





Native Sun expands to Jacksonville Beach

Doors open Sept. 19 at 3rd Street location

Iacksonville Beach is about to "go native" with help from a local natural foods market chain. Native Sun, an allorganic natural foods store, opens its third location this month in Jacksonville Beach at 1585 3rd St., N. Long-time locals will recognize the spot as a former Blockbuster Video location—but the new building is completely unrecognizable after a top-to-bottom remodel.

The Saturday grand opening event will begin at 10 a.m. and will offer \$50 of free groceries to the first 250 customers in addition to sampling, representatives from local farms and product providers and other in-store events.

The new store has brought 50 jobs to the Beaches. Just like other locations on Baymeadows Rd. and San Jose Blvd., the Third St. location will offer familyfriendly events year-round.

Native Sun was founded by Jacksonville native Aaron Gottlieb in 1996-and Gottlieb remains very hands-on at all locations. Gottlieb said that the expansion into Jacksonville Beach was a natural for the company.

"The grocery business is a neighborhood business," Gottlieb said. "We were glad to come to Jacksonville before it had natural foods—but the Beaches have always been a goal. The Beach has just been calling. I've been looking and looking."

Gottlieb said that in planning the new location, they went to customers for feedback on what Native Sun could

'We've learned as we expanded our food service at the Baymeadows location that people wanted more natural foods solutions to quick meals," Gottlieb said. "We have a whole different footprint at the beach. Our deli is actually a section of the store with a seating area and registers built into the area. It's two-sided—one side is self-serve and one side is full serve. Now is it more of a food destination to sit down and eat."

When the first store opened in 1996, Native Sun was the only option for shoppers who wanted to purchase organic groceries. Now that many chain supermarkets offer organic options, Gottlieb says that Native Sun customers return because of the high standards and responsiveness offered by the grocery store.

"We offer only organic produce, grass-fed beef, and dairy products free of synthetic growth hormones and antibiotics not because we hope to capitalize on their current popularity, but because we consider these items essential to a healthy lifestyle."

After its grand opening, Native Sun in Jacksonville Beach will be open Monday through Saturday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., and Sundays, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Archaeologist to discuss endangered 3,000-year-old site in Miami

The Archaeological Institute of America--Jacksonville Society will meet at noon on Saturday Sept. 19 at the University of North Florida. A lecture by archaeologist and director of the Archaeological and Historical Conservancy, Inc., Robert Carr titled "The Miami Circles: Uncovering 3000 Years of Miami's History" will be presented.

The lecture will describe archaeological discoveries made at the mouth of the Miami River. After the preservation of the Miami Circle on the south bank of the river in 1999, archaeological excavations were conducted on the north bank beginning in 2012.

Over 2,000 post holes have been uncovered representing numerous Tequesta structures, including eleven circles. On the same parcel evidence of a Seminole War fort and the foundations of Miami's first hotel, the Royal Palm, have been uncovered.

These discoveries and their dilemmas for preservationists and developers will be discussed.

The meeting is free and open to the public. Complimentary refreshments will be served in the Archaeology Lab after the lecture. Did you ever think you'd end up in Florida?

No. I never thought I'd be living in Alabama and never thought I'd be living in Florida! I'm married with three kids — they're all students here also — and we love Florida. We love the southern culture. My wife is from northern Virginia and went to University of Richmond and was a lower school teacher in Richmond for a number of years. She loved Richmond. We knew we were going to love this kind of feel to a town. Her brother lives outside of Orlando in Winter Park — so we've spent some time in Florida and we are thrilled to be here.

Tell me about your children.

They are going into seventh, eighth and ninth grade at Bolles. This is a great lower school campus and they feed into our middle school campus. The middle school has its own campus. I have two there — a boy in seventh grade, Beau, and a daughter, Campbell, in eighth grade. And then I have a son, Wyatt, on the big campus — the San Jose Campus — in ninth grade.


I've loved that middle school experience. They really can just be middle school students there. They don't have to worry about what the big kids are up to. That's my crew and they're enjoying it. It's been a good transition for all of us.

What is your vision for this year at the Bolles School?

I was a headmaster before, and in year one I really do like to spend a lot of time listening. I'll be doing that on all of our campuses — this campus in particular. Spending time with the faculty and the parents, with the administration. Just spending time listening and learning the culture. Then taking it from there. We are engaged in our reaccreditation with the Florida Council of Independent Schools, FCIS. That happens once every 10 years. We are required to go through that this year, and as part of that we do strategic planning. I'll be listening but we also are developing a strategic plan. We have lots of constituent members from the community involved in that. Some of those plans will roll out in a month or two.

What sets Bolles apart from other schools where you have worked?

I think it's the mission. Our motto is: 'The Bolles Way: Pursuing excellence through courage, integrity and passion.' When I was a candidate for the job and saw that on the website, that really got me excited. I dug a little deeper and now that I'm here, it's more than a motto — it's an ethos that permeates every corner of every campus. I love that. I love that we are academically an outstanding school and these kids are going to be exceptionally well prepared. When they go from lower school to middle school to upper school, they'll be exceptionally well prepared for college — no doubt. I've talked to alums and parents of alums and they all say that to a person.



St. Augustine's big birthday bash

City commemorates 450-year history with music festival, fireworks and other special events

A spotlight shined on the nation's oldest city during its 450th commemorative anniversary celebration last week, and despite the inclement weather, multitudes of people turned out to mark the historic occasion.

The celebration took place over several days from Sept. 4–8 at various locations throughout historic St. Augustine.

A highlight of the festivities was a free three-day music and street festival with live entertainment on five stages featuring local and national headliners such as veteran R&B singer, Aaron Neville, rhythm & blues gospel singer, Mavis Staples, Justin Townes Earle, JJ Grey and Mofro and Emmylou Harris with Rodney Crowell.

Saturday night closed out with a bang with a fireworks show over the Matanzas River.

The official anniversary was marked Sept. 8 with a countdown clock ceremony at the Visitor Information Center, a reenactment of Pedro Menéndez' landing in St. Augustine in 1565 and a procession to the Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine followed by a commemorative mass.

Sharks feast on Palatka Panthers

The hour-long bus ride to Palatka had no ill affects on the Ponte Vedra Sharks Friday evening as Coach Matt Toblin's football team took control of the game early then cruised to a 28-10 win.

Ponte Vedra recovered a first quarter Panther fumble and converted the turnover into a touchdown six plays later. Three Nick Tronti passes to Harry Jorgenson, JD Pirris and Hal Swan pass gave Ponte Vedra possession at the host's 6-yard line. Swan's 3-yard plunge put the Sharks up 7-0.

Strong defensive play by Noah Solaun and a holding penalty led to a Palatka punt but the Sharks turned the ball over right away when the Panthers intercepted Tronti's long pass intended for Quint Boyd. Ponte Vedra got a break when a holding penalty against the Panthers negated a 50-yard touchdown run. Palatka was forced to punt again and the Sharks engineered a 98-yard, eleven play touchdown drive to double their lead 14-0. Key plays included a third down pass to Marshall Few and runs of 26, 20 and 24 yards by Swan. Tronti earned the touchdown with his 11-yard keeper.

The Sharks got the ball right back when Alexs Djukic fell on a Panther fumble at the Palatka forty. Six plays later FB Colin York opened a hole for Tronti who bulled over for a 21-0 Ponte Vedra advantage. The hosts had to settle for a 33-yard field goal after driving inside the Shark red zone with 23 seconds left in the half.



Jacksonville finishes preseason 2-2

The NFL regular season for the Jacksonville Jaguars begins Sunday after going 2-2 in the preseason.

Jacksonville opens Week 1 against Carolina. Jacksonville will try to improve on last season's 3-13 record in head coach Gus Bradley's third season in which the club has only recorded seven total wins.

Offense has been the big concern. The Jaguars have averaged only 88.8 rushing yards a game in Bradley's tenure. Production from rookie running back T.J. Yeldon and running mates Denard Robinson and Toby Gerhart will hopefully bolster a lackluster ground threat.

The offense ranked 31st in the league last season. The offensive line is buoyed by free-agent signings – Jermey Parnell at right tackle and center Stefen Wisniewski.

Focus will be on the marked improvement of QB Blake Bortles. In the preseason he completed 65 percent of his passes for 461 yards, with a TD and no turnovers. The second-year signal caller out of UCF also ran for 42 yards and a TD.


THOMAS TO MISS OPENER —







Brumos Motor cars then and now

Marking 25 years of history

This year marks a notable milestone in the history of Brumos Automotive. Twenty-five years ago, a partnership between Dan Davis and Bob Snodgrass was formed under the name of Brumos Motor Cars, Inc., marking the end of the Gregg family's era of ownership and consolidating the Mercedes-Benz and Porsche dealerships under the Brumos name.

Since then, Brumos Motor Cars has continued to evolve, now including five stores — Brumos Porsche, Bru-

mos Motor Cars (Mercedes-Benz including Sprinter) and Brumos Lexus of Jacksonville; plus Mercedes-Benz of Orange Park (including smart) and Brumos Lexus of Orange Park. Also located in Jacksonville is the Brumos Collision Center. The Brumos of today remains fully dedicated to the principles on which the company was founded.

The Brumos story began in 1953 with racing enthusiast Hubert Brundage. Brundage owned a Volkswagen shop called Brundage Motors in Miami Springs. After relocating to Jacksonville, he became the sole VW distributor in three states. Brundage continued racing, driving the first Porsche to compete outside of Europe in 1955. Awarded the Porsche distributorship for the Southeast, he named his new operation Brumos, for his company's Telex address (BRUndage MOtorS). He drove the first Brumos Racing Porsche at Sebring in 1960, but his life was cut tragically short in a highway accident in 1964.

Peter Gregg, who was a friend of Brundage, purchased the company the following year, retaining the Brumos name for the Porsche dealership. Under Gregg's ownership, the company acquired a Mercedes-Benz franchise, named Gregg Motor Cars. In 1966, Gregg earned his first major sports car race win. When a young Hurley Haywood bested Gregg in a local autocross event, the two became friends. They teamed up to make racing history, dominating the world of sports car racing and making the Brumos name known around the world. After Gregg's death in 1980, his widow, Deborah, assumed ownership and kept Brumos Racing in operation.

Bob Snodgrass, General Manager for Gregg, joined with Jacksonville businessman and racing enthusiast Dan Davis to purchase the company in 1990, merging the Porsche and Mercedes-Benz brands under the Brumos name. In 1991, Davis and Snodgrass were awarded the Lexus franchise for Jacksonville, originally named for third partner, Danny Sullivan. The dealership's name was





changed to Lexus of Jacksonville after Sullivan's partnership ended.

Snodgrass kept the racing tradition alive, immediately returning Brumos to competition.

In 1991, Hurley Haywood won his fifth Rolex 24 at Daytona, followed by SuperCar Championship titles. Snodgrass was also instrumental in founding the GRAND-AM Rolex Series in 2003.

Following Snodgrass' death in 2007, Davis continued his support, never missing a race.

Two years after Brumos Racing won the 2009 Rolex 24, Davis returned race

operations to Jacksonville.

Deciding to 'race what we sell', a #59 Brumos Porsche 911 GT3 made its debut in the GT Class in 2011, winning the GRAND-AM Rolex Series GT championship that same year.

President and CEO Charlie Tomm's vision for Brumos Automotive is to build on the heritage of the company's past, and partnership with the Ponte Vedra Auto Show is a great way to celebrate that heritage.

Ken Perry — Perry is currently at IT project manager at Landstar System Inc. Perry owns a 2003 Boxster S and is on the board of PCA. Perry currently serves as chief judge at the Festival of Speed, and this is Perry's second year judging with the Ponte Vedra Auto Show.

Mike Ross — Ross holds a mechanical engineering degree from General Motors Institute and attended the Harvard Business School. As an executive with GM from the late 50s to the late 90s, Ross was the head of the Fisher Body Division Operations, which consisted of 28 plants and 100,000 employees. In the 80s, Ross moved to Europe to become the head of Passenger Car Europe (Opel and Vauxhall) Operations, whose volume at the time was 1.6 million units and 100,000 employees. Ross returned to the United States to head up Truck Group Operations, launching the Chevrolet Tahoe and GMC Yukon before retiring. 





New this year: QR codes

New feature will provide additional info about featured auto show cars

A new technological-driven feature will be available at the 2015 Ponte Vedra Auto Show — QR codes that when scanned via a smartphone device, will provide the user with additional information about a particular auto show car.

Each car, if they register early enough, will have a QR code on their participant's sheet located on the car window.

The QR code will link to the Ponte Vedra Auto Show website where additional facts about the cars including make, model, year, interior/exterior colors, cylinder size, engine size, etc., as well as individual stories regarding such things as the car's history and a photograph of the car, if provided, can be accessed

Most car enthusiasts like to share detailed history about their cars, Beau Phillips, communications manager for the St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce said.

"A lot of these cars have individual stories passed down through the years," Phillips noted.

The idea to include QR codes as part of this year's program was that of Irina Finkler, St. Johns County Chamber of Commerce Ponte Vedra Beach Division member, who is also on this year's auto show committee.

Finkler, who owns Local Marketing Factory, LLC a Ponte Vedrabased business, works with technology in building apps and websites for her customers and thought the use the QR codes would be a nice addition to the car show program.

In order to scan the QR codes, you need to have a QR code-reader app installed on your smartphone. There are many available for iPhones or Android devices, just visit your app store.

"The earlier the vehicles are able to register, the more information we are able to share about them... information is a great addition into any program. The more information we can share, the better the program," Phillips said.

Local brings passion for motorcycles to this year's show

For Jacksonville native John Duss, the love of motorcycles began at 12 when he first got his hands on a Lambretta motor scooter. What started as an affordable way to get around quickly grew into a full-fledged leisurely pursuit that has led him down the path of vintage motorcycles.

By profession, Duss is a lawyer — but once a year, when he isn't in court communing with judges, he can be seen at the Ponte Vedra Auto Show participating as one. He has been with the show since its inception, 13 years ago.

The auto show this September promises to break the mold with several new additions, one of them being a vintage motorcycle display that Duss has taken the responsibility of organizing. This will not be the first time Duss has orchestrated such an event. What he is probably most well known for around the Greater Jacksonville Area is starting the vintage motorcycle exhibit that can be seen every March during

the annual Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance.

"They [the other judges] asked me about having a motorcycle class and I said I would be glad to do it if I can be in charge of it and invite specific motorcycles to participate — and so that's what we've done," Duss said.

Drawing upon the list of friends and acquaintances he has met through different vintage motorcycle circles over the years, he has recruited about 12 – 15 different owners and their bikes to come participate in this year's Ponte Vedra Auto Show. According to Duss, if everything goes as planned there will be an unrestored, fully operational 100-year-old Reading Standard on display.

"We'll have a long view of technology, design, mechanics and purposes," said Duss. "Some of them were purely for transportation, but motorcycling tends to have a more embedded sports aspect to it than automobiles do. Racing and performance has always been a significant aspect of motorcycle design and production."

While a lot of motorcycle enthusiasts

these days are into modifying bikes and turning them into choppers or café racers, the vintage motorcycle crowd, according to Duss, appreciates and prefers the fundamental aspects of an unrestored bike with original parts.

In regards to the 100-year-old Reading Standard, which Duss has seen displayed at the Amelia Island show in the past, everything down to the paint job is original. The bike, according to Duss, is not exactly a "museum piece," and it has most likely had some work done on it over the years to keep it in running condition, but by no means has it deviated from its original factory design.

Duss has about a dozen bikes of his own, some restored and some factory original. His oldest and the one he plans on displaying at the Ponte Vedra Auto Show is a restored 1931 Indian Scout, which he has owned for five years.

While you might think that these vintage — and certainly valuable — motorcycles are probably best kept in a garage, out of harms way, according to Duss, some of these bikes get used

quite a bit. And that's a good thing.

"It's kind of like exercise," said Duss.
"It's good for you under the proper conditions to engage in physical activity because it keeps you in good shape. The same is true with machinery."

Unlike the traditional Ponte Vedra Auto Show that will take place this year, the vintage motorcycle display is not a competition and will only serve as a tribute to the hobby and profession of preserving and restoring older bikes. There won't be awards handed out for best in show or best in class, but according to head judge for the PV Auto Show, Larry Weisman, that is something that they will hopefully be able to incorporate in the years to come as the appeal of vintage motorcycles continues to grow.

"I think it's fabulous," said Weisman about the inclusion of vintage motorcycles to this year's showcase. "I think it opens up our show to a whole other community, which is the two-wheel community vs the four-wheel community. A lot of people live in both worlds but some only in one and we are glad we can have a display this time."

Celebrating Corvette's 'King of the Hill'

The 2015 Ponte Vedra Auto Show is a special one for more than a few reasons, but this one will weigh especially heavy on those who've had a life-long obsession — or even moderate fascination — with General Motor's original sports car, the Chevrolet Corvette. This year marks the 20th and 25th anniversary of Chevy's Corvette ZR1, or "King of the Hill," as it is referred to by its owners and admirers alike.

According to the auto show's head judge Larry Weisman, 51, the Corvette ZR1, which was only reproduced from 1990–95, was a turning point for the sports car.

"The Corvette was coming through the late 70s and early 80s as having absolutely no performance at all. It was just a sloppily made, low quality vehicle with low performance that looked okay," Weisman

said.

Most notably for owners of the ZR1 was the addition of the 5.7 liter LT5 V8 engine, a powerful piece of mechanical engineering designed by Group Lotus — which was owned by General Motors at the time — that pushed out an impressive 375 horsepower at 370 pounds of torque per foot. According to Weisman, the engine alone added about \$30,000 to the base price of the car.

"In 1990 it was the most expensive car that GM had ever sold," said Weisman. "It

was a big step for a car manufacturer to take back then. They were just starting to grasp an understanding of electronic fuel injection and there were mandates from the government to reduce pollution and increase fuel economy, but in doing so it made the performance level of any kind of car God-awful. This was really breaking out of the box in the performance world."

The car officially debuted in 1989 at the Geneva Auto Show and by early March of the following year the ZR1 — in an effort to help market the car with its extravagant price tag — had set a new world record for the highest 24-hour/5,000-mile land-speed over 175 mph.

According to Weisman the ZR1 was not economical, however. Despite its wider tail and slight taillight variations, when compared to its non-ZR1



counterpart, the body style differences were not distinguishable enough to warrant the large differential in price.

"Think about the guy who spent 70-80 grand on this exotic Corvette and then nobody knows what it is because it doesn't look a whole lot different," said Weisman. "There just

wasn't enough body work done to it for the layperson to say 'Oh hey, that's an \$80,000 Corvette!"

In the final three years of ZR1 production Lotus made significant modifications to the cylinder heads, valve train and exhaust system, which brought the horsepower up to 405

with 385 pounds of torque per foot.

"It truly was the 'King of the Hill'," Weisman said.

According to Weisman only 6,939 ZR1s were produced in the six-year period and four of them are set to be on display at the Ponte Vedra Car Show on September 13.





A compassionate physician: Meet Dr. Arnold Fong

[Note: This column ran in last week's edition but was missing its final lines. This week, you will find it reprinted in its entirety.]

More than at any other time in our lives, we elders want to feel that life is still good, that we have value and contributions to make. And, perhaps more than at any other time, we want to feel supported and well taken care of by our physicians. So, it's important that we choose well, by expertise and, too, by personality. When I was in my thirties, I complained to my doctor that a specialist he'd referred me to was certainly intelligent but abrupt and condescending. I said that I guess it should be more important to me that he's more than qualified than to complain about his personality. My doctor said: "You should have both." I haven't forgotten that and have chosen my doctors accordingly.

Dr. Fong agrees. "There has to be good communication and understanding between the patient and physician in order for things to work well."

In his training at the University of Florida and Tallahassee Memorial Hospital, Dr. Fong enjoyed being able to care for patients of all ages. For him it was a more well rounded experience. Therefore, his decision to open a practice in Family Medicine. However, several incidents occurred that added a great number of elder patients to his practice. "When I was doing rounds at Baptist Beaches Hospital, one of my patients, a nurse, had a broken shoulder. She worked at Vicar's Landing and liked my care and became a source of referral for me, and many residents there started coming to see me. One of my patients from Vicar's was a vibrant, youthful and healthy woman

in her 80s who died tragically in an automobile accident on A1A. That event was the impetus for me seeing patients at Vicar's Landing rather than having them come to my office, and also moving my

practice from Jacksonville Beach to Ponte Vedra."

Doctor Fong was born in Miami of Chinese parents both of whom immigrated to the United States from Mainland China. After his Residency in Tallahassee he did locum tenens work, temporarily filling in for various doctors who needed to be away from their practices in Tampa, Topeka and Australia. When he returned from Australia he brought back his tired suitcase and a lively interest in a nurse named Vicki who he met while in Queensland. Over the next two years they endured countless hours in the air as their courtship continued, ending with marriage and Vicki moving to Ponte Vedra. Not long after, Vicki became the Practice Manager. Together they have surrounded themselves and their patients with a kind and friendly staff. Valuing the importance of his office personnel to his patients, Dr. Fong says: "They are the face of my practice. They have to have a pleasant and cheerful attitude when they speak for me."

About his philosophy of patient care: "I try to approach a patient and treat them as if they were a member of my family. That's my role as a family physician — to be a friend as well as a physician." He related

the story of having been at TPC and seeing one of his patients who didn't look or feel well. "He was alone and I finally convinced him to let me take him to the hospital." Another time, a patient came into his office alone saying she was dizzy and wanted Dr. Fong to give her something for dizziness. "Well, she was in atrial fibrillation and I took her directly to the hospital."

I asked Dr. Fong what he would want someone looking for a primary care physician to know about him. "That they are going to get quality care. I know my limitations about what I can take care of. If they need a specialist, I try to choose someone as understanding as I am."

"Do you feel that putting a stethoscope to the chest might sometimes be less important than holding a hand?" I asked. "You have to be a good listener but to marry that with good clinical skills so you don't miss a medical condition that should be treated. With medicine the way it is today, doctors have to see more patients. Some offices have Non-Physician Providers. I see everyone myself and I still try to give everyone the time they need."

"What's the best recipe for aging well?" I asked. "The basics: eating healthful food, exercising, maintaining good blood pressure and cholesterol levels. Not smoking. Also, having healthy relationships. I like to find out what my patients want for themselves and give them the information they need to make good choices. When it's our time to go, there's nothing we can do as medical professionals to change that time. But we can make sure we help our patients have a good quality of life rather than quantity."

I asked how prevalent is loneliness, depression or anxiety in his elder patients. "It's significant, especially if there is a loss of a loved one where their main support came from. Depression comes with isolation and lack of a good support network. But depression is fairly consistent in all age categories. Sometimes counseling is needed and medication as well."

"Are you holistically inclined?"
"Well, my training is in allopathic medicine so if I can treat with medication, I will. But I'm open to holistic approaches if a patient wants to try alternative medications."

Following that question I asked if Dr. Fong had any particular advice for elders. "I worry about their wishes for end-of-life care. I think it's of great importance that their affairs and stated wishes are in order. And that they have a Trustee who will respect their wishes, not necessarily a member of the family — perhaps a financial advisor — someone they trust who will abide by their wishes. I also would love them to write their memoirs."

"What are the most rewarding aspects of your practice?" "I think when I find medical conditions and the patient gets treatment quickly, or even if it's too late, making sure they get their affairs in order so they can plan ahead for their legacy. I like the 'cradle to grave' aspects of my practice, taking care of the young and watching them through their lives and helping older patients have comfortable later years and not suffer with pain. I always encourage a healthy pro-active lifestyle."

eat it year-round, summer is when ice creams are the most delectable, aren't they? Ice cream cools us down like no glass of iced tea ever could. Start slurping some of the hundreds of flavors out there.

You may remember climb-

ing into the family station wagon and sailing off to Howard Johnson's, which first opened in 1925, and by the '70s, had grown to 1,000 restaurants nationwide, with ice cream a staple, and we're not just talking vanilla, but also 27 other flavors, which seemed like a huge amount. But today bacon ice cream is a big hit in some stores. One shop tried making a smoked salmon ice cream but that didn't spawn a lot of followers.

Ice cream is \dots um \dots hot these days, both on TV and in the news. (Did you know a cow can produce 9,000 gallons of ice cream in a lifetime?) Despite all the commercials and features about eating healthier choices of ice cream, 70% of us still prefer eating the premium kinds, i.e., the "bad" kind, heavy on the cream and sugar, and on us.

Artisanal ice cream producers have popped up in many states, one of them being in the state of Maine. Mount Desert Island Ice Cream, is named one of the top 25 ice creams shops in America. The store is, no surprise, pronounced by the locals as "Mount Dessert Ice Cream."

The Sea Salt Caramel is not surprisingly a popular flavor, given how salted caramel products are soaring. But there's loads more, such as Cereal Milk that tastes like the milk at the bottom of a bowl of Captain Crunch. Girl Scouts Gone Wild is a must for those who love Thin Mints. If you love figs, try Bay of Figs ice cream. A Rocky Road blend of fudge and marshmallow cream with Belgian chocolate and chocolate "pebbles," and a cake batter flavor are also on my bucket list. As an homage to Maine's blueberry crop, Mount Desert Ice Cream came up with Blueberry Sour Cream Crumble, made with wild blueberries. It was rated by judges as OMG! the highest rating. The good news? The company plans to sell it retail in the future, so you can skip the drive to Maine.


Ice & Vice in downtown Manhattan has 11 popular flavors, including buttered popcorn with toasted raisins and dark chocolate bits. You can buy Three Little Pigs, a salted caramel base with bacon fat and chunked bacon pralines.

Can't decide what to choose? A store called MilkMade in Manhattan will sell you five (not-so) mini cones for \$12, if vou can't decide on what flavor. Some of their ice cream flavors include three different kinds of s'mores, chocolate coconut macaroon, PB&J, and a rhubarb compote. What a great idea! Beer samples are sold in small amounts, so why not ice cream?

No need to fly away in search of the perfect ice cream. Think local. You can even cool off with a frozen yogurt and your own choice of candy and cookie toppings at a nearby gas station — while you top off your car with gasoline. How convenient is that? I'd think FroYo counts as one of the 22 lbs you need to eat to be in sync with your fellow Americans.

I'm thinking that next summer I'm going to try to consume 22 pounds (make that gallons) of raspberry iced tea instead of ice cream. Fat chance.






