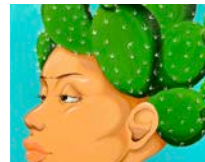

Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks under threat

Local conservation groups are worried that the Trump Administration could shrink the boundaries of the Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks National Monument or allow extractive mining or leasing.

Leaked documents and individuals who spoke on condition of anonymity to the Washington Post have indicated that OMDP as well as two smaller national monuments in northern New Mexico –

Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks National Monument and Rio Grande el Norte – are being considered to either shrink the boundaries or open up the land to extractive permitting. This has local conservation groups worried.

Patrick Nolan, executive director of the Friends of Organ Mountains-Desert Peaks, said that the Bureau of Land Management currently manages 495,000 acres of the OMDP.

Mark Allison, executive director of New Mexico Wild, told the Bulletin that the boundaries around OMDP were carefully considered and included an on-the-ground inventory of archeological, historic and cultural values.

Nolan said the monument boundaries contain

pictographs, cultural sites of importance to various Indigenous cultures, old homesteads from the state's land grant era and a portion of the Butterfield

Overland Trail traveled by stagecoach with passengers, mail and freight in the mid-1800s.

Carrie Hamblen, chief executive officer and pres-

ident of the Las Cruces Green Chamber of Commerce, said that if Trump issues an executive order to alter OMDP's boundaries or allow extractive

permitting, that the order would impact the city economically.

A study the Green Chamber commissioned in 2022 found that the OMDP generates \$35 million in positive economic impacts and that visitation to the monument supported 305 jobs.

The study also found that in 2022 visitors to OMDP resulted in \$1.9 million in tax revenue and \$13 million in taxes over a decade.

Hamblen said the last thing she wants to see is an oil rig against those mountains. She said the Organ Mountains are "an iconic symbol of our area."

This isn't the first time the Trump administration

More details emerge about Judge Cano's arrest

The U.S. Justice Department said late Friday that former Doña Ana County Magistrate Judge Joel Cano smashed a cellphone and his wife, Nancy, plotted to delete a social media account to prevent federal authorities from finding further evidence against a Venezuelan man accused of possession of firearms living on their property.

Federal authorities arrested the Canos late Thursday, April 24th. Joel Cano, 67, was charged with tampering with evidence. Nancy Cano, 68, was charged with conspiracy to tamper with evidence.

According to federal authorities, when they arrested Cristhian Ortega-Lopez, 23, a Venezuelan man, for illegal possession of firearms and ammunition in late February at the Canos' Las Cruces home, authorities seized four firearms believed to be in Ortega-Lopez's possession, along with three cell phones. During the search, authorities allowed Ortega-Lopez to make a phone call before he was taken to the Doña Ana County Detention Center, according to federal authorities. Ortega-Lopez allegedly told federal agents the phone he wanted to use was not among those recovered.

Video calls from the Doña Ana County Detention Center allegedly showed Nancy Cano in possession of what federal

authorities believed to be Ortega-Lopez's fourth, unrecovered cell phone. On March 7, Nancy Cano made a call through a private messaging platform offering end-to-end encryption for greater security, to a third-party person, named only as "Michelle," according to the USDOJ. Nancy Cano then used her own cell phone to facilitate a video-call conversation, through another enhanced security platform, between Michelle and Ortega-Lopez, according to federal authorities.

In a separate, April 20th call between Nancy Cano and Ortega-Lopez, Nancy Cano allegedly discussed with him deleting his Facebook account. The DOJ states in a news release that Ortega-Lopez's Facebook account is the platform he previously used to share incriminating content, including images the federal government says connects Ortega-Lopez to being affiliated with the Tren de Aragua gang and images of him holding firearms.

U.S. Homeland Security agents executed a subsequent search warrant at the Cano's residence on Thursday, April 24th, to locate Ortega-Lopez's fourth, unrecovered cell phone. During that search, Joel Cano admitted to smashing the cell phone with a hammer five weeks prior because he believed it contained photos and videos of Ortega-Lopez that would incriminate him, according to the DOJ's statement.

Using forensic analysis, federal authorities say that the recovered phone reveals messages that link Ortega-Lopez's alleged criminal activities, including affiliations with the Tren de Aragua gang and images of Ortega-Lopez in possession of firearms.

Federal agents arrested and charged Ortega-Lopez in late February with being an unlawful alien in possession of firearms and ammunition. Two other men associated with Ortega-Lopez were also living in the casita and they were also arrested because of an alleged association with Tren de Aragua, according to court documents.

The Cano's arrests came around a month after Cano resigned in March from his judicial office when he faced disciplinary action from the New Mexico Judicial Standards Commission. The New Mexico Supreme Court issued an order last month, in response to the Judicial

Standards Commission's actions, stating that Cano could never hold judicial office again, be a candidate for judicial office or exercise judicial authority, including officiating at a wedding, in New Mexico.

The case began when the U.S. Justice Department and U.S. Homeland Security began investigating three Venezuelan men living in a casita on the Canos' property in Las Cruces. Federal authorities say they received an anonymous tip that Ortega-Lopez was unlawfully present in the U.S. and that he was in possession of firearms. Homeland Security investigators found

Former NM county judge, wife released from custody

Former Doña Ana County Magistrate Court Judge Jose Luis “Joel” Cano and his wife, Nancy Cano, were released on separate \$10,000 bonds Tuesday in connection to federal charges of tampering with evidence in an immigration case.

The Canos appeared in U.S. Federal District Court in Las Cruces Tuesday before U.S. Magistrate Judge Gregory J. Fouratt. Joel Cano faces one charge of tampering with evidence while Nancy Cano faces a charge of conspiracy to tamper with evidence. The couple’s charges relate to their alleged connection to Cristhian Ortega-Lopez, a Venezuelan national prosecutors allege resides in the U.S. unlawfully and has connections to the Tren de Aragua gang.

The Canos have been in custody at the Doña Ana County Detention Center since Friday, according to the jail’s website. They appeared in court Tuesday in shackles, alongside over 70 other people facing criminal charges who were waiting to have their cases heard. The room had standing room only, and viewers included several of the Canos’ neighbors.

Fouratt agreed to release both defendants on \$10,000 secured bonds, on the condition that they: provide DNA samples; notify

the court of any address changes; surrender their passports and eschew new travel documents; don’t associate with Ortega-Lopez and avoid contact with possible witnesses to the case; don’t leave Doña Ana County without his approval; and provide pretrial service officials with information about their renters.

The Canos told Fouratt that they own nine rental properties and all but one are occupied. The judge said they must ensure they rent only to U.S. citizens or immigrants legally allowed to live in the U.S. Fouratt also said they must provide pretrial services with information about their renters and any overnight guests outside of immediate family.

The judge permitted the couple to continue to reside together in their long-time home, despite prosecutors’ worries that they might discuss the

case. Fouratt said he could not legally restrict topics of conversation between married couples.

“I want you to have a chance to convince any other judge you see” that the decisions the couple made related to this case were outside of their usual “decision-making,” Fouratt said during the hearing.

The U.S. Department of Justice announced the charges against the Canos in the same news release in which they announced the arrest of a Milwaukee County Circuit Court Judge Hannah C. Dugan for allegedly allowing a Mexican immigrant charged with domestic violence to temporarily avoid arrest by federal agents.

The Canos have not yet entered pleas to the charges, and neither of them have yet been scheduled for an arraignment hearing, according to court records.

Civil liability of 911 dispatchers resolved

A Las Cruces family won the ability to proceed on a wrongful death lawsuit against the New Mexico Department of Public Safety and the Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Authority.

The New Mexico Supreme Court clarified in a decision delivered on Monday, April 21, that 911 dispatchers and their governmental employees are not shielded by New Mexico law from being sued for allegedly mishandling a 911 call.

The decision came as a victory for the family of Isaac Brealey-Rood, who was 16 when he died in July 2020 after suffering a heat stroke during a hike

in the Organ Mountains east of Las Cruces.

During the hike with his mother, brother and two dogs, Isaac became ill, stumbled and fell. He overheated and became non-responsive, according to the complaint. His mother, Carissa Brealey, called 911 but the family waited an hour and 20 minutes before rescuers reached Isaac to administer aid and carry him the three quarters of a mile back to the trailhead, the complaint says. While the family waited, Carissa called 911 multiple times for help and responders reached the trailhead but waited for approximately an hour before heading up the trail to respond to the medical call, the complaint states.

The 911 dispatchers also called off ambulances twice and labeled the call a search and rescue when the family was not lost, said Mollie McGraw, the plaintiff's attorney. McGraw said the dispatchers

also mislabeled the call as a minor medical when Isaac was suffering a heat stroke, which is a major medical event. The dispatchers also called in a fire code inspector when it was not a call involving a fire or fire codes, McGraw said.

Isaac's temperature reached 106 degrees that day, according to the com-

plaint. He died the following day from multi-organ failure resulting from heat stroke.

The family filed a wrongful death lawsuit in 2023. The case went to federal court because the incident began on Baylor Canyon Trail, which is now federal land.

The defendants, which include the Mesilla Valley

Regional Dispatch Authority, Doña Ana County, the New Mexico Department of Public Safety and the city of Las Cruces, each filed a motion to dismiss claiming each is immune under New Mexico law, McGraw said. The state Supreme Court addressed whether the dispatchers could be sued, McGraw said.

The federal court then asked the New Mexico Supreme Court to answer the question of whether New Mexico law shields 911 dispatchers, McGraw said.

The state Supreme Court sided with the family in this case, stating that the New Mexico Emergency Medical Services Act allows dispatchers and 911 operators to be sued under the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

The Las Cruces Bulletin contacted attorneys for the Mesilla Valley Regional Dispatch Facility Authority and the New Mexico Department of Public Safety for comment but did not receive a response by the time of publication.

Carissa Brealey and

James Rood, the parents of Isaac, said they are happy to see progress being made in the court.

"We are relieved and grateful that the [state] Supreme Court recognized that the law allows 911 dispatchers to be held accountable for the tragic and preventable series of errors and communication barriers that were a cause of Isaac's death," they said jointly in an email to the Las Cruces Bulletin.

"Isaac brought out the best in everyone that he met, and his absence is felt every day. Our hope in pursuing this case is to prevent other families from suffering our heartbreak. In life, Isaac made the world a better place, and he continues to do so through our pursuit of justice on his behalf," Brealey and Rood said jointly.

The lawsuit can now proceed in federal court against all four defendants.

has considered remapping the OMDP. Former Secretary of the Interior Ryan Zinke traveled to Las Cruces in 2017 to assess the possibility. But after his visit, Zinke did not recommend reducing the OMDP's size. The Trump administration, instead, targeted two national monuments in Utah.

Nolan said this new consideration seems to be part of a larger plan to dis-

mantle the national park system. He called the current attempt "much more aggressive" than the first Trump administration's efforts.

Nolan said that exploratory mining could also be a threat if Trump changes the rules to allow permitting. Nolan said that if the land is available for oil and gas leasing, companies could buy up the land to use as leverage for other land swaps elsewhere.

Republican Party of New

Mexico Chairwoman Amy Barela said in a statement to the Bulletin that the party supports the Trump administration's review of federal land, including the OMDP "to ensure a balanced approach to conservation and economic growth.

"New Mexico's economy heavily relies on oil and gas, which accounts for nearly 40% of the state's tax revenues, funding critical services like schools, roads, and hospitals. Responsible

development of energy and mineral resources on federal lands can create high-paying jobs, strengthen local communities, and bolster the state's budget, which depends on royalties from oil and gas activities on non-tribal federal lands. President Trump's America First policies will deliver economic opportunities for New Mexicans while preserving the beauty and significance of our state's landscapes," Barela said.

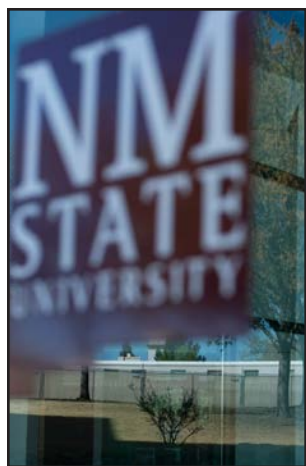
NMSU police searching for suspects

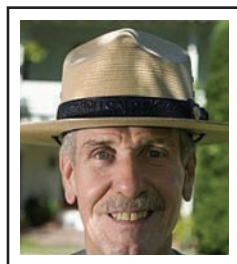

Las Cruces Utilities serving city in new, innovative ways

A mini trash truck, a latch that keeps trash bins closed, a data system that helps keep customers on budget and a drone that gives the department an aerial perspective of all its facilities are just some of the innovations the City of Las Cruces Utilities Department (Utilities) has recently put in place, said Utilities Director, Adrienne L. Widmer, P.E.

Many of these breakthrough improvements come from “team efforts” within Utilities’ Water, Wastewater, Solid Waste, Natural Gas and Energy, Business Services, Technical Support, Regulatory Compliance and Management of Information Systems Lines of Business, “and we’re always looking for innovations,” Widmer said.

Widmer and other members of Utilities’ upper management review any suggestion to improve the Department,

putting it through lots of background research, she said, to ensure it is feasible, affordable and safe. With a green light, the idea goes to the City Utilities Board of Commissioners for approval.

Because Utilities is funded entirely by the rates charged for its services, “We have to plan ahead to afford new innovations that our staff brings forward,” Widmer said.

Here are recent examples of how Utilities is serving Las Cruces in new ways:

- Little Grabby mini-truck was added to the Solid Waste fleet last spring to pick up trash on narrow streets where a full-size trash truck has a hard time maneuvering. The name “Grabby” was suggested by a third grader who won a naming contest. “Little” was added to honor William Little, a member of the Utilities Board from its 2006 inception

until he retired in 2024.

- User tracking technology is part of Utilities’ automated metering infrastructure that measures how much water and natural gas a customer uses. UtilityHawk, Utilities’ free service for customers, will alert you if there is continual flow of water in your home which could indicate there may be a leak, and will let you know ahead of time if you are likely to exceed your monthly utility budget. (Sign up for UtilityHawk at lascnm.utilityhawk.us/login.)

- A free and easy-to-use trash cart latch is now being installed by Solid Waste employees on all residential trash carts. The latches have a fastener at each end to hold your trash cart lid in place in case of tipping over in the wind. (All residential bins should have

the latch by early 2026.)

- Utilities’ drone gives the department “a bird’s eye view of all its facilities,” Widmer said. It can be especially helpful with roof inspections and a wide range of engineering functions like finding leaks in underground natural gas or waterlines and measuring grade and elevation.

While all these technological innovations are valuable, “we always need people,” Widmer said. “You will always have an on-the-ground person.”

Utilities is also researching an appropriate work-order system to change from paper to electronic forms to direct and track the work employees do, including, for example, locating a service-line leak, pulling the appropriate length of polyethylene line from the warehouse and making the repair.

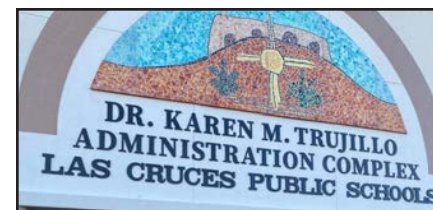

District hosts budget town hall meeting

Las Cruces Public Schools will host a budget town hall meeting on Wednesday, May 7 at 5:30 p.m. in the boardroom of the Dr. Karen M. Trujillo Administration Complex. Led by Chenyu "Alex" Liu, deputy superintendent of Finance, Procurement, and Budget and Matthew Saenz, director of budget analysis and development, the meeting includes a presentation and discussion of the proposed FY 2025-2026 budget for LCPS.

The May 7 event is the final in a series of budget town hall meetings during this budget cycle to provide transparency and demonstrate fiscal



responsibility to community stakeholders. The cycle includes collaboration by the Budget Survey Committee, a group of teachers, administrators, community members and staff who collected feedback on budget priorities using a public budget survey.

that Ortega-Lopez entered the U.S. near Eagle Pass, Texas, and was released due to overcrowding at the Border Patrol facility, according to the USDOJ.

Joel Cano said in a March 21st response letter to the disciplinary action he faced from state court, that Ortega-Lopez and the two other Venezuelan men living with him in the Canos' casita, were asylum seekers and that all three had asylum hearings with an asylum judge scheduled. Many immigrants seek asylum when crossing the U.S. border due to violence experienced in their home countries.

Cano also argued in his March 21st response letter that the three men had traveled freely through various U.S. security

checkpoints and that if they had lacked legal documentation, they would have been arrested at those checkpoints.

According to the USDOJ, multiple photos and video on social media show Ortega-Lopez and other undocumented men handling firearms at a shooting range in Las Cruces. The guns included a Sig Sauer P365 handgun, an AR-15 rifle equipped with a suppressor and other high-powered firearms and ammunition, the USDOJ said in its news release.

The USDOJ also said that tattoos, hand gestures and clothing worn in the photos suggest Ortega-Lopez is affiliated with the Tren de Aragua gang. In March President Trump invoked a 1798 law which gives him wartime authority to detain or deport members of an "enemy nation." In his presidential

action, Trump said Tren de Aragua are "infiltrating" the U.S. and "conducting irregular warfare."

Cano, in his response letter, pushed back on federal authorities' claims that Ortega-Lopez and the other two Venezuelan men living in Cano's casita are members of the Tren de Aragua gang. Cano stated that ICE agents had viewed the Venezuelan men's tattoos when they crossed the border and that the Trump administration is deporting migrants regardless of due process laws.

If convicted of the federal felony charges, the Canos could each face a maximum penalty of 20 years in prison, three years of supervised release and up to a \$250,000 fine.

The Canos' lawyer, William Lutz, did not return a request for comment by press time.

Ammu Devasthali supports the arts and higher ed

Ammu Devasthali has devoted much of her life to study and to art.

So, it might come as no surprise that Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham appointed Devasthali in 2019 to New Mexico State University's board of regents to fill an unexpired term. Devasthali is now the chair.

"I have never felt held back because I am a woman," Devasthali told the Bulletin. "In this com-

munity, nobody has said, 'You're different.'"

Devasthali, a native of India, came to Las Cruces from Chicago with her husband, Rama, in 1987.

But before migrating to the U.S., Devasthali earned a bachelor's degree in Russian language from Nehru University in New Delhi, then pursued a Master's degree and a Ph.D. in Soviet literature from Moscow State University in Russia.

Once she and her husband moved to Las Cruces, Devasthali began taking

art classes at NMSU while raising her son and daughter. She earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in

printmaking then went on to earn a second MFA degree in painting.

Devasthali opened up her own art studio, called Art Ventures, and a jewelry business called Designs by Ammu.

She also became a fierce advocate for the arts and a long-time community activist and philanthropist.

Devasthali has led campaigns to raise millions of dollars to build the Associated Students of New Mexico State University, or ASNMSU, and its Center for the Arts, as well as Devasthali Hall. ASNMSU Center for the Arts houses the Theatre Department and its performing arts spaces while Devasthali

Hall is home to the Art Department and the University Art Museum.

Devasthali has also served for more than 13 years as a board member for the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico, helping create the SpringBoard scholarship program that gives women in southern New Mexico opportunities for advanced education.

Devasthali said her mother was her "mainstay."

"She grew up in a culture that wasn't always kind to women," Devasthali said.

But, she added, her message to her own children was "advocate for your-

self."

"If you have an idea you truly believe in and you can back it up with action, don't ever back down," she said.

Ammu and Rama Devasthali received the 2016 Governor's Award for Excellence in the Arts. Now, as regents chair, Devasthali says she believes in NMSU's new president, Valerio Ferme. She said he will not balk at "making tough decisions."

Lujan Grisham reappointed Devasthali to a full six-year term in 2022. She is in her fifth year as board chair.

"I do what I do because I love this university," Devasthali said.

Firefighters assist County with fire

Judge sides with plaintiffs in Yazzie/Martinez NM education equity case

ORDERS PED TO COMPLETE REMEDIAL PLAN BY LATE 2025

A New Mexico district court judge on Tuesday, April 29, found that the Public Education Department has not complied with previous orders in the Yazzie/Martinez education equity case and ordered the state to begin the process for creating a plan to rectify the situation.

Parties in the more than 10-year-old Yazzie/Martinez case returned to court after plaintiffs filed a motion of non-compliance in September 2024, pointing to continued poor student outcomes, high turnover within the PED and high teacher vacancy rates.

First Judicial District Court Judge Matthew Wilson concurred and said the state needs a plan to ensure progress is made and tracked.

“A court-ordered plan would provide guidance to the Legislature and the executive branches of government, particularly when making difficult budgetary decisions that need to survive political and economic shifts,” Wilson said during the hearing.

Plaintiffs’ legal counsel had proposed appointing the Legislative Education Study Committee to lead the development of the plan because the department has permanent staff and access to educational research. However, Wilson said because the LESC is not party to the case, he does not have the authority to direct them to create a plan. Instead, PED is tasked with developing a plan and LESC can provide input.

Wilson gave the PED until

July 1 to identify an “outside expert and consultant to assist” in developing the plan and to file a status report with the court. The state then has until Oct. 1 to develop a draft report and file another status report with the state, “taking into consideration all of the components and elements raised by the plaintiffs in their briefing.” Wilson said the final plan must be completed by Nov. 3 and filed for the court’s review.

The plaintiffs outlined a proposed plan with nine goals to address the needs of Native American students, low-income students, English language learners and students with disabilities.

A PED spokesperson told Source NM that the department welcomes Wilson’s decision. According to court documents, the PED did not object to creating a plan but objected to the LESC taking the lead in the process.

“Improving student out-

comes is central to our mission and this plan will support lasting improvements to our educational system,” the PED told Source in

a written statement. The department also said the state has “substantially increased funding” and the department has made “significant steps” to improve student outcomes and teacher recruitment.

Melissa Candelaria, education director for the NM Center on Law and Poverty, which represents the plaintiffs, said plaintiffs still see the court’s decision as a “victory” because LESC will still be involved. She said the plaintiffs will be involved as well, because

Wilson ordered that stakeholders be consulted.

She said the plaintiffs will need continued support “as we go forward in holding the state accountable in implementing the plan and ensuring that the voices are at the table in the development of the plan, as the court said just a little while ago,” Candelaria said during a news conference following the court’s decision.

Wilhelmina Yazzie (Diné), one of the original plaintiffs, was emotional following the court’s decision.

“I think it’s about time, and I really am staying positive. As I mentioned, my boys were young when we started this, now they’re young adults,” Yazzie told Source NM.

Stanford researcher: U.S. at a 'tipping point on' measles resurgence

A new report from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention notes that the current measles outbreak marks the second highest annual case count in 25 years, and more than 80% of the nearly 900 current cases are associated with the "ongoing outbreak in close-knit communities with low vaccination coverage" in New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas.

Overall, 96% of the cases have been among people confirmed as unvaccinated, or with unknown vaccination records.

As of Tuesday, New Mexico had 66 cases, with no new ones reported yet this week. Most of the state's cases are in Lea County, just across the state line from Gaines County, Texas, where the outbreak began in mid-February.

Measles, one of the most contagious diseases known to science, is a respiratory virus which is spread through contact with droplets from an infected person's speech, coughs or sneezes. Symptoms, such as fever, headache, red eyes, runny nose, and a spotty red rash, can take weeks to develop. People can spread measles days before they show symptoms.

Heath officials say the best prevention from measles infection is two doses of vaccination.

From Feb. 1 to April 25, 20,304 New Mexicans received a dose of the measles vaccine statewide, nearly double the 10,860 people over the same time last year, according to the New Mexico Department of Health. The national vaccination rate has slipped from 90.8% for one dose of measles, mumps and rubella, below the 95% threshold to prevent outbreaks from spreading.

In 2000, after decades of vaccination, the CDC declared measles eliminated in the U.S., but if current vaccination rates continue, or decline further, measles may become commonplace again, according to research co-authored by Dr. Nathan Lo, an infectious diseases physician-scientist at Stanford University.

"It was striking for us, just seeing how much the U.S. was at this tipping point for

measles, where small declines in vaccination can put us very certainly on the path for measles returning," Lo told Source NM in a phone call. "But also, small increases in vaccines can push us back into safe territory."

In research published in the academic journal JAMA last week, Lo and other researchers at Stanford used mathematical models to estimate how four serious diseases eliminated by vaccines in the U.S. (measles, rubella, polio and diphtheria) might reemerge based on vaccination rates. The models run thousands of simulations, projecting what the changes look like in the next 25 years.

A 10% decrease in people choosing to vaccinate could spur an estimated 11 million measles cases over 25 years in the U.S.

Even at the current levels of vaccination, measles could reestablish itself in the U.S. with hundreds of thousands of cases over 25 years.

"We're still very likely on the path toward measles return, but it won't happen for sometime," Lo said, estimating that reemergence is about 20 years away.

The state with the highest risk of measles: Texas. This is in part due to declines in vaccination rates, but also due to its large cities with international travel and demographic features, such as the age of the population.

As for New Mexico, Lo said: "One of the

risks is being next to Texas, I think that's been made clear."

Prevalent measles infections would mean preventable illness-related deaths, often in children, and long-term injuries such as brain damage, he said.

"There's a number of rare but real neurologic complications that happen from measles; some of which are universally fatal and many of which lead to lifelong disability," he said. "Those are the really unfathomable types of outcomes we hope don't come to pass."

For the other childhood diseases to reemerge, there would need to be a significant drop in vaccination rates, such as a 30% to 40% decline, he said.

That's unlikely to happen without big policy shifts from the federal government, Lo said, such as changes to the childhood vaccine schedule, reducing potency of vaccines or revoking vaccines' uses.

"Suddenly, those scenarios of vaccine decline suggest that even rubella, polio and their really awful clinical complications such as babies born with birth defects and people living with lifelong paralysis or even dying, becomes much more of a risk," Lo said.

Lo said he hopes that not just policy makers, but parents and people considering getting a vaccine hear about the research.

"A small fraction of the population can really make a difference here," he said.

My daughter is in trouble again. She's suddenly grown a fierce attitude, perfected the art of the eye-roll and constantly pushes the boundaries of opposition to her parents. Luckily, though, she is six going on 16 and not actually 16. So, her recent suspension from the school bus, her fifth this year for safety concerns as a kindergartener, has been met with consequences. The whole family suffers because family movie night is cancelled; fun, weekend outings are being rescheduled; and after-dinner desserts aren't making it to the table for the foreseeable future. In addition, her dad

is picking out her school clothes (cringe!) and the occasional ice cream treat is just a distant, unreachable hope. But more than that, we've had to talk to her about our disappointment. We've discussed our expectations of her behavior and what we are trying to teach her as she grows. We reiterate that we still will always love her, but don't love her behavior sometimes.

In contrast, my son has always been a good boy. He is empathetic and he listens. But recently he, too, was starting to forget his manners with his teachers. Luckily, during his Individualized Education Program, his special education teacher mentioned it to us. We took him home, talked to him about his behavior and he was grounded for a period, similar to what his sister now faces. And wouldn't you know it, that same teacher texted me this week to say that our

son is now polite and kind and that he has even chosen not to follow some of his friends in poor choices they are currently making. She says that "he is a leader and not a follower". Now you have to understand, my son has autism. He has always unwaveringly sought the approval of his peers and he has, in the past, been taken advantage of because of it. So, for her to now say he is choosing the right path, even though it isn't the popular path, is such a profoundly proud moment for him and for us.

But this teacher was hesitant to mention his infractions. In retrospect, I am surprised that she did. I am sure teachers are regularly met with apathy or indignation by parents who don't care, or who are embarrassed, or whose pride will ultimately be their child's downfall.

I am conflicted. On one

hand, our daughter must be taught manners and how to be a good person. But on the other, I secretly admire her fearless ferocity, because I know that this world is not kind to good little girls who blindly follow authority.

But my hesitation to punish her fades as soon as I think about the consequences if she is allowed to grow up without rules. I am instantly resolute in the knowledge that it is no longer the old adage of "spare the rod and spoil the child" but rather to doom that child to a life of crime. Because it is this lack of authority, a lack of respect for our most basic societal expectations and a complete lack of fear of any consequences that leads to what happened at Young Park.

I hope that my children look back when they are grown and appreciate that being a parent requires

strength even in the face of crippling uncertainty and outright emotional pain. Every decision is languished over if you're doing it right. And in these uncertain times we all live in today, with all of the outside influences of what can only be described as evil, it is truly the hardest job to raise good human beings to adulthood; to make sure they can make good choices even when you aren't there to catch them. And I hope that my children realize that that is truly the greatest love. Much like that realization has been for me.

A trade war would hit this region hard

In 2007 I accompanied then-Gov. Bill Richardson

on a trade mission to Chihuahua, Mexico. I wasn't the only one. Business owners from throughout the state also made the trip south to negotiate deals with business owners in Mexico.

Until that trip, I didn't understand the importance of international trade to our state, espe-

cially southern New Mexico.

According to the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative, New Mexico exported a record \$12 billion in goods in 2024, supporting an estimated 14,000 jobs in our state. There were 1,332 different companies that exported products out of New Mex-

ico, with the vast majority of those being small and medium-sized businesses.

Not surprisingly, Mexico is by far our most important trade partner, with \$7 billion in exports in 2024. But we also had \$2 billion in exports to China, \$1.5 billion to Malaysia, \$255 million to Taiwan and \$215 million to Vietnam.

Agricultural exports from New Mexico accounted for \$910 million in trade in 2023, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Dairy products led the way with \$215 million in exports, followed by tree nuts with \$203 million.

The United States leads

City and schools can work to prevent shootings

The shooting at Young Park shows the brokenness of our community on multiple levels. For thousands of years, the most basic tenets of society have been “do not harm others or encroach on their property.” Here in Las Cruces and across New Mexico, we are seeing what happens when we do not uphold these rules.

Parents should be teaching kids from a young age that they cannot hit others, take other kids’ toys, or damage another’s belongings. In school, these rules should be reinforced so that they are engrained by the time the kids reach adulthood. There must be consistent and sure enforcement of these rules, no matter whether people are young or old, rich or poor, Hispanic or white, housed or homeless. These are literally the overarching rules that allow society to survive.

There have always been some parents who don’t raise their kids well, but now our schools are perpetuating the same cycle. I advocate for hundreds of teachers and parents across the state, and they have shared that kids in schools

are allowed to harm others and property with no real consequences. Kids throw chairs in classrooms, hit other kids, destroy bathroom facilities, and the teachers aren’t allowed to really stop it.

For example, a Las Cruces mother related that in her daughter’s class, one of the kids has intense temper tantrums. Instead of imposing consequences to help this child learn proper behavior, the teacher takes the rest of the kids out of the class and allows the child to trash the classroom.

An elementary teacher in Farmington shared a similar situation, with a little girl who is violent, repeatedly hitting the other kids. The teacher is not allowed to impose any real discipline nor move this girl to another class where she could receive more individualized attention. The other kids in class cringe in fear whenever the girl walks by, knowing she is likely to hit them.

A Las Cruces teacher told me the district has taken away any real tools for imposing discipline. The students are essentially allowed to do anything, with no consequences. Behavior issues are a prime reason that many teachers have left the schools, and this teacher would

not want her own children to attend public school here.

Year after year, all these kids are learning that no one will stop a kid who chooses to hurt others, steal, or destroy. By the time these kids are teens, they have escalated to fighting, doing drugs, shoplifting, stealing cars and guns, and shooting others. With New Mexico’s lax juvenile crime laws and catch-and-release policies, these kids are ripe for getting involved with organized criminal gangs and cartels, who know that youths can break the law with very little consequence. We now have many kids growing up with no respect for the most basic laws of society. And thus, we have high rates of juvenile crime with tragic consequences, like what happened at Young Park.

It’s not compassionate to allow kids to continue their violent, destructive behaviors. In the long run, this is harming kids as well as our community. Teachers and principals need to be allowed to impose swift, sure discipline for students who refuse to respect the rules. They need support from the superintendent and School Board in changing the culture.

City Council can ensure we have good

laws, that the laws are applied equally to everyone, that we have enough police officers to keep our community safe, and that there are sure consequences for those who break the law. Our state legislature refused to tighten up our juvenile crime laws, but City Council can follow the lead of Anthony and Alamogordo by implementing a curfew for teens that holds both teens and parents accountable. City Council can also greatly increase the salaries for our police officers in the upcoming union negotiations, so that Chief Jeremy Story will be able to better attract and retain officers.

If the City Council and School Board both decide they will no longer tolerate people harming others and their property, they can make a big difference for our community.

the world in pecan production, with an estimated 115,000 metric tons a year, according to the group Southern Ag Today. Georgia is the top producer, but New Mexico is a close second. Mexico is the largest pecan importer, followed by Canada and the European Union.

During the trade mission to Chihuahua, I had a chance to tour an auto manufacturing plant that was as modern and efficient as anything we have in our country. The woman who had moved from Michigan to Mexico to manage the

plant explained the complex network of manufacturers and suppliers in multiple countries that all played a role in the final product.

Maybe that was a mistake. The North American Free Trade Act of 1994 has led to greater efficiency for businesses and lower prices for customers, but it also caused manufacturing jobs to be shipped to other countries with lower labor costs.

With the benefit of 21 years of hindsight, it is worth having the academic debate as to whether NAFTA was a success. But it is folly to believe that networks created over two decades can be shattered overnight

without enormous damage to our economy and our standard of living.

We’re still in the bluster phase of our current trade war. On April 9 the administration put a 90-day pause on a raft of tariffs that were cobbled together so haphazardly that they included sanctions against an uninhabited island. Now we’re told the master dealmaker is working his magic.

Like everybody else in the rest of the world, I have no idea what will eventually emerge from this. I understand the argument for tariffs. The reason pecan exports to China have fallen is because of tariffs imposed by that nation.

There is a case to be made for targeted, measured tariffs needed to level the playing field. But, if the goal is to undo NAFTA and return to a post-war era of booming industrialization, we’d be better off investing in a time machine.

With economists now predicting a recession, it’s clear that these tariffs will be bad for the nation. They will be worse for New Mexico, and devastating to southern New Mexico.

ICE is eroding the rule of law

"I got lucky," José told me. "Because they got the wrong person."

José, 28, who did not give his last name for fear of retribution from U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, ICE, said he was leaving his house in rural southwestern Colorado recently "when two federal SUVs pulled out, blocking my path in both directions."

Jose is not a criminal, though 10 years ago he crossed the border into the United States from Mexico without legal documentation. Since then, he's worked as a painter and a chef, has always paid federal and state taxes, and has never been in trouble with the law.

That morning, though, he was a target: "It was the migra, and they pulled me out of the driver's seat, forced me into one of their cars and asked me for identification."

Because the ICE agents were looking for someone else that day, and because

rural Colorado has limited jail space to hold detained migrants, they let José go. But they told him he had to show up for an interview at an ICE substation.

Jose didn't go to his interview. "I don't want them to find me," he told me. "I'm always looking over my shoulder. My life is here, but I've moved and have to start over again."

Jose's experience is not unique. Scores of people with darker skin – including Native Americans – have fallen prey to the new administration's trawl-net approach to immigration enforcement.

During his campaign, President Trump repeatedly said, "I will launch the largest deportation program of criminals in the history of America." His stated goal is to deport 1 million immigrants before 2026.

During the first 50 days of Trump's second term, ICE arrested nearly 33,000 people – but only half of them were convicted criminals. ICE also detained foreign students for voicing their political opinions,

arrested at least one legal U.S. resident, and wrongfully held foreign visitors for weeks, including a woman from Canada who was legally in the United States.

Created as part of the Department of Homeland Security, ICE was charged with policing immigration in the aftermath of the 9/11 terrorist attacks. Before 2003, immigration enforcement was primarily handled by other federal agencies operating within a far less militarized framework. Two decades later, ICE has ballooned into a federal behemoth.

ICE says its work is essential for national security, but its more than 20,000 employees operate with extraordinary freedom. Local and county police usually know and understand the community they work in, and in case of misconduct, they can be held accountable for their actions. But not ICE.

Under Trump, ICE has become increasingly aggressive in its tactics while appearing to focus on non-criminals and activists. In

recent months, ICE has concentrated on apprehending people far above the U.S.-Mexico border; used military planes as a tool of deportation; outsourced detention to third parties, including sovereign nations like El Salvador; and enlisted wartime law to bypass due process.

For the first time, ICE is also employing data from the Internal Revenue Service to identify some undocumented residents – a move that could also have devastating consequences for legal residents and citizens who get swept up with the undocumented.

Nayda Benitez, a director for the Colorado Immigrant Rights Coalition,

oversees a state hotline where people can report ICE activity in their community. "We've seen a huge increase in reports," she said. In one Colorado town, she said, ICE showed up at a trailer park, "and they put a woman into handcuffs who was a U.S. citizen."

As a legal advocate for immigrants in southwestern Colorado, I see the contributions of migrants everywhere. Children of immigrants attend local schools, and their parents work in every sector of the economy, including restaurants, transportation, construction, farming and ranching, hotels, resorts and hospitals. I also see the fear that immigrants are forced to endure, and the countless ways in which ICE agents disregard our

nation's most cherished rights, including freedom of speech, due process, protection from government excess, and cruel and unusual punishment.

"If you look at authoritarian leaders throughout history," Benitez said, "our nation is repeating some key patterns like academic censorship and the marginalization, criminalization and dehumanization of specific social groups."

It's time to take a stand against federal overreach, and ICE is the right place to start.

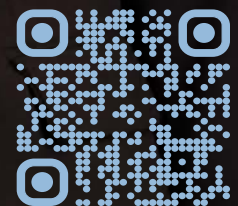

Crossing Borderlines explores cultural perspectives

Perspectives shift over time, creating a wealth of possibilities that make us uniquely human. Nowhere is that more apparent than within the cultural stratification of so-called minority societies. The month of May will present an opportunity to explore these shifts in cultural identity when Nopalitos Galeria hosts the Crossing Borderlines exhibition, opening Friday, May 2.

Artist Tonio LeFebre, from Pueblo, Colorado, thinks a lot about boundaries, cultural and otherwise. Born of mixed Pueblo and Hispanic heritage, he spent a lot of his early years living between cultures. As an adult he has dedicated his art to breaking down those boundaries to reveal the humanity underneath. He found a focus within the Chicano culture prevalent in Pueblo.

"My family moved from Las Cruces in the late '40s to work at the steel mill here," he said from his Colorado studio. "We often went back and forth to visit family. My family is Piro and Tewa, so throughout the years we kept our ties to the native community, but living here in Pueblo, it seemed so far away from all that. The Chicano community here is very inclusive, embracing people from all cultures who don't feel like they have a place in society. That's the environment I grew up in."

It was during one of those trips to Las Cruces to visit family that the idea for the Crossing Borderlines exhibition was born. It started

when a waitress recognized him as he and his wife Wanda were dining at Nopalitos restaurant on Mesquite Street.

"She introduced me to the owner Victor Gallegos, and he said he was interested in maybe hosting a one-man show," LeFebre recalls. "I said yes to the opportunity."

But then LeFebre looked at the gallery, which is an historic 1600 square foot adobe house with four bedrooms, built in 1920.

"I realized right away that I didn't have enough of my own work to display, so I asked him if he would be interested in me bringing some of my fellow artists from Pueblo to display their work with me," LeFebre said.

Victor agreed, and LeFebre returned to Pueblo and started connecting with artists he knew in the area. That process opened the project up to a variety of possibilities and mediums and showed him the wide-ranging implications of such a show.

"My first thought was to put together a Chicano-themed show, but the artists I talked to come from various age groups and experiences," he said. "We all have different perspectives of what it means to be Chicano. Me and the older guys, we grew up when activism and La Raza were part of the civil rights movement, while the younger people, they grew up in the lowrider and cholo version of the culture. So, instead of having the Chicano-themed exhibition, we would just do a Chicano

The opening reception on May 2 will also be making use of the outside patio, with music provided by Las Cruces group The Sons of Soul and Buffalo dancers from the pueblo,

who will open the show with a blessing ceremony. Additionally, Nopalitos will supply a patio menu so attendees can order dinner.

"I really think the pieces will create a lot of conversation, which is what we want," LeFebre said. "There are a couple of more political pieces, but mostly it's about culture and beauty. We're not there to tell anybody how to think, we just really want to make it a celebration of art and culture."

Q: It's been interesting to watch Dennis Quaid on "Happy Face." Has he done any other series?

A: The Paramount+ true-crime drama has just wrapped up its season, and before that, the actor did another show for that streaming service, 2023's

"Lawmen: Bass Reeves." That same year, he also was in the cast of the limited-run mystery series "Full Circle" for Max (directed by Steven Soderbergh, with whom Quaid also worked on the Oscar-winning 2000 movie "Traffic").

Quaid's television credits date all the way back to a 1977 guest appearance on Robert Blake's detective series "Baretta," and he made such TV movies as "Bill" and "Johnny Belinda" (both for CBS) in the early 1980s. Around that time, feature films such as "The Right Stuff" (1983) and "The Big Easy" (1987) boosted his opportunities on the big screen, so he largely stayed there, though he turned up on TV again on occasion.

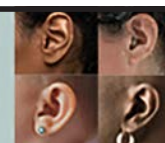
The first continuing series role for Quaid was in "Vegas," a 2012-13

CBS drama on which he also was an executive producer, as was fellow star Michael Chiklis. Quaid played the fact-inspired Sheriff Ralph Lamb, who battled attempted underworld infiltration of the gambling business in Las Vegas. The next series for Quaid was "The Art of More," a New York auction house saga that the streamer Crackle showed over two seasons (2015-16).

The thriller series "Fortitude" was shown by Pivot in 2015, with Quaid as part of an international cast that also included Stanley Tucci, Sienna Guillory, Jessica Gunning, Michael Gambon and Parminder Nagra. And "Merry Happy Whatever" was a seasonal 2019 offering on Netflix that featured Quaid as a family man stressed out by a variety of things at the holidays.

Truth or Consequences Fiesta celebrates 75 years

DEX REPORT

It's been 75 years since the city of Hot Springs, New Mexico, changed its name to Truth or Consequences, which makes 2025 the Diamond Jubilee of the Truth or Consequences Fiesta. Celebrating over the weekend of May 2-4, the annual event features vendors, games, food trucks, a beer garden, a junk boat race, a color walk/run, a rubber duck race, a skateboard competition, kid's fishing tournament, and a full slate of diverse and dynamic musical acts.

The year was 1950 and the inaugural event was a dual celebration of the 10th anniversary of the popular NBC national radio show "Truth or Consequences," which was preparing to debut a television version later that year, and of the decision by the City of Hot Springs to retire the name inspired by its coveted mineral-rich geothermal water and adopt the distinctive appellation of Truth or Consequences.

The renaming was spurred by a coast-to-coast promotional contest sponsored by the radio program. Ralph Edwards, the show's famously affable host, conveyed his gratitude to the city by launching the first annual Fiesta and returning every year with celebrity pals for half a century. Edwards, a multi-Emmy winner, passed in 2005, but as the saying goes, the show

must go on.

The fun begins at 5 p.m. on Friday, May 2, with opening ceremonies on the main stage in the Bank of the Southwest parking lot, 504 N. Broadway St. Performing for the crowd at 5:30 p.m. will be the Chachalacas from Albuquerque, followed at 7:15 p.m. by the Tequila Nights from Arrey/Caballo, and at 9 p.m. by the Rockabilly Strangers from Las Cruces.

Horsemanship aficionados will also find plenty to do at the 75th Annual Fiesta Rodeo at the Sierra County Sheriff's Posse Arena, 601 Rodeo Arena Rd. The gates open at 5 p.m. and the Rodeo starts at 7 p.m., with a featured performance by National Charro Trick Roping Champion Daniel Castro.

The next day at 8 a.m., Saturday, May 3, the 2nd Annual Color Walk/Run kicks off at the Tractor Supply, 499 S. Broadway, with a 1.5k race and all proceeds going to the HSHS Tigers Unidos. The official Fiesta Parade will travel the downtown loop starting at 10 a.m., followed by the opening of the Fiesta at noon.

Musical guests taking the main stage throughout the day Saturday include Pint & A Half, from TorC, at 12 p.m.; Casual Fridays, from Las Cruces, at 2 p.m.; National recording artists Syd Masters & the Swing Riders, at 4 p.m.; Papayas con Chile, from Las Cruces, at 6 p.m.; Burt Ferguson & Sierra County Line,

at 8 p.m.; and finishing off with comedy cover band Metalachi at 10 p.m.

Events happening throughout the day include the Sand Volleyball Tournament and the 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament, both starting at 12:30 p.m. in Ralph Edwards Park; and the Corn Hole Tournament at 1 p.m. in the Bank of the Southwest parking lot.

The Rodeo also continues at 2 p.m. on Saturday, at the Arena, with a featured performance by the Buckles & Belles Drill Team, followed by a 7 p.m. dance with music by Tudy Romero & the Silver Bullet Band.

On Sunday, May 4, the event continues with the Kids Fishing Tournament and a Skateboard Contest, both at 10 a.m. in Ralph Edwards Park. The Fiesta Junk Boat Races follow at 12 p.m. in the Rio Grande River. Also in the Rio Grande will be the Club Duck Races at 2 p.m.

The 2025 T or C Film Fiesta will screen locally made movies, and feature panel discussions and a reception, at the historic El Cortez Theater, 415 Main Ave., throughout both Saturday and Sunday. Vendors will be set up all three days at City Hall, 505 Sims St., and the Healing Waters Plaza, 300 Daniels St.

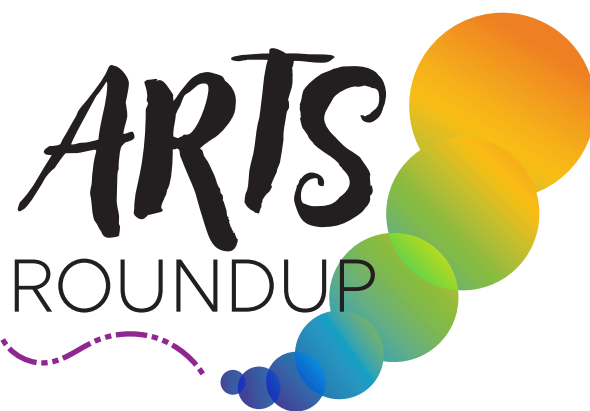

The past lives on in Bloomsday

Do we ever really let go of the past? No Strings Theatre Company presents Steven Dietz haunting play "Bloomsday," a lyrical time-travelling romance about "what-ifs," directed by NSTC's Artistic Director, Ceil Herman. Told with wit, humor, and heartache, Bloomsday is a buoyant, moving story about making the most of the present before it becomes the past.

Robert (Ed Montes) has returned to Dublin to find the love of his life Cait (Karen Buerdsell) who he fell in love with after having spent one single day together 35 years ago. But nothing is straight-forward in this play. Both his younger self Robbie (Atticus Starritt), as well as the young woman Caithleen (Autry Rebekah) are present and conversing with

their older selves. Questions arise immediately. Do these characters know the future? Can the future be altered?

Bloomsday, celebrated on the 16th of June each year, is the day when fans of James Joyce's 20th century modernist novel "Ulysses" dress up like the characters from the book. The play contains some references to the book but is not a simple retelling. A recurrent theme in the play is making the most of opportunities before it's too late. Robert quotes Leopold Bloom watching a man be buried and imagines what the man in the coffin might be thinking: "Wait, I wanted to. I haven't yet."

"Bloomsday" opens May 2 and runs through May 18 at the Black Box Theatre, 430 N. Main St., Las Cruces. The cast consists

of Karen Buerdsell as Cait, Ed Montez as Robert, Autry Rebekah as young Caithleen, and Atticus Starritt as young Robbie. Peter Herman is light and scenic designer, Autumn Gieb and Karen Buerdsell are the costume designers, Autumn Gieb is stage manager and board operator, and Sarah Babin is the assistant stage manager.

Performances are 8 p.m., Fridays, May 2, 9 and 16, and Saturdays May 3, 10 and 17. The Sunday matinees are at 2:30 p.m. on May 11 and 18, and the Thursday performance on May 15 is at 7 p.m.

Vaccinate horses

BULLETIN REPORT

Horse owners should vaccinate their animals against West Nile virus.

The New Mexico Department of Agriculture (NMDA), in partnership with the New

Mexico Department of Health (NMDOH) and the New Mexico Livestock Board, encourages horse owners to contact their veterinarian about vaccination. West Nile virus and other mosquito-borne diseases, such as Eastern

and Western Equine Encephalitis, pose serious health risks to horses.

Horses become infected through mosquito bites, and while many may not show symptoms, some can experience serious neurological illness, or even die. Clinical signs may include fever, stumbling, muscle tremors and behavior

changes.

"Vaccinating horses against West Nile virus is one of the most effective steps owners can take to protect their animals during mosquito season," said Dr. Samantha Holeck, New Mexico state veterinarian. "Prevention through vaccination is far safer – and often less costly – than try-

ing to treat the horse after infection."

In 2023, New Mexico saw 19 confirmed cases of West Nile virus in horses—six of which were fatal. According to the American Association of Equine Practitioners, West Nile virus vaccination is considered a core equine vaccine. "There is no specific

cure for West Nile virus in horses," said Dr. Erin Phipps, NMDOH Public Health Veterinarian. "Vaccination is the best protection."

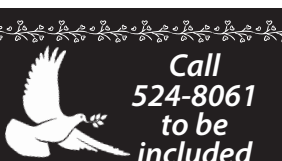

Recognizing our cultural history

HISTORIC PRESERVATION MONTH

May is Historic Preservation Month and history is all around us in Las Cruces.

If you live or work in one of the older parts of town, eat in one of the fine restaurants, or visit the shops, parks and art galleries in these areas, you have been surrounded by the places where history happened and where our unique culture developed. The importance of our local history has begun to be officially recognized and honored by listing these places on the Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties.

If you walk down Mesquite Street in the Mesquite Historic District, El Camino Real is right under your feet. You are walking where, for 300 years, traders, Indigenous peoples, soldiers, settlers, and monks walked, rode

their horses, and drove their oxen between Mexico City and Santa Fe. You can almost feel their presence beside you; can almost hear their horses' hooves clop, the oxen grunt, and calls of greetings or warnings.

Great-great grandchildren of the settlers still live in the adobe homes of their ancestors and carry on family history and traditions. The Native American youth of the Piro, Manso, Tiwa pueblos still dance at the yearly religious ceremonies. Klein Park is a focal point of community gathering, from large scale events to community youth groups practicing T-ball and ballet folklórico.

Several neighborhood groups use the park for yearly events. One group has revitalized the Pachanga, a traditional Mexican festival that was very popular in the 1950's. It was then called Fiesta de Las Cruces. They have

kept the foods, arts and crafts and games that are part of the traditions and added a lowrider car show that draws thousands of visitors. Another group holds a Winterfest with Santa and Mrs. Claus distributing presents to the local children and youth.

Main Street was the heart of the city from 1849 until the mid-1960's. It was the place where the community came to shop, eat, socialize, and

have concerts, dances, and plays on the plaza of St. Genevieve's Catholic Church. The elders of the neighborhood would meet daily to discuss the 'affairs of the world' and watch the people and cars go by. In the 1960's it was the site of the first play by the Las Cruces Community Theatre. You could gather at the post office, pay your utility bills at City Hall, have a soda and hamburger, go to the

movies at the Rio Grande, State, or Plaza theaters, or buy the latest fashion. There was always something to do downtown for community members of all ages and cultural backgrounds.

Building styles

High-style buildings, like the impressive Judge H. B. Holt home, a Trost designed Mission Revival house on Alameda Boulevard, are culturally sig-

nificant as much for their design as for who lived there. But at least as significant are the vernacular adobe buildings that are the still-existing embodiment of a tradition that continues today.

Some are associated with individuals who, for better or worse, left a mark on their times. A modest bungalow on South Miranda Street was once

home to New Mexico's first U.S. senator, and later Secretary of the Interior in the Harding administration, Albert Bacon Fall. Unfortunately, he was also the first person holding a cabinet position to be convicted of a felony after accepting bribes from private oil interests in the infamous Teapot Dome Scandal.

Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties

The City Historic Preservation Commission has established the Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties which recognizes not only buildings, but places, such as parks or sites, where any of the many different groups of people who make up the rich culture of Las Cruces have, and still do, carry on traditional activities. Inclusion on this register honors these places and buildings for either, or both, their historical and cultural contributions.

Anyone can propose a nomination for a site worthy of recognition, although the owners of the property must always

give their permission. Forms can be obtained from the Las Cruces Department of Community Development at 575-528-3059. If you live or work in an historic or

traditionally built building, or know of a culturally significant place, consider talking with the Specialist. He will help you decide if you wish to pursue it.

Benefits of listing in the Las Cruces Register of Cultural Properties:

Possibility of grants or tax rebates for restoration.

Rise in property value. Many people prefer to live in an older home with char-

acter than in cookie-cutter tract housing, and artists and other creatives favor the stimulating atmosphere of older neighborhoods.

It adds to the perception of Las Cruces as a historic city, increasing visitation and raising local revenue from Heritage tourism.

Misconceptions of listing your property on a historic register:

The government will tell me how to remodel my home, I won't be able to do anything with my property without getting permission first. No. Listing is only an honor and cannot overrule owner's rights.

I want to update my kitchen. Does it have to look original? No. You can do anything you want with the interior.

Listed properties are more expensive to maintain. Wrong. Material and labor costs the same for similar work on any building.

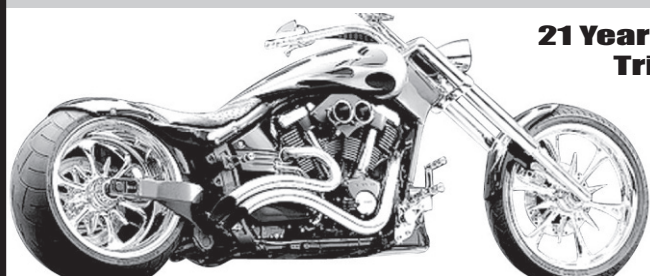
Only expensive and ornate properties qualify for listing on a register; Wrong again. History and tradition also happen in small, simple buildings.

Will I have to open my home to yearly tours? No. You are never required to open your home to visitors.

From Las Cruces to the lights of the NBA

Two former New Mexico State University alumni basketball players are competing for the highest basketball honor: to call themselves an NBA champion.

The race for the NBA Larry O'Brien Championship trophy is showcased by two former Aggie players – Pascal Siakam and Trevelin Queen. The only two active players from New Mexico State University in professional basketball, both managed to make the NBA Playoffs in the 2024-2025 season. Siakam plays for the three seeded Eastern Conference Indiana Pacers and Queen plays for the seven seeded Eastern Conference Orlando Magic.

While at his time at New Mexico State University, Siakam won WAC Newcomer of the Year in 2015, WAC All-Tournament Team in 2016, WAC Player of the Year in 2016, as well as a back-to-back WAC All-Defensive Team player, WAC All-Conference First Team player, and a NABC All-District First Team player. In 2015 and 2016, while representing the Aggies, Siakam averaged 12.8 points, 7.7 rebounds, and 1.3 assists per game, all while playing 30.8 minutes per game in the 2014-2015 season. In the following year, he averaged 20.2 points, 11.6 rebounds, and 1.7 assists per game, while playing 34.6 minutes per game in the 2016 season.

The NBA playoffs are something Siakam is familiar with. The Aggie alum has been to the playoffs nine times since being drafted in 2016 to the Toronto

Raptors. During his time playing for the Raptors, he was named Most Improved Player across the entire NBA in 2019, All-NBA Second Team in 2020, All-NBA Third Team in 2022, was a two-time All-Star Selection, and worked alongside Kawhi Leonard to help the Raptors win their first and only NBA Championship in the 2018-2019 season. It was the 2023 season, when Siakam was traded to the Indiana Pacers where he continues to compete. As for the current NBA season, Siakam has averaged 20.2 points, 6.9 rebounds, and 3.4 assists per game, and he became an All-Star for the third time in his NBA career.

The other former NMSU player, Queen has had a different path to the NBA. The Aggie alum went undrafted in 2020 yet continues to show that he can still play against the best. Starting in the G League to develop the skills for the NBA, Queen was awarded All-NBA G League 1st Team in 2022, All-NBA G League 2nd team in 2024, All Defensive 1st Team in 2022, and was named the Most Valuable Player in the 2021-2022 G League season.

Transitioning to the NBA, Queen has been part of the Houston Rockets, Indiana Pacers, and now plays for the Orlando Magic. He has averaged 4.9 points, 1.7 rebounds, and 1.1 assists per game while only playing 31 games during the current season.

While playing at the Pan Am Center in Las Cruces, Queen played over 50 games and won WAC Tournament Most Valuable Player, WAC All-Tournament Team, and became a

one-time WAC Player of the week in 2019. WAC All-Conference Second Team, Cayman Islands Classic All-Tournament Team, and NABC All-District Second Team all awarded him in 2020. Queen only played two years at NMSU but he averaged 7.8 points, 2.9 rebounds, and 1.7 assists per game in 2018. In 2019 he began to take off, averaging 13.2 points, 5.2 rebounds, and 2.4 assists per game.

Becoming an NBA champion is no easy task. Siakam will be competing against the Milwaukee Bucks, who captured the NBA championship in 2021. The Bucks are led by this season's Most Valuable Player finalist Giannis Antetokounmpo in a best of seven game series. As of press time, the Indiana Pacers are up on the series with 3-1 on the Bucks.

The Orlando Magic has a chance to knock off the defending NBA Champions, Boston Celtics, led by finals MVP Jaylen Brown, All Star Jayson Tatum, and Jrue Holiday. However, as of press time, the Orlando Magic find themselves down 1-3 in the series.

There is a chance that both Siakam and Queen play against each other. If both of their teams make it to the Eastern Conference finals, it would hypothetically put both players just one game away from playing in the prestigious NBA Finals.

Coping with adversity: What you need to know

If you play golf, serious golf, you will face some adversity along the way. Life is like that, too. Life has a way of throwing curve balls at us. Adversity is sometimes failure, sometimes bad luck, and maybe bad decisions. On the golf course we face adversity every time we go out and play; some of our own making and some just by chance. Adversity and

misfortune are wicked bedfellows. The 1st Century Greek philosopher Epictetus once said, "It's not what happens to you, it's how you react to it." When bad things happen, it can cause some people to choke, and others to respond with a brilliant performance.

A perfect example of the latter was Rory McIlroy's triumph at the Masters on April 13, 2025. McIlroy, 35, had been battling demons in the majors for more than a decade. After winning four majors early in his career he had not won another in 11 years. In the 2014 Masters he had a four stroke lead going into the final nine holes, but sadly slipped to a 4-over-par 80, and finished tie

for 8th. This time in the final round Rory made two double bogeys on the front nine, and two more doubles on the back nine. Fans were thinking this is "déjà vu" all over again. But Rory defied the odds. He also slayed the demons with brilliant birdies to erase the doubles. And it was a winning birdie on the single playoff hole.

McIlroy had been working with the most respected and most well-known golf psychologist, Dr. Bob Rotella, who was there to support Rory at Augusta. In his book *How Champions Think*, Rotella explains about "failures" in golf: "On the golf course, it's best to treat failure as an accident." And that's ex-

actly what Rory did on Sunday after his four doubles. Rotella has also equated adversity with mistakes. He has said that the game of golf was originally created with mistakes in mind, and that's why golf courses are designed the way they are, with hazards and pitfalls of all sorts; mistakes will most assuredly happen. Golf would be boring otherwise. Rory has not disclosed any of the advice that Dr. Rotella had provided, but there is no question in my mind that sessions with the good doctor made Rory mentally strong enough to handle the guaranteed adversity and win the Masters.

Do you struggle with being able to handle ad-

versity? An important aspect of how you react to calamity is what you are telling yourself when disaster strikes. Are you someone who says under your breath, "I just ruined my round!" Or can you take a blow-up hole in stride, and continue to play on confidently, as if it never even happened? Positive self-talk requires you to be your own caddie and lift your spirits when you're sagging. Golfers who have mental resilience can quickly recover from setbacks by maintaining control of their emotions, staying focused on the task at hand and having a positive mindset. There's an old saying that goes, "If it doesn't kill you

it will make you stronger," and it applies to golf. We all need to understand and accept the fact that adversity, setbacks, awful mistakes and bad breaks are inevitable in golf. If there are too many of them in your game, and it's getting you down, don't get depressed - put in more time practicing and get professional instruction.
