Mandatory Sump Inspection

Recently, every home owner received a letter from the City of Wanamingo. This is in compliance with the sanitary sewer system's rules about discharging clear water into the system from your property. Specifically, the Code of Ordinances (section 53) prohibits the

discharge of clear water from your roof, surface, ground water, sump pump, footing drain, swimming pool, beaver system or other natural sources on your property into the system.

According to Michael Boulton, City Administrator, the city has hired WHKS Engineering to complete the sump pump inspection this fall. "The idea behind the program is to cut down on the clear/storm water from entering into the sanitary sewer system", said Michael. (continued on page 14)

Who Can Really Change Things?

In case you didn't notice, we are in an election year. 16 years ago, when we were also in an election year, one candidate for president had a slogan that really caught on, and helped propel him to the White House. Do you remember that slogan? "Hope and Change".

When there is a change in the top elected leader of our country, people hope the new president will change things for the better. But no matter how much the new president tries to change things, it's usually not as much change- or at least not as much change in a good direction- as we had hoped for.

That shouldn't surprise us, because the kinds of changes that our society needs most-people being responsible, kinder toward each other, more generous and less greedy, more honest and more loving toward each other, more faithful to their marriage partners and more determined to carry out their proper roles in marriage and family the way God designed them to be- can't really be brought about through a change in laws or political leaders. You can change people's outward behavior to a certain extent through laws, if they are enforced. But to bring about real change in these areas requires the ability to change people's hearts. Laws, and the authority of governments to punish and use force, don't have the power to do that.

But there is something- or I should say someone- who can change people's hearts. And when he changes their hearts, it also changes their behavior toward other people. Let me give you an example:

Around 2000 years ago, there was a certain well-educated man who was very proud and sure of himself. He tried very hard to follow the ways his forefathers had handed down to him, and thought he was serving God by doing so. When what seemed to him like a new religious movement arose that rejected some of what he had been taught, even though this movement wasn't doing anything that hurt anyone, he thought this was a dangerous movement that must be stopped. So that's what he tried to do. He had members of this

For advertising information call Terry Campbell at 507-951-7417 even got some of them put to death. He chased most of them out of the main city of his country, then set out toward another large city where many of them had fled, in order to have them arrested and punished.

But while he was on the way to the city, something happened to this man that changed his heart. Instead of priding himself on living a better life than others, he became someone who saw himself as the worst of sinners,

new movement arrested and put in jail. He and was amazed that God had been merciful and forgave him, and loved even someone like him. Instead of hating the movement he had been using force and violence against, he became someone who loved what this movement was about; and he worked harder to spread it than he had been working before to stop it. But he worked in a different way. He never used force and violence to try to spread this movement; he just spoke words that he hoped would change the hearts of those who

opposed it, just as his heart had been changed. He willingly endured threats and violence done to him because he spoke up for this movement. Instead of taking revenge on those who did such things to him, he prayed for them. Along with other members of this movement, he lived a life of kindness toward others; of refraining from greed and lust; of helping the weak and needy; all to give honor to the God who so loved him and had forgiven him his sins. Which of These Was a Neighbor?

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself." - Luke 10:27

When we moved into our house 12 years ago, there were only five other houses on the street and a lot of empty lots where new homes would be built. We imagined what the houses and neighbors would look like-and now, with almost 100 houses on our street alone, we have made friends with many of our neighbors.

Along the way we decided to become 'muffin people," delivering those treats to about a dozen houses nearby. We introduced ourselves without thinking who might be behind the door except that they were neighbors. We began a soup and buns night with neighbors too, learned their stories, and shared life with them. It may have cost us a bit, but the reward of sharing experiences has been life changing.

It is about risk and relationship with people who are not identical to us. It is about seeing the one that Jesus has placed in front of us and becoming involved in their story. It is about addressing hurts and loneliness because that is what Jesus is asking us to do. It is about paying attention to the needs of people around us and not stepping aside or walking by, thinking that someone else can take care of them.

Who is your neighbor?

Lord, open our eyes and hearts to all the people whom you have given us to be our neighbors. Help us to see and share your love for all. Amen.

City of Wanamingo Update

The City of Wanamingo would like to update the public regarding the incident on Friday evening on the east side of Wanamingo in which Nelson Drive, 3rd Avenue, and Beverly Street were closed for a short while. The Goodhue County Sheriff provided the following information on the incident as per the weekly media release from the weekend:

On 08-23-2024 at 7:14 pm, deputies responded to a report of a disturbance at the Springcroft Apartments in Wanamingo, that three males were fighting. A second caller reported that a knife had been involved and one of the males was bleeding, also that a possible suspect had left the scene. Upon arrival it was found that one of the males had several knife wounds to an arm and both hands. He was transported by ambulance to St. Mary's with non-life threatening injuries. The suspect, Victor Armando Aguirre Toral, was located by a Zumbrota PD officer after he had left the scene and was taken into custody. GCSO was assisted at the scene by Zumbrota PD, Kenyon PD, Wanamingo First Responders, and Zumbrota Ambulance.







Ask **A Trooper**

Question: Hello, we took a trip to the cities this summer. While down there we came across these freeway ramp meters. I know we don't have those in out-state Minnesota but I thought you might be able to write about it in one of your articles for anyone that travels. Thank you for all you do and be safe!

Answer: Thank you. I don't believe this is a topic I've wrote about before but I'd be happy

Ramp meters are signal lights on freeway entrance ramps that help control the flow of merging traffic. Like traffic signals at intersections, red, yellow, and green lights indicate when drivers can proceed. Only one car may proceed each time the light is green.

One Car Per Green Light: Used with freeway ramp meters at on-ramps to indicate that one car may proceed each time the light turns

Question: My husband always used to say "never use your cruise control during any rain". Is that still true with advances on tires and technology?

Answer: He is correct, cruise control should never be used on wet or icy roadways. If your wheels lose traction, the cruise control will continue to accelerate, causing the vehicle to skid. By the time you realize you are skidding, it could be too late.

With dry road conditions, cruise control helps you safely monitor your speed, stay within the speed limit and improve driving comfort on long, fairly straight stretches of road. It should be used only when you are able to drive at a steady speed with safe road conditions.

On icy, snow-covered or wet roads.

When deciding if you should set your cruise control:

• Ask yourself if it's safe to travel the speed limit. If not, it isn't safe to set your cruis.

- Is there limited visibility? If it's foggy, snowing, or raining and your range of visibility is significantly reduced, play it safe. Don't set your cruise.
- Is traffic moving smoothly? If it's stopand-go, or there's heavy traffic around you, it's not safe to use cruise.

Remember that using your cruise control can be an advantage when driving long distances, but YOU are your vehicle's best safety feature.



"During rain events, the flows increase by over 8 times the regular flows."

All property owners must schedule a mandatory inspection through WHKS & Co, the project engineering consultant.

Please do not call the city offices to schedule this appointment. All appointments and any questions in regard to the rules and regulations MUST be through WHKS. You can

reach them at (833) 509-0270, or go online at wanamingosump.com to schedule your mandatory appointment, and ask questions. The hours to call are Monday - Thursday from 8 am to 5 pm, and 8 am to 12 pm on Friday. Your login and password to schedule an appointment are listed on the top of the letter you received recently.

Along with the sump pump inspection program, the City will be conducting smoke testing later this fall for cross connections with the storm water/sanitary sewer lines. The City needs to get all the information under control in the next couple of years before the regional waste water treatment plant is up and running. If it is not reduced, sewer bill rates will be significantly higher to cover the costs of

treating the water. This could be hundreds of thousands of dollars, so these inspections are very important.

Numerous other cities have successfully completed sump pump inspections, including Kasson, Owatonna, Austin and Rochester. All homes are either required to comply with the inspection, or be subject to a \$100.00 a month fee on their monthly utility bill.

The City will host a public informational meeting on Thursday, August 29th at 6:00pm at the Community Center to discuss the need for this program, the scheduling of inspections, proper connections, and other miscellaneous items. If you have questions, WHKS will get them answered.

Public Comment Sought for County's Hazard Mitigation Plan

Goodhue County has completed an updated draft of its Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) and is now seeking public feedback. Like all Minnesota counties, Goodhue County is vulnerable to a variety of natural hazards such as tornadoes, windstorms, severe winter storms, flooding, drought, and extreme temperatures, which can threaten the loss of life and property in the county. Planning for natural disasters minimizes the impact of events that can cause vast economic loss and personal hardship.

All county residents, as well as other interested agency or organizational stakeholders, are strongly encouraged to review and offer feedback on the interactive website, PDF of the draft plan, and proposed local mitigation actions. The review and comment period is open for a period of 15 days through September 3, 2024. The public can access the plan using the following links:

The Goodhue County HMP is a multi-jurisdictional plan that covers Goodhue County, including the cities of Bellechester, Cannon Falls, Dennison, Goodhue, Kenyon, Lake City, Pine Island, Red Wing, Wanamingo, and Zumbrota.

Update of the plan has been under the direction of Goodhue County Emergency Management in cooperation with U-Spatial at the University of Minnesota Duluth and representatives from county departments, city and township governments, school districts, and other key stakeholders. Together, the planning team worked to identify cost-effective and sustainable actions to reduce or eliminate the long-term risk to human life or property from natural hazards. Examples include infrastructure projects for areas that experience repetitive flooding; construction of safe rooms in areas where residents and visitors are vulnerable to tornadoes and severe storm events; burying powerlines that may fail due to heavy snow, ice, or wind storms; ensuring timely emergency communication to the public through warning sirens and mass notification systems; and conducting outreach to increase public awareness of severe weather and personal preparedness.

Hazard mitigation planning helps Goodhue County and other jurisdictions protect their residents. Working with local communities through the process helps identify vulnerabilities and develop strategies to reduce or eliminate the effects of a potential hazard. In addition, increasing public awareness of natural disasters and encouraging personal preparedness helps to create a community that is resilient to disaster, and breaks the cycle of response and recovery. Updating the plan further allows Goodhue County and its jurisdictions to be eligible to apply for future FEMA Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant program funding for projects that help to reduce or eliminate the impacts of future natural hazard events.

Community feedback is vital to the success of the plan. Goodhue County invites public review and feedback of the draft plan prior to submitting it to the State of Minnesota and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for review. Feedback may be provided via the online comment forms or directly to Goodhue County Emergency Management.


