

# Ponte Vedra Corporation withdraws from County Commission hearing

On Sept. 13, the Ponte Vedra Corporation, a subsidiary of GATE Land, formally withdrew from the County Commission Transmittal hearing's agenda. The Sept. 17 meeting would have decided whether to move forward with the company's Comprehensive Plan Amendment application for the Outpost property.

The amendment was intended to change parts of the property from a conservation designation to a residential zoning intended for the development of a 66-home community, Vista Tranquila.

According to a letter from Ponte Vedra Corporation to the commission, the planned unit development will remain pending and within the time period specified in the Settlement Agreement between the corporation and county, the PVC may request the application be placed on

a future agenda for public hearing and vote.

Additionally, the letter stated, "Since agreeing to the Settlement Agreement, unfortunately, recent discussions have implied that PVC is requesting to remove conservation protections from the property. PVC absolutely rejects this notion, as the company maintains that the proposed low-density residential use is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and that an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan is not required for the proposed development on its private property."

The founders of Save Guana Now released a statement to their followers, informing them not to show up to protest at the Commission meeting.

The Save Guana Now organization made the following statement in an email:

"Evidently, Gate was not interested in an encore of the PZA hearing with our record-setting attendance and our experts whose arguments were so strong, Gate's attorney's best strategy was to campaign to slash their time. Gate's latest strategy is not a viable one; they can't rezone the Outpost without a comp plan change."

As stated in the letter to the commission, however, GATE still intends to allow for a three-year hold on the property with the intent to allow for a private or public organization to buy it.

"Even though the Comprehensive Plan request has been withdrawn by Ponte Vedra Corporation and the hearing was cancelled, we're remaining vigilant because PVC now intends to seek rezoning without getting a Comp Plan amendment," said co-founder of Save Guana Now, Nicole Crosby. "According to our attorney, this would be in violation of the Comp Plan. We continue to oppose the rezoning and the development of 66 homes on conservation land."

According to Sandy Kavanaugh, Ponte Vedra Auto Show Manager, all those currently confirmed for Sept. 15 show participation will remain registered.

Originally planned for Sunday, Sept. 15, the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce decided to reschedule the event because of Hurricane Humberto.

"It is the prudent thing to do," said Chamber President/CEO Isabelle Renault. "We look forward to welcoming attendees to view the many cars showcased by our faithful car aficionados."

Due to rescheduling conflicts, Porsche

# J&S Carousel takes final St. Augustine spin



The line to take a last ride on the J&S Carousel was consistently long Sunday, Sept. 15. The attraction first opened at Davenport Park on the corner of San Marco Avenue and San Carlos Avenue in 1994.

Sunday, Sept. 15 was the last day to ride J&S Carousel at Davenport Park. The iconic St. Augustine attraction had been located at the park since 1994 entertaining children of all ages with brightly painted horses and traditional carousel music. For just \$1, parents and grandparents could relive a childhood memory and share an American tradition with younger generations.

Owner Jim Soules passed away suddenly Sept. 6, and the family notified the City of St. Augustine that it was Soules' wish to have the carousel returned to Port Charlotte, Florida where he had been a deputy sheriff and K9 trainer before retiring. Soules was passionate about sharing the carousel he inherited after his brother's death.

The line to take a last ride was long and consistent all day Sunday. Soules' sister, Kathleen Nasrey, traveled from Royal Oak, Michigan to support the family and see the carousel operate in St. Augustine.

"I'm so thrilled at the lines of people," Nasrey said. "My brother would be ecstatic."

Soules' wife Peggy and son Tony Pabon rode the carousel Sunday evening.

"We rode what was supposed to be the last ride about 9:40," Nasrey said. "Peggy rang the bell and everyone cheered when it ended. The line formed again and Peggy said, 'Let them ride."

Monday morning, family members and a crew of workers were on site to dismantle the ride, load it into trucks and take it back to Port Charlotte according to Soules' wishes. One of the workers was carefully remov-

ing bulbs from the upper perimeter. When asked if he was counting them, he said, "I don't need to count. There are 800 bulbs. I've put them in and taken them out many times."

The worker was Soules' son., Tony Pabon, who ran the carousel for about a year after leaving the military. Pabon was impressed with St. Augustine's outpouring of affection for the ride and the long lines that formed after the announcement the carousel would close.

"He ran it to honor the memory of his brother," Pabon said. "If Jim was here, he wouldn't have believed it." The plan is to store the carousel and perform a complete restoration.

"Jim restored cars, so he just did it," Pabon said. "He painted all the horses."

As the inner workings of the dismantled ride was attached to the trailer hitch Monday, Soules' sister reflected on the day before when the community came out to ride one last time.

"We appreciate the outpouring from St. Augustine. People had a favorite horse and named it," she said through tears. "I think (the last ride) was good for Peggy... very peaceful. She saw that they loved it."

# REMEMBERING J&S CAROUSEL



Kristin Misenhelder was born in St. Augustine and has been riding the carousel since she was a child. She waited patiently in the long line Friday, Sept. 13. "I used to come here as a kid," she said, waiting in the carousel line with Latos and their students for final rides. "My dad used to bring me and we'd get hot chocolate across the street. Then, we'd come and ride the carousel together. It's really sad that they're taking it away." "I think a huge majority of residents are upset and I do wish they'd work something out or at least replace it," Latos said. "It was the icon for the people that actually live here. St. Augustine is a tourist town, but as the residents, we always felt like the carousel belonged to us."



"All my kids grew up here with the carousel," said ARK Christian Academy teacher, Angel Latos, who's lived in St. Augustine since 2000. "So it's sad, everybody's really sad." Latos's children are now grown and married. Passing down the family fun, they brought their own kids to J&S, too, sharing the merry-go-round with the next generation of locals.

Ellen Leroy-Reed thinks she is the luckiest person in Ponte Vedra, mostly because of the view. Personal and professional experience paved the way for her dream job as Friends of the GTM Reserve executive director. And she still carves out time for another passion instilled from childhood – sewing.

# What can you share about your background?

I was born in Boston but have traveled around the country first as a Navy brat and then as a Navy wife. Finding a place at the GTM Research Reserve was an unexpected dream come true and is the culmination of all my professional experience coming together into one incredible position. I am truly the luckiest girl in Ponte Vedra Beach.

# You have worked for several nonprofits. What attracts you to that sector?

Working in the nonprofit sector is appealing to me because I see the direct impact our supporters have on the mission. There is an almost immediate return on their investment - whether it is being able to purchase supplies for the Sea Turtle Patrol, repairing an ATV for the rangers, getting lunch for teachers' training in the estuary, or funding fellowships for graduate researchers - we are able to transform a donor's dollars into action that is protecting the estuary, monitoring our waterways and educating the next generation of scientists. When I walk through the Visitor Center and see a group of teenagers getting excited about seining in the Guana River – well, you just can't beat that feeling. You know you are making a difference.

# How long have you been with Friends of the GTM Reserve and how has your role changed?

I joined the Friends team in July of 2016 as the nonprofit's first executive director. Since then, we have grown our ability to support the GTM's programs and have seen an increase in generosity from our Friends members and the community. We have also focused on improving our procedures and polices

in an effort to become a stronger nonprofit organization, which is a large part of the Friend's strategic plan. It is also part of my role to get out into the community and get people excited about supporting GTM. Though this beautiful treasure is right here in our backyard, many are still unaware of it and not sure how to access its amenities. In 2020, through outreach and community engagement, we hope to have even more energized Friends members, volunteers and visitors serving as champions for the

### What do you enjoy most about working in Ponte Vedra?

"We're just browsing," Grant said enthusiastically and standing tall in his Panama hat, overlooking the crowd for the five motorized gems.

One of the winners drove straight to them, like fate, in a dark green 1993 Nissan Gloria, as if it just rolled out of a JDM (Japanese Domestic Market) garage, right-hand drive and all.

"Someone will always say, 'Your steering wheel is on the wrong side,'" Gloria owner, Greg Faulds said. "And I'm like, 'No, it's on the right side.""

Faulds bought this car from friend, Josh from Nippon Imports, with only 18,000 miles. He fell in love with the Gloria while stationed in Japan during the Air Force, so when Faulds found it back in the States, he couldn't miss his chance.

"The sticker on the back meant this was owned by a police captain in Fukushima," Faulds said. "Josh put tint on the windows. I put seat covers on it. Otherwise, it's completely stock and I'm not doing anything to it."

Tucked in another aisle, the judges spotted another winner and this time, it's American-made, baby. A white 1964 Chevrolet Impala with red interior and classic trim parked as gracefully as it rides, according to owner, Lee Geohagan.

"I had all the suspension redone, so it rides really smooth," he said. "I went to Andrew Jackson High School, locally, so red and white were my high school colors. This is the one I wanted when I graduated. It took 50 years, but I got it."







# 'Think It, Sink It, Reef It'

Nonprofit TISIRI sinks artificial reef Starship off coast of Mickler's Beach

Naturally, the topography of the sea floor near the coast of Northeast Florida could be considered a massive underwater desert. Sand, stretching for miles, as far as the eve can see.

What it lacks visually, it makes up for in potential. Since 2008, the nonprofit group, TISIRI Corp., has been turning trash into a treasure chest of life and watching it grow. TISIRI stands for "Think It, Sink It, Reef It," and prides itself with focusing its effort on reef creation, environmental conservation and marine awareness. About 10 reefs have been constructed using materials ranging from discarded concrete pilings to deteriorating ships, which are now home to a conglomeration of bustling life.

"We can use clean concrete or clean metal," executive director Joseph Kistel said. "The projects we like to do is to recycle things because there is actually quite a bit of material out there that is otherwise going to go to waste."

Last year TISIRI was contracted by the Coastal Conservation Association to help with the construction of an artificial reef off the coast of Mickler's Beach, in an area called Floyd's Folly. Two barge loads of 1,500 tons of rock went into the construction of two 200 by 100 foot piles of underwater rubble, named Starship reef. Starship will celebrate its one-year birthday in October.

Kistel said the creation of the reefs not

only provide an entirely new thriving ecosystem, but help to elevate North Florida's biggest industry — tourism.

"Not only are you creating this area that is benefiting marine life and the ocean's ecosystem, but at the same time you're creating a recreation area for people," Kistel said. "Now that there is marine life there, people are scuba diving, taking pictures and fishing. You're literally creating a destination. It's really a win-win."

Kistel said that as soon as a few hours after deployment, fish can be seen making their home on the structures. Within a year, hard coral and sponges will have begun development, bringing a vast array of species with them.

At a recent eight-month dive at Starship, Kistel said he observed juvenile fish just hatched from a larval stage, giving indication that the fish had arrived from coral recruitment.

Kistel said the project would not have been accomplished without outside funding from the CCA and Shell Oil, help from Dames Point Work Boats and concrete donations from Lamb's Yacht Center.

"(The Starship) is a perfect example of how these reefs get done," Kistel said. "It gets done without the support of the counties, which is very frustrating. That whole project was funded with no contribution

from Duval county."

Particularly, Kistel is concerned about the lack of maintenance for the reefs. For years, boats, divers and fishermen use the reefs recreationally without any programs designed to clean them afterward. At a recent reef clean up event sponsored by TISIRI, Kistel said his crew found miles of accumulated fishing line and even strangled marine life like sea turtles. Currently, there are no programs in effect to care for the reefs on our coasts.

"It's one of those situations that is out of sight, out of mind," Kistel said.

# Clay Day to benefit several charities

Davidson Realty's annual fundraiser adds Builders Care as beneficiary

Davidson Cares, the corporate giving program of Davidson Realty, has added Builders Care as beneficiary of its fourthth annual Clay Day event Thursday, Oct. 24. Other sponsored charities include St. Augustine Youth Services and Investing in Kids.

While some funding for projects comes from organizations like Catholic Charities USA, most Builders Care contributions originate from

individual private donors. Many of those donors are NEFBA members.

"Because we're associated with NEFBA, we have over 1.200 members who are willing to come help us out," said Brown, who came aboard in 2015 with a background in commercial real estate. "NEFBA members have huge hearts and do good with what they have."

Despite donor generosity, Builders Care operations are lean. Brown and Project Manager Eddie McKinnon are the only full-time employees. A volunteer manages the Facebook page and projects are completed by church groups, corporate teams and others who donate their time.

In 2018 alone, Builders Care volunteers logged more than 8,500 hours of service.

Builders Care and its volunteers are making a real impact for Northeast Floridians. In 2018, the organization completed 14 rebuilds from Hurricane Irma and 112 roof repairs — 11 of those were complete reroof projects. So far in 2019, volunteers have completed five wheelchair ramps, 15 reroof jobs, 35 roof repairs and 41 projects for other repairs from electrical to flooring

"I see no shortage of people who are genuinely in need," said Brown, who gets about 40 requests per week and solely manages a lengthy wait list. "We can't help everyone so I triage the issue, determine where the serious needs are, and refer it where I can.'

To curb the environmental devastation to the reefs, TISIRI has begun the Sea Saver program, which they are currently trying to scale up to meet the needs of local reefs.

"In addition to creating the reefs we think (preservation) is just as important, if not more so," Kistel said.

The next reef the team is putting together will consist of an old tugboat, which they are painstakingly cleaning inside and out before sinking it at Harm's Ledge by the east Jacksonville inlet near Mayport. Prior

to hitting the sea floor, the tugboat must be thoroughly inspected by the Coast Guard and cleaned of oil and any material that is not metal.

Flushed and left bare boned, the project hopes to be a destination for not only fish but for fishermen and explorers interested in the new ecosystem. For the tugboat and all the other artificial reefs afterward, the bottom of the ocean will not so much be a watery grave but a chance at a second life.



# Kate Amato Foundation awards \$150,000 for innovative pediatric cancer research projects

The Kate Amato Foundation recently announced it is awarding \$150,000 to fund four groundbreaking pediatric cancer research projects during Childhood Cancer Awareness month in September.

Kate Amato, a local Jacksonville Beach child who passed away in November 2016 after a long and difficult battle with cancer, is the inspiration for the foundation. Kate's bright smile, strength and grace captured the hearts of thousands of locally and around the world. Through her illness, Kate's parents discovered how severely underfunded research is for pediatric cancer and witnessed first-hand the brutal effects of outdated, toxic treatments. To honor Kate's life and continue the fight for other children, the Kate Amato Foundation is dedicated to finding safer, smarter and more effective treatments for children with cancer.

Dr. Patrick Brown of Johns Hopkins University, one of the pediatric oncologists serving on the KAF Scientific Advisory Board, said, "There is a critical need for new treatments for childhood cancer that are not only able to cure the cancer, but

do so in such a way that the surviving child can lead a long and healthy life. The Kate Amato Foundation was established precisely to meet this need. The 2019 KAF grant recipients are committed to finding targeted approaches to treat childhood cancer effectively and safely."

Another pediatric oncologist serving on the KAF Scientific Advisory Board is Dr. Duane Mitchell, Director of the University of Florida Brain Tumor Immunotherapy Program.

"Kate Amato Foundation is dedicated to supporting research to advance the next generation of pediatric cancer treatments that are more effective and less toxic than current approaches," Mitchell said. "This year's KAF Grants are innovative proposals designed to accelerate the realization of safe and curative therapies for childhood cancers."

The 2019 Kate Amato Foundation Grant recipients are:

■ Hamid Bassiri, M.D. at The University of Pennsylvania and Children's Hospital of Philadelphia whose project is titled, "Elucidating the role of invariant natural

killer T cells in neuroblastoma antitumor immunity" and will investigate a safer, targeted cellular immunotherapy approach for neuroblastoma that could also be also used in other solid tumor pediatric cancers.

- Dr. Corrine Linardic, M.D., PhD at Duke University School of Medicine whose project is titled, "The role of the macro lncRNA KCNQ1OT1 in embryonal rhabdomyosarcoma tumorigenesis" and will investigate a promising new genetic target for rhabdomyosarcoma tumor growth that could lead to the development of a new class of cancer therapies.
- Max Pimkin, M.D., PhD at Harvard Medical School and Dana Farber Cancer Institute at Boston Children's Hospital whose project is titled, "Transcriptional Addiction in Acute Myeloid Leukemia" and will investigate a genetic "Achilles heel" for AML in order to develop a targeted therapy with little or no detrimental effects on normal tissues.
- Ling Tao, PhD at Baylor College of Medicine and Texas Children's Cancer Center whose project is titled, "Understanding the role of MYCN-driven FA up-

take to lipid metabolism and tumor growth to identify a targeted approach for highrisk MYCN-amplified neuroblastoma" and will investigate a pioneering approach to treating neuroblastoma by specifically disrupting the cellular metabolism of cancer cells without harming healthy cells. This approach could quickly be translated into clinical trials and be used in the treatment of additional cancer subtypes.

Lisa and Jeff Amato, Kate's parents and founders of KAF, expressed sincere gratitude to the Jacksonville community, stating, "The support we have received over the years has been overwhelming and humbling, from supporting Kate through her illness to helping us build her legacy by funding pioneering research to help future children. It's breathtaking and beautiful and shows just how kind and caring our community is."



# Eagle Scout project brings 'Reflection Garden' to K9s for Warriors campus

When Jack Whitten was tasked with coming up with his Eagle Scout project, he knew right away which organization he wanted to benefit, he just wasn't sure exactly how.

The 10th grader at Providence School of Jacksonville has been a part of the Boys Scouts for a long time, and with help from his troop, Boy Scout Troop #288 from Ponte Vedra Presbyterian Church, Whitten led a project to benefit K9s for Warriors and the veterans who go to the Ponte Vedra-based nonprofit for help.

Whitten comes from a long line of Boy Scouts, and also has close family connections to military veterans — he also loves animals — which inspired him to do something for at K9s for Warriors' Camp K9 location.

On Sunday, Aug. 24, Whitten, along with members of Troop #288, installed the "Reflection Garden" at K9s for Warriors' main campus in Ponte Vedra.

In this Q&A, Whitten discusses how he came up with the project, what it is and and what it means to him.

# Can you tell us about the "Reflection Garden" project? How did you come up with it?

I met with both Ms. Stephanie Vogt and Mr. Jason Snodgrass to first learn about the K9s For Warriors campus and learn what their needs may be. When I found out that the warriors come and live on the campus for three weeks at a time, I began thinking about building something that they could enjoy outside. They are partnered with their dogs all day, so I wanted to create a space where they could spend time with their dog outside. Some of my first ideas were a basketball court, a fire pit area, a horseshoe game or a garden. The more I thought about it, the garden made sense because the warrior and dog could stay together. I then asked about putting the garden in a place with a nice view and together, we decided that a "Reflection Garden" by the pond made the most sense. Eventually, they plan to create a walking trail around the pond, and my "Reflection Garden" will be a place to stop on the trail and relax with their dog.

# What was it about K9s for Warriors that made you choose to focus on the organization for the project?

I have several family members that are veterans who have served our country and I appreciate their service and sacrifice. One family member has suffered from PTSD, so it's a condition that's close to my heart. When I learned that K9s For Warriors specifically focused on helping warriors with PTSD, I knew that I wanted to work with them. I also have always been fond of all animals and to learn that K9s For Warriors can train dogs to help these warriors made me even more interested.

# Did you have help with planning the project? How was it funded?

I developed the project myself with help from my Eagle Scout Counselor, Mr. Zeke Paxton and working directly with K9s for Warriors. I developed 3 or 4 versions of it before I presented it to my Scout Committee. The committee reviewed it, asked questions, and provided more input. I made those changes and then worked from that approved plan. As a part of the planning, I had to create a budget. My project cost close to \$700, with the all-weather resin bench costing more than half of my budget. I funded the project myself by saving money from chores, doing odd jobs, babysitting, and using some money that I had saved.

# What was the overall experience like working to install the project on Aug. 24?

My experience on project day was great. We were lucky to have great weather, even though it was very hot. The best part is that I had six adult leaders and seven other Boy Scouts who volunteered to help that day. I was pretty blown away that everyone showed up on time because I wanted to start at 9 a.m. and they were there. The best experience was to see that the project idea that I had created, planned and drawn out was being put together by all of us. It was interesting for me to be in charge of the project and I really liked how everyone asked me what I wanted them to do and everyone followed my instructions. One thing that I really liked was that when the bench was assembled and carried over, they asked me where to put it. I told them and they put it down. Then, I was the first one who got to sit down on the bench to check out the view. That was cool.

# How long have you been with the Boys Scouts and what does Scouting mean to you?

I started Scouting as a Tiger Cub when I was in first

grade. Scouting, to me, means having fun with friends, going on adventures, camping a lot and doing good things in your community. Over the course of my time in Scouting, I can see all the many lessons and skills I learned have prepared me to be a leader in my community. I especially enjoy leading the younger Scouts and teaching them the skills that I learned at their age.

# Why do you think projects like this one are so important to the community, nonprofits, etc?

It is important to give back to the community that you live in because the community provides a safe and great place to live in. If we all contribute in some way, we will make it an even better place to live. For a non-profit organization like K9s For Warriors, a project like that one enhances their campus and helps their mission without them having to spend the money or time to develop it. They are doing great work for the warriors that serve our country and I can give to them, so that they can focus on their mission of helping warriors.



# Is now a good time to buy a home?

When interest rates are declining, it can be a good time to acquire a mortgage to purchase a home. Lower interest rates reduce the monthly payments due on a mortgage and that is a positive for prospective homebuyers. The buyer also needs to be aware of price trends in the neighborhood where they want to live and be

an educated buyer in terms of the home itself and the neighborhood where it is situated.

# Why buy instead of rent?

The buy-versus-rent decision is based upon what the user can afford to pay on a monthly basis and what housing options are available in the area where they want to live. Buyers own the property and pay all of the attendant costs like taxes, utilities, upkeep and the rest, and these costs should be factored into the decision. When you own your home, it's an asset that can appreciate (or depreciate) depending on market conditions. History has shown that long-term ownership of a home – if properly maintained – can be an attractive investment. Because of recent tax changes, prices on rental properties have gone up here in Jacksonville, making it hard in some cases to find attractive rental opportunities.

# We're coming up to an election year. Should I

The dynamics of the housing market are driven by many factors, most importantly the health of the economy overall. Election year dynamics are not a dominant factor in housing trends.

# What's the first step in choosing a lender?

The choice of a mortgage lender can incorporate many factors. When advising clients, Family Foundations advisors generally tell them to start with current banking relationship (checking, auto, credit cards) and then to shop around with at least two other lenders, including a credit union. What they should be focused on beyond the interest rate itself is what upfront fees are charged, whether require private mortgage insurance is required and whether there is any upfront assistance on mortgage costs. Most mortgage lenders have mortgage calculators on their website to allow prospective buyers to enter the interest rate and all fees to figure out the true cost of the mortgage offering thereby allowing for comparison between lenders.

# Should I apply at more than one mortgage

Buyers can apply at more than one lender if they want, in a 30-day window, without impacting their credit. We do not usually recommend it since it adds administrative hassle and can attract duplicate upfront fees.

# How do I get the best interest rate?

Interest rates usually tie directly to the credit profile that a prospective buyer presents. All lenders check credit scores (the history of how a borrower has handled obligations). Prospective homebuyers should always know their credit score and manage it to the best of their ability when they are considering a home purchase.

# What are points?

Points are upfront fees that a borrower sometimes pays to receive a mortgage from a lender. Beware, oftentimes a lender will offer a lower interest rate on a mortgage but charge upfront points that add to the cost of the transaction for the buyer. When comparing between lenders, make sure to add the cost of points to the interest rate offered.

well. 

Roberts, who has been hailed as "a genius of modern piano" and his trio join forces with Courtney Lewis and the Symphony to bring a fresh vibe to Gershwin's masterpiece Saturday, Sept. 28, in the Times-Union Center for the Performing Arts' Jacoby Symphony Hall.

The concert begins at 8 p.m. with Dukas' Fanfare from La Perí. The highlight of the evening will be the Marcus Roberts Trio's performance of Gershwin's jazz and classical fusion, Rhapsody in Blue. The concert will end with Dvořák's Eighth Symphony.

Doors will open at 7 p.m. for concertgoers to walk the red carpet and enjoy an hour long, preconcert performance by Jacksonville local, the "Sultry Sister of Soul." Mama Blue performing in the Uible lobby.

Roberts grew up in Jacksonville, where his mother's gospel singing and the music of the local church left a lasting impact on his own musical style. He began teaching himself to play piano at age 5 after losing his sight but didn't have his first formal lesson until age 12. Despite that late start,

he progressed quickly through hard work and good teachers. At age 18, he went on to study classical piano at Florida State University.

In 2014, the celebrated CBS News television show, "60 Minutes," profiled Roberts' life and work on a segment entitled "The Virtuoso." The show traced Roberts' life to date from his early roots in Jacksonville and at the Florida School for the Deaf and Blind to his remarkable career as a modern jazz musician.

Roberts has won numerous awards and competitions over the years, but the one that is most personally meaningful to him is the Helen Keller Award for Personal

Achievement. While Roberts is known throughout the world for his development of an entirely new approach to jazz trio performance, he is equally known for his remarkable ability to blend the jazz and classical idioms to create something wholly new while retaining the authenticity of each art form. His 1996 Sony Classical recording (Portraits in Blue) was among the first to fully integrate the jazz and classical genres.

Mama Blue's songs are about life - the joy and pain of love, being a mother and the social forces that influence our lives. # Bud Beech to retire after 34 seasons

Storied basketball coach to remain on Ponte Vedra High School staff as dean

After 34 seasons, coach Bud Beech is stepping off the court. According to him, however, his coaching days are far from

In January of 2017, Beech hit his 500th winning game, one he said, "is a milestone in coaching," but was quick to add that that number probably came with about "350 to 400 losses, too."

When a coach has spent 24 years up and down the side lines, they tend to have many highs and lows. His coaching style has evolved over time as well, spending more focused attention at practice and less "intensity" during the heat of the game.

"Over the years, it's been more doing what I need to do in practice versus being upset at games," Beech said.

His advice? Sometimes you're just not going to win. In those cases, face the game head on and work on improving at what you do best.

"You got to take what you got and continue to build what you do have," Beech

While Beech has made peace with loss, he is no stranger to the thrill of the win. He remembers 1992 clearly, when the Nease Panthers went to State and then

again, in 2002, when they brought home the title. Time flies on the court, however, and coach Beech is even impressed with how long he's been at it.

"I've had the opportunity to coach a lot of great kids and know wonderful people," Beech said. "It's been a fun career. I never would have thought it would end up being that long, but you just do it each year."

Much like his players, basketball started for him in high school as well. He eventually went on to play for Flagler College, leading the Saints in assists and eventually being inducted into the Flagler College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009. After graduating, he went to work in the financial department for American Express. The job was short lived, however. He soon started a position part-time as a coach's assistant for the St. Johns County's new high school, Allen D. Nease, which opened in 1981. The rest is history well, 24 years of history at Nease and then another 10 at the new Ponte Vedra High

He is currently dean at Ponte Vedra

High and has no plans to change that. "A certain aspect is mentoring," Beech said "You do reflect a lot of things (between coaching and being a dean). Here, I might give out some discipline but at the same time I find out about their background and the things going on in their life. I try to keep in touch like I do in coaching."

While you might be able to take the dean out of the coach, there is no taking the coach out of dean Beech. Students fortunate to end up in his office get more encouragement than lectures.

"In coaching I teach players how to react and respond to things in the game," Beech said. "With adversity and losing, it's about how you accept it. There are parallels to (how I talk to students)."

Beech said he will miss coaching but looks forward to having more free time, particularly for his wife and four children. His son, Beau, was a former standout guard at Ponte Vedra and is now playing in Germany with the Hamburg Towers. The team has been promoted to the Basketball Bundesliga, the highest professional league in Germany for the season starting later this month.

Being available for a few weeks at a time to see his son play overseas is an opportunity he doesn't plan to miss out on.

Additionally, Beech fully intends to keep up with Bud Beech Summer Camp, an affordable all-sports camp he maintains with his wife.


