A new path for justice

A FIRST-OF-ITS-KIND PROGRAM AIMS TO FIX COMPETENCY PROBLEM

James Ketcherside approached the bushes behind the Las Cruces fire station where the woman had been spending nights, bracing for resistance but determined to try.

She'd been on the streets for months, since a fight with her husband that ended in her arrest and expulsion from the family home. Her trim sweater and clean sneakers did not betray her circumstances, and she volunteered that she was 10 years sober. But the courts had recently stripped her of visitation rights for her children. As her emotions rose, her speech accelerated, each sentence running into the next.

"I worked so hard to get off of pills," she said, beginning to

cry. "The judge said that the only way I'm gonna get my kids back is if I get into some program and get help. And I'm like, I don't need it."

Ketcherside heard her out. "I know I don't like people telling me what to do," he said. "We're not telling you what to do."

An employee of the Doña Ana County Magistrate Court, Ketcherside helps manage the state's first competency diversion program, for people charged with misdemeanors who have a mental illness and may be unable to understand legal proceedings or participate in their own defense.

Typically, many such defendants who "raise competency" have their charges dismissed, then continue struggling unassisted with their illnesses, and face possible rearrest all over again. Now, as part of the pilot

program, Ketcherside steers some of them towards services that can help with medications, housing, and whatever else they need to break the cycle. But he has few tools other than persuasion at his disposal.

Speaking to the woman over a low chain-link fence, he redirected her with a series of questions:

"What's your ultimate goal?" "Where do you see yourself in the next few months?" "Maybe housing?"

And finally, "How about some treatment?"

Defendants with serious mental illnesses pose a fundamental challenge to the legal system: judges can't hold people accountable if they are not cognizant of the world around them or the meaning of their actions.

But can they shepherd those



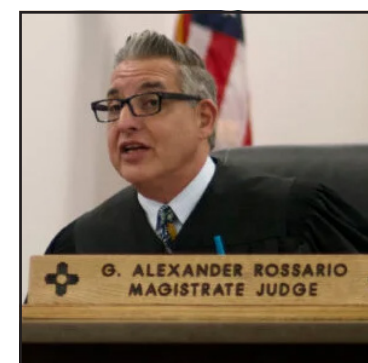

people towards services to relieve their symptoms, stabilize their lives, and limit the friction they otherwise encounter with the people around them?

And should they force such services on the unwilling?

Last year, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham and the state legislature clashed over these questions. Frustrated that courts are dismissing charges against

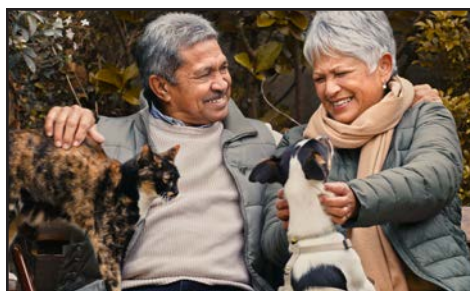


During a December hearing, Magistrate Judge Alexander Rossario in December 2024 dismissed the charges of several people who had engaged with the program, and kicked out several people who had not.

people with mental illnesses who raise competency, the governor wanted them ordered to treatment, and if necessary, jailed. Civil liberties and mental health advocates pushed back, arguing that locking up more people would do the opposite of help.

In the end, they agreed to fund Doña Ana's competency diver-

NEW DEPUTIES TO JOIN DOÑA ANA SHERIFF'S OFFICE



The Doña Ana County Sheriff's Office (DASO) will graduate 14 cadets on Thursday, February 13, at a public ceremony at the Doña Ana Community College East Mesa campus auditorium. Jury weighs decisions leading to fatal encounter as Lunsford testifies

From shoplifting to shooting, the moments that left a man dead at a gas station and a Las Cruces police officer charged with manslaughter lasted only a few minutes. Both men made dozens of decisions that set them on a fatal collision course.

Now, each decision is being poured over by a jury to determine if Brad Lunsford is guilty of voluntary manslaughter in the death of Presley Eze. On Feb. 11, a Las Cruces jury saw Lunsford take the stand. He testified about his career, his training, his memory of the day he killed Eze on Aug. 2, 2022, and his state of mind.

It was the high point of Lunsford's two-week trial, set to end before Feb. 14. It has featured a dozen witnesses, experts and calls for mistrials since Feb. 7. All has been in service of describing and defining what happened when Lunsford and Eze came into contact.

Lunsford faces a charge of voluntary manslaughter. While he has no past criminal history, Lunsford could face six years in prison.

Lunsford killed Eze after Eze shoplifted a beer from the former Chevron on Valley Drive. Both sides agreed that the interaction began calmly as Lunsford investigated the situation. But things escalated after Eze gave Lunsford the wrong name,

and Lunsford decided to pull Eze out of his car. This led to a scrum, a self-inflicted injury from the second officer, and Lunsford ultimately decided to shoot Eze in the head.

Prosecutors have argued that Lunsford greatly overreacted. Lunsford's lawyers argued that the officer's life and his partner's life were in danger.

There's been no bombshell moment in the trial. But the case has more than enough tension. Twice, prosecutors with the New Mexico Department of Justice have called for a mistrial.

First, Assistant Attorney General John Duran scolded the defense for trying to bring up a toxicology report the judge banned.

The report found that Eze had methamphetamine in his bloodstream when Lunsford killed him. But Judge Jim Foy ordered that that report could not be presented to the jury. Before the trial, he found that the defense could not be sure that the information was material enough to outweigh the bias that information could have on the jury.

"This is character assassination," Duran called it, adding that Lunsford's lawyer, Jose Coronado, had "shucked the rules" that Foy established. Foy instead admonished Coronado and threatened to fine him \$1,000.

The second call for a mistrial came dur-

ing Lunsford's testimony. He told the jury that Eze had warrants, something Duran called "outrageous," and Foy acknowledged it as being completely false. Again, Foy said that a statement to the jury correcting the record would be enough.

Lunsford takes the stand

Much of Lunsford's testimony focused on his knowledge and extensive training as both a police officer and army cavalry scout.

But after hours of that, Coronado questioned his client about what he felt and saw as things escalated between him and Eze.

Lunsford testified that he feared Eze was reaching for Officer Keegan Arbogast's gun after the two men fell to the floor in a scrum. Arbogast was dazed and down for the rest of the encounter after failing to execute the takedown and injuring

cided to pull out his gun and shoot Eze. When asked by his attorney why he chose to shoot Eze, Lunsford said, "to protect my partner and myself."

But on cross-examination, Duran pointed out that Lunsford never read Eze his rights or explained to him why we wanted to detain him. Duran also pointed out that Eze did not hit Arbogast while he was on top of him and reiterated the prosecution's main point – that Lunsford had a slew of less lethal options but chose to shoot Eze in the head.

Expert vs expert

The case also featured three expert witnesses. Each qualified the situa-

tion differently.

Duran and his prosecutorial partner, Greer Staley, brought two experts to the case. First was retired Chief Chet Epperson. The second was Micheal White, also a retired police officer.

After the state rested, Judge Foy said Epperson's testimony – that Lunsford did nothing right from start to finish – was not valuable and that he was relying on White's testimony to keep the case going.

In contrast to Epperson, White testified that Lunsford started off correctly, approaching the situation calmly, but erred as the scrum escalated and ultimately

Las Cruces lawmaker proposes enhanced cannabis regulation

A Las Cruces representative is looking to give the state more teeth in regulating the budding cannabis industry.

Doreen Gallegos (D-Las Cruces) sponsored the RLD Cannabis Enforcement Act, which would give the New Mexico Regulation and Licensing Department the power to hire police to investigate and enforce actions against unlicensed cannabis operations.

“This bill ensures that all of our licensees will be on the same, level playing field and give RLD the necessary tools to enforce our existing laws,” said

Rep. Gallegos in a news release. “As the cannabis market in New Mexico continues to grow, we must prioritize consumer safety and hold bad actors accountable.”

The news release also said an enforcement body would be staffed by six certified peace officers and a bureau chief. It would “have the authority to investigate and take action against unlicensed cannabis operations, impose stronger penalties for violations, and streamline compliance efforts.”

“The bill addresses concerns from both licensed businesses and agency stakeholders seeking a fair regulatory environ-



ment and a market free from adulterated or unlawful cannabis products,” the release said.

According to a legisla-

tive analysis, the Cannabis Control Division issued 15 violations in 2024 at about \$10,000 per violation. If that trend continues, RLD’s cannabis enforcement group can expect to collect

about \$150,000 per year. Currently, that money is sent to a state education fund. However, with expanded capacity, the analysis said it was rational to assume that new enforcement could collect

twice that much.

However, the same analysis also pointed out a few issues. For one, it pondered whether having RLD police officers would create jurisdictional overlap with State Police. And since the bill would allow these officers to conduct unannounced inspections, the analysis said that could place a burden on businesses already compliant with the law.

A retooled version of the bill passed the House Commerce and Economic Development Committee. It was scheduled for another hearing in the House Judiciary Committee on Feb. 10.



LCPD looking for surveillance techs

The Las Cruces Police Department is looking for technicians for its Real-Time Crime Center, set to open this spring.

The RTCC, funded by state and city taxes, will use real-time information and technology, such as cameras scattered around Las Cruces. RTCC technicians will monitor the cameras along with radios and data systems to provide data and situational awareness assistance for officers in the field, a news release said.

The news release said LCPD will hire five people for the technician positions. Current LCPD sergeants and uniformed officers will also be part of the Real-Time Crime Center. Applicants must have at least an associate’s degree plus two years’ experience in criminal justice or a similar law enforcement environment. Still, a combination of education, experience, and training may be applied to meet the requirements.

“Those interested in applying for the Real-Time Crime Center Technician positions can learn more and complete an application online,” the release said. “Applications must be submitted no later than March 3, 2025.”

NM AG amends WNMU complaint

In an amended complaint filed Wednesday in New Mexico’s Sixth Judicial District, state Attorney General Raúl Torrez expanded upon his original allegations last month against former Western New Mexico University President Joseph Shepard and the university’s former Board of Regents.

The new filing added an aiding and abetting claim to the complaint, as well as another violation of the state Constitution by the board via its agreement to defend Shepard against future claims. That indemnity clause, the amended complaint stated, violates the constitution by obligating the state “to a contingent liability of an unlimited amount for an unlimited term.”

Shepard took over as WNMU president in 2011, and was terminated by the board last December after the New Mexico Office of the State Auditor published a report detailing the misuse of hundreds of thousands of public funds. That report followed a December 2023 investigation by Searchlight New Mexico on the university leadership’s lavish spending.

The case was referred to the State Ethics Commission. Shepard ultimately received a \$1.9 million severance package that Torrez unsuccessfully tried to halt. The amended complaint restates the prior claims of breach of fiduciary duty, lack of consideration, unconscionable contract terms, violations of the Anti-Donation Clause, violations

of the Open Meetings act, and unjust enrichment.

Earlier this week, Torrez and state lawmakers announced a proposed constitutional amendment to strengthen oversight of university regents and administrators.

“Public officials and university administrators have a legal and ethical responsibility to act in the best interest of the institutions they serve, not their own financial gain,” Torrez said in a statement accompanying a news release announcing the amended complaint. “This case underscores the urgent need for greater transparency and accountability in higher education governance, which is why we are taking bold legislative action to prevent similar abuses in the future.”

mately crossed the line by shooting Eze.

Lunsford and Coronado also brought an expert. Barry Brodd, a former police officer and use of force expert who testified in the Derek Chauvin trial, told the jury that Lunsford was in the right. Lunsford and Coronado also called on Las Vegas, Nevada based Sergeant Jamie Borden.

Ultimately, it will be the jury who will decide which expert is more

persuasive and more accurate.

But beyond the families and friends of Lunsford and Eze, important eyes are on this case.

Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story sat in the gallery almost every day of the trial. City attorney Brad Douglas has also spent time in the courtroom. Both officials have also talked with Luis Robles, a prominent attorney who represents the City of Las Cruces in nearly all police killing civil lawsuits.

Robles appears to be participating in the de-

fense’s case. At one point before Lunsford’s, Coronado handed Robels a sheet of paper with a big handwritten note asking Robels to give over questions he felt should be asked of Lunsford. But overall, it’s unclear what role, if any, city officials are playing in Lunsford’s defense.

On the other side, prominent civil rights attorney Shannon Kennedy has also sat in on the proceedings. Kennedy is representing the Eze family in a civil lawsuit against Robles and the city of Las Cruces.

Week marked by grim anniversaries, remembrance

The week of Feb. 10 marks two grim anniversaries in Las Cruces.

Feb. 10 was the 35th anniversary of the Bowling Alley massacre, while Feb. 11 marks the first anniversary of the killing of Las Cruces Police Ofc. Jonah Hernandez.

Hernandez, 35, was stabbed to death while responding to a trespassing call. He was the first Las Cruces police officer killed in the line of duty in department history.

Hernandez, an El Paso resident, left behind a wife and two sons. He'd been a police officer for two years.

"Not one day has passed

that Jonah is not in our memories, in our hearts and actions as we continue to heal from that painful loss," said Chief Jeremy Story in a news release remembering the death.

The news release also said that city staff and police would hold a small private remembrance. Officers and staff will also participate in the annual Fallen Officer Run on Feb. 16. That event is open to the public and begins at 10 a.m. at Las Cruces City Hall.

"We, as a department, are strengthened by Jonah's family who has every right to be bitter and dejected, but instead they continue to display kindness and provide inspira-



tion as we move forward together," Story said.

Bowling Alley Massacre

Thirty-five years have passed since two gunmen shot and killed four children and three adults.

In 1990, police received a call to the now-defunct bowling alley at 1201 East Amador Avenue. The caller, Melissia Repass, a 12-year-old shot multiple times, called 911. When police arrived, they found 26-year-old Steven Teran, his 6-year-old daughter Paula Holguin, and 13-year-old Amy Hauser already dead.

Steven Teran's 2-year-old daughter, Valerie Teran, was rushed to a local

hospital but died shortly after arrival. Repass, her mother Stephanie Senac, 34, and 33-year-old Ida Holguin, who was not related to Paula or the Terans, were taken to the hospital. Senac died nine years later, in 1999, from complications related to her injuries.

Police believe the two gunmen stole less than \$5,000 from the bowling alley before setting fire to the office.

Las Cruces-Dona Ana

County Crime Stoppers continues to offer a \$25,000 reward for information that helps identify the men responsible for the mass shooting. Tips can be provided anonymously by calling Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-8477. Tips can also be provided online at NMCrimeStoppers.org or through the Crime Stoppers app, "P3 TIPS." The app is available through the App Store on most devices.

One jailed after 17th Street stabbing

A Las Cruces man faces an open count of murder after police say he stabbed another man near 17th Street and West Picacho Avenue on Feb. 4.

James Michael "Junior" Melendrez, 31, faces the charge following the death of Lawrence Patrick Rubio. Prosecutors have filed a motion seeking to keep Melendrez in jail as the case against him progresses.

According to a statement of facts, a witness said Melendrez and Rubio were on their way to buy drugs when they got into an argument that turned physical.

Security video from a nearby business showed Melendrez striking Rubio in the chest area before running away.

For now, Melendrez remains in jail. According to a pretrial detention request, prosecutors believe that Melendrez' history of violating probation agreements, as well as his past criminal convictions, are enough to keep him in jail.

Prosecutors must prove to a 3rd Judicial District judge that Melendrez is dangerous and that no conditions of release can protect the community. A hearing to determine this had not been scheduled by press time.

Two rescues in Organ Mountains leave one dead

The Las Cruces Fire Department was called out twice on rescues to help find a lost or stranded hiker in the Organ Mountains.

The first rescue happened around 5 p.m. on Feb. 9. Five members of LCFD's Technical Rescue Team were activated to help locate a hiker who was stranded near The Needle, the highest point of the Organ Mountains, which sits at an elevation of about 9,000 feet above sea level, about 5,100 feet above Las Cruces, according to a news

release.

LCFD's team was joined by the U.S. Border Patrol's Search and Rescue team, New Mexico State Police, Mesilla Valley Search and Rescue and the Organ Mountain Technical Rescue team.

"The hiker, a 29-year-old man, was located by a Border Patrol helicopter flying in stiff winds near the peak of The Needle. The hiker was guided down The Needle, with help from a helicopter spotlight, to an MVSAR team that had scaled the mountainside to a rendezvous point. Rescue

teams were then able to help the man descend trails to the rescue staging area," the news release said.

The man was not injured.

The second rescue happened on Feb. 5. The LCFD Team joined Mesilla Valley Search and Rescue, Organ Mountain Technical Rescue, and New Mexico State Police in the search and recovery of a 63-year-old man who died after a fall in the Organ Mountains.

The man was from Columbus, Ohio. The search and recovery mission was completed at about 3 a.m. on Thursday, Feb. 6.

City Council signals support for alcohol harm alleviation fund

The city of Las Cruces council called for the state government to establish an alcohol harm alleviation fund on Feb. 4 after approving the transfer of five liquor licenses during a meeting.

The fund, which would come from a special tax on alcohol, would go towards alleviating negative outcomes associated with alcohol, such as alcoholism, teen drinking, and alcohol-related deaths.

While several specific legislative proposals in the past would increase the tax on alcohol or establish a fund, the council's resolution was meant to signal support for the general idea – not a specific policy or bill.

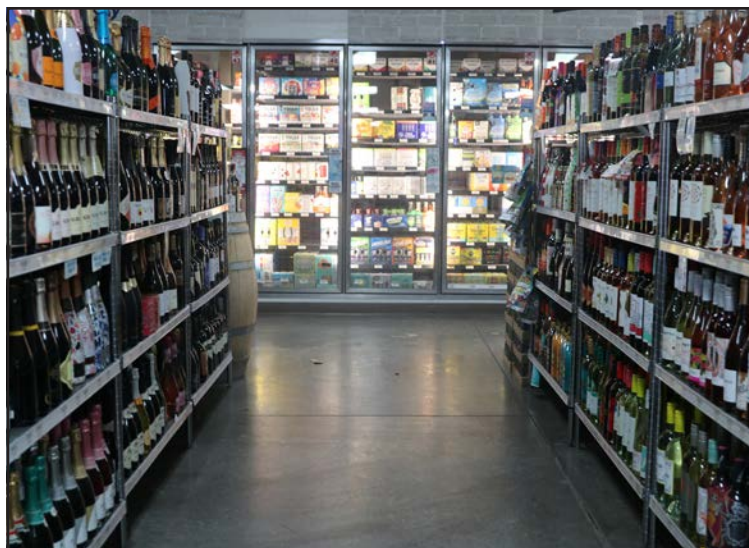
"This is in support of the idea of creating some sort of fund," Councilor Johana Bencomo said during the meeting.

This is the third year advocates have proposed increasing the tax on alcohol. They say increasing the tax and using the proceeds to start an alcohol harm alleviation fund would positively affect one of New Mexico's deadliest public health challenges.

The state Department of Health reported in January that alcohol deaths had declined for a second straight year in 2023. However, the same information showed 1,896 New Mexicans died from alcohol-related deaths that year. It decreased from 2,067 in 2022 and from 2021's high watermark of 2,274.

Those are the worst numbers in the U.S.

"The decline highlights the positive impact of targeted interventions, community partnerships, and policy initiatives designed to address alcohol misuse," NMDOH Chief Medical Officer Miranda Durham

said in a news release. "While this progress is encouraging, we must remain committed to expanding access to health-care, including substance use treatment, and implementing community-based interventions

that address prevention."

In the last two years, legislators have proposed bills to raise the tax by 25 cents on all sellers of beer, wine, and spirits. Critics – including Rep. Micaela Lara Cadena, D-Mesilla – said

the hike was too high and could be ineffective. Lara Cadena and others have proposed bills that would raise taxes on more expensive drinks and lower taxes on less expensive ones.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham ultimately vetoed an increase last year.

During the same meeting, the council approved the transfer of four liquor licenses from Brewer Oil Company to New Mexico Company Operations, LLC.

The five New Mexico Company Operations include:

- Nacho Shell, 2512 E. Lohman Ave.
- University Shell, 1305 S. Solano Dr.
- Country Club Shell, 2901 N. Main St.
- Triviz Shell, 3040 N. Main St.
- Holiday Shell, 2645 S. Valley Dr.

The approvals were for package sales.

sion program and others like it around the state, appropriating about \$3 million.

The programs are just starting and meant to be small, with space for a few dozen defendants at a time. But they give a preview of what courts can currently do for defendants who aren't competent to stand trial — and their limits.

Mental illness and public safety are again a focus during this year's legislative session, which kicked off Jan. 21. Funding for competency diversion programs like Doña Ana's, and other mental health services, is on the table. And support is growing among lawmakers for a

bill to push more arrestees with mental illness into treatment.

As Ketcherside said goodbye to the woman and got behind the wheel of his car, he said he considered the visit a success. She had agreed to catch an early-morning bus to an intake appointment at a local clinic — but she'd made such promises before. "We have to start making steps towards the right direction," he said, "little by little."

Falling through the cracks

Briana Zamora first noticed the problem in 2009 when she was a Bernalillo County Metro Court judge and each weekend arraigned people arrested for misdemeanor crimes. The dockets were huge,

with around 6,000 cases assigned to her. But a small group had an outsize presence: those who were incompetent to stand trial and were being arrested again and again.

"I would see the defendants come in, and I would recognize their faces and their names," she said.

Defendants may raise competency for any number of reasons, mental illness being only one of them. Until they understand the court's proceedings and can participate in their own defense, they cannot be prosecuted.

The small share who are charged with felonies and found dangerous can be sent to the state mental health hospital to have their competency "restored," which takes months.

But for the defendants

appearing before Zamora, most of whom had been charged with minor crimes, she was limited in what she could do. She'd typically dismiss the charges and invariably, they would be back. "We simply were doing nothing for these individuals."

More than a decade later, when Zamora had risen to the state Supreme Court, she encouraged the Administrative Office of the Courts to put together some money to begin a pilot program to "divert" this group from prosecution and connect them with programs that could help.

Last June, the courts established the first pilot in Doña Ana County, where prosecutors and defense attorneys were amenable to trying something new. The county's Health and

Human Services director Jamie Michael said that compared to New Mexico's other counties, Doña Ana's medium size put it in a sort of Goldilocks zone: "We have resources, but we're still small enough where everybody knows each other. Those relationships are built."

Additionally, the county has for years run one of the state's only programs that allows family or clinicians of people with mental illness to petition the court to require them to undergo outpatient treatment, known as Assisted Outpatient Therapy (AOT). AOT, like competency diversion, aims to push people into treatment who are otherwise resistant to it, but is imposed with civil law, since participants have not been charged with crimes.

In practice, AOT also reaches a smaller group: Doña Ana's program is funded to serve up to 40 people each year, whereas its competency diversion program is expected to serve double that number, according to the Administrative Office of the Courts.

"Under his tenure, the department began its transition from a majority volunteer-led to career firefighter service, now with over 100 paid staff members," the County said.

But Cherry is not taking a break from one gig to the next.

MES Fire, a fire and law enforcement equipment seller and supplier, announced Cherry would replace Jeff Wood as Apparatus Sales Manager from the company's Las Cruces facility.

"We are deeply grateful

for Jeff's years of service, his unwavering dedication, and his passion for the fire industry. His legacy of excellence and commitment will continue to inspire us as we move forward," said John Skaryak, President of the Fire Division, in a news release.

The MES Fire news release said Cherry will oversee all apparatus sales initiatives throughout New Mexico.

"His extensive experience and proven leadership in the fire service aligns seamlessly with our mission to deliver unparalleled service and support to our customers," the news release said.

'Red or Green Chile Month' proposal advances

What's your preference – red, green or Christmas?

You may soon have the whole month of August to decide as another legislative proposal dedicated to the beloved chile pepper moves forward in the Roundhouse.

Rep. Rebecca Dow (R-Truth or Consequences) presented House Bill 172 to lawmakers in the House Rural Development, Land Grants and Cultural Affairs Committee Tuesday morning and received a unanimous do-pass vote. The bill proposes proclaiming August "Red and Green Chile Month" annually.

The proclamation is intended to give a nod to the state's status as the "Chile Capital of the World," as well as the economic and cultural impacts the peppers bring to the state.

"It'll provide us the opportunity (in) all four corners of the state, all 33 counties, to celebrate chile and New Mexico," Dow said during the meeting. "We really want to have an opportunity to elevate awareness and celebrate our producers and what's unique to our state."

Dow said the plan is to work with New Mexico True, a campaign of the Tourism Department, to create tours across the state.

In 1996 the New Mexico

State Legislature passed a House Joint Memorial declaring "Red or Green?" as the official state question. In 2023, Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham signed a bill into law declaring the smell of roasting green chile the state's official aroma. Chile is also one of the state's official vegetables.

Travis Day, executive director of the New Mexico Chile Association, joined Dow as her expert witness and noted for lawmakers that 8,800 acres of chile were harvested in the state in 2023, equating to about \$41.5 million in value.

"I think as a state, we need to take advantage of every opportunity to promote and advocate for our New Mexico chile product, because we are a declining crop, unfortunately, and we want to do anything we can to help build that industry back

up," Day told committee members.

Lisa Franzoy, a "life-long" resident of Hatch and organizer of the annual Hatch Chile Festival, which is celebrated over Labor Day weekend, said she is proud that her family has long been involved in chile production in the valley and said she supports the bill.

"We've already got our license plates, we already have our billboards," Franzoy told lawmakers, "and chile is an important industry to New Mexico, to every New Mexican."

Joe Wellborn, a member of the New Mexico Chile Association board, also voiced his support for the bill saying a month-long celebration of the crop might attract more people from out of state to take advantage of what New Mexico has to offer.

"We are trying to build an agricultural tourism industry in New Mexico, and this has to be part of it," Dow said during the meeting.

Committee Chair Rep. Linda Serrato (D-Santa Fe) added that northern New Mexico has an old tradition of producing red chile while southern New Mexico claims green chile. "I love how we mix it together," she said.

HB 172 will be heard in the House Government, Elections & Indian Affairs Committee. It has yet to be scheduled for a hearing.

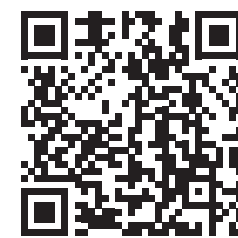

Strategic Water Supply squeaks through first committee

An amended version of the proposal backed by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham for a Strategic Water Supply advanced through its first committee on a 5-4 vote, but lawmakers warned the sponsors their support now doesn't guarantee their floor vote.

"I think there's been improvements," said Rep. Marian Matthews (D-Albuquerque) in explaining her vote to advance the bill. "I'm still not one hundred percent convinced and I might change my vote on the floor."

The Strategic Water Supply would enable the State of New Mexico to create a market for treated oil and gas wastewater, aka produced water, as well as salty water from deep underground for uses such as manufacturing, and use grant funds to support these projects. A previous half-billion dollar bid to do so introduced last year went nowhere.

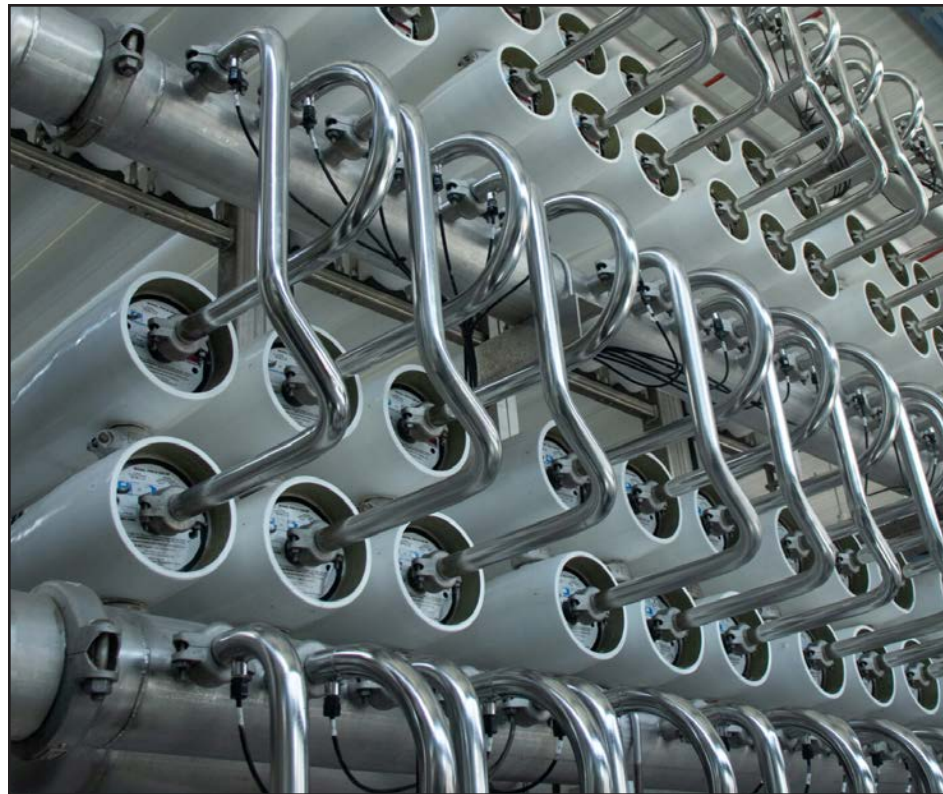
The House Agricul-

ture Acequias and Water Resources Committee amended this year's version, House Bill 137, sponsored by Rep. Susan Herrera (D-Embudo), significantly on its second hearing Tuesday.

Only water projects aiming to treat salty water from deep underground will be eligible for the \$75 million appropriation under new language.

Another change lowered the new fee per barrel on produced water from \$0.05 to \$0.03, and would require a rule-making process before it could go into place. Revenue could fund future produced water treatment projects.

A news release from the governor's office following the committee's passage characterized it as "an important step" in realizing the governor's "goal of ensuring that the state has enough water to support future economic growth without depleting or endangering its valuable freshwater supplies." In a statement, Lujan Grisham reiterated her position that "the Stra-

tegic Water Supply will support clean energy and advanced manufacturing initiatives without putting our freshwater supplies at risk," and said she looked forward to

"continued work with the Legislature to advance the bill and secure the needed funding for the program."

Environmental and indigenous nonprofits

opposed to the project say both brackish and oil and gas wastewater pose numerous health, safety and logistical concerns in treating them.

Rep. Micaela Lara

Cadena (D-Mesilla) told Source NM after the vote that the amended legislation addressed her concerns.

"I don't have the expertise of the members on Energy [Environment and Natural Resources Committee] I'd like to hear them weigh in. If they say it's a bad idea, that's a different take on whether or not they think this is fitting into New Mexico energy and water economies," Cadena said. "But, I think this conversation about water — and how little we have of it — needs to be had at the New Mexico Legislature every chance we get."

Rep. Angelica Rubio (D-Las Cruces) joined Republicans to vote against the bill.

"From a moral standpoint, everything outside of the aquifer mapping piece is just something I fundamentally oppose," she said. "I don't know how much you could fix this bill to get my support because I'm just fundamentally opposed."

Man sentenced for mother's murder

Dillon Alexander Waller, 31, was sentenced to life in prison for the first-degree murder of his mother, Cynthia Berendzen, and three years for the charge of tampering with evidence.

Waller was convicted by a jury in December 2024 after police said he strangled his mother while she slept. He admitted to

moving her body to the shower, cleaning the scene and attempting to cover up the crime with the help of a friend, a news release said. Waller also initially denied any involvement in his mother's death and drove to Mexico after killing her, police said.

"This sentence reflects the gravity of the crime and serves as a reminder that justice will

be served for victims and their families," said District Attorney Fernando Macias in a news release. "We hope today's decision provides some measure of closure for her family and the community."

After his arrest, court records show that Waller was held in jail for the duration of the case.

Enrique Simon Miranda Lucero, age 100, passed away peacefully at his home near Radium Springs, NM on January 23, 2025. He is preceded in death by his wife of 73 years, Enedina Franco Lucero, and his parents, Simon Luis Lucero and Adelina Miranda Lucero.

He received his education at Hill Public School and Las Cruces Union High School, class of 1942. At age 17, he joined the U.S. Navy as he had always planned. Under Warden Lucero's leadership, the Metropolitan Correctional Center in downtown San Diego, California was the first high-rise institution in the system to receive accreditation. He retired in 1984 and, once again, headed back to the family farm.

Enrique and Enedina became farmers on the northern part of his dad's 1922 Homestead near Radium Springs. They took pride that the pecan orchards they started will continue the three-generation legacy by his son Dennis of Pecans de Lucero.

Enrique and Enedina were active members of the Radium Springs community. Enrique was instrumental in forming the Radium Springs Volunteer Fire Department and served as its first Fire Chief. They actively pursued State approval and

Sluggish Legislature no match for feds

As of Sunday, there had been 711 bills, memorials and resolutions introduced during the 60-day session of the New Mexico Legislature. State lawmakers will have until Feb. 20 to add to that list. They will have just 30 days to carefully consider, debate and amend those proposals.

None of the legislators will have the staff needed to come close to accomplishing that task in a thorough and thoughtful manner. That void will be filled by the hordes of well-paid lobbyists who descend on Santa Fe.

The Legislature has been fortunate to have several bright, innovative business leaders serve. None of them would run their business the way we run our state, except for the part

about not paying workers.

Our Legislature is the only one in the nation not to pay lawmakers. I suppose some taxpayers think that's a good deal. I have a tremendous amount of respect for unpaid volunteers who help fill in the cracks and perform essential services in our community. But they shouldn't be writing our laws or be responsible for a \$33.1 billion state budget.

There is a smidgeon of progress. This year, every legislator will have a staff member to do something other than answer the phone and take messages.

Our Legislature operates under rules designed to accommodate living condi-

tions of 1912. There is still a rule requiring each piece of legislation to be read out loud, word for word, three times before a final vote. Instead of changing the rule, they ignore it.

Limiting the Legislature to 30-day sessions focused on the budget in even-numbered years and 60-day sessions in odd-numbered years may have been sufficient at a time when lawmakers left their farms and rode by horseback to Santa Fe each year to deal with a handful of issues. At a time when the federal government is moving at warp speed, it leaves the state pretty much defenseless to respond.

When this session ends next month, there will be hundreds of bills that were introduced and then never got even one committee hearing. All of those decisions will have been made by a small group of leaders convening behind closed doors.

The mandate that each session ends at noon on the final day gives every member of the Legislature the opportunity to single-handedly gum up the works by extending the debate with a string of pointless questions on every bill. It's a system that is designed to fail a lot more than it succeeds.

In theory, the lack of a strong Legislature would cede power to the governor. But, when Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham

attempted to address our growing crime problem through executive orders, she was shot down by the courts. And so, the problem keeps getting worse. We'll see what, if anything, the governor and Legislature are able to agree to this year on the issue of public safety. But we already know it won't be the result of a well-organized and coordinated effort.

There are several pieces of legislation now under consideration to modernize and professionalize our Legislature. Our lawmakers need to work longer, harder and smarter. And they need to be fairly compensated for it.

Medicaid Forward Will Kill Private Medical Practices that Serve Adults

Expanding insurance for uninsured people by increasing Medicaid eligibility seems like a great idea at first blush. Of course, we want everyone in New Mexico to have access to healthcare coverage. However, having a Medicaid card does not mean you have a doctor to see you.

The Medicaid Forward bill being proposed will have detrimental long-term impacts to the entire medical system. This bill makes me very scared about the future of health care in New Mexico, and I encourage every legislator to vote against it.

New Mexico’s medical system is fragile at best. There have been dozens of news stories talking about the problems and delays people have getting in to see a doctor, doctors leaving the state in record numbers, the cost of medical malpractice insurance and on and on.

A less known story is how hard it is for private medical practices to make ends meet given the reimbursement rates for Medicare, which is the plan that covers about 25% of New Mexicans – people 65 and older.

Medicaid covers about 48% of New Mexicans, primarily mothers and children, even with the expansion. But most specialists primarily see people

with chronic diseases like diabetes or cancer, and who are either covered by a traditional commercial health insurance plan or Medicare.

Medicare reimbursement rates only pay 80 to 83% of the costs of care for physicians, meaning we typically lose money on every Medicare patient we see. Specialists rely on the commercial insurance market to make up the gap and cover the expense of seeing a Medicare patient and providing care.

According to a study conducted by Mercer on the proposed Medicaid Forward plan, approximately seven percent of people currently insured on a commercial plan will switch

over to the Medicaid Forward plan. Losing this money will make practices unable to cover the costs of seeing Medicare or Medicaid patients. Mercer did not calculate the increased costs or decreased access that would result from this bill.

When practices cannot afford to see Medicare and Medicaid patients, their doctors either leave the state, retire or join a hospital. Hospitals are paid twice as much for seeing Medicaid and Medicare patients as physician practices are paid, so overall health care costs will go up and access will get even worse.

Legislators, we have to find ways to get more people insured with an insurance

card that guarantees access to care. If Health insurance that is adequate to cover the costs of care is not affordable, let’s work on solving that problem. Health Insurance companies are making a lot of profit, and the Pharmacy Benefit Manager middlemen make even more. Administrative burden could be minimized. Please help the doctors of New Mexico stay in practice and take care of the people we came here to serve.

LCCT gets a **Clue** and scores a hit

There was a while there when community theatre in downtown Las Cruces had grown a little musty and staid. Old chestnuts were dropping with a thud and there seemed to be a distinct lack of

enthusiasm, both on and off the stage. All that has changed over the past few years, with venerable institution Las Cruces

Community Theatre getting a rejuvenating second breath, and relative new-comer Blank Conversations injecting an always thrilling dose of youthful energy into the mix.

That energy must be infectious, because the former's production of *Clue*, now playing on the LCCT stage, has turned a classic comedy into a youthful romp, with a cast of "mature" actors gamely goofing with shameless abandon. Based on the 1985 movie, which itself was based on the best-selling board-game, *Clue* is slapstick farce at its most absurd; a whodunnit send-up that would no doubt make Agatha Christie cringe, while secretly giggling inside at the impudence.

A throwback to Vaudeville in many ways, Sandy Rustin's

script, based on the screenplay by Jonathan Lynn, is a dynamic frolic through the tropes of the mystery genre, requiring not only great comic timing, but a physicality that may leave audiences as breathless as the characters. In this retro world of camp comedy, doors open and close, secrets are revealed, thunder cracks, and the body count rises, all the while embroiling the major suspects in a mounting barrage of circumstance.

Key to this immersion in the preposterous, set designer Doug Roby's clever design makes effective use of ambulatory doors within a larger tableau of gothic splendor. Scattered about are oversized dice and mammoth game pieces harkening

back to the play's origins, which also find themselves insinuated into the action in an ingenious display of resourcefulness. Janet Beatty Cold and seamstress Jamie Sharp outdo themselves in the costuming department, with choices that go far beyond simple color scheme. Dan Robillard's efficacious light and sound design lends an atmospheric vibe that pushes the action to the limits.

Newcomer Chelsey Juenemann, a recent transplant from the Midwest, directs the drollery with a verve and intensity that speaks of years in the theatre trenches, prompting one to wonder what she will

Mandy Moore

OF THIS IS US ON NBC



Q: I was sorry to see that Mandy Moore and Milo Ventimiglia were among the celebrities whose homes were affected by the Southern California wildfires. Did they live near each other?

A: Somewhat, relatively speaking, since the former television "spouses" (on NBC's "This Is Us") resided roughly within an hour of each other – which could be deemed somewhat close in the geography of that state. Moore's house was in Altadena, while Ventimi-

glia lived in Malibu ... and those two areas were among the most severely ravaged in the tragedy.

The related losses in Moore's family extended to her brother-in-law — the younger sibling of her musician husband, Taylor Goldsmith, and a drummer whose musical instruments were taken by the flames — and sister-in-law, who were expecting their first child at the time they lost their home to the Eaton Fire, one of the several simultaneous blazes that challenged first responders massively. That also was the fire that damaged a considerable portion of Moore's own home, after several years spent on renovating it. (She previously had lived in nearby Pasadena; friend Hilary Duff opened her home to Moore and her family.)

Ventimiglia said that he recognized the irony of his "This is Us" character, Jack Pearson, having died as a result of a house fire. He and his wife also were expecting a baby at the time they had to evacuate their home in the Palisades Fire, and they had arranged a nursery for their family addition.

As his residence fell to the circumstances, Ventimiglia spoke to reporters about watching on security cameras. He added that he eventually stopped looking, reasoning, "What good is it to continue watching? We kind of accepted the loss."

After filming the "This Is Us" footage that depicted Jack's fate, Ventimiglia began advocating for fire safety. He has said that he now wants to do the same where wildfire safety is concerned.

be doing next. The same can be said for the mix of old and new faces in the ensemble cast, who waltz through the foolishness with a carefree abandon that is both groaningly irreverent and refreshingly

unhinged. This being a true ensemble, there are no real standouts, though Darin Robert Cabot and Rachel Thomas-Chappell have mastered the comic timing and arch asides that make their characters truly splendid.

This being community theatre, there are a few

rough spots: set changes that take a little too long, actors stomping on each other’s punchlines, backstage banter that is hard to hear, but nothing too egregious. In fact, if opening night was any indication, the run of this production, and the word of mouth it will surely generate,

should be spirited and enthusiastic. There are very few productions I am confident enough to say this about, but I dare you not to laugh. You’ll try not to groan, you’ll probably roll your eyes, but in the end, you’ll find yourself succumbing to the madness. I dare you not to.

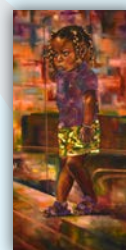

A visiting organist from Norfolk, Virginia will make a stop in Las Cruces as part of what he calls his 50-60-70 Project. John Dixon, who has served as organist at Providence Presbyterian Church in Virginia Beach for more than a quarter of a century, is in the process of sharing his own compositions in person in all 50 states between his 60th and 70th birthdays. Spring sellers' market possible

Las Cruces Utilities Wastewater Line of Business

Almost everything we flush down the toilet or pour down a drain winds up being recycled by the City of Las Cruces Utilities Department Wastewater Line of Business. But there are some things that should never be flushed or put down a drain.

“Flush it down the toilet and goodbye – that’s everybody’s thought,” said Laura Montoya, who was Utilities Deputy Director of Wastewater until her retirement last fall after 18 years with Utilities and three as deputy director.

“People flush everything down,” said Joaquin Murillo, who became Interim Deputy Director of Wastewater Oct. 1. “At this point, nothing will surprise me.” Murillo, a native of Chamberino, has worked for the City for 12 years, all in Wastewater, where he started in line maintenance.

Montoya said 99 percent of wastewater is water, while one percent is some kind of solid – mostly food waste (sometimes put down a garbage disposal), toilet paper and human fecal matter. Those solids break down in the city’s wastewater treatment system, which includes 600 miles of sewer lines, 18 lift stations that move wastewater from a lower to a higher elevation and three wastewater treatment facilities that treat about 15 million gallons a day. Wastewater is treated and cleaned of pollutants and released back into the Rio Grande river. Solids are treated and dried and become compost that is available free of charge to anyone who wants it.

There are certain items and substances that should never be flushed. For example, most wipes – even those with the word “flushable” on their labels – are not flushable. They don’t break down like toilet paper and can get caught in transmission lines, create clogs and even cause wastewater to back up into homes and businesses.

Other items that should never be flushed or poured down a drain create the acronym FOG: fats, oils and grease. These items harden in transmission lines and must be removed by city employees using water jets and vacuum trucks. To properly dispose of FOG, place items in a non-recyclable container in the trash. Oil should be solidified in a refrigerator or freezer and then placed in a container and put in the trash.

Also, don’t dispose of prescription or over-the-counter medications by dumping them in the toilet or sink, because they can eventually, indirectly contaminate drinking water. The best way to dispose of unwanted or expired medicine is to take it to a drug take-back location. Visit www.fda.gov/drugs/disposal-unused-medicines-what-you-should-know/drug-disposal-drug-take-back-locations to find local



drop sites.

If taking medications to a site isn’t possible, the FDA says almost all of them “can be thrown into your household trash.” (Visit www.fda.gov/consumers.)

Other things not to flush or put down the drain include paint and nail polish.

Once wastewater reaches a City treatment facility, bacteria, ultraviolet (UV) lights and chlorine gas are used to treat it. Treated wastewater then goes back into the system, while solids are dried, aerated and analyzed to ensure they contain no heavy metals or live bacteria, and then become compost. Up to 10 five-gallon buckets of compost are available free (including the buckets) at the Jacob A. Hands Wastewater Treatment Facility, 2851 W. Amador Ave. For larger loads of compost, call 575-528-3597.

“It’s a 24-7 process. Everything revolves around the microbiology. It’s really fascinating,” said Murillo, who has an associate’s degree in water technology from Doña Ana Community College (DACC).

“It’s an amazing field,” said Montoya, who has degrees in chemistry and biology and taught in DACC’s water technology program for 12 years.

The Wastewater Line of Business includes “dedicated staff working tirelessly to keep water flowing,” Murillo said.

Haaland announces run for NM governor

Former Interior Secretary and New Mexico congresswoman Deb Haaland made a long-rumored run for governor official early Tuesday morning, posting a two-minute video announcing her intent to be the first Indigenous woman governor of the state.

Haaland, a Democrat and member of the Laguna Pueblo, said in the video posted on social media Tuesday morning that she would soon begin a listening tour across the state.

“The problems we face now are bigger than ever, and we must be fierce to solve them,” Haaland said. “That’s why I am running for governor of the great state of New Mexico. New Mexico is rich in tradition and spirit, rich in natural resources. So why can’t our families pay our bills?”

She cited rising costs as major problems facing New Mexicans, along with crime, poverty, homelessness and addiction. She also touted her successes in Congress and the Interior Department, where she said she helped small businesses, boosted solar power use in the state, plugged old oil wells and partnered with rural communities to protect their water.

Haaland introduced herself in the video as the child of military parents who moved around a lot, and as a single mother

with 35 years of sobriety who worked at a bakery and sold homemade salsa before getting into politics.

As the Interior Secretary under former president Joe Biden, she was the first Indigenous cabinet member in United States history.

The government’s role, she said in the video Tuesday morning, is to make success easier for small businesses, lower costs, prevent crime, strengthen schools and make rent and housing affordable. “The solutions are there if we are fierce enough to choose them,” she said.

Speculation had built for months that Haaland would run for governor and potentially face off against U.S. Sen. Martin Heinrich, also a Democrat, in a primary. But Heinrich late last month announced he would stay in the Senate.

Haaland is the only declared candidate for the election, which takes place Nov. 3, 2026.

Lauren Garcia Named CUSA Player of the Week

DALLAS – With the first weekend of Division I softball in the books, Conference USA announced its first crop of weekly awards for 2025 on Monday.

The awards recognize the best player, pitcher and freshman of each week. Headlining this week's group was NM State's own Lauren Garcia after a phenomenal three days at the plate. In her first weekend with the Crimson & White, Garcia led the way for an

Aggie offense that racked up 70 hits on a .389 batting average en route to a 4-2 record.

"Lauren is simply amazing. We recruited her out of high school, so when she went into the portal, I felt all along that she was our type of hitter. I'm very grateful to have her and I feel like she is going to come into her own this year as an Aggie," said Head Coach Kathy Rodolph.

Garcia posted one of the best debuts in Aggie history over the weekend as NM State went 4-2 with two wins over

each Colorado State and Kansas City. In 15 at-bats, the New Mexico transfer racked up nine hits, including eight for extra bases. Four home runs and as many doubles each led the team as the red-shirt sophomore tallied a whopping 25 total bases in just six games.

Garcia accounted for 12 RBIs, including 10 on Sunday alone; eight of which came against Kansas City in the final game of the weekend. Her eight RBIs were also tied for the most by an Aggie in a single game in five seasons.

was just the beginning of the El Paso native's remarkable individual marks, as three walks boosted her on-base percentage to .667. The team-high eight extra-base hits resulted in an otherworldly 1.667 slugging percentage and 2.333 OPS.

Last season, two Aggies earned the same award. Jillian Taylor became the first CUSA Player of the Week in program history,

earning the honor on April 1, 2024. Two weeks later, Devin Elam picked up the same honor. Elsewhere, Desirae Spearman picked up five Freshman of the Week awards and a Pitcher of the Week distinction before Emily Dix matched with a pitching award of her own on April 29.

Next weekend, Garcia will lead the Aggies into the annual Troy Cox Classic. Over the four-day

Drop in 2023 earnings prompting the PGA tour to plan changes

The PGA Tour's financials for 2023 were recently released. The Tour generated \$1.83 billion in revenue for the year, \$70 million less than in 2022. The primary source of revenue is media rights, totaling \$730 million, or 40 percent of gross revenue. Other major revenue sources include tournament earnings and royalties. The notable thing is that media rights are critical for the Tour and depend on television ratings. But TV ratings for golf are deteriorating. Stats for TV viewership for the 2024 PGA Tour season show that for Saturday and Sunday viewership (no majors), an average drop of 18 percent. In business terms, that's like having

your cash cow product line show a sales dip by one-fifth. And it isn't due to LIV golf, which nobody watches.

There is a combination of things at play. We know there are too many commercials, including the "playing through" sort. You watched advertising 25 percent of a broadcast.

A published analysis of the CBS broadcast of the first round of the Farmers Insurance Open at Torrey Pines (3 hours and 47 minutes) revealed that CBS showed 268 golf shots. That meant CBS aired 1.2 golf shots per minute for the broadcast. We deserve better. What's more, the

CBS coverage showed 25 golfers out of the 155 players. CBS is just representative of golf on TV.

The PGA Tour, the TV networks and the tournament sponsors are all aware of the problem and what's going on. There isn't one fix, but a good place to start is the pace of play.

The final group at the American Express tournament in Palm Springs, in perfect weather, took 5 hours and 40 minutes to play 18 holes; the final group on Sunday at Torrey Pines took five and a half hours. The Tour needs a Shot Clock. A clock won't cause a full return

of viewership to where it should be, but it will help. It helped Major League Baseball to rebound from boring, dull, long baseball games. The PGA Tour collects the Shotlink data, knows who the slowest players are, and then fines them privately.

On Feb. 1, 2025, www.globalgolfpost.com reported that the Tour's chief competition officer, Tyler Dennis, said they were "considering making public how much time it takes each player to typically hit a shot, giving fans data as to who the fastest and slowest players are. Fines for pace-of-play violations could also be made public to bring more transparency to a subject that provokes fans' frustra-

tion."

While the Tour plans for the proposed Shot Clock to be tested in a few actual tournaments, it is worth noting that Shotlink data from several years says that what the Tour calls "average stroke time" has been stable at 38 seconds per shot. What is hidden in that data is exactly when the timing starts.

The term "when it's your turn to play" leaves it open. Some players, whose turn it is to play, may spend a couple of minutes or more walking to the green and back to figure out what they want to do before addressing the ball. At the ATT Pebble Beach Pro-Am, Tom Kim, who got plenty of TV airtime, took 42 seconds just

addressing his ball and another 23 seconds wagging and looking before he made his swing. Meanwhile, Ludvig Aberg's routine is a simple practice swing, a look at his line, and wham. It takes 20 seconds. My suspicion is that, with slow players, it may be their swing coach who prompts the "deliberate" routines.

As for important changes to enhance the PGA Tour's performance as an entertainment product, Tour executive Andy Weitz says the results from the Tour's "Fan Forward" initiative, started last year, which involved approximately 50,000 interviews, are among the driving influences. He adds that "everything is on the table."
