





We are excited to let our community know that Doña Ana County Senior Games will be celebrating its 45th anniversary!

This year, we will be hosting our first POWERLIFTING competition on Saturday, March 22, under the direction of Jack Thomas at ONE MORE REP GYM. The competition lifts include 1) squat, 2) bench press and 3) deadlift.

We have also added an event to two established Sports/Activities. A Singles competition has been added to the Cornhole and Pickleball Competitions of Mixed, Women's and Men's Doubles.

2025 SENIOR GAMES INFORMATION

Welcome to the 2025 Doña Ana County Senior Games! We are pleased to have had 154 athletes compete last year and look forward to seeing more in 2025!

Doña Ana County Senior Olympics is committed to a program of sports and recreational events to promote healthy and active lifestyles for all seniors age 50 and above. Our programs encourage both the athlete and the beginner to participate within their own 5-year age category starting from 50-54 and going up to 90+. Senior Olympics in Doña Ana County is a volunteer group, with support coming from your modest registration fees. We offer 19+ events with opportunities for singles, doubles and mixed doubles play. When participating in any of our events, each person is

covered by an athlete insurance policy. Your age group for competition is the age you are on December 31 of the registration year.

For more information, e-mail the office at dacso2211@outlook.com. If you are playing doubles or a partnered sport, you will need the name, birthdate and email of your partner. Your team age is determined by the youngest partner's age as of December 31, 2025.

Example: if you turn 50 on September 1, 2025, you are considered 50 for the full year of 2025, and eligible for the spring 2025 games.

We will follow New Mexico State Game Rules.

- The **Swimming** order of events will be: 200 Free, 100 Fly, 50 Breast, 200 IM, 100 Back, 50 Free, 200 Breast, 100 IM, 200 Back, 100 Free, 50 Fly, 100 Breast, 50 Back, 200 Fly, 500 Free.
- At the time of this printing, **Bowling** requires picture ID to enter the White Sands Missile Range base – Check with the event manager on updates.
- **Archery** will allow one of the following: Recurve (with sights), Compound Fingers (with sights), Compound Release (with or without sights), Barebow Recurve (no sights), and Barebow Compound (no sights).
- The **Track** order of events at Field of Dreams on March 29th are: 8am – 100M run, 1500M run, 50M run, 400M est walk, 400M run, 9:30am – 1500M Power walk, 800M run, 200M run, 800M est walk.
- **Powerwalk** 7:30am – 5K at Sisbarro Park on May 10th.
- The **Road Race** at Sisbarro Park on May 10th order of events are: 9:00am – 5K & 10K run concurrently. All runners will do the 5K and the 10K runners continue on for a 2nd 5K to get their 10K time.
- The **Field** order of events at Field of Dreams on March 29th are: 9am - Standing Long Jump, Running Long Jump, 10am - High Jump, 11am - Shotput, Discus, Javelin.
- The **Air Gun** event includes: Pistol-standing, pistol-benchrest, rifle-standing, rifle-benchrest.
- **Fun & Rec** events include: Soccer Accuracy Kick, Softball Distance Throw, Frisbee Distance, Frisbee Accuracy Throw.
- **Cornhole** will have singles, mixed doubles, and men & women's doubles.
- **Shuffleboard**: Practice 12pm – 1pm, men/women's singles 1pm – 2 pm, men/women's/mixed doubles 2pm – 6pm.
- **Powerlifting** is a new sport this year! It includes the following 3 lifts... squat, bench press and deadlift. You must participate in all three lifts to receive a score.

PRICING:

Registration \$20, each Event \$5. Fun & Rec is \$5 for each of the 4 events. The extra fees for golf are \$48, targets for Trap or Skeet are \$10 and Bowling \$6/day.

I agree that failure to do so will result in my disqualification or suspension from the DACSO Games for a specified period of time.

In Remembrance of
Our Friend, Gary Tuttle
 May 28, 1936 – March 5, 2024



Doña Ana County Senior Olympics has sponsored local senior games for more than four decades, and for more than half those years—27 years to be exact—Gary Tuttle took the spotlight as one of our most dedicated volunteers. He served as our Board Treasurer and he managed at least two of our annual competitive events: golf and bowling.

Gary had endless energy and enthusiasm for sports of all kinds, so it was a natural fit for him to become involved with Doña Ana County Senior Olympics in the late 1990s. Throughout his life, he had taken up water skiing, dirt track racing, bowling, golfing, and pool, among other sports. As his daughter Kileen Squibb noted, “He was game to do anything.”

In his meticulous manner, Gary planned and



managed our bowling and golfing events year after year, putting in 50-60 hours of time for each event. He took extra care to try to assure just the right pairings for doubles in bowling, and he made little purchases on his own dime to accommodate golfers with “swag” because,



as an avid golfer, he knew that was part of the golf tournament tradition.

In his role as Board Treasurer, Gary stewarded our organization’s financial wellbeing just as carefully as he had managed his own successful business, Johnstone Supply. He reconciled bank statements each month, he prepared financial reports for the board, and he ensured compliance with IRS and state reporting requirements.

Along with other members of the board, Gary tried to ensure that our organizational coffers would be sufficiently full each year so that with the roll of a bowling ball, the throw of a javelin, or the shot of a pistol, the “games would go on.”

No doubt about it, Gary was an exceptional volunteer. But what many people probably don’t know about Gary is that he was also a philanthropist, quietly and with no fanfare using his resources to improve the welfare of others and support causes he believed in. In 2024, Gary anonymously gave a generous donation to Doña Ana County Senior Olympics, and he made donations to other nonprofits as well. “Senior Olympics was close to his heart,” his


daughter explained. “He decided years ago to give his personal estate to charity.”

Prior to his death last year, Gary worked with the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico to set up the Tuttle Family Fund, which, once active, will begin supporting senior services throughout southern New Mexico. President and CEO of the Community Foundation, Terra Winter, said she expects grant awards will begin in 2026.

Our dear friend leaves a legacy of generosity, community engagement, and care for others.

For these extraordinary qualities and for the time he gave us, we offer heartfelt appreciation of our fellow senior athlete, Gary Tuttle.





Lifelong Athlete Eugene Pettes Going for the Gold

measure the height of his high jumps. "It's makeshift," 81-year-old Eugene says, "but it works." In another corner of his property, running along the fence, Eugene has portioned off a strip to practice his long jumps.

Eugene started competing as a field and track athlete when he was just in middle school, representing Court Junior High School beginning in 1957. He went on to compete for Las Cruces High School, boosting his teams' success in many track and field events, including high jump, long jump, the 200 and 100 meter races and the 440 relay. He said his coach bought him proper track shoes. He holds records in both the 110 high hurdles and 180 low hurdles. "All my life I've been into sports," says Eugene, explaining that even after graduating from high school in 1963, he got involved in coaching Special Olympics for a spell.

"What drove me to get involved with Senior Olympics was that I never got a chance to go to the Olympics, Eugene said. "I didn't have sponsors to cover me." He explained that when he turned 50, he got involved with Senior Olympics because it allowed him to compete on a local, state and national stage in honor of his earlier Olympic dreams. He has been competing in the annual Doña Ana County Senior Olympics games ever since, and often competes at the State level.

Eugene is a busy man. He is the lead singer in a local band, Genie and the



When you head out the back door of Eugene Pettes' house set on his 2 1/2 acre property off Mesa Grande Road in Las Cruces, one of the first things you notice is a makeshift high jump landing system. It consists of stacked dense foam pads and two upright aluminum poles on each side, with equidistant spikes hammered into the poles running vertically upon which Eugene can place a wooden stick horizontally to



Starliners, and he works as a security guard seven days a week. He says he gets serious about getting in shape for the local Senior Olympics games during the winter. In addition to practicing his high jumps and long jumps, he works out in a room in his home that he has designated as his weight room.

In the July 4, 2019 edition of the Las Cruces Sun News, the photo and news clip on page 2A give testimony to the ongoing story of Eugene's sustained commitment to athleticism and its rewards: "Las Cruces Man Takes Second in the Long Jump." The distance: 10 feet, four inches. And in the summer of 2025, when the National Senior Olympics games take place in Des Moines, Iowa, Eugene, who will be competing in the 80-84 year-old age bracket, is determined to go for the gold. "Next year (in 2025) I'm going to be first," he promises. "And I hope I live to be 110." And if longevity banks on staying physically active, Eugene will surely live that long.
