Doña Ana County woman gets new trial

In a split 4-2 decision, the state Supreme Court reversed the convictions of a Doña Ana County woman on March 27 for her role in an alleged murder-for-hire plot and remanded the case for a new trial.

Cristal Cardenas was sentenced to life in prison for the 2018 murder of her ex-boyfriend. Mario Cabral, and sentenced to 24 additional years for

first-degree murder and criminal solicitation to commit first-degree murder. The jury acquitted Cardenas of one count of first-degree murder for the death of Cabral's girlfriend, Vanessa Mora. The victims were found shot to death in their Doña Ana amphetamine. County home in 2018.

Cardenas had a sixmonth-old daughter with her boyfriend Luis Flores, who pleaded guilty to

death. In their split decision, the Court concluded that Cardenas failed to receive a fair trial be- ing. cause the prosecution was allowed to question the defendant about the six-month-old daughter testing positive for meth-

In her appeal, Cardenas argued that the prosecution's questioning about the daughter's drug test was inadmissible and Court's majority agreed jury's verdict," the Court that the trial court erred by allowing the question-

Lunsford was convicted in February of voluntary manslaughter with a firearm enhancement for the death of Presley Eze after an altercation at a gas station on S. Valley Dr. in August 2022. Shortly after Lunsford's convictions. his new lawyer, Matthew Chandler, filed motions requesting a new trial. The motions state that Foy replaced two jurors with alternate jurors out of order and that this violates Lunsford's due process rights. Chandler also filed a motion alleging juror bias improperly withheld before trial and that is also

Airport master plan unveiled

Las Cruces International Airport Administrator Andy Hume said when he looks out his window toward the airstrip he doesn't "see a couple thousand acres of mesquite and brush." Instead, he sees the vision that is laid out in a draft master plan for the facility.

That vision is: "the Las Cruces International Airport is a thriving, wellconnected aviation and commercial aerospace gateway to the city of Las Cruces, the region and beyond, providing access and economic opportunity."

Hume presented the master plan to the Las Cru-

ces City Council during a work session on Monday. Because it was a work session, the council did not take action on it this week. However, Hume said he hopes to bring the master plan back to the council for action in the near future.

Some of the projects involved in that vision include extending runways, renovating the terminal and expanding parking.

These could be expensive undertakings. Hume said runway extension projects can cost tens of millions of dollars.

Hume said funding could also be available through the Federal Aviation Administration.

also linked its master plan process to the Las Cruces Innovation and Industrial Park plan. The park is separated from the airport by a fence. Bringing high speed internet to the airport and the park could help with economic development. Hume said.

Las Cruces Economic Development Director Elizabeth Teeters said both the airport master plan and the plans for the industrial park highlight the need for infrastructure.

will be collaborating with the airport to determine types of businesses they could attract to the industrial park that need airport access.

The master plan incorporates lessons the airport learned during the COVID-19 pandemic, including that "we can't have all of our eggs in one basket. We need to have a diverse approach to how we operate our airport," Hume said.

He said during the pandemic, military flights stopped across the country, including in Las Cruces.

"When we saw a decline in that, we saw actually an increase in medical traffic, which actually has continued to this day," he said.

Hume said the master "We would seek grants plan looks at expanding passenger air service, continuing support of general aviation, growing the commercial aerospace and supporting training programs, including those at the New Mexico State University.

Hume expressed hope Hume said the airport that soon people will be able to fly from Las Cruces to Phoenix and possibly one day to Dallas-Fort Worth.

> "We want to connect Las Cruces to New Mexico, the world and beyond," he said.

Hume said the airport will need to have a terminal capable of accommodating larger aircraft and will need to provide a minimum revenue guarantee to get service started between Las Cruces and Dallas-Fort Worth.

Councilor Becky Cor-She said her department ran questioned plans to expand service to Phoenix and Dallas. She said a big investment into the airport to support the expanded service doesn't necessarily "reflect what some of our

values are or our biggest and most pressing needs."

"I just sort of want to beg a question of what kind of investments should we make and what population is this serving and what's the ultimate impact that we want to make with money,"

Corran said the master plan is ambitious and has budget implications that need to be considered.

Councilor Yvonne Flores said she sees the airport as an economic development issue.

"We need a lot of money in other areas, without a doubt," she said. "But this is a gold mine and this is something that we should prioritize."

The master plan was funded through a \$270,000 grant from the New Mexico Department of Transportation and involved a lengthy public input period.

"Having a robust public input process is absolutely essential, and we did so with our airport master planning process," Hume said. "We made sure that we reached out to a wide variety of key stakeholders."

Hume said the public expressed interest in additional fueling options at the airport. He gave the example of electric vertical takeoff and landing aircraft.

"The development of that aircraft is really speeding up and so having electric capabilities for fueling is going to be really critical moving forward." he said.



The Vietnam War remembered

Veterans came together Saturday, March 29th, at Veterans Memorial Park to commemorate the more than 50 years since the last withdrawal of combat troops from Vietnam in 1973. The event was bittersweet for the American troops who waded in swamps, navigated dense jungle and had first-hand experience fighting Communist-led insurgents in south Vietnam.

Many American soldiers returned with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder. Joe Chavez, retired specialist 4th class, and Billy Armijo, a retired infantryman, who both attended the commemoration said they came back haunted by their experiences of the war.

"I'm alive and I'm grateful to have survived, but there are a lot of people who didn't make it. A lot." Chavez said.

Armijo said one of his iobs while serving in the Vietnam War was to set up explosive devices called claymores. The claymores contained triggers and when someone, or something, set them off by walking through the jungle, the device blew up anything within the vicinity.

Armijo said one of the devices he planted killed a tiger. But he also remembers the first person killed through a claymore he set. Armijo said he knew the person was a nurse because a backpack she was

Chavez recounted that he made a wish when he was 19 that he would make it to his 20th birthday.

He described responding to what he called a "Hot LZ," which is military jargon for a landing zone under active fire, and

10 feet to the ground.

"I was 160 pounds, and the rucksack is another 100 pounds. So, I am jumping 10-15 feet and I weigh Chavez served in the over 260 pounds, and I go one way, and my rucksack went the other, so I end up on my back. It is amazing what the body, at 19, will do to survive," he said.

Chavez said the music his troop listened to came from a single channel. But one song they heard through it, he loved to sing to because of the title, "We Gotta Get Out of This "I was stubborn. But I Place" by The Animals.

"One night, they had a band playing in the barracks, and we had been drinking a little, so we got into it. Every time they'd finish, we'd yell 'one more time!' We loved that song because that's how we felt. 'We've got to get out of this place," Chavez said.

Rachel was preceded in death by her parents, Francis M., and Martha L. Burke (2014, and 2011) who were ranchers and pecan and apple growers in the Mesilla Vallev (Las Cruces) of New Mexico. She was the youngest of three daughters, and grew up in a loving though at times raucous – Christian family. As a child, she often read with her father on the couch, and helped on the farm:

She joined Wycliffe Bible Translators, studied linguistics (earning a Master's degree from GIAL, now DIU) and served for two years in Kenya, preparing pastors there to receive the Scriptures which had been recently translated. Rachel was preparing to work in Indonesia when she met Mark Miller of Spokane, Washington who was a PhD candidate analyzing a minority language. They married in December, 2005, and two years later they moved to Malaysia with their threemonth old son, Abraham.

In the (seventeen!) years

that followed, Rachel and Mark were blessed with three more beloved sons. all of whom were homeschooled for some of their early years overseas. We will miss Rachel's loving care for people – especially for children, in whatever she was involved in. We will miss her hospitable nature, always wanting to include others in her circle. We will miss her lovely voice, often leading others in worship to the living God. Rachel believed in the power of God to bring redemption and renewal to a hurting world, and we trust it will bring redemption to her also.

Rachel is survived by her husband, Mark Miller. sons: Abraham (17), Samuel (15), Ezekiel (11), and Jedediah (9); her oldest sister, LuAnne, her middle sister. Esther: her aunts. HB 10 aims to regulate cannabis in New Mexico

While some people in New Mexico have poured their life savings into starting cannabis operations. some are concerned that an illegal market may have cut into profits. That illegal market may also be putting members of the public at risk.

Rep. Doreen Gallegos, D-Las Cruces, sponsored House Bill 10 to address the issue.

"I was concerned, number one, that people had invested their life savings into these cannabis building businesses, and then with the illegal market going on, that they were going to lose everything that they had invested," Gallegos told the Las Cruces Bulletin. "I was also concerned that if people were going to bring in product, was it going to be laced with other items? Was it safe?"

The bill establishes an enforcement bureau within the state's Regulation and

Licensing Department and gives the new bureau the authority to investigate and enforce violations. This bureau could hire certified peace officers to investigate violations of licensing requirements and individuals who are allegedly defying the Cannabis Regulation Act.

Additionally, the legislation establishes criminal penalties if someone removes, conceals, destroys or disposes of embargoed cannabis products or sells or transfers products that are included in recall or-

HB 10 received broad bipartisan support, passing the House of Representatives on a 68-1 vote and the Senate on a 25-1 vote. It is now waiting for the governor's signature.

"This legislation will provide another critical tool for effectively regulating cannabis in New Mexico," Regulation and Licensing Department Superintendent Clay Bailey said in a press release.

Gallegos said she has had conversations with Gov. Michelle Luian Grisham about HB 10 and the governor seems supportive of the effort.

"I'm very, very hopeful that she will sign it very soon," she said.

Lujan Grisham praised the legislation after it passed and said in a statement that she looks "forward to signing this bill and strengthening the foundation of our regulated cannabis industry."

The bill not only had bipartisan support on the floor, it also had a bipartisan group of sponsors. In addition to Gallegos, HB 10 was sponsored by Speaker of the House Javier Martinez, D-Albuquerque, House Minority Floor Leader Gail Armstrong, R-Magdalena, and Reps. Marian Matthews, D-Albuquerque, and Art De La Cruz, D-Albuquerque.

On the Senate side, Sen. Linda Trujillo, D-Albuquerque, carried the bill.

Gallegos said part of the reason she sponsored HB 10 was to make sure people who consume cannabis are safe and that products aren't laced with fentanyl.

She said if people buy from the illegal markets, "it's like still buying it from your local dealer. and who knows how that's coming in."

HB 10 allows state officials with the enforce-

both announced and unannounced inspections. If illegal products are found, or products that the officials suspect may have been altered or fraudulently labeled, it gives those officials the ability to seize those products. The officials could then petition a court for permission to destroy the product.

"We didn't have the tools we needed to keep New Mexicans safe, and that's what this bill does," Gallegos said.

Gallegos said her background in social work and "iust knowing how it affects kids and families," were factors that resonated with her when she decided to sponsor HB 10.

She said legislation should be viewed as living documents that can change. Gallegos referenced past cannabis legislation in New Mexico.

"Just because you do a law doesn't mean it's perfect, and you can't add on to it," she said.

Gallegos said when cannabis was legalized, "we saw what we didn't have in place."

"When we see that things maybe aren't working the way they should. or that sometimes we just missed a piece, that's where we can go back and fix it," she said.

Safety top priority for students

A survey conducted by Las Cruces Public Schools found that the largest concern among LCPS students dents. is school safety.

Las Cruces Public Schools held a budget town hall meeting at the Dr. Karen M. Truiillo Administration Complex on Wednesday, March 26, to discuss a survey the district conducted from December 2024 until January 31 of this year. Las Cruces Public Schools Budget Director Matthew Saenz said 77% of the students responded and 15% of parents responded.

The highest priority for 81% of students who responded to the survey for

the upcoming fiscal year, FY2026, was campus safety followed by health and wellness with 80%.

Campus safety was crucial in responses from stu-

One example of a survey response expressed concerns about the need for bathroom safety measures to counteract problems such as bullying and vaping.

Saenz said the survey provides the schools with input on how to make improvements along with a way to get the community involved.

The budget survey committee selected eight categories that revolve around student success. Those eight categories were programs, extracurricular activities, instructional resources, campus safety. health and wellness, technology, and facilities.

Students were offered the survey during their advisory period and the questionnaire was available to both high school and middle school students. Students also had a chance to win a \$10 gift card in which five were randomly selected.

The budget survey results included 2,321 responses, with 1674 (the 77%) of those responses being students. The highest priority for the upcoming fiscal year (2026) on the survey was Campus Safety with 81% favorability followed by health and wellness with 80%.



Know what's **below. Call** before you dig.

Digging: Your Rights & Responsibilities

New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator (a person using a mechanical digging device) for preventing damage to underground facilities. The law provides for a one-call system that the excavator can use free of charge to arrange to have underground facilities located and marked before an excavation occurs.

State law requires excavators to:

- 1. Plan your excavation.
- 2. Mark the excavation area in white.
- 3. Call before you dig.
- 4. Determine the location of any underground facilities.
- 5. Call the one call center if any facility is not marked to determine if it is "clear."
- 6. Preserve line location markings or provide offsets.
- 7. Expose any conflicts and maintain at least 18 inches of clearance from the horizontal mark and the edge of the mechanical digging device.
- 8. Support underground facilities during excavation as necessary.
- 9. Backfill in a careful manner.
- 10. Notify facility owners and 811 of any damage immediately.
- 11. Standard locate tickets are valid for 15 working days.

What happens when you call?

Once you provide the necessary information, the one call operator will confirm all pertinent details. It is your responsibility to ensure the information was properly recorded on the request. Likewise, faxed or on-line requests will be returned to you as confirmation, and it is your responsibility to immediately confirm the information is correct.

Escarbar: Sus Derechos y Responsabilidades

La ley de excavación de Nuevo México impone ciertas responsabilidades al excavador (Es una persona que utiliza un artefacto mecánico para escarbar) para prevenir daños a las instalaciones bajo tierra. La ley provee un sistema de "una llamada" que el excavador puede utilizar sin costo para hacer arreglos para que le localicen las instalaciones bajo tierra y que estas sean marcadas antes de que la excavación ocurra.

La ley requiere que los excavadores hagan lo siguiente:

- 1. Planeé su excavación.
- 2. Llamen antes de excavar.
- 3. Marcar el área de excavación en color blanco.
- 4. Determine la ubicación de cualquiera de las instalaciones existentes bajo tierra.
- Llame al centro de "una llamada" si alguna de las instalaciones no está marcada para determinar si es seguro "proseguir".
- Conserve la ubicación de las líneas o proporcione la distancia / desvió.
- Avise de cualquier conflicto y manténgase al menos 18 pulgadas al margen y de la orilla de algún artefacto mecánico para escarbar.
- 8. Apoye/preserve las instalaciones bajo tierra según sea necesario cuando este excavando.
- 9. Rellene con cuidado.
- 10. Avise a los dueños de las instalaciones y marque al 811 inmediatamente para reportar cualquier daño.
- 11. Las peticiones estándar (ticket) son válidos durante 15 días hábiles solamente.



Alleged Young Park shooter involved in "limited scuffle"

sole adult apprehended in the Young Park shooting. which left three dead and 15 injured, was reportedly involved in what officials are calling a "limited scuffle" at the Doña Ana County Detention Center.

Eduardo Estrada. spokesperson for the Third Judicial District Attornev's Office, said in an email that his office has not had an indication that there have been any threats received in relation to Rivas. But Estrada said Rivas was involved in a "limited scuffle," since entering the facility after his arrest on Sunday. Estrada said guards broke up the altercation quickly.

The Doña Ana County Detention Center did not respond to a request for

lice spokesperson Dan Trujillo directed the Bulletin's inquiry about Rivas' center.

Rivas made an appearance in Doña Ana Magistrate Court on Monday, during which the judge told Rivas he may face a grand jury trial and that he will continue to be held in custody. > "He certainly has the right to request it (restrictive housing) if he feels he is in danger. At this time, we have no indication that the detention center has received any threats in relation to Mr. Rivas," Estrada said.

> Estrada added that the detention center is a secure facility with professionally, well-trained staff members. Placement of any new inmate is always considered for safety concerns, he said.

> "The staff are aware of concerns surrounding high profile cases and will deal accordingly with the information they receive," Estrada said.

New state park waits governor's signature

For proponents of the proposed Slot Canyon Riverlands State Park in Doña Ana County, the location makes sense.

The proposed Rio Grande Trail goes right through the area and it borders the Organ Mountains Desert Peaks National Monument.

Legislation that would provide approximately \$9 million in funding to the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department to create the state park – encompassing 783 acres in Doña Ana County - is waiting for the governor's signature having received bipartisan support,

ate on a unanimous vote.

Should the governor sign the bill, funding is in the budget to support creation of the state park.

The state park could bring new opportunities for hiking, bird watching, non-motorized boating. camping and other outdoor recreation while also protecting wildlife habitat and restoring ecosystems.

"At the end of the day, there was very strong bipartisan support to do it, and people are genuinely excited to have this park be created and looking forward to visiting it when it's built," bill sponsor Sen. Jeff Steinborn, D-Las Cruces, said.

The slot canvons are narrow, winding canyons.

"They're very kind of surreal and other worldly," Steinborn said.

The proposed state park brings in various habitats including the riparian area along the Rio Grande where beavers build dams and large cottonwoods grow to the desert slot canvons, he said.

The creation of the state park will also increase access to the national monument, according to Steinborn. He said there is not a sanctioned access point where the proposed state park will be located.

City to soon track lodger's tax payments

SHORT-TERM RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS WILL BE NOTIFIED IF NOT PAYING

The city of Las Cruces will soon track owners of short-term rental properties and will know who has not paid the city's 5% lodger's tax.

The city passed the tax in 2020 but has not had a way to track who is paying. But the city is implementing a new software that will allow it to assess when the tax is not paid starting May 25, Lorena Lozano, director of marketing, said.

"We just like to remind people (about the tax), especially new people that may have moved here over the last five years. As this was implemented in January of 2020, you could imagine if new people moved here, they probably don't know about the lodger's tax," Lozano said.

The tax is used to promote the city, including city events and promotional activities for tourists. Lozano said the city has made paying the tax easier.

"Also, through the system, a letter is sent out to the identified short-term rental properties reminding them of lodgers tax requirements and also introducing/reminding them of the new online system," Guss said.

How do I register?

Residents who own short-term rental properties were supposed to begin paying the lodgers tax since Jan. 1, 2020.

Short-term rental property owners must first create an online account at lascrucesnm-self.govplatform.com.

The online user will be prompted to ask questions about the property such as location and size. They will then need to pay a \$50 registration fee.

Renters must report and pay taxes by the 25th of each month for the month prior. Now, if the property was not rented during that period, renters are required to input zero.

People who are late with payments will be required to pay a 10% late fee or \$100, whichever is greater.

Renters will also need to pay a one percent interest penalty on any unpaid

monthly balances, accord-What happens if I fail to ing to the city website.

Organizers say Las Cruces reproductive health center expected to open in late summer 2026

Las Cruces could see New Mexico's state-funded reproductive health clinic open its doors on the east side of town by late summer or fall 2026, according to project organizers.

Christopher Ramirez, spokesperson for the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center. told Source NM that organizers are in the final stages of design and development and expect to present plans to the Department of Higher Education and the State Board of Finance for approval in May and June. Once approved, the search for a contractor will start.

"Our hope is to have a contractor in place and construction to begin by September/October," Ramirez told Source NM in an email, adding that the goal about a vear later.

The Center for Reproductive Health is part of a \$10 million capital outlay project requested by Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham and approved in 2023 to expand access to reproductive health care in Southern New Mexico. The project is a partnership between UNM and advocacy organizations Bold Futures, Strong Families New Mexico and Planned Parenthood of the Rocky Mountains.

tors, organizers and local leaders broke ground on the center in September 2024, on East Lohman Avenue near MountainView is to open doors to patients Regional Medical Center, following over a year of few updates on the project.

The center is expected to offer medication and procedural abortion, contraception options, pregnancy loss support and management, lactation support and doula support, along with other services.

Lujan Grisham recently requested another \$10 million in capital outlay funds for a reproductive health center in Northern New Mexico. Neither the governor nor the Las Cruces

Luian Grisham, legisla- center organizers have confirmed that the same organizers will be part of the planning for the second center. A location for the center has not been released, though Republican lawmakers speculated during the legislative session that Santa Fe would be the target.





Q: It was nice to see Zoe Saldaña win an Oscar. Will her series "Lioness" be back?

A: After earning her Academy Award for best supporting actress in "Emilia Pérez," Paramount+ has not yet given an official renewal for a third season of the military-espionage drama series. However,

things look promising on that count for a number of reasons.

Saldaña said in an interview last fall that she was committed to three seasons of "Lioness." Both existing seasons of the show have fared quite well in terms of ratings — the series was among the top 10 of all scripted streaming series in the United States.

Also, if the series returned, "Lioness" would be able to boast no less than three Oscar winners as major cast members, provided that Nicole Kidman and Morgan Freeman also returned to the series. That's big prestige for any network or streaming service and not easily dismissed, even in these times when

production costs are being scrutinized more closely than ever.

Saldaña has an investment in "Lioness" beyond performing in it, since she's also an executive producer — as is Kidman. So is co-star Jill Wagner, who developed the show with "Yellowstone" mentor Taylor Sheridan, one of the kings of Paramount+ programming when one considers he also furnishes "1923," "Mayor of Kingstown" and "Tulsa King" to the service. Sheridan wrote all of the Season 2 scripts for "Lioness," so it's likely that he'll have his work cut out for him again (something he doesn't shy away from) if a third year is ordered.

Rossum's Universal Robots boldly aspires

There's a lot to unpack in Karel Capek's 1921 stageplay, Rossum's Universal Robots, now trundling the stage at Las Cruces Community Theatre. As a longtime proponent of this play, I was both thrilled that one of our local theatre troupes would be taking on such a fabled production, and understandably wary of what might transpire when they did so.

I would first like to applaud the director, the crew, and the cast of Rossum's Universal Robots, for taking the chance. For those of us in the opening-night audience who stuck it out after intermission, it was an entertaining, if somewhat perplexing experience. I do have to wonder, however, if perhaps instead of concentrating so resolutely on the "sci-fi" aspects of the production, a little more attention should have been paid to the milieu of the conception itself.

At the time this play was written, the stage was a very different place. Stage actors played not only to each other, but to the audience. They hammered





every revelation home, with a nod and a wink. Many of their monologues were supercilious at best, and tedious at worst. They carried themselves broadly and exclaimed loudly, while spouting euphuistic words like supercilious, and euphuistic. It's just the way things were done then. The subtleties of method acting were not yet necessary ingredients for audience plausibility.

Which makes most of what was staged in 1920 – the year the play was written – what we would today refer to as melodrama. This play is a melodrama; unfortunately, only a few of the cast members got the memo. Those who did, present their characters broadly and unabashedly. They are a joy to behold. Those who did not, however, come across as overly serious and somewhat lost in the dialog which, let's be honest, said without any irony whatso-

ever, sounds awkward and affected.

Which is not to say that any of this is a problem of the 105-year-old play. Even Shakespeare can sound clumsy in a modern mouth. It just takes an understanding of the material and, perhaps, a more knowledgeable and experienced director to pull it off adroitly. For a directorial debut, it may have been too prodigious a bite, though Jason Wyatt must once again be commended for attempting the challenge. It's clear he loves this play, and I believe he will return to again and again. With luck, I will be around to see his 10- or 20year reprisal. In the meantime, let's just say that this production of Rossum's Universal Robots is not for everybody. Really, what 20th century Czechoslovakian literature is? However, for those who approach it as what it is – a highly prescient futuristic treatise that speaks clearly, if somewhat stentoriously, to our own time - it can be a uniquely fulfilling experience. It's also silly, and clever, and hokey, and even charmingly, dare I say politically, incorrect, but considering the climate, both then and now, still in goose step with the times.

Las Cruces Utilities using drones for inspections

Did you know the City of Las Cruces Utilities Department has

four licensed pilots?

Associate Engineer, Fernando Ortiz, Senior Engineering Technician, Juan Ricarte, and two others have remote pilot certificates from the FAA because they fly drones commercially as part of the work they do in Utilities' Technical Support Line of Business.

The City purchased Utilities' drone in 2022 to do visual inspections that can be dangerous, challenging, or otherwise impossible for humans.

"We don't have to climb onto roofs anymore," said Ortiz, a Las Cruces native who has been with the City for 19 years, all in Technical Support. That's especially helpful in roof inspections on construction sites when a fall-protection-certified City inspector is not available, Ortiz said. And, using the drone can save the time it would take the inspector to drive to and from the site.

"Everything we're doing is perfectly safe," said Ricarte, who has been with the City for two years. A native of Sunland Park, he started work with Utilities as part of the NMSU co-op program.

The drone, which cost \$30,000, is equipped with advanced imaging capabilities for topography and land surface mapping. It can also be fitted with a methane-detecting or heat-sensitive infrared camera to quickly and safely identify leaks in underground natural gas or water lines. Additionally, it can measure grade and elevation, providing topographical details that were previously unavailable.

The drone is also used to inspect City water tanks, which are typically more than 30 feet tall and hold up to four million gallons of water.

Instead of an inspector climbing all those steps to reach the top. as was necessary until just a few years ago, Ortiz or Ricarte can deploy the drone to inspect a water tank. Using a nearby flat area as a launch site, they can position the drone above the tank, where it hovers while its camera rotates to capture a full view of the top. By watching live or recorded footage and utilizing a specialized high-resolution camera, they can efficiently assess the structure for corrosion. wear and tear, and other potential damage.

Drone images are also useful in pre-construction meetings, Ricarte said, because they can provide a real-time image of an entire construction site. The drone can also be flown over City landfills to measure capacity and waste volume.

The drone, which measures about five feet across when its wings are fully extended, weighs about 10 pounds and is transported in a specially designed case.

If Ortiz or Ricarte intend to fly the drone near Las Cruces International Airport, they must file a flight plan beforehand to avoid any airspace issues. Using its built-in radar, the pilots are also careful to keep the drone away from power lines, trees and homes. It makes very little noise, so it doesn't disturb people, dogs or horses.

Ortiz and Ricarte said Utilities keeps finding new and innovative ways to use the drone, and, literally, the sky's the limit!

Turtleback Mountain Golf & Resort to host NM Open

Turtleback Mountain Golf & Resort in Elephant Butte will host the New Mexico Open for the next three years, beginning this September 15-17.

The announcement came Tuesday, March 25, at a press conference at the resort where elected officials spoke, including Lt. Gov. Howie Morales, who read a proclamation from the governor.

The New Mexico Open began in 1954 and has been held annually, usually in September, at various courses around the state.

usually moving every two or three years. In 2020, it was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The 2021 event was pulled together at the last moment at Ladera golf course in Albuquerque. For the last three years, it has been at Rockwind Community Links in Hobbs.

Cory Armstrong, executive director of the Sun Country Golf House in Rio Rancho, said New Mexico has 12 to 15 courses difficult and interesting enough to host the state open. He said Turtleback's staff lobbied the Sun Country Section of the Professional Golf Association (PGA) of America.

which covers all of New Mexico and the westernmost part of Texas, to hold the next three opens in Elephant Butte.

Both amateur and professional golfers may enter opens. Lee Trevino won the New Mexico Open in 1966 and 1972. Notah Begay III won in 1998. Promoters say the tournament should bring in 140 players and hundreds of spectators, meaning \$1 million in new spending on hotels, food, beverage and other pur-

chases. The partnership with the new owners of the Turtleback resort, PreReal Investments, will mean this vear's open can increase its prize money and "introduce enhancements that will elevate both the player and spectator experience," according to a news release.

Morales read a proclamation from Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham that designated March 25 as Turtleback Mountain Golf & Resort Day for "elevating New Mexico's status as premier golf and recreation destination by hosting the prestigious New Mexico Open, drawing elite athletes, spectators and tourism revenue to the state and further advancing its reputation as a world-class destination for leisure and sports."

State Sen. Crystal Diamond Brantley, R-Elephant Butte, praised Prendamano at the press conference. "Your commitment has been nothing short of transformational and anyone who lives here can see the life they have breathed back into this community," she said.

"Your work is not just building structures. It's building the future of southern New Mexico," she

Sierra County Commission Chairman Travis Day said, "as a commission, we believe that the best opportunities and the best options for a county or a local government to get involved in is to let private business do its thing and that's exactly what PreReal has done."

PreReal Investments, a Staten-Island based firm, owns the 18-hole golf course, the pro shop and the restaurant at the resort. It also has an adjacent residential development with 1.300 available homesites.


Perfectionism is complicated

Following his recent win at the Valspar Championship on March 23rd, Victor Hovland was quizzed by reporters about his tendencies toward perfection. Having not won in two years. Hoyland has gone through five swing coaches in the previous 12 months. He tinkers with his swing more than a kid with a new erector set. Hovland told the media after the Valspar, "I find it kind of weird that we're professional athletes and the people that are wanting to improve are somewhat looked at as, 'Oh, he's a perfectionist – he's out on the perimeter searching too much.' It's like, that's what we do," he said.

Perfectionism is a per-

obsessed with perfection pulses or images that are struggle to recover from a perceived as intrusive and bad shot.

the tendency toward perfectionism was common. And that situation is intertwined with self-esteem issues, parental pressures and perceived judgement.

Research studies during the past decade have revealed that self-oriented and socially prescribed perfectionism would aggravate the level of stress and emotional exhaustion; and perfectionism was associated with mental fatigue with related maladaptive coping strategies. Perfectionism has also been proven to be linked to obsessive traits, including

inappropriate. All of this is From my experience, indicative of a personality trait that is contrary to a freedom of movement and thought that has been typical of champion sportspersons through the ages.

One of the best (and most popular) books ever written about the mental game is "Golf Is Not A Game Of Perfect" by Dr. Bob Rotella. Rotella is basically the "dean of sport psychologists." Having helped many of the greatest golfers on the PGA a guest columnist for the Tour and the LPGA Tour. he is still coaching the current pro golfing stars. If you have one book on your shelf to refer to when you

fall victim to mental and emotional lapses, make it this one. One of Rotella's many "rules" states: "Golf is a game played by human beings. Therefore, it is a game of mistakes. Successful golfers know how to respond to mistakes."

Some golfers are "fake perfectionists." They invent thousands of excuses why they didn't hit it perfect, like "that dog barked in my backswing, otherwise I would have hit a perfect shot." Oh, well.
