

County takes steps toward paid off-beach parking plan

In the April 2 St. Johns County Commission meeting, the Board of County Commissioners decided to move forward with a Request for Proposals (RFP) process for a paid parking program for off-beach parking lots. Based on the community feedback and public comment, however, county staff has a difficult task ahead with balancing the area's expectations and limited resources.

Although the vote passed narrowly in a 3-2 decision, the program will only continue negotiations with Republic Parking System LLC to fine-tune an agreement for the project. Commissioners Jimmy Johns of District 1, Jeb Smith of District 2 and Henry Dean of District 5 voted in favor of continuing negotiations, while Jeremiah Blocker of District 4 and Paul Waldron of District 3 voted against it. The County Commission has yet to proceed with a finalization of the plan.

The paid parking program would affect approximately 25 locations. Mickler's Landing Beachfront Park in Ponte Vedra Beach is included in the plan. Although not yet finalized, the proposed rate would be \$5 a day or \$50 for an annual pass for both off-beach parking and parking at the county's boat ramps. The system would rely on a digital

app that would utilize "smart meters" and pay-by-phone methods

The paid parking management program has been an ongoing discussion for the past few years. It hopes to offset some of the challenges involved with directing the county's limited financial budget toward beach services. Some of these services include maintaining beach access and beach driving lanes, managing trash collection and restrooms and administering habitat conservation and public safety services such as lifeguards and marine rescue. As of fiscal year 2017, the total funding for such services was \$1,728,881, according to the county. The revenue

collected is from an on-beach driving fee that leaves about \$1 million in deficit for beach services. According to Jesse Dunn, the county's director of the Office of Management and Budget, the current funding approach is "geographically limited," and the new plan would close the \$1 million revenue shortfall for beach services. Currently, this shortfall is levied from the General Fund and the Tourist Development Tax.

Dunn pointed out that the parking fee program could also help improve the 12 boat ramp facilities in the county.

Sea turtle nesting season begins May 1.



Sea turtle nesting season begins May 1

Sea turtle nesting season begins May 1, and St. Johns County officials are asking residents, visitors and businesses to help protect natural habitat by observing all nesting season laws and regulations.

Between May 1 and Oct. 31, vehicular traffic on the beach is allowed between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. In addition, all beachfront properties are required to reduce their impact by eliminating interior and exterior lights, which may disrupt nesting sea turtles. Volleyball court lights at St. Johns County Pier Park will turn on at sunset and turn off at 9 p.m. during this time.

According to the county, beach visitors can also have a positive impact on nesting sea turtles by taking the following actions while enjoying the beach:

- Refrain from using fireworks and open fires.
- Remove ruts and fill in holes left by vehicles and sandcastle building.
- Remove all chairs, umbrellas or

canopies from the beach before dark. These items are subject to removal by County staff.

- Refrain from using flashlights, as they can harm sea turtles.
- Avoid entering sand dunes and conservation zones (15 feet seaward of the dune line).
- Refrain from using balloons, as they can fall into the ocean and harm marine life.
- Never approach sea turtles emerging from, or returning to the sea. According to the county, nesting sea turtles are vulnerable, timid and can be easily frightened away.

Per the county, one should never push an injured animal back into the ocean. If an injured, sick or deceased sea turtle is encountered, call the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office non-emergency dispatch line at (904) 824-8304

Miss Florida 2018 gives PVHS students 'Real Talk' about substance abuse

Miss Florida 2018 Taylor Tyson visited Ponte Vedra High School (PVHS) on Wednesday to speak to students about substance abuse prevention.

The presentation, titled "Real Talk," is based on prevention techniques included in the Alcohol Literacy Challenge, developed by nationally-recognized researchers Drs. Michael Dunn and Thomas Hall.

The program is the first classroom-based prevention program that specifically challenges students' preconceived notions about drinking and its effects, according to the addiction research facility that sponsors Tyson's presentations, Advanced Recovery Systems.

Tyson, a South Florida native, told the Recorder that the topic is especially close to her.

"In my family, substance abuse was never something that was swept under the rug," Tyson said. "It's something my family struggled with my whole life, and I feel a personal connection to what I'm talking about. I know that sometimes there is so much of a stigma attached to it and as a society we don't talk about it that much. I believe that in order to solve problems as big as this, we really have to have an honest conversation about it."

Tyson is currently touring schools around the state giving presentations on the various platforms that are important to her. In addition to speaking about drug abuse and prevention, she speaks to elementary and middle schools about the Florida Everglades, as she did early Wednesday morning at Landrum Middle School. Tyson also advocates for empowering young women, and was the third runner up for Miss America 2018.

Girl Scout Troop works to earn Silver Award at Cultural Center

Beaches Dial-a-Ride celebrates new vehicle, expanded services

Beaches Dial-a-Ride board and staff and business, civic and philanthropic leaders from the Beaches community celebrated Dial-a-Ride's service and vehicle expansion at Beach Diner in Atlantic Beach on April 4.

The newest para-transit vehicle in Dial-a-Ride's fleet was revealed to nearly 60 guests at the private event, hosted by Barry Adeeb of Beach Diner. The 13-passenger vehicle is a 27-foot, 2015 StarCraft AllStar with space for 10 regular seats and three wheelchairs.


The winner of the raffle will be announced live at the Rotary Club's annual Mineral City Celebration; the winner does not need to be present to win.

This "Waterway Access Management Program" could provide maintenance for the ramps and amenities, improve parking lot access and capacity, as well as ensure regular channel access dredging, which has recently relied on Hurricane Matthew and Irma funding. Dunn told the Recorder that money accrued from boating passes could be implemented toward expanding the Palm Valley Bridge boat ramp. He was quick to add, however, that all money collected for boating passes will go to only boat ramp facilities, and any money collected from off-beach parking will be allocated only toward beach services.

In a survey conducted about the program, a majority of residents said the current boat ramps were "insufficient."

Although many residents stated the boating ramps need improvement, most of the public comment was regarding opposition to the parking fees.

Most commenters said because they pay property taxes, they should be granted access to the beach. Concerns about Uber and Lyft ridesharing programs were also presented as an impediment from capturing money from any actual tourists, who might not be traveling via their own vehicles or rentals.

Dunn said that due to an agreement with the Army Corps of Engineers regarding federal funding for beach renourishment, the paid parking program could not allow for differentiating between resident and nonresident rate structures for the plan without possibly losing the money intended to supplement the renourishment projects.

Blocker and Waldron were in opposition to the overall project. Blocker restated his position on raising the bed tax, and Waldron raised concerns over including boat ramps in the program, saying the program could "curtail" the biggest attraction in the county.

Smith said he believes it is an "equitable thing to be able to charge for a service you're benefiting from." He went on to point out that not everyone goes to the beach or uses a boat, adding that he is, "one of them."

"Somebody has to pay," Smith concluded.



Lotteries date back to before Christ. The Han Dynasty sold Keno tickets to finance The Great Wall of China. The King James version of the Gospel of Luke tells us that Caesar Augustus sent out a decree "that all the world should be taxed." Apparently taxing the world was not enough, Caesar Augustus also organized a lottery. The proceeds from that early lottery were used to make repairs and improvements to the city of Rome. "I found a city built of sun-dried brick," Augustus declared toward the end of his four-decade reign. "I leave her clothed in marble." Governments have long loved lotteries as a way to

raise money without raising taxes.

The first official English lottery pre-dates the King James Version of the Bible. It was organized by Queen Elizabeth I in 1567 to provide funds for the "reparation of the havens and

strength of the realme, and towardes such other publique good works." To this day, lotteries still advertise that the proceeds will be used for the public good. Florida, for instance, advertises that the proceeds of its lottery are used to fund education. King James organized a nationwide lottery to finance the colonization of Jamestown, Virginia, in 1612.



Initially, the government sold tickets directly to the public. Later, ticket sales were turned over to brokers. These brokers hired "runners" to sell tickets. Since many of the poorer members of society could not afford a whole ticket, the tickets were broken into sixteenths. These early brokers of lottery tickets would eventually become modern stock brokers.

America has a long history with lotteries. Columbia University, Princeton University, and the University of Pennsylvania were all initially financed by lotteries. Benjamin Franklin organized a lottery to buy cannon for the defense of Philadelphia in 1747. The scheme of that first Pennsylvania lottery called for selling 10,000 tickets at two pounds each. Three-thousand pounds would go to defense and the remaining 17,000 would be paid out to 2,842 winning tickets with no winning ticket worth more than 500 pounds.

The Continental Congress used lotteries to finance the American Revolution. We were fighting a war against taxes, so the Founding Fathers used a lottery to raise taxes without actually raising taxes. George Washington organized a lottery in 1768 to build a road across the Alleghany Mountains. It failed, but if you still have your hand-signed ticket, it is

worth \$20,000 today at auction.

George Washington's lottery proposed to pay out 85 percent of the proceeds to many winners. Most early lotteries paid out many small prizes rather than one big prize. It was Alexander Hamilton who first proposed the idea of one giant prize. "Everybody," he said, "will be willing to hazard a trifling sum for the chance of considerable gain ... and would prefer a small chance of winning a great deal to a great chance of winning little." I doubt even Hamilton would have foreseen how big those prizes would get.

In 2016, the Powerball paid out over 1.5 billion dollars on one drawing. That is still the record payout. Lotteries fell out of favor in the 1830s, largely because they were seen as an unfair tax on the poor. For decades, the only major lottery in the United States was run by the Louisiana State Lottery Company, a notably corrupt organization known as the "octopus."

Lotteries came back in favor following the initiation of the New York State Lottery in 1967. That first Lotto advertised itself as "Your Chance of a Lifetime to Help Education." The NY Lotto has been criticized for paying out only 40 percent of what it takes in. Ticket sales were suspended in 1975 and 1976 because organizers were manipulating the game so that unsold tickets were selected as winners.

The first multi-state lottery was organized in 1985. Powerball, the big daddy

of lottery drawings, began in 1992. Powerball tickets are now sold in 44 states. When Florida joined Powerball in 2009, one of the conditions was that the drawings would be held at Universal Studios in Orlando. Today the chances of winning the Powerball Drawing is one in 195 million. On average, half of the money from ticket sales is paid out as a

Math is hard. Numbers are confusing. When someone in Alabama or Kentucky wins half a billion dollars in the lottery, we tend to see it as a miracle. After all, the chance of winning that big grand prize is almost one in 200 million. But, in another sense, the odds that someone will win that prize is actually 100 percent. The odds of you winning are astronomical. The odds of someone winning are even odds. The chance of the Government winning is the same: 100 percent.

Most of us, who don't win the grand prize, would be better off investing our ticket purchases into the stock market. Twenty dollars a week invested at a 10 percent rate of return will grow to almost \$500,000 in 40 years. That is a lot less than a half billion if you hit the winning ticket, but, as I already discussed, it will be a miracle if you do.

Put together a professional team to help you reach your goals


As you work toward achieving your goals in life, you will need to make moves that contain financial, tax and legal elements, so you may want to get some help — from more than one source.

Specifically, you might want to put together a team comprised of your financial advisor, your CPA or other tax professional, and your attorney. Together, this team can help you with many types of financial/tax/legal connections.

For starters, you may decide, possibly upon the recommendation of your financial advisor, to sell some investments and use the proceeds to buy others that may now be more appropriate for your needs. If you sell some investments you've held for a year or less and realize a capital gain on the sale, the gain generally will be considered short-term and be taxed at your ordinary income tax rate. But if you've held the investments for more than a year before selling, your gain will likely be considered long-term and taxed at the lower, long-term capital gains rate, which can be 0 percent, 15 percent or 20 percent, or a combination of those rates.

On the other hand, if you sell an investment and realize a capital loss, you may be able to apply the loss to offset gains realized by selling other, more profitable investments and also potentially offset some of your ordinary income. So, as you can see, the questions potentially raised by investment sales — "Should I sell?" "If so, when?" "If I take some losses, how much will they benefit me at tax time?" — may also be of importance to your tax advisor, who will need to account for sales in your overall tax picture. As such, it's a good idea for your tax and financial advisors to communicate about any investment sales you make.

Your tax and financial advisors also may want to be in touch on other issues, such as your contributions to a retirement plan. For example, if you are self-employed or own a small business, and you contribute to a SEP-IRA — which is funded with pre-tax dollars, so the more you contribute, the lower your taxable income — your financial advisor can report to your tax advisor (with your permission) how much you've contributed at given points in a year, and your tax advisor can then let you know how much more you might need to add to move into a lower tax bracket, or at least avoid being bumped up to a higher one. Your financial advisor will be the one to recommend the investments you use to fund your SEP-IRA.



Guitarist Tab Benoit to perform 'Whiskey Bayou Revue' tour at Ponte Vedra Concert Hall April 13

Guitarist Tab Benoit will perform at the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall Saturday, April 13, as part of his "Whiskey Bayou Revue" Tour.

Benoit is a three-time GRAMMY-nominated musician and five-time "Contemporary Male" Blues Music Award Winner.

Born in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in 1967, he grew up in the nearby oil and fishing town of Houma, where he still resides today. Musically, he was exposed early on to traditional Cajun waltzes and the country music broadcast on his hometown's only radio station.

In the late 80s, Benoit began hanging out at the Blues Box, a music club and cultural center in Baton Rouge run by guitarist Tabby Thomas. Playing guitar alongside Thomas, Raful Neal, Henry Gray and other high-profile regulars at the club, Benoit learned the blues firsthand from these living blues legends. He formed a trio in 1987 and began playing clubs in Baton Rouge and New Orleans.

In 1992, Benoit released his first recording "Nice and Warm" on the Justice Label. The title track became a AAA Radio hit and Benoit's touring career kicked into

high gear. Benoit began playing 250 shows a year, a schedule he has kept up for over 20 years. He recorded four albums for Justice Records before being signed to the Vanguard label, and became Louisiana's No. 1 blues export. Vanguard allowed Benoit to produce his own recordings; Benoit wanted to record the sound that he was trying to create and in 1999 Vanguard Records released "These Blues Are All

Benoit's music evolved again after he signed with the Telarc International/Concord Music Group in 2002. He began to strip it down to a three-piece group, where he found more freedom as a guitarist. He was also on a mission in wanting to use his music and his energy to bring attention to Louisiana's coastal erosion issues. Benoit began to spend more time in the Wetlands and it was where he began to write his songs. "Wetlands" was the title of his first Telarc/Concord International release. Following the release of "Wetlands" in 2004, Benoit founded the Voice of the Wetlands no-profit organization (www. voiceofthewetlands.org) and began to use music and gather other musicians to use their platforms for getting the message out. He put together a band that featured Cyril Neville, Anders Osborne, George Porter Jr, Big Chief Monk Boudreaux, Johnny Vidacovich, Johnny Sansone and Waylon Thibodeaux that became The Voice of the Wetlands All-Stars.



Sawgrass Country Club players top net competition at JAGA Scratch & Spring Four-Ball


