# Nease student selected for Honeywell's space camp leadership program

It's one thing to be a stellar student. To be interstellar, however, that's a whole other ballgame.

Sixteen-year-old Maria Ribot shows the world what an interstellar student looks like by dreaming big and keeping her head in the clouds. Recently, she attended the Honeywell Leadership Challenge Academy at the U.S Space & Rocket Center in Huntsville, Alabama. She was one of the few students across the globe chosen to participate in the program in February and March.

This year, Honeywell sponsored 292 students from 41 countries and 27 states to attend the two, week-long programs. The Academy aims to challenge 16 to 18-year-olds with activities in STEM leadership skills, such as building, coding, computer sciences and astronautics.

"I was skeptical that (I would) get in," Ribot said. "I heard that it was a global camp with people from all over the world coming. I couldn't imagine how many people were going to apply to this program and I thought I'm just going to apply and do my best and see if I get in."

Ribot is no stranger to taking chances. Originally from Puerto Rico, she came to the U.S when she was just 10 years old, after her father got promoted at his position at Honeywell. She didn't speak any English and described the experience as a "major culture shock."

"When I moved to Virginia, it was very different," Ribot said. "When I got there and I saw how people acted and how people spoke — they didn't speak my language and I was just freaking out because I thought, 'What if I never blend in?"

During her first day at school, she got lost finding her class, didn't know how to open her locker or even ask for help.

"It was just a feeling of hopelessness," she said. Although she was enrolled in the English as a Second Language (ESL) program, she still felt lost and alienated from her peers, who were at times less than welcoming because of her accent and background. Even the "interpreter" the school provided didn't speak Spanish. After feeling scared and alone, she decided she wouldn't let the relocation get the best of her.

"I decided to just get past that," she said. "(I would)

move on and try to learn as much as I can in as little time as possible."

So, she did. Ribot worked and studied and managed to learn English in only six months. Not only did she learn the new language, but she achieved more than many of her native speaking peers by getting on the A-B Honor Roll her first year at her new school, in her new country.

Shortly afterward, her father was transferred to Jacksonville, so she moved to her current home state. When he heard about the space program through his work, he encouraged her to apply.

While at the Honeywell Leadership Challenge Academy, she participated in challenges such as simulated astronaut trainings, shuttle missions, moonwalks and even a centrifuge simulation that put 3.2 Gs of force on her, equal to three times her body weight. Ribot said the experience felt like her "face was melting off."

Never an underachiever, Ribot also won the program's Leadership Award for her ability to keep a cool head and direct her teammates during simulations. She credits her levelheadedness and leadership skills to her experiences as an older sister.

"I knew people were freaking out over the whole situation (during a simulation)," Ribot said. "Automatically my brain switches to like, "They need to calm down and look at the problem and look for a solution and get going."

Currently in the 11th grade, Ribot said when she graduates from Nease, she plans to pursue pre-med. She said she has dreamed of doing this, "since she was little." When asked if she is going to be a "space doctor," she laughed.

"Sure. Why not?" she said. "Space is so undiscovered. I could study so much."

She added emphatically, "I don't have to be an engineer to fly."

# OPES students give back to Wolfson Children's Hospital

The fifth-grade student ambassadors of Ocean Palms Elementary School (OPES) recently completed the service project, "Banks for Kids," to benefit Wolfson Children's Hospital.

Students first decorated small piggy banks (each with \$5 dollars inside) provided by THE PLAYERS and Character Counts! of St. Johns County. They then donated them to children at the hospital so they can make a purchase from the "Wolfie Wagon," Wolfson's mobile shop for hospitalized kids.

"Being hospitalized isn't fun, but a visit from the Wolfie Wagon, our store on wheels, can be a bright spot for kids," Wolfson Children's Hospital says on its website.

By participating in the project, the student ambassadors were able to have firsthand experience with the Character Counts! pillars of citizenship and caring.

"The Banks for Kids program has promoted good character in me by showing the Character Counts! Pillar of Caring," said Brianna, one of the fifth-grade

"Knowing that some people are in the hospital and need special care ... it makes me feel good to be giving to others," Brianna added. "I hope these banks make children have a smile on their faces."

"This project has helped me learn that you can help others while having fun and being creative," Ambassador Jordan said. "I had tons of fun making these adorable banks which will be helping to cheer up sick kids. This makes me really happy. It makes me want to be more of a leader. I had almost just as much fun raising money to put in the banks by buying and selling candy grams to give to all my friends."

Following the project, ambassadors were asked to reflect about their participation.

"The Banks for Kids program has impacted my leadership abilities by showing me that I need to give back to people in need," Ambassador Jameson said.

The student ambassadors ultimately decorated and donated 50 piggy banks filled with \$5 bills.

"This project has made me think about how grateful I am to be well," Ambassador Josie said, "and that I should always care about others."

The Tesori Family Foundation's All-Star Kids Clinic teed off for the fourth year at Sawgrass Country Club on the eve of the first round of THE PLAYERS.

The March 13 clinic hosted 25 kids with special needs, or "VIPs," and their families to learn golf tips from the masters themselves. During the event, PGA TOUR caddies and other instructors offered special instruction and demonstrations to create a unique experience for the children participating. Making a special appearance once again was PGA TOUR player Jordan Spieth, who conducted a demonstration of his own and took photos with the kids.

The Tesori Family Foundation was founded by former PGA TOUR player and current PGA TOUR caddie Paul Tesori. His wife, Michele Tesori, co-hosts the event with the help of their son, Isaiah, who has Down syndrome. Michelle Tesori said she is inspired to give back to "execute what god put in our hearts to do."

"I think that people set expectations perhaps differently for our kiddos with special needs," Tesori said. "I think if they are just given a chance in an environment where they feel loved and supported and

# Tabitha Furyk

(Note: This interview was conducted prior to THE PLAYERS Championship.)

## Can you briefly tell us about your background?

I was born in Torrance, California and raised in Columbus, Ohio. I went to Ohio State and got an elementary education degree. I met Jim at the Memorial (PGA TOUR tournament in Dublin, Ohio). I traveled a little bit with him, and then we moved to Ponte Vedra Beach.

#### What does THE PLAYERS Championship mean to you?

THE PLAYERS Championship has always been very special to me and Jim because it is the one tournament that is in our backyard. It's great to share it with friends and family and great to see and to participate in some of the wonderful charity events that they do to support our community.

# What were some of the events you were involved with the week of THE PLAYERS?

On the Sunday morning before the tournament, we hosted Operation Shower on the golf course for 40 women who are either active military or whose husbands are deployed. Later that evening, we hosted close to 400 people for our ninth annual Jim and Tabitha Furyk Foundation Furyk & Friends event. That featured opportunities for participants to attempt the 17th Hole Challenge and shop in the new pro shop. The event also included a closestto-the-pin shootout at the 17th hole for our PGA TOUR celebrities to compete for \$10,000 for charity. The evening also featured an acoustic concert and about 10 celebrity chefs who cooked outdoors there at the Grove. That next morning, we hosted our golf tournament at Sawgrass Country Club. On Tuesday, we had These Kids Can Play, where we hosted 100 families suffering from life-limiting and other conditions through Community PedsCare and Wolfson Children's Hospital. We finished up Tuesday with the Military Appreciation Concert.

#### What's your involvement with the PGA TOUR Wives Association? Can you please tell us a little bit about that organization?

I've been a member of the PGA TOUR Wives Association for, I believe, 24 years now. It is very impactful as a young wife to be able to travel each week and know that there's something — an activity or an event — that we can do to give back to our community. Most of them are very hands-on. That's the reason I started These Kids Can Play at THE PLAYERS Championship. We used to have a luncheon and fashion show, which was great, but it didn't give you that feel that you were supporting somebody in the community, even though you knew there were charity dollars going there. Now, this gives us a very hands-on opportunity to spend some time with some kids who really appreciate us being there and really could use a helpful hand. # What's it like to be a significant other of a PGA TOUR player?

It is an adventure. There's a lot of emotion on the golf course. Although it seems glamorous to travel week to week in amazing locations, there are also the fun challenges of trying to be on a plane or in a long car ride with two small children and trying to find laundromats and living out of a suitcase week after week. So, there are certainly pluses and minuses.



#### What do you enjoy most about living in the area?

I think the thing we enjoy most as a family is the access to the waterways. Whether it's the beach or the St. Johns River or the Intracoastal, most of our activities surround those waterways. It really makes for great family adventure. It's a great way to entertain folks who come into town to visit. (We're) pretty proud of how beautiful (the) venues that we have along the waterway are and being able to share those with folks.

# When you're not working in the community or on the golf course, what do you like to do in your free time?

We're very active. We spend a lot of time watching our kids play sports. We like to do activities such as participate in runs, take the boat out for a spin with the kids, play beach volleyball with the kids, fish, etc. At this point, with a freshman and a junior in high school, they still like to hang out with us, so anything familyoriented, we're up for.

Lopez said one of his favorite parts of the event was having the chance to meet some of his favorite golfers, while his step-father's favorite was the fact that these golfers came out just to meet kids like Lopez. Jim Furyk was one of the PGA TOUR

# Leprechauns, libations and living the life at the Island Green of THE PLAYERS Championship

It's a scene more like a crowded outdoor patio than your typical golf tournament. "It was definitely a lot quieter earlier," a

spectator says to a friend.

Welcome to a Saturday afternoon overlooking TPC Sawgrass' iconic Island Green, one of the golf universe's wonders of the world.

The view is spectacular. The green of the par-5 16th pops across the water less than a football field away, the bowl of the arena circling both that green and the entire tee-to-green experience of the 17th hole.

It's a stage for the game of golf's superstars, ferocious despite its diminutive size. The 146-yard par 3 took the generation's biggest superstar, Tiger Woods, out of tournament-winning contention when he drowned two balls at the hole a day before.

Crowds lounge on the money green slope overlooking the green, while others watch from the two stories of suites and seats above.

Mid-afternoon, the slope is lively. A woman dressed as a leprechaun in a miniskirt carries a round of island-style drinks. A pack of fraternity brothers poses for photos with the green in the background, their arms outstretched with kooziewrapped beverages. Another guy has a Sharpie-inspired face tattoo — it's one of those afternoons.

The focus of the crowd shifts from green aluminum cans to the more famous green intermittently, the reaction time dwindling as the day burns. Players come and go, most enjoying nothing more than an occasional hoot and clap as the banter rises.

At 4 p.m, Tony Finau steps on the 17th tee, the American working on a pleasing 5-under third round and in a tie for eighth place in the tournament.



The Island Green at TPC Sawgrass is one of the golf universe's wonders of the world, and also one of the most entertaining, sometimes for reasons that are not golf-related.

#### Splash.

"Nooooo," the crowd snaps as the focus momentarily sharpens. It's the largest reaction of the day to that point. Finau collects his double-bogey, just like the many waterfinders before him.

Moments later, a lone duck appears on the wooden edge of the green, sitting like a statue on a front porch. It jumps in the water for a bath, then swims in circles, its serenity juxtaposed by the thousands of live onlookers visiting its home for the weekend. At the same time across the water, a glassy-eyed couple tries to take a selfie with the duck and green in the back-ground. They are less successful in their quest than the duck is in its.

Twenty minutes after Finau leaves the arena, Sergio Garcia mimics his result. Splash. The crowd jeers.

"He's going to have to take the walk of shame," a woman says, lounged with her elbows in the grass belts. The 2017 Masters champion scoffs at his fortune and prepares his 80-yard shot from the drop zone, a shot that lands on the green and spins aggressively toward the front ledge. It stops just inches from the drink.

The same woman shrieks in decibeldefying fright, the horror of the Island Green soothed by the flavor of her island concoction.

A man walks nearby, his homemade wide-rim hat a replica of the Island Green itself.

Nothing too out of the ordinary here. It's just a typical Saturday afternoon at the 17th hole at THE PLAYERS.

# Seniors seeking companionship, looking for love

It's not just puppy love for several area residents; S.A.F.E. to celebrate older dogs at adoption event

Seniors are often overlooked when it comes to adopting a dog, but S.A.F.E. (Saving Animals from Euthanasia) Pet Rescue is aiming to make some very special love connections for some of its more mature residents.

The nonprofit organization is holding an adoption event to celebrate senior dogs on Saturday, March 23, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the parking lot of the Pet Supermarket on A1A in Ponte Vedra. The S.A.F.E. mobile van will be onsite to offer up some possible "furever" friends to area residents. While younger dogs will also be available, the event is honoring and offering dogs whose wisdom and vast life experiences aren't always appreciated by potential adopters.

Several Ponte Vedra residents have already found lasting relationships by keeping an open mind — and an open heart — when it comes to pet adoption.

Here are some of their love stories.

#### SCOOBY

A chance encounter at the tennis courts turned out to be a perfect match for Barbara Heamon and 12-year-old Scooby.

Heamon lives in Sawgrass Country Club and had gone to the tennis courts to watch a tournament when she saw an older sheltie with an "Adopt Me" scarf around his neck. She asked the handler if the dog could spend a night or two at her home to see how things went. That was more than eight months ago, and Scooby has been there ever since.

"He's just a good old guy," Heamon said.

Scooby was turned in to the shelter when his elderly owner was no longer able to care for him, and Heamon said, despite his age, he really hasn't had any health issues. And, because of his age, he's also a great fit for her lifestyle.

"He's just happy eating and sleeping and hanging out," she said. "There are some things as an older person I can't do anymore, and it's the same with Scooby. He's at the same place in his life."

Heamon said she understands the concerns people have of knowing a senior pet won't be around as long, and it's never really possible to prepare for the heartbreak of losing one, but the love she's received from Scooby in return makes it all worth it.

"He has adapted to our lifestyle without making it hard for us," Heamon said. "He's just easy. And he's very, very loving. He sticks to me like glue."

#### BELLE

Belle can't see or hear. She's blinded by cataracts and missing quite a few teeth, and although she may not win any modeling contests, Cynthia Brink was able to see her inner beauty shine through, which is why she named her Belle, which means beautiful in French.

Belle was 11 or 12 years old when the Brinks adopted her around two years ago. She wasn't getting adopted at her original shelter and was going to be euthanized before S.A.F.E. came to get her and bring her to its no-kill shelter. Brink saw past the dog's physical issues and decided



to give Belle the chance at life so many others had passed on.

"The fact that you know you saved the life of a living thing is really a comforting thought," Brink said. "Usually, they're not much trouble at all. They just want to be loved. They're grateful, especially dogs that have been in the pound for a while. They're just grateful to have someone to pet them."

Now, with the Brinks, the 7-pound toy poodle gets to be Belle of the ball.

"She has a good life," Brink said. "She gets dressed up for Halloween and goes to the Halloween dog parties. ... She likes to walk and prance around, but she also has a stroller for when she gets tired, so she's known as 'stroller dog."

Brink said Belle has also been beneficial to them, and that senior dogs are a great fit for retired seniors.

"Puppies are a lot of work, and we have so many people in the Ponte Vedra area that are older and retired, like my husband and I, who can get around better with a senior dog and who don't want to take 5-mile walks every day," she said. "We'd rather just do our 30- or 40-minute walk, and some of the younger dogs need more exercise. They're very good about behaving themselves."

#### **ELLIOTT**

Sometimes you don't really know you wanted something until you can't imagine your life without it. That was the case for Jean Gleason and Elliott.

Elliott was among a group of chihuahuas that arrived at S.A.F.E. from a backyard breeder who no longer wanted them. Elliott attended an adoption event at Pet Supermarket and Gleason, who is a S.A.F.E. volunteer in the Ponte Vedra area, agreed to foster the then-10-year-old dog. Gleason said the breed wasn't really one she'd considered before, but Elliott changed all that.

"He just found his way in my heart," she said. "I never gave any thought to chihuahuas, but I'm a total chihuahua nut now."

Elliott had lived most of his life in a crate and didn't know what to think the first time he stepped on grass. He also had an eye condition that required two types of medicine in each eye for the rest of his life, and Gleason wondered who would be willing to administer his treatment every day. She knew it was true love when she decided she would be willing to do that for him. That was more than two years ago.

"As time wore on, I just grew really attached to the little guy," she said.

Gleason said there are a lot of advantages to adopting an older dog that people sometimes don't consider.

"You know what you're getting. What you see is what you get," she said. "They're also much more settled than a puppy or younger dog."

She also thinks a senior-senior partnership is a match made in heaven.

"Don't shy away from seniors," Gleason said. "I think seniors are good for seniors because they enjoy their naps, and they've gone through the stage of being hyper. Now they're calm."

#### MURPHY

Snuggling and affection go a long way to winning Monica Kohn's heart. And Murphy turned out to be a snuggle pro.

About four years ago, Kohn and her sister, along with Kohn's large black lab-mix, went to S.A.F.E. to check out the adoptable pups. Kohn initially asked to visit with a younger dog, while her sister visited with Murphy, who was between 8 to 10 years old at the time. When Murphy leaned his head against her sister's chest, Kohn knew she'd found the one.

"Murphy was very sweet, but he had a lot of hair missing, had cataracts, and he was older, so I knew it would be harder for him, and that also broke my heart," Kohn said.

Finding a loving home did wonders for Murphy's health, however.

"The longer I had him, the healthier he got," Kohn said. "He almost got younger."

Murphy has trouble seeing but gets around with no problems. Kohn said she can't imagine not having him in her life and appreciates that S.A.F.E. takes chances on dogs that are often forgotten or go unnoticed.

"He was pulled from a kill shelter and saved by S.A.F.E., which pulls dogs that are great dogs, but may have been overlooked because they may be older or have a skin issue, or something like that," Kohn said. "If they hadn't done that, I would have never been able to meet him, so it's really awesome and I'm very grateful."

Kohn said people may think an older dog is too set in its ways, and will have trouble bonding, but that hasn't been her experience at all.

"You almost feel like you bond more with them," Kohn said. "You almost feel like they really do appreciate just being in a good place. They just have this wisdom about them, and they really do adapt."

And Murphy isn't shy about showing his affection and appreciation for the No. 1 woman in his life.

"I love dogs that love to snuggle, and he's just glued to me," Kohn said. "He's just a sweetheart. He's a little snuggle-bug."

#### HENRY

Henry is pretty much a ladies' man.

The little chihuahua/Boston terrier mix was approximately 7 or 8 years old when he began wooing his way into Shelia Harper's heart.

Harper said Henry is kind of a one-person fellow, preferring to spend his time with her rather than her husband, Graeme, and with women in general. Henry will make an exception, however, when it comes to sporting events.

"During the Super Bowl, my husband was watching and yelling at the TV and Henry comes out and gets on his lap and just starts watching TV," Harper laughed. "He likes sports."

Harper said Henry also put his feelings aside to watch some of THE PLAYERS last week, again joining Graeme in front of the TV to find out what all the excitement was about.

Henry was originally expected to be a store dog, hanging out with Harper at her boutique Ellie Bing, and greeting customers, but he was a little skittish and preferred to be a homebody. The separation, however, makes the daily reunions when Harper returns home from the shop even more special.

"When I get home, every day it's like Christmas for him," Harper said.

Harper saw Henry at an adoption event, trembling in the arms of a volunteer. His name was Goblin at the time because of his huge ears, and Harper couldn't resist his undeniable charms.

"He seemed to love me right away," she said.

And the feeling is mutual, as the two have grown closer over their two years together. "If you don't move, he doesn't move. If you move, he moves," Harper said. "He's just a really good companion. And he's not annoying or pawing at you all the time, he's just happy to be with you."

According to a petfinder.com survey, older pets have the hardest time finding homes, and "typically spend nearly four times as long in shelters as younger animals."

Gleason said some of the main reasons people often resist adopting an older dog are concerns over possible veterinary costs and the difficulty of knowing the dog won't have as long to live, but Gleason points out the quality of life a senior dog receives during its golden years outweighs the quantity. "We owe it to these dogs to give them the

best life while we have them," she said. While losing a pet can be a traumatic

event, people who have taken a chance on senior dogs say knowing you gave them the opportunity to experience love in their later years goes a long way toward healing from the loss.

"The hardest thing about owning a dog is losing them," Kohn said. "As much as it hurts, I just know what makes me feel better is giving another dog a chance to have a better life. And whether it's a year, two years, six years, just knowing they had a great life and knew what love was makes it even better.

"They don't ask for a lot," Kohn added. "Just to be loved."

## Jacksonville Symphony's 70th season to center around Beethoven

The 2019-2020 season for the Jacksonville Symphony will be the organization's 70th and is built around one of the most famous composers, Ludwig van Beethoven.

Born in 1770, Beethoven is known for paving the way for the future of the musical art form. December 2020 will mark his 250th birthday. Featured on the season for the local Symphony will be Beethoven's Mass in C, "Emperor" Piano Concerto and Violin Concerto. The Symphony will end the season with a performance of one of the most recognized symphonies of all time: Beethoven's Ninth Symphony featuring the Jacksonville Symphony Chorus and the University of North Florida Chorale.

In addition to Beethoven's masterpieces, the "Florida Blue Masterworks Series" will include several classical favorites such as Brahms' Piano Concerto No. 2 and Second Symphony, Dvořák's Symphony No. 8 and Edward Elgar's Violin Concerto. Nathan Aspinall will return to the Jacoby Symphony Hall podium for a program featuring Rachmaninoff's "Symphonic Dances," and guest conductor Anu Tali will make her first Jacksonville appearance with Tchaikovsky's "Pathétique" Symphony.

"We're also excited to take you on some

adventures with captivating music you may not have heard before," said Courtney Lewis, Jacksonville Symphony music director. "You will hear Franz Schreker's music, full of resplendent color much like Richard Strauss. Music by Henri Dutilleux is virtuosic for every instrument in the orchestra and we'll also perform masterpieces by Lutosławski and Thomas Adès."

One of the highlights for the Symphony's 2019-2020 season is the upcoming trip to Washington D.C. The Symphony was accepted into SHIFT: A Festival of American Orchestras as one of four ensembles from across the country. The Symphony performs a program including Copland's Clarinet Concert (with New York Philharmonic Principal Clarinetist Anthony McGill) and two works written specifically for the city of Jacksonville: Courtney Bryan's "Bridges" (to be premiered in April 2019) and Duke Ellington's "Celebration."

The "Symphonic Night at the Movies Series" returns with "Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban," "Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back," "Jurassic Park" and Disney Pixar's "Up."

"Hooray for Hollywood" will open the "Fidelity National Financial Pops Series" in October with Michael Krajewski conducting some favorite movie music. Michael Cavanaugh joins the Symphony for a program celebrating "Piano Man" Billy Joel. Cavanaugh was handpicked by Billy Joel to star in the Broadway Musical "Movin' Out." The Doo Wop Project returns with an all-new program, and the Symphony honors the legacy of Aretha Franklin. In March, Steven Reineke, music director of the New York Pops, will conduct a program of Broadway favorites. The Jacksonville Symphony season finale will feature the annual traditions of "Holiday Pops" and "Patriotic Pops."

Beethoven's epic Fifth Symphony can be found on the 2019-2020 "Raymond James Coffee Series," along with Camille Saint-Saëns' Organ Symphony performed on the Bryan Concert Organ. The music of Aretha Franklin joins the Coffee Concert schedule, and the Symphony performs a program of romantic favorites on Feb. 14 and 15.

# **Fantastic Finish** McIlroy narrowly defeats Furyk to win THE PLAYERS

#### **By Kathy Bissell**

Leaderboard gravity. That's what NBC's Paul Azinger called it when there were several golfers with a chance to take the lead at THE PLAYERS on Sunday.

And like regular gravity, the sheer weight of the moment brought most of them down, one after one, until only Rory McIlroy of Northern Ireland remained at 16-under 272. The exception was local Jim Furyk, who advanced all afternoon and then was beaten by one stroke, finishing at 15-under 273.

McIlroy, who has been a wunderkind since turning professional, has been inundated in recent months with questions about not winning lately and not capitalizing on final-round opportunities. He only got those questions because he is such an exceptional player, expected by most to close out any tournament when he is within four of the lead. When he doesn't, people want to know "what's wrong," even if it's something as simple as just getting outplayed by another world-class golfer.

McIlroy believes the last few months of not winning assisted him in turning the corner.

"I think all the experiences I've had over the last few weeks in terms of trying to win and not getting over the line definitely helped me today," he said after winning THE PLAYERS. "The fact that this win has come at this golf tournament, a tournament where Sawgrass and I didn't have the greatest relationship starting off, and I'm very

thankful to the PGA TOUR for putting it back to March. That was very helpful for me."

The rest of the field didn't make it easy, at first, and neither did the golf course.

Those who were in the lead or within two shots of the lead during the day included Furyk, Tommy Fleetwood, Jon Rahm, Ollie Schniederjans, Abraham Ancer, Jhonattan Vegas, Jason Day and little-known Eddie Pepperell from England. Pepperell even finished as clubhouse leader about an hour before McIlroy was walking up 18.

As the day wore on, the scores went topsy-turvy several times with golfers shooting up and down, in and out of contention. You needed a magnet board with names to shift people in and out of the top spot. For a while, there were

## Local favorite Jim Furyk finishes runner-up at THE PLAYERS

After Jim Furyk birdied on 18 late Sunday at THE PLAYERS, a few tears crept down his face as he tipped his hat to the crowd and walked toward the TPC Clubhouse.

At that moment, Furyk was the leader of the tournament at 15-under, but perhaps more significant, the longtime area resident was home, with friends and family in the crowd, and he had returned to a state of his game not seen in years.

"I missed the nerves, I missed the excitement, the cheers, and I think the emotion you saw on 18 was just I was proud of the way I played," said the 48-year-old Furyk, who finished the tournament 15-under 273, just one stroke behind ultimate winner Rory McIlroy. "I haven't been healthy in a lot of years. I haven't put myself in the heat to win a golf tournament in a while, and I missed it."

#### A WELCOME SURPRISE

Furyk qualified for THE PLAYERS as one of the last six golfers in the field, according to the PGA TOUR. Planning to have an off week, he learned of his fate the Sunday before the tournament, sometime between hosting a baby shower for military moms-to-be, and a charity concert for his foundation.

He took advantage of the last-minute opportunity. After shooting a 1-under 71 on a blustery Thursday afternoon, Furyk played in calmer conditions on Friday morning and shot a course-best 8-under 64, making eight birdies and 10 pars. It was his lowest score in 80 rounds at THE PLAYERS, and he was tied for third at 9-under.

On Saturday, Furyk didn't have as much success, shooting another 71, but he played well enough to stay within striking distance for Sunday. He finished at 10-under, tied for sixth and five shots behind third-round leader Jon Rahm.

#### **CHAMPIONSHIP SUNDAY**

Paired with Joel Dahmen, Furyk started Sunday's round with a bogey at 1, but recovered with an eagle at 2 and made par on 3 and 4. The sequence of events at holes 5 though 8, where Furyk went birdie, par, par, par, proved to be crucial.

"5, 6, 7, 8, I hit just some horrific golf shots, and I kind of lost my tempo, I lost some confidence back there, made some bad swings, and I was able to get the ball up-and-down," he said. "I chipped in on 5, two-putted 6, got up-and-down from the bunker at 7, got up-and-down from short of the green on 8. So I played four holes where I really felt lost with my setup and my golf swing and I played them 1-under par. That saved my round."

After a par on 9, Furyk said he told his caddie, Mike "Fluff" Cowan, he had to make an adjustment heading into the back nine, because something just wasn't right.

"I think I know what I'm doing wrong," Furyk said he told Fluff, "and if I can just get it going and hit a couple good shots at like 10, 11, 12, I think we can get through ..."

The halftime adjustment was planned perfectly. Furyk birdied on 10 and 11 and jumped to the top of the leaderboard. Then tied with Rahm for the lead at 14-under, the crowds surrounding Furyk began to quickly multiply. After nearly draining a 14-foot putt on 12 for birdie, Furyk settled for par. On the walk from 12 to 13, he pounded the waiting fists of a few kids standing behind the ropes.

"What's up, guys?" Furyk calmly asked, as a few other kids started screaming Fluff's name.

Furyk made par on the par-3 13th, and then drained a 6-foot putt for par at 14. Jacksonville resident Bill Koch was excited to see Furyk's run unfold before his eves.

"He's a local boy," Koch said. "We all love him. He's a great player, and it's exciting to see a guy with a little age competing with the youngsters."

A missed putt for par at 15 resulted in a costly bogey for Furyk, which dropped him to 13-under and tied for third.

Nevertheless, Ponte Vedra High School senior Matt Howard was impressed on the way to 16.

"It's incredible," Howard said. "My dad's 53 and just seeing him (Furyk) out here. 48. Like wow. You never really see that, do you?"

#### **AN EPIC CHARGE**

After a birdie at 16, Furyk was back at 14-under. On the way to 17, it seemed as if every fan in the stands was a direct member of the Furyk family, with cheers, whistles and applause resonating throughout the iconic golf arena. Once on the Island Green, he nearly birdied but missed just right, finishing the hole with a par.

At the par-4 18th, Furyk hit a rounddefining 7-iron to within 3 feet of the hole and ultimately birdied to finish the day 5-under 67 as the clubhouse leader.

"I had to hit that 7-iron pretty hard, and so I was aiming out there 15, 20 feet right of the pin and trying to hammer it," Furyk said. "It was going to try to hold it for a while, but I knew as hard as I was hitting it, it was going to land, the wind was getting it, and it came off exactly how I planned."

Furyk's dramatic finish did not ward off the roar of Rory, who was a few holes behind. Furyk said that end result, though, doesn't take away from his feelings about his performance.

"I don't feel any less pride for the way I played because I didn't win," Furyk said. "And because it was Rory, I mean,

three or four tied for first and at least four or five tied for second. You couldn't blink or somebody would change positions.

McIlroy hurt his own chances with a double-bogey at the fourth hole. He came up short with his second shot. Water.

"I wasn't aiming that far left for sure," he explained. "I was trying to land it like 10 yards on the green just right of the hazard, and if it had have been just that little further right, it would have probably landed in a good spot, but it just came out a little bit left."

While a birdie at the sixth was helpful, the following-hole bogey didn't help him much. He finally made another birdie, however, at the ninth, and righted the ship.

The back side is where McIlroy put the tournament away. Even though it wasn't perfect golf, it was good enough golf to win. There's a difference. Sometimes golfers just don't miss a shot, but usually at TPC Sawgrass that doesn't happen. It's how a guy recovers that matters.

probably doesn't take any sting out of it. I have a lot of respect for his game. I have a lot of respect for him as a person. But it still stings. I mean, I'm a competitor, and it pisses me off I didn't (win)."

As for the future, Furyk said he still plans to play 18 to 20 events in total this

year, but his performance at THE PLAY-ERS may result in him changing his schedule, as he will qualify for additional tournaments.

"My whole goal was to see how competitive I could be," Furyk said about this season. "I was definitely at peace with whatever happened. I was just excited about the fact that I was healthy, and I wanted to see what I could do. So this tournament showed me."

For instance, McIlroy had a bogey on 14, usually the toughest hole on the course, and then his drive at the 15th went into he wasn't sure what. Because of where the marshal was standing, he feared it was in some unmentionable grass stuff that might make his next shot impossible, but it was a clean lie in the bunker. He was relieved and hit a 6-iron.

"The second shot on 15 to set up that birdie putt was the best shot of the day by far," he said.

He made the 14-footer for a muchneeded birdie.

Like most who win THE PLAYERS, Mc-Ilroy played the final holes well. He birdied the 16th, then headed to the 17th tee.

"(I) kept telling myself on the way to the 17th tee, just make three more good swings," McIlroy said. "To step up and make those three good swings, it's very satisfying knowing that it's in there when it needs to be."

He ultimately made par on 17 and 18, and picked up his first win at THE PLAYERS. He joins Tiger Woods and Henrik Stenson as the only players to win at least one FedExCup, THE PLAYERS, a major and a World Golf Championships event.

While it's an intangible, McIlroy said he likes the March date versus May. He said the rye grass does a better job of visually defining fairways and rough. It gives him a better landing area for his ballistic drives. So, certainly, he's a fan of the change. And he's gaining life perspective.

For Jim Furyk, who finished a few holes ahead of McIlroy and was in the lead at the time he came up 18, it was a welcome experience. He's been injured most of the last two or three years. Finally healthy, some good golf came out. A change to the arm-lock putting style has also helped.

"I felt like I was pretty solid from 5 feet and in," Furyk said. "But I wasn't making a lot of 8- to 20-footers for birdie, or even better yet, I didn't think I was hitting quality putts and giving enough of those putts a chance to go in."

He messed around with arm-lock. But he was not convinced it would work for him. Then, just as Tim Clark had given Webb Simpson a tip on arm-lock putting, Simpson gave Furyk a tip. And ultimately he said it proved to be the difference.

"I've told him like six times since how

much I appreciate his help," Furyk said. "He spent 60 seconds with me, and in 60 seconds he gave me two tips, and one of them has changed my focus on how I putt with that putter. And it was the way he grips it. He said, there's two ways to grip it with your left arm, Bryson (DeChambeau) and Stewart (Cink) do it one way, he and Kuch (Matt Kuchar) maybe do it another."

So, the first tournament with a gold trophy, return to March and St. Patrick's Day date is in the books. As expected, the weather could have been 85 or 55, and it was — all in one week. The luck of the Irish, however, must be real, because not only did McIlroy win THE PLAYERS on St. Patrick's Day, he also won the Arnold Palmer Invitational in 2018 on St. Patrick's Day. Top that.
