Grassroots effort to stop Realize Las Cruces

A group of Las Cruces residents are petitioning door to door to stop the city's new planning and zoning ordinance from going into effect.

Realize Las Cruces is the new planning and zoning code reform passed by a 6-1 city council vote in late February. The new code allows for greater flexibility and character-based development, instead of zones marked as either residential or commercial. Chris Faivre, community development director for the city, said the city had many goals in mind when reforming the old code and one was to encourage new development.

But a group of citizens opposed to Realize Las

Cruces are trying to get enough signatures to force a halt to the new code's implementation and send the zoning reform to the voters to decide in November. The grassroots group are canvassing door to door and have a drop-in location at 925 W. Picacho Ave.

Sarah Smith, first vice chair of Coalition of Conservatives in Action, told the Bulletin the volunteers aim to gather the required 3,240 signatures needed. She said some of the objections to Realize Las Cruces include a plan for more multi-family housing and some commercial development mixed into residential areas.

The petition gatherers have until March 20. If they succeed, the city clerk's office will then validate the signatures. If the

signatures are validated, the city council would then decide if it wants to return to the old code, established in 2001, or let the voters decide in November if Realize Las Cruces should move forward. Smith said she wants the new code reform to go to the voters.

"I'm not against development," Smith said. "When

they start encroaching for high density apartments and commercial development on residential streets, that's where the problem lies."

Smith said she is concerned the new zoning code will increase housing costs through new rules around building park amenities in new neighborhoods.

Faivre told the Bulletin that the 2001 code had no formal ordinances in place for how developers built parks within a housing development. He said Realize Las Cruces codifies how park amenities will be built in the future.

"It was more of a negotiation [in the past] between the developer and the Parks and Recreation Department. We're trying to formalize the process," Faivre said.

Faivre said developers can add only limited commercial development, such as small cafes and small bed and breakfasts. He said that developers will still have to meet certain requirements for things such as enclosures for dumpsters, meet setbacks and parking requirements for any commercial property.

Faivre said one of the problems that Realize Las Cruces could help solve is that there is limited land available that allows for higher density. But there is vacant land currently zoned for commercial use along El Paseo Road and along S. Solano Drive. He said more flexible zoning could make redevelopment of those areas more

Food pantry takes shape in Chaparral to fight hunger

\$1.9M FACILITY TO BOOST FOOD ACCESS IN GROWING COMMUNITY

CHAPARRAL – A new food pantry is in the works in Chaparral to combat hunger.

Officials broke ground Oct. 11 on the pantry at 190 County Line Drive near the Betty McKnight Community Center. The pantry will focus on feeding families from both the Doña Ana County and Otero County sides of Chaparral, located close to the Texas state line. It will be the community's first permanent pantry.

Former state Rep. Willie Madrid, a Democrat from Chaparral, spearheaded the project when he proposed the food pantry in early 2024. State Rep. Micaela Lara Cadena, a Democrat from Mesilla, joined in, and both helped provide \$1.3 million in funding through the Legislature's capital outlay process.

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, Madrid said he observed how schools addressed food necessity for students and parents.

"There were nuns from a Chaparral church doing it (providing food) out of St. Thomas More Church parking lot for the last 12 to 15 years. That's when I decided that was enough. But, it's young and the old that are getting the mix of this," Madrid said.

Higher rates of hunger

In Doña Ana County, 16.4% of people were food insecure in 2022, the most-recent data available from Feeding America. The rate was about the same in Otero County. That means residents experience high uncertainty about where or when they'll get their next meal. Advocates have said they believe the rates of hunger are actually much higher in the rural and border communities, like Chaparral and Sunland Park, than the countywide numbers show.

Nationwide, the rate was 13.5% the same year.

Madrid said his major concern is about the elderly not receiving enough benefits. He added they may not qualify to receive assistance. According to the Food Research and Action
Center, children who experience hunger are two to four times more likely to face individual health problems. The children are also prone to struggling academically. Food insecure children entering school show significantly slower development in reading and math compared to their peers.

Madrid proposed the idea of a food pantry to Casa de Peregrinos, a major pantry in Las Cruces that also serves outlying areas, as a way to combat hunger in Chaparral. Lorenzo Alba Jr., executive director of Casa de Peregrinos agreed with Madrid's opinion for the need of a food pantry, and both pushed for the project.

Alba said the whole reason the project was "pushed across the finish line" was because he asked Doña Ana County representatives what they would like to see for the project to come to fruition, and in return they provided the remainder of the funds to complete the project.

According to Doña Ana County Project Manager Justin Weaver, the estimated total cost for the project is \$1.92 million for design and construction.

He added that the design was funded by Doña Ana County General Funds in the amount of \$164,358.45, and \$1.3 million will go towards building efforts from the 2024 state appropriation.

The facility will be owned by the county and Doña Ana County will oversee design and construction of the building.

Moving dirt

Weaver said Nine Degrees Architecture and Design Inc. will design the building. It will consist of a 1,633-square-foot warehouse and feature a walk-in freezer, walk-in cooler, and large storage shelving.

The building will in-


Lunsford seeks new trial

Former Las Cruces Police Officer Brad Lunsford returns to court on March 21 for a review of a motion filed by his lawyer for a new trial.

Lunsford was found guilty last month of voluntary manslaughter with a firearm enhancement for the death of Presley Eze.

Lunsford's new attorney, Matthew Chandler, filed a motion for a new trial, arguing that two jurors were substituted on the last day of the trial out of order. Chandler argues in court filings that this violated Lunsford's due process rights. Chandler has also filed additional motions for a request for a new trial based on the fact that Eze's toxicology

report was excluded from trial and that a juror's alleged bias against police was not revealed during jury selection. Chandler has also asked that Lunsford be released from prison while he awaits sentencing.

"We believe he is enti-

tled to release pending the motion for new trial and appeal, just like any other citizen," Chandler told the Bulletin.

Eze died in 2022 when Lunsford and another officer responded to a call about Eze allegedly stealing a can of beer from a gas station in the 2600 block of S. Valley Drive. An altercation ensued during which Eze reportedly mounted the other officer, knocked his head into the pavement, put him into a chokehold and drew his Taser gun. Lunsford, who was on top of Eze in the altercation. shot Eze at point-blank range. Eze died on the scene.

New Mexico Department of Justice did not respond to a request for comment.


Fugitive arrested in El Paso

El Paso Police captured a man wanted in connection with the murder of a Las Cruces Sonic employee on March 5.

Officers encountered Luciano Roman Valente Frias in the 9400 block of Alameda in El Paso. Police said Frias brandished a weapon, shots were fired and Frias fled but was apprehended. He was wounded and taken to the hospital.

Las Cruces police were looking for Frias, who was believed to be responsible



for a fatal shooting Tuesday evening at the Sonic Drive-In in the 3400 block of Foothills Road.

Las Cruces police and fire departments responded to a call at about 9:40 p.m. on March 4 due to a report of shots fired. Police say they found Benjamin Hernandez, 20, an employee of the restaurant, suffering from at least one gunshot wound.

Police say Hernandez was pronounced dead on the scene.

Police say they learned Hernandez and Frias, also an employee of the restaurant, got into an argument inside the restaurant. Frias allegedly produced a handgun and discharged at least one round, striking Hernandez.

Frias fled from the restaurant on foot, according to police.

NM lawmakers consider bill for 'open primaries' in future elections

To cast a primary election ballot in New Mexico, voters must declare a political party. But that could change if lawmakers pass Senate Bill 16 this month to adopt open primaries.

Supporters say New Mexico's electorate has changed, with 40% of those between the ages of 18 and 24 choosing not to affiliate with a party.

The state does allow

same-day registration, but Sila Avcil - the executive director of the group New Mexico Open Elections - said that still means more paperwork and time is needed to vote in a primary for those who choose not to register with a political party.

"Under this bill," said Avcil, "what would happen is - if I'm a registered independent - I would just show up and say, 'I'm an Independent, here's verifying my registration, and today I would like to vote Senate Republican Electoral College

as a Democrat or a Republican or a Libertarian."

She said the bill would prohibit voters from participating in more than

one party primary.

Critics of open primaries worry voters could affiliate with one party over another to influence that party's nomination, by choosing a candidate they feel would be easier to defeat in a general election.

Research shows the percentage of independent voters in New Mexico is growing.

From 2000 to 2022, Democratic registration declined from 52% of the electorate to 44%. At the same time, the state's Republican registration declined from 33-percent to 31-percent.

Avoil said the trend suggests a change would be helpful.

"I think this is the right time," said Avcil, "because we constantly are seeing every year an increase in independent registration - particularly by young people. They're registering more and more as independent."

New Mexico is one of just 10 states with closed primaries. Avoil noted that this is the 10th year the bill has been introduced in the Legislature, but she said she believes there is more support this time around.

clude an 800-square-foot office space, including an intake room, lobby and restrooms. The facility will include a covered drive-up lane for food pick-up.

"We are hoping to have the warehouse open for distribution by the end of January 2026; the entire facility will be open by February 2026," Weaver said.

Alba said dirt removal was expected to start by the end of February. He said they now need to focus on supplying food to the facility once it's up and running.

"I don't think we need to go after any more capital outlay. I think what we need to go after is to just bring more food," Alba said. "Our intention is to go to Rep. Sarah Silva and ask for some assistance with that and ask other

representatives in the proximity if they can help find some additional food for the southern part of the county, which in essence is the poorest part of the county."

Alba added that the Roadrunner Food Bank of New Mexico is a food bank partner, meaning they will help supply the food available at the food pantry.

"We know what the need is there, and we want to supply that," Alba said.

Alba and Madrid agreed that Chaparral is a growing community, and this is a small step in the right direction to help families in poverty.

Chaparral's population totaled about 16,500 in the 2020 U.S. Census. However, Madrid believes the population is much larger than the official numbers.

The growth of El Paso is creeping north toward the New Mexico state line, and many people who work in that city are looking for homes in Chaparral and other southern Doña Ana County communities.

Madrid, who left office in January after losing a re-election bid in last year's primary election, has said because of the continued growth from El Paso and within Chaparral, he hopes lawmakers from both Doña Ana and Otero will continue supporting infrastructure like more food pantries.

Congressman says pantries 'critical' in NM

U.S. Congressman Gabe Vasquez, whose second congressional district covers much of Southern New Mexico, has been a proponent of food security infrastructure in New Mexico. The Democrat secured \$300,000 for the renovation of a food pantry in Hatch, and he attended the groundbreaking for the Chaparral food pantry in October.

"We are thrilled that Casa de Peregrinos is serving Southern New Mexico through its efforts in Chaparral and Hatch — communities located at the southern and north-

ern ends of Doña Ana County," Vasquez said. "The vastness of our state and the scarcity of food pantries make this work even more critical."

Food bank officials saw an increase in the numbers of people able to get assistance within weeks of opening the permanent Hatch pantry, something they attribute to the added infrastructure.

Vasquez said he wants families to have access to the resources they need.

"I believe it's essential for all community leaders to experience this collaboration in action — it's a model of resilience and compassion that strengthens our region as a whole," he said.

Vasquez and Madrid hope that Chaparral residents will accept any help with open arms.

Madrid said he has donated and given out resources at past food drives where families, mostly elderly, were appreciative of the food.

Vasquez agreed.

"I understand that accepting help can be difficult, especially for those who've spent their lives being self-reliant, but seeking support is a sign

of strength, not weakness," he said. "These resources are here because you've earned them, and by embracing them, you continue to contribute your invaluable wisdom and presence to our community."

Vasquez added that Chaparral does not only face the challenge of food scarcity, but it also faces challenges accessing resources when they are available.

In addition, Vasquez added that seniors bear a large burden of food insecurity.

He noted a study titled "Spotlight on Senior Health: Adverse Health Outcomes of Food Insecure Older Americans" highlights the risk of chronic health conditions among food-insecure individuals that are seniors.

"Hunger and limited access to nutritious food deeply affect their quality of life and overall wellbeing," Vasquez added.

Gila National Forest loses workers to Trump firings

Conservation advocates say the Trump administration's firing of probationary U.S. Forest Service workers in New Mexico and other Western states could ruin summer vacations - and even prove lifethreatening.

The Forest Service has not commented, but Gila National Forest workers told the Silver City Daily Press that at least 13 employees of the trails and recreation crew lost their jobs.

Aaron Weiss, deputy director with the Center for Western Priorities, said those employees terminated are people we've come to depend on.

"They're the ones leading the tours, they're the one answering questions in the visitor center, they're the ones cleaning trails," said Weiss. "So in some cases here, you're talking literally about the folks who make sure you have a

safe, sanitary, clean family vacation."

A former employee told the Daily Press that the firings affected the forest's "13/13" crew - permanent seasonal employees who work six months a year.

The firings are part of a massive federal workforce reduction by Donald Trump and Elon Musk, head of the newly-formed advisory group - the Department of Government Efficiency, or DOGE.

The Gila National Forest and Gila Wilderness encompass some 600,000 acres and draw thousands of tourists each year.
They've also been the site of recent fires, which

Weiss said worried him.

"February is prime season for hiring wildland fire-fighters for the upcoming fire season, and for doing controlled burns and wild-fire prevention work," said Weiss. "If you're not doing those controlled burns now, you are leaving more fuel on the ground that will burn this summer."

New Mexico's Democratic congressional delegation released information showing the state has about 2,200 federal employees in probationary periods in the Forest Service, Veterans Health Administration, Bureau of Land Management, and the FBI.

feasible.

"There are many goals associated with this. Realize isn't going to, overnight, make the city more walkable. We're trying to encourage new development, enable developers to be more creative. It's applicable across all areas

of the city but it's not as though we can retrofit walkability in all areas," he said.

Mandy Leatherwood Gus, the city's communications director, said the city developed Realize Las Cruces over the course of four years, with many stakeholder meetings, work sessions and considerable public input. She said the plan was driven by the home builder community.

Faivre said another goal of Realize Las Cruces was to ease parking requirements in the urban core. He said developers could repurpose some parking lots.

"It's going to be very beneficial for the city," Faivre said.

High risk to state in taking a stand

The Legislature's Finance Committee does a thorough analysis of every bill, including their best estimate as to how much money it will cost or save the state. But some bills are hard to put a price tag

House Bill 9, the Immigrant Safety Act cosponsored by Rep. Angelica Rubio, D-Las Cruces, won't have a direct cost to the state. But the indirect costs could be enormous.

The bill would prohibit all government entities in the state from entering into agreements with the federal government for facilities to detain immigrants, and would require those with existing agreements to terminate them as soon as possible.

The bill passed the House on a 35-25 vote and now moves to the Senate, where similar legislation

has passed its first commit-construction of a border

tee and is now awaiting consideration in the Judiciary Committee.

The LFC report notes that the bill would likely spark lawsuits from conservative communities as one

potential indirect expense. But the greater danger is the risk of retaliation from the federal government. Our state has received approximately \$6.5 billion in federal funding since 2021, and it is unknown how much of that is tied to compliance with federal immigration law, the report said.

This isn't the first time the state has tried to thwart the ambitions of President Donald Trump. The Legislature worked for four years during Trump's first presidency to block

wall, with some success and little apparent retaliation. But this time feels different. During a recent House committee hearing, Chairman James Comer

said local governments that refuse to cooperate on immigration, "should not receive a penny of federal funding."

Maybe that shouldn't matter. With a proposed \$33.1 billion budget under consideration, the state has never been in a better position financially to take a stand like this one. All residents of New Mexico have rights. If those rights are being violated, the state should do what it can to protect them.

There will be a mass deportation carried out

in the coming weeks and months. That's what the voters have demanded. The initial focus may be on immigrants with criminal records, but once the sweeps begin many others will also be rounded up and forced to leave the country.

We can't stop that. But we should try to ensure that arrests and detentions in the state are lawful and humane.

ACLU attorney Max Brooks notes that there have been three deaths in our state's ICE facilities since 2022. A 2021 inspection of the ICE facility in **Torrance County found** chronic understaffing, leading to unsafe and unsanitary living conditions that included clogged toilets filled with human waste.

The bill specifically states that it would not prevent law enforcement

from detaining individuals for investigation of other crimes. But it would undoubtedly increase conflicts between local and federal law enforcement agencies, not to mention in-state conflicts between conservative and progressive sheriff's departments.

It will be a four-year struggle. When it's over, there may be fewer undocumented immigrants living in the United States. but the problem won't be solved. That would require a plan that is consistently carried out from one administration to the next through an act of Congress. And, they would rather fight over the problem than fix it.

If it must be a fight, we should be on the right side.

our local heroes is facing a more nefarious fight, one in which the New Mexico Attornev General has taken up for purely politic reasons, to cement his own legacy.

The officer, an Army veteran who served

our country then and now. has been with LCPD since 2014. In 2022, he shot and killed a suspect who had stolen a beer from a local convenience store. But the plot thickens. The suspect did not cooperate with police then chose to fight the officers, slamming one into the pavement so hard that he was diagnosed with a concussion. The suspect reached for the officer's taser. Per his training, the officer shot him.

In 2022, the local DA elected not to prosecute and the officer returned to work. But last year, the New Mexico AG pursued charges and last month, Officer Brad Lunsford was convicted of voluntary manslaughter and immediately remanded to

custody pending sentencing on April 4th.

New details have emerged in Officer Lunsford's trial. First, the suspect's toxicology was excluded from trial, including that he was high on methamphetamines and amphetamines. Second, that Officer Lunsford's training taught him to respond to a suspect in exactly the manner he did was also excluded. Third, two jurors, that the defense had vetted and approved, were removed and replaced just before the trial began. Recall, our Constitution requires a fair trial, including an impartial jury. This notion has been obliterated by the final, latest finding, that Juror #8 failed to disclose that they are a

member of an anti-police group, had commented on and re-shared anti-police propaganda on social media, and had even participated in anti-police protests and podcasts. This person eventually became the jury foreperson, driving deliberations that would eventually lead to Officer Lunsford's conviction.

The clear issues highlighted above have

denigrated any future discussions regarding officer-involved shootings. Bad ones inevitably occur. But this isn't one of them and it brings into question whether inherent bias exists in the prosecutor of every other case going forward.

And if you wish to debate the decision that a dedicated officer made in a split second when his and his fellow officer's lives were threatened, fine, but the bottom line is that this state has weaponized the justice system to target this officer, to keep critical evidence and context out of the trial. And this has huge implications – our officers now feel that the state that they serve does not support them, or that their lives, their freedoms, their rights are somehow worth less than the criminals they give up

their lives (figuratively and literally) to keep us all safe from.

Officer Lunsford's next hearing is on March 21st at 10:30 a.m. in District Court. Here, the judge will determine whether there are grounds for a retrial and/or whether the officer can spend two weeks with his wife and two young sons prior to his sentencing, where he faces nine years in prison.

Artist's Workshop Week returns

Are vou an artist looking to learn a new technique? Or are you an art lover who would love to try your hand at the creative life? If you've been waiting for the opportunity to learn a new craft from a professional, get ready to exercise your inner artist, as the Ten O'Clock Club kicks off its second annual Artist's Workshop Week on Saturday, March 15 and runs through Sunday, March

The brainchild of local printmaker Gabriele Teich, Artist Workshop Week is a way to try a new hobby or discipline without having to set aside weeks or even months of classes, not to mention buying all the art supplies you might need for those classes. Offering workshops throughout the week and over two week-

ends, the event is a loosely facilitated series of handson seminars running from two to five hours, given by local artists who make a living at their crafts.

"I came up with the idea interested in what they because I was in Australia with friends, and we drove through the small town of Bellingen," said Teich. "It was super busy, and the restaurants were full, but it's this tiny town like the size of Mesilla and I asked, what's going on here? My friend told me that it was the end of workshop week, and I wanted to know more. We talked about it, and I thought, what a great idea! We should do this in Las Cruces!"

Do it she did, with last year's premiere of the event drawing 13 local artists to teach over 50 participants. Organizing the event with her co-founder, local painter Margaret Bernstein, Teich is very pleased with the reception the event received.

"Most artists I know do teach workshops here and there, whenever they feel like it, or whenever they have a group of people do," she said. "This is a way to bring them all together. The workshops are all concise, you can take as many throughout the week as you want, and just experience different kinds of art. They're all hands on and each person who attends will go home with a finished product that they have created themselves."

This year's lineup includes 33 artists, who open their doors to studios and workspaces. teaching everything from painting, sculpture, textiles and gourds to music, dance, and words. To sign up, attendees are invited to visit Teich's personal website at GabrieleTeich. com and toggle the Workshop Weekend pulldown

at the top of the home page.

"It's everything anybody needs to take part," Teich said. "There's a calendar with all of the workshops and the times, there are descriptions of each class with small artist bios, and finally there is contact info. Interested parties can then contact the artist they want to take the class from directly and make their plans that way."

This removes the middleman from the equation, she said. This way, it's up to the artists to decide how many students they will take on, the times and the cost per workshop. Some will obviously be more expensive than others, based on the kind of materials used, but that is all included in the price.

"I personally really like this format for the workshops," Teich said. "In two to five hours, you get to know a little

bit about a new hobby or discipline that interests you. You don't have to spend a lot of money

buying art supplies that you might not even use.



Tori Crichton: 24-year-old rocket scientist

ori Crichton only graduated from New Mexico State University a few years ago but already she's a rocket scientist working in the aerospace industry.

"A big thing that helped me to get to where I am is NMSU and Atomic Aggies," said Tori (Hoffman) Crichton. The 24-year-old is a Las Cruces native and a Mayfield High School and New Mexico State graduate who is now a propulsion engineer with Virgin Galactic at Spaceport America north of Las Cruces.

As part of Atomic Aggies, NMSU's collegiate rocketry team, Crichton got hands-on experience designing, building and testing high-powered rockets in the annual Spaceport America Cup competition. Her team finished eighth in the finals among 150 national and international teams in the 2021-22 competition. And, the Atomic Aggies won the Chile Cup in both her junior and senior years, as NMSU finished with a higher overall score than regional rivals the University of New Mexico, New Mexico Tech and the University of Texas at El Paso.

"You really learn to build, launch and recover rockets" and gain leadership experience in the competition, said Crichton, who is the daughter of Kiel Hoffman and Darby Sanchez.

Crichton graduated from NMSU in 2023
with two degrees – one in aerospace engineering and one in mechanical engineering. She had job offers in many states, but only one in Las Cruces: Virgin Galactic, "the

first commercial spaceline for Earth,

pioneering

human spaceflight for private individuals, researchers and professional astronauts," according to

the Virgin Galactic website.

"Ultimately, I chose to stay here," Crichton said. She and her husband, Remington Crichton (they were married in 2023), have bought a house in Las Cruces, which Tori said is a "great little town to raise a family in one day."

While Atomic Aggies ignited her love for rocketry, Crichton said her

"love for rockets and space started when I was a little kid." Her parents took Tori and her sister, Sidney, to the New Mexico Museum of Space History in Alamogordo, where they got to build and launch small rockets.

"I thought that was the coolest thing ever," she said.

Crichton is a propulsion operations team lead at Galactic, working on rocket motors and engines – "everything that propels," she said. Working for Galactic "has been an awesome experience."

Watching people step off the spacecraft after a Virgin Galactic flight and "getting to share their testimony makes your work feel rewarding,"

she said. "It's just really exciting. I just love to do what I do. I love to put a smile on people's faces and see their dreams come true."

Along with all the other Galactic employees, Crichton gets to sign her name on the rocket motor she has worked on before the spaceship goes up.


When she talks to young students about engineering and rocketry, "it's not gender specific," Crichton said. "I just kind of think, I can do it too, so who cares."

Galactic has offices in Las Cruces and at Spaceport America, which is located in the Jornada del Muerto desert basin about 45 miles north of Las Cruces and 20 miles southeast of Truth or Consequences.

Getting to live and work in Las Cruces "is a blessing," Crichton said. "Both our families live here."

Crichton said her family has "always been my biggest cheerleaders. When I wanted to work on a dualdegree program, they never had a doubt that I'd be able to do it," she said. "They supplied me with everything I needed. I couldn't have done it without them."

HER story Cas Cruces Crystal Diamond Brantley: Making a difference

n the 2020 general election, Crystal Diamond Brantley won New Mexico State Senate District 35, which includes all or part of seven New Mexico counties. A resident of Elephant Butte, she is the first woman and the first Republican ever to hold the seat. Brantley was re-elected without primary or general-election opposition in 2024, even though the district had been substantially redrawn following the 2020 census.

Brantley said she represents all voters in the huge district that includes all or part of Catron, Doña Ana, Grant, Hidalgo, Luna, Sierra and Socorro counties.

"I consider myself, and certainly vote, as a moderate Republican," said Brantley, who is a New Mexico State University graduate and a former member of the Truth or Consequences Board of Education.

Her effectiveness in the state Senate "has been more than anything about relationships," she said. That includes friendships with senators across the aisle like moderate Democrat Joseph Cervantes of Las Cruces and progressive Democrats like Mimi Stewart of Albuquerque, who, as Senate president pro tempore, appointed Brantley as ranking Republican on the Senate Judiciary Committee, which Cervantes chairs.

"She and I never vote the same." Brantley said about Stewart. "Politically, we are very different. But there is a level of respect between us," she said, and that was part of the reason Brantlev got the appointment as ranking member on Judiciary.

Serving in that leadership role is "arguably the most important and effective" assignment Brantley could have in the Senate, she said, because Judiciary deals with the vital issue of public safety.

In Santa Fe and throughout her district, being successful as an elected official is also "a matter of listening to the constituents." Brantley said. She and other Republicans who have won

legislative seats in traditionally Democratic areas in southwest New Mexico "often do not vote straight party," she said. "We carry the votes of our constituents. That goes back and forth across party lines."

Brantley said her motivation for running for the state Senate and for continuing to serve is her two daughters.

"They are my reason for going to Santa Fe and the reason I can't wait to leave Santa Fe," she said. "I ran for office to show them as women we really can make a difference."

Both girls have taken leadership roles in student government and FFA in T or C public schools. Brantley said. And, since she married Carlsbad farmer and rancher Tom Brantley in 2023, their family has expanded to five girls.

"We're all kind of in this together," Brantley said.

Although uncertain if 2026 will be the right time to consider a run for governor, "I don't think the state Senate is where I'll end," Brantley said. But "for this session especially, I am extremely effective. Right now, I need to be here and do my best work for the district and the state. I'm in an important position where I can influence a lot of policy."

She supports a criminal competency and treatment bill that passed both chambers and has been signed by the governor. The bill is a top priority for law enforcement, Brantley said,"


Addressing failures in the state Children, Youth and Families Department is "a moral calling as a legislator

and a mother," she said. "We have to do something to fix this agency. If we're not willing to help our most vulnerable children.



what more can we do as a state?" Brantley has introduced Senate Bill 11, Anti-Distraction Policy in Schools, which she said would encourage schools to adopt policies to provide "specialized storage equipment" -Brantley called them "lock bags" - to lock up phones during classes so they aren't a distraction to student learning.

"It's an honor to serve Senate District 35," Brantley said. "My most important work is as a mother and a wife. I bring values to build a stronger family for myself and others."

CTS of the Heart: The Remarkable Story of Live Entertainment's Mother Hubbard" is the title of a new book about Las Cruces and New Mexico State University legend Barbara Hubbard, who retired for the second time in 1998 as director of NMSU's Pan American Center after decades of bringing some of the biggest names in the entertainment industry to perform in Las Cruces.

A native of Benton, Arkansas, Hubbard came to Las Cruces in 1954 – she was Barbara Johnson in those days, marrying Peirce Hubbard (1931-2006) in 1959 - to become a teacher at Las Cruces High School. She joined NMSU in 1966, first in the athletics department and then as the first ever director of special events and director of the Pan American Center, From 1967-1987, Hubbard ran the facility with just a secretary, a custodian, a box office manager and NMSU student volunteers.

"I'm proud of that," Hubbard said, sitting on a couch at Hubbard's Music, the Las Cruces music store owned by her son, Dru Hubbard.

And, as the book title reflects, she's also proud of the American Collegiate Talent Showcase (ACTS) scholarship campaign she created more than 50 years ago to help students at NMSU and across the country break into the entertainment industry and get an education.

Hubbard is still booking top-level entertainment at venues across the country and continues to work tirelessly for ACTS. She is planning a fundraiser to bring the ACTS endowment to the \$1 million mark, hopefully around her 98th birthday in July, or later this summer.

"I'm working on it," Hubbard said. "I'm optimistic. Don't tell me I can't do anything."

Friends of Barbara agree.

"Barbara Hubbard is still out there at almost 98 years old pursuing her dream and her passion every day," said Marci Dickerson. "She basically started an industry of concerts and entertainment and led the way for women's participation in that industry. She just did it, and she created more opportunities for those of us who came later."

"I have sat across from Barbara Hubbard at St. Paul's United Methodist Church for 45 years and I have watched how her spiritual strength has allowed her to help so many young musicians," said Heather Pollard.

"Barbara Hubbard is the most amazing lady in the entertainment world," said Wanda Bowman, "She went into the entertainment business when it was all men. She's never given up. I work to keep up with her – she's still working the crowd for music groups."


Hubbard continues to assist NMSU School of Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Management Director Jean Hertzman, Ph.D., by teaching a class at the university called entertainment business and venue management.


Hubbard has received many honors over the last 50-plus years, including Pollstar Magazine's firstever lifetime achievement award (she is also featured in the March 2025 issue of Pollstar), Billboard magazine's Golden Circle Award and Venue Today magazine's first Women of Influence Award. She received NMSU's third-ever Presidential Medallion in 2017, along with the NMSU Distinguished Alumni Award. The NMSU College of Arts and Sciences gave her a lifetime achievement award in 2023. Hubbard also received NMSU's James F. Cole Memorial Award for service, and the 2023 award for Women in American History from the Daughters of the American Revolution.

The performers Hubbard brought

to Las Cruces include Paul McCartney, Bill Cosby, Bob Hope, Taylor Swift, George Strait, Reba McEntire, ventriloquist Jeff Dunham (an ACTS student in 1983), The Eagles, Guns N' Roses, Kenny Rogers, George Burns, Johnny Cash, James Taylor, Mac Davis, Merle Haggard, Alan Jackson, John Denver, Randy Travis, Linda Ronstadt, Tom T. Hall, the Bolshoi Ballet, Olivia Newton John, Neil Diamond, Fleetwood Mac, KISS. Ike and Tina Turner. Garth Brooks, Charlie Pride and many more.


"People have been good to me," Hubbard said. "I like people. I love my students. That's what keeps me still here."

The American Southwest Theatre Company is doing what Tony Awardwinner Mark Medoff and Dr. Bruce Streett created the nonprofit to do more than 40 years ago: Raise money to benefit the students of the New Mexico State University Theatre Department.

Proceeds from the event "support NMSU theatre students and the productions which provide them with practical experience toward their career goals," said Theatre Department Head Wil Kilroy.

One example of how ASTC has helped NMSU theatre students in the past was through helping to pay for the live orchestra that accompanied performers in last year's sold-out production of "The Addams Family" at NMSU. ASTC also pay for guest artists who visit NMSU theatre, including professional actors and stage crew and a renowned intimacy coor-

dinator. ASTC supports the Theatre Department's High Desert New Plan Development Workshop.

"At ASTC, we all have one goal: to support NMSU theatre students," Welsh said. "ASTC exists to enhance the educational experience of our students!"

The event will include line-dancing lessons, a silent auction with more than 60 items, a buffet dinner, a disc jockey and freestyle dancing.

Denise McElroy, an instructor at Michelle's Dance Academy, will teach simple line-dancing lessons during the evening, ASTC Board member Julia Brogan said. McElroy has been teaching line dancing for 15 years and has been a dancer since age 7. She now focuses exclusively on line-dancing and is great at coaxing even the inexperienced or dance-shy to limber up.

"I've taken line-dance lessons from Denise McEl-roy since 2022," Brogan said. "I started as a beginner with no knowledge of line dancing and really enjoyed it! A friend of mine met Denise and said, 'I have two left feet; I can't dance.' Denise told her, 'Yes, you can.' That's how Denise approaches line

dancing."

The DJ for Boots and Bling is digital creator Fred Ramirez, the owner of Sight and Sound Entertainment in Las Cruces.

"We will be playing a variety of music from country, Spanish, swing oldies, '80s and '90s to current top 40," Ramirez said.

The catering will be provided by caterer Marci Dickerson and will feature smoked beef tri tip and green chile mashed potatoes.

"We will be embracing our inner cowboy at this great event," said Dickerson. The meal will include a vegetarian/vegan option. There will also be a cash bar.

The silent auction has more than 60 items donated by local business owners and artists, said long-time ASTC Board President Denise Welsh. Items include a Nambe bowl, a wooden and silver chip and dip platter and a Turkish glass serving platter; a signed Navajo pot, a signed storyteller vase from Acoma Pueblo and sand paintings: chile sauces from a local producer; wine and gift baskets; hand-knitted

Afghans and scarves: a southwestern quilt; pet gift baskets, pet boarding and pet grooming; silver and turquoise jewelry; a leather jacket, a sequin iacket and other items of clothing; a steakhouse gift certificate: hair care: service from a local tire franchise; and a leather love seat. It also includes a four-course Italian meal for up to 20 people prepared by members of the ASTC Board.

Indira Devi, a Theatre Department work-study student and actor, office aide, theatre house manager and back-stage crew member, told the Bulletin that ASTC has helped her.

"One of the absolute biggest ways ASTC has helped me was through their student funds request form," said Indira Devi.

"I've been fully financially independent for years now and I'm putting myself through college getting two degrees, so when I was worried I wouldn't be able to secure housing because of [a request] form cost, it was so amazing that I was able to contact ASTC for help," Devi said. "Denise (Welsh) has also personally reached out to me since then, making sure I'm okay and that I have all the support that I need to continue getting through college."

The Monkey - 2025, Horror, Rated R

Some film adaptations of Stephen King's novels, such as "The Shining" and "Christine," are masterful, truly terrifying studies in horror, while others feel like they're adapted from a gore-obsessed, wise-ass eighth grader's creative writing project. Unfortunately, Osgood Perkin's "The Monkey" falls into the latter category.

Loosely based on the classic horror tale "The Monkey's Paw," two brothers (Christian Convery and Colin 'O Brien) and their single mother



(Tatiana Maslany) living in a small Maine town gradually become enmeshed in a mysterious death spree when they're given one of those terrifying goggle-eyed, drumclapping wind-up monkey toys.

Babysitters, realtors, no one is left unscathed. If only any of the victims had any discernibly interesting qualities, or their mourning treated with anything other than

lazy slapstick, the film wouldn't have you constantly checking the time on your phone. While "Lord of The Rings" Elijah Wood makes a briefly funny turn as a marriage counselor to one of the now-grown brothers (Theo James), and the soundtrack has some great Rock 'N Roll nuggets courtesy the likes of Little Richard and Clyde McPhatter, you're better off rewatching the "It"



series and not feeding this monkey at all.

Last Breath - 2025, Thriller, Rated Pg-13

When young Scottish undersea pipeline repairman Chris (a strangely Heath Ledgerish Finn Cole) tells his fiancée everything will be fine at the beginning of Alex Parkinson's "Last Breath," you know everything will be going completely to hell in a half hour or so, a la other true life marine adventures like "The Perfect

Storm" and "Deepwater Horizon."

Sure enough, he's sent along with a soon-to-be retired Duncan (a 'taking a break from his cannabis stash to wander onto set' Woody Harrelson) and Dave ("Shang-Chi"s Simu Liu) a thousand feet below sea level for a twenty-eight day stint to repair a broken gas pipeline in a capsule the size of one of those tiny electric cars. Before long. breathing tubes become ensnared, storm systems make easy retrieval of

the men impossible, and people with various accents above and below the ocean must pull together to bring them back before they run out of oxygen.

Evoking the terror of man vs. the impenetrable underwater darkness of films like "The Abyss" and even the early-on explorations of the doomed Nostromo crew in the original "Alien," "Last Breath" doesn't really offer anything new to the genre, but it is a perfect diversion for land, sea or air.



Las Cruces group talk about challenges women face

The League of Women Voters of Southern New Mexico celebrated International Women's Day with a panel of experts last weekend who have played a pivotal role in shaping women's studies and rights both nationally and locally.

Reflecting this year's theme, the panel featured educators from different generations: Judy Long, founder of the first women's studies program in the U.S. at Cornell University in 1972; Patti Wojahn, the former head of the interdisciplinary studies department at New Mexico State University; and Laura Anh Williams, the current head of gender and sexuality studies at NMSU.

Held at Doña Ana Community College Workforce Center, the event was themed "Moving Forward Together! Women Educating and Inspiring Generations." It coincided with a global recognition of International Women's Day and the 30th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, a U.N. agenda to achieve gender equality.

The League of Women Voters, which organized the event, emerged from the suffrage movement, forming just months before the 19th amendment granted white women the right to vote in 1920. Various racial barriers prevented many women of color from voting until decades later.

Nearly 50 years after the 19th amendment's passage, the League of Women Voters established a southern New Mexico branch in Las Cruces. Along with boosting voter education, registration and participation,

members engage in community-driven activities.

Southern New Mexico.

The panelists discussed how far women have come, the setbacks they currently face and the work yet to be accomplished.

Unlike Long, the other panelists discovered women's studies late in their education. Wojahn, who grew up in a small, rural town in Minnesota, said her first women's studies course opened her eyes to the hidden contributions women have made.

"If you start to educate yourself in a particular field and your first discovery is there haven't been any women wrong." Long said. "These women have always been there before us."





League member Elisa Sánchez highlighted the importance of recognizing all women as historical contributors, especially in a state like New Mexico with a dominant Hispanic and Latino population.

In the audience of mostly older white women, sat a few Black women, Girl Scouts and even men. As the conversation shifted to current challenges women face, the League emphasized its commitment to justice, equity, diversity and inclusion, a direct opposition to recent policy changes under President Donald Trump's administra-

tion.

In his March 4 joint address to Congress, Trump announced the abolition of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) policies across the federal government saying, "Our country will be 'woke' no longer." Taking it a step further, he also proposed banning words such as "accessible," "transgender," and "women."

The panelists found these governmental actions regressive and hugely discouraging.

"I'm of an age now where I'm very pessimistic about the future of women's rights in our country," Long said. "I wish I were 10 years older and I can die and forget the whole thing."

She said future heavy-lifting will likely be done at the local level to "help strengthen democracy or protect it at least."

Williams cultivates empowerment in the next generation by teaching zine classes, showing girls they can be "makers, not just consumers." Unlike Long, she adopted an optimistic stance.

"These policies and lists of banned words are so absurd to me, I just can't believe this is our world," Williams said. "As long as I refuse to believe it, I'm absolutely not going to go along with it."

She encouraged the audience to do the same, resulting in resounding applause, including from 14-year-old Carmen Resendez.

For younger attendees like Resendez, the gathering was a source of motivation.

"The pessimistic mindset sets us back," she said. "I think we all should have a little bit of hope to be able to move forward."

The League hopes to attract new members and continue to evolve with the times. They encourage anyone 16 and older to apply for a membership anytime during the year for an annual fee.

"Never in my wildest imagination did I think that this country would lose what it had, but we're in the process of doing that," Sánchez said. "It's necessary, and it's actually an opportunity, for a lot of people that never considered themselves political to get involved."

Domination Continues As NM State Topples UNM

There's no place like home. After last playing in Las Cruces in Februarv. New Mexico State returned to the New Mexico State Softball Complex to play host to rival University of New Mexico. With the Crimson & White controlling the series of late. Tuesday night proved no different as they won their 20th game in the past 23 installments of the Battle of I-25. Back-to-back three-

run innings to start the night secured a lead the Aggies would never relinquish in a 6-2 victory. The win vaulted New Mexico State to 15-11 overall and 2-1 in CUSA play. University of New Mexico fell to 14-12-1 on the season.

How It Happened

The Lobos put themselves on the scoreboard first in the opening frame of Tuesday night's contest with a two-run double to left field. Starting pitcher Desirae Spearman escaped the inning after a

diving play by first baseman Kristiana Watson brought the Aggie bats up facing a 2-0 deficit.

New Mexico State answered quickly after

Faith Aragon and Desirae Spearman opened the night with a pair of walks. With two teammates on base, former Lobo Lauren Garcia stepped up to the plate. The first-year Aggie built up a full count before launching a double



over the right fielder's head and off the outfield wall. The knock scored both Aragon and Watson. tying the affair at 2-2. Kendal Lunar matched

Garcia with a double of her own on the next at-bat, scoring a pinch-running Payton Nicholson run to make it 3-2 for the home

After starting the second inning with a strikeout, Desirae Spearman was relieved by fellow sophomore Faith Aragon. The UTEP transfer retired the first two batters she faced before recording a single in the bottom half of inning two. Two pitches later, Spearman crushed a double to center field that placed her and Aragon in scoring position. Kristiana which University of New Watson brought them both across to score while making a trip around the bases herself as the first baseman mashed a 1-0 pitch back to center field and well over the wall for her third home run in five days. The three-run blast put her side ahead 6-2 and proved to be the last run batted in of the night.

The first two Lobos of the third inning reached via hits, but Aragon reached another level, sitting 10 of the next 11 batters she faced. In the fifth,

an error was immediately erased as the sophomore pitcher caught a line drive and rifled it over to first base for a double play to end the inning.

Meanwhile, the home offense cooled off. A pinch-hitting Bella Clapp produced the only baserunner in the Aggies' final 14 at-bats as she drew a walk with two outs in the sixth inning.

Three Lobo singles threatened to cut into the deficit in the final inning, but Aragon escaped once again, doing so with a flyout and a strikeout in which she forced three swings and as many misses. Kenzie Nicholson recorded the final out of the game as she snared a line drive to close the door on a comeback from the visitors. The lineout capped off a night in Mexico left nine runners on base, including three in the seventh frame.

Numbers of Note

- The Aggies have now won 20 of the previous 23 meetings against the Lobos, dating back to April 29, 2014.
- The Crimson & White now hold a 46-31 advantage over their rivals across all games played in Las Cruces.
- · NM State now trails the all-time series against New Mexico 75-87 in what

is the most-storied rivalry in program history.

- Since dropping five straight games from Feb. 21-28, Kathy Rodolph's bunch has claimed victory in six of their last eight outings.
- The victory boosted the Aggies to 9-4 in home games this year.
- Five Aggie hits were the fourth fewest of the vear and their lowest tally in a win.
- For the fourth time this season, zero Aggies tallied multiple hits.
- In the opening 22 games of the season, NM State allowed its opponents to score 127 runs for an average of 5.77 per contest. In the ensuing four contests, the Aggies have allowed 13 runs to the tune of 3.25 per night.
- Kristiana Watson now has three home runs in her past four outings, doing so in just five days.
- · Faith Aragon extended her hitting streak to a career-best seven games, still holding the longest active streak among all Aggies.
- · Aragon has now reached base safely in 10 straight outings, pacing the team and further extending a new career high.

The Aggies will host Jacksonville State this weekend for their CUSA home opener.



PGA tour and PIF/LIV golf seek President Trump's intervention

During the month of February there were two meetings at the White House between the PGA Tour commissioner, Jav Monahan, (with Tour representatives) and President Trump. One without Tiger Woods and with Woods; and one without and one with Yasir Al-Rumayyan, the governor of the Public Investment Fund (PIF) of Saudi Arabia, whose coffers are close to \$1 trillion. These meetings were aimed at unlocking the negotiations between the PGA Tour and the PIF, which funds the upstart LIV golf tour, and have been going on for nearly two years, since June 2023, when a "framework agreement" was made to repair the

split in professional golf. Trump had said before the 2024 election that

the 2024 election that he could bring these two parties together, solve the impasse, and get the best players in the world together at more events than simply the four major championships. But Trump is certainly not an impartial, unbiased

is certainly not an impartial, unbiased interested party in this case, observing the PGA Tour vs PIF/LIV negotiations. Since LIV golf began playing actual events in 2022 they have played several tournaments at Trump's properties, including his Doral resort in Florida. Following the second meeting with Trump,

commissioner Monahan, player representative Adam Scott and Tiger

Woods signed a statement that read: "Thanks to the leadership of President Trump, we have initiated a discussion about the reunification of golf." After all this time, the wording of "initi-

ated" seems odd. Golf writer Eamon Lynch of Golf Week and The Golf Channel opined that PIF governor Al-Rumayyan "remains determined to keep shoveling cash into the furnace of his own pridefulness," meaning LIV golf. No telling when these negotiations may end.

The buzz-word in this matter seems to be "reunification." At present, the best players on the two big tours that are eligible for Official World Golf Ranking (OGWR) points are the PGA Tour and the European Tour (now the "DP World Tour"). LIV tour players are not eligible for OWGR points mainly because LIV tournaments are only 54 holes with no cuts. So, the only time the top players from LIV and the other tours can compete is with the four majors, namely the Masters, U.S. Open, PGA Championship and the Open Championship (aka the British Open), which are not controlled by any tour. Reunification would change that.

If there is a solution to bring the PIF/LIV and the PGA Tour together, it would mean the full elimination of LIV and team golf altogether, and the golfers who glommed on to the hundreds of millions of dollars to sign with LIV, would have to qualify to get back on the PGA Tour, along with paying back most of the LIV money in order to establish some form of justice and equity for the players who did remain loyal to the PGA Tour. But, that's not going to happen. The LIV tour is a non-entity. Are you interested in tuning to a Fox channel to watch LIV no-name golfers? There are more than enough young, talented and up-and-coming play-

ers on the PGA tour, like
Jake Knapp, Nick Dunlap,
Davis Thompson and
Luke Clanton, to pique my
interest. Not to mention
Scotty Scheffler, Jordan
Spieth, Gary Woodland
and Ricky Fowler. We
have plenty of superb
PGA Tour players who
provide ample excitement
and great golfing to satisfy
my tastes. But, of course,
I'm "old school."
