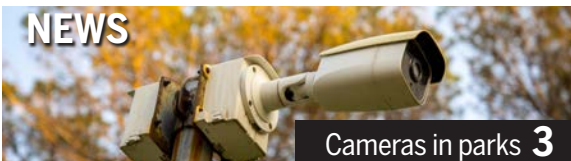

Las Cruces community recounts Young Park shooting

Zanaya Hernandez just graduated college and chose to celebrate by visiting her family in Las Cruces for the weekend. She did not expect her trip would include leaving flowers at her friend's memorial at Young Park.

Hernandez was friends with Jason Gomez, 18, who lost his life along with Andrew Madrid, 16, and Dominick Estrada, 19, on March 21, during what police are calling a gun fight between two groups during an unauthorized car show at the park.

On last Friday evening, 18 people were caught in the cross-fire of what some witnesses are calling, "a jealous fight." Three of the 18 shot have died, while 15 were transported to area hospitals.

"Some car just got done doing their tricks, and there were

other cars popping tricks as well so, at first, we heard the first two but after, we just heard shot after shot after shot. I saw my brother turn around and look at me and the look he gave me, [it was] like he pushed me to run," Hernandez said.

Hernandez said that when she heard bullets, everyone began to scramble and hide underneath vehicles.

"I wanted to get in and go but my brother was just like, run. And thankfully I listened. They shot the front tires," she said. She added, pointing at a bullet hole in her family's car, "If I would have left, I would have

been shot," Hernandez said. "I probably wouldn't be here."

Craig Theriault, a disabled and retired first responder, is a car enthusiast who visited the park on Monday. He recalled the final moments he held one of the victims in his arms Friday night. He said it all started when one car backfired, then suddenly shots began to ring out.

"I saw a young man fall and an older man fall. As soon as I ran over there, I took my shirt off immediately because I saw a bullet wound in his (the young man's) head and I reached for the back of his head, and I felt an exit wound so I knew I had to wrap him. I wrapped him really tight, and I just held him as tight as I could," he said.

Theriault said he continued to hold the victim until EMTs arrived.

"I couldn't do nothing but

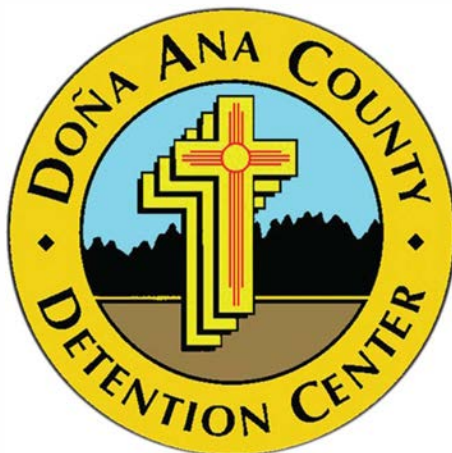

Cameras coming to city parks

Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story said during a press conference on Tuesday that cameras will be placed in city parks as part of the city's efforts to make parks more secure in the wake of the shooting death that took three lives and injured 15 on March 21.

Story held the press conference on March 25 to update the public in the aftermath of the shooting and to respond to the public outcry over police response. He said the LCPD are following up on leads for more suspects connected with the Young Park shooting but he did not give more details as it is an active investigation.

Many have blamed the police for not doing enough to keep the individuals who visited Young Park last Friday night safe. Some community members are demanding change in the wake of the shooting.

Story said one way the LCPD is responding is to place cameras at parks around Las Cruces. He said the cameras have been ordered but the man-

ufacturer won't be able to install them before May.

"This is not about politics, but it is about policy," Story said. "Police chiefs from across the state and New Mexico Association of Chiefs of Police have been screaming from the rooftops about a very serious juvenile crime problem we have in New Mexico."

He said problems range from cars being stolen to local stores being vandalized by juveniles. He said

he testified about juvenile crime before the Interim Courts, Corrections and Justice Committee when the legislators visited Las Cruces in October 2024.

"DA's across New Mexico have been sounding the alarm on juvenile crime. We have to come together to find solutions and ensure accountability for violence," Story said.

He added that he must emphasize, he does not believe in "locking up every kid that makes a mistake"

but he would love for people to look at the other end and see the positive opportunities that exist for kids.

"Tragedies like this present us with two options for our community and our state. It could bring us together and become a catalyst for meaningful change or it can tear us apart and further divide us," he said.

Story said LCPD have not been ignoring the issues coming out of Young Park. He said the police have taken necessary pre-

cautions to prevent further violent acts.

"To highlight some of the things we've done, during our operation we have included park patrol so that we went by every night before and right after to make sure nothing is going on. We had an agreement with New Mexico Mounted Patrol so they can do additional park patrol when they have time," he said.

Story added that the city had gates installed just recently so the parks can be closed. He said a park ranger program is near training completion to ad-

dress issues within the parks.

Las Cruces City Manager Ikani Taumoepeau said the police will continue to patrol the parks, but park hours will remain the same.

Story added that the gun violence among youth goes back to the parents.

"I would say first and foremost it needs to come back to the families and parents. They need to try and help us prevent that. Most of these firearms are stolen, so they're either obtaining them by stealing or selling them between each other," he said.

Legislative session ends with calls for action on gun violence

As Las Cruces residents reeled in the aftermath of a mass shooting on March 21, Republican legislators and Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham pointed fingers at Democratic lawmakers and called for a special session to address gun violence even as the regular 60-day session entered its final hours.

The Young Park shooting on March 21 took the lives of three and injured a reported 15 others. Las Cruces Police have arrested four suspects in connection with the shooting. During Lujan Grisham's post-legislative session talk, she devoted close to 30 minutes of her nearly hour-long talk to the shooting, calling it "horrific," and saying that the state stands ready to provide resources to support Las Cruces in the wake of the shooting.

"In respect to that community, we are having what can be viewed as recognizing wins and disappointments (from the legislative session). This is not the day to be doing that at the end of this 60-day session," she said.

Lujan Grisham said 270 bills on public safety and crime were introduced into the 2025 legislature but only nine of her proposals were passed and an additional 18 were passed but some of those were connected to emergency

response. She called it "shameful."

"There was not a single productive debate on reducing juvenile crime," she said.

She did not announce a date for a special session but she said she has told state lawmakers to be ready for one. She previously convened a special session to address public safety last year.

"We will do more sooner rather than later," she said.

During the press conference on Saturday, Republicans announced that they had sent a letter to Lujan Grisham requesting a special session to address public safety and healthcare.

"New Mexicans have been demanding real action to address the growing crime crisis," House Minority Whip Rep. Alan Martinez, R-Rio Rancho, said in a press conference following the session.

One Democratic senator representing Doña Ana County has come under attack. Sen. Joseph Cervantes, D-Las Cruces, is the chairman of the powerful Senate Judiciary Committee, which has a reputation in the Roundhouse of being a place bills go to die. A piece of legislation that made it through Senate Judiciary has activists upset because Cervantes broke party lines and voted against the bill.

Senate Bill 279 sought to prohibit gas-powered semiautomatic rifles and

high-capacity magazines.

The group New Mexico Students Demand Action is among the advocacy organizations that say this type of legislation is needed to address gun violence.

"I grew up in Las Cruces – I know the park, the neighborhood and some of the victims that were there – this shooting is personal," Leighanne Muñoz, a New Mexico Students Demand Action volunteer and National Organizing Board Member, said in a press release.

"Lawmakers in the Roundhouse chose to play politics with our safety – and today we have been reminded how inaction is a death sentence. My senator, Joseph Cervantes, blocked legislation to ban assault weapons and after last night, it's time he asked himself if he plans to turn a blind eye while his constituents die or if he'll actually do what he was elected to do and vote for gun safety."

SB 279 passed the Judiciary Committee on a 5-4 vote, but stalled before making it to the Senate floor.

Cervantes expressed concerns about the bill's constitutionality and said he suspected it would be challenged and overturned in the state's Supreme Court.

During the Judiciary Committee's debate on SB

Governor signs Game Commission reform bill, with a partial veto

As a father of three, Ángel Peña said wildlife and the outdoors are an important part of his life.

“We definitely spend a lot of time outdoors, whether it be camping, hunting, fishing or just taking walks,” he said.

His daughter bagged her first elk during the fall hunting season after waiting six years to score a tag.

“Since October, we haven’t been to the groceries for meat,” he said.

Thanks to the elk tag, his daughter has not only been able to provide meat for the entire family, she is also giving friends some of the meat.

Peña is also the executive director of the Las Cruces-based organization Nuestra Tierra Conservation

Project, which is among the groups that advocated for the passage of a Game Commission reform bill.

Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham partially vetoed Senate Bill 5 on Thursday.

Currently, the governor has the ability to remove members of the New Mexico Game Commission. The section of SB 5 that she vetoed would have required the State Ethics Commission to file an action in district court to remove a commissioner, and that could be appealed to the state Supreme Court.

“Given the many pressing matters addressed by district courts and the Supreme Court, it would take years to remove even the most blatantly incompetent or corrupt individuals – allowing those individuals to continue to hinder or corrupt the Commis-

sion in the interim,” Lujan Grisham wrote in her veto message.

In her message, Lujan Grisham stated that the partial veto “has nothing to do with me, as I am nearing the end of my second consecutive term in Office, and I doubt this issue will arise before I depart.”

Proponents of requiring action by the State Ethics Commission to remove a game commissioner said it would help take politics out of the equation.

Lujan Grisham signed into law the rest of SB 5, which includes changing

the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish to a wildlife department and giving it the purview to regulate a broader range of species, including insects. She also signed into law the increases in certain hunting license fees.

These increased fees—as well as other funding sources—will help the department better manage the broader array of species.

“A vision without resources is a little more than a hallucination,” Peña said.

He said his organiza-

tion in particular supports raising the costs of non-resident licenses so that New Mexicans do not “bear the full brunt of that cost.”

Peña said he also supports having the department manage a broader range of species. He said managing more species will help make the ecosystems healthier for game species such as elk.

“Taking on that broader perspective, not only helps feed the families, but also helps encourage healthy New Mexico [game] stock...that belongs to New

Mexicans,” he said.

Rep. Nathan Small, D-Las Cruces, was among the sponsors of SB 5.

“Southern New Mexico has a long, rich history of hunting and fishing, and is also blessed with a vibrant and diverse wildlife ecosystem,” he said in a statement. “The modernized wildlife management system established in Senate Bill 5 will help us protect both, while also supporting our growing outdoor recreation industry and preserving our natural heritage for future generations to enjoy.”

Firefighters put out four fires in 16-hour period

Las Cruces firefighters extinguished three structure fires and a brush fire during a 16-hour period beginning Wednesday, March 19.

Firefighters were dispatched to the report of a commercial structure fire on the 1700 block of north Valley Drive on at about 1:20 p.m. Wednesday, March 19. Crews encountered heavy smoke coming from the building and quickly determined the fire was in the attic. Firefighters located the source of the fire and contained it to a small section of the building.

The fire was brought under control with 20 minutes.

Later that same afternoon, shortly after 5 p.m.



firefighters were dispatched to a residential structure fire on the 1900 block of Coleen Avenue. Crews arrived to find a storage shed and other items on fire in the backyard of the residence. The fire was contained within minutes.

Also on Wednesday, shortly after 7 p.m., fire personnel were called to

a brush fire in the area near Elks Drive and Desert Bloom Drive. Elks Drive had to be temporarily closed for about an hour as crews stopped the fire from spreading to two nearby homes.

In the early hours of the next morning, fire crews were dispatched to a residential structure fire at 4:50 a.m. Thursday,

March 20, in the 1500 block of north Mesquite Street. Firefighters initiated fire suppression efforts and had the blaze contained to one room in about five minutes.

Fire investigators continue working to determine what started all four fires. Damage estimates on the three structure fires has yet to be determined.

Water Line Maintenance service to customers

If you think you have a water leak in an underground line that runs inside your home or business or on your property, the best thing to do is call the City of Las Cruces Utilities Emergency Dispatch phone number at 575-526-0500.

“That’s always the best way,” said Las Cruces Utilities (Utilities) Water Line Maintenance (WLM) Supervisor, John Phillip “JP” Flores, who has been with the City for 18 years, including the last five years with Utilities. “It’s a service we provide to our customers.”

WLM’s staff are on call 24-7/365 to deal with waterline emergencies, Flores said.

Sometimes, waterline leaks are obvious – a large wet area in your

home that wasn’t caused by a spill or some other source you can’t identify, or excess water in your yard that isn’t coming from a hose that you could turn off. If you see a large spike in your water bill, or Utility-Hawk shows continuous water consumption, that could also indicate a leak somewhere, Flores said.

In addition to calling in, if you think you have a leak, you can carefully open your water meter box and check if the meter is reporting flow. Caution is needed, as there may be additional wires attached to your meter box lid that can be easily damaged. If you know there is no faucet or tap running in your house and no hose is running in your yard, but the meter is showing

there is water flowing, you likely have a leak.

If you call to report a leak, Utilities will send a service technician to your address to use specially designed microphones and sensors to pinpoint the leak.

If the leak is on the customers’ side of the water meter, it is up to the customer to call a plumber and get it repaired, Flores said. WLM staff will be available to turn the water off at the property if that’s necessary, and then to turn it back on as soon as the leak is repaired.

If the leak is on the City side of the water meter, Flores’ team will replace the entire line in case it has other damage.

Flores said the goal for every

member of his team is to respond promptly to calls, get repairs done as quickly as possible, and minimize water loss.

Water systems aren’t like vehicles, he said. “No ‘check engine’ light comes on. It just happens. When it does, we’re ready to respond.”

Also, call New Mexico 811 if you are planning any sort of excavation on your property, including planting a tree or a shrub. That way, you can locate waterlines before you start digging and eliminate the possibility of damaging a waterline with a pick or shovel, or planting something on top of a line. (Visit nm811.org: Resources for Damage Prevention.)

Juvenile defendants held in custody

The three juveniles arrested in connection with the Young Park shooting that killed three and injured 15 will remain in custody pending further legal proceedings, the Doña Ana County District Attorney announced on March 25.


Doña Ana County District Attorney Fernando R. Macias office said through a news release that the DA’s office presented clear and convincing evidence that the three juveniles presented a serious risk of harm to themselves and the community during an initial juvenile court hearing on Tuesday, March 25. Judge Grace B. Duran granted the state’s motion for continued detention.

During the March 25 hearing, with testimony from LCPD detectives, Macias presented the alleged role of each defendant in the March 21 incident, according to the press release. Macias provided a detailed overview of the involvement of the juveniles, highlighting the significance and dangerousness of their actions, and the ongoing investigation into the shooting, the press release states.


“This office reasserts its stance on juvenile crime on our community and will not tolerate the criminal and intentional use of firearms to intimidate, hurt, or harass others,” said Senior Trial Attorney Jeanne Quintero. “Our goal is to assist the community in fostering a safe environment for all.”

Don't blame police or the car show

The Las Cruces Police aren't to blame for the mass shooting Friday night at Young Park that left three people dead and 15 wounded.

Freshman Rep. Sarah Silva was wrong when she said police had, "the resources they need to address the issues." Anybody who has made a police call recently and waited forever for an officer to arrive knows they are short on manpower.

And it's not just staffing. Recent changes to the law on bail reform and the inability to charge and convict those found to be incompetent to stand trial also prevent police from being able to effectively do their jobs.

As a member of the Legislature, it's Silva's responsibility to provide those resources that she falsely

claims police already have. She wasn't a member of the Legislature last year when lawmakers rebuffed Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham's call for a special session to address public safety, but she will be this year. The governor has made clear she plans to do just that.

The unauthorized car show wasn't to blame for the mass shooting either.

I sympathize with nearby residents who are tired of the noise and commotion late at night. The city probably should have been more responsive to their calls for help. A gate that is intended to lock at 11 p.m. clearly isn't enough.

But, young people have been gathering to show off

their cars ever since the end of World War II, and not always with the permission of local authorities. It's sort of a right of passage in this country. If they weren't at Young Park they would have been somewhere else, with the same result.

The sad fact is, mass shootings have become our new reality. Ours was the 53rd mass shooting in the United States this year, and we aren't even through March. You can find the list on Wikipedia. Before our mass shooting on March 21 there was one in Alabama on March 19 and two the day before, one in Pueblo, Colorado and the other in Georgia.

The list covers all of America, from the big-

gest cities to the smallest towns. On Feb. 9, seven people were shot during a house party in Las Angeles. The day before, five people were shot and killed in Byron, Wyoming. The list tilts more toward Texas and the southern states, but nobody is immune. Everybody gets their turn. Friday night was ours.

Based on preliminary reporting, this was an incident where two heavily armed groups of combatants began shooting at each other without warning. More than 50 bullets were found at the scene from an unknown number of different guns.

In the future, we will undoubtedly work to prevent mass shootings by "hardening" the targets. We'll have more police checkpoints, more restrictions

on mass gatherings, more surveillance cameras watching our every move. We'll also have less liberty and freedom of movement.

None of that will matter. As long as damaged and violent people have easy access to weapons, our time will come around again.

I know this is a crazy idea ... and I'm just spitballing here ... but what if we made it harder for teenagers to buy semi-automatic weapons?

Nah, that'll never work. Let's just crack down on the car shows instead.

We see it all the time on social media – citizens lamenting about the actions or inactions of law enforcement: "I called the cops and no one showed up" or "why do the cops just let these guys go?!".

I have always been a firm believer in the thought that you don't get to complain about something if you

aren't willing to do something about it yourself. And while there are few people in this world with the mental or physical fortitude to become police officers, there are other ways we can all get involved in our communities. You'd be sur-

prised how many neighborhood watch groups exist in Las Cruces, bolstered by a Las Cruces Police Department Community Outreach Team that supports such neighborhood organizations and their purpose to

bring communities together, while recognizing that each neighborhood is unique. But there was still something missing – the groups were formed and functional, but they still existed as islands within the city, not knowing about or collaborating with other similar organizations in other neighborhoods.

But all that changed last year. Two neighborhood watch captains, spurred to action by the tragedies, violence and property crimes exploding in our city, decided to organize the organizers. As such, the captains have quarterly meetings to educate,

Sleepovers with needy pets

If you love sleepovers and want to help shelter pets, the Animal Services Center of Mesilla Valley (ASCMV) has a year-round event that allows one with a dog or a cat over a weekend.

Vanessa Chastain, the foster coordinator for ASCMV, said studies indicate that sleepovers help shelter animals. She said urine samples show the pets' stress levels to be lower than when the animal was first admitted to the shelter, bringing the pet a sense of safety.

ASCMV is found at 3543

Bataan Memorial West. The sleepover program was introduced in 2023. The next sleepover event will be held from April 4-April 7, and another will be held from April 25-28.

The event allows Doña Ana County residents over the age of 18 to host an eligible dog or cat from the animal shelter for a weekend.

The animals selected for the event are considered "long-term animals" from the shelter, meaning they have been at the shelter for more than 30 days.

Two dogs ready for their sleepovers are twins! Meet Agustin and Bruno two

Great Dane mixes that are highly energetic and love affection. Both dogs are dark brown color with white paws and a white-striped chest. The brothers are nine months old and weigh about 30 pounds, just the perfect size for cuddling.

Both brothers have been at the shelter since August.

"They're great, they have so much energy and love. But they've been here since they were small. Their siblings are all gone but they are still here, just overlooked," Chastain said.

Chastain said the dogs selected for sleepovers are already vaccinated and fixed.

Chastain said that people with pets should always keep the sleepover pet and theirs separate until they decide to adopt the pet or not.

One community member who was eager to take advantage of this event was Las Cruces Councilor for District One, Cassie McClure.

McClure's family lost their fur baby, Kira, in 2024. McClure said it took several attempts to foster a new pet before coming across Molly. McClure said before adopting Molly, she tried the ASCMV sleepover event.

She said it gave her a good experience. It gave her and the shelter a better perspective on what dogs would be a good fit for certain people.

Bookmobile

inform and share ideas about how to make the city safer and learn strategies to empower their neighbors, all while working directly with LCPD to stay informed. One officer in particular has gone above and beyond to help, as the community liaison officer, working directly with neighborhood watches

all over the city. Officer Charli Velasco seeks to empower neighborhood watch groups in a collaborative, proactive and informative manner that celebrates the "culture" of each individual neighborhood. Velasco provides constructive suggestions about locations to install cameras, fencing or signage and even coordinates official neighborhood watch signage, paid for, installed and maintained by

the city. He offers a plethora of informative presentations on crime statistics specific to each area, what to expect when 911 is called and fraud prevention and education.

The police are doing their best. But with staffing issues and an increase in crime across the city, they have to triage their responses. But Velasco said it helps responding officers to already have contacts

with a neighborhood watch group. Neighbors can reach out to Velasco as a direct liaison to the police department to ask questions.

So the next time that something happens in your neighborhood, and you pick up your phone to post the cliched "does anyone know what happened...." on one of the Facebook groups, ask yourself instead if you can start an intelligent conversation

about what happened with your neighbors and a dedicated police officer, and, better yet, arm yourself with information so that it either doesn't happen again, or you have an established communication mechanism for how to deal with it in a proactive approach.

The Young Park mass shooting incident took the life of a Centennial High School student and some of the injured were Las Cruces Public School students.

Las Cruces Public Schools is responding by offering support and counseling resources following the March 21 fatal shooting.

Over the weekend, LCPS administration worked with local mental health agencies to provide support at all school campuses Monday morning.

"We are deeply saddened at this news and offer our condolences to all the families impacted by this senseless tragedy," said LCPS Superintendent Ignacio Ruiz. "The events that un-

folded over the weekend are difficult to understand, especially for our young people. Our schools need to be a safe space for our students and staff, and we are committed to ensuring that."

District officials reminded staff, students and families that LCPS is working closely with law enforcement and any information related to the investigation should be shared directly with police using the non-emergency number provided over the weekend, 575-526-0795.

The district reports that it has also shared with parents the Crisis Lifeline number for emotional support, available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Anyone needing assistance can call or text 988 for free, confidential support. The

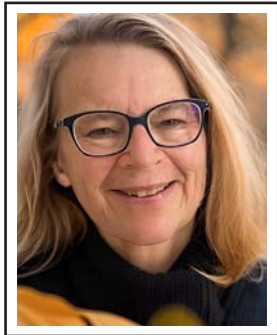

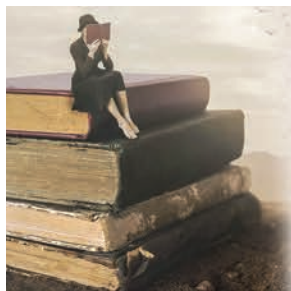

Celebrating a Legacy: Emma "Sis" Warnke and Michele Rose Warnke Self

Emma "Sis" Warnke was a woman ahead of her time.

Born on April 22, 1918, she dedicated her life to proving that age is no barrier to movement, vitality, or achievement. She often said, "You don't stop moving because you get old, you get old because you stop moving." Her belief in the power of physical activity not only shaped her own life but also inspired countless others in Doña Ana County and beyond. Growing up during the Great Depression, Warnke learned the value of hard work and perseverance. She worked tirelessly to put herself through college, an achievement that paved the way for a lifelong commitment to education and physical fitness. She became a beloved Physical Education teacher at Alameda Junior High School, where she inspired generations of students to stay active and embrace healthy lifestyles.

After retiring from teaching, Warnke opened Sis Warnke's Dancewear Shop to stay busy and support her youngest daughter, Mickey, who owned her own ballet studio.

Despite people telling her she was too old, Warnke took her first run at the age of 62 and was immediately ad-

dicted. Soon after, she added bicycling to her routine. Her shop became the meeting place for a local group of seniors who called themselves the "Bike and Chowder Club." They gath-

ered for a 20-mile ride three times a week, followed by a hearty breakfast where they would "chow down" and enjoy each other's company.

At the age of 80, she took on one of her most impressive challenges—biking across the state of Kansas. This remarkable feat was yet another testament to her belief that age should never be a limitation. A true pioneer in senior athletics, Warnke was instrumental in establishing the Doña Ana Senior Olympic Games in 1987, a local extension of the National Senior Games. Through her work, she provided an avenue for older adults to stay active, competitive, and socially engaged. Her dedication to promoting physical fitness among seniors helped redefine aging, proving that life after retirement could be just as energetic and fulfilling as any other stage of life.

Warnke's enthusiasm for movement and sports was not merely professional—it was deeply personal. She herself was a passionate participant in various athletic events, demonstrating firsthand the benefits of an active lifestyle. Whether it was running or cycling, she remained

engaged in physical pursuits well into her later years, embodying the very philosophy she preached. Of the rooms full of medals and trophies she earned throughout her athletic career, she was most proud of her New Mexico Golden Athlete Award, which she received in 1998. The selection was based on athletic ability, community service, and efforts to further senior programs. Her advice to seniors was simple yet powerful: "Keep moving!"

Emma "Sis" Warnke's legacy is one of empowerment, resilience, and action. Her influence is still felt today in the continued success of the Doña Ana Senior Olympic Games and the many seniors who embrace fitness as a way of life. She proved that age is not a limitation, but rather an opportunity to continue striving, learning, and achieving. Each of her four children were heavily involved in sports as well, including her three daughters who were active in dance, gymnastics, and cheerleading. In fact, her oldest

daughter, Elizabeth Burgess, is the current president of the Doña Ana Senior Olympics Board of Directors.

Her youngest daughter, Michele Rose Warnke, whom everyone called "Mickey," was a devoted cheerleader throughout high school and college. She was a mentor to younger cheerleaders and, sponsored by Barbara "Mother Hubbard," became the first All-American Cheerleader at New Mexico State University. Her school and Aggie pride knew no limits. Mickey went on to open Michele's Dance Academy, bringing dance to the stage in Las Cruces. The studio's first performance of *The Nutcracker* was held outside on the steps of her first studio downtown. Today, it has celebrated its 41st annual performance, becoming a cherished tradition in the community.

In 1983, Michele Warnke Self founded the Las Cruces Chamber Ballet in hopes of promoting classical

ballet and various dance forms. The organization has strived to provide serious dance students with opportunities to develop their talents and

gain professional performance experience. Over the years, it has grown into the longest continuously running professional ballet company in New Mexico, enriching the cultural landscape of Las Cruces.

As we celebrate Women's History,

we honor the lasting contributions of Emma "Sis" Warnke - a woman who redefined what it means to grow older and left a legacy of movement, health, and joy for generations to come, and Michele "Mickey" Warnke Self - a woman who pioneered to

Nicole Black: Keeping it humble

Nicole Black went to work for Las Cruces Home Builders Association (LCHBA) in August 2013 at the front desk, earning minimum wage. Today, she is executive director of the organization as it expands its mission and territory and morphs into New Mexico Construction Association (NMCA).

"I can't build a house, but I can definitely make that happen and smooth out the process," Black said. "I try to bring things together, connecting people and advocating for the construction industry."

Among many other duties for more

than 300 association members, Black oversees the annual Las Cruces Home and Garden Show, the Home Builders' Showcase of Homes coming up this spring and the 10th anniversary Casa for a Cause.

Casa for a Cause began in 2014, as Las Cruces builders and subcontractors donate labor and materials at cost to build a house. When the house is sold, the profit is donated to local non-profit organizations. Total donations are expected to reach \$1 million with the sale of the 2024 Casa for a Cause house, Black said.

She also leads the NMCA-sponsored Build My Future, which brought together more than 1,500 high school

students from Las Cruces and throughout southern New Mexico last October - up from 200 in 2019 - to gain hands-on-experience working with local builders and tradesmen.

Build My Future "is literally about showing our youth the trade," Black said, including everything from welding, dry-walling and stucco work to framing, plumbing and pouring cement.

Construction is a great career, she said, because "you're always going to need a roof over your head and a floor under your feet and everything in between. That's our industry."

NMCA is also part of Education House, in collaboration with KT Homes of Las Cruces, Tierra del Sol Housing Corporation, Organ Mountain High School and Las Moñtanas Charter High School. It gives students hands-on building experience "from the ground up," Black said.

Build My Future and Education House train both girls and boys for good-paying jobs in the construction industry.

"We're seeing a lot more girls starting to come in," Black said. "I tell the girls, 'you got this; you can do this.'"

Black remembers going with KT Homes founder Kent Thurston to deliver lumber to Las Moñtanas students to build a table. When the project was complete, one of the participating students asked if he could take the table home "so my family can sit down together," he said. (The answer was "yes.")

"Builders are good people," Black said. "We do so much. Our doors are open to anybody, youth or adult, that's interested in construction," she said. "There is nothing more rewarding than



connecting people in our industry."

Leading NMCA "is not work to me," Black said. "I see it as doing something I love."

Black, who was raised in a single-parent home, became a mother at age 14. Without a college degree, she began work in human resources for a local construction company before joining NMCA.

"I just remain very humble," she said.

Richard Coltharp, a journalism professor at New Mexico State University, worked with Black on several projects during his time with the Las Cruces Bulletin from 2010-2023.

"Nicole has always been a no-nonsense person with a get-things-done approach," Coltharp said. "She's also creative and is able to work well with and get along with a wide variety of people. The Las Cruces Home Builders Association made positive strides under her direction."

Prior to that, Amell was in the third and final season (2011) of the HBO comedy-drama "Hung," playing a gigolo who cemented for business with the main figure portrayed by Thomas Jane. And before that, Amell's other gig as a series regular dated back to 2006-08 and the comedy "Rent-a-Goalie" ...

made in Amell's native Canada, with the subject matter exactly what the title made it sound like. (Another notable cast member was Ashley Newbrough, who now stars frequently in Hallmark Channel movies.)

Katy Camunez: Put Mesilla on the Map

Katy Griggs Camunez (1914-1998) started the landmark restaurant La Posta de la Mesilla on the historic Mesilla plaza in September 1939 in the back room of a compound dating to the 1840s that was once the Corn Exchange Hotel.

The hotel was later a stop on the Butterfield Stagecoach line and, now, is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Jerean Camunez Hutchinson, Katy's great niece, said she and her husband, Tom, are "the blessed stewards of an amazing legacy."

"Katy would be very proud that we have continued the legacy she started 85 years ago," Jerean said.

Katy got her start with the restaurant by asking her uncle, then-prominent local merchant George Griggs, to help her start a chile store. For \$1, he deeded her the small room, which had four tables, a dirt floor and no running water. Katy's mother did the cooking, using some of the recipes that are still on the La Posta menu today, Jerean said.

Katy was a shrewd businesswoman, a hard worker and an entrepreneur. She invented tostadas y chile, known today as chips and salsa, and made them free to her customers, Jerean said. Katy also created the tostada compuesta cup.

Katy used chile grown by Mesilla Valley farmers in her recipes, a tradition that continues today.

"Katy pretty much put Mesilla on the map," Tom said.

Katy also "supported people in need," by taking her homemade enchiladas in the trunk of her car to feed the hungry in the community.

The "Legends of La Posta" wall in the restaurant honors Katy and legendary employees Juanita Nieto (1924-2004), Francisca "Panchita" Flores (1916-2006) and Elisa "Licha"

Carnero Gallegos (1938-2018).

"These women are the backbone of La Posta," Jerean said, remembering "the stamina, the strength, the grit" of Panchita, who made salsa every morning. Jerean called Panchita "the heart and soul of our back kitchen."

Katy "was known to make people blush," Jerean said.

When the Hutchinsons became engaged in 1979, Katy hosted a gathering for them at La Posta that was attended by Tom's Irish grandfather and French grandmother. Katy, wearing makeup ala Mae West, walked into the room, said "Hi, everybody!" sat in Tom's grandfather's lap and ran her fingers through his hair, Tom remembers. The old man turned red with embarrassment, and "my grandmother almost came across the table," he said.

"There was only one Katy. She had a big personality," Tom said.

Tom and Jerean bought La Posta in 1996. They expanded; added items to the menu like seafood, a second, hotter chile and La Posta's unique version of fajitas; and started serving tequila and signature margaritas, including one made with agave wine.

The Legends of La Posta also includes Manuel "Rucho" Chavez (1924-2015), who worked at La Posta for 50 years, and Everardo "Gilito" Lopez (1926-2015), known as "The Piranha and Bird Man" because he took care of the sharp-toothed fish and the parrots, cockatoos and toucans Katy found homes for in the restaurant lobby as another attraction.

A piranha and multiple colorful and talkative birds continue to draw people to La Posta.

When you go to another restaurant, "you're an eater," Tom said.

"When you come here, you're a diner," he said. "You're looking for an experience."

A section of an original adobe



wall is preserved behind a sheet of glass near the entrance to La Posta's main dining area. Some of the building's original vigas are also visible and some have an "M" carved into them to designate their destination as they were floated down the Rio Grande. There is also wall tile Katy brought back from Spain.

Among La Posta's 120 employees are three servers Katy hired more than 40 years ago.

"We're still a family restaurant," Jerean said.

La Posta draws about 300,000 peo-

ple a year, which is close to half the annual attendance at nearby White Sands National Park, Tom said.

"I seat people from all over the world," La Posta host and long-time Las Cruces frame shop and art gallery owner Ron Saltzman said.

Tom and Jerean are at work on a new tribute to Katy Griggs Camunez. Katy's Korner, just across the street from the restaurant, will be a small park, Tom said, and will include a bronze statue of Katy forever overlooking her treasured La Posta.

THE PROCESS

1 Start with a mammogram

Mammograms are an essential part of preventive healthcare for women. Because breast cancer is very common, and because early detection is so important for successful treatment, most women who are over 40 should schedule a mammogram every year.

3D mammography is a clinically proven screening and diagnostic tool for early breast cancer detection. It uses advanced technology to take images of your breast from different angles and combine them to create a more complete and accurate image of your breast than is possible with regular 2D digital mammography.

For a routine annual (screening) mammogram, women 40 and older do not need a written referral. For patients experiencing unusual breast symptoms, a written referral is required for a diagnostic mammogram.

Screening for dense breasts

Annual mammograms are the best way to catch breast cancer early, but not all breasts are the same. Dense breast tissue can mask the appearance of tumors, making it more difficult for mammography to detect cancer.

If you are one of the 40% of women with dense breast tissue, your provider may recommend an MRI, whole breast ultrasound or automated breast ultrasound (ABUS) for additional screening and added peace of mind. Memorial Medical Center is the only facility in Las Cruces offering this advanced technology.

2 What if everything looks normal?

Most mammograms don't find anything out of the ordinary. If this is the case, schedule your next annual mammogram and keep an eye on your breast health throughout the year by performing self-exams. Visit your primary care provider immediately if any concerns arise.

3 What if something doesn't look right?

If your provider spots something unusual, they may ask to schedule a breast ultrasound. A breast ultrasound uses medical sonography to obtain additional images of the breast that can help to identify benign or suspicious lesions. With the Mammo to Answers program, we will expedite unusual findings to a breast ultrasound.

Most unusual mammogram findings are not cancer.

A breast ultrasound can show whether a breast lump is a fluid-filled breast cyst (usually not cancerous) or a solid mass (which could be cancer and may need further testing through a biopsy).

4 What if something still doesn't look right?

If your breast ultrasound yields unusual findings, your provider may recommend a biopsy. A breast biopsy is a procedure that involves using a biopsy needle or surgery to remove a sample of your breast tissue so that a pathologist can examine it for breast cancer or other conditions.

A breast biopsy is the only diagnostic procedure that can definitively determine if a suspicious area is cancerous. Most often this will be a core needle biopsy (CNB). But in some situations, such as if the results of a needle biopsy aren't clear, you might need a surgical biopsy. A pathologist then determines what type of disease, if any, is present.

5 What if something doesn't look right?

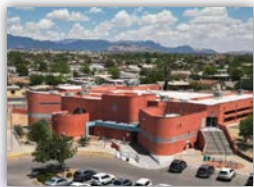

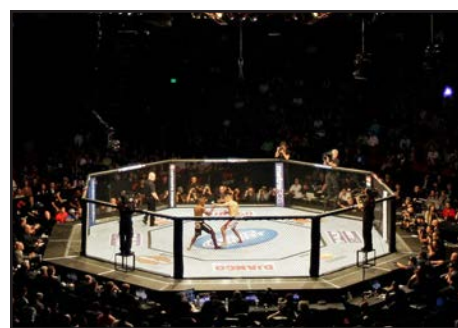

Black Bag – 2025, Spy Romance Thriller, Rated R
The Rule of Jenny Penn – 2024, Psychological Horror, Rated R

Given the expert team of Cate Blanchett, Michael Fassbender and director Steven Soderbergh, you'd expect the spy thriller "Black Bag" to be a sharp jab to the blahs of late winter moviegoing, and to some extent this proves true. Writer David Koepp's multi-layered plot of a mole within the UK SIS spy agency has married veterans Kathryn St. Jean (Blanchett) and George Woodhouse (Fassbender) on their toes when a suspicious movie ticket found in the waste bin has George wondering where Kathryn has been spending her time during her own 'Black Bag' (aka classified mission) excursions.

An early dinner party hosted by the couple to feel out other agency operatives raises hopes of a deliciously sophisticated good time, as a game of 'give the person next to you a resolution' elicits a great stand-off between agency techie Clarissa Dubose (Marisa Abela) and her boozy philandering lover Freddie Smalls (Tom Burke), while agency therapist Dr. Zoe Vaughn (Naomie Harris) has fascinating kinks of her own.

Unfortunately, the supporting characters turn out to be the most interesting thing about the film, as Blanchett, all striding hauteur, and Fassbender, apparently given direction to imitate Gary Oldman's lifeless George Smiley in the 2011 remake of "Tinker, Tailor, Soldier Spy," have no real chemistry and appear more middle-aged models in a London Architectural Digest profile than a devoted couple.

Fassbender also seems stuck as David the android in the "Alien" prequels and looks out of practice when called to deliver the kind of emotion he had as say Mag-

neto the Holocaust survivor in the "X-Men" movies. His horror at the suggestion Kathryn might have betrayed the agency is as muted as the film's modishly tasteful lighting and Mayfair apartment decor.

Soderbergh often punches in his patented electronic jazzy percussive score to make us feel like we're watching one of his truly exciting thrillers like "Out Of Sight," "The Limey" or "Haywire," but since the Pandemic his films have felt increasingly sterile, all tightly-gripped craft and no spontaneity. "Black Bag" would probably make a great series on Hulu, exploring all the petty workaday shenanigans of Smalls, Dubose and Vaughan; as it stands, give me JLo and George Clooney flirting in a car trunk over the cold deliberations of yuppie spies any day.

On the flip-side, you might enjoy or at least be genuinely disturbed by David Ashcroft's "The Rule of Jenny Pen," especially living in our citadel of senior nursing care. A New Zealand judge sent to assisted-living after a stroke, Stefan Mortenson (Geoffrey Rush) faces off with Dave Crealy (John Lithgow) who, like some demented, failed music hall performer, subjects the other residents to daily torments with a baby doll hand-puppet. Blending the banal sadness of nursing home life with the psychological horror of being helplessly bullied suffered by many seniors, "The Rule of Jenny Pen" won't exactly work as an anti-depressant to the woes of 2025, but it may at least make you think about your aging loved ones in a new, considered light.

Match Day at Burrell

On Friday, March 21, a group of 144 Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine student doctors and their families gathered at New Mexico Farm and Ranch Museum to count down the minutes before they could open envelopes unveiling residency assignments.

Match Day is a significant moment for individuals training to become medical providers. It is the moment when they learn where they've been accepted for residency, which is a significant step on their career journey.

"It's like a draft," Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine President John Hummer said, as student doctors, who had listed their preferred assignments, were paired with residencies through the National Resident Matching Program.

About 25 percent of the students were assigned to residencies in Burrell's mission region, which includes New Mexico



and parts of Texas and Arizona, Hummer said, helping to address a "shortage of doctors in this part of the country," he said.

"It was amazing," student doctor Rikelle Trent said, as she opened her envelope and discovered she had been matched with Memorial Medical Center in Las Cruces, where she will pursue a practice in family medicine.

"I felt I was placed in the right place," said the New Jersey native who came to Burrell in 2020. "I love Las Cruces. I'm feeling that sense of family and community," Trent said.

"I was overwhelmed," student doctor Cedar Edell said, as he opened his envelope and learned he has been matched with the residency program at the University of New Mexico School of Medicine in Albuquerque. Originally from Oregon, Edell said he is "excited to go to UNM," where he will be part of the anesthesiology program.

Student doctor Anna Fuller said she was excited to "go back to my family roots," after learning she had been matched with a residency program at Sutter Health, the hospital in Modesto, California, where she was born. Fuller plans a career in internal medicine.

"This is the culmination of what we're about as a medical school," Burrell Director of Career Development Michelle Devora told the students.

"I'm super proud of the students," said Ben Matkin, director of Burrell's standardized patient program. "After years of hard work and dedication, they have realized their dream of becoming a doctor. Now they are ready to make a meaningful difference in the lives of their own patients."

After graduation in May, Burrell will have graduated more than 850 doctors, Hummer said.

He said 99.3 percent of them have been placed in residency programs, which is well above the national average.

Established in 2013, Burrell is a four-year, private osteopathic medical school located on the New Mexico State University campus.

Mammos to Answers

One of the worst things a woman can hear is that a doctor has found a suspicious lump in her breast.

Las Cruces businesswoman Marci Dickerson learned in the fall of 2022 that she had a suspicious mass and from the moment she heard those words until she got a diagnosis of breast cancer through a biopsy, only 10 days transpired.

But as Dickerson went on her cancer journey, she learned that that's not true for many women in Las Cruces. Because

of what Dr. Rob Shoots, a breast health radiologist at Memorial Medical Center, called a "fragmented" health system, many women must wait up to three months between the time the suspicious mass is found and the results of a biopsy.

Shoots said that, from a clinical standpoint, limiting the amount of time it takes to identify cancer improves chances of survival. But there's also the mental health aspect.

"Sitting at home wondering is one of the worst parts of having breast cancer. When you're sitting at home, you're never

minimizing. It could seem worse than it probably is," he said.

Initially, Dickerson responded to her own cancer journey by co-founding a nonprofit with a group of other breast cancer survivors called Cancer Warriors in the spring of 2023. Cancer Warriors provides care boxes to cancer patients for free. Dickerson said the surgery box, for instance, contains the correct wraps, correct ice packs, pads for seatbelts and shirts to go under normal clothing to hold the drains.

Cancer Warriors has raised over \$500,000 since

its inception, Dickerson said. But Dickerson wanted to do more so she and Cancer Warriors are now, along with Memorial Medical Center, initiating a new program called Mammos to Answers. It launches April 1.

The new program is expected to reduce the amount of time it takes for a woman to learn whether a suspicious mass is cancerous or not. The goal is for a breast cancer patient to wait only 21 days, Dickerson said.

Dickerson said that Memorial Medical Center has found a way to "short-circuit" the timeline so that patients don't have to wait for appointments for a bi-

pray,” he said as he held back tears. “I told him it was going be okay, and that God loves him, that he would stay with us. To stay strong. He stayed breathing until the EMT’s got there to tourniquet him properly. I tried my best, but I couldn’t save him.”

Car meets

Hernandez said car meets are a way to have fun and allow young people a way to show off their car projects. She added that it has nothing to do with guns.

“People who are putting that together are like ‘oh, that’s what car meets are.’ That has nothing to do with the meet,” she said.

Theriault said he also regularly attends car meets and has never encountered gun violence.

Hernandez said she is grateful she survived.

“I’m glad I’m here. I’m thankful I’m alive because I was right in front of our vehicle, watching everyone do their thing and next just

boom, boom, boom and my brother runs. It was just crazy,” Hernandez said.

Hernandez’s mom, Nik-kole Silva, who also visited the park on Monday, said now her daughter must live with the trauma of the shooting along with the grief for the loss of her brother’s best friend.

“I wasn’t here but my kids were. There are bullet holes on the other side of my car. If my son hadn’t grabbed my daughter and pulled her to the other side of the car to hide, she would have been shot,” Silva said.

Alleged shooter Tomas Rivas’ first appearance in court

On Monday, March 24, a judge told Tomas Rivas he may have to face a grand jury.

The criminal complaint says that one witness recognized and identified Rivas and his brother as the shooters.

Two witnesses allegedly said they observed two groups arguing before they saw guns taken out and the shooting began.

One witness provided ve-

hicle information for Rivas which was a 4-door, black Mercedes with a temporary license plate, according to the complaint.

“That officers were conducting mobile surveillance and observed the defendants drive to 1835 Rentfrow building D, in Las Cruces where one of the defendants (the 15-year-old) exited the vehicle, walked up to the dumpster on the side of the apartment and placed a tan in color bag inside,” according to court documents.

After a search warrant was issued, investigators allegedly found four guns. According to court documents, all four were black, semi-automatic, 9MM, .40 caliber and .45 caliber handguns that were believed to have been used during the Young Park shooting.

Investigators allegedly were able to recover footage of the 15-year-old defendant fleeing the scene as a driver along with Rivas.

“The scene was processed by the crime scene unit of the Las Cruces Po-

lice Department and spent shell casings belonging to a 9mm, .40 cal, and .45 cal. The shell casings located at the scene matched the firearms that were discovered at 1835 Rentfrow Ave.,” according to court documents.

Rivas has no criminal history in Las Cruces but faces charges in El Paso, Texas.

He has pending charges for four counts of smuggling individuals and evading arrest in El Paso County. He was also ar-

rested for Transporting an Alien who is Unlawfully Present in the United States, according to court records.

Rivas listed his occupation as a car hop from Sonic who lived in Las Cruces for a significant amount of time, according to court records.

“Defendant has a history of criminal activity which appears to be gang related,” the court documents state.

The state of New Mexico has issued an order to tem-

porarily deny release to keep Rivas in state custody while awaiting a pretrial detention hearing.

“The state requests that the District Court set this matter for a hearing wherein the State will prove by clear and convincing evidence that no release conditions will reasonably protect the safety of any other person or the community. The state intends to proceed to grand jury indictment in this matter,” court documents state.

opsy.

Shoots said Memorial has set time slots aside to expedite the process. He said that one aspect of providing oncology care in Las Cruces is that Memorial Medical Center sees patients who often travel for an hour or more for care.

“They could go home and fall through the

cracks. It’s important to keep the timeline short and well defined,” he said.


Shoots said Memorial Medical Center treats the majority of breast cancer patients in southern New Mexico. He said Memorial provides a multi-specialty breast tumor board to plan treatment from diagnosis through surgery and post-operative care.

“This is the same treatment you would get if you go to Yale or the Mayo

Clinic. This is the best standard of care,” Shoots said.

Dickerson said that when the biopsy result comes in, the doctor can tell the patient if she has breast cancer, but it could take an additional week for the patient to know what type of breast cancer she has.

“I am so honored to get to be part of something that truly changes the course of cancer care in our community,” Dickerson said.

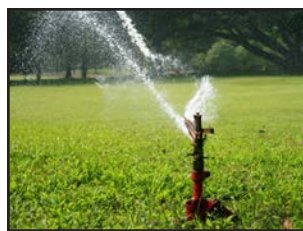

Spring/Summer Water Restrictions

water their vegetation on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays. No watering is allowed on Mondays.

279, Cervantes spoke about mass shootings, including the one that happened in El Paso at a Walmart in 2019. He said he welcomes the chance to explore ways to address access to certain weapons, but it has to be constitutional. In particular, he expressed concern about the definition centering around gas-operated. He said no other state has implemented a ban using a gas-operated definition.

Meanwhile, Cervantes sought to limit the ability to convert firearms into automatic weapons by sponsoring SB 318, which would have created penalties for selling conversion devices such as "Glock switches."

That bill passed the Senate with just four days left in the session and made it through the House Judiciary Committee on a 6-4 vote before time ran out.

Sen. Crystal Brantley, R-Elephant Butte, who represents a portion of Doña Ana County, joined Cervantes in voting against SB 279.

"I think we came into this legislative session with good intentions to address public safety, to push back on the criminals that are plaguing this state," Brantley said during the Judiciary hearing on SB 279. "This is not going to do it. This then targets the law-abiding citizens, the ones that join you in being sick and tired of the crime that's taken over New Mexico."

Brantley sponsored legislation focused on increasing penalties. One of those bills, Senate Bill 95, would have made it a capital felony if someone distributes fentanyl or a fentanyl-related substance to a person who later dies because of using the drug. SB 95 was referred to the Senate Judiciary Committee, where it was never heard. She also sponsored

SB 187, seeking to have people sentenced to death if they are found guilty of murdering a law enforcement officer. New Mexico has not had the death penalty since 2009. Like SB 95, the bill was never heard in the Senate Judiciary Committee.

House Bill 8, which did pass with bipartisan support, included six different pieces of public safety legislation, including one that would prohibit devices to turn semi-automatic weapons into automatic weapons. HB 8 also included criminal competency reform and measures to address fentanyl trafficking.

Meanwhile, Rep. Angelica Rubio, D-Las Cruces, sponsored HB 253, which would have resulted in sealing eviction records, and HB 9, the Immigrant Safety Act. Both bills made it through the House and reached the Senate Judiciary Committee toward the end of the legislative session. Neither were heard in Judiciary.

Golf tournament to bring \$1 million, promoters say

Turtleback Mountain Golf & Resort in Elephant Butte will host the 70th New Mexico Open on September 15-17 and continue to host the golf tournament in 2026 and 2027.

Promoters, who unveiled the plan at a press conference on Tuesday, March 25, say it will bring in \$1 million in new spending on hotels, food, beverage and other purchases, about 140 players and hundreds of spectators.

The New Mexico Open began in 1954 and has been held at various courses around the state. In 2020, it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. For the last three years, it has been held at Rockwind Community Links in Hobbs.

Both amateur and professional golfers may enter opens. Lee Trevino won

in 1966 and 1972. Notah Begay III won in 1998. The tournament is sponsored by the Sun Country Section of the Professional Golf Association (PGA) of America. Its partnership with the new owners of the Turtleback resort, PreReal Investments, will mean this year's open can increase its prize money and "introduce enhancements that will elevate both the player and spectator experience," according to a news release.

Golf doctor's unanswered questions

I answer readers' questions from time to time, but today I'm asking the questions. The first one concerns the media firestorm created by two-time major champion Colin Morikawa, with his refusal to face the media after his one-stroke loss to Russell Henley on March 9 at the Arnold Palmer Invitational tournament. After his snub of the press at Bay Hill, Golf Channel broadcasters criticized Morikawa. At one point, Morikawa dug himself in deeper with the words "I don't owe anyone anything." He followed that with this statement: "I might bite my tongue after saying this, but to

the Brandel Chamblees, to the Paul McGinleys, to the Rocco Mediates of the world, I don't regret anything I said."

Should we excuse Morikawa for avoiding his post-tournament responsibilities to the media or view Morikawa as a spoiled brat who snubbed the legacy of Arnold Palmer in the process of his tantrum? I vote for the latter. In contrast to Morikawa, Tiger Woods, at the height of his popularity, recognized that he owed everything to golf but he said, "golf doesn't owe me

a thing." I would suggest that his posse corral Morikawa and explain that he does owe golf fans, the PGA Tour, the sponsors,

the media, television and the golfing public for the marvelous opportunity he has in professional golf.

My second question is about the PGA Tour/PIF-LIV negotiations that have dragged out almost two years. I'm wondering, does anybody care if no agreement is made? I think the PGA Tour has such an abundance of talent – and more emerging each year

– along with a tournament schedule that is more entertaining than ever, that the LIV group can go their own way.

Next, when is someone going to build a real nine-hole golf course in Las Cruces. A 9-holer would be great for seniors, kids just learning golf, and others who just don't want to spend 4 to 6 hours on an 18-hole round. I enjoy playing 9 holes, which takes less than two hours in mid-afternoon.

How long will it be before divots on the fairways are considered as "ground under repair," which means a golfer is entitled to a free drop of

one club length, not closer to the hole. Golf's ruling bodies have all approved of removing stones and other matter from sand bunkers without a penalty and given the OK to tamping down "spike marks" on the greens. So, why not divots?

I continue to wonder why we don't have a First Tee here in Las Cruces. The closest First Tee is in El Paso. First Tee was founded in 1997 by then PGA Tour Commissioner Tim Finchem, with key partnerships that include the PGA of America, LPGA, USGA and the Masters Tournament Foundation. The primary strategy

of First Tee, serving youth ages 7 through 14, is to improve children's life skills through involvement in golf. But the program goes much further than that, and emphasizes developing strength of character, gaining self-confidence, and empowering achieving personal goals. Go to www.firsttee.org.
