The charitable organization began meeting in a dirt parking lot to help those in need to enrich their lives from sub-standard housing, homelessness and hunger in the Spuds, Elkton and Armstrong communities.

SEA is located at 6408 Armstrong Road in Elkton, 13 miles southwest of St. Augustine.

Members of class, the Chamber, community leaders and local government officials celebrated the completion of the Leadership St. Johns project and donated property improvements at SEA with a formal ribbon cutting Oct. 13 at the Elkton

Classmates contacted local businesses to donate a new 30-by-30-foot concrete pad, picnic tables, signage, landscaping and yardwork, along with a screened area for food distribution to the community. Local donors include FASTSIGNS, Marker 38 Investments, Mudflower Creative Media and TBL Construction Inc.

As part of the Leadership St. Johns activities for this year's class, participants also conducted a back-to-school backpack and supplies giveaway at SEA for children

and families in need of many required items to begin school.

In October 2017, SEA purchased a run-down cement block building at 6312 Armstrong Road to house a potential community center and public rest station along the Palatka-to-St. Augustine State Trail.

An improved structure and property alongside the bike and pedestrian paved pathway would help the underserved rural community receive additional funds to better their quality of life while providing trail followers a place to rest and refresh.

The project is still in progress and needs volunteers and donors to complete the facility.

SEA has been operating in a singlewide trailer alongside the First Baptist Church of Armstrong and holds its food pantry — free to anyone — with daily bags of groceries and 150 to 800 hot meals each month.

The nonprofit also distributes 150 to 250 turkeys and hams each year during the holidays along with year-round field trips, clothes, shoes, books, toys, book bags, school supplies, computers and

A summer children's camp, lunch program and afterschool program are also offered. Services are also provided by North Florida Community Action Agency clients, FEMA, Toys for Tots and Empty

Community activities and events hosted by SEA include a St. Vincent Mobile Outreach Unit, which provides medical services, and visits from the St. Johns County bookmobile; plus, biking events with the North Florida Bike Club and Bike Florida; the Annual Rails-to-Trail Festival, which includes a celebration of the area's Gullah Geechee ancestry; the MENDE Film Festival; Gullah Geechee Festival; and tables and chair rentals for third-party events.

A humanitarian outreach program to Haiti is also in place.

district officials are working to address challenges in the aftermath of COVID-19, security following the tragedy at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School and elimination of the Florida Standards Assessments (FSA).

County Schools, spoke about these and other issues Sept. 15 during the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce Ponte Vedra Beach Division's Chamber at Noon event. The luncheon and presentation were held at the link, a new facility in Nocatee.

The coronavirus pandemic may have had more impact on the schools than any other issue in the last couple of years. It has affected the district's ability to find qualified applicants for jobs, acquisition of supplies needed to construct new schools and classroom attendance.

"Last year, we never had more than 200 students (test) positive at any given time," Forson said. But on a single day in the first week of this month, 846 students tested positive.

That resulted in a lot of absences – not only those who had contracted COVID, but also anyone who needed to be quarantined due to propinquity. However, the district has found that the need for such quarantining is reduced from 2020. In part this is due to older students receiving the vaccine, but also due to a shortening of the necessary quarantine period and a reduction of social distancing requirements.

Pine Island Academy, the new K-8 school in Nocatee, experienced a shortage

of flooring materials due to COVID-impacted supply-line disruptions. As a result, incoming students and staff found some floors to be exposed concrete.

It has also been difficult to fill many positions, as there are more jobs than available workers.

This has impacted the transportation and food services departments, as well as instruction.

At the same time, enrollment is up 8% over last year. Currently, it stands at 43,293. Forson said enrollment rose this

academic year equal to the student population of two entire schools.

Because the district has only one school planned to open next year, rising enrollment continues to be a concern.

Forson expressed optimism at the announcement on Sept. 14 by Gov. Ron DeSantis that Florida would be replacing the FSA with progress monitoring.

"We want the students to perform well," Forson said, "but I think we lost instructional time faced with the depth and the magnitude of some of the standardized

tests."

Still, he expressed some concern for accountability in education.

"When we lose something that everybody sees as a measuring tool, we just have to be prepared to replace it with something else that gives us confidence with what we're doing, that we're doing the right thing," he said.







Chamber helps the link mark grand opening in Nocatee

Members of the public had a unique opportunity to see firsthand the next step in the evolution of working July 14-16 during the grand opening festivities at the link.

The celebration began with a pair of ribbon-cutting ceremonies, one for the link and another for the Flagler Health+ Immersive Studio located within the facility.

The St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce Ponte Vedra Beach Division hosted the ceremony.

The link is a \$7 million, 22,500-square-foot co-working space, multi-use innovation incubator and membership-based venue in Nocatee Town Center that had been in the works since 2018. It is the creation of visionary entrepreneur Raghu Misra, founder of Wired2Perform, a talent-growth platform that's building workforce agility for the future, and the nonprofit Sapna Foundation, which helps displaced workers sync their talents with employment opportunities

Ground was broken in June 2020 on a featureless plot of land at 425 Town Plaza Ave. Thirteen months later, Misra and his family cut the ribbon on a facility where people of all ages can go to "learn, play, think, do" under one roof.

"We want to be the link that makes things happen," said Misra during the ribbon cutting ceremony.

The link concept allows tech entrepreneurs to launch their businesses and flourish while balancing career, family and recreation.

Though permanent offices were quickly snapped up, the link offers a variety of office-space solutions, including desks, meeting rooms, virtual office space and a mail service. There are audio and podcast recording studios, free highspeed WiFi and the Costa Coffee Smart Café, which can vend more than 200 flavors of coffee drinks

But the link is more than a place to work.

For members, there is an emphasis on lifestyle, as well, with recreational and educational activities for children and families.

One of the most popular amenities for those attending the grand opening was the Flagler Health+ Immersive Stu-

dio. The meeting room's walls form a 360-degree environment that puts people inside videos from all around the world and images from webcams. The studio is useful for virtual travel, demonstrations, training, education, design visualization, team collaboration or simply relaxation.



Smith were in the driveway of their home washing and scrubbing the octopus, when suddenly four Landrum Middle School students who also live in the neighborhood showed interest and began helping them clean the six-foot statue.

According to Jackie Smith, she was amazed at how fascinated the children were and delighted that they offered to help.

"They volunteered their time," Jackie Smith said. "It really was a great show of community."

The octopus is just one of several animals that the company has constructed statues of over the years, many of which have been corralled lately and are waiting to go on display at the link.

'We have a full aquarium (of statues) in the garage," Erin Smith chuckled.

Ocean Sole's U.S. headquarters are in Ponte Vedra Beach.

The initiative was started to help solve the problem Kenya has had with used flip-flops piling up because there is nowhere to go with them, many of the discarded flip-flops were winding up along the country's waterways and beaches.

That is when the idea came about to begin recycling flip-flops by creating art and functional products with them.

According to the Ocean Sole website, last year they were able to recycle 750,000 flip-flops through their projects.

Not only was he proud of being chosen for the honor, but he also took solace in the fact that he was the inaugural winner of the award that athletic director Michael Harrison plans to be a monthly occurrence, along with weekly honors throughout the school year.

Being involved athletically is a rule that his parents have, and it has been in place for each of his four older siblings.

According to Fasanelli, the rule is there to encourage playing a sport whether it is school related or as part of a club organization.

"It is mainly for exercise reasons," Fasanelli said.

He played soccer the past two years but decided to focus on cross country and track for this year.

While his sisters ran the shorter disciplines of track, he found that his niche was at the longer distances.

The primary differences between cross-country and even the longer track races is the time it takes to complete.

"Let's say you're doing the mile (run), well a track race is about five minutes or so, while cross country is like 18 minutes, which is a really long time," Fasanelli said.

Continuing to perform at high levels both in the classroom and on the course can be a juggling act at times, but Fasanelli has learned to make it work with proper organization and planning.

"I usually have to be doing my homework throughout the day," Fasanelli said. "Time management is a big thing. I've usually already prepped all my stuff the night before with my lunch and clothes packed. Sometimes I'll even go ahead and put my bags already in the car the night before.'

Cross country takes place in the fall with morning practices, while the track season is in the spring with afternoon practices. He gets up around 5:50 a.m. to be ready for 6:30 a.m. cross country practice. Fasanelli enjoys math, as well as chemistry and physics, and even takes a college-level math course two days a week at the high school.

He has also been getting more interested in the aspects of computer science.

On top of all that, Fasanelli is also a member of the PVHS Hi-Q Club team, which is an academic trivia competition.


