City budget increases funding for Fire Department

The Las Cruces City Council voted unanimously to pass the city's budget for fiscal year 2026 at the May 19th city council meeting.

The over \$612 million city-wide budget sees monetary increases to the police department, fire and emergency services, and programs aimed at helping the unhoused community.

The Las Cruces Fire Department was allotted \$31.1 million from the \$175.3 million general fund, an

compared to last year. The Las Cruces Police Department got approved a \$1.9 million increase totaling \$41.1 million for the upcoming fiscal year.

Thirty new jobs were also approved with the fire department receiving nearly half of them. Fourteen new positions - three lieutenants, three drivers and eight fire fighters - were created, aimed at staffing the new Fire Station 9 once construction is completed in early 2026. The department will also receive a Ford F150 and a Ford Maverick.

Project LIGHT – a crisis response team made up of behavioral health professionals through the fire department – saw the allocation of money to fund overtime for social workincrease of \$4.4 million ers in the program. At the

The Las Cruces Police Department also saw staffing increases as one code enforcement officer, and

one animal control officer will join the department. LCPD will also receive nine new vehicles including eight Ford Interceptors and one Ford F150 with the latter going to the animal control officer. The eight Interceptors will replace eight older vehicles in service.

LCPD was also budgeted for the National Integrated Ballistic Information Network, or NIBIN, lease. NIBIN is a system that aims to help compare ballistic evidence faster. Budget and Grants Administrator Jaqueline Rubalcava said that "this will improve our ability to solve firearm related crimes."

DEADLINE TO PROTEST PROPERTY VALUE IS JUNE 2

Notices of Value were mailed out May 1, following a one-month delay due to pending state legislation impacting veteran tax exemptions. Residents have until June 2 to file a protest or request a property tax exemption.

Under the New Mexico Property Tax Code, individuals may dispute their property valuation or update their status to qualify for exemptions, including head of household, veteran's, charitable, or educational designations. No protests or status changes will be accepted after June 2.

LCPD have not released name of officer involved in shooting

Las Cruces Police Chief Jeremy Story still has not released the name of the officer involved in a shooting that took place around dawn on Thursday, May 8th.

Story and the City of Las Cruces held a press conference on May 20th to divulge more information regarding the police shooting earlier this month that left one person dead. Story said the delay in holding a press conference was due to his and other LCPD members' attendance in Washington D.C. for National Police Week. He did not divulge the officer's name who was involved in the shooting. Mandy Gus Leatherwood, spokesperson for the City, told the Bulletin that the officer's name has not been released vet because the incident is still under investigation.

Story said the shooting took place at 6:30 a.m. in the parking lot of 925 S. Walnut St., near Lynn Middle School. A patrol officer was parked across the street behind a business doing paperwork, Story said and did not see the incident until gunfire erupted.

Witnesses told police two teenagers were walking north on Walnut Street when a sedan carrying four people drove past, Story said. The young men involved in the incident allegedly told officers the incident began when the two groups argued near the

intersection of Walnut St. and Sambrano Ave. over how both parties looked at each other.

Witnesses told police that during the argument, both parties allegedly brandished firearms. No shots were fired at this time as the two teenagers who were walking continued north to the intersection with Nevada Ave., according to Story.

Near this intersection, two people from the sedan - one of whom was 18-year-old Josiah Perrault- began chasing the two teenagers who had been walking, Story said.

The two teenagers fled into a business' parking lot of 925 S. Walnut St., across from Lynn Middle School, where the officer in question was parked in who was shot did not sufhis patrol car.

At this time, the unnamed officer intervened and fired his weapon. Perrault was struck by gunfire and pronounced dead at the scene.

Witnesses related to Perrault said he pointed his gun at the officer before being struck, according to Story.

Body cam footage started after the shooting took place, which Story showed during the press conference. Story explained that the officer's body camera had to be activated manually and the officer was unable to do so due to the speed of events.



"Imagine if two people run in front of your car and then gun fire erupts," Story said. "It is understandable that your first instinct is to not manually activate the camera."

> Perrault had a history of ment in the past, Story said. He had been charged with aggravated fleeing and evading an officer in May 2024. Police believe Perrault was the driver of a vehicle involved in a drive-by shooting in March 2025 and police recovered two weapons immediately after the shooting during a traffic stop, Story said.

> Story also said Perrault was a passenger in a vehicle that fled from Doña Ana County Sheriff's deputies in April 2024. A firearm was involved in that incident but Perrault was not charged. Story said.

volved in the incident were under the age of 19.

"Ultimately this is another example of losing our teenage boys for meaningless acts," Story said. "I think that is a deeper problem that we need to address."

This event marks the second police-involved shooting in Las Cruces this year, matching the total from last year.

More charges may be brought against the others with firearms.

The officer, who has two years of experience with the Las Cruces Police Department. has been put on administrative leave. which is standard procedure for discharging a weapon.

Richard J. Ketchum died May 21, 2024. Richard, nicknamed Dick, was born in Lexington, Kentucky, May 6, 1941. Dick grew up in Chicago attending Scott Elementary and Hyde Park High.

Happy summers were spent in New York State with his cousins on their farms. Dick loved the White Sox and Cubs, was a long suffering Chicago Bears fan and enjoyed the glory days of Michael Jordan with the Chicago Bulls.

Dick attended Beloit College in Wisconsin. His junior vear at Beloit he studied at the University of Freiburg in Germany. He traveled to Europe on a freighter, bought a motorcycle and toured Europe before he began his studies. Since all his classes were in German he became fluent in the language.

He attended the University of Pennsylvania where he earned his doctorate in Philosophy. Hired by Vanderbilt University as an Assistant Professor he taught there for four years before being recruited to the University of California-Santa Barbara. He loved Santa Barbara and it was there that Dick's love of birdwatching began. For the rest of his life. wherever he traveled, his plans included "birding".

Dick spent seven years teaching in the Philosophy



Department in Santa Barbara. He met his wife, Jill, in Santa Barbara. They were married in 1979 and moved to Miami. Florida. where he taught at Florida International University. Dick and Jill enjoyed living in Miami taking advantage of their proximity to **Everglades National Park** to bird.

Dick took a visiting professorship at the University of Texas at Arlington. He and Jill visited state parks in Texas and Oklahoma pursuing new birds. Dick was then offered a professorship at the University of Missouri-St. Louis.

and with its proximity to Chicago it made for many enjovable weekends visiting family. In 1984 Dick took a teaching job at Lindenwood College in St. Charles a few miles from St. Louis.

Dick was ready for a new adventure when he was offered a teaching job at NMSU in 1985. Dick taught at NMSU in the Philosophy Department until

his retirement in 2002 and was Department Head for the last five years.

Dick loved living in Las Cruces. He enjoyed birding in the state. He and Jill loved getting good Mexican food whenever they wanted. Green Chile hamburgers were a favorite.

Dick loved to travel and after he became interested in birding he would always combine the two. Before he and Jill were married, he backpacked for a month in Alaska. Belize was a special adventure for him. He and Jill traveled twice to Thailand, South Africa and Ecuador.

Dick loved France and taught himself the language. He always said he knew hotel and restaurant French. He and Jill took 25 trips to France with each a month long. France would combine three wonderful things for Dick: good food, good wine and good birding.

After Dick retired, he Dick enjoyed St. Louis and Jill traveled to California to visit family and favorite places. And of course Dick would bird.



Petition to stop new zoning ordinance fails

Tensions flared during the City Council meeting on Monday, May 19th, when the city disagreed with petitioners over the number of signatures a group obtained trying to halt the city's new zoning ordinance.

The City Council voted not to accept the petition for a referendum on Realize Las Cruces in a 6-1 vote. Councilor William Matice voted in favor.

A grassroots group led by Sarah Smith has been trying since March to gather enough signatures on a petition to halt Realize Las Cruces, the city's new zoning ordinance that the city worked on and held public meetings over since 2020.

The Realize Las Cruces ordinance aims to bring higher housing density and more flexibility to land use to the city.

Las Cruces City Clerk Christine Rivera presented the state of the petition saying that it had 2,547 of the needed 3,240 valid signatures to successfully take it to the ballot box.

While the city did receive more signatures, many were thrown out due to not following the rules of gathering signatures for a variety of reasons. Organizers of the petition effort claimed that the signatures were unjustly not counted. Councilors responded by criticizing the petitioners of spreading "misinformation."

During her public comment, Smith said that the petition was signed by, "4,671 Las Cruces residents" but that many were thrown out due to people using nicknames, and elderly people needing other people to sign for them. Smith claimed that this should not invalidate the signatures.

After nearly an hour of divided public comment, City councilor Joanna Bencomo spoke saying that the petitioners were spreading "misinformation" about the integrity of the process and "exploited peoples worst fears about their neighbors" causing at least one person to leave the meeting angrily. Bencomo finished by saying that if you are against "diverse

County repairs more roads in Doña Ana

The Road Department will repair some roads with hot mix and chip seal until May 30 in the Doña Ana area, in the County's Districts 4 and 5.

The roads scheduled for repairs are Joe Gutierrez Street, Desert Wind Way, Webb Road, Sandhill Road and Ferguson Road.

All roads will remain open throughout the maintenance work schedule and traffic will be reduced to a single lane.

Hot mix is a type of asphalt made by heating a sticky material from oil and mixing it with small rocks. This creates a strong, smooth road sur-

face that can handle heavy traffic and harsh weather without breaking down.

Chip seal is heated asphalt liquid sprayed on the road's surface, followed by small chips. Chip sealing helps extend the life of asphalt by protecting the pavement from the effects of sun and water, increasing skid resistance and filling small cracks and other surface defects.

Motorists should reduce speed around maintenance areas, pay attention to signs and follow the guidance of road traffic control staff.

Doña Ana County under fire restriction

Due to increasingly dry and warm conditions, Doña Ana County, among others around the state, are now under a state ban prohibiting smoking, fireworks, campfires, open burning and open fires.

The Energy Minerals and Natural Resources Forestry Division announced the restrictions on Monday, May 19th. The restrictions will be in effect until the State Forester rescinds them.

The dry and warm conditions have been exasperated by low humidity, high winds and an abundance of drv fine fuels in both forest land and grass land. Wildfire danger is at extremely high levels.

The restrictions are in effect for non-municipal, non-federal and non-Tribal lands and, in addition to Doña Ana, include the following counties: Catron, Chaves, Cibola, De Baca, Eddy, Grant, Hidalgo, Lea, Lincoln, Luna, Otero, Roosevelt, Sierra, Socorro, Torrance, and Valencia.

ico expects the annual monsoon season to arrive on time, starting in July. If this proves true, and the monsoon rains are productive, the state could lift restrictions.

Emergency action in Sunland Park possible

A troubled Southern New Mexico utility scrutinized for recent arsenic violations has just logged vet another one, prompting state environmental officials to evaluate taking rare emergency action.

The Camino Real Regional Utility Authority manages drinking water and sewage for approximately 19,000 people in the southern portion of Doña Ana County, Sunland Park and Santa Teresa. The area has high levels of naturally occurring arsenic in the groundwater, which can cause cancers and other health threats over years of exposure.

After a series of water quality issues in late 2023, state investigators found the utility had bypassed its arsenic treatment systems and sent water with high-level of arsenic to residents, in addition to dozens of other violations.

said it had addressed those violations, but recently self-reported arsenic levels in the water at one plant that violate the federal standards.

Last week. Doña Ana County commissioners voted unanimously to terminate its role in the utility's governance, as residents and the state's environment secretary continue to criticize the utility's lack of accountability.

Now, the state Environment Department reports that water tests the agency itself took at CCRUA on May 7 recorded arsenic levels at the Santa Teresa Industrial Park plant that violated the federal limit.

This marks the third ceNM. overage recorded at the plant in recent weeks, although the other tests were from voluntary tests.



Mesquite Historic District

Across Spanish America and in some of American southwest towns, the founders laid out the townsites as grids arranged around a central plaza.

The Mesquite Street **Original Townsite Historic** District is an example of that. U.S. Army Lieutenant Delos Bennett Sackett. at the behest of Don Pablo Melendrez, surveyed the square and rectangular parcels into 84 blocks. One block each was reserved for a church and a plaza.

The church plaza in Las Cruces is visible in the center of the survey plat filed in 1853.

The built environment plays a crucial role in shaping the collective identity, cultural values, beliefs and history of groups of people. For Las Crucens. St. Genevieve's Catholic Church, erected

in 1886, was at the heart of the residential and business communities.

A tremendous infusion of federal dollars after the end of World War II led to a population explosion and Las Cruces began to experience many dramatic changes. The construction of new homes and shopping centers drew people in their new automobiles away from the heart of town. By the 1950s and 1960s business dramatically declined in the original townsite and central business district.

renewal, officials tried to convince residents of the benefits of building a modern downtown area that generations of citizens could enjoy. The city altered the traditional cityscape and civic spaces, the church and plaza, were demolished. St. Genevieve Church was demolished in 1967.

Focal points are important for districts: it can be a fountain, or a square, or a building. It is a landmark, like St. Genevieve once was and now the Downtown Plaza currently is.

By 1975 there were ten cant buildings. Except on Seven blocks of Main Wednesday and Saturday mornings, when the Farmers and Crafters Market, established in 1971, set up virtually empty. A rich architectural and cultural heritage had been largely lost.

> Las Cruces was not the only city to try this. Around 100 American cities tried to make their downtown a shopping mall. But by the 1980s saw tage tourism was proving to be a viable option for towns and cities who had retained their historic

character. But, as a 1970 Las Cruces Sun-News editorial stated, "We have destroyed a part of the old charm of Las Cruces for a possible new ugliness."

In 2002 renovations began again. The canopies were removed and the street opened once more to two-way traffic with onstreet parking. This took several years and millions of dollars more, but eventually small specialty stores, bars, restaurants, and other venues of modest ambition began attracting residents, tourists, and college students. The street, although changed, is viable again. But, oh, what it could have been! And, although too much of the real Las Cruces has been lost on Main Street, on either side of it, in the Mesquite Original Townsite and in the Alameda-Depot Historic Districts, the heart still beats.

Cannabis is finally being recognized as medicine. However, there is little to no research available. There is plenty of anecdotal evidence that lives have been improved and suffering has been eased, by the responsible and medical use of cannabis.



It didn't take long for him to land the part of casino security chief (and later president of operations) Danny McCoy on NBC's "Las Vegas," a role he kept for the full five-season run of the drama (2003-08). Much also was made of Danny's background as a veteran of the U.S. Marines, with some memorable episodes finding him trying to help other soldiers in various ways. Duhamel also played Danny in several crossover stories on another NBC show of the time, "Crossing Jordan."

Also serving as narrator of the 2011-12 G4 documentary program "Bomb Patrol Afghanistan," Duhamel lent his voice to such animated series as "The Replacements" (Disney Channel, 2008-09), "Fanboy & Chum Ćhum" (Nickelodeon, 2009-14) and "Jake and the Never Land Pirates" (Disney Junior, 2011-16). His next major TV acting role was in CBS's "Battle

Creek" (2015), which cast him in the part of an FBI special agent based in the title Michigan city.

Duhamel then appeared in Hulu's Stephen King-based limited series

"11.22.63" in 2016, then played a po-lice detective investigating the title crimes in "Unsolved: The Murders of Tupac and The Notorious B.I.G." on USA Network in 2018. Netflix – where Duhamel now appears in "Ransom Canyon" - was his next series-regular stop in the 2021 fantasy "Jupiter's Legacy," then he co-starred in NBC's "The Thing About Pam" in 2022.

Featured in Season 2 of "The Mighty Ducks: Game Changers" on Disney+ later in 2022, Duhamel hosted and executive-produced CBS's 2023 reality-competition series "Buddy Games," which was based on a 2019 movie that he directed, co-wrote and starred in.

her include "West of Paradise" in 2015, "Love Letters" in 2011. "Such Fine Things" in 2009. "River of Life" in 2002 and "Teresa Tudury" in 1992.

Tudury will perform all 12 songs on the album during the June 6 concert, and will tell stories about the songs and the people who she wrote and performed them with. That was pretty much the premise of her radio show, "Live From the Doublewide," which debuted on KTAL-LP in 2019 and featured songs by artists who Tudury has known and performed with during her career. Along with Jones and Musselwhite, that list includes Leonard Cohen, Ritchie Havens, Lyle Lovett, Taj Mahal, Leo Kotke and Bonnie Bramlett, according to the news release.

Tudury started writing songs when she was 12 years old and was performing in San Francisco nightclubs by the time she was 15.

Tudury's songs combine beautiful melodies with sharp-witted observations. Her voice was described by "LA Weekly" as a cross between Bette Midler and Bonnie Raitt, and is a perfect fit for her bluesy guitar style, according to the news release.

"I'm pretty sure I breached the rules," Theegala said, "so I'm paying the price for it, and

I feel good about it."

But that's not always the case in high-stakes professional golf. A couple of years ago PGA Tour Canada pro Justin Doeden was caught fudging his core card, erasing a 7 on a hole and replacing it with a 5, thereby pushing him within a shot out of the cut line. Doeden subsequently withdrew from the tournament. In the 2019 Hero Challenge tournament Patrick Reed (one of the original PGA Tour players that jumped ship to the LIV tour) was caught on camera manipulating the sand in a bunker to better the lie of his ball while making practice swings in a bunker and
