World Down Syndrome Day celebrates an extra (special) chromosome

321 Love Your Neighbor event sheds stigma with help of Tesori Family Foundation and Church of Eleven22

Fact: The average life expectancy of a person with Down syndrome is nearly 60 years old. Some people with Down syndrome will live into their 80s. This is a huge increase from 1983, when the average life span of a person with Down syndrome was 25 years old.

Myths and misinformation were dispelled as one by one, community members stepped on stage at the Church of Eleven22 in Jacksonville on March 21 to present these facts about those living with Down syndrome during World Down Syndrome Day. The event not only dispelled common misconceptions but aimed at celebrating the often-misconstrued diagnosis of the third copy of the 21st chromosome. According to Michelle Tesori, co-founder of the Tesori Family Foundation, "Down Syndrome Day is a special day for us to formally celebrate what we have the pleasure of celebrating with our son every day — an extra chromosome!"

The second annual 321 Love Your Neighbor celebration included bouncy slides, activities and food trucks outside the Baymeadows location of the Church of Eleven22. The Tesori Family Foundation, a Ponte Vedra-based nonprofit organization devoted to helping families across Northeast Florida, hosted the event in addition to the church.

WJXT4 news anchor Nikki Kimbleton emceed the event, along with notable Downs syndrome speaker John Franklin "Frank" Stephens. Stephens is an advocate, actor, author and athlete with Down syndrome, who has spoken about the genetic disorder at Congress and has been invited to the White House — not once, but twice.

Stephens doesn't only advocate for the rights of those with Down syndrome. He also presents his story as a mirror to children and parents of children with the condition to empower them to believe in a positive future. His success story of achievements reframes the dialogue about having a lifelong "disability" and what can be expected from someone with Down syndrome.

"When I come here, I know I advocate mostly to young parents and families," Stephens said. "(I know) you're wondering what life with Down syndrome has in store for you. I can answer that for you. It will be full of the ordinary and extraordinary. It will be filled with laughter and tears, but most of all, it will be filled with love. I know this because it has been my experience."

Although a Down syndrome diagnosis still carries a stigma, there have been many recent improvements toward lifting the quality of life of individuals diagnosed. Organizations such as the Down Syndrome Association of Jacksonville provide an array of services and job training initiatives to help those in the community achieve their potential. In anticipation of the Association's 30th anniversary, it has grown from serving only a handful of families, to over 1,500 individuals and families with Down syndrome. The growth has resulted in the nonprofit's recent relocation of its original Riverside office to Southside, where it can accommodate more onsite programming. This additional, new programming includes North Florida's first employment training program tailored specifically to people with

Down syndrome, who, according to a recent study from researchers at MassGeneral Hospital for Children (MGH-fC) and colleagues in the Netherlands, never stop learning and acquiring functional skills throughout their lives.

During Stephens' presentation at the 321 Love Your Neighbor event, he spoke about his October 2017 congressional testimony. In front of Congress, Stephens advocated for allotting federal money to research that would help people with Down syndrome, rather than focusing on addressing the condition with prenatal testing that could result in selective abortions. He addressed the chairman and members of the committee with the introductory statement, "Whatever you learn today, please remember this: I am a man with Down syndrome and my life is worth living."

By looking at his history of accomplishments, it safe to say that Stephens has indeed had a full life at only 37. He has acted in the award-winning film, "Touched by Grace," as well guest-starred in the Emmy-winning TV show, "Born this Way." In addition, Stephens won the 2016 Quincy Jones Exceptional Award from the Global Down Syndrome Foundation for his work addressing discrimination against those with Down syndrome. He regularly lectures at universities around the U.S, promoting his message of inclusion and acceptance in a diverse world.

Stephens credits much of his success to his parents, John and Cornelia Stephens, and his brother, Nick, for support-

Puppies and patriotism: A perfect pairing

K9s for Warriors is seeking 'puppy raisers' in area to help mission of serving veterans

Do you want to be able to give some love to adorable puppies and help veterans at the same time?

K9s for Warriors, a nonprofit based in Ponte Vedra, is looking for "puppy raisers" to help expand its mission of pairing military veterans and service members suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Traumatic Brain Injury and/or military sexual trauma with a canine companion.

The Puppy Raisers program places puppies between the ages of 8 weeks to 12 months old in a home environment to ready the youngsters before they can begin more formal training at the K9s for Warriors facility.

"Acceptance is contingent on if we have enough raisers," said Brianna Bentov, public relations manager for K9s for Warriors. "We do get offered more (puppies) than what we can handle."

According to Ks for Warriors, puppy

raisers must meet the following requirements:

- Must be at least 18 years old
- Must live within 50 miles of Camp K9 (114 Camp K9 Road, Ponte Vedra Beach)
 - Must have regular access to a car
- Must attend monthly obedience classes with K9 trainers
- Must provide a safe environment for a puppy under 1 year of age
- Must teach the puppy manners and basic obedience
- Must provide the puppy with age-appropriate socialization opportunities, such as public outings
- Must supervise the puppy throughout the day
- Must agree to return the puppy upon request


share her personal story of abuse.

Can you please briefly tell us about your background?

I grew up in New Canaan, Connecticut, a great place to live and near New York City. I come from a large family with seven siblings, many of whom live nearby. My father, Jim Allegro, and step-mom, Lesley, live in St. Augustine. He was a former Marine and corporate businessman who became an executive board member of ESPN in its early years and helped to build the company and grow its operations. He helped the team at ESPN establish the V Foundation for Cancer Research, and my younger sister is now on the board and founded the Wine Celebration raising over \$108 million for research to date. Our mother was lost to cancer and then a few years ago, we lost our oldest son to brain cancer, which has resulted in a few of my passionate endeavors.

I've been coming to St. Augustine since 1982 when we had a beach condo and my sister was studying at Flagler. My husband and I moved here permanently 25 years ago with young children, and it was a great place to raise a family. I worked primarily in business development for a private company for several years and I also had a small equestrian center here in Ponte Vedra. A few years ago, I joined the St. Johns County Recreation Advisory Board (RAB) to advocate for sports & recreation. My husband, Sandy, and son, Kevin, have a successful carpentry and remodeling business and my daughter, Becca, lives in Winter Park, Florida.

What's the story of the Jamie Chapin Classic Golf Tournament?

The event relaunched a few years ago when the new University of Florida (UF) lacrosse coach, Garrett Hanrahan, decided to select a cause for the team and became aware of Jamie and his legacy. Jamie, my son, was a UF grad who had been captain of the lacrosse team at UF and at Nease High School. He helped launch lacrosse locally, but he loved all sports — especially ice hockey. He was diagnosed with a Glioblastoma/Astrocytoma, a deadly brain cancer, after graduating from UF. Coach Hanrahan, along with Jamie's friends, inspired us to pick up where we left off and we began the annual golf event again.

We discovered the newly formed Immunotherapy Research Team at UF directed by Dr. Duane Mitchell. So, together we're working to host a special event to create awareness and help fund the research initiative.

When is the third annual event? What makes this year's event different?

We're hosting an evening event on Friday, May 17, with a presentation from Dr. Mitchell to raise awareness about UF and the ReMission Alliance — a collaboration of 12 top research centers in the United States and Canada under the direction of UF, including Duke, MD Anderson, Dana-Farber, UCSF and others. With the help of AI (artificial intelligence), they are going to change the trajectory of this devastating disease. Dr. Mitchell scored among the top at the recent Biden Cancer Summit and announced the Alliance in February 2019. They are looking to raise \$100 million to fast-track the trials and treatments.

It's about time there is a collaboration of sharing the tissue and the data! This is about the future of cancer treatment. We hope to raise funds and to create alignment of private entities and advocates that have the same goal — to support research. We can't turn our backs on this; quitting is not an option because cancer isn't going anywhere.

On another note, we understand you've worked to preserve greenspace in Ponte Vedra. How did you start PV Greenway Alliance Incorporated?

A team of grassroots advocates and I started on a mission to create some safe recreational, destination-based trails in Ponte Vedra and preserve some greenspace. It is now PVGA — a 501c3. We've identified areas that could possibly be used for a multi-use greenway. Over the last few years, much that had remained has been purchased and developed. We did a lot of outreach and inspired other groups to begin similar initiatives. We were accepted for assistance from RTCA National Park Services in 2016.

Today, PVGA is on the brink of our phase 1, which includes a small wharf in Palm Valley. From there, we will endeavor to design a multi-use path to Sawgrass Village and eventually connect to the schools. (We have five schools and a YMCA within two miles.) Our new Commissioner, Jeremiah Blocker, is helping to establish this as a priority in our area. We have recently been awarded a grant from DEP and UF and that will help with the cost of the wharf decking. A marine contractor is helping to build this to commemorate his family heritage so we'll hope to break ground soon! Community advocates can support us by liking us on Facebook @ PVGreenway and join our group of advocates.

ing him. He urged the families at the 321 Love Your Neighbor celebration to do the same.

"Your kids are going to climb on your shoulders and do things we never even dreamed," Stephens said. "This is what happens when you decide to follow joy not despair. Open you hearts to your children's joy. Oh, and when you run across an occasional nonbeliever, who looks at your

child and frowns, or ones that say something like, 'Bless your heart, that must be so hard,' or the kid that says, 'What's wrong with your baby?' Just tell them, 'My little one has an extra chromosome — but don't worry he is very accepting, he won't hold it against you that you're common.""

Money raised by the KATE KUP will benefit the Kate Amato Foundation's focus on cuttingedge pediatric cancer research projects around the country.

signed up and the foundation raised over \$50,000.

"The community response was fantastic," Amato said. "Everyone had a good time and raised lots of funding. Enthusiasm has increased this year. There are over 100 players. The energy and excitement are unlike anything I've experienced before."

STORY OF THE FOUNDATION

Kate Amato, a local Jacksonville Beach girl who died in November 2016 after a long battle with cancer, is the inspiration for the foundation.

Kate suffered from metastatic alveolar rhabdomyosarcoma, a lethal cancer that attacked the skeletal muscles. Knowing that only 4 percent of federal funding supports pediatric cancer, Dr. Lisa Amato and her husband, Jeff Amato, started the Kate Amato Foundation. They are determined to see an increase in funding for pediatric cancer research and a decrease in pain and suffering among children and families.

"Through her illness, we realized how little research there was," Amato said. "I think people assume because we have such great national foundations, that it's all being taken care of, that there's enough money and there's not."

Pediatric cancers are also often ignored by pharmaceutical companies because they see the investment as a financial risk and the revenue does not outweigh the investment, Amato noted.

"It is the most excruciating pain imagin-

able," Amato said referring to the loss of her daughter. "Through grief, we knew that we were going to do something. We learned too much to turn our backs. We felt responsible that we had to do something with this information. Educate, fundraise and advocate for change."

The Kate Amato Foundation is making a difference with its three current research projects at UCLA, Baylor University and the University of Colorado. Each project was carefully selected by the foundation's scientific advisory board, which includes pediatric oncologists from around the country.

"We give money directly to scientists doing the work," Amato said. "We are directly having an impact on advancing science."

The Kate Amato foundation awarded \$100,000 to these projects in its first year alone. And as Amato pauses and reflects on her family's journey, there is no doubt in the world that she is stopping there.

"It's a lot of mixed emotions," Amato said about the efforts of the foundation. "It fills my determination. It energizes us. I imagine that what it means is one day some child may have a better option at a better life. It's important that Jeff and I say how grateful our family is to the love and support throughout Kate's illness and as we're building the foundation. It's humbling, inspiring and we're very thankful.

"I think it brings me more of a sense of peace than anything," Amato added. "If we could spare family pain and suffering and could give a child life. We couldn't do it with Kate, but we might be able to do that for somebody else."

Featuring Wounded Warrior Project

Charlamain Caycedo

In this edition of Why I Serve, featuring Wounded Warrior Project, the Recorder sat down with St. Augustine resident Charlamain Caycedo, a Navy veteran of four years who served in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and the Persian Gulf.

After you enlisted in the Navy at 17, what would you tell someone at a similar age who is about to embark on a similar experience?

Go for it. Don't be afraid of anything. I've actually helped two women in my life enlist into the Navy. One currently is serving as a corpsman, and she just graduated. We have such a short life, and the military, though it has a lot of hardships, has a lot of benefits, and you see the world. You are put in situations that you never believe that you're in. And if it's hard, it's worth it, typically.

What does Wounded Warrior Project mean to you?

We were introduced very briefly in California to Wounded Warrior Project. It wasn't until we moved here that we really got to see what Wounded Warrior Project does. They have really just opened our eyes to our fellow brothers and sisters. The community and the network are



lifechanging. As a military family that goes through the trials and tribulations, to be connected to those individuals who have also done that really means a lot.

Puppies

Bentov said a lot of the puppies are donated from breeders and are usually between 8 to 12 weeks old. The puppy usually remains with the puppy raiser from 2 to 8 months (depending on its age) before going to the K9s for Warriors onsite location for formal training, and eventually, being partnered with a

Puppy raisers are given a training manual and provided everything needed, including food, leash, crate and veterinary care, to help the puppy prepare for its important, future role.

Bentov said she understands it can be a difficult situation for a puppy raiser knowing the puppy they fell in love

with will have to be returned, but the nonprofit tries to make the transition as smooth and welcoming as possible. Puppy raisers are invited to graduations to see their puppy and meet the warrior it's paired with, as well as recognized at the event for the job they did.

"They understand they're helping to save a veteran's life," Bentov said.

According to Bentov, the number of requests to be a puppy raiser is increasing, and about half of those who apply are approved. But, she said, there are plenty of opportunities — and puppies - available for those who qualify.

"It's hard to turn puppies away," she said. "Especially when it's going to something so important."





Varsity blues

"There's no secret ... anybody can be successful in anything if they just put in the time and work." That's what legendary University of Southern California (USC) water polo coach Jovan Vavic said in 2017 in an article published on USC's website. Now, it looks like money helps, too.

Vavic was among the 50 defendants arrested in the nationwide college admissions conspiracy called "Varsity Blues" by federal prosecutors. Other high-profile defendants include actresses Lori Loughlin and Felicity Huffman. The scheme, orchestrated by William "Rick" Singer, involved two kinds of fraud, according to the prosecutors. One

was to cheat on the SAT or ACT, and the other was to use Singer's connections with coaches and use bribes, disguised as charitable contributions, to get the students in under fake athletic credentials.

The ACT/SAT scheme, per court papers, involved parents paying between \$15,000 and \$75,000 per test for a third party - usually Harvard grad Mark Riddell — to take the test in the place of the student, or replace their responses with his own. How he did it, reported the Wall Street Journal, allegedly involved Singer bribing test proctors,

If you haven't been regularly reviewing your estate plan, start when you hit 60

How frequently you should review your estate plan depends on how old vou are and whether there has been a significant change in vour circumstances. If you are over age 60

and you haven't updated your estate plan in many decades, it's almost certain that you need to update your documents. After that, you should review your plan every five years or so. But if you're younger, you don't need to do so nearly as often.

Here are a few age ranges and what they mean in terms of estate planning:

- 18-30. Everyone needs a durable power of attorney, healthcare proxy and HIPAA release so that they have people they choose to step in and make decisions for them in the event of incapacity.
- 30-40. Once you begin accumulating assets, get married and have children, it's important to create an estate plan to care for your loved ones in the event of your death. It also can't hurt to update your durable power of attorney, health care proxy and HIPAA release, since the people you may have appointed at 18 (your parents?) may not be the people you want in these
- 40-60. Unless there's been a change in your circumstances, and assuming you've set a good plan in place during your 30s, you probably don't need to review your estate plan during your 40s and 50s.
- 60-70. Once you've hit your 60s, it's time to take a look. Your children are probably grown. You may have grandchildren. And, hopefully, you've accumulated some wealth. The people you appointed to step in in the event of incapacity when you were 35 may not be in a position to assist when you're 65. You may have retired or are contemplating doing so. And, unfortunately, the chances of disability or death increase with every year.
- 70+. Now it's time to review your plan every five years or so. Changes happen to your health and that of your loved ones, to the tax laws, to the programs supporting long-term care or disability care. It's important to have a plan in place and to adjust it as circumstances change.

Change in circumstances

While the timeline above outlines when you should review and perhaps update your estate plan, it needs to be supplemented by the following potential changes in circumstances that would warrant a

review of your plan to see if it still meets your goals and needs:

- Marriage. You're likely to want your assets to go to your spouse and to name him or her to be your agent in the event of incapacity.
- Divorce. Likewise, if you get divorced, you probably won't want your assets to go to your ex-spouse or to rely upon him or her to step in if you were to become incapacitated.
- Children. Once you have children, you'll want to provide for them and to name someone to step in as guardian in the event of your death or incapacity and that

of their other parent, if any. Generally, once you have a plan in place, you do not have to update it if you have more children.

- Disability. If you or someone who would inherit from you becomes disabled, you will need to plan to protect and manage your assets, whether for yourself or for vour beneficiaries.
- Wealth. If you accumulate sufficient assets to exceed the thresholds for state and federal estate taxes (\$11.4 million federally), you may want to plan to reduce or eliminate such taxes.
- Moving. If you move to a new state or country, it will be important to have your

estate plan reviewed to make sure it works in the new jurisdiction.

In short, until you reach age 60 or 70, reviewing your estate plan every five years probably is overkill. But do so whenever you have a change in circumstances such as those listed above. If you're over 60 and haven't updated your estate plan in many years, now's the time. Then, having a review every five years is definitely a good rule of thumb.



Time for some financial spring cleaning

Spring is here and for many of us, that means it's time for some spring cleaning. This year, in addition to tidying up your home, why not try brightening

your financial environment? Some of the same moves you make to clean your surroundings may apply to your finances. Consider these suggestions:

- **Get rid of clutter.** When you go through your closets, attic, basement or other areas, you may find many items you no longer need. You might be able to sell some of these things or find other ways of disposing of them. And as you review your portfolio, you might also encounter "clutter" in the form of investments that may be redundant to others you own. If so, you might consider selling these investments and using the proceeds to purchase new ones, which may help you broaden your portfolio.
- Protect yourself from hazards. As you go about your spring cleaning, you may encounter hazardous substances. such as cleaning agents, paints, batteries, pesticides and so on, which you don't need anymore and which may pose potential health risks. You can reduce the possible danger from these materials by recycling or disposing of them in an environmentally safe way. Your overall financial situation has hazards, too, in the form of illness or injury preventing you from working, or, in your later years, the need for some type of long-term care, such as an extended stay in a nursing home. To protect yourself, you may need appropriate insurance, including disability and long-term care.
- **■** Find new uses for existing possessions. When you are sprucing up your home, you may rediscover uses for things you already have. Who knows perhaps that treadmill that's been gathering dust in your garage could actually be employed again as part of your rededicated exercise regimen. And you might be able to get more mileage out of some of your existing investments, too. Suppose, for instance, that some of your stocks are paying you dividends, which you take as cash. after many of these students received permission to take untimed tests, based on doctors' notes attesting to learning disabilities. Riddell, a Florida resident, was able to get targeted test results. According to court documents, he is slated to plead guilty to conspiracy to commit mail fraud and money laundering, and faces up to 20 years in prison. He expects a reduced sentence in exchange for his cooperation.

The bribes to coaches are almost the more breathtaking allegations. The bribed coaches, who make recommendations on which recruited athletes should be accepted, were vouching for athletes who, in many cases, had never played the sports in which the coaches were claiming they excelled. According to numerous reports, Lori Loughlin, who played Aunt Becky on "Full House," and her fashion designer husband, Mossimo Giannulli, are accused of paying \$500,000 in bribes to have their two daughters designated recruits to the USC crew team, although neither daughter had ever competed in crew. The parents allegedly sent photographs of each girl on a rowing machine.

In the indictment, one parent was recorded in a conversation with Singer saying, "...you understand that [my daughter] is not worthy to be on that team." The response from Singer was: "No, no, he's my guy... [A]nd he knows [s]he's not coming to play, he knows all that." While the allegations haven't been proven yet, this is compelling, and galling, evidence.

So how are the universities responding? So far, Yale has announced that they are rescinding the admission of one student as a result of their part in the scandal,

which included their former soccer coach accepting bribes to recommend students who were not athletes. Other schools have launched investigations, and students at Stanford have filed class-action lawsuits, claiming that "unqualified students found their way into the admissions rolls of highly selective universities, while those students who played by the rules and did not have college-bribing parents were denied admission," according to a UPI article published on March 14. The students also claim their degrees from Stanford will have less value "because prospective employers may now question whether she was admitted to the university on her own merits."

What should happen to the students? Should students, who didn't know they were admitted under false pretenses, be punished for their parents' sins? At a minimum, they shouldn't get the benefit of their parents' criminal behavior. Perhaps they should be made to retake entrance exams, and reapply, on their own merits this time. If students did know, should they be prosecuted in federal court, marking them for the rest of their lives, for what their parents did? Surely, children should not be punished for the sins of their parents. Maybe the silver lining of the whole Varsity Blues case is that these children will learn important lessons about the price of feeling entitled.





Sharks football coach Toblin leaving for Bolles

Search for replacement underway as PVHS aims to elevate program

Ponte Vedra High School (PVHS) is searching for a new head football coach after Matt Toblin resigned from the job last week to take the head coaching position at Bolles.

"Coach Toblin is a great coach, great man, great teacher," Ponte Vedra Athletic Director Eric Frank said. "We were fortunate to have him as part of our program over the last five years, and we will definitely miss him and wish him the best of luck as he and his family go on to Bolles."

Toblin led the Sharks to an 8-3 record last season, including a 42-13 win over Bolles. He has a 39-18 record in his five seasons at PVHS and led the Sharks to a runner-up finish in the 2016 Class 5A state championship. He takes over a storied Bolles program that finished 8-5

last season and lost to Trinity Christian in the Class 5A regional finals.

Toblin published a letter on the Ponte Vedra football Twitter page on March 20, thanking the school and players for their support. He wrote that leaving the programs was "one of the most difficult things I have ever had to do."

"The Ponte Vedra program has always been bigger than one person and I expect it to continue to grow and flourish," Toblin said in the post.

Frank said the school has begun a search this week, both locally and nationally, to find the right candidate to replace Toblin and continue the program in the "great direction" it was heading under him.

"We not only want it to continue in that direction, but we want the person who comes in to elevate the program to the next level," Frank said.

Frank said there is no set timetable for finding a replacement and the school plans to be diligent in making the right choice.

"We are going to be very selective in our decisionmaking going forward because we want to make the best decision for our school and our student athletes," Frank said. "Holding us to a timeline could hinder that success so we're paying attention to all the details."



in Jacksonville. "I wasn't sure this day would ever come. I feel blessed to be here and lucky that I got it done. It was certainly a crazy finish there at the end. I pulled everything out that I could and it ended up being enough."

Entering the final hole needing a birdie to tie Lower at 19-under, Covello stuck his ball to one foot away for an easy birdie and entry into a playoff. He then promptly pulled his drive into the water to start the playoff but got up and down from 113 yards for par to match Lower.

"When I was down there (by the water), I knew I wasn't done yet," Covello said. "I still had a chance. I still ended up with a clean lie and a good angle into the pin, so somehow I talked myself into believing that I still had a chance. I made that 10 to 12 footer to extend it, and that was huge."

All week long Covello relied on his

iron play at the par-71 course. He led the field in greens in regulation through three rounds before hitting only 11/18 during the final round. Covello began the day with a bogey at the first before rattling off birdies at Nos. 4, 5 and 7 to make the turn at 2-under. After another birdie at the par-5 12th, Covello bogeyed Nos. 13 and 14, falling three back of Lower. Anthony earn her 600th victory this past season, and Hobby credits Anthony with helping her succeed.

"I just love Coach Sherri to death, honestly," Hobby said. "She's been a really great coach and a great person. Obviously, every day at practice she pushes me. She's just always been there as a coach, and someone I know I can call on if I need anything at all."

Next up for Hobby is NC State, which is the No. 3 seed in the Women's NCAA Tournament. The Wolfpack beat Kentucky 72-57 on Monday night to advance to the Sweet 16 where they will play second-seeded Iowa on Saturday. The 10th-ranked Wolfpack (28-5) have a respected and storied history in women's

basketball, which was a big factor in Hobby's decision.

"I saw how much they cared about the women's program," Hobby said of NC State. "Not every school do you have thousands of people come to watch women's basketball, so the fans really care. Coach (Wes) Moore and the coaching staff recruited me really hard, and I just felt like they cared about me and how I could progress as a player."
