# NMSU's golfer Emma Bunch makes history

Emma Bunch, a New Mexico State University junior golfer, was one of 72 competitors in the Augusta National Women's Amateur. She tied for 11th place last week in Augusta, Georgia.

Bunch is the first women's Aggie golfer to have competed in the renowned tournament.

The ANWA began Wednesday, April 2 where 36 opening holes were played over the course of two days before an official practice round began on Friday, April 4.

There are dozens of qualifications needed for the women golfers to enter the ANWA. Bunch earned her spot by also being ranked number 37 in the Women's World Amateur Golf Rankings.

Some of the more prestigious qualifications Bunch needed to play in the ANWA were reigning U.S., Women's Amateur Champion, reigning girls national champion, and reigning girls junior PGA



champion.

With so much accomplished, NMSU Women's Golf Coach Danny Bowen said it's hard to pinpoint what Bunch needs to improve.

"That's actually kind of the hard part, is figuring out what to work on for her now because there's so many areas that are her strengths, so that's something that might have to be thought of over the

summer and before next season," Bowen said.

Bowen has coached Bunch for her three years at NMSU and will include her upcoming senior year as well.

"I think one of her goals now is obviously turning professional so we also have to make sure that we're doing everything on our part to where she can just blend into professional golf pretty seamlessly," he added.

Bowen has coached at NMSU for 13 seasons, and he said he's never known of someone winning five tournaments in a row.

Bunch participated in a series of tournaments in spring of 2024 where she won five tournaments consecutively.

#### **Incorrect Treasurer Name on Envelope**

Our office remains committed to fiscal responsibility and environmental sustainability. Due to a printing oversight by our third-party vendor, the bulk-ordered payment envelopes for this tax cycle still display the name of the previous County Treasurer. To reduce waste and avoid additional costs to taxpayers, we will be using these envelopes as planned. Please be assured that this does not affect our operations in any way.

#### **Low-Income Tax Rebates for 2024 Property Taxes**

Ordinance 332-2023 authorizes a property tax rebate for low-income property owners with a modified gross income of \$24,000 or less. Taxpayers can claim this rebate as a credit on their individual state income tax return. Please note that property taxes must still be paid in full.

#### Changes to Veterans Exemptions in 2025 and 2026

Due to a constitutional amendment approved by New Mexico voters, changes to veterans' property tax exemptions will take effect as follows:

2025: The veterans' exemption for property tax values will increase from \$4,000 to \$10,000.

2026: The disabled veterans' exemption will be based on the veteran's disability


These exemptions apply only to properties occupied by the veteran as their principal place of residence.

# Torrez sues company alleged to prey on veterans

New Mexico Attorney General Raúl Torrez filed a lawsuit against Disabled Veterans Consultants for allegedly collecting payments for consulting services to veterans that offer for free.

Torrez announced the lawsuit from the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post, 5845 Bataan Memorial West, in Las Cruces on April 3. Officials from various veteran groups attended.

The company did not respond to requests for com-

The complaint alleges that the company charged for services that are offered for free elsewhere and violated both federal law and Veterans Affairs rules. The complaint says that the company mar-

keted itself as being able to offer quicker turnaround times with benefit claims when submitting veterans' applications but VA rules mandate that all claims go into the same processing order of receipt.

NEW LCPD CADETS SAY THEY'RE READY TO SERVE

After the Young Park shooting on March 21. that left three dead and 15 injured, Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story said the police are understaffed.

Many individuals took to social media after the shooting and blamed the Las Cruces Police Department for the fact that the vouth had gathered at the park unofficially to show off their cars. But Story told the Las Cruces Bulletin that policing is difficult in this day and age and even more so when depart-

Story said fewer people want to be police officers. He said that became particularly noticeable after the summer of 2020. That summer a Minneapolis police officer, Derek Chauvin, placed his knee on the neck of a man. George Floyd, for about nine minutes despite pleas from Floyd that he couldn't breathe. A jury found Chavin guilty of secondand third-degree murder and he was sentenced to 22.5 years in prison. Story said things have not been the same for police recruit-

"That's an objective fact. You look at our application numbers over time, you can look at state police. Albuquerque or even Portland. It has a lot to do with the environment or the climate around policing especially from 2020 on."

Story said being a police officer is a difficult job.

"It's more difficult now than it used to be. It's harder today than it was when I started, by far," he

Story, who has been on the Las Cruces Police force for 18 years, said

police are now more than ever being held accountable. He emphasized he is not against accountability but he added police make mistakes like any person.

"There's these expectations set on officers that are almost impossible to meet all the time. You have a 25-year career, you're going to make mistakes, right?" Story said.

He said the pressure officers receive from press, politicians and government officials can be intense and many may not understand the stress of-

## State police and Border Patrol involved in high-speed chase

Landon Hutchens, public affairs specialist for U.S. Customs and Border Protection, said that at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, April 2, a Border Patrol agent assigned to Las Cruces was involved in a use of force incident. ## One signature away from drawing New Mexico into greater sunshine

With the 2025 legislative session over and out, many have moved on. But some are taking stock of why some bills failed while others made it through the legislative wringer.

One bill sitting on the governor's desk would make that accounting easier in the future.

House Bill 143 is simple. even while requiring more effort from lobbyists, in some cases likely on a daily basis. If the governor signs the bill, lobbyists and their employers would file a report within 48 hours of beginning their work on a bill stating whether they support or oppose it. And again within 48 hours if their position on the bill changed.

The reports would be kept on the individual bill's public webpage on the legislative website, as well as in searchable and downloadable formats on the Secretary of State's website.

The idea behind the measure is that lobbyists have a lot of swav over whether a bill becomes law, and the public ought about that influence.

#### What is a Lobbyist?

House Bill 143 is aimed at the hundreds of people registered with the Secretary of State as lobbyists each year. Lobbying has a specific definition under the law. If you simply give

makers about a bill, you aren't a lobbyist. But if you meet certain requirements, you must register. Here's how the law defines a lobbyist:

"Any individual who is compensated for the specific purpose of lobbying; is designated by an interest group or organization to represent it on a substantial or regular basis for the purpose of lobbying; or in the course of his employment is engaged in lobbying on a substantial or regular basis."

"I represent a district that is four and a half hours away, and they can't come to the capital and the Roundhouse during session, and so their ability to see all the activity that's happening here and all of the people and influences that help shape legislation is critical," Rep. Sarah Silva, D-Las Cruces, one of the bill's co-sponsors, said Feb 22 to lawmakers on the House Judiciary Committee. "When I go back and we have conversations about these issues. I want them to be able to click a link and see all the players involved."

The new requirements to have more information aren't groundbreaking outside the state. According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, 15 states already required similar reporting as of

worked on. When the lobbyist first starts work on a bill, or changes positions on it, they file a report within 72 hours. Searchable reports are available online.

The news organization spoke to several Colorado lobbyists, who said that while it took time to get a handle on the reporting requirements, they've adapted. One lobbyist noted that the additional transparency helped lobbyists, too, because it made clear where everybody stood on a particular bill. allowing a natural giveand-take to occur: "They say, well, what can you do to amend that? It initiates a dialogue."

For New Mexico, a state that one national watchdog group ranks in the bottom tier for lobbyist transparency, the new reports would be a seachange.

Instead of having to decide whether they believe general statements they hear in the media about which special interest groups have power at the Roundhouse, members of the public could simply go to the bill's individual web page to see who supported or opposed it.

New Mexico In Depth heard rumblings during the legislative session from lobbyists that the reporting requirements would be onerous.

One veteran lobbyist J.D. Bullington said he

trepidation about the 48hour reporting requirement. It could conceivably cause him to file a report everyday, given he is analyzing new bills and communicating about them to lawmakers on a daily basis during the session. Bullington is among about 30 lobbyists, out of hundreds, who have more than 10 clients.

Lobbvists "aren't real crazy about having to file numerous additional reports during a session, when it's the busiest time of our year." he said.

But Sen. Jeff Steinborn, D-Las Cruces, a co-sponsor of the bill who's pushed for greater transparency for years, argued that the reporting would become routine. "I think they are quite clear on what they're here lobbying on," he said during the Senate floor debate on the bill. "...once they get used to this, and there's an easy module for them to do it, and they'll be involved in the rulemaking by the Secretary of State, I would submit to you, this will all become very second nature."

Bullington said Steinborn may be right, and that input from lobbvists in designing the reporting system would be key. The details of how lobbyists would file the reports would be left to the Secretary of State, whose staff members told lawmakers during public hearings that they support the bill and would be able to cre-

# Las Cruces takes part in National HandsOff! Protest

Many in the Las Cruces community gathered Saturday, April 5, at Albert Johnson Park to participate in a nationwide protest organized by local grassroots organizations against President Trump's recent executive orders and policy changes implemented by the Department of Government Efficiency.

The initial protesters who signed up in the morning to attend the event drew a larger crowd of Las Crucians who lined the sidewalks up and down North Main Street and occupied Albert Johnson Park and the front of City Hall. They carried

or D.O.G.E. in what the Trump administration says is an effort to make government more efficient and save taxpayers money.

People had various reasons to attend, from protesting plans to cut funding to Medicare and Medicaid, workforce cuts in social security, mass deportation efforts, DEI cutbacks, LGBTQ+ rights, increasing tariffs, and the ongoing genocide in Gaza and the West Bank. One protestor, who would not give her name, said she was there because her husband is a veteran and she fears her family will be impacted by the cuts.

The Las Cruces protest

was part of a nationwide HandsOff! movement organized locally by the Indivisible Las Cruces chapter. Indivisible is a grassroots coalition that formed in the wake of Trump's 2016 election.

"Government is not a business: it's a service, and this is the grassroots effort that will hopefully end the insanity at the federal level. For example, the tariffs I guarantee these companies don't move their

business to the U.S.; there are 8 billion other people worldwide. We need them more than they need us. But that's why I am here today, why everyone is out here today, to show that we will not give up our country that easily to Trump and his buddies. We will do this non-violently, we will do this through the courts and the ballot boxes," said Mary Brannon, a member of the steering committee with Indivisible.

# Call 811 before you begin your outdoor planting

CITY OF LAS CRUCES

April is National Safe Digging Month. So, as you begin thinking about outdoor planting in your yard or at your business, it is also a good time to remember to call 811 to locate the utility lines on your property BEFORE you dig!

Before you plant a tree, put in a lawn or a sidewalk, install a sprinkler system, put up a fence or start any other do-it-yourself project that involves digging, "you should call 811," said Las Cruces Utilities Locating Supervisor Joe Atencio.

If you hire a landscaper, contractor, installer or anyone else to do the work for you, plan to make the call to 811 yourself, to be certain all utilities and underground lines are located before work begins, Atencio said. And, remember to call at least two business days before you plan

to start digging.

Calls to 811 are answered 24 hours a day, seven days a week by an operator who links you with the City of Las Cruces Utilities Department (Atencio and his staff) to locate and mark all City water, wastewater and natural gas lines that connect to your property. The operator can also put you in touch with El Paso Electric and with companies that have installed below-ground fiber optics lines.

It's a free service most people don't know about, Atencio said, and calling 811 before digging is required by state statute.

As the City website explains, "New Mexico excavation law places certain responsibilities with the excavator for preventing damage to underground facilities." Excavators include everyone from contractors operating heavy equipment to one person with a shovel.

You can also submit a request to dig online at www.nm811.org.

As you plan your outdoor project, pre-mark the area where the digging will be done with white paint, flags or stakes.

Locating technicians will mark only City-owned utility lines, that is up to the gas or water meter. Beyond that, it's up to the homeowner to locate those lines. The 811 operator can recommend private companies to locate lines on the homeowner's side of the meter, which is done at the homeowners' expense.

In his job as the Locating Supervisor, "a unique challenge is presented every day," Atencio said. "To me, it doesn't get old."

Atencio has been with the city for more than 22 years. He began his career as a "potholer," which is the person who manually (and carefully!) digs into the ground to locate a utility line when GPS and other technology cannot find them. Atencio spent the first 19 years of his career in Utilities' Natural Gas and Energy Line of Business before moving over to Locating.

Las Cruces was an early innovator of new technology like tracer wires and GPS to locate utility lines, he said, and Locating still employs six potholers.

## NM Supreme Court invalidates felony murder conviction

The state Supreme Court vacated the first-degree felony murder conviction of a Las Cruces man for a shooting death at a house party in 2021.

But Mawu Ekon Revels could potentially face another trial, according to a news release. A jury convicted Revels of killing Nicodemus Gonzales when he and another man allegedly fired multiple times into a group of people during a fight at the house party. Bullets also hit the car of a voung woman who was driving away from the area, according to the news release. In addition to felony murder, Revels was convicted of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, shooting

conspiracy to commit aggravated assault, and conspiracy to commit shooting at or from a motor vehicle, according to the release. He was 17 years old at the time of the fatal shooting.

The New Mexico Supreme Court concluded on Monday, April 7, in a unanimous opinion that aggravated assault cannot serve as the underlying felony to elevate a homicide to a charge of felony murder which is what happened to Revels, according to the news release.

"Defendant's conviction for felony murder is legally invalid because it is based on the predicate felony of aggravated assault. Therefore, we vacate that conviction as a nonexistent

at or from a motor vehicle, crime," the Court wrote for resentencing and fur- charge, the Court explained release. in an opinion by Justice C. Shannon Bacon.

The Court vacated one of the conspiracy convictions, explaining there was not enough evidence to prove more than one conspiracy by the young men in pulling out their weapons and shooting, the press release states. The justices also concluded Revels improperly received a four-year sentence enhancement because a firearm was used in the crimes. The law imposes a one-year firearm enhancement for juvenile defendants like Revels who are charged with first-degree murder, according to the news release.

The Court ordered the case back to the district court in Doña Ana County

ther proceedings. Revels can be retried on felony murder or a lesser included offense, such as seconddegree murder, the Court of or collateral to the hoexplained. Double jeopardy protections prohibit a retrial for willful, deliberate first-degree murder because the jury acquitted him of that charge, according to the release.

New Mexico law provides for different types of murder in the first degree, all of which are punishable by life in prison. Felony murder is a second-degree murder elevated to first-degree murder when the killing occurs in the commission of a felony or attempt to commit a felony, according to the news release.

In vacating the murder

that New Mexico law requires the underlying felony for a charge of felony murder to be independent micide. Aggravated assault cannot serve as the basis for felony murder because it is not possible to commit second-degree murder without also committing some form of aggravated assault, the Court noted.

Double jeopardy protections do not preclude retrying Revels because the reversal of his felony murder conviction as a nonexistent crime was a reversal for a trial error and not an acquittal, the Court wrote.

"At bottom, a conviction for a nonexistent crime is a charging defect," the Court said, according to the news

The justices also explained that the reversal of the felony murder conviction does not warrant remanding the case to the trial court for sentencing on second-degree murder. The Court provided guidance to lower courts on applying what is known as the "direct-remand rule," which "applies only to cases that are reversed on appeal for insufficient evidence in other words, cases where the defendant has been acquitted – and its application depends on the evidence and the jury instructions given in each case." That rule does not apply to Revels because a trial error caused the reversal in his case, according to the news release.

## All four defendants in Young Park shooting indicted

#### **BULLETIN REPORT**

A grand jury indicted Tomas Rivas, the lone adult arrested in connection with the Young Park shooting, and the three minors also accused in the shooting that took the lives of three and injured

Third Judicial District Attorney Fernando R. Macias announced the grand jury's formal in-

dictment of first-degree groups. murder, including conspiracy to commit murder late Wednesday, April 2.

Law enforcement arrested Rivas and the three minors shortly after the shooting, which took place around 10 p.m. on March 21 at an unofficial gathering of young people showing off their cars. Police have said the incident began because of an altercation between two

"These indictments represent an important step in the pursuit of justice for the victims involved and underscores our commitment to upholding the law," said Macias. "The grand jury's decision to indict all defendants reflects the thorough investigation carried out by detectives of the Las Cruces Police Department and our office."

The defendants will be arraigned on Monday, April 7th.

"Lieutenant Peter Bradlev of the Las Cruces Police Department Criminal Investigations provided a comprehensive review of the evidence during his testimony before the grand jury," added Macias. "We deeply appreciate his dedicated efforts on behalf of the victims and our community."



# Shine a light on Roundhouse lobbying

It's hard to overestimate the influence of lobbvists at the New Mexico Legis-

In other states, legislators and their paid staff work full-time between sessions to study the issues, meet with their constituents and prepare bills. In New Mexico, our unpaid legislators are assigned to interim committees between sessions. Some attend those meetings, some don't.

Even those who do attend the meetings come ron ponying up nearly \$2 woefully unprepared for the avalanche of legislation to be considered in

30- or 60-day sessions. They will be greeted at the start of each session by an army of well-paid lobbvists who will be only too happy to help them fill in the blanks on whatever bill they may be seeking more information on. Let's discuss it over din-

According to a report by the nonprofit Common Cause, there are more than six lobbyists at the Roundhouse for every one member of the Legislature.

Lobbyists and their employers gave more than \$12 million in political contributions between the years 2021 and 2024, according to a report by New Mexico In Depth. Not surprisingly, the largest contributions came from oil companies, with Chev-

We can guess which side of the issue lobbyists representing Chevron are on, but they aren't required to tell us. A bill passed by the Legislature and awaiting the governor's signature. would change that.

House Bill 143, sponsored by local legislators Rep. Sarah Silva and Sen. Jeff Steinborn, both Democrats, would require lobbyists and their employers to file a report stating if they are in support or opposition to the bill they are lobbying on.

It would also lower the threshold for itemized expenditures from \$100 to \$50, And, thanks to an amendment passed on the House floor, it limits expenditures on food, entertainment and gifts to \$50 during the session.

The bill is being hailed by Common Cause as, "the biggest lobbying reform passed in New Mexico in the last decade." That may be true, but if so it's a sad indictment on the state of affairs.

Legislators often bristle at the notion of lobbying reform, insisting, "I can't be bought for a hamburger." That misses the point. It's not bribery, it's influence. If the price of a hamburger is all it takes to get a legislator to sit down and listen to a lobbyist's pitch, that was money well spent.

I've spent much of my career trying to inform readers about the actions of our government. I'm a huge fan of transparency ... open records laws, open meetings laws ... put it all out there for the world to

But the truth is, there's already a wealth of information about lobbyists available on the Secretary of State's website that nobody ever looks at. Exposing rot in the system is a good thing, but it doesn't

remove the rot. Forcing lobbyists to issue more reports won't lessen their influence during the session.

Incredibly, even this modest measure may be a step too far for Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham. As of Monday, she had yet to sign the bill. Maybe we shouldn't read too much into that. It's not unusual for a flurry of bills to be signed on the final day.

But the governor is finishing her second term. I worry that the voters of New Mexico don't mean as much for her future as those well-dressed men and women waiting outside her door.

he Las Cruces International Film Festival is in full swing, with cinefiles from across the state and beyond taking part in the event which began Wednesday, April 9 and continues through Sunday, April 13. Briefly, however, the stars themselves will be the limit as the Star Trek: Boldly Going from Script to Screen panel beams into the Rio Grande Theatre, 211 N. Main St., from 2-3:30 p.m., on Saturday, April 12.

If you're a fan of the Star Trek franchise, or just interested in how a story goes from script to screen, this panel is for you. In addition to featuring the star power of actors Michelle Hurd – who played Raffi for three seasons on the Paramount + series "Star Trek: Picard" – and Wilson Cruz – Dr. Hugh Culber on the Awardwinning series "Star Trek: Discovery" – there will also be a handful of writers and producers for several of the series in the franchise on hand to share their secrets.

At the festival to receive the Outstanding Achievement in Drama award, Hurd joined the cast of "Star Trek: Picard" in the second season of the wildly popular show as Raffi Musiker, a disgruntled former subordinate of Jean-Luc Picard (Patrick Steward), the former captain of the Enterprise D. Award-winning actor, producer, activist, "Actorvist," and humanitarian Wilson Cruz has become known

for playing complex gay characters, beginning with his ground-breaking GLAAD Media Award portrayal of Rickie Vasquez on the short-lived but critically-acclaimed drama "My So Called Life." As Doctor Hugh Culber onboard the United Federation of Planets starship Discovery, he was the voice of reason during the Federation-Klingon War a well as the vessel for the consciousness of a 24th century Trill Xenobiologist named Jinaal Bix. Together, they will offer a unique peek behind the scenes as they discuss the creation and exploration of characters in all three series, what it was like to create them, embody them, and add them to the pantheon of the almost 60-year-old franchise. Of greater interest to those who are true fans of the series, photo and autograph opportunities with the writers and actors will follow the panel discussion. Moderated by writer/producer Bill True, it promises to be an unforgettable event, whether you're a hard core Trekkie, or just a lover of the medium.

The NMSU Theatre Arts and American Southwest Theatre Company 2024-25 season concludes with the uplifting musical, "The Prom," a fictional story inspired by true events, running April 11-27 at the NMSU Center for the Arts, 1000 E. University Ave., Las Cruces.

The original concept created by Jack Viertel tells the story of four forgotten Broadway stars looking for a cause to support for self-gain. 



### Three Crosses gains internal medicine residency program

The group that accredits graduate medical training programs for physicians in the U.S. gave its approval recently to Three Crosses Regional Hospital for a new residency program in internal medicine, which will begin with 24 residents over the next three years.

The Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education approved accreditation for an internal medicine residency at Three Crosses in late January. Once accredited, the program received about

4.000 medical students from the U.S. and other countries. Out of that, hospital staff interviewed 60 and selected eight applicants for its first year, said Dr. Muhammad Owais Khan, a residency program director,



said. The program will include 24 residents over three years, he said.

Three Crosses Regional Hospital's new internal medicine residency program is "a lifeline for healthcare in our city and our county," Khan said.

Khan said the eight chosen are a diverse group and noted that most speak Spanish, which he called "vital" since Las Cruces is more than 50% Hispanic. The new residents will be welcomed to Las Cruces in July, Khan said.

The goal for the residency program is to train "quality physicians who are able to practice in-patient and out-patient medicine locally," said Khan, a native

Cruces in 2020.

"I want to locally train the physicians and keep them here." he said.


Three Crosses joins Memorial Medical Center and Mountain-View Regional Medical Center in having a residency program. Khan said, which means Las Cruces will be able to provide more primary care doctors "to alleviate the shortage and get everyone the same quality of care so they don't have to go outside Las Cruces."

Three Crosses residents will be trained by "very, very talented leadership" at the hospital, he said. The doctors who will lead the training are "board-certified internal medicine physicians." said Khan. Collectively, they speak seven different languages, he said, including Spanish.

"We are very blessed," said

of Pakistan who came to Las Khan, who, in addition to holding an M.D. degree, also possesses a master's degree in business and health care law. He also is board certified in quality assurance and utilization review and is a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Physicians and the Society of Hospital Medicine. ## **Short game guru Dave Pelz passes at 85**

In late March the golf world lost one of the most revered and influential golf innovators and instructors of all time with the passing of Dave Pelz. He was 85. Pelz became famous for his groundbreaking research and analysis of the short game of golf, played from 100 yards from the green.

Pelz began playing golf

vear golf scholarship to Indiana University. His only claim to fame in college was that he played 22 matches against a young Ohio State golfer named Jack Nicklaus, and lost 22 times. He graduated from Indiana as a physics major, after which he began career as a research scientist at NASA. He became a senior NASA sci-

Missing golf, Pelz applied his knowledge of physics and his passion for research and testing to the game, especially putting. He began measuring what happens when the putter head strikes the

promise. He earned a four- of player and club swing through the putter. He found that the majority of missed putts were because the ball was not hit in the precise center of the putter face.

In 1977 Pelz started a project that required an analysis of every shot in golf, using caddies, tour players and amateur golfers. He spent more than three years entering the data from thousands of golf rounds, including shot distance, proximity to the target and more. He came to the conclusion that 60% of golf shots are part of the "short game" - those attempts from within 100 yards of the hole. His data at an early age and showed ball, and the mechanics showed that pro players

with the best short games ing, including chipping, won the most money. That tended to confirm the ageold adage "drive for show and putt for dough." Another revelation he uncovered was that PGA Tour pros miss their shots from beyond 100 yards from the hole by an average of 7% of the total shot distance, whereas that percentage from within 100 yards. It turns out that Pelz developed golf analytics before analytics became the rage.

With his prodigious work on testing and development of golf training equipment, Pelz began to acquire a following of tour professionals as a specialist of short game teach-

putting and bunker play. From 1978 through 2021 Pelz's professional golf students won a total of 22 major championships. One of Pelz's pro students is Phil Mickelson, who attributes his winning six majors from 2004 to 2021 to work he did with Pelz.

Pelz approached the rises to 16-20% on shots problems and complexities of the difficult game of golf from the standpoint of "thinking outside the box." His inquisitiveness was contagious and compelling in that he saw things that seemingly didn't make sense and then got to their root cause. For example, he discovered that on a golf course the effect of

foot traffic around the hole late in the day caused an otherwise simple, straight putt to miss, which he called the "lumpy donut effect." In the manner of today's analytics, Pelz made professional as well as amateur golfers smarter about how a good "scoring game" leads to success.
