SENATE BILL NO. 2536 (As Passed the Senate)

AN ACT TO REQUIRE ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL, PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER LEARNING OR INSTITUTION OF HIGHER LEARNING THAT IS A MEMBER OF THE NCAA, NAIA, MHSAA OR NJCCA TO DESIGNATE ITS ATHLETIC TEAMS OR SPORTS ACCORDING TO BIOLOGICAL SEX; TO PROVIDE PROTECTION FOR 5 ANY SCHOOL OR INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT MAINTAINS 6 SEPARATE ATHLETIC TEAMS OR SPORTS FOR STUDENTS OF THE FEMALE SEX; 7 TO CREATE PRIVATE CAUSES OF ACTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Designation of athletic teams. (1)10 Interscholastic or intramural athletic teams or sports that are 11 sponsored by a public primary or secondary school or any school that is a member of the Mississippi High School Activities 12 13 Association or public institution of higher education or any 14 higher education institution that is a member of the NCAA, NAIA or 15 NJCCA shall be expressly designated as one of the following based 16 on biological sex: 17 "Males," "men" or "boys"; (a) 18 (b) "Females," "women" or "girls"; or

(c) "Coed" or "mixed."

- 20 (2) Athletic teams or sports designated for "females,"
- 21 "women" or "girls" shall not be open to students of the male sex.
- 22 <u>SECTION 2</u>. Protection for educational institutions. A
- 23 government entity, any licensing or accrediting organization, or
- 24 any athletic association or organization shall not entertain a
- 25 complaint, open an investigation, or take any other adverse action
- 26 against a primary or secondary school or institution of higher
- 27 education for maintaining separate interscholastic or intramural
- 28 athletic teams or sports for students of the female sex.
- 29 **SECTION 3.** Cause of action. Any student who is deprived of
- 30 an athletic opportunity or suffers any direct or indirect harm as
- 31 a result of a violation of this act shall have a private cause of
- 32 action.
- 33 **SECTION 4. Severability.** Any provision of this act held to
- 34 be invalid or unenforceable by its terms, or as applied to any
- 35 person or circumstance, shall be construed so as to give it the
- 36 maximum effect permitted by law, unless such holding shall be one
- 37 of utter invalidity or unenforceability, in which event such
- 38 provision shall be deemed severable herefrom and shall not affect
- 39 the remainder hereof or the application of such provision to other
- 40 persons not similarly situated or to other, dissimilar
- 41 circumstances.
- 42 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 43 and after July 1, 2021.
