is where
the buck stops. He
oversees the entire county
government and acts as
the county's chief liaison
to the outside world.
However, unlike his
municipal counterparts,
Andrews shares power
with elected officials such
as the sheriff, the county
clerk and the county
accessor.

The tension inherent in power-sharing has led to public feuds and the undoing of previous administrations. But Andrews said he's up for it.

"The nice thing about being the new guy is that I have nothing against

anyone. They shouldn't have anything against me because they didn't know me," Andrews said. "So I think just sitting down and saying 'Hey, I'm here to help you. How can I make your job easier?" Andrews said.

That's one challenge. Andrews also anticipates that modernizing the government will be part of his tenure as county manager.

"In this region, we are compared to Las Cruces or El Paso or insert name of neighboring city where I think we need to be looking bigger. We need to be looking at best practices nationwide," he said.

That doesn't mean he wants to come in and flip the monopoly board, as he put it. But it does mean looking at how things are done and why they're being done.

"Modernization to me means taking our money the furthest, leaning on technology, being innovative. Do we need a position for that? Or is that something we can outsource? Who does it better? So, kind of asking all those questions, taking a step back and reflecting on, what are we doing well? What are we not doing well?" he said.

Modernization must also include economic development for Andrews. Interviews with county commissioners about Andrews revealed that they gave him a mandate for economic growth.

The U.S. Census Bureau estimates that about 1 in 5 residents and 1 in 4 children live below the poverty line. Additionally, most county residents make less money per year

than other New Mexicans. Those economic realities fuse with political ones that place Doña Ana County squarely in the sight of immigration challenges and border trade.

It'll take time to meet that goal, Andrews said.

"Right now, we have a staff member in economic development. Just one," he said. "We're not going to add 15 positions overnight, so we'll have to chip away this thing over the next few years."

Yet, ever the optimist, Andrews said his outlook for the future is positive.

"We're in this historic moment, at a crossroads for the area, addressing the haves and have-nots, addressing those that have been forgotten about, making the best of the resources around us," Andrews said.

with him to lower his weapon.

After backing up, Cosper continues yelling at Baca with his gun drawn. Baca responds to him, but her words cannot be heard on the body camera recording. She also transfers the knives to hold both in one

Ultimately, Baca takes a few steps forward, at which point Cosper fires two rounds into the 75-year-old woman. Baca dies a few minutes later, leaving a pool of blood in her doorway.

On appeal

It's entirely unknowable what Baca perceived or what she was even capable of perceiving during the final 43 seconds of her life. attorney for Cosper and

As both a Spanish speaker and someone in the throes of dementia, it's unclear if she understood Cosper's commands or what was happening.

Still. Loman said Cosper's actions left a lot to be desired.

"Officer Cosper immediately sees Amelia Baca standing there and pours gasoline onto the situation, which had been very calm and peaceful when he arrived. And it is that escalation, not just a failure to de-escalate, but it is that escalation that amounts to a (civil rights) violation," Loman said.

Loman also argues that Cosper could have backed away from Baca or beckoned her outside the house to give her more space and options.

Philomena Hausler, an

the city, disagreed and said it was essential to consider the totality of the circumstances. She pointed out that the 911 call –while confirming that Baca was suffering from a mental health episode - also ended abruptly with the call line still open.

"The officer had to make a decision in a split second," Hausler said.

However, the judges questioned Hausler about whether Cosper's actions were reasonable given the situation.

"She looks to me like someone who's disoriented, and she takes two small steps, and she's dead," one judge said.

Still, the judges - Allison Eid, Gregory Phillips and Harris Hartz - did not indicate what their ruling might be from the bench.

Budget forecast comes with warning

Later this month, the consensus revenue estimate will be released, providing the basis for the state's budget when lawmakers meet next month in Santa Fe. And the expectation is a continuation of the oil-fueled revenue boom, leading to another record budget.

The estimate is prepared twice a year. The August report predicted lawmakers will have \$659.6 million in "new money" to add to the record \$13.4 billion budget for the current fiscal year. It's a dramatic reversal from the days of the Richardson administration, when lawmakers were forced to claw back money from local school districts to avoid budget deficits, which are now allowed under state law.

And it all comes from a single source. Oil and natural gas production in New Mexico has grown by 381 percent since the year 2017, making our state the second-largest

oil producer in the nation, behind only Texas. In the last year, New Mexico was responsible for nearly 50 percent of oil production growth for the entire nation.

The state has made a concerted effort to diversify its economy through things like boosting tourism, incentivizing film production and legalizing cannabis. And we have a Democratic-controlled, progressive legislature and governor who can't be comfortable with our expanding role in contributing to climate change.

But, like it or not, our state's ability to provide basic services is inextricably tied to the oil and gas industry. That's been incredibly rewarding in the last few years. But as any lawmaker still around

from the Richardson era remembers, booms in the oil industry don't last forever.

And the August revenue report warns that the dramatic increases

in price and production are already starting to slow down. "Prices are expected to remain lower than previous highs and prior expectations because of moderating economic conditions and lower demand combined with growing supply," the report states.

The report also notes that there has been significant consolidation in the oil industry during the past few years, creating much larger companies with more power to influence the market. They tend to prioritize shareholder returns over production growth, the report said.

The election of Donald Trump will surely mean an effort to increase domestic production by reducing environmental regulations and opening up more public lands to drilling. If successful, that increase in supply would lead to an equivalent decrease in demand and revenue for the state.

In the past, I've been critical of legislators for stashing money away in various funds when we have so many critical problems that need to be addressed now. It would be a logical argument in a state that has a steady, predictable revenue supply. We don't have that.

Last week I wrote about a proposal by Think

New Mexico to address the state's shortage of healthcare providers, and wondered how much it would all cost. In a community radio interview, Think New Mexico's Fred Nathan said their request for a \$2 billion permanent fund would cover all expenses moving forward.

Oil has been a blessing and a curse. It has provided tremendous wealth for our state government, but not its people. It has made the state complicit in activities that its leaders detest. And it has made our economy reliant on the whims and proclivities of industry executives and foreign powers.

Stashing some money away probably isn't a bad idea.

Councilors uninterested in crime

They failed to include public safety and related crime issues in the city's agenda for legislative priorities in the 2025 New Mexico legislative session.

Are crime and drug use no longer an issue for Las Cruces city leadership? Several councilors only seem to care about the poor and homeless and have a disdain for addressing such things as catch and release, mental competency, bail reform and increasing drug use in Las Cruces.

They believe actions to address these issues only affect the homeless. the poor and those with mental issues. They exhibited these thoughts when opposing the passage of ordinances several months ago. Some seem to think a clean, brightly lit facility, staffed with medical personnel (an overdose prevention center, as presented at a work session on Oct. 28) for addicts to use to shoot up would be great to reduce drug deaths in Las Cruces. Instead, I would think getting drug treatment for those in need to get them off drugs would be a priority for the city. Instead, some councilors would rather provide addicts with a taxpayer funded drug den.

LCPD Chief Jeremy Sto-

ry's legislative priorities dealing with public safety and crime in Las Cruces were discussed by many at the December 2 meeting. Council members stated support for them. However, a couple councillors talked mostly about their personal concerns. Chief Story's legislative priorities should have been included in the agenda for discussion. Instead, they endorsed a bill that would entitle New Mexicans to paid family medical leave from their employer. Small businesses wouldn't be able to hire replacements and would struggle to stay open. This will be a death knell for many small businesses, like the COVID lockdowns of 2020 when many never reopened.

Families stayed together, neighbors helped each other, and abundance, though rare, was celebrated and shared. In the rush of our lives today, most of that is lost. And that is a shame.

Last week, we found ourselves flush with an excess of cucumbers and onions. A simple recipe has yielded surprisingly delicious, home-made refrigerator pickles. For Thanksgiving, apples that we picked ourselves, with the occasional blemish you would never dare to accept finding in a store, became an apple crisp pie that I was proud to share with my family.

But on the other side of the coin, we work hard and often find ourselves leaving home in the dark and coming home in the dark. My children have lamented more than once that I was picking them up "late" from daycare. My heart dies a little every time but how else am I supposed to live the American dream and provide them more abundance and opportunity than I had?

I've decided I do it by balancing hard work and long days with weekends full of sunshine, adventure and, hopefully, an enduring appreciation and even love for a life that moves at a little slower pace and is rooted in the abundance that the land can provide if you have the patience to look and learn. But if the quail would slow down a little for this tired mom, that would be nice, too.



Celebrate Traditional Holiday Values at Farm La-La

Many people lament the loss of tradition and good old-fashioned family values during the 21st century holiday season. As technology becomes a more present influence in our lives, going back to a simpler time – when families and friends came together to share the warmth and excitement of the most wonderful time of the year – is a common refrain. Lucky for us all, then, that the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum heard that yearning and decided to fill the niche with their annual Farm La-La event. taking place this year on Tuesday, Dec. 17.

Celebrating its third vear, the Farm La-La is a fun, festive holiday experience harkening back to that simpler time, when Christmas lights were as tech as it got. and activities such as trolly rides, crafting and consuming s'mores and hot chocolate were the call of the day. Hosted by the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs, it is part of a series of New Mexico traditions held throughout the state during the holiday season.

"I think what sets this event apart from some of our other events, like Cowboy Days in March, is that it's a wintertime event, with activities both inside and outside the museum," said Naomi

Terry, the museum's deputy director. "Whether it's Christmas or Hanukkah or Kwanzaa, we want people to feel welcome, no matter how they celebrate the season."

Among the many ways to celebrate at Farm La-La are activity stations inside the museum, where people can make a Christmas ornament, or even a marshmallow snowman. to take home. One of the more popular offerings is a trolly pulled by a tractor that crosses the historical green bridge, which is festooned with lights, and takes a small tour around the animal pens to view the livestock. Of course, all of the museum's exhibits will also be open, and both employees and volunteers will be on hand to answer any questions that may arise.

"I think this event captures the vibe and the energy of the season," said Terry. "The trolly ride is a very simple and short ride, but it gives people the opportunity to see the Farm and Ranch Museum through a different lens. It's at night,

with the festive lights, and the cold air and the smell of s'mores. It's a very different vibe from what you might get during an afternoon visit. Everybody is so excited, kids and adults alike, that they get to the visit the museum at night. There's a lot of excitement in the air."

The best part about it, according to Terry, is the memories that are created during the event. "At first I was really surprised that

kids would put that much thought into something so simple as making an ornament, but they really do understand that they are making something that will remind them of this time in their lives. ... It's not just a trip to the museum," she said.

It's this sort of engagement that makes the Farm La-La such an important addition to the holiday season, especially during a time when fellowship and joy are in such short supply. We can all use a break every now and then. This event allows us to disengage from our electronics and remind ourselves, and our children, that joy can be found in the most unexpected of places.

"Farm La-La brings us back to basics," Terry concludes. "It's about spending time with your loved ones and neighbors. There is no fancy technology here, it's all being done the way things have been done for generations. It's about relationships and enjoying time with other people, whether it's a child, a grandparent, a friend, or maybe even a friend you've made that night. It brings us back to what life is all about."

Farm La-La runs from 5-8 p.m., Tuesday, Dec. 17.
Admission is \$5 per family and includes access to all of the museum's exhibits.

who operated a rundown combination of gas station, diner and motel in the Mojave Desert. Cleavon Little ("Blazing Saddles," 1974) was also in the cast as the Goldberg character's husband.

Goldberg had much more of a creative say in her next try at a sitcom, as indicated by the show's name ... "Whoopi." It lasted a single season (2003-04) on NBC and had a certain thematic link to "Bagdad Cafe," since Goldberg played a hotel operator, albeit one in Manhattan. The humor of the show often was topical, with politics and ethnicity among the subjects as Mavis Rae (Goldberg) dealt with her employees and guests. One episode reunited Goldberg with her fellow "Ghost" (1990) star Patrick Swayze,

while another teamed her again with Eli Wallach, with whom she worked in the movie "The Associate" (1996).

Though they weren't comedies, Goldberg also did ongoing duty on several other programs. She portrayed Guinan in a recurring role on the syndicated "Star Trek: The Next Generation" (1987-94); she made an early attempt at a talk show with the syndicated "The Whoopi Goldbera Show" (1992-93), which ran for a halfhour on weeknights, as opposed to the usual hour-long length of such ventures; and she was the narrator of "The Con" (2020-22), an ABC series recounting true crimes and compiling interviews with people who were involved in the featured situations.







Gallery approaches 20 years on Mesilla plaza

MESILLA – Mesilla Valley Fine Arts Gallery has had a lot to celebrate. Earlier this month, the gallery celebrated its 30th anniversary, making them one of the longest operating co-op galleries in New Mexico. In January, they will ring in two decades at their current location near Mesilla's historic plaza, at 2470 Calle de Guadalupe.

The gallery is an artist cooperative gallery featuring work from southern New Mexico and west Texas. The artwork in the gallery ranges from acrylic, pastel and watercolor paintings, oil, basketry, drawings, photography, wood turning, gourd art, ceramics, mixed media, stained glass and jewelry.

Additionally, in 2025 MVFA will mark 20 years in a historic adobe building owned by the descendants of Albert Fountain at the south end of Mesilla's historic plaza. The building houses several businesses today, with the gallery located in a rear adobe wing facing the entrance to the Fountain Theatre.

Yvonne Postelle, a co-op member, has been a part of the gallery since the beginning. She is one of the few remaining original members. The gallery has 30 members and there is a wait list to join.

Postelle began displaying her oil paintings at

Sunland Art Gallery at Sunland Mall in El Paso. Texas as well as at Mesilla Valley Fine Arts Gallery when it was located in the Mesilla Valley Mall in Las Cruces. Postelle began her art journey in high school by drawing and was later introduced to oils. After she retired, she went all in with oil painting. She noted that she likes oil as a medium because it's vibrant and lasts forever, and she said depictions of the area landscape are popular.

"I try to paint the Organ Mountains and the scenes around Las Cruces," Postelle said. "I have expanded out to Cloudcroft because I like to paint trees."

Postelle explained that member artists have their artwork on display with rotating locations and also work in the gallery. She tries to have new paintings ready when they rotate quarterly.

"I have a drive to keep

painting," Postelle began.
"I feel like I'm not going to
live long enough to paint
everything. You have to
have an inner drive."

Mesilla Valley Fine Arts Gallery began in the Mesilla Valley Mall with three rooms next to JCPenney. To begin with, the gallery had 26 local artists, including Annette Hoover, Carolyn Bunch, Earline Barnes and Carl Cogar.

After 24 years, she said the gallery was incorporated as a nonprofit organization, under the name Mesilla Valley Fine Arts, in 1994. In 2003, the gallery left the mall and moved to Mesilla, settling into their current home in the Fountain building in 2005.

Kerry O'Neill, an artist who heads the gallery's marketing committee, has deep roots at the gallery. Long before she became a member in 2018, her family would often visit the gallery at the mall and purchase art. O'Neill

recalled playing a game in which artists replicated works by a famous artist or they did an original piece inspired by that artist. Visitors would guess who the artist was. One year, O'Neill and her mother won a gift certificate. The "My Masterpiece" challenge remains a recurring gallery event.

O'Neill is a retired elementary art teacher who lived in Gallup before moving to Las Cruces 11 years ago. While teaching middle school art, she was required to teach her students ceramics.


"I knew zero about it, so I had to be self-taught," O'Neill explained. "Just before I left Gallup, I met someone who taught me how to throw on the wheel. When I moved up here, I took many classes from the museum and got better and better at it. I then created my own little home studio."

O'Neill, along with Ray Baird, was a November artist of the month. She said she draws inspiration from the folk art of Europe and Mexico. She also has a series of plant-based impressions at the Branigan Cultural Center as part of an exhibit named "The Dinner Party: Multicultural Crossroads in Clay."

In discussions with Art Fountain, O'Neill said she learned the building originally was a Mexican customs house with a hostelry. Down the street heading south, there is an empty lot that once housed the corral.

In 1854, after the Gads-



Local cast and crew hail 'Santa's Cousin' opening

"I play a lot of psychopaths. I wanted to do something my grandchildren can see," actor Eric Roberts said about playing Santa Claus in the feature film "Santa's Cousin," which filmed in Las Cruces in 2023 and had its world premiere Dec. 4 at the Cineport 10 cinema in the Mesilla Valley Mall.

"The whole place (Las Cruces) is like a neighborhood. It's a nice place," said Roberts, who has grandchildren ages 5, 3 and 2. He spent three days in Las Cruces filming "Santa's Cousin," attended the 2024 Las Cruces International Film Festival and shot the movie "3" here last year as well.

Joining him at the premiere were other "Santa's Cousin" cast and crew members, including New Mexico State University Creative Media Institute professor Ross Marks, who directed the film, and local actors Knut Brekke, Jessica Jimenez and Nick Check, along with Allen Theatres President Russell Allen.

"It's a great opportunity to do this," said Allen, who opened Cineport 10 (the home of LCIFF) in 2009. "The most amazing thing about (hosting) movie premieres" is that famous actors like Roberts who come to Las Cruces to make movies are "just like you and me," Allen said. "They're regular people. They'll sit down and talk."

Before attending the movie screening, Roberts spent more than an hour in the cafe on the second floor of Cineport 10 talking to the Las Cruces Bulletin, Marks, Allen, other actors in the film and others attending the premiere.

"Eric is so gracious, so kind and patient, so giving. Not all actors are like that," said Marks, who has directed 16 films and has worked with Oscar-winning

actors including Al Pacino, Faye Dunaway and Brendan Fraser.

"I am more proud of 'Santa's Cousin' than any movie I've ever made," Marks said.

Including "Santa's Cousin" and "3," Roberts has appeared in more than 700 movies, filming in 108 countries around the world, he said. He was nominated for an Oscar for best supporting actor for his performance in 1985's "Runaway Train," and is also a three-time Golden

Globe nominee. Now 68, Roberts continues to receive 30-50 acting offers a day, he said.

"I'm an institution," Roberts joked. "I've been lucky, lucky, lucky."

"It was a dream come true to get a part in this movie," said Brekke, who teaches theatre at Mayfield High School and has been acting in local films and live theatre for 20 years. Brekke, who played Mayor Benjamin Harper in "Santa's Cousin," got royal treatment when he recently visited Ruidoso, the setting for the movie. Brekke got to meet the real mayor of Ruidoso and even hosted the "Mondays with the Mayor" local radio show.

One of the highlights of being in the film was working with so many Las Cruces actors, and with more than 30 CMI students on the crew, said Jimenez, who also has performed in many local films and theatre productions. "They rocked it,"

Jimenez said of the students who worked on "Santa's Cousin." "They were on it every single second of every single day."

Jimenez was the on-set costumer for Mel Gibson when he filmed "Hot Seat" in Las Cruces in 2021 and for Ryan Philippe, Kate Bosworth and Ving Rhames for "The Locksmith" when it filmed here that same year.

"In "Santa's Cousin," Jimenez played Morgan Welsh, a character very much like herself. "I got to play me," she said.



If you have tree limbs and branches (including Christmas trees) to dispose of, the City of Las Cruces Utilities Department (LCU) Green Grappler will pick them up and turn them into mulch that is available free of charge to anyone living in Doña Ana County.

"You give us your yard waste you don't want and we turn it into something you do want," LCU Solid Waste Manager Phil Glasson said. "It's a win-win situation."

LCU Solid Waste's Green Grappler picks up tree limbs and branches free of charge from residential customers once a month. There is a charge for picking up green waste from businesses.

Don't want to wait for LCU's Green Grappler on its regular schedule? Just call Customer Central for an extra-service pickup and pay a fee based on the size of the load. Or, take your yard waste to the City's Foothills Clean Fill Landfill, located at

Free yard waste pick up for residential customers

555 S. Sonoma Ranch Blvd. at no charge. You also can pick up free mulch – bring your own containers! The landfill is open 8 a.m.-4 p.m. Monday-Friday and 9 a.m.-3 p.m. on Saturday.

Here are the guidelines to follow for pickup:

- Tree limbs or branches should be no more than five feet in length and no more than five inches in diameter.
- Yard waste must be placed in the street near the curb, at least five feet from any obstruction, including parked vehicles, mailboxes, street signs and other containers; or any overhead obstruction like tree limbs or powerlines.
- Please be sure the waste is not blocking a sidewalk or driveway.
- Stack limbs (neatly, of course!) and have them ready curbside by 6 a.m. the morning pickup is scheduled, or the night before.



- Cut Christmas trees can be placed on the curb for pickup after Christmas. They should be free of lights and decorations (including tinsel) so they can be ground up into mulch. Christmas trees have branches on them, as long as they are no taller than five feet.
- Only green cut trees can be picked up, colored trees are not recyclable.
- · Artificial trees can

be placed curbside for pickup by the bulk grappler on its scheduled day of the month.

 No cut or artificial trees, tree limbs and branches should be placed in trash bins or dumpsters.

Not sure when to put the green waste out? No worries! Utilities mails out a Green Grappler schedule to LCU customers in December. You can pick up a schedule at City Hall, 700 N. Main St., or at the LCU Building, 680 N. Motel Blvd., 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday-Friday. Visit https:// grappler.lascruces.gov/ and fill in your address and the other requested information to see your pickup schedule online.

Survey probes social media use among evangelicals

BULLETIN REPORT

Is vour social media use more helpful or harmful to building real relationships, sharing high-quality information or deepening one's roots in a real community – such as one's faith?

Infinity Concepts, a

Christian marketing firm, and Grey Matter Research conducted a survey of 1.039 evangelical **Protestant Christians** and recently published a report titled, "Helpful or Harmful? Evangelicals and Social Media."

Among its key findings,

the report finds that 54 percent of respondents sav social media is more harmful than helpful to their faith – but they stay online anyway.

The authors also found some advantages were cited by participants: Social internet sites

provide opportunities for evangelism, fast and free access to Christianoriented content and positive community. The report suggests that social media becomes more helpful, and less harmful. for those more actively engaged in faith activity.

In a news release. **Infinity Concepts CEO** Mark Dreistadt suggested church leadership provide guidance to believers about their use of digital media.

"Some evangelicals talk glowingly of how social media has allowed them to talk to others about Jesus, build their own faith through study

or encouragement. and develop greater community with other believers," Grey Matter president Ron Sellers stated in the release. "Others bash social media as shallow, distracting, untrue, seductive, and even evil. But almost all use it."

Community of Hope presents wish list for lawmakers

Mesilla Valley Community of Hope is looking for nearly \$9 million from state lawmakers to expand services, according to a presentation on Dec. 2.

The money would help cover some of the costs of four projects outlined during a Las Cruces City Council meeting. Government entities and quasi-governmental entities like Community of Hope can receive state money through capital outlay or appropriation. The money typically goes towards brick-and-mortar

projects.

The city's chief administrative officer, Barbara Bencomo, said Community of Hope was looking for \$8.8 million. The proposed projects include:

- \$5 million for The Kitchens, a 20,000-squarefoot soup kitchen and licensed commercial community kitchens
- \$410,000 to convert an existing patio into a deescalation office
- \$600,000 for the planning, designing and construction of a solar project for Amador Health Center and El Caldito Soup Kitchen

• \$2.7 million for roadway and pedestrian improvements, including two HAWK systems, a bus/turning lane, a third emergency exit driveway, lateral, trail development/fencing and parking lot renovations as part of the Mesilla Valley master plan implementation.

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously to approve a resolution containing the recommendations, although COH can submit the request independently.

The legislative session begins Jan. 21.



Star athlete looks to future, on and off the track

Goals are a part of everything Kaselle Davis does. They are the beginning. What follows is mostly expected.

As the 2024 New Mexico High School state track and field championships approached last May, the conversation between Las Cruces High coach Jennifer Eatmon and Davis went something like this:

"I asked her what her goals were for state and she said, 'Break records,'" Eatmon said. She won gold medals in four individual events at the state meet – running an 11.8 in the 100 meters, 24.2 in the 200, 54.1 in the 400 and cleared 5-9 in the high jump. The 200 and 400 times were Class 5A state championship records.

"Kaselle is a hard worker and she definitely knows what she wants and how to get it," Eatmon said. "Once she sets her mind to something, there's no stopping her."

Davis capped off her outstanding junior year by being named the Gatorade New Mexico Girls Track

and Field Athlete of the Year. It was only her third year competing in track. The daughter of a football-playing dad and a long-distance-running mom, Davis participated in gymnastics as a child, competitive cheer in elementary school and volleyball in middle school. During her freshman year at LCHS, she decided to give track a try because "my friends were doing it."

"It was during my sophomore year that I thought, I can go somewhere with this," she said. "During my junior year, my goal was to get looked at by colleges."

Eatmon wasn't surprised when the colleges started calling.

"Since I've been here (2016), we've had a lot of great kids with great talent," she said. "We've had five or six go on to the next level. But Kaselle was going to a big school. She's one of the top athletes

we've coached."

Davis visited four schools: Indiana University, Arizona State University, Southern Methodist University and Mississippi State University. She chose Indiana and signed a scholarship offer with the Hoosiers last month.

"I had a bunch of calls and texts," Davis said.
"Some of the schools followed through and some didn't. The four I visited were all good, but the moment I got to Indiana, it felt like home away from home."

Davis has a 3.66 gradepoint average at LCHS and plans to major in biology at Indiana. "Academics are very important to me," she said.

Before moving to Indiana next fall, Davis has another track season ahead, one that will offer more opportunities to break records and improve physically and mentally. She expects to compete in the 200 and 400 at Indiana.

"There are strategies," she said. "The 400 is a very mental race. It's broken up into three or four sections. You have to get out fast, maintain your speed in the middle and you have to kick it in the final 200. I do notice my opponents but I'm in my own world at the same time. The 400 is not for everyone. The 200 is more fast-paced and in the 100, it's all about getting out (of the blocks) quickly."

Eatmon said much of Davis' success is due to the extra work she puts in on her own. "She knows what it takes to succeed, but she doesn't stop there. She does things on her own."

Davis is a regular at the gym, lifting weights "to get more explosive" and she's also focused on maintaining a healthy diet

A new season means new goals. Davis hopes to trim seconds off of her best times this spring. She also plans to run in Albuquerque in January to experience more competition and get some experience running in an indoor meet. Her long-term goals are to compete in the NCAA championships and the Olympic Trials.

"The national meets open more doors," she said. "I want to run with the best."

"Kaselle knows she has a gift," said Eatmon. "All of our athletes are good, humble kids, but she takes that to another level."



Getting into the flow helps your golf game

One of my favorite books in my substantial golf library is "They Played With A Quiet Mind" (1991) by Charles F. Kemp, a professor of pastoral psychology at Texas Christian University, a scratch golfer and psychological consultant to the LPGA.

"The most effective attitude for winning golf is what we have chosen to call a 'quiet mind.' It is a freedom from tension and pressure, a sense of calm and serenity," Kemp wrote. He cites examples of players who performed their best while feeling more positive and relaxed than ever, experiencing "peace of mind."

Recently, Rick Sessinghaus, longtime swing coach for Collin Morikawa, wrote an article for Golf Digest titled, "How

Collin Morikawa quiets his mind." One would think he had just been reading Kemp's book. The previous July. Morikawa had missed a cut and finished T-64 at the RBC Heritage, the two worst finishes

of his career to that point. "He was not in the correct headspace to play his best," said Sessinghaus. "Besides the swing work, a big part of my coaching involves trying to get Collin in the right mental place to perform at his peak. In sports psychology terms, we call this the flow state - loosely de-

fined as being wholly immersed in an activity with a sense of heightened

> focus." This was the very first reference to "flow" relative to golf I had seen in many, many years.

The concept of flow in positive psychology has been studied and researched

since the early 1970s. The term was coined by University of Chicago psychologist Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi in 1970, which he described as "a state of concentration so focused that it amounts to absolute absorption in an activity."He pointed out that the flow state can enhance every human

endeavor, including work, art, music, intimacy, recreation, sports and much

Csikszentmihalyi states that optimal experience is an end in itself. The activity that consumes us becomes intrinsically rewarding. In this way, it is an "autotelic" activity, referring to a self-contained endeavor that is done not with the expectation of future benefit, but simply because the doing itself is the reward. Avid recreational golfers don't stick the tee in the ground expecting a big reward four hours later: They play because they cherish the experience. We play for the fun of it.

There are certain similarities with the flow state and playing in the "zone." In both cases, overthinking and self-consciousness are dampening aspects to performance. When someone in sports is described as playing in the zone, it's often accompanied by being "out of his head," "possessed," "on fire," or "unconscious." They mean intensely focused, absorbed and consumed by what you're doing. That's flow. When professional golfer Al Geiberger ("Mr. 59") became the first PGA Tour golfer in history to shoot 59 for 18 holes in tournament play in the 1977 Memphis Open, he said later, "The day I shot 59 I didn't know I was in the zone, until I was out of the zone."

If you want to create the conditions in your own activities where the flow state and optimal experience are possible, start by eliminating those things that block flow from developing. When you're on the golf course, stop worrying, cancel negative thoughts, don't overanalyze everything, do not complain, clean up bad habits. Tension, anger and nervousness should play no part in your demeanor on the golf course. Is it possible for you to enjoy the combination of the solitude of nature and the comfort of being with other people? Those folks who find themselves in a flow state experience joy. We all need to feel the joy when we play golf.
