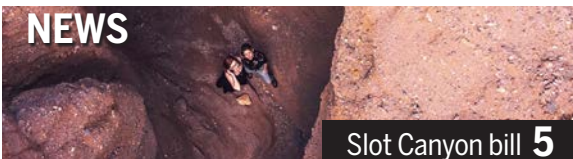

Commission calls for DASO audit as Stewart spat spirals

NEW UNDERSHERIFF
APPOINTED IN
LEADERSHIP

In the wake of the sheriff's office's latest public spat, the Board of County Commissioners agreed to pursue an external audit of the Doña Ana County Sheriff's Office and its Sheriff during a meeting on Feb. 24.

The Commission will still have to select an outside auditor and approve a contract, but Tuesday's informal agreement to hire an external auditor directed County Manager Scott Andrews to pursue the effort. It comes after Andrews filed a lawsuit on Feb. 13, calling Sheriff Kim Stewart's decision not

to commission 14 deputies a threat to public safety.

"This is not personal against Sheriff Kim Stewart. This is about the processes and procedures and laws that surround

this issue. This is about making sure that we have set the expected standard, and that is the same for all persons," acting County Attorney Cari Neill told the Commission.

Neill's statement came at the conclusion of a presentation that showcased the collapse of Stewart's relationship with the County and was set against a backdrop of dozens of lawsuits

against Stewart in her six years as sheriff.

The presentation, along with statements made in the most recent lawsuit, indicate that the County may have grounds to remove Stewart from Office. The Commission stopped short of embracing this option during the meeting on Feb. 24.

Problems with deputies old and new

Neill's presentation highlighted issues that began when Stewart sought to decommission her long-time right-hand man, Major Jon Day.

For years, Day had been a fixture of DASO leadership, ap-

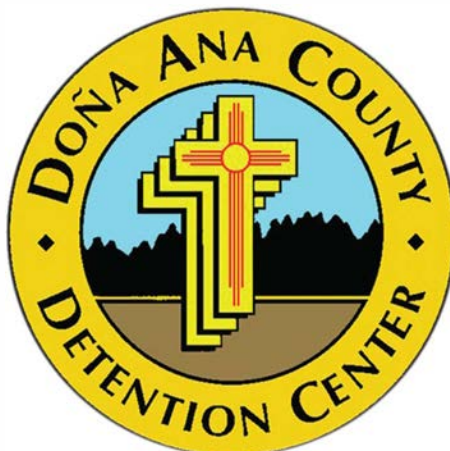

Lunsford sentencing set for April hearing

Brad Lunsford, a former Las Cruces police officer convicted of voluntary manslaughter, will be sentenced on April 4, according to court records.

A jury convicted Lunsford on Feb. 13 of voluntary manslaughter. The jury found that Lunsford while responding to a shoplifting call at the former Chevron gas station

on Valley Drive, wrongfully shot and killed Presley Eze. After eight days of videos of the killing, witness recollections, and expert testimony, a jury convicted Lunsford after about 3 hours of deliberation.

Lunsford could face up to nine years in prison – six for the voluntary manslaughter charge and three for firearm enhancement. After the conviction, Lunsford was taken to jail.

On Feb. 21, Lunsford lawyers filed a motion requesting he be released from jail until sentencing. The motion argued that he had strong ties to the community and that he would not flee or obstruct the judicial process if released.

A hearing or response to the motion had not been filed by the time of this article's publication.

Police union raises funds for Lunsford

On the day Lunsford was convicted of manslaughter, the Las Cruces Police Officers Association set up a GoFundMe for Lunsford's family.

"Brad was the sole financial provider, while Lacy raises their boys. Being a police officer, means that you have been taken in by an entirely new family, brothers and sisters in blue. We get to know one another and we build connections with each other's families, and they too, become family. We learn to lean on each other in good times and bad," a post set up by LCPD Ofc. Veronica De La O states.

The post continues,

"Whether you agree or disagree, they deserve to be taken care of so that Lacy doesn't have to worry about how to provide for her family as they navigate life moving forward. Thank you for your support."

As of this article's publication, the GoFundMe has raised \$31,505 with 201 donations. LCPD Chief Jeremy Story is the top donor, sending \$1,100 to the Lunsford family.

Eze family statement

In a statement shared by their family attorney, he said the family continues to mourn his loss.

"They are grateful to the New Mexico Depart-

ment of Justice and the jury for recognizing the injustice of Presley's death and fighting for the fundamental principal of human dignity. Presley's family implores the City of Las Cruces to redouble efforts to make sure no other family suffers the tragedy of losing a loved one to abusive police conduct. Even today, Presley's widow can't help but look at their four-year-old son and long for her loving husband to be back with them now and for the future. Presley's family takes solace in the guilty verdict as a beacon of justice to light the way toward less violence, Presley did not die in vain."

Vasquez demands answers in Border Patrol incident

U.S. Congressman Gabe Vasquez, a Democrat, called on the U.S. Department of Homeland Security to release more information about a bus of local high schoolers stopped and questioned by Border Patrol on Feb. 21.

According to statements from multiple agencies and a Las Cruces coach, Border Patrol Agents boarded the bus as it reached the Interstate 25 checkpoint. The bus was ferrying students from Las Cruces High School, Centennial High School and Mayfield High School to a swim meet in Albuquerque.

The incident follows

weeks of uncertainty and fear generated by a slew of executive actions from the Trump Administration, which has promised to deport 20 million people as part of a mass deportation program. Vasquez, who represents the 2nd congressional district, held a press conference Monday afternoon to discuss the incident.

“Harassing and frightening children does not make New Mexico safer. No student traveling to a school event should be subjected to intimidating enforcement actions,” Vasquez said.

After agents questioned the bus driver, who did not speak English, agents questioned students about

their immigration status before allowing the bus to move on. The coach declined to comment to the Bulletin but in an interview with another media outlet, she characterized the Border Patrol agents as aggressive.

On Feb. 24, The Las Cruces Public Schools Superintendent Ignacio Ruiz released a statement about the incident. Ruiz said he “engaged in open and productive communication with U.S. Customs and Border Protection” on Monday and that the conversation included “implementation of proactive measures to prevent similar incidents in the future.”

“I understand the fear

and uncertainty our students and staff must have felt in that situation,” Ruiz said. “We believe this was an isolated event, and we will continue to work with local and federal authorities to ensure students’ educational experiences are not disrupted. Our community is diverse, and every student, regardless of background, deserves to feel safe and supported while participating in school activities.”

Border Patrol confirmed the incident happened, adding that the bus was unmarked.

“Checkpoint inspections in the El Paso Sector play a vital role in maintaining the integrity of our nation’s borders. They are instrumental in deterring illegal immigration and

ensuring that those traveling away from the border comply with immigration laws. By conducting these inspections, border patrol agents help safeguard the security and well-being of communities throughout the United States,” said a Border Patrol spokesperson.

Still, Vasquez said that the incident was proof of the Trump administration’s intentions.

“We’re entering a new world of immigration enforcement, and we don’t know how far the Trump administration is willing to go to bully our citizens,” Vasquez said.

“We need clear answers about why these students were subjected to this treatment and to ensure that this doesn’t happen

again, and our border enforcement should be focused on actual security threats, not harassing students, teachers and families,” he said.

LCPS said this was an isolated incident. But Vasquez connected it to a U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement encounter on the Mescalero Apache Tribe in February when a tribe member reported an ICE agent requested to see a passport despite having no evidence the person was not a U.S. citizen.

“We have a responsibility to hold these agencies accountable and demand that our government operates with fairness, transparency and respect for the people that it serves,” Vasquez said.

Slot Canyon bill waiting on committee hearing

A bill that would declare Slot Canyon New Mexico's 36th state park remains in committee after being introduced on Jan. 29.

The bill, H.B. 29, would create the Slot Canyon Riverlands State Park north of Las Cruces along the Rio Grande. According to a news release, the park would be established on 783 acres of land owned by the New Mexico State Parks Division and would include camping, miles of trails, diverse wildlife viewing, river recreation access, and outdoor education.

The bill would also appropriate \$9 million to develop the area.

"Slot Canyon Riverlands State Park will boost economic development,

improve wildlife habitat, and be a gem for southern New Mexico. I'm proud to be part of this important project that will create new opportunities for New Mexicans to enjoy the lands and wildlife that make our state and our community such a special place to live," Rep. Nathan Small said in a news release.

Small is one of three Las Cruces-area legislators sponsoring the bill, which is also sponsored by Rep. Joanne Ferrary and Sen. Jeff Steinborn.

"I'm beyond excited to work towards the creation of this incredible new state park. It's a place where people can experience breathtaking landscapes and unique wildlife while also boosting our outdoor economy," Steinborn said. "This park



isn't just about protecting nature – it's about creating a space where our community and visitors can



connect with the beauty that makes our state so special. Plus, as a key stop along the Rio Grande Trail, it's sure to become a must-visit destination for outdoor lovers across New Mexico."

A fiscal analysis of the bill said the \$9 million appropriation would be a one-time expense but would also require a \$400,000 increase to the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department, which would oversee the park.

The \$9 million appro-

priation would be used for start-up costs, such as salt cedar removal, natural resource management planning and trail development. The analysis found that the park would also need a recurring \$400,000 to fund four permanent positions and two seasonal positions and utilities, equipment and maintenance.

The bill was assigned to the House Rural Development, Land Grants and Cultural Affairs after it was introduced. It had not yet been scheduled for a hearing date as of this article's publication. There are no representatives from Las Cruces or Dona Ana County on this committee.

The Bulletin inquired about when or if the bill would be heard soon. We are awaiting a response.

Film Las Cruces reports growth

Film makers spent about \$6.8 million last year over about 200 days of production, according to a presentation from Film Las Cruces.

The information came as part of a presentation from Film Las Cruces, a publicly funded non-profit that connects film productions with state tax incentives, local vendors and helps handle permitting for productions – all in services of growing the

local film industry.

Andrew Jara, Film Las Cruces' Liaison, told the Dona Ana County Board of County Commissioners on Feb. 11 that things were trending up. Film Las Cruces also hosts workshops, keeps data on local film productions and provides mentorship to students.

"We had a very successful year last year," Jara said, adding that much of the success came on the back of two locally filmed movies.

New Mexico offers



various film incentives to attract productions to the state. According to Film Las Cruces, some films can offer incentives cover-

ing 50% of crew member wages.

According to a 2023

Proposed alcohol tax passes first committee

Lawmakers today introduced a proposal to raise New Mexico's tax on alcohol for the first time in 30 years and re-direct revenue toward treatment and programs.

The House Health and Human Services Committee voted 6-4 to advance House Bill 417, Liquor Tax Changes and Programs. It now heads to the House Taxation and Revenue Committee.

The bill specifically creates a new 6% sales tax – also called a surtax – on alcohol sold in retail establishments and eliminates distribution of revenue from the existing

alcohol excise tax to the general fund, which currently receives a portion of that money.

Instead, the bill creates a new Local Alcohol Harms Alleviation Fund to allocate funding to counties and “target the communities most in need by prioritizing counties with the highest death rates from alcohol use,” a news release on Wednesday said. Counties that receive the funding “could use these funds for grants to raise awareness of the harms and risks associated with substance misuse, promote prevention, get people into treatment, and address issues like impaired driving.”

HB417 also creates

a new Tribal Alcohol Harms Alleviation Fund and Program to provide grants to the state's tribes, nations and pueblos, as well as entities that serve Native Americans.

Lawmakers say the bill arrives after months of discussion. The proposal also follows several years of failed efforts to raise the tax on alcohol and increasing scrutiny of New Mexico's top ranking for alcohol-related deaths.

Representatives Micaela Lara Cadena (D-Mesilla), Joanne Ferrary (D-Las Cruces) and Cristina Parajón (D-Albuquerque) and Senators Shannon Pinto (D-Tohatchi) and Antionette Sedillo-Lopez (D-Al-

buquerque) co-sponsored the bill.

“Far too many of us have lost a loved one to alcohol,” Ferrary said in a statement. “With this bill, we are taking an important step that is many

years in the making to help improve access to treatment, reduce excessive drinking, and hopefully begin saving lives.”

A fiscal analysis of the bill estimated that the proposed surtax imposi-

tion will generate \$45.7 million in FY26, and that HB417 would reduce recurring general fund revenue by \$24.7 million by redirecting revenue to the alcohol prevention and treatment programs.

Mesilla Valley Economic Development Alliance analysis, the film industry generated about \$17.28 million in economic impact across the county and city in 2022. That same study said the industry generated about \$244,000 in new gross receipts tax revenue.

Film Las Cruces receives funding from the major municipalities in the region, including the county and the city of Las Cruces. The city and county each send about \$95,000 to Film Las Cruces

yearly.

But commissioners said that was money well spent.

“It's pretty impressive,” Commissioner Shannon Reynolds said of the economic impact data. “For our investment of about \$95,000 a year, we're getting a return of roughly \$350,000.”

Jara said one of the most important things Film Las Cruces does is location marketing.

“A lot of the productions we talk to are either in Albuquerque or Los Angeles. We had one last year from Germany. So, they're not going to re-

ally know what's here in town,” Jara said.

To fill the gap, Film Las Cruces prepares packages to show them what's available in Las Cruces. Jara said Film Las Cruces sent out 49 such packages last year. They do the same work to showcase local vendors and in-person scouts.

Jara also highlighted ads and articles in industry publications, some of which targeted ghost hunting reality shows and productions in Texas, and reported growth in the number of locations, vendors, and crew members used from 2023 to 2024.

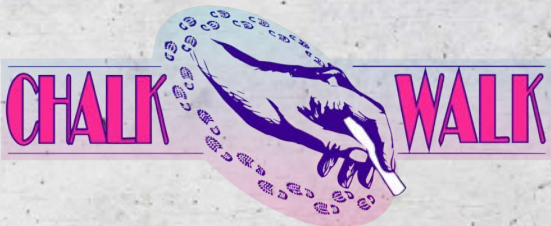

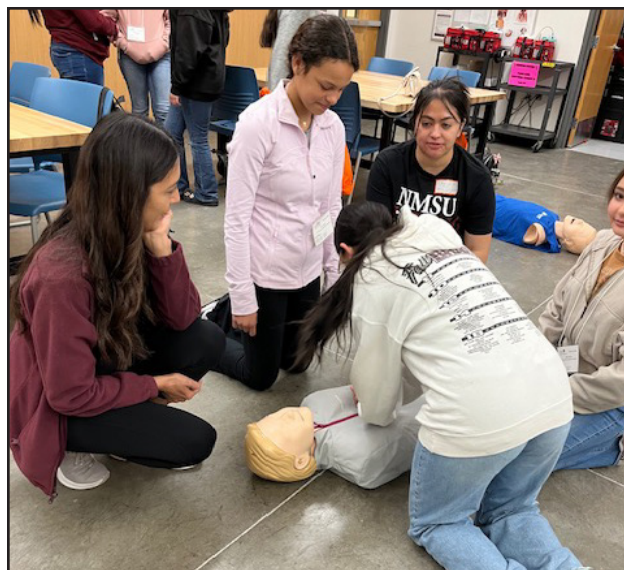
Girls Can! provides motivation to sixth grade girls

Is there anything girls can't do? The American Association of University Women-Las Cruces (AAUW-LC) and Doña Ana Community College (DACC) have the answer for you. Girls Can! is the annual career exploration conference for 6th grade girls that demonstrates the possibilities available using education to further one's career path. The conference will be held at 8 a.m., Saturday, March 1, at the Student Resources Building, DAEM, DACC East Mesa Campus, 2800 Sonoma Ranch Blvd, Las Cruces.

This year the event will feature 25 career topics spanning the fields of arts & entertainment, health & medicine, first responders & law enforcers, as well as science & engineering. The event provides each participant three one-hour, hands-on workshops provided by professional women in the area. There are also bilingual workshops for the girls' parents and guardians that cover college options, financial strategies, and the advantages of higher education.

"My personal belief is that this is maybe one of the most important things we do in our community, because it builds our future," said this year's event coordinator Patricia Johnson. "That future is, in this case, to inspire a

large group of students to think about what they can do to contribute to our society in a meaningful way."

This philosophy is one that has never wavered since the AAUW-LC founded this program 29 years ago. Though she was not present at the beginning, Johnson is proud of the work Girls Can! has done and continues to do in the community.

"The program has really grown over the years," she said. "This year we have more students preregistered than we have ever had, close to 400 girls. I started with this program in 2017 and we felt really good about the program because we had 200 girls registered. The growth has been phenomenal."

According to Johnson, the program has really

blossomed since 2017. That was the year the program moved from Lynn Middle School to the Doña Ana Community College. Introducing the girls to the halls of higher learning appeared to really send the message home. She credits two strong women for that upward momentum: Stephanie Hofacket and DACC president Monica Torres.

"Stephanie is a district administrator who in 2017 was in charge of the science teachers in the middle schools," Johnson explains. "She decided that it would be a good idea if she had the science teachers be the liaisons to Girls Can! This greatly increased the number of students who signed up. For the first time, we

The House passed a strong public safety package

The persistence of Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham on the issue of public safety has finally paid off. Lawmakers have passed legislation this session to address our growing crime problem with both enhanced enforcement and treatment. House Bill 3 deals with the enforcement end and includes a provision that would give the court more options in cases where defendants have been found mentally incompetent to stand trial.

It would authorize prosecutors to petition for assisted outpatient treatment of up to 30 days. After a qualified professional has examined the defendant, those found incompetent to stand trial could be placed in a diversion treatment program. Following suc-

cessful completion of the program, charges would be dropped for defendants who were not charged with a serious crime. Those unable to finish the program could be subject to a civil commitment process or assisted outpatient treatment.

In a recent opinion piece opposing the bill, the local chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness argues that it does not address the real problem, which is a shortage of community-based mental health services. That's why the Senate bills needed to be passed along with the House bill.

SB1 creates a new trust fund for behavioral health initiatives throughout the

state. SB 2 appropriates \$200 million to get that fund started. And, SB 3 will establish the Behavioral Health Executive Committee to work with local stakeholders to identify gaps in the system and ways to address them.

I share the concern of mental health professionals that the bill risks adding to the public misperception that equates mental illness with crime. But those beliefs won't be changed by ignoring the problem.

And it is a problem. Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story says that even though a small number of people may fall into this protected category, they

are causing significant damage and taking up an inordinate amount of time for police officers. One of the reasons response times are so long is that officers are dealing with the same repeat offenders who can't be held accountable for their crimes.

The House bill also increases penalties for fentanyl trafficking; makes it a fourth-degree felony to issue a mass-shooting threat against a school or public building; outlaws devices to convert guns into fully automatic weapons; increases penalties for repeated theft of vehicles; and makes it easier for police to search vehicles for controlled substances.

Bail reform won't be addressed in this session.

There has been a bill introduced by a trio of Republicans in the House, but it's stuck in committee. That's unfortunate. But this is a solid public safety package that should help police, and the courts make our cities safer.

We can't incarcerate our way to safety and prosperity. Clearly, affordable housing, job training, childcare, addiction treatment and behavioral health services are all important parts of the equation.

But law enforcement needs to be able to address threats to the community, regardless of the mental competency of the person posing the threat.

Why does New Mexico hate small businesses?

The Legislative Session is ongoing in Sante Fe. Among the inadequacy and disinterest in any real crime legislation, the majority of legislators seem completely dead set on crippling small businesses across the state, many of whom are still struggling to recover from oppressive closures during Covid.

The latest out of Sante Fe includes all-but-already-passed HB 11 for Paid Family Medical Leave. This will impose

a tax on every employer and every employee in the state to pay into a fund in which anyone can take off work for up to three months per year, for any number of reasons.

This would be the bill last year that the governor, when she heard it had failed to pass, illegally stormed the legislature and demanded that it be called again to attempt to bully legisla-

tors into passing it. She then launched a diabolical campaign to ensure the moderate democrats who did not vote in favor

were primaried out during the last election cycle, well and truly ensconcing New Mexico residents into the pit of the far-left Emerge elite. This iteration will almost certainly pass. I

recommend everyone visit nmlegis.gov to read the

full bill for themselves.

Another bill brewing is HB 246, which will increase the minimum wage in New Mexico to \$17 per hour. How exactly is a small, family-owned and operated business supposed to remain competitive with prices for customers, remain open for the same number of hours per week, and/or continue to employ the same number of people when the overhead cost of payroll increases nearly 50 percent!? Most basic

economists reference supply and demand. Well, the same supply will be available, and the same demand is projected, but the third elephant in the room is cost and those are about to go through the roof to offset this huge increase overnight.

Add this to the knowledge that the City does not care about the exorbitant cost of property damage to the local businesses (of any size) and the lack

Mass firings cut the muscle, not the fat

The stories are heart-breaking. US Forest Service, National Park Service and other federal workers – some of them within weeks of ending probationary periods – fired. And not for cause; these workers were just starting out on dreamed-of careers or taking on new responsibilities in agencies where they'd already been for years.

The Trump administration's vaunted effort to "trim the fat" from the federal government and curb "waste and fraud" reveal one terrible – but not surprising – fact: The cost-cutters have no idea how government works or who does what in the federal workforce.

Probation doesn't mean poor performers. It simply means that someone has only worked one or two years under authorities such as Veterans Recruitment Authority or Schedule A of a permanent job. Or it's their first time in a supervisory position.

I worked for the Forest Service in forestry and then wildland fire for over 32 years before retiring in 2020. Because I'm now an advocate for firefighters, I've heard from many Forest Service workers who were suddenly fired by the Trump administration. I'll tell you about two of them.

When he was 18, Cyrus Issari was hired to work with the Idaho Conservation Corps, building trail

in the Sawtooth Mountains. He'd "found his passion," he said, getting jobs as a temporary employee for the Bureau of Land Management and then the Forest Service. He cleared hazard trees with a chainsaw, cleaned campgrounds and also donned the Smokey Bear costume for public events. Best of all, he started fighting wildfires.

In 2022, Issari secured a permanent position – what he called his "dream job" – with a wilderness trail crew on New Mexico's Gila National Forest. A few weeks ago, his entire eight-person trail crew was fired. Issari had been making \$18.96 an hour.

"The land and people will suffer from (this) if nothing is done," Issari told me.

Liz Crandall was fired last week from her field ranger position in Central Oregon. She started as a volunteer on the Umpqua National Forest in Southwest Oregon in 2016, helping a botanist get rid of invasive weeds.

The recreation shop scooped her up and put her to work doing sign maintenance, improving trails and cleaning campgrounds. Hired into a temporary recreation position in 2018, she also received wildland fire training and assisted on numerous wildfires.

She moved on to work for Oregon's Willamette National Forest in recreation and then, in 2023, secured her permanent

position as a field ranger on the Deschutes National Forest.

"I have dedicated my career and life to the US Forest Service," Crandall said. Her performance evaluations were rated "excellent," which is why she was outraged by the wording of her termination:

"The Agency finds, based on your performance, that you have not demonstrated that your further employment in the Agency would be in the public interest." Liz had been making \$19.10 per hour.

There are common denominators in these stories, shared by the thousands (so far, 3,400 from the US Forest Service, 1,000 from the National Park Service, and 400 from the US Fish and Wildlife Service) of others who have been fired.

These folks love our public lands and have trained to do a variety of needed jobs. They feel a calling to serve the American taxpayers and countless visitors. They seek jobs that always pay more in sunsets than money.

Make no mistake, these hard-working and dedicated people aren't the fat, they are the muscle.

These firings will have ripple effects. They are your neighbors

who pay rent or take on mortgages. They shop in the local grocery stores and feed stores and coach basketball.

Many will have to move, and they will take their small, but meaningful, paychecks with them. They won't be there to assist with search and rescue, to fight the wildfires that are becoming larger and more unpredictable, threatening the lives and livelihoods of countless Americans.

What can we do to support them? Show up for rallies. Write, or better yet call, your elected officials and tell them what effect these firings will have on you, your family, your business, your community. Be kind to those who are still working. Some were forced to fire the very people who never should have been let go.

There's a big void to fill, now, and everyone needs to pitch in.

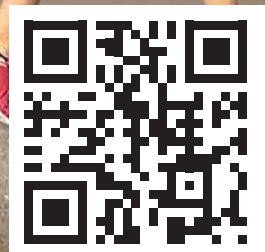

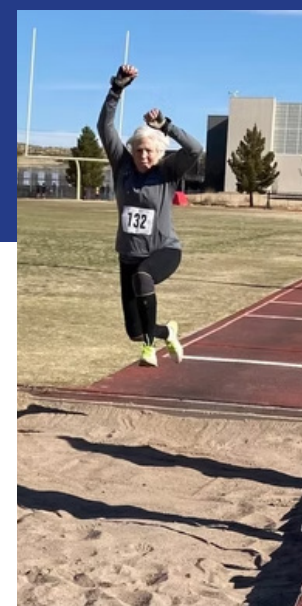

Q: I always enjoy seeing Reese Witherspoon as Rachel's sister in "Friends" repeats. How many times was she on that show?

A: Twice, though it might seem like she was on it more, since those two episodes of the sitcom are repeated so frequently (as is every other episode of it). Thanks to such pictures as "Election" and "Cruel Intentions,"

Witherspoon was a major movie star — though "Legally Blonde" and "Sweet Home Alabama" were yet to come — by the time she first played Jill Green in a 2000 "Friends" story appropriately titled "The One With Rachel's Sister."

Jill showed up at her sibling's New York apartment in need of help when she was suddenly cut off financially by their father (not seen in that episode, but played in others by Ron Leibman). He sent Jill to get advice on basic monetary survival from Rachel (Jennifer Aniston), who wasn't happy at all when Ross (David Schwimmer) seemed to take a more-than-friendly interest in Jill ... and vice versa.

In the next episode, "The One Where Chandler Can't Cry," Witherspoon continued her role as Jill — who wasn't happy, in turn, when she found out that Rachel asked Ross to back off from seeing Jill in a romantic light and behaving in kind. Of course, that didn't stop Jill from pursuing Ross anyway, making things quite tense between the sisters.

Reese Witherspoon and Jennifer Aniston have reunited in their careers since, as stars of the Apple TV+ drama series "The Morning Show," on which they both serve as executive producers as well. The show about a fictional television newscast has run for three seasons so far, and two more were ordered before Season 3 premiered in 2023, so there's plenty more Witherspoon-Aniston teamwork yet to come.

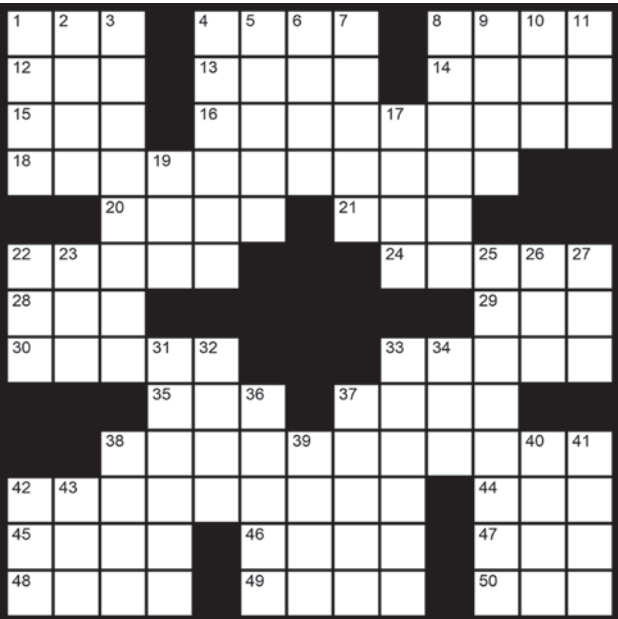

Welcome to the 2025 Doña Ana County Senior Games! We are pleased to have had 154 athletes compete last year and look forward to seeing more in 2025!

Doña Ana County Senior Olympics is committed to a program of sports and recreational events to promote healthy and active lifestyles for all seniors age 50 and above. Our programs encourage both the athlete and the beginner to participate within their own 5-year age category starting from 50-54 and going up to 90+. Senior Olympics in Doña Ana County is a volunteer group, with support coming from your modest registration fees. We offer 19+ events with opportunities for singles, doubles and mixed doubles play. When participating in any of our events, each person is

covered by an athlete insurance policy. Your age group for competition is the age you are on December 31 of the registration year.

For more information, e-mail the office at dacso2211@outlook.com. If you are playing doubles or a partnered sport, you will need the name, birthdate and email of your partner. Your team age is determined by the youngest partner's age as of December 31, 2025.

Example: if you turn 50 on September 1, 2025, you are considered 50 for the full year of 2025, and eligible for the spring 2025 games.

Doña Ana County Senior Olympics has sponsored local senior games for more than four decades, and for more than half those

years—27 years to be exact—Gary Tuttle took the spotlight as one of our most dedicated volunteers. He served as our Board Treasurer and he managed at least two of our annual competitive events: golf and bowling.

Gary had endless energy and enthusiasm for sports of all kinds, so it was a natural fit for him to become involved with Doña Ana County Senior Olympics in the late 1990s. Throughout his life, he had taken up water skiing, dirt track racing, bowling, golfing, and pool, among other sports. As his daughter Kileen Squibb noted, "He was game to do anything."

In his meticulous manner, Gary planned and



managed our bowling and golfing events year after year, putting in 50-60 hours of time for each event. He took extra care to try to assure just the right pairings for doubles in bowling, and he made little purchases on his own dime to accommodate golfers with "swag" because,

as an avid golfer, he knew that was part of the golf tournament tradition.

In his role as Board Treasurer, Gary stewarded our organization's financial wellbeing just as carefully as he had managed his own successful business, Johnstone Supply. He reconciled bank statements each month, he prepared financial reports for the board, and he ensured compliance with IRS and state reporting requirements.

Along with other members of the board, Gary tried to ensure that our organizational coffers would be sufficiently full each year so that with the roll of a bowling ball, the throw of a javelin, or the shot of a pistol, the "games would go on."

No doubt about it, Gary was an exceptional volunteer. But what many people probably don't know about Gary is that he was also a philanthropist, quietly and with no fanfare using his resources to improve the welfare of others and support causes he believed in. In 2024, Gary anonymously gave a generous donation to Doña Ana County Senior Olympics, and he made donations to other nonprofits as well. "Senior Olympics was close to his heart," his

daughter explained. "He decided years ago to give his personal estate to charity."

Prior to his death last year, Gary worked with the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico to set up the Tuttle Family Fund, which, once active, will begin supporting senior services throughout southern New Mexico. President and CEO of the Community Foundation, Terra Winter, said she expects grant awards will begin in 2026.

Our dear friend leaves a legacy of generosity, community engagement, and care for others.

For these extraordinary qualities and for the time he gave us, we offer heartfelt appreciation of our fellow senior athlete, Gary Tuttle.

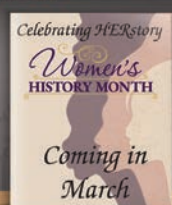

Lifelong Athlete Eugene Pettes Going for the Gold

measure the height of his high jumps. "It's makeshift," 81-year-old Eugene says, "but it works." In another corner of his property, running along the fence, Eugene has portioned off a strip to practice his long jumps.

Eugene started competing as a field and track athlete when he was just in middle school, representing Court Junior High School beginning in 1957. He went on to compete for Las Cruces High School, boosting his teams' success in many track and field events, including high jump, long jump, the 200 and 100 meter races and the 440 relay. He said his coach bought him proper track shoes. He holds records in both the 110 high hurdles and 180 low hurdles. "All my life I've been into sports," says Eugene, explaining that even after graduating from high school in 1963, he got involved in coaching Special Olympics for a spell.

"What drove me to get involved with Senior Olympics was that I never got a chance to go to the Olympics, Eugene said. "I didn't have sponsors to cover me." He explained that when he turned 50, he got involved with Senior Olympics because it allowed him to compete on a local, state and national stage in honor of his earlier Olympic dreams. He has been competing in the annual Doña Ana County Senior Olympics games ever since, and often competes at the State level.

Eugene is a busy man. He is the lead singer in a local band, Genie and the



When you head out the back door of Eugene Pettes' house set on his 2 ½ acre property off Mesa Grande Road in Las Cruces, one of the first things you notice is a makeshift high jump landing system. It consists of stacked dense foam pads and two upright aluminum poles on each side, with equidistant spikes hammered into the poles running vertically upon which Eugene can place a wooden stick horizontally to



Starliners, and he works as a security guard seven days a week. He says he gets serious about getting in shape for the local Senior Olympics games during the winter. In addition to practicing his high jumps and long jumps, he works out in a room in his home that he has designated as his weight room.

In the July 4, 2019 edition of the Las Cruces Sun News, the photo and news clip on page 2A give testimony to the ongoing story of Eugene's sustained commitment to athleticism and its rewards: "Las Cruces Man Takes Second in the Long Jump." The distance: 10 feet, four inches. And in the summer of 2025, when the National Senior Olympics games take place in Des Moines, Iowa, Eugene, who will be competing in the 80-84 year-old age bracket, is determined to go for the gold. "Next year (in 2025) I'm going to be first," he promises. "And I hope I live to be 110." And if longevity banks on staying physically active, Eugene will surely live that long.

had more than a hundred kids register. She is really the key to making this program successful in the Las Cruces schools.”

Torres, she said, “totally embraced the program. She has allowed Girls Can! to be on the campus for no cost to AAUW. If

we had to pay for the facilities, it would be prohibitive. That contribution is a huge one. She deserves a lot of credit, too, for making this program so successful.”

That success can be measured not only in attendance, but also in long lasting impressions on the girls who have taken part in the program. Johnson relates a story about a young woman – an

engineer at NMSU – who attended one of the organization’s monthly meetings.

“She specifically mentioned her experiences at Girls Can! as allowing the girls to think they could have careers beyond what they thought was available to them,” Johnson said. “It opened up her world. She said at that time she was intimidated by mathematics. She never even

thought about working outside of a very narrow group of careers. Attending Girls Can! allowed her to see that there were other possibilities.”

The 6th grade girls in every middle school in Doña Ana County have been invited to participate in this year’s event, and efforts have been made to reach home-schooled students. About 400 girls and 100 parents

are expected to participate. The event is staffed with about 100 volunteers who are primarily AAUW members and NMSU students. Girls Can! is supported financially by AAUW members as well as local businesses and organizations.

Westside Bistro hopes to satisfy Aggie appetites

The student-run restaurant, formerly known as the 100 West Café, is back in business at New Mexico State University. It has been revamped as 100 West Café, located at the University's Gerald Thomas Hall at 940 College Drive, Las Cruces.

The restaurant that once served three-course meals ushered in the new change to accommodate students and city residents. Director of the School of Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Management, Jean Hertzman, said this was a needed change.

"100 West Café was built around 2005, and I started in 2016, and it really did not have much renovation since we changed

it. It only had some pictures on the wall, but with this revamp, although limited, we were able to spruce it up," Hertzman said.

"But the students came up with nice ideas for changing the décor, simplifying it, making it look modern. Then renaming the lunches really modernizes it and puts it more in line with the changes our Chef Danielle Young initiated last semester."

Hertzman said the menu now introduces a-la-carte items, making it far more convenient for students on the go.

"Before, a lot of our students and even faculty were more-so worried about not having enough time to eat. Now, you can get an appetizer and eat in 15 minutes if that's all you have or even a full meal," she said.

The solid change came after Young proposed the idea to Hertzman in the fall of 2024, with new menu items to accommodate a short time frame.

"My marketing students also take the quantitative food class, which runs the bistro, and we were all discussing how we could get more people to each lunch there, and one of the things the students mentioned was how outdated it was. After that, my department head (Hertzman) and I discussed it, allowing us to re-brand and redecorate it to make it more of a restaurant space," Young said.

Young added that the restaurant has always been named after the room number of the actual class. She and her students felt that it needed to be separated from the "classroom setting" and bring in the restaurant ambiance.

Aside from the usual menu, one of the restaurant's "outdated" issues was the wall décor. Young and Hertzman said

they now have new art that is not only in style but also from current NMSU art students.

"We get to work alongside other departments and showcase other students work alongside ours at the restaurant, really giving each other that community experience," Hertzman added.

Both NMSU faculty members said the goal was to bring in more students and faculty.

They said that with students and faculty having so little time in the day, they wanted to eliminate the necessity of having to sit and wait an hour or two to eat.

"It seemed like the restaurant was fancy, and a lot of people thought they could not eat there like it was invitation only or that it was more of a club. We were going to keep the three-course meal, but we would have had to increase

prices and with our community but with our students we couldn't do that, so we decided to do a-la-carte," Young said.

She said the student will learn to serve and cook, be a manager, and manage guest services in about five weeks.

"It's hard to learn and make changes so we decided to keep the menu the entire semester rather than a new menu every week. Last semester we first started the a-la-carte menu, and it was a bit rocky but then we introduced weekly specials which is designed purely by our students and the guest love it," Young said.

"The good thing about it all is if someone only has 15 minutes, they can come in and get their food very

quickly, they no longer need an hour or hour and a half to dine with us."

Young added that they have a regular customer base that continues to show up and hopes the restaurant's fan base can grow now that it is open to the community.

Westside Bistro is open to the public on Fridays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. for lunch, with weekly specials. Young added that people can also call to place an order for pick up during operating hours on Fridays.

The menu includes appetizers, full-course meals, and desserts; prices range from \$5 to \$12.

Free 'Lush & Lean' workshops open to public

Join the City of Las Cruces Utilities Department's Water Conservation Program in celebrating the 30th anniversary of its very popular and informative Lush & Lean program by attending a free workshop this spring to learn about vegetable gardening, fruit trees, soil, tree pruning and much more from some of the region's most respected experts.

As its name indicates, Lush & Lean helps educate the community about ways to make their yards and gardens beautiful and satisfying – that's the lush part – while conserving our precious local water supply – that's the lean part.

Lush & Lean began on Arbor Day 1995 as a City-sponsored tree giveaway program. This event and others that the Program offers are "a fabulous opportunity for us to get to know our community," said Program Coordinator Rhonda Diaz.

In 2024 the Water Conservation Program hosted 1,300 Las Cruces fourth graders and 40 community organizations that participated in the 10th annual Children's Water Festival, and 800 elementary and high school students received the "Where Does Our Water Come From?" classroom presentation.

Hundreds of local residents attend Lush & Lean workshops every year to learn about best practices for growing plants, trees and shrubs and conserving water in our desert environment, and to ask questions of local experts. Input from workshop participants also helps determine topics for future workshops.

pearing alongside Stewart at public outings and filling a key role in her leadership structure. But no longer. Around the time of Feb. 10, emails Neill presented to the Commission show that Stewart wanted to decommission Day and another member of her command staff, Captain Brian Johnston.

It's unclear why, but Johnston claims in a lawsuit against the County that Stewart pushed him to pressure another deputy to break up with his girlfriend, because she believed the girlfriend was responsible for a public records request that irritated her.

Johnston also claims that Stewart instructed Day to take "illegal action" against another DASO employee but doesn't specify what that might have been.

Regardless, Johnston and Day were taken out of the command staff and assigned to work in the district courthouse. Johnston characterized the change as a reduction in prestige and a hit to his career prospects.

When Stewart attempted to decommission Johnston and Day, the County's Human Resources told her that wasn't in her purview.

Neill explained that a decommissioned officer loses the right to enforce the law. Neill also said that all promotions and demotions for all county employees, deputies included, must go through

a process outlined by the County's Human Resources.

"When the sheriff was notified of this, she sent multiple emails stating that if she can't decommission the officers, she will not commission them," Neill said, referring to the cadets of the 29th DASO academy who were set to graduate on Feb. 13.

Those emails were attached to one of the lawsuits against Stewart.

"I have been told I cannot decommission anyone, that suggests there is no need to commission anyone," Stewart wrote in an email to HR. "Going forward, you might want to have some written documentation indicating to these employees from where they derive their power. It would appear they obtain their power to enforce the law, etc., in Doña Ana County by job description classification only. Good luck on that."

More emails reveal that Stewart took issue with HR's concerns over some of the cadets' psychological evaluations.

It's unclear what specifically the issues were. What is clear is that the class initially had 19 cadets before the academy began. But the state Law Enforcement Academy (LEA) board said five cadets were ineligible to be police officers due to their psychological exams and ethical concerns, according to an email Stewart sent to HR.

"These five people have been working for us for months," Stewart said in the email. "The Academy

starts this Monday. LEA is telling me if I let them attend pending what they say is an appealable process, they will close our academy. I am firing these people now, then, as I have no alternative."

On Feb. 13, the County hosted a graduation ceremony for the cadets. Surrounded by family and friends, county personnel and the sheriff, the ceremony went on like nothing was amiss.

Afterward, upon learning that Stewart had not commissioned the deputies, County Manager Andrews filed a petition for a Writ of Mandamus. The writ requested a judge order Stewart to commission the deputies, as is her duty mandated by law.

Neill said this has happened. All 14 deputies were commissioned. But Stewart has yet to notify the court that she has followed the judge's demand, Neill said.

Stewart's years of lawsuits

Neill's presentation also encompassed the long history of lawsuits against Stewart.

Twice, former 3rd Judicial District Attorney Gerald Byers requested a judge compel Stewart and DASO via Writs of Mandamus. In one case, Stewart tried to pull DASO away from having to serve some of the DA's subpoenas. In another, Byers sought to force Stewart to turn over information about a boy mauled to death by dogs.

In both cases, judges sided with Byers.

Neill also brought up a public records lawsuit in which the sister of a man killed by DASO in 2022 is suing the County. She claims that DASO has failed to turn over public records such as police reports, body camera footage, photographs, and other documents for two

and half years.

State law calls for governments to be penalized \$100 per day for failing to hand over public records, something Neill pointed out in her presentation. Neill said this is a recurring problem.

"Then there are the cases against the County and or the sheriff for violations of the Whistleblower Protection Act. All filed between Apr. 11, 2023, and Jan. 21, 2025, all of which allege retaliation suffered at the hands of Sheriff Kim Stewart," Neill said, showing a cascade of lawsuits, many of which are still pending.

Stewart responds, hires new Undersheriff

Around 2:30 p.m., DASO issued a news release stating the sheriff welcomed an audit.

"We are very pleased to hear the Board of County Commissioners are seeking an external audit," DASO said. "It is suggested that the external auditors' work be extended to include Human Resources and the Legal Department as these departments are regularly impacted by these partnerships."

The news release went on to suggest that the disconnect was a structural one.

"Sheriff Stewart is not the first in her Office to have challenging experiences with county government and has requested numerous times over the years for a mediator to be retained. Her request is now likely to materialize sooner than later. It is also imperative that DASO

should be given the opportunity to collectively agree on a fair and unbiased external auditor," DASO said.

"DASO is willing to work closely with county management in order to maintain consistent cohesiveness as we continue to move forward," the news release concluded.

The same release also announced Robert Parra would fill the role of Undersheriff. Parra is the president of the New Mexico Fraternal Order of Police. He also has a background as a Senior Special Agent of Internal Affairs for the Department of Corrections.

Parra replaces Tessa Abeyta, a former Las Cruces Councilor with no law enforcement background. Abeyta said in a Facebook post that the decision to leave came with mixed emotions. She said that she was recovering from a medical incident and looked forward to spending more time with family.

"I am proud of what we achieved together in enhancing community safety and outreach. In these crucial times, my commitment to bringing essential resources to our communities remains strong. I want to express my gratitude to Sheriff Stewart, the deputies, and the entire team for your unwavering support and the invaluable experiences I've gained. I look forward to staying connected and wish everyone continued success in your important work," Abeyta said.

Abeyta was on the job for about a year.

In the opening round, the Aggies posted a 316 (+28) before narrowly improving to shoot a 314 (+26) in the afternoon. Host UCLA closed the day in the top

spot on the leaderboard as they were the lone squad in the 12-team field to finish the day with a score in the red – shooting 574 (-2).

Filipovity named CUSA Player of the Week

LAS CRUCES, N.M. – After missing two games due to illness, Peter Filipovity returned to action in dominant fashion, making an immediate impact for NM State. The Aggies faced one of the toughest road swings in Conference USA, taking on league frontrunner Jacksonville State followed by Kennesaw State. Filipovity rose to the challenge, delivering back-to-back standout performances that earned him CUSA Player of the Week honors.

The Hungary native

wasted no time making his presence felt in his return to the lineup. Against Jacksonville State - who entered the contest undefeated at home - Filipovity powered the Aggies to an upset victory, posting a team-high 20 points, 12 rebounds, and two assists while shooting 50% from the field. His dominant effort marked his sixth double-double of the season and third in conference play, ranking him second in CUSA in total double-doubles this year.

Filipovity carried that momentum into the Aggies' matchup against Kennesaw State, where he

tallied 18 points, a team-high nine rebounds, one assist, and one steal. His performance helped NM State complete a crucial road sweep—making them the first team in CUSA play to take down both Jacksonville State and Kennesaw State on their home courts in the same trip.

This marks the second time an Aggie has earned CUSA Player of the Week honors this season, with senior guard Christian Cook receiving the award on Jan. 6. NM State also joins as one of just three CUSA teams to have multiple players claim the accolade this season.

When it's breezy, swing easy

In case you haven't noticed, it's the windy season. From now through the end of April, afternoons are frequently typified by 20 to 30 mph winds, with higher gusts, and golf courses are generally playable on those days. But 40 mph and higher winds are too high for golf. Golf becomes unplayable when the ball begins to move on its own from a stationary position on the putting surface. Here are a few tips for playing on windy days.

There are basically three wind conditions we are concerned with: hitting into the wind, hitting down wind and hitting into a cross wind. Bear in mind that there are several variables which in-

clude high, wicked gusts, shifting wind directions, unusual air density and humidity. The variation in the wind will be greater on hilly or mountain courses and will be less on flatter topography. The wind has the potential to affect every shot. In our town, my own experience has been that the prevailing wind this time of year is from the southwest and the west, which tends to create the most blowing dust. And the wind is strongest coming down from the West Mesa, and less strong from the East Mesa. Playing golf this time of year requires that we become adept at read-

ing the breeze and maybe choosing to embrace the wind.

When hitting straight into the wind it is recommended that you take more club – sometimes even two or three clubs more. You can figure one more club for each ten mile-per-hour of wind speed. Some pros like to grip down on the club and make a shorter backswing, leading to better control. For recreational golfers trying to swing the club harder is not a good idea because it too often results in a high, wildly ballooning golf ball that can go anywhere.

When hitting with the

wind behind you, remember that the wind will affect the higher shots the most, and sometimes “knock down” a rising ball, thereby flattening the trajectory. Achieving a lower ball flight makes the most sense. Note that it will be harder to stop your shot on the green, so playing for the ball's roll out is important. Playing a shot with a strong left-to-right or right-to-left crosswind takes some practice, especially since you need to figure out whether you're better at hitting into the wind or going with the direction of the wind.

For approach shots to the green we need to notice where exactly the hole is located, as we want

to avoid being short-sided downwind to the hole. A controlled, balanced swing is what's needed.

Putting on a windy day presents an equally dramatic challenge. For most golfers putting represents 40% of their scores. A strong breeze or wind will certainly affect how the ball rolls, especially when the greens are fast. It's important, as with all other shots, that you stay balanced when putting. Sometimes a wider stance is needed. Be acutely aware of the slope of the green and the direction of the wind when hitting an approach shot or a chip to the green, so you know what to expect on your putt. It may be impossible to stop a downhill,

downwind, down-grain putt; it might just roll off the green. Pay particular attention to the break of the putt, as you may need more “borrow” than before.

For par 3's your decision where to aim your tee shot is critical. I say aim for the middle of the green; that way a miss slightly right or left won't get you in trouble. If you aim at a sucker pin you risk a sky ball with a buried lie in the bunker, or splashing in the water from an errant ball off line.

There is no doubt wind will separate the skilled and smart golfers from all the pretenders. As the old saying goes, “when it's breezy swing easy.”
