





# Sand replacement projects to impact parking at Mickler's Landing

# County urges caution, explores improvements

In the wake of last year's disastrous hurricane season, erosion has become a pressing concern for many Ponte Vedra Beach residents—particularly those living along the beachfront. To better protect their homes, some residents recently began private sand replacement projects along Mickler's Beach, and the county is now urging visitors to take caution.

"Some residents had permits to do some sand placement, and to facilitate that request, we're allowing the use of Mickler's parking lot," explained Billy Zeits, assistant director of the St. Johns County Parks and Recreation Department. "The contractor is managing his heavy equipment that's going in and out of the parking lot and onto the beach, and we're allowing public access during that time, because we know it's important for people to go to the beach this time of year."

As the only free public beach access in Ponte Vedra Beach proper, the parking situation at Mickler's Landing Beachfront Park is already a source of frustration for many local beach-goers. The private projects, which officially began on Monday, April 30, are projected to be completed by May 15,

but Zeits confirmed that visitors to the beach can expect the normal parking difficulties to be exacerbated for the projects' duration.

"There's definitely going to be portions of the parking lot that won't be available for parking," Zeits said. "There will be flag men there to help people know when the heavy equipment's coming. Our intent is to just to make sure that people are prepared for an unusual beach experience for the next two weeks."

Zeits added that the county is aware of the community's concerns regard-

ing parking and accessibility at Mickler's Landing and revealed that there are plans in the works to address them.

"We appreciate everyone's patience and we are still working towards making some improvements at Mickler's, once all of these construction projects are done, to improve the beach access at the site going forward," Zeits said. "There is a plan to build another boardwalk, there's a plan to redo the parking lot, there's a plan to redo the emergency vehicle access and, right now, we're working with contractors to get some accurate pricing."

Guests at the party also bought raffle tickets for a dazzling Ippolita necklace that will be raffled off at Angelwood's "Color Our World" gala on Saturday, Aug. 18, at Sawgrass Marriott Golf Resort & Spa. The trunk show continued at Underwood's Friday, April 27, and Saturday, April 28. Angelwood will ultimately receive 10 percent of the weekend's proceeds.

"It's a huge thing for Ippolita to give back to charity," said Natalie Wall, director of sales for Ippolita. "It's definitely a wonderful charity. We're honored to partner with them."

Former Angelwood Development Director and current volunteer Tera Lageman said the weekend-long event at



Underwood's has raised approximately \$25,000 for the nonprofit over the last two years, allowing the organization to buy new vehicles for its clients and renovate its group homes.

"We wouldn't have been able to do this without them [Underwood's and Ippolita]," said Lageman, whose organization serves more than 350 families locally. "They've become like family to us. They really have their whole heart in it."

#### **LETTER TO THE EDITOR**

At the Board of County Commissioners meeting on April 17, the commissioners voted to move forward on examining a user fee (fancy word for tax) for certain county services.

This discussion included possible fees for beach parking, boat ramps, parks, rec fields and libraries.

Now let's put this all in context with the talk since 2015 about the county's budget woes and revenue shortfalls. In fact, two years ago, this was all spelled out, and several solutions were proposed. Of all the possible sources of new revenue, the one that would give us the largest increase, while at the same time allow us to share the burden with nonresidents, was to add a 1-cent increase to the current county sales tax.

Did you know that out of 67 counties, St. Johns County has the second-lowest tax rate at 6.5 percent? Of that, we send 5 cents to Tallahassee, leaving the county with a penny and only a half-cent for the schools. The proposed 1-cent sales tax increase would be all ours.

Tourists would pay around 35 percent of the sales tax. It was estimated to collect over \$32 million dollars annually. The school board asked us to go forward with them in their request, but two of our county commissioners, Jeb Smith and Jimmy Johns, were adamant against any tax increase (both knowing full well that it would be the citizens who would make the choice at the ballot box, not them).

Then last year, we found out that Tallahassee was going to put an amendment on the 2018 ballot offering an increase in the homestead exemption (from 50,000 to 75,000). That will cost the county an additional 10 million in lost revenue if people vote for it, and you know they will.

So here we are today, already having lost well about \$40 million in additional sales tax revenue.

Our problems still exist, only worse. We continue to have a huge hole in our unfunded deferred maintenance for roads and bridge repairs. You name it, no money, no repairs.

Last year, a group of us even contacted the City of St. Augustine and St. Augustine Beach Commissioners, explained the situation to them, asked if they would go to the county commissioners and help us, as they too would share in the additional revenue. They didn't bother and yet in the newspaper they are screaming about no money and wanting more of the bed tax revenue.

My friends: You do know it is our property taxes that are paying for the beaches, parks and libraries. Now they want you to pay more to use what you already pay for.

From our experience last year, it was again Jeb Smith, Jimmy Johns and now Paul Waldron who would not even consider putting the sales tax on the ballot for you to vote on.

If they continue down this path, it will be well over \$100 million in revenue that we will have lost over the next three years. I'm afraid their only option will be to raise our property taxes. These shortsighted elected officials are costing us a lot of money (services) and have not even given us an opportunity to vote, up or down. They should be ashamed! You, my fellow citizens, should be ashamed as well if you say and do nothing.

# Local nonprofit hosts soiree to promote greenway trail project

PV Greenway Alliance Incorporated a 501c3 nonprofit organization advocating to designate and develop a nature-based greenway trail through Ponte Vedra/Palm Valley — hosted a soiree featuring a presentation, hors d'oeuvres, drinks and more on Wednesday, April 25, at Ruth's Chris Steak House in Ponte Vedra Beach.

PV Greenway began as a grassroots effort in 2014 before recently growing into a nonprofit organization. Its stated mission is to identify, designate, preserve, expand and enhance a nature-based greenway providing safe mobility, interconnectivity and outdoor recreation to the Ponte Vedra/ Palm Valley community. "We have had a need in this community for our sidewalks, bike paths, greenways," Pam Marrott with PV Greenway Alliance said during the presentation. "Deb [Chapin] actually had this vision of a greenway from riding her horses along the beaches; she has had a vision for this greenway for a very long time."

Marrott added that the nonprofit is looking for more donors and support.

Deb Chapin, the founder of PV Greenway, said the project would add recreational opportunities and connect parks and other destinations. According to the nonprofit, a greenway would also increase property values, expand and diversify the golf course community market and keep pedestrians safe by providing a traffic-

separated corridor.

"The genesis of this was literally the concern for safety and the fact that we don't have the recreational activities," said Chapin, who also noted her organization recently received a grant from the Coastal Partnership Initiative. "When you look at the per-square mile recreation opportunities — on our map there's a lot of green space but a lot of that is hypothetical — it doesn't exist. We're really getting squeezed in."

# Visit Jacksonville unveils new visitor center at Beaches Museum

The Beaches Museum & History Park and Visit Jacksonville solidified their new partnership Thursday, April 26, with the official unveiling of Visit Jacksonville's new Beaches Visitor Center, located inside the museum's lobby.

"We're so excited to welcome the newest Visit Jacksonville Visitor Center here to our museum," said Christine Hoffman, executive director of the Beaches Museum & History Park. "It has been years of hard work to fully realize the dream of a fully staffed visitor center. We're excited to finally make it a reality."

Members and officials of the Jacksonville and Beaches community applauded as staff of both the museum and Visit Jacksonville held a ceremonial ribbon cutting to celebrate the new visitor center, which will be open seven days a week — even when the museum is closed.

"It's a mutually beneficial relationship," Hoffman said. "We bring in new visitors to the visitor center — and also into the museum — and vice versa, and we're going to continue to work together to grow this relationship and make this one of the top spots for visitors coming to our Beaches.

"We've seen quite a bit of change here at the museum in the past few years, including more engaging programs and exhibits, more opportunities for community groups to utilize the museum and the history park, and more importantly, free admission to the museum," Hoffman continued. "Now visitors that come into the visitor center can not only stop here and get their information, but they can stay and learn about the history of the area that they've chosen to visit."

With the addition of its new Beaches Visitor Center, Visit Jacksonville will now have a total of three information centers throughout the city, including one at Jacksonville International Airport and another at 208 N. Laura St. in Downtown Jacksonville.

# SJCSD seeks applicants to serve on SJC Planning and Zoning Agency

The St. Johns County School District (SJCSD) is seeking applicants interested in serving on the St. Johns County Planning and Zoning Agency (PZA).

According to the district, Florida growth management legislation requires all counties to have a school board appointment as a non-voting member to participate in discussions on rezoning amendments to the land use plan that impact density. The St. Johns County Commission has agreed to go beyond the legislative requirements to make the school board appointment a full voting member of the PZA.

The applicant must be a resident of St. Johns County. Selection will be based on a number of factors, including the applicant's involvement in the county and in public education. The deadline for applications is noon on May 18.

Each applicant will need to attend the workshop with the school board Tuesday, June 5, at 8:30 a.m. The school board plans to make the appointment at its regular monthly meeting Tuesday, June 12 at 9 a.m.

# Murray Beard

#### Can you please tell us about your background with THE PLAYERS Championship, and your family's connections to the tournament?

I started as a volunteer with the old Greater Jacksonville Open as a teenager when I was a standard bearer for one year at Hidden Hills. As an adult, I began volunteering in 1982 just after the tournament moved to its permanent home at TPC Sawgrass. Those were fun days with the volunteers taking on significant roles in the operation of the tournament. Over the years, I volunteered on many committees, including Markers (now Walking Scorers); Inventory/ Supplies; Course Prep; Sign Installation; VIP Parking; Banking; and Spirit. We helped with the SENIOR PLAYERS Championship when it was held here, along with the U.S. Amateur in 1994, the first of Tiger Woods' three wins.

I was promoted to vice chairman in 1996 when Gerry Hurst was chairman of the tournament. I was honored to chair the tourney in 2000, the year Hal Sutton won on a Monday finish. I got my children involved when they were early teens, initially as runners and later as standard bearers. They enjoyed being able to get up close to some great (and not so great) players. My son Max was Standard Bearer of the Year in 2009. As an adult, my daughter has gained a passion for the tournament and over the past several years has chaired the Standard Bearer committee. This year, she will oversee the Benefactor Committee, coordinating about 40 volunteers.

#### **How was THE PLAYERS Championship** different when you served as chairman?

THE PLAYERS was very different in 2000. Things had begun to change with the "Tiger" effect with more PGA Tour staff and trying to upgrade the look and feel of the tourney. TV coverage was expanding, and corporate hospitality was beginning to grow. Just look at 16 and 17 today with all the hospitality venues. It was just a fraction of that in 2000 and before. The volunteers associated with corporate hospitality has grown. I think we had 1,200 overall volunteers in 2000, compared to over 2,000 today.

#### What are your thoughts on the tournament moving back to March?

I like the tournament going back to March for two reasons. The weather is cooler and more enjoyable, and I like the PGA Tour's efforts to create a schedule of major tournaments with the year kicking off with THE PLAYERS.

#### What makes THE PLAYERS Championship so special?

From a big picture perspective, it is a significant golf championship for the professionals. We will always debate if it is a major. Locally, it has a huge impact on our community. It is the single largest event in our community, and the charitable impact cannot be understated. Millions of dollars are raised to make a difference in our community.

#### What is your favorite moment from THE PLAYERS Championship?

My lasting memory of THE PLAYERS was the year I was chairman of the tournament. I had the pleasure of spending the day with Byron Nelson, one of the great legends of golf. I drove him around the golf course, so he could see and invite players to come play in his tournament in Fort Worth. The respect and admiration all the professional players shared with him was amazing and the stories he shared during our day together was priceless. He sadly passed away a couple of years later.

#### What do you enjoy most about living in Ponte Vedra?

Speaking of changes, my wife Elise and I moved to Ponte Vedra Beach in 1982 back when A1A was a twolane road and many of the neighborhoods were not constructed yet. Sawgrass Village was under construction for the first time! We love our little beach community and all the little quirks of it. It's a beautiful place with great friends and neighbors.

# WHY I SERVE JEREMIAH BLOCKER

In the latest edition of the Why I Serve series, the Ponte Vedra Recorder sat down with Jeremiah Blocker, a Ponte Vedra resident and local attorney, to discuss his time in the Army and Air Force Reserve and why he served in the military. #### What was your role in the army?

In the Army, I served as everything from platoon leader to company commander. I led a military police company — we were embedded with the Iraqi police in Mosul, Iraq, and Northern Iraqi. We actually managed all the police stations. I managed all the police stations in Mosul at that point. This is a time of ongoing contingency as we were fighting, at that time, with pre-ISIS. We were embedded with



the Iraqi police making sure that their logistics were correct, that they had clean water, that they had the correct amount of ammunition and enforcing the rule of law in a very intense combat environment. I've been in charge of all the logistics, a multi-million-dollar budget, managing the resources, the manning, the training requirements. I've worked in two different battalion staffs during my time in the Army, and most importantly, the opportunity to lead troops in combat as a company commander.





# Keep your kids safe in and around water this summer

healthy. It includes habits such as looking both ways before crossing the street, washing your hands with soap and water and eating the right amount of fruits and vegetables every day.

For too many parents, however, safety in and around water is not on the list, and that's something we need to change. Florida leads the country in drowning deaths of children ages 1-4, according to the Florida Department of Health. Annually in our state, enough children to fill three to four preschool classrooms drown before their fifth birthday.

During National Water Safety Month this May, the Y offers Safety Around Water, a program to engage parents about the importance of water safety skills and provide more children access to water safety lessons. As part of the program, the Ponte Vedra YMCA will provide scholarships to children from low-income and underserved communities to participate in free water safety lessons. The lessons teach young people valuable skills like what to do if they find themselves in the water unexpectedly, a situation every child should be equipped to handle.

To find out how to enroll your child in the Y's Safety Around Water program or swim lessons, visit FirstCoastYMCA.org/ youth-swim.

#### **Water Safety Tips**

Before letting your children hit the water this summer, remember these tips to ensure it's an enjoyable and safe experience.

**1. Never swim alone.** Teach your children that they should only swim in locations where a lifeguard is on duty.

2. Supervise your children whenever they're in water. Whether it's bath time or taking a dip in a pool or lake, make sure your children are within arm's reach at all times.

**3. Don't engage in breath holding activities.** Children shouldn't hold their

breath for a prolonged amount of time while swimming, as this can cause drowning and has several other severe physical side-effects.

**4. Wear a life jacket:** Inexperienced or non-swimmers should wear a Coast Guard-approved life jacket.

**5. Don't jump in the water to save a friend who is struggling in deep water.** If a child finds their friend in deep water unexpectedly, their natural reaction may be to jump in the water to try to save them. Even if a child is a great swimmer, a panicked person will overpower them, pulling them underwater with them. The Y's Safety

Around Water program teaches the "reach, throw, don't go" concept of using a long object to reach for them and pull them to safety. By using this technique, children can help their friend without compromising their own safety.

**6. Enroll your children in water safety or swim lessons.** Just like teaching your children to look both ways before they cross the street, participating in formal water safety lessons teaches them an important life skill.

# Woods, Mickelson commit to THE PLAYERS Championship

THE PLAYERS Championship announced last week that Tiger Woods, the 2001 and 2013 champion of THE PLAYERS, and Phil Mickelson, the 2007 champion, have committed to play in the 2018 tournament, at THE PLAYERS Stadium Course at TPC Sawgrass May 8-13.

Woods and Mickelson have a combined 122 PGA Tour wins and are No. 50 and No. 4 in the FedExCup standings, respectively.

Woods, who is in search of his first PGA Tour victory since the 2013 World Golf Championships-Bridgestone Invitational, is the only player in golf history to win THE PLAYERS, the Tour Championship, the FedExCup and all four major championships. Woods was unable to defend his 2013 title at THE PLAYERS due to a back surgery, but returned in 2015 and finished T69, his most recent start at TPC Sawgrass. This year, he earned a spot in the tournament due to the five-year exemption that exists for past champions of the event.

Woods is one of six two-time winners of THE PLAYERS (Jack Nicklaus has won the championship three times), where he owns 16 made cuts in 17 starts, including one runner-up (2000) and three additional top 10s. He also ranks second behind only Sergio Garcia in



career money earned at THE PLAYERS (\$4,421,241.90), and his 13 consecutive made cuts at THE PLAYERS is the second-most in tournament history, behind only Sergio Garcia and Brad Faxon, who each own 14 straight made cuts. Should Woods win THE PLAYERS

this year, he would join Jack Nicklaus as the only three-time winners of the event (1974, 1976, 1978), and he would also notch his 80th TOUR victory, bringing him within two of Sam Snead for most wins on the PGA Tour.

Mickelson recently earned his 43rd PGA Tour win at the WGC-Mexico Championship in a playoff against reigning FedExCup champion Justin Thomas, 23 years his junior. As Mickelson looks to become the seventh player to win THE PLAYERS more than once, he is also in search of his first multiple-win season on Tour since 2013.

"I am forever grateful to Indiana University, Coach Allen, Coach Sheridan and Coach DeBord for giving me an opportunity to compete with the best in college football," Tronti tweeted on Sunday, April 29. "I will always be thankful for the experiences and lessons that I learned while in Bloomington. However, I will be transferring from Indiana University. I am now exploring all of my options to continue to chase my football dreams."

Tronti did not reveal any information pertaining to where he will transfer. The former Shark redshirted the 2017 season, and was named offensive scout team player of the year and a four-time scout team player of the week for the Hoosiers.

The quarterback led Ponte Vedra on a magical playoff run in 2016 that ended


# Ponte Vedra boys lacrosse advances to regional finals

in a heartbreaking 35-33 loss to American Heritage High School in Ponte Vedra's first ever-state championship appearance. He passed for 3,333 yards and 34 touchdowns and rushed for 662 yards and 19 touchdowns throughout his senior season, which ultimately resulted in him being crowned Mr. Football in December by a statewide panel of high school football coaches and media representatives.
