Las Cruces Fire chief retires after 22 years

By the time of his interview with the Las Cruces Bulletin, Las Cruces fire chief Jason Smith had mostly cleared out his office.

Near the front desk in the 60-year-old Fire Station 1, Smith's now barren workspace was once adorned with accolades and artwork constructed by his children. This is the arc Smith, retiring after 22 years in the department, wants to replicate. From a life leading Las Cruces' fire and emergency medical response, to one of family.

In his empty office, Smith counted among his top achievements as chief the passage of the 2018 general obligation bonds, overseeing the fire department's reorganization, adding ambulance services to the department, growth of the Mobile Intergrated Health and the creation of Project LIGHT, while building out Las Cruces Fire Department's fire prevention capacity.

Throughout Smith's career, LCFD has had to grow as Las Cruces grew, and Smith was there for it either as a participant in growth – Smith was in LCFD's first paramedic class in 2006 – or overseeing it, as he did with the department's reorganization when he was deputy chief.

Being a firefighter wasn't always in Smith's plan. His first taste of it came when he was a teen-

ager. Smith's father was in the Navy, and while traveling back from Hawaii, Smith had the chance to undergo a bit of firefighting training on a ship.

"We did some firefighting training that you

would do for a 12-year-old or young teenagers there, where you have a hose line and they're pumping the sea water up through it. That's what you're using for firefighting," Smith said. "But then after that, I was really thinking about a different career path."

He started his professional life in the business world. He graduated from the University of Texas El Paso in 2002 with a Bachelor's in business administration.

"I was thinking of going into financial services, and I was actually working as a financial advisor when I really wasn't feeling fulfilled," Smith said.

Things changed when a colleague suggested he look to the Las Cruces Fire Department. He was already thinking about getting more involved in the community via volunteer work. But after a few short interactions, followed by a 12-hour ride-along, Smith was

in love.

"That really felt like what I was missing, as far as the team aspect and helping people, being involved with the community that was checking all the boxes," Smith said. "And there's a lot of fun in firefighting. The camaraderie of station life is really one of the things that firefighters talk about the most, and what they most often miss."

Indirectly, Smith contributed greatly towards the quality of station life. In his four years as chief and six years as deputy chief, Smith oversaw two new Las Cruces fire stations – both funded at the will of voters.

Voters approved a

Silva calls for press protections with new bill

A freshman state lawmaker and leaders in both legislative chambers want to update and strengthen New Mexico's press shield law.

Rep. Sarah Silva (D-Las Cruces) is carrying House Bill 153, which would update the definition of a journalist to include bloggers and nonprofit news outlets (like Source NM).

It would also protect reporters' electronic communications, such as email, from state spying.

The bill is modeled after the federal PRESS Act, which Congress failed to enact last year after then President-elect Donald Trump ordered congressional Republicans to block it. That would have codified regulations adopted by the U.S. Department of Justice in 2021 under former President Joe Biden.

"We see examples at the federal level of government chipping away at journalists' ability to do their jobs by pursuing the identities of unnamed sources and deterring whistleblowing," Silva said in a statement.

Silva's Protect Reporters From Exploitive Spying Act is being co-sponsored by House Speaker Javier Martínez (D-Albuquerque) and Senate Majority Leader Peter Wirth (D-Santa Fe), according to a news release from the Democratic majority in the House.

The House of Representatives assigned the bill for hearings in the House

chairs on Friday had not yet scheduled it for a hearing.

If enacted, the legislation would only apply to proceedings in the state government's legislative and executive branches because of a 1976 New Mexico Supreme Court ruling forbidding the Legislature and governor from enacting laws related to rules of evidence in court.

rebuild of Fire Station 3 along Valley Drive in 2018 and a new station, Fire Station 9 on the East Mesa, during Smith's tenure. It's one of the things he's most proud of. Fire Station 3 opened in April 2022, while the city broke ground on Fire Station 9 in October 2024.

"Being involved with that, and seeing the \$36 million that came in for (the) Fire Station 3 replacement, the new animal shelter, the East Mesa Park, the trail system; when you look at all those things, it's like, wow, that's where I got to really spearhead something that was outside of what a fire chief would expect to be doing," Smith said.

With Smith's departure on Jan. 31, City Manager Ikani Taumoepeau appointed Deputy Chief Sean Heck as interim chief. In a news release, Taumoepeau and the city said they would launch a national search to replace Smith.

That person will have their work cut out for them as Las Cruces continues to evolve, Smith said.

"I think we're getting to a point where we really need to examine our EMS system and our hospital system," Smith said.

As the community grows and health services scale up, Smith noted that they become a magnet for smaller communities looking for treatment. He said that people in need of treatment will look more and more to Las Cruces.

With that, emergency services will need to have the ability to transfer patients in and out of Las Cruces with ease. Other systems, like 911 call centers, will also have to expand to meet increased demand.

LCFD already sees high demand for services, Smith noted, attributing that to a combination of poverty and older residents both needing LCFD.

But Smith's parting message was twofold, in part for firefighting and in part for emergency medical services.

"On the EMS side, we need to continue to be advocates for our patients and we need to provide the best care we can throughout the entire system, from the 911 call-taker all the way up to hospital. We need to advocate for our patients and take care of them.

"On the fire side, when it comes to resources, we try to be very diligent with the public's money. We need to continue to be funded for the type of services they want to see and public wants to have.



Heinrich cosponsors bill on fentanyl derivatives

Fentanyl-related substances would be permanently classified as Schedule I drugs in a change to the Controlled Substances Act cosponsored by U.S. Sen. Martin Heinrich, D-N.M..

"We're losing more than 75,000 Americans each year to illicit fentanyl overdoses," Heinrich said in a written statement. "I refuse to accept this reality, and that's why I'm working to deliver tools law enforcement personnel need to keep deadly fentanyl off our streets and out of our communities."

The bipartisan bill, styled as the Halt All

Lethal Trafficking of Fentanyl Act, was introduced Thursday, Jan. 30.

Fentanyl is a synthetic

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid approved for use as an anesthetic and pain reliever, but the Drug Enforcement Administration estimates its potency as 100 times stronger than morphine and 50 times stronger than heroin. The toll of addiction and overdose are high: Of 107,543 overdose deaths tracked in the United States in 2023, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimated 75,000 - nearly 70 percent - involved fentanvl or fentanyl-related substances.

Fentanyl-related substances are synthetic opioids with a chemical structure similar to fentanyl, as defined by DEA, which are either smuggled into the country or manufactured domestically. They are often disguised as other prescription opioids, per law enforcement agencies and federal authorities, and are sometimes mixed with heroin, cocaine or opioid medications, all increasing the risk of misuse and fatal overdose. The composition also changes frequently as a result of efforts to evade detection

and prosecution.

For years, the DEA has temporarily classified some fentanyl analogues as Schedule 1, the classification for drugs that have no accepted medical use and high potential for abuse, a list that includes heroin, Ecstasy and LSD. The designation has been repeatedly renewed by Congress - as recently as last month. Other fentanyl derivatives used in veterinary and human medicine are Schedule 2 drugs, a designation for drugs with dangerous potential.

The "HALT Fentanyl

Act" would permanently include those substances as Schedule 1 drugs, which Heinrich said would establish consistent and clear criminal penalties under U.S. law. Similar bills have been introduced in recent years in both chambers, one of which passed the House of Representatives in 2023.

Traffickers in fentanylmimicking drugs would face imprisonment anywhere from five years to to life, depending on the amount of product involved and previous offenses. The bill also includes provisions facilitating further research into the derivatives, and calls for the Department of Justice to study the research and report to Congress within a year of the bill's enactment, per a draft copy of the bill.

Heinrich, a Democrat, is joined as a lead sponsor by Republican colleagues Bill Cassidy of Louisiana and Chuck Grassley of Iowa. As of Thursday, the bill had lined up about a dozen cosponsors comprising Democrats, Republicans and one independent.

The high court's press shield rule provides "reasonably strong" protection against compelling journalists from disclosing confidential sources and information, according to a compendium written by Albuquerque lawyer Charles K. Purcell, an expert on the state's shield law and rule and a New Mexico Foundation for Open Government board member.

However, Purcell wrote, that protection goes away whenever someone can convince a judge that the source or information is "crucial" to their case and they have no other way of getting it.

According to the news release, Silva and Purcell will ask the Supreme Court's Rules of Evidence Committee to consider changing the shield rule.

What's new with Las Cruces' 2022 GO bonds

Projects funded by the 2022 general obligation bond cycle are progressing on track, with some exceptions, according to a presentation to the Las Cruces City Council on Jan. 27.

Voters approved the four projects—a new fire station, park improvements, a recreation center, and affordable housing—and \$23 million in the 2022 general election with overwhelming majorities.

David Sedillo, the city's public works director, presented the updates as part of a quarterly check-in on the progress.

Fire Station 9

The first of the four updates featured progress for Fire Station 9.

Billed as a new fire station for Las Cruces' evergrowing East Mesa on the Mesa Verde development, voters sent \$9.8 million in public funds to the project. In all, Sedillo said the project will cost about \$12.13 million. The gap in funding is being filled by Telshor Fund money and grants.

The city hosted a groundbreaking for the fire station in October, and it's now about 10 percent complete. Sedillo estimated a completion date of Feb. 28, 2026.

Park Improvements

The second project was about \$1.98 million for park improvements. The

city chose to invest the bond funds in improvements to La Llorona Park, with extra funds going to Tellbrook Park. The city will redo the restrooms, upgrade amenities and repair the trail at La Llorona. At Tellbrook, the city will replace exercise equipment.

Sedillo said the La Llorona improvements are awaiting final approval from the International Boundary and Water Commission, an international body that oversees development on border rivers including the Rio Grande.

Sedillo said this project is behind schedule largely because of the back-andforth with the IBWC. However, the expected completion date remains at the end of 2025.

East Mesa Public Recreational Complex

One of the largest public works projects undertaken by the city in recent years, the East Mesa Public Recreational Complex, has required two bonds to complete. Sedillo said about \$2.25 million was needed from the \$5 million bond to finish phase one.

Now, those remaining items include a shade structure and playground equipment. Sedillo said the shade structures were delayed but should be available and installed in February. In all, Sedillo said he expects a completion date toward the end of 2025.

Affordable Housing Bond

Natalie Green, the city's housing and neighborhood services manager, listed three projects when updating councilors about the \$6 million GO Bond, which is meant to help the city grow its affordable housing supply.

The first project was Three Sisters, a 70-unit housing complex on N. Walnut Street for families with children. The units will be reserved for families making less than 60 percent of the area's median income.

Green said the project was about 70 percent complete, with a tentative opening date in March.

The second project was Pedrena apartments on El Paseo Road and Farney Lane. This 80-unit apartment complex is reserved for residents 55 or older who make less than 60 percent of the area's median income.

This project was about

60 percent complete. Green has previously estimated completion for December 2025.

Peachtree Canyon was the final GO-bond-funded project Green presented. The city broke ground on this project in October 2024. It's a 144-unit affordable housing development on the East Mesa. Construction remains in the early phases, Green said. She did not provide an estimated completion date.







'The state's housing agency'

Q&A WITH HOUSING NEW MEXICO'S DIRECTOR

Housing New Mexico, founded in 1975, is marking its 50th anniversary this year. For much of that time, it was known as the New Mexico Mortgage Finance Authority. Executive Director and CEO Isidoro Hernandez explains, "When we started out, we were doing mainly first-time homebuyer programs and mortgages, and some bond issues to do rental development." Later, he said some state programs were transferred to the quasi-governmental agency, expanding its mission into several other areas relating to housing.

Now known as Housing New Mexico, Hernandez said the organization addresses "the full continuum of housing, from homelessness to homeownership."

Hernandez, a New Mexico State University graduate, began work at Housing New Mexico as a management trainee in 1992 and has been the executive director for five years. He spoke with the Las Cruces Bulletin to offer readers an introduction to the agency and its work.

Q: We might start by letting you introduce your agency to readers.

Hernandez: We are the state's housing agency. We provide affordable hous-

ing opportunities for the full spectrum of housing. We have programs to address a full continuum of housing, from homelessness to home ownership. We have a total of 40 programs and about as many funding sources.

We serve the entire state of New Mexico from corner to corner, and we do that via a network of partners across the state.

We're a quasi-governmental agency. We are not a state agency, but we do have oversight from the state. We have three elected officials on our board: the lieutenant governor, the state treasurer and the attorney general. The governor appoints our other four board members.

Q: Who are your partners?

Hernandez: We have approximately 350 partners that deliver services at the local level. They vary from being, say nonprofits, for-profits, local governments, tribal governments, the realtors, lenders – the whole scope.

Q: You reached a high mark in state funding last year. How was that dispersed through the state?

Hernandez: We were very fortunate to have support from the legislature and the governor last year, and we received \$50 million for the New Mexico Housing Trust Fund on top of some recurring

funding we started receiving a couple of years ago.

The housing trust fund can be used only for some very specific uses. It mostly has to go to actual capital outlay, for building new housing, or renovating housing, and not for operations or services.

There's a great need for housing, and we have a great network of partners that are helping us put that money to good use in a very rapid fashion, to meet the needs. That's not money that's going unused or sitting there, not being put to good use. As far as this session, we're very grateful for the money we received. There's a great need and I'm hopeful that we get at least that much. It would be nice to get significantly more than that to help us make a bigger dent in the need for housing.

Q. How do you measure how much you need for the fund?

Hernandez: We did a housing strategy assessment toward the tail end of '22 that kind of quantified all of the needs, the resources available, the gap, and then strategies to fill that gap. We update the needs portion of it on an annual basis and we do some calculations on what it would take to meet the entire need. From data that's a year, a year and a half old, it would take something like \$42 billion to meet that need. Obviously we're not going

to get that from our legislature or from federal funding, but the more we get, the more we can put to good use and leverage it with other resources.

Q. You mentioned that you work with the full spectrum of housing. Can you describe that in more detail? What are some ways citizens interact with your agency?

Hernandez: We only have one office here in Albuquerque. We rely on our local partners for initial contact. We work with lenders across the state, so if somebody wants to get a first-time homebuyer loan with a below-market interest rate, participating lenders tell them about our programs and assess whether they meet the qualifications.

Another person might be homeless and in need of shelter. They might go to one of the local shelters we fund.

We interact directly with some folks with some of our programs, such as the Home Ownership Assistance Fund, which is a federal program to assist families that suffered some loss - we've assisted close to 4,800 families with those funds. We have another program, the Home Improvement Program, where we are taking applications directly to do rehab on homes in particular counties.

Q. One of your partners

here in Las Cruces is the Mesilla Valley Community of Hope. Tell us how you work with that agency.

Hernandez: We provide them with several sources of funding. We have the Linkages Program, where we receive funding from the state Health and Human Services Department, and we provide rental vouchers for folks that are homeless and have severe mental illness

or behavioral health issues. In addition to shelter, they receive some supportive services from behavioral health entities, local lead agencies or service support agencies to help them with the services they need to stay housed.

Lunsford trial begins

Brad Lundsford had no plan but many alternatives when he tried to subdue Presley Eze after pulling him out of his car. He could've kicked Eze, hit him with a baton, relied on his physically more significant partner to wrest control, or stunned him with a Taser.

Instead, he shot him in the back of the head, all over a shoplifted can of beer.


That was the essence of the prosecutors' argument against Lunsford, a former Las Cruces Police Department officer charged with voluntary manslaughter following the killing of Eze on Aug. 2, 2022.

"Mr. Lundsford had multiple options short of going nuclear," said John Duran, the assistant attorney general prosecuting the case.

But Lundsford's defense attorney, Jose Coronado, presented a very different story on Feb. 4, the second day of the 10-day trial.

He pointed out that Eze gave a false name when Lundsford sought to identify him, and that Eze backed away and tried to flee as Lundsford and the other officers sought to bring him to the ground.

And that despite Eze being outnumbered twoto-one, a self-inflicted injury to one of the officers evened the fight. Beyond that, the officers feared that Eze was trying to

reach for their weapons.

Lunsford's trial began on Feb. 3 with jury selection, and continued on Feb. 4 with opening arguments and witness testimony.

The facts of the case – as outlined in court records, police body cameras and reports, and by the detective who investigated the case – begin as Eze tries to buy a beer from the former Chevron on Valley Drive near the Interstate 10 on-ramps.

Eze had no driver's license but wanted to buy the beer on Aug. 2, 2022 from Chevron. A verbal spat ensued between him and the clerk before Eze walked out in frustration, beer in hand. The clerk called 911 and reported Eze for shoplifting.

Sometime later, Lundsford arrived alone. Eze and two other men remained in their car at the gas station, something that Duran pointed to as proof that the situation started calm and remained calm. But as another officer, Keegan Arbogast, arrived, Lundsford tried to take Eze out of his car.

The situation escalated from there. Arbogast tried to tackle Eze but hit his own head against the pavement, something Duran qualified as "a completely failed maneuver."

The few seconds between Lundsford pulling Eze out of the car and shooting him in the back of the head will be reviewed profusely during the trial.

And both Duran and Coronado plan to call forward use-of-force experts to buttress their cases. Lundsford will also testify, according to Coronado, as will the Chevron clerk and several police officers and evidence technicians.

Arbogast will also testify, as will a senior LCPD official.

Las Cruces looking to add more areas to redevelopment plans

The city of Las Cruces will consider designating three more redevelopment areas over Las Cruces districts, according to a presentation to the Las Cruces council on Jan. 27.

Metropolitan Redevelopment Areas (MRAs) are special designations over impoverished or blight-stricken parts of inner Las Cruces. They allow the city to invest public funds in infrastructure to spur private development.

"Revitalization attracts new businesses and enhances existing ones," said Celina Morales, interim deputy economic director, who presented the four potential MRAs. That has a positive effect on gross receipts taxes, Morales added.

The Council will first consider the stretch of Valley Drive between West Hadley and Brown Road, near the Valley and West Amador Avenue.

Celina Morales, interim deputy economic director, described what made these areas appealing.

She pointed out that the area hosts about 55 businesses that employ 759 people, 15 vacant parcels, and about 74 percent of the housing was built before 1980. Morales said that the sidewalks in the area are deteriorating, and the average household income is about \$25,000.

Morales highlighted the second area,

Apodaca Park, from Solano Drive to North Main Street and over to Spruce Avenue. She said that there were 40 vacant parcels and 90 businesses employing about 1,300 employees. She added that about 70 percent of the buildings were built before 1990, and 30 percent of the residents make less than \$25,000 yearly.

The third area is south of East Lohman Avenue, past Missouri Avenue, and west of Interstate 25. This area also has deteriorating sidewalks, a median household income of about \$30,000 with about 88 percent of homes built before 1990.

The final area is around Mesquite Street. Morales said this region had about 93 businesses, employing 801 people, 115 vacant lots, and a median household income of about \$27,000 annually.

In October 2022 and January 2023, Las Cruces hired a firm to assess and rank the areas that qualify for MRAs. The firm, Groundworks Studio, evaluated the areas based on physical conditions (like the number of blighted buildings) and socio-economic conditions (poverty rate, income, etc.).

The top two were the El Paseo and West Picacho corridors. The Council approved MRAs for both districts in 2023. Morales told the Council to expect updates on both MRAs later this year.

Full proposals will go before the Council for a vote in March.

Lawmakers push psychedelic reform

A group of lawmakers introduced a proposal Jan. 30 to establish a program for medicinal use of psilocybin mushrooms.

Senate Bill 219, the Medical Psilocybin Act, would create a program for residents to receive medicinal treatment for pre-qualified behavioral health conditions such as major treatment-resistant depression, post traumatic stress disorder, substance use disorders, end-of-life care and others approved by the Department of Health.

According to the National Institute on Drug Abuse, psilocybin is a chemical found in certain mushrooms, often called "magic mushrooms," which have historically been used recreationally or in traditional ceremonies. It's also being researched as a clinical treatment for substance use disorders and mental illnesses.

"As an integrative psychiatry provider in the state of New Mexico I strongly support the need of new tools such as medical psilocybin, to assist the rising number of New Mexicans with mental health needs," Deborah Thorne, a doctor of medical science and certified integrative psychiatry specialist in Las Cruces, said. "The Medical Psilocybin Act

will provide an equitable, safe and well monitored means of offering this valuable medicine to many while strengthening the ongoing research at UNM."

The bill would establish an advisory board, treatment equity fund, research fund, and remove psilocybin from the Controlled Substances Act to protect "qualified and registered patients, clinicians and producers," according to a joint news release by the office of the Senate and House Democrats.

If passed, the law states the program would be available by Dec. 31, 2027.

Cosponsor Sen. Craig Brandt (R-Rio Rancho) said that he is hopeful this treatment option will benefit his "fellow veterans" who may be dealing with post-traumatic stress disorder or other mental health conditions.

"When we're facing epidemic levels of depression, anxiety, PTSD, and other debilitating mental health conditions, we owe it to those suffering to explore promising new treatments like psilocybin," cosponsor Rep. Elizabeth Thomson (D-Albuquerque) said. "By establishing a highlyregulated, state-run program, we can provide alternative options to those not responding to traditional treatment, in a safe, controlled environment."

Las Cruces touted for Casa de Peregrinos Food Pantry

The city of Las Cruces will be honored with the Audrey Nelson Award from the National Community Development Association for the expansion of Casa de Peregrinos Food Pantry, according to a news release.

The award recognizes the exemplary use of Community Development Block Grants (CDBG), annual grants from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Las Cruces used the money to expand Casa de Peregrinos Food Pantry and increase the scale of its services.

"What an honor to receive the 2025 Audrey Nelson Award for our Food Pantry that is a lifeline

for thousands of people across our County," said Natalie Green, Housing and Neighborhood Revitalization Administrator, in the news release.

They used \$350,000 of CDBG money, \$4 million in funding from the New Mexico State Legislature, and \$3.75 million from the Telshor Fund.

"For years, our community partners have collaborated tirelessly to uplift the lives of our most vulnerable – those experiencing homelessness, poverty, and hardship. Today, we are better equipped than ever to meet the needs of our community con cariño. I look forward to the future growth and additional opportunities ahead," Green said.

The city began construction in 2022 and completed the remodeled food pantry a year later. According to the city, the expansion allowed for 14 percent more clients to be served and more than 1 million additional pounds of food to be distributed.

"Just five years ago
Casa de Peregrinos was
distributing more than 4.7
million pounds of food,
far beyond what it could
accommodate from its
original 4000 square foot
space," the news release
said. "It was in desperate
need of expansion to keep
up with the needs of the
growing community."

Other award recipients include the city of Tuscaloosa, the city of Detroit, Pasco County, the city of Orlando, the Columbus Consolidated Government, and the city of Albuquerque.

Journalists in need of protection

From Here

I write most columns from the outside looking in. This one is different.

New state Rep. Sarah Silva (D-Las Cruces) has introduced a bill protecting journalists. And she's got a couple of heavyweights backing her. Speaker of the House Javier Martinez (D-Albuquerque) and Senate Majority Leader Peter Wirth (D-Santa Fe) are cosponsors.

House Bill 153 is called the Protect Reporters From Exploitative State Spying Act, which would have made a great acronvm if not for the word "from." It would prevent the state from forcing iournalists to turn over sources, records and documents unless they are necessary to prevent an act of terrorism or imminent violence, especially

against children. It also broadens the definition of who qualifies as a iournalist.

"We see examples at the federal level of government chipping away at journalists' ability to do their jobs by pursuing the identities of

unnamed whistleblowers," Silva said in a statement.

CBS is being sued by Donald Trump for \$10 million over allegations that its interview with Kamala Harris was edited to make her look good. Trump had agreed to an interview and then backed out.

Now, the Federal Communications Commission is involved. It ordered CBS to turn over the full transcript from the interview. and camera feeds. Brendan Carr, Trump's new

pick to lead the FCC, will determine if CBS treated

his boss fairly. Incredibly, CBS turned over the documents and seems to be pursuing a settlement. So, they're OK with having the government in their editing

room from now on?

Carr isn't stopping there. He has also launched investigations into NPR and PBS and has called for Congress to cut off their funding. The investigation focuses on messages in support of underwriters, an issue I've become familiar with in my new role as general manager at KTAL-LP 101.5 FM community radio. We can run messages of support for our underwriters, but they can't have a call

to action.

We couldn't survive without our underwriters, and I doubt PBS or NPR could either, which, of course, is the point. Both are seen as unfriendly toward the current administration, which will do everything in its power to weaken or eliminate them.

ABC agreed to pay Trump \$15 million to settle a case after interviewer George Stephanopoulos said he had been found liable for rape when, in fact, the charge was sexual abuse.

Meta agreed to pay Trump \$25 million for booting him off Facebook after the Jan. 6 riot, which was a mistake.

Now, liberals and conservatives have online news feeds to confirm their biases and reinforce their hatred of those on

the other side. What a great time for Facebook to end fact-checking.

Rep. Silva's bill won't fix any of that. It's a modest effort that only applies to proceedings by the Legislature and governor. The hope is that the courts will follow with broader protections. But it's something.

The press has always had a frosty relationship with government. We're naturally suspicious of them, and they are undoubtedly frustrated by much of our reporting. But there has always been a grudging understanding in the past that both are needed for the system to work well. I'm not sure that's the case anymore.

She and the Legislative Democrats are rather at odds, mostly because of her disastrous Special Session last sum-

I encourage everyone to email their legislators and ask that they prioritize

public safety bills that might help keep our cities safer than they feel like they've been for several years. Give the judges, prosecutors and police the tools they need to compel criminals off the streets.

If every reader were willing to email one legislator, that would be such an incredibly powerful show of support - for our police force, for our businesses and for our community. You all can be the heroes of this story!

Defending civil rights in the face of dangerous narratives

In a recent town hall, the chief of police for the city of Las Cruces called for changes that should alarm anyone who values justice, fairness and the protection of civil rights. His proposal to shift the burden of proving dangerousness in pretrial detention hearings from the state to the defense is not only legally misguided but deeply concerning in its philosophical underpinnings. It reflects a dangerous pattern we have seen before – one that echoes the practices of authoritarian regimes that subvert fundamental rights to expand the state's power over individuals.

In our legal system, the presumption of innocence is not just a quaint ideal. It is a cornerstone of justice.

It demands that the state - armed with its immense resources – prove its case against an accused individual. The chief's suggestion would turn this principle on its head. Requiring defendants to prove their own non-dangerousness is tantamount to treating them as guilty until proven innocent. This is not just a procedural change; it is a step toward eroding the very freedoms that distinguish democratic societies from oppressive ones.

History warns us of what happens when the state's power to detain is unchecked by rigorous standards of proof. Fascist regimes in the 20th century - from Nazi Germany to Mussolini's Italy – routinely used pretexts of "public safety" to justify the mass incarceration of political dissidents,

marginalized communities issues – poverty, trauma, and anyone deemed undesirable. These regimes normalized the stripping of civil liberties under the guise of keeping society "safe." Such systems prey on fear and prejudice, using rhetoric about crime and disorder to justify the erosion of individual rights.

Here at home, we must resist any narrative that suggests incarceration and prosecution are the primary solutions to complex issues like mental health and crime. Criminalizing those struggling with mental health challenges is not a solution; it is a failure of compassion, policy and governance. The chief's insistence on advocating for "more carceral solutions" reveals an unwillingness to engage with the systemic causes of these

lack of access to healthcare and social support systems.

Rather than amplifying calls for incarceration, we should be investing in evidence-based alternatives. Mental health courts, diversion programs and community-based treatment offer pathways to address the root causes of criminal behavior without resorting to the blunt instrument of incarceration. These approaches are not only more effective but more humane.

As a civil rights attorney and criminal defense advocate, I have seen firsthand the damage wrought by a justice system overly reliant on incarceration. I have witnessed clients stripped of their dignity and opportunity, not because they were irredeem-

able, but because they were caught in a system that prioritized punishment over rehabilitation and reentry.

We must ask ourselves: Who benefits from a system that incarcerates instead of heals? Who profits when the burden of proof is shifted away from the state? And who suffers?

The answers to these questions remind us why it is essential to uphold the principles of justice and liberty enshrined in our Constitution. These principles are not relics; they are safeguards that protect the most vulnerable among us from the excesses of state power.

To the residents of this city, I urge you to approach these calls for carceral solutions with skepticism. Reach out to your legislators not to

demand more incarceration, but to advocate for solutions that address the systemic inequities at the root of crime. Insist on policies that expand access to mental health care, affordable housing, and education—not just policies that expand the size and reach of our jails.

Heed this warning: If we sacrifice civil liberties in the name of safety, we will find ourselves neither safe nor free. We must remember the lessons of history and resist the seductive but dangerous rhetoric of fear. Together, we can build a system that prioritizes justice, dignity and human potential over punishment and oppression.

City looks to legislature to further strategic plan

As we welcome the new year. I would like to extend a heartfelt greeting to the 70 state representatives and 42 state senators joining the 57th Legislature of the State of New Mexico. I am truly grateful to the many women and men who generously dedicate their time and resources to make New Mexico a remarkable place to live.

I want to particularly recognize our Doña Ana County delegation. The city of Las Cruces, Sunland Park, Anthony, Mesilla. Hatch and the various villages and towns throughout

our county are thankful for their steadfast commitment to enhancing the quality of life in southern New Mexico.

It has been 13 months since I stepped down as mayor of Las Cruces. However, thanks to the development of a comprehensive five-year strategic plan, the city is poised to move forward with several important initiatives that reflect the progress our city has made over the past 16 years.

I would like to highlight some key legislative requests that align with its goals. One notable request is for \$5.9 million to further our master plan for the East Mesa Recreation Complex, a place where residents of

Las Cruces and southern New Mexico can enjoy baseball and soccer games, participate in pickleball and attend regional tournaments.

Additionally, the city is seeking \$5.6 million to improve and enhance ADA accessibility for our residents. Another request of \$4.6 million will support the continued development of the city's active transportation plan, which encompasses the construction of sidewalks, ADA upgrades and energy-efficient street lighting throughout the city. The city is also requesting \$4.5 million to bolster affordable housing initiatives, including a 50-unit apartment complex at

Amador Crossing Apartments.

One of the most innovative projects launched by the Las Cruces Fire Department is Project L.I.G.H.T., which stands for "Lessening the Incidence of Grief, Harm, and Trauma." This initiative provides holistic support for residents facing mental health or substance use challenges, with specially trained mental health providers and paramedics delivering trauma-informed care during critical moments. In light of the program's success, the city is requesting \$2.5 million for the design and construction of a dedicated facility.

Finally, the city is seeking

\$1.5 million for crime reduction initiatives, which will include the installation of additional traffic cameras and drone pods on city buildings, along with five regional police response vehicles to assist the New Mexico State Police with tactical operations.

I would also like to take a moment to express my personal gratitude to the men and women in law enforcement for their unwavering dedication and commitment to serving and protecting our community. The next time you encounter a law enforcement professional, firefighter or corrections officer, please take a moment to thank them for their service.







her own fame by accidentally saving a celebrity's life.




cessful painter, Estella reappears in his life and Finn falls deeply in love, knowing all the while that it is a feeling that can never be returned.

NMSU to host 2025 New Mexico Chile Conference Feb. 3-4

Nearly two dozen chile pepper experts will gather in Las Cruces to present the latest industry trends and research breakthroughs at the 2025 New Mexico Chile Conference. Presented by the New Mexico State University's Chile Pepper Institute and Department of Extension Plant Sciences, the conference will take place Monday, Feb. 3, and Tuesday, Feb. 4, at the New Mexico Farm and Heritage Museum.

"The New Mexico

Chile Conference is the premiere annual event in the country that focuses solely on chile peppers, providing the latest research findings and production guidance for the state's signature crop," said Stephanie Walker, Extension vegetable specialist at NMSU and cochair of the conference.

The Monday evening reception will feature a presentation on the history of NMSU's Chile Pepper Institute, provided by Danise Coon, a research specialist who's been a part of the institute since 1992. During the Tues-



day morning session, a grower panel will discuss "Envisioning the Future of New Mexico Chile," followed by a keynote address by Michael Mazourek, a vegetable breeder and associate professor at Cornell University.

In his keynote address, Mazourek will share his vision for chile that leverages his experience modulating pungency, selecting for culinary value and

using evolutionary breeding genomics.

Additional presentations will cover guest labor programs, irrigation outlook, robotics, pest and disease management, and genetics.

Deadly weekend crashes leave two dead on Las Cruces' streets

Two people were killed in car crashes over the weekend in separate parts of Las Cruces.

The first occurred on Jan. 31 around 4:53 p.m. at the Interstate 10 ramp near Avenida de Mesilla at a construction zone. The crash closed all eastbound lanes, which reopened sometime later.

According to a spokesperson from New Mexico State Police, investigators believe a semi-truck caused a chain reaction crash when the driver entered a construction zone and rear-ended another vehicle.

The driver of the rear-ended vehicle, 35-year-old Josie Cardona of El Paso, Texas, was pronounced dead on the scene by the Office of the Medical Investigator. The spokesperson was waiting to confirm whether criminal charges would be filed. Two passenger vehicles and two semi-trucks were involved in the crash.

A Las Cruces spokesperson said some two dozen firefighters were called to the scene, and four people were taken to the hospital.

The second crash occurred on Feb. 2 around 9 p.m. on Valley Drive near the West Picacho Avenue intersection. Las Cruces police said a 2024 black Nissan Armada sped north on Valley Drive when it rear-ended a silver Chevrolet Malibu. The Malibu then entered the southbound lanes of traffic and sideswiped an orange Ford Mustang.

Meanwhile, the Armada went off the roadway and struck a building, killing the driver, 54-year-old Michael James Massa, from Bellflower, California.

The driver of the Malibu and two occupants of the Mustang were transported to area hospitals with non-lifethreatening injuries.

The crash also closed a portion of Valley Drive while police investigated, but it has since reopened.

TUCSON, AZ – After one day and nearly two rounds at the N.I.T., the Aggies find themselves firmly in the mix as they sit in third place among the deep field of 14 teams. Led by Javier Delgadillo and Mateo Payán who each are among the top-12 golfers, the Aggies shot 15-under before play was suspended due to lack of light.

In the opening round, four different Aggies shot under par, including Delgadillo (66, -6), Alexandre Bauduin (68, -4) and Ethan Klose (69, -3) who all posted rounds in the 60s in T1, T7 and T11 positions on the leaderboard. At 15-under in the opening round, NM State was just three strokes off the lead and two strokes ahead of host Arizona who entered the tournament ranked No. 11 in the nation.

The Aggies cooled off in the second round as they are currently at even-par through 16 holes. In the afternoon, NM State was guided by true freshman Mateo Payán who sits at 3-under with two holes to play. The strong second round has moved Payán



five spots up the leaderboard and into a tie for 12th place.

In total, four Aggies will begin Tuesday inside the

Gewirtz dropped a massive 17 points on the Hilltoppers this past Saturday to help give the Aggies the winning edge in the final minutes of play. Her 80%





The professional golf tours keep extensive stats on performance. Going beyond "fairways and greens," these data go much deeper into the effectiveness and efficiency of the best. One of my favorite stats is the "bounce-back." a frequency with which a player makes birdie immediately following a double bogey or worse.

One of my statistics professors said 98 percent of all statistics are made up. So. I started thinking of even more ob- centage of putts made

scure methods of tracking personal performance and more interestingly analyzing golfer behavior.

Here are some of my unique and contrived stats you might like to keep:

• Do-Over ratio:

Frequency of a player declaring a "breakfast ball" on the first tee.

- Panhandling probability: The likelihood that a player will be begging for strokes prior to teeing off.
- Shank-you's: The number of solid shots after two consecutive shanks per round.

• Bear-downs: Per-

after someone says "get it close" as you address the ball.

 Hangover scoring: The average score on morning rounds when you suffer from a serious hangover.

• Gimmies: Putts longer than four inches that you get to pick up during a round. This stat is adjusted by the number of putts you thought should have been gimmies.
