AG office: City violated law in selection of city manager

The city of Las Cruces violated New Mexico's Open Meetings Act throughout the process of selecting its new city manager earlier in 2024, an investigation by the state Department of Justice found.

In fact, based on public records and official meetings, the state found that city manager Ikani Taumoepeau was never formally appointed, though the council approved an employment agreement with him including an annual \$216,000 salary.

As a result, "the City Council engaged in closed deliberations and invalid (final) actions prior to the single, open public meeting held to discuss the hiring of a new city manager on April 1, 2024. These actions deprived the public of any meaningful opportunity to participate in, or even witness the deliberations on, a question of significant public importance."

That conclusion was stated in a determination letter following a monthslong investigation by the Government Counsel and Accountability Division. under the New Mexico Attorney General. The letter also indicated that. during the investigation, city staff had acknowledged errors and taken corrective actions. The Department of Justice is authorized to enforce the law through district court, and even to pursue misdemeanor charges, although that is rare.

The office reviewed information gathered by Bulletin news staff, videos and agendas of city council meetings, press releases, text messages, resolutions approved by councilors and reports published by the Bulletin.

City Manager Ifo Pili resigned from the city in February after three and a half years for a new job in Utah. The process of choosing his successor moved quickly and mostly out of public view, and ended with the selection of Ikani Taumeopeau, an assistant city manager who had begun his career working under Pili in Utah before serving as city manager of Clayton, Calif. from 2019 to 2020. He reunited with Pili and took a position with the city of Las Cruces in 2021.

When Pili's resignation was announced on Feb. 28, the city stated that internal applications for the job were underway, an indication that a decision had been made to hire Pili's replacement internally rather than launch an executive search.

At the time, city spokesperson Mandy Guss told the Bulletin, "The city manager hiring process was suggested by Ifo, who spoke individually with the city council members and got their OK to move forward."

Investigator Blaine Moffat wrote in the Dec. 20 determination letter that

the city council, Mayor Eric Enriquez and Pili had reached "a private consensus to accept internal applications" through what is commonly called a rolling quorum.

The law states that any meeting of a quorum, meaning the minimum number of members of a municipal government required for a legal business meeting, must comply with the requirements of official meetings of public governing bodies, including advance notice and publications of an agenda.

The law allows public bodies to meet in closed session for certain topics, such as certain personnel matters or confidential discussions with legal counsel.

The city had argued that no policy vote took place, and that no violation of the law had therefore occurred. However, as the city manager is the one position appointed by the city council, Moffat determined that the selection process needed to be discussed in open session, "regardless of any formal votes occurring."

Besides the scope of the search. Moffat wrote that the March 18 selection of three finalists for the job in a closed meeting also violated the Open Meetings Act. While the law permits discussions of hiring, firing, promotions and similar matters out of public view, Moffat emphasized that that pertains to discussions of individual public employees. The selection of finalists "must have occurred in an open meeting, as these are

matters of public business and affect the public," Moffat wrote.

Similarly, the office determined that the selection of Taumoepeau in a closed session on March 20 was also illegal. Text messages between councilors and Taumoepeau indicated the selection and offer were made in closed session, as well as a press release from the city on March 21 announcing the council had made an offer. The mayor stated in

that press release, "...the decision was not easy."

By the April 1 meeting where councilors approved Taumoepeau's contract, Moffat wrote, "it was clear that the employment agreement ... had already been negotiated, as the contract was already drafted and ready for the City Council's approval. The City Council never publicly discussed the selection of Mr. Taumoe-

for the whole family. A DJ will provide music until 9 p.m., when Las Cruces band Caliente, featuring Hurley-based Tejano singer Keana Huerta on vocals, take the main stage with high-energy dance tunes. That's when the party really begins.

"We don't have a beer garden, or anything like that," said DLCP Executive Director Susan Greenwald. "Instead. we encourage people to visit the bars along Main Street. Little Toad Creek, Icebox and Rad Retrocade will all be open. They're sort of our de facto beer garden. It's also our hope that people will start the evening at the Amador Live New Year's Eve bash, have dinner, enjoy some

entertainment, then walk over to enjoy the festivities at the Plaza."

The evening's highlight, of course, is the illuminated chile drop at midnight, a unique symbol of Las Cruces' culture and heritage. At the stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve. a 19-foot chrome chile pepper, covered in 2.400 sparkling LED lights is lowered, while the crowd goes wild. As in previous years, the public votes on whether the chile pepper will be red or green, paying homage to the official state question, "Red or green?" To vote, the DCLP provides a QR code for people to vote both before the event and during.

"Last year we had between 6,000 and 7,000 people, but they weren't all there at the same time," said Greenwald, "Some

people, mostly families with kids, come early to eat, play a few games and listen to music, then leave before the band starts. Then there are a lot of people who come later in the evening to experience the event. Last year I was on the stage at midnight, and it was wall to wall people all the way to Bank of the West. I think it's just become a tradition for most people. It's something they can do with the family and best of all, it's free."

The Las Cruces Chile Drop is a tradition that seems to be catching on. As Greenwald points out, "Different communities and regions have their own. There's a peach drop in Atlanta, there's a potato drop in Boise. It always seems to be something unusual. There's a crab drop somewhere back east.

There's a cheese ball in Wisconsin. I think it sort of symbolizes the region each takes place in."

With all those drops to choose from, it's a point of pride that for the last few years, the Las Cruces Chile Drop has been in the top 5 of USA Today's lineup of New Year's Eve celebrations. This, in turn, has gotten the attention of national media outlets.

"Our event continues to grow," said Muñoz. "Last year we had CNN and were top ranked in USA Today's New Year's Eve destination spots. It was incredible to see us on TV with an international audience and a record crowd. The CNN group absolutely loved our community, and the Chile Drop celebration. We were so proud because

this is a great family event Las Cruces. and celebration and a great way to show case our beautiful city and community."

"They really loved Las Cruces," adds Greenwald about the CNN crew. "They were so kind and supportive. They loved downtown, they loved Grounded, they even loved the chile. They asked for a case of chile to share with the folks back in Georgia. They were so enthusiastic. They couldn't have been better guests."

All of which makes this event the feather in the DLCP's proverbial cap. Credited through New Mexico Main Street and Main Street America, the DLCP is a nonprofit dedicated to the economic development of downtown

"It's something we do for our community," said Greenwald. "The Chile Drop is sponsored by the city and it's something that we all take a lot of pride in. It's also important to remember that this is a family event. Even though it runs late, it is for the whole familv. It's a friendly, welcoming, feel-good place to be at the turning of the new year."

The Las Cruces Chile Drop brings the community together to ring in the new year, 5 p.m.-12:30 a.m., Tuesday, December 31 at the Plaza de Las Cruces, 100 N. Main St., Las Cruces. More information is available online via DowntownLasCruces.org. or by email at director@ dlcp.org.

peau, only the employment agreement."

"The City Council's lack of compliance (with open meetings law) deprived the public of information and the opportunity to participate in the affairs of government and the official acts of public officers and employees who represent them." Moffat wrote.

It also rendered the process legally invalid, starting with the decision to limit the scope to internal candidates, the letter stated.

The GCA investigation also found that required public statements about what was discussed in closed session had not been made promptly, as the law directs, while noting the council had said that arose from an error "due to misrepresentation of the requirement by staff."

The GCA offered the city two ways to cure the violations.

One option is to hold a properly noticed open meeting "summarizing all the discussions and comments made outside of a public meeting in violation

of OMA, and ratifying the actions by a public and open vote of a majority of the City Council." The discussion would need to address all of the defects in the process dating back to the decision to limit the search to internal candidates. This would not have the effect of validating the decisions retroactively, Moffat underscored, and the approvals would take effect on the day of the new meeting. The implications of that on matters including the employment agreement were not immediately clear.

Another option offered to the city was starting the entire process over and conducting all deliberations and votes in lawful public meetings.

In a written response, City Attorney Brad Douglas did not indicate which option the city would choose.

"We will take immediate action to remedy the deficiencies the (Attorney General) identified. We will take this as a learning opportunity and make improvements in the future. As the AG acknowledged, we have already made corrective action regarding the closed meeting statement requirements."

City looks to fund affordable housing

The Las Cruces City Council committed about \$1.35 million to a new affordable housing project in the El Paseo corridor during a meeting on Dec. 16.

According to the city, Paseos Verdes is set to be an affordable housing development at 905 S. Campo St. It will eventually create 218 units for veterans, seniors and local workers.

When presenting the proposal, Housing and Neighborhood Services Administrator Natalie Green reminded the council that Las Cruces is 5.600 units short of meeting housing demand. When the housing supply is low, the cost of available and new units increases, pricing out individuals and families with lower incomes. Academic research also shows that high housing and rent costs increase the number of unhoused residents.

Green said the Paseos

Verdes project would be divided into three phases. The first phase would include 80 units, with 20 set aside for veterans and mostly 1-bedroom apartments.

Green also said the entire cost of the development was estimated at \$22.17 million, and the city was seeking state funds to help finance the project.

Every member of the council voted to approve the funding commitment expect Councilor Becki Graham, who was absent.

Retiree losing home sparks call for more tenant protections

A group of about 50 people gathered in front of a quiet, single-story apartment building on a quiet Las Cruces street Saturday morning. Many of them held signs bearing messages written by hand: "Affordable housing now," "Stop no cause evictions" and "Keep Sandy housed."

Sandy BarMcQ, 82, a retired schoolteacher, local community activist of 39 years and a leukemia patient, was seated on her walker near the entrance to the small apartment on Fairway Drive where she has lived since 2018.

Last month, she received a notice from her property manager informing her she needed to move out by the end of December.

While she was subsequently granted an extension allowing her to vacate the apartment by the end of February, BarMcQ said finding housing she can afford, living mainly on Social Security income, has proven difficult.

"I've been really active in this community for 39 years," she told the Las Cruces Bulletin. "I love Las Cruces."

BarMcQ said she did not plan a legal fight with the property owner, Purple Mountain Real Estate and Investments, acknowledging that the company was acting legally in ending her lease. She said one of her neighbors had received a similar notice, also with no cause given. BarMcQ said she had stayed current on her rent and did not know why she had been asked to leave.

Property manager Betty Zwilling told the Bulletin in an interview that BarMcQ had been on a month-to-month lease for four years, under an arrangement that originated during the COVID-19 pandemic. Zwilling did not provide a reason for ending the lease, saying it was confidential, and confirmed she had not provided an explanation to the tenant, either.

"Whenever I give a notice to anyone that I am not renewing them, I never discuss it with them," she said, "because they always have a reason, they always have an excuse, and they want to argue, and I don't want to argue with anyone."

Zwilling said she regretted the timing of her initial notice, which would have required BarMcQ to find new housing and complete her move during the December holidays, and confirmed an extension allowing her to stay until Feb. 28. Zwilling stressed that the law permitted termination of her lease with as little as 30 days' notice and that ending her lease was legal.

"New Mexico law is pretty fair to both. It tells the owners and the landlords what they have to do, and they tell the ten-



ants what they have to do, and we each have to abide by what it says," Zwilling

She said she was confident new housing options were within reach.

Unlike many tenants, BarMcQ has a network of friends and supporters who mobilized the Dec. 21 rally, pointing to her story as an illustration of the city's lack of affordable housing or options for tenants who, like BarMcQ, may have their leases terminated without cause and given as little as a month to find a new place in a crowded housing market.

Attendees of the rally said the stress of forcing BarMcQ to move, considering her age and delicate health, could be life-threatening.

Speaking into a microphone, Rev. Carol Wilkins evoked the timing of the

property owners' action close to the Christmas holiday and said, "I call forth right now that all of you here focus on compassion, and I speak to the landlords in this city: There's nothing wrong with making money but there's something wrong with not being compassionate, not having humanity as the first thought ... If this were your mother, would you treat her the same way?"

Zwilling said she had received email messages and phone calls on BarM-cQ's behalf, but that the decision was final.

Turning to housing in the city, Wilkins argued that new development focused on single-family housing. Other speakers linked Sandy BarMcQ's situation to broad trends, including cost-cutting and profit-seeking by companies owning and manag-

ing apartment buildings, displacement of low- and middle-income residents, broken neighborhoods and homelessness.

"So many people in power say that this is a private problem," Sarah Silva, a community organizer, consultant and recently elected state legislator, said when she took the microphone. "Actually, this is a very public problem. It has public solutions."

Silva, one of the event's organizers, called on the city to consider an ordinance limiting no-cause lease terminations, and said she would propose solutions at the state level aiming to keep people housed when she begins her term in Santa Fe. Silva, a Las Cruces Democrat, was elected in November as the state House representative for District 53, which overlaps Doña

Ana and Otero counties.

State Rep. Angelica Rubio, D-Las Cruces, also attended the rally and told the Bulletin a number of proposed new protections for low-income tenants and borrowers were planned for the legislative session opening in January.

During 2024, the city of Las Cruces and Doña Ana County broke ground on multiple affordable housing projects, the largest of which was the 144unit Peachtree Canyon Apartments on the city's east side. On Dec. 16, the Las Cruces City Council approved \$1.35 million toward a \$22 million, 218unit development in the El Paseo corridor, including living space designated for veterans and senior citizens. The efforts to build more housing comes as, by the city's estimate, Las Cruces is 5,600 units short of meeting demand.

Two city councilors, Becky Corran and Cassie McClure, attended the event but did not speak.

"Sandy's situation is upsetting, compelling and

Luján urges Biden to protect DACA recipients before term ends

More than 4,500 New Mexico residents are recipients of federal protections allowing people brought to the U.S. undocumented as children to remain in the country and obtain work permits.

Cindy Nava used to be one of them.

Nava, now a U.S. citizen who will be sworn in as a Democratic state senator from Bernalillo in January, remembers the precariousness that came with being a participant in the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program.

"It's always been sort of a place of limbo. The uncertainty is so troubling," she said, noting two of her siblings still rely on the program.

Federal lawmakers are looking to assuage some of that uncertainty – at least for now. U.S. Sen. Ben Ray Luján recently joined fellow members of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus to urge President Joe Biden to protect immigrants before President-elect Donald Trump, who has said his administration will conduct mass deportations, starts his second term.

In particular, Luján, alongside U.S. Sens.
Catherine Cortez Masto, D-Nev., and Alex Padilla, D-Calif., encouraged the outgoing president to use his final days in office to expedite DACA renewals

and extend Temporary Protected Status for eligible nations like El Salvador, Nicaragua and Venezuela – allowing immigrants to remain in the U.S. amid armed conflict, environmental disaster and other emergencies in

their home countries.

A group of U.S. senators including Luján, Cortez Masto and Padilla also sent a letter to the White House on Monday urging the actions.

"We need to come together as a country – the business community, the faith community, every one of us across the country – to speak clearly and loudly and help organize and bring together the American people so that we can get this done together," Luján said at a Tuesday morning news conference.

The push comes as New Mexico's all-Democratic congressional delegation is "bracing" for a tough four years in the aftermath of Trump's election.

Still, in past statements and at the news conference, Luján has pledged his commitment to bipartisanship, hoping Trump "would be agreeable" to compromises on immigration policy.

Luján and his colleagues stressed the

economic contributions of DACA and Temporary Protected Status recipients.

Andrea Flores, vice president of immigration policy at the bipartisan political organization FWD.us, estimated during the conference Temporary Protected Status participants from Venezuela already have contributed more than \$11 billion to the U.S. economy. Extending the program to people from Ecuador would add \$5.9 billion, Flores added.

"Mass deportations will jeopardize the safety and security of millions of mixed-status families – sowing deep [distrust] and fear in the communi-

The pay is good for 'amateur' athletes

Christmas came early this year for former NMSU quarterback Diego Pavia, and every other "amateur" college athlete who started at the junior college level.

Pavia was recently granted an injunction by the U.S. District Court in Tennessee, giving him an extra year of college eligibility. That means he will continue to make millions of dollars as an unsalaried, "amateur" college quarterback rather than have to take a far lower salary playing as a professional in the United Football League, which plays in the spring, or the Canadian Football League.

Pavia, who transferred from NMSU to Vanderbilt last season, will now be eligible to enter the transfer portal again. And there will likely be a lucrative bidding war among "amateur" college teams for his services unless Vandy steps up with an offer he can't refuse. It's expected that Pavia will rake in more than \$1

million in revenue next season for his name, image and likeness.

If he chooses to continue his career after college and is not able to make an NFL team, his professional salary

will be much lower than his "amateur" earnings. Players on the active roster in the UFL make \$5,500 per game, but only during the season. Salaries in the CFL range from \$100,000 to \$130,000 a year in Canadian dollars.

The court ruled that the two years Pavia played at New Mexico Military Academy don't count against his eligibility, reversing an NCAA rule that has been in place for decades. That means all college players who started at the junior college level will now have an

> additional two years of eligibility.

In denouncing the ruling, the NCAA made no mention of its potential impact on academics and classroom

studies. That's not surprising, as they never cared about those things. But they also ignored the potential impact on competitive balance. Their only concern seemed to be that other student-athletes will be denied that sweet NIL money.

The official statement read, "the NCAA is disappointed in today's ruling and wants all student -athletes to maximize their name, image and likeness potential without depriving future studentathletes of opportunities."

Don't worry guys. There's plenty of money from boosters to spread around.

Pavia was able to successfully sue the NCAA under our antitrust laws. Enforcing the NCAA rules that have been in place for decades amounts to unfair restraint of the labor market.

There are legitimate students-athletes toiling mightily to juggle the competing demands of athletics and academics in all sports other than football and basketball. The NCAA should be for them. Its rules still make sense in that world. They no longer make sense in the multi-billion-dollar entertainment conglomerate

that college football and basketball have become.

In 2021, the New Mexico Legislature was one of the first in the nation to challenge NCAA rules preventing student-athletes from cashing in on their fame. That was the beginning of the end for the old NCAA model, with other dramatic changes quickly following.

Now that both the courts and the legislature have called out the NCAA model for the sham it is, it's time to start over with a new model.

I've been enjoying the expanded college football playoffs this year. But I'm under no illusion that I'm watching "amateur" student-athletes competing for the championship.

On universities and civil society

In a climate in which 'alternative facts' are proposed to contest realities that are grounded in scientific discovery and open discourse, the role of the public university in promoting knowledge, advancing research and educating students and the public needs to be reasserted.

Higher education has a special place in democratic societies. Apart from the generation of new knowledge, the promulgation of a scientific understanding of nature and society and the diffusion of information and technology to students and the public, the American university also has a central role in promoting civil discourse, preparing students for democratic citizenship, reinvigorating higher education for the public good and building community partnerships for positive social change.

The challenges are great.
The growing forces of antiintellectualism, science denial
and radical individualism
stand in stark contrast to the
university. The very foun-

dation of American higher education has been to advance scientific knowledge, promote democratic institutions, enhance access to schooling and to serve our communities at the local, state, national and global levels. Universities, by their fundamental nature, advance the economic, social, environmental and political development of society. Universities act as a buffer to extremism. They promote open discussion of verifiable facts and evidence based theories. They are inclusive, forward looking and committed to the pursuit of the public good.

Some would seek to reshape universities into advanced jobtraining centers. Others would narrow the range of campus discussion to conform to ideological worldviews. Institutions have been held to account for failing to bow to the forces of political fashions and, too often, their funding has been threatened lest they toe the line as defined by the constituency that is in ascendancy.

University scholarship is fact-based. It's grounded in evidence, not opinion. By cooperating with an engaged

citizenry, the work of community engaged scholars is also relevant and timely to the university's constituents. While public universities strive to be just, equitable and committed to a sustainable future, these aspirations are not couched in a political agenda, but rather in an historic definition of the college as a responsible partner with the public it serves. The work of universities is inclusive, democratic and participatory. It is not a servant to any political constituency, party or ideology.

Universities, when unfettered by external political intervention, tend to strengthen democratic values, promote civic responsibility, address critical social issues and contribute to the public good. As alternative realities engulf the national dialogue, community-engaged scholars must reassert the traditional roles of higher education in American life.

Sentencing set for man convicted of killing mother

BULLETIN REPORT

A Las Cruces man convicted of killing his mother in 2023 is set to be sentenced in February. Court records show he faces a possible life in prison.

A jury convicted Dillon Alexander Waller, 31, on Dec. 18 of first-degree murder and tampering with evidence after a three-day trial. Waller was accused of killing his 69-year-old mother, Cynthia Berendzen.

Police said Waller then

drove to California in her car with her dogs and silverware. Days later, Border Patrol agents found the abandoned vehicle and the dogs, still in good health. After his arrest, Waller confessed to the killing.

Samuel McCallum Olmstead, Waller's lawyer, argued that the prosecution had not presented a thorough case and relied too heavily on Waller's confession.

The jury deliberated for about an hour before returning a guilty verdict.

ties we represent – and, without a doubt, destabilize the United States' economy," Luján said.

Nava, who in 2022 became the first DACA recipient appointed by the White House and served as a senior policy adviser to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, said she's hopeful the push from U.S. senators will make a difference, though it's uncertain what more can be done during Biden's remaining days in office.

"To see senators like Sen. Ben Ray Luján [and] Sen. Padilla advocating and pushing is something I'm sincerely very grateful for – because we need people who can uplift their voices in the absence of our families," said Nava, a self-described "alum" of Luján who formerly worked as his political director.

She added, "I'm an optimist by heart. That's how I've had to do life."

Action now is just the beginning of efforts to provide stability for DACA recipients, she said. With Trump's return to the White House looming, Nava advocated for continued pressure on immigration decision-makers – including the Trump administration.

"We have to be able to have a place and active communication with the new administration, ensuring that they know and that they understand our contributions." Nava said.

She added, "It's in our country's best interest to ensure that we provide the next step after DACA – that is permanent and that allows folks to have just the feeling of safety."

"Those exams are very tough," said Utilities
Department Deputy Director for Water Ronald
Borunda, who holds all eight certifications from both lines of business and has worked in the water and wastewater industry for more than 20 years. "In the begin-

ning, it's more rules, regulations and basics. As you get into higher levels, they really ramp up mathematics: formulas; algebra, geometry and some calculus."

Successful test takers also must understand both the United States Customary or Imperial System of measurement and the metric system, and how to convert from one to the other. That's vital to the work that Water and Wastewater employees do because some of the machinery, components and chemicals they use on the job are manufactured in other countries that use the metric system.

Level 3 and Level 4 certification also include "more management-style questions," Borunda said, to help train employees to become Utilities managers and administrators. ""The whole goal is for you to grow over time to a Level 4," he said.

Water Line of Business Certifications also include knowing about water systems in general; the City's water supply, where it comes from and how it is protected; the rules and regulations for clean drinking water established by the federal Environmental Protection Agency; and a wide range of safety issues.

The Wastewater Line of Business Certifications include an understanding of the microbiology involved in the treatment and recycling of the City's wastewater so it can be returned to the Rio Grande and the city's water supply or used to water turf in golf courses, parks and playfields and for other purposes.

"We try not to waste anything," Borunda said, and that's what Utilities employees learn as part of the Water and Wastewater certification.

"When I see these employees get these higher certifications, I rejoice for many different reasons," said Borunda, who has been with Utilities for six years, including the last four years as deputy director for Water. "They are growing, they're learning; they're serving their community. I am super proud of all these staff members."

too common in Las Cruces," Corran told the Bulletin on Monday. "We are committed to addressing housing at every level, with hundreds of new affordable apartments coming on line in the next months and years, zoning reform and working with our legislators and housing advocates."

McClure said the council had been alerted to BarMcQ's situation earlier this month, but the city's housing and legal departments had advised there was little that could be done.

"It adds to feeling impotent when more could be done in tandem with state and city leadership examining routes forward, especially on fast-tracking the creation of more housing," McClure said.

She expressed hope that sweeping zoning changes the council will vote on in February will add options, such as permitting more homeowners to build small dwelling units like casitas.

As friends, at least one neighbor, church members and other community members offered her good wishes and

INTO THE WILD

'What Walks This Way' combines field guide with memoir

Some urban raccoons can untie knots and open doors. Fisher cats aren't felines and don't eat fish. A bobcat's teeth have evolved to fit precisely into the spaces of its prey's spinal cord. Spotted skunks warn away predators by doing a handstand on their front feet and spreading their back legs in the air. As Sharman Apt Russell's excellent new book shows us, the animal kingdom is a riot and a hoot.

Like so many of the creatures that the author references, "What Walks This Way" is a hybrid: part memoir, part field guide, part natural history. The tone is that of a generous mentor talking you through a topic - wildlife tracking – that she clearly adores. Potted histories of coyotes, bears, raccoons, etc., are intermingled with anecdotes about the author's time wandering the wilderness in southern New Mexico with a beloved friend, or stories of legendary trackers, her rugged great-uncle among them, or evenings spent on the porch listening for mysterious

rustlings that might lead to discoveries.

While Russell possesses the curiosity of a serious scientist, endearingly there remains something of the enthusiastic amateur about her. She writes, "You... have to care, really care, about what animal was here a day ago... The truth is that sometimes I care,

and sometimes I don't." Elsewhere, she states that professional trackers carry rulers to measure paw marks; she usually forgets hers and measures everything with her fingers. (She assures us that the distance from fingertip to first crease is about an inch.)

The book is full of enjoyable digressions. Besides brief introduc-



tions to biologists and ecologists doing vital conservation work, Russell offers copious examples of nature's whims and absurdities. The gray fox can scramble 60 feet up a cottonwood tree and leap from branch to branch; the red fox can't climb trees at all. Coyotes and badgers often hunt together, sometimes with the same partner throughout the season. Researchers in Chicago have seen coyotes wait at stoplights until a road is clear, wander into the middle, then pause to check for traffic going the other way. Javelinas mourn their

In some ways, the digressions are the point. The author quotes the ecologist Mark Elbroch: "The competent tracker is both scientist and storyteller." Russell, a novelist as well as a nature writer, concurs. She mentions that imagination is

key to tracking because imagination allows us to interpret the signs discovered. Why was this mountain lion bounding so quickly up this particular slope? Why did this herd of deer change direction and veer towards the trees? Trackers use everything they know about an animal and weave it, along with the signs that the animal has left behind, into a story.

Stories can be wonderful, but of course the budding tracker needs a few basics. In "What Walks This Way," practical information comes in panels with a shaded background. These panels consist of brief explanations of how to identify

a particular animal's tracks, as well as handy (paws-y?) diagrams of these tracks. Kim Cabrera's illustrations are a model of clarity and elegance. Cabrera also offers possibly the best advice imaginable for trackers: "You teach yourself by spending time in the dirt."

While the book is joyful, it does touch upon serious ecological issues. Each chapter details the degree to which the animals described are endangered. More often than not, human intervention, aka greed, is the cause. Climate change looms large. There is also a section that describes how and why we hunt. (Hint: it's not always for food or self-preservation.)

"What Walks This Way" will send you back to the wild places. If you

live in a rural area or go hiking, you'll find yourself eyeing the ground as you walk, hoping for the telltale sign—a triangular palm pad, the X shape of a dog's hind track, a dewclaw toe—of some gorgeous critter who passed this way. And all the while, you'll have Russell's friendly voice in your head imploring you to pay attention, to notice the things worth noticing: in this case, the creatures with whom we share this sacred planet.

Border highway connector to impact ports of entry

DIEGO MENDOZA-MOYERS El Paso Matters

A new highway that will run through Sunland Park, New Mexico, is another step closer to reality after an engineering firm finalized the route for the so-called Border Highway Connector state road that will likely be built over the next half-decade.

There's a number of reasons New Mexico is building the new, 8-milelong state highway, which is estimated to cost \$150 million. The new road is expected to slash travel

times in half for residents in Sunland Park traveling to the industrial parks west of Santa Teresa or to the Santa Teresa Port of Entry. The road will also provide an alternate path for first responders to travel to emergencies in the area.

The highway could also redirect traffic away from congested El Paso ports of entry, providing an alternative for travelers, particularly semi-trucks as the federal government looks to remove truck traffic from the Bridge of the Americas.

"You can very quickly, with this border connector highway, jump onto Paisano (Drive), and jump onto Loop 375 and go anywhere in our region that you want to go very quickly and unimpeded," said Jerry Pacheco, CEO of the Border Industrial Association, which recruits companies to the Santa Teresa area.

"We'll have a second set of major ingress and egress into the Santa Teresa industrial base. That new Border Highway Connector is going to get cargo, it's going to get

employees, it's going to get support service companies much more quickly into Santa Teresa," he said.

Construction on the highway will likely start in late 2025 or early 2026. It future development in could be completed in 2028 or 2029, said Bert Thomas, a vice president of the Albuquerque engineering firm Bohannon Huston, which the state of New Mexico hired to plan out the new highway.

Thomas said the Border Highway Connector is expected to see more use from passenger vehicles than commercial semitrucks. Still, the road will offer a quicker entry into Sunland Park or El Paso than Pete Domenici

Highway for some trucks that cross into the U.S. at the port of entry in Santa Teresa.

And long-term, the connector will be in place to serve new residents and Santa Teresa and Sunland Park fueled by job growth at the industrial parks as well as big, new residential developments that are slated to come to the area.

The population of Sunland Park grew by 6% from 2020 to 2023, when the city's population reached nearly 18,000, while El Paso's population remained flat over that time. And employment in manufacturing in Sunland Park and Santa Teresa has increased fourfold since 2010, making up over 40% of jobs there, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

"It's infrastructure to support economic development," Thomas said. "There's a lot of potential growth in this area. There's a lot of potential increase of economic opportunities, and this will help support that."

The new highway will start at the intersection of Sunland Park Drive and McNutt Road in Sunland Park, where the road will start heading south and feature a roundabout at an intersection with Anapra Road. From there, the highway will head

west, running adjacent to the two nearby elementary schools – Desert View and Sunland Park in the Gadsden Independent School District – before the road crosses over Union Pacificowned railroad tracks and onto the mesa of undeveloped desert west of Sunland Park.

The highway will end at an intersection with Pete V. Domenici Highway, about 2 miles north of the Santa Teresa Port of Entry.

"You can cross at the port of Santa Teresa, and a couple of miles north of Santa Teresa, you can make a right hand turn east on the Border Highway Connector, (and) boom, you're in Sunland Park. And then boom, you're in El Paso," Pacheco said.

The plan is to build a multiuse trail along the highway. For now, the New Mexico Department of Transportation has secured \$79 million in funding from a federal grant out of the \$150 million price tag.

The eastern portion of the highway in the developed area of Sunland Park will be fully built out initially. But the western portion of the highway in the undeveloped desert will be just two lanes at first. As development in the area takes place in the coming years, the New Mexico Department of Transportation can expand the highway four lanes and add the multi-use trail. Thomas said.

"As development occurs in that vacant land, it could be easily expanded to four lanes," he said.

Impact on Borderland ports
The new state highway could
improve the flow of traffic near
the port of entry in Santa Teresa for trucks looking to avoid
more congested crossings such

as the Bridge of the Americas or the larger Ysleta-Zaragoza bridge, Thomas said.

"The truck traffic that I would anticipate using this (is) if they're trying to deliver something to the Sunland Park area, or to one of the facilities within the El Paso area, they may use this as the route to get there instead of going up and around" Pete V. Domenici Highway, Thomas said.

At recent community meetings about the Border Highway Connector in Sunland Park, residents expressed concern about semi-trucks creating traffic problems in Sunland Park and on McNutt Road. They also said there ought to be a physical barrier between the highway and the two schools, as well as adjacent neighborhoods, to block the sound of passing vehicles.

Thomas, however, said a sound barrier is unnecessary based on his firm's estimates of how much noise the new traffic will create.

"I'm not a fan of trucks coming through there, but I understand this is going to be a state road," Sunland Park Mayor Javier Perea told El Paso Matters. "There's not much I can do to stop that. But at least (the Border Highway Connector) does provide us an opportunity to be able to get safety vehicles out there at a much faster pace."

Perea said he expects the new highway to cut in half the time it takes to get from the southern part of Sunland Park to the Santa Teresa Port of Entry, from 20 or 25 minutes currently down closer to 10 minutes. And he said he expects new growth and development to follow the new highway.

"I'm sure it'll spark further economic development west of us," Perea said. "The Border Highway Connector will have a positive impact on the community."

On average, just over 1,000 cargo trucks cross north and south at the Santa Teresa Port

of Entry daily, according to estimates from the El Paso Metropolitan Planning Organization. Only the Ysleta-Zaragoza bridge handles more commercial traffic among the region's border crossings.

And the Border Highway Connector could make the Santa Teresa crossing more attractive to importers and exporters by cutting the time it takes trucks to get from the Santa Teresa Port of Entry into El Paso, and vice versa, Pacheco said.

Santa Teresa's port of entry may also see more traffic after the Bridge of the Americas crossing in south El Paso closes for three years while the federal General Services Administration completes a \$650 million renovation of that port of entry. Construction at BOTA is expected to begin in 2026.

It's possible the federal government will ban commercial trucks from crossing at BOTA once that bridge reopens to traffic likely in 2029, a move meant

to alleviate pollution from idling trucks in nearby neighborhoods such as Chamizal.

If the federal government bans commercial trucks from BOTA, the crossing in Santa Teresa could permanently see an additional 80 to 90 cargo trucks shift from BOTA to instead cross at Santa Teresa every day, according to the MPO.

And even if cargo trucks aren't banned permanently from BOTA – a decision the federal government will make in January – Santa Teresa's port will still likely see an uptick in truck traffic while BOTA is closed for construction.

"Where are those trucks going to go during construction? Or permanently, if they choose. They're going to go to Santa Teresa. They're going to go to Zaragoza," said Eduardo Calvo, executive director of the MPO.

Meanwhile, the city of Sunland Park is continuing work to develop its own international crossing into Mexico.

Thomas, of Bohannon
Huston, said his team had to
re-route the Border Highway
Connector because an earlier
path they designed that was further south would have crossed
through the property Sunland
Park identified as the future site
of a new border crossing.

At the Border Highway Connector roundabout that's expected to go near Anapra Road, Thomas said the city of Sunland Park will be able to add a fourth leg that will lead south to a port of entry site if it's eventually developed.

The new state highway in New Mexico is one piece of a broader effort to improve the flow of people and goods throughout the Borderland region, Thomas said.

"This is a very important project for the border connectivity," he said.

Commissioners praise jail's progress but call for upgrades

BULLETIN REPORT

The Doña Ana County Board of Commissioners gave the county detention center high marks, calling it clean and remarking about the courteousness of the staff. However, it said that some improvements were needed.

The comments came from three commissioners during a meeting on Dec. 10, which was part of the yearly jail inspection report for the Doña Ana County Detention Center.

County records show that commissioners Diana Murillo and Christopher Schaljo-Hernandez visited the jail on Nov. 13 for the yearly inspection. Commissioner Susana Chaparro, who works in the criminal justice industry, also gave her thoughts on what's working and what isn't.

"This was my fourth inspection of the detention center, and (there's been) great improvements since 2021 up to this year,"
Murrillo said.

Detention center records show that the jail houses around 600 to 800 people on any given day. Some are there for a few hours, while others wait months or years as their court cases drag on.

Overall, the commissioners said the facility was very clean, the staff was very courteous and improvements to the jail floor and kitchen areas were well made.

"I know that you all take pride in the facility,

and I know that the individuals that work there take great pride in their work," Schaljo-Hernandez said.

Still, Murrillo and Schaljo-Hernandez highlighted the need to renovate the staff locker room areas. Chaparro reiterated that point and went further.

She called the employee area "overcrowded" and said an expansion was needed. She also noted that the area of the jail reserved for attorneys to meet with clients was below par.

"It's just the same as it was 20 years ago," Chaparro said.

The board suggested they'd like to address some of those upgrades in the upcoming budget.

DOJ report says systemic failings led to 2022-23 hazing incidents

New Mexico State University must make significant and sustained changes to mitigate the chance of another incident that led to "disturbing sexualized hazing incidents" within the 2022-23 men's basketball team, according to the New Mexico Department of Justice.

The report commended NMSU for making changes but said more was needed, even as three former basketball players face criminal charges for allegedly molesting other

players as part of a hazing ritual.

"This report is intended to shine a light not only on the specific misconduct by members of NMSU's basketball team but also the institutional deficiencies that allowed that misconduct to go unaddressed by leaders inside the university," Attorney General Raúl Torrez said in a state- three key findings: ment released with the report. "While NMSU has made commendable progress since these incidents occurred, more must be done to ensure accountability and prevent future harm."

Former players Deshawndre Washington, Kim Aiken Jr., and Doctor Bradley all face criminal charges following what the Attornev General described as "a monthslong scheme of sexualized hazing targeting at least four teammates and two student managers."

The report highlighted

- · The assaults occurred in an environment characterized by a toxic culture that permeated the basketball program.
- · Opportunities to observe and intervene were missed by those close to

· Institutional safeguards were insufficient to prevent or address misconduct.

The report also came with 35 recommendations, six of which were deemed as "high priority." Those were:

- · Written guidelines for collaboration between the athletic department, Office of Institutional Equity, and dean of students.
- · Recurring Title IX and anti-hazing training for all students and staff.
- · Proportional disciplinary measures for studentathletes based on the severity of misconduct.
- Stronger standards for recruiting practices and coach/player vetting.
- · Ensuring senior lead-

ership prioritizes and adequately funds safety initiatives and programming.

· Establishing a center dedicated to sexual violence education, prevention, and victim advocacy.

"We also hope the report will serve as a roadmap for other educational leaders in our state for how they can take proactive steps to either prevent or at least mitigate the traumatizing impact that hazing has on students at every level of our educational system," Torrez

In a statement released to news media, NMSU said they were committed to making changes.

"We have received the attorney general's report

and are currently in the process of reviewing it in detail." NMSU's statement said. "We are pleased that the Attorney General acknowledged the work we have done to enhance training and put safeguards in place to help ensure a situation like this never happens again. The report also notes areas for additional improvement and provides recommendations for measures to further protect and support our students. We are committed to giving the detailed report and its recommendations careful review and consideration. and we look forward to continuing the collaborative effort to ensure the safety and well-being of our students."

Unlock motivation to play better golf

Let's face it: Most golfers are stuck in a rut. They go out to the golf course to play with their usual friends, spend $4\,1/2$ hours playing their usual game, go home and don't remember how they did. They enjoyed recreating for 25 percent of their waking hours, but did they get better? If the answer is "no," some golfers would be concerned. Those are the motivated golfers. Are you one of them?

I'm one of those teachers who believes if we aren't learning and improving we're going backwards. It's all about achievement motivation.

Motivation is a complex phenomenon. It is not directly observable. but there are evident

symptoms and it is measurable. When Herb Wimberly and I were doing our golf schools, I remember that some of our students were obviously highly motivated to change their golf game for the better and were willing to expend the effort, while others just wanted to know the "secret" to better play so they didn't have to practice. I have noticed golfers who have such a negative attitude and sour disposition that it is difficult to believe they are motivated to get better at

golf much less enjoy it.

Being motivated for playing better golf in-

of his previous 15 events. and then won at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship on Nov. 17. Having the innate ability to do something, like swing a golf club, is not a requirement for success. It is possible to be motivated while lacking the corresponding ability. For example, if you currently lack the

skill to hit a quality shot out of a sand bunker, your motivation, together with instruction and practice, will change that. Strong, persistent motivation usually manifests itself in a sustained dedication over time. This remains true in virtually all aspects of life, including professions, music, business and athletics. Research has shown a correlation between high motivation to recover from illness or accident with a faster recovery. Strong motivation can turn weaknesses into strengths.

If you know your motivation to improve is lacking, do your best to figure out why. Can it be inconsistent results, nagging

injuries, perfectionism or unreachable (unrealistic) goals? If you feel like working on your game is a chore, find ways to notice the joy in golf. No one can give you motivation. You must be self-motivated. In many ways it becomes habit. All it takes is a little improvement that is directly related to what you are trying hard to do that will give you a little boost.

A lapse in motivation could be due to forgetting about your goals. Something as simple as keeping track of the number of greens and fairways you hit in regulation, and then raising the bar for yourself can help. How about the number of putts

you take in a round? A lot of recreational golfers take over 40 putts for 18 holes. That's too many. Set a goal for under 36. Consider sharing your new goals with your golfing friends, and see if they share your interest in raising the bar. If you want to tweak your swing for the better, get used to being uncomfortable. It's like a gym workout: It wasn't meant to be comfortable.

If you have a good golf swing, do not squander what you were given, but rather try to make it earn more satisfying results. Being motivated to excellence leaves absolutely zero tolerance for complacency and excuses.
