Immersion in marine science a summer option

Marine Science Center offers camps and experiences

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The Port Townsend Marine Science Center is offering numerous youth summer camps this summer, as well as other educational opportunities for the whole family.

From July 23-26, the Center offers a "Longboat Explorations Camp," in which children ages 13-15 can learn about marine ecology and conservation on the water, collecting scientific data on the Northwest Maritime Center's historic longboats, visiting some areas only accessible by boat. The camp goes from Tuesday to Friday and includes two day-long expeditions.

The "Coastal Explorers" camp, from July 8-12, allows children aged 8-9 to explore coastal environments of beach, glacial bluff, forest and meadow and learn how they support life in coastal ecosystems.

The Marine Biology camp, for 10-12 year olds, is from July 15-19 and is made up of classes, lab and field programs that include sieving through sediments, identifying plankton through microscopes, and articulating a gray whale skeleton.

An Art Camp called "Art in Nature," run by the Port Townsend School of Arts in conjunction with the Marine Science Center and the Jefferson Land Trust, allows children in grades 4-8 to explore the intersection of art and nature throughout Fort Worden, learning about the local ecosystems and creating studio art based on them with a student art show at the PTMSC aquarium finishing the week off.

There will be a volunteer information session on June 11 at the PTMSC Museum Classroom in building 502 across from the aquarium.

The PTMSC is offering low tide walks, in which people can explore tide pools and learn about the challenges that organisms in the intertidal zone face, on various weekends throughout the summer. On June 16, it will be from 9:30-11 a.m. On July 4 it will be from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., on July 14 it will be from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., on August 3 it will be from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m., and on August 31 it will be from 10 a.m. to noon. The walks cost \$5 for adults and \$3 for children over five, and groups meet at the PTMSC Museum portico.

The PTMSC and Puget Sound Express are offering Sum-

mer Puffin Cruises every Saturday from June 29 through August 10 from 6-9 p.m. Cruises will leave form Point Hudson Marina and voyage to Protection Island to learn about the history of the Protection Island Wildlife Refuge and its wildlife, with possible glimpses of Tufted Puffins in one of their last two nesting colonies in the Puget Sound. The cruise costs \$80 and \$60 for PTMSC members.

The PTMSC will host the Orca and Salmon Festival at its Fort Worden campus on June 15. According the PT-MSC website, the festival is "an annual tradition of celebrating the ecosystems that make up the Salish Sea, and deepening our relationship and responsibility to them." The festival is being produced in partnership between the Port Townsend Marine Science Center, Puget Sound Express, North Olympic Salmon Coalition, Port Townsend School District and Thunderbull Productions. There will be free entrance to the Marine Science Center from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., Salmon & Orca hat making with North Olympic Salmon Coalition from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., tours of Hope at 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and an educational exhibit for children including Fin the Migrating Salmon.

Full summer camps with a waiting list include "Seal Pups," for ages 3-4, "Junior Explorers" for ages 5-7 and "Marine Biology, Afoot and Afloat."

Coding camp returns to PT library

Kids 8 to 12 can learn valuable technical skills

"In this day and age having a fluency in coding and building software is becoming more and more important," Pacifera said. "It should be taught like a foreign language, every kid should have a taste of it."

As the weeks progress the kids will be led through activities by volunteers until they are writing their own code.

Last year the event had a regular attendance of 10 to 15 kids, youth services manager Hillary Verhaggen said, and they hope it will be just as successful this year.

Pacifera said while the program is perfect for kids who enjoy math and problem solving, the technical skills which will be developed are universally applicable.
