


#### **St. Johns County Pet Center**

#### THE OUTPOST

Regarding the April 20 article about Save Guana Now's preparations for hearings on The Outpost property, we're puzzled by Ponte Vedra Corporation Attorney Boulris' claim that residents opposed to the development have pressured the county to "change the rules." What rules was she referring to? Save Guana Now simply wants the existing rules enforced.

We have more examples of Ponte Vedra Corp. attempting to change the rules than can fit into a letter to the editor. 1. The land use category for The Outpost clearly identifies the use of the land as conservation, which means residential use is not permitted. 2. PVC has always been fully aware of the land use designation and the restrictions therein. 3. Residential is not compatible with

the land use of almost the entire land surrounding the Outpost, which is open space.

PVC not only changes rules, they rewrite history. Boulris claimed, "All PVC has ever asked for is a fair hearing in front of the county commission...." Really? That contradicts Boulris' admission that PVC sought an administrative interpretation from the county regarding the limits of the Conservation des-

ignation of The Outpost. This would have circumvented a public hearing if granted.

#### **TRAFFIC STUDY**

A group of six people decided to do a traffic study of Ponte Vedra and Palm Valley so they could get onto A1A easier. Now, there is a movement to promote A1A to six lanes and intersections to five lanes at 10 intersections, starting with the Dolphin Cove-Marlin entrance, and nine

more south on A1A. In addition, the group is recommending sidewalk and bike lanes headed north.

Since none of the six live in a subdivision fronting A1A, it is easy to suggest the rest of us who do live just off A1A take the brunt of the suggestions.

Fine for you, bad for us.

This will create more problems than solve when we can't even get from one side of the road to the other. Our property values and mobile abilities are at risk.

Sending letters to the editor could be an excellent way of reaching out to all our subdivision neighbors to put a halt to this expensive, and decidedly untenable, idea.

The NFTPO recently completed a traffic study for Ponte Vedra and Palm Valley. Although there are many valid suggestions we would benefit from adopting, there is one we would not. And that is making A1A six lanes.

Making A1A a six-lane roadway would seriously encroach on hundreds of homes and families, negatively affecting their quality of life and property values. It would put pedestrians and bikers, who are crossing A1A heading to the beach, schools, stores, churches, etc., in an exponentially more dangerous situation. This, in turn, would encourage them to drive instead – which in turn would ironically increase traffic density.

And traffic experts have identified a phenomenon called "induced demand," which has been studied and documented

in England, Sydney, China and the United States. It demonstrates that adding or widening roadways doesn't actually lessen traffic, but actually adds to the congestion. Traffic engineers have a clever quote to better describe the concept: "Trying to cure traffic congestion by adding more capacity is like trying to cure obesity by loosening your belt."

Not to mention the mind-blowing

bottleneck we would have as we traveled northbound to Butler Boulevard and Jacksonville Beach.

Let's listen to the experts about induced demand and our logical observation skills and not waste our tax money on this foolishness.

A1A through Ponte Vedra should not be expanded to six lanes.

Ponte Vedra Beach is a seaside residential community known for its beaches, local shopping, resorts, golf courses and easy living. The North Florida Transportation Planning Organization publicly released its traffic study and recommendations on April 13, 2017 impacting this community. While some of the recommendations to expand turning lanes and safely enter and exit Route 210 on the

bridge over the Intracoastal will enhance traffic flow with minimal impact on the look and feel of our community, the recommendation of expanding A1A to six to eight lanes through Ponte Vedra Beach is an absurd recommendation in their quest to improve peak time traffic congestion.

There are several reasons this recommendation is not in the best interests of Ponte Vedra Beach or the surrounding communities. Studies show that expanding road size does not solve congestion –

it creates more. Increasing the number of through lanes causes a significant increase in the accident rate, and the accident rate actually decreases during peak rush hour on roads such as A1A. Lastly, expanding A1A will decrease property values in Ponte Vedra Beach.

Expanding A1A will not solve congestion problems, will increase traffic and accidents and lower property values. This congestion is limited to a few peak hours and it is caused by cut-through

traffic according to the traffic study. It does not make sense to build a permanent, expensive, offensive infrastructure as a flawed resolution to a problem caused by cut-through traffic occurring a few hours during the day.

We demand better and more community-focused solutions from our tax-supported public officials.

I would like to submit my comments on the traffic study. While the study does have some good recommendations, particularly for intersections, I am appalled at the recommendation to increase A1A to six to 10 lanes.

Instead, it would have been much better for our community to add bike lanes and family-friendly intersections to safeguard and assist the existing community in that locale to access our wonderful resources. For example, many children and families utilize these roads and intersections to walk, ride, skateboard and bike in the area and to the beach. The creation of an eight to 10 lane obstacle course for them to cross A1A is absolutely dangerous! On

any weekend, and all through the summer, you will see scores of families dodging the existing traffic to get to the beach with rolling carts, surfboards and beach accoutrements – making A1A wider will make it nearly impossible and possibly deadly.

The additional congestion and noise from more lanes of traffic will also negatively impact the quality of life and home values of the local residents, some of whom have driveways directly onto A1A. The lovely look of this scenic highway with its palm trees and grassy medians should be enhanced – not cemented over so cars can roar by during the day and race by at night. Even further, additional police resources will be required to man-

age this traffic, representing an additional cost to the community.

Speaking of additional costs, the Ponte Vedra community is effectively funding the failure of the Nocatee developers in that Nocatee residents are utilizing A1A in Ponte Vedra to access JTB for jobs, education, shopping – while in fact those Nocatee residents should have those resources within their own community. It is wrong that the Ponte Vedra community has to pay for the construction of additional lanes to resolve the failure of the Nocatee and other developers in the establishment of Nocatee and other new communities.

Finally, the horrible recommendation

to increase A1A to six lanes (and up to 10 lanes at some intersections) will only be a temporary fix for traffic flow, since Nocatee is only partially built out and local developers are planning even more development and these roads will quickly fill up.

Instead, please put your thinking caps back on and develop other roads for Nocatee and the new communities, such as extending a road west to connect to Hodges at JTB – or better yet, do what was promised and develop jobs and schools in the Nocatee area, so these people don't have to connect with JTB and downtown.

## Residents voice opposition to traffic study recommendations at packed community meeting

A standing-room-only crowd of local residents packed the Ponte Vedra Concert Hall Tuesday night, with many attendees voicing their opposition to the key recommendations included in a new Ponte Vedra Palm Valley

Organized by the Citizens Traffic Task Force (CTTF) to present the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization's (NFTPO) draft recommendations, the meeting began with an open house from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m., during which attendees could watch a brief video summarizing the study's highlights, view blown-up photos of key intersections, ask questions and submit comments. That was followed by a formal presentation by NFTPO staff, who reviewed the report's key recommendations, which include widening portions of A1A to six lanes, adding a westbound off-ramp from the Palm Valley bridge to Roscoe Boulevard and replacing the Mickler roundabout with a signaled intersection.

While the meeting was the first formal presentation of the study's findings, it was clear from the public comments period that many of those in attendance had already read the report's recommendations and were there to express their opposition, particularly to any talk of widening A1A or Mickler Road.

"If they build it, they will come and I'm afraid if we make them wider, whoever is making a pathway through Ponte Vedra will only be encouraged by this," said Lee Gaul, a longtime Ponte Vedra resident who teaches at Ponte Vedra High School. "It seems to me the people at that roundabout – that long line in the morning – are not people who live here. They're not even people who work here. They are people who are cutting through

"We keep talking about what a great community we have," Gaul continued. "That's because it doesn't look like Beach Boulevard. Why are we going to try to make it look like

Odom's Mill resident Mario Dipola also expressed his opposition to removing the Mickler roundabout, which he said does a good job of keeping traffic moving.

"It's like the Haunted Mansion ride at Disney," Dipola said. "The line never stops."

#### Overdeveloped?

Throughout the course of the open house and formal meeting, attendees expressed the belief that rampant development has caused Ponte Vedra's traffic woes, with one word repeated numerous times: Nocatee.

At the start of the public comment section, Tonie Laliberte asked why a road couldn't be built west of the Intracoastal Waterway that would connect JTB to Nocatee, drawing a loud and sustained round of applause from the overflow audience.

"That may be easier said than done," Laliberte acknowledged. "The folks that own that right of way that would alleviate the congestion are also the folks that have profited handsomely from the Nocatee development itself. We have a great community – Nocatee is also a great community. I think we can find a solution that we can all live with here. But I'd like to knock on the Davis Family to see what they can come up with."

CTTF board member Greg Leonard suggested, however, that Ponte Vedra's traffic problems are more complex and deep rooted than the development of the relatively new Nocatee community.

"We have a perfect storm of growth

factors, and Nocatee is just one of them," Leonard told The Recorder.

Leonard noted that in the past three decades, the county's population has skyrocketed 400 percent while Ponte Vedra's demographics have shifted from a majority of retired couples to families with young children, putting more cars on the road.

'There's a whole litany of factors that, when taken together, have created the difficulties we're experiencing," Leonard said.

While those who spoke at the meeting expressed opposition to widening roads and replacing the roundabout, most acknowledged that Ponte Vedra has traffic issues that need to be addressed. Several residents described the difficulty they currently have entering and exiting neighborhoods located along A1A, such as Fairfield, Sawgrass Country Club and the Avalon neighborhood located near the on ramp to JTB.

"Cars are just flying by," said Michael

Switkes, an Avalon resident and president of the Ponte Vedra Community Association.

Since being named executive director of THE PLAYERS Championship in December, Jared Rice has been preparing for a 2017 tournament that will debut some significant changes to the Stadium Course.

### Jared Rice

#### With less than two weeks to go until THE PLAY-ERS Championship, this must be crunch time for you. What is the main focus of your tournament preparations?

THE PLAYERS is the best fan experience in golf, and our team is constantly thinking like a fan and examining ways to improve what it means to attend the event. We have a talented team that is passionate, committed and competitive – all working together to produce the very best for our players, sponsors and fans

## You became executive director amid some of the biggest renovations and upgrades to the Stadium Course in the past decade. What has been the biggest challenge you've faced in getting ready for THE PLAYERS Championship 2017?

In the beginning, it was the transition period when I was still working both roles. We've since hired someone, so now I think it is maintaining the hectic schedule. Fortunately for me, I work with some great people who I trust to get the job done. All of us at the PGA Tour look at this as our "Super Bowl" and every employee has a part in making it the "Showcase of Excellence" it is.

#### What do you think will surprise returning visitors the most about the course changes?

Those who are familiar with the course will be extremely surprised and impressed with renovations that took place over the past year. The transformation of hole 12 into a drivable par 4 is by far the most obvious change on the course, followed by hole 6 and 7. New mounding throughout the course allows better viewing vantages for fans, and the openness we created really showcases the significance of the tournament.

## You have an extensive background in sports marketing, having worked for everyone from the Anaheim Angels and Mighty Ducks to the Detroit Red Wings. Does a golf tournament present its own set of unique challenges in terms of marketing and promoting the event?

Like all sports, golf reaches a broad spectrum of demographics, so the marketing mix has to reflect that. Sports teams like the Anaheim Angels, and the Mighty Ducks, can focus most of their marketing efforts on local markets because that is their main fan base. Last year nearly 55 percent of ticket purchasers for THE PLAYERS came from outside the five-county area. That means we are constantly reshaping our marketing campaign to reach those national and international spectators. We see what worked, what didn't, and go from there.

#### What kind of economic impact does THE PLAYERS Championship have on Northeast Florida?

Half of our ticket purchases originate from outside Northeast Florida, and many of our regional hospitality partners are hosting guests nationally and internationally. In addition, we're seeing a greater number of national companies based outside of our region

activating at PLAYERS. Collectively, this means more out-of-town guests are coming to Northeast Florida and staying in our hotels, eating at top local restaurants and enjoying what makes our community so special. This has a great effect on our business environment and our ability to impact local charity – for which we generated \$8.5 million for Northeast Florida charities last year.

#### You're originally from New Hampshire. What is your favorite part of living on the First Coast?

Like many of the national and international guests attending the tournament, we discovered an amazing community that's active and vibrant. Not having snow on the ground six months a year helps that!

#### Traffic

Making A1A three lanes along that stretch without adding a stoplight, Switkes fears, would only exacerbate the problem and encourage drivers to go faster.

"They just built 28 houses in my neighborhood," he said. "They need to slow people down, not make it three lanes."

Resident Kathy Buttner, meanwhile, noted that prior to moving to Ponte Vedra, she had lived in Long Island, Boston and California.

"I spent a big percentage of my life sitting in traffic," she said. "I felt safer driving in those places than here, with all the tailgating. I saw three cars in a row texting while driving over the Palm Valley bridge."

Despite the negative reception to many of the traffic study's recommendations, meeting attendees thanked both NFTPO and CTTF representatives for the time they had invested in studying the issue. Residents also offered their own suggestions for addressing local traffic woes, including enforcing the speed limit on A1A, installing a traffic light at the entrance to Fairfield and the Sawgrass Country Club south gate and – the most popular suggestion with attendees - building a north-south road on the western side of the Palm Valley bridge that connects to JTB.

#### Next steps

NFTPO and CTTF representatives stressed that Tuesday's meeting was merely the latest step in a process that has many hurdles to clear before any recommendations are approved, funded and ultimately implemented. Leonard said the next step will be for the CTTF board to meet next week to review the feedback garnered at Tuesday's meeting and share it with NFTPO. Once the draft study report is updated to reflect community input, funding would need to be obtained to finance the traffic improvements and secure any necessary rights of way before construction could begin.

CTTF also stressed that the task force was not there to advocate for the draft report's recommendations, but instead to serve as a communications resource, distributing information and actively seeking widespread community input.

"We're certainly not here to propose or encourage one outcome," Leonard said. "Ultimately, our goal is to reach into the community and get broad feedback about what type of change we are willing to tolerate in order to keep this community viable for ourselves, our children and our grandchildren."



# Commissioners approve moving forward with \$3M incentive program for 'Project Boilermaker' to relocate HQ to St. Johns County

The Board of County Commissioners voted unanimously last week to support the advancement of a \$3 million economic incentives program for an unnamed company that is considering relocating its U.S. corporate headquarters to St. Johns County.

Referred to in county documents as "Project Boilermaker," the company is reviewing potential sites to invest \$86 million for the construction of a 210,000-square foot office building, for which it plans to hire more than 300 employees by Dec. 31, 2030, paying an average wage of \$79,442 (200 percent of the county's average wage).

In addition to Florida, the business is considering another state for its head-quarters and has asked for confidentiality during the due diligence process. Details regarding the firm, including its name, current location and products/services, are consequently unknown. County Director of Economic Development Melissa Glasgow noted, however, that the company would not compete with any existing county businesses.

Glasgow explained at the April 18 meeting that the commissioners' motion to approve moving forward with the company's requests for incentives is just one step of the process. If the company ultimately chooses St. Johns County, she said, an agreement identifying the company would be drafted, disclosed publicly and brought back to the commission for final approval. Project Boilermaker would ultimately plan to construct and occupy the new building by March 31, 2020.

Project Boilermaker has requested both state and local economic incentives, Glasgow said, adding that the company scored 8.0 points on the county's Business Incentive program. That score qualifies it for an economic development grant equal to four years of ad valorem taxes paid on capital improvements and tangible personal property as well as 100 percent of impact fees and water/sewer connection fees paid to the county. According to

county documents, the company is also eligible for consideration of expedited permitting. The estimated value of the proposed grant is \$2,758,310.

Project Boilermaker has also applied for a Florida Qualified Target Industry (QTI) tax refund for 145 of the estimated 300 new jobs. Because the business falls within one of the high-impact sectors designated under Florida law, it is additionally eligible for the Qualified Target Industry Tax Refund with a High-Impact Sector Bonus. Glasgow said the total value of this state incentive is \$1,015,000, and the local financial support required is 20 percent, or \$203,000.

As a result, the total proposed county incentive package is estimated to be \$2,961,310. That total would be paid to the company over an eight-year period, with the first payment made in fiscal year 2022. Per a cost/benefit analysis conducted by Glasgow, the project would lead to a \$7 million increase in the county's general fund over the next 20 years.

During public comment, St. Augustine Beach resident Tom Reynolds voiced his vehement opposition to the incentives package, referring to it as "corporate welfare." He also expressed his concerns about the county engaging in what he called "secret government." Reynolds demanded that commissioners not only cast down the proposal, but also close the economic development department, appoint Glasgow as head of the county's public relations department, freeze her salary and give her a bonus for every company she brings into the county without "give-aways."

"We don't need to give away," said Reynolds, suggesting that companies should want to establish business in the county without being provided incentives.

In response, Commissioner Jay Morris asked for the "right perspective" on the matter, saying that the incentives will pay for themselves through ad valorem taxes, and the county will eventually bring in \$7 million from the

investment.

"This is one heck of a deal for St. Johns County," he declared.

According to the St. Johns County Supervisor of Elections website, Reynolds has registered to run in 2018 as a Democrat for Morris' commission seat. Morris has consistently said he will not run for reelection when he completes his current term representing District 4, which includes Ponte Vedra.

#### New pump station, ZAB members

In other BCC business, commissioners voted to approve a request for a new pump station building located at 324 Landrum Lane. According to county officials, the old pump station was too small and unable to handle recent flooding. It was also partially located on a neighboring property. The new building will be much larger, with closer access to the new pumps, and will be moved south to accom-

modate for the abutting property to the north. The timetable for construction is unknown, as no commercial plans have been submitted yet.

The county commission also approved a recommendation to appoint Brad Scott, Daniel Cook, Timothy Powell and Megan McKinley as board members of the Ponte Vedra Zoning and Adjustment Board. Scott and Cook previously served as board members and requested reappointment after their terms expired in 2016. Powell and McKinley are new to the board, filling vacancies due to the expired term of Jane Lucker and the resignation of John Cellucci in 2016. Scott, Cook and Powell will serve full four-year terms scheduled to expire April 18, 2021. McKinley, who is filling the unexpired term of Cellucci, will serve a partial term scheduled to expire March 17, 2019.



Yet throughout the evening's glitter and glitz, the woman who inspired both the foundation and its fundraising efforts was never far from attendees' hearts and minds. Apryle Schmidt was just 37 years old when she was diagnosed with stage four breast cancer. Despite battling her illness courageously, she lost her fight in August 2015.

"Apryle was a Nocatee resident, so it's been really important to us to have a presence here," said Apryle's friend, Lauren Stafford. "The point of tonight is to celebrate life. Apryle was such a vital person. She loved to dance – if she were here tonight, she'd be leading the dancing out on the floor.'

A cancer survivor herself, Stafford now serves as president of the board of the Apryle Showers Foundation, which provides healing, restorative getaways for people ages 30 to 55 who are battling cancer.

#### A healing getaway

The impetus for the Apryle Showers Foundation, organizers said, came from a similar getaway weekend that Apryle Schmidt received as a gift during her battle with cancer.

"The day-to-day reality of cancer can be frightening and grueling," Apryle's mother, Patricia Reinhardt, told gala attendees, listing the many doctor's appointments, treatments and medications those battling cancer must manage, all while fighting for their lives. "The psychological impact and demands on the individual, their family and friends can be

"Now picture a weekend break from all that," Reinhardt continued. "Apryle and her family were blessed with this type of gift. Her legacy is to provide that same experience for

the foundation's beneficiaries, including Julie, a mother of five who went to the hospital after feeling nauseous for a few days, only to learn she had non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.

"Hearing I had cancer was super hard, but telling my grown children was the hardest," Julie said. "Like most moms, I didn't want help (from the foundation) – we're used to being the ones who help everyone else. But boy, I'm glad I did."

Through the Apryle Showers Foundation, Julie and her husband enjoyed a getaway to the Ritz-Carlton Amelia Island, where the couple rode bikes, went to the beach and for the first time had an opportunity to "get real" about her illness.

"I was always trying to be strong – for my kids, my family, my friends," she said through tears. "(The getaway) was the first chance I had to just let go."

Two-time cancer survivor Hope also enjoyed a getaway. Her dream was to swim with dolphins.

"It was an emotional experience for me, because I was dealing with all these issues but I was interacting with nature," Hope said. "We had an excellent time."

Foundation board member and cancer survivor Maria Salomon noted sadly that one of the foundation's beneficiaries had died earlier that week, shortly after returning from her dream getaway to a jazz festival in Miami.

"We take it hard when we lose one of our beneficiaries," said Salomon, adding that she gained comfort from knowing the woman was able to attend the festival as she had long

nine warriors and the service dogs with which they'd been paired. The Ponte Vedra-based nonprofit trains and pairs rescued service dogs with military veterans suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), traumatic brain injury and/or military sexual trauma as a result of military service post-9/11.

Before the graduation, K9s For Warriors also celebrated its five-year partnership with American Legion Post 233. Founder Shari

Duval reminisced about her organization's humble beginnings in a 900 square-foot house, where the nonprofit used to "shove three to four warriors" into the building, she said

At first, the nonprofit held its graduation ceremonies in front of the house's garage, Duval explained, until the American Legion offered to host the events at its nearby post. In its first few years, K9s For Warriors held approximately 200 graduations at the veterans' facility.

"Year after year, in one way or another, you have been there," said an emotional Duval. "We'll never forget your graciousness, your

generosity, your love and your support."

In turn, representatives from the post honored Duval, who announced in March that she would be retiring, handing off her duties as board president to her son, Brett Simon. The local veterans presented Duval with a plaque recognizing her service to the community and nation, as well as a certificate of honorable mention from their organization's past commanders recognizing her as a lifetime, honorary member of the post.

"We're like family," said Dan Wortman, commander of American Legion Post 233. "We've been helping them out. They've been helping us. Veterans help veterans."



# Taking care of mental health is good for your heart, new research finds

While diet and exercise are well-known ways to improve your health, new medical research is shedding light on the importance of mental

wellness on your heart. More evidence is mounting that depression, stress and anxiety can be as damaging to your circulatory system as major risk factors like high cholesterol and obesity.

#### Link between mental health and heart disease

Two recently published studies have found a strong connection between mental health and heart disease. One study from the journal "Atherosclerosis" found that dying from cardiovascular disease was as strongly associated with depression as high blood pressure, diabetes and obesity. Depression and stress

accounted for about 15 percent of cardiovascular deaths in the study. Even after adjusting for other risk factors like smoking, researchers found a link between depression and heart disease.

The second study from "The Lancet" found that increased activity in the amygdala – a region of the brain involved with stress – is associated with a greater risk of heart disease and stroke. Patients with higher amygdala activity were more likely to develop heart disease and at a younger age. Stress increased the overall inflammation in their bodies and arteries – which may be one reason why stress and heart disease are related

#### Stress management tools for your heart health

The good news is that you can take steps to reduce your stress that will improve both your mental and physical wellbeing. The first step when dealing with stress, anxiety or depression is to understand why you're experiencing it. Whether it's work stress, family issues, or anxiety over a chronic health condition,

understanding the problem will give you the best pathway to treatment. If you suffer from clinical depression, it is important to consult with a doctor about seeking counseling services or medical treatment

It's also a good idea to engage in stress-reducing activities every day. Some of the best practices for managing stress are deep breathing exercises, restorative yoga and meditation with guided imagery. Even a stress-reducing hobby like gardening, reading a book or listening to music can make a big difference. Thirty minutes to an hour of stress management each day can have significant positive impacts on your heart health.

Another important step is choosing heart-healthy habits. Since physical and mental health are so closely linked, making positive physical changes can have the power to improve your overall mental health as well. Living a heart-healthy lifestyle entails com-

mitting to regular exercise and a balanced diet. Adults should aim to exercise for 30 minutes at least five days per week, as well as focus on a diet high in fruits, vegetables, and whole grains and low in salt and processed sugars. Making lifestyle changes can add extra stressors, however, so it may be best to take these changes in small increments.

Diet and exercise will always be keys to good health and a long lifespan – but with more research confirming the link between mental and heart health, it is essential to consider our psychological wellbeing and reactions to stressful circumstances as key determinants of our cardiovascular health.





# Nease students to participate in experiments conducted on International Space Station

Nease High School students will soon participate in experiments that have been conducted on the International Space Station (ISS), allowing them the opportunity to provide real feedback to scientists.

Nease science teacher Christina
Talbot is partnering with Orion's Quest,
a nonprofit organization that engages
middle and high school students in ISS
research, to carry out the project in her
earth and space and physical science
classes. Through observation and analysis of research videos and photographs
from orbit and into the classroom,
Talbot's students will provide real data
that is passed on to scientists in support
of research databanks.

The organization's live mission, STEM on Station, studies the effects of microgravity on the human heart. The findings of this research could also advance the understanding and treatment of heart disease here on Earth. Current virtual missions include studies of the effects of space on microbes, plant growth, spiders, fruit flies, butterflies, and worms.

"Having a staff member who is also a practicing teacher brings important insights to our curriculum development process," said Peter Lawrie, executive director for Orion's Quest. "This work supports world class scientists and we are thrilled that forward looking teachers have seized on this opportunity to expose their students to the wonders of STEM education at this level."

Talbot hopes to kick off Nease's weeklong project this week. Talbot explained that her students will conduct experiments on crystal structure to study the effects of gravity. Students will look at photographs of crystal structure experiments that have been conducted on the ISS without gravity, she said, and then run similar experiments in the classroom with gravity in play to analyze the difference.

"They get to see real life applications," Talbot said.

After the experiment, students will take part in a conference call with Orion's Quest to discuss the data and provide feedback on what they learned.

Orion's Quest is the only organization in the United States that offers a program of this kind. The nonprofit provides materials and support needed for the experience free of charge. Teachers can choose to engage their students in "live missions" currently being conducted on the ISS, or "virtual missions" that support past ISS experiments for which scientists continue to collect data.

### Accept and prepare for significant stock market declines

The Dow Jones Industrial Average hit the low of Feb. 11, 2016, when it bottomed at \$15,660. Yep...sure would have been a nice time to add stocks to one's portfolio, but when people are in the midst of a major hurricane of sorts, they often do not think clearly or rationally. Nevertheless, the Dow closed the year at \$19,974.62.

The move from \$15,600 to \$19,974 was, of course, not straight up. In fact, there were many scary moments thought the year. But once again the stock market, measured by the Dow Jones Industrial Average, climbed the

proverbial "Wall of Worry" as it ascended to close just short of \$20,000.

Indeed, nobody would think one was a genius for staying the course or better yet, buying stocks when there was blood in the streets. Nope, crazy was more like it! However, at least for now, some of the "crazy" ones are coming out ahead!

When we are in the middle of so much anxiety and folks are stampeding to the exit door, it is hard to recognize that the theater is not on fire. Nevertheless, it was déjà vu all over again, as far too many folks hit the panic button and their rational thinking went out the window. When selling stopped, and all the bears were exhausted, there appeared nothing else to do but buy! This is called capitulation! Regardless, many investors apparently believed this was going to be the first time in market history that the market went down and stayed down forever.

"Mr. Market" did it again! He made fools out of those who bet on the demise of the stock market. Of course, nobody knows what the future holds for stocks. In fact, the doomsayers will perhaps be right at some point, but for the past seven years, the alarmists have been dead wrong! I know that you understand that we will experience more gut-wrenching declines at some point. Regrettably, that is how the "game" works. I encourage you to accept and emotionally prepare for the pending significant decline in stocks. Heck, it could begin as I type these words, or we may not witness a meaningful downturn for years.

In other words, it is not a matter of if, but when. Therefore, how will you react when the inevitable time arrives? As I have been saying for 32 years, keep your finger off the panic button during times of turmoil. As difficult as it is, I encourage you to bite the bullet and allow the process to run its course. 


## Stellers Gallery spring show to feature works by Laura Lacambra Shubert and Erin Gregory



first female golfer to sign for a Division 1 golf team in Florida.




