




\$700 - Concierge Pass: See unlimited films in person with exclusive Concierge service, not shareable or transferable; includes VIP access to select parties, Dinner

on Taylor Street and a tax benefit; Unlimited Virtual Pass included with purchase.



\$250 - Festival Pass: See unlimited films in person, not shareable or transferable; Unlimited Virtual Pass included with purchase.



\$120 - Six-Pack Pass: See six films in person; can be shared with others.

Pass Holder Entry Queue

Step 1: Select your films.

Step 2: Line up outside of the theatre of your film choice. Lines form early for the most popular films. Some film venues have smaller seating capacities. Arrive early for the best chance at your top picks! We suggest 45-60 minutes, depending on venue size.

Step 3: Forty minutes before showtime, ushers will distribute numbered tickets to the pass holders in line. We distribute on a first-in-line, first-served basis. All pass holders must be present to claim a ticket. A numbered ticket guarantees a seat. For example:

9:00 show – tickets released at 8:20 9:15 show – tickets released at 8:35 9:30 show – tickets released at 8:50

Step 4: Doors open just 10 minutes later, 30 minutes before showtime. You must show your numbered ticket and pass to enter. Remember, your ticket is your ballot!

Latecomers: If you are a pass holder and arrive after the doors open, see the theatre manager for a numbered ticket. If the house is full or the film has already started, you will have time to select a different film. No one will be allowed entry after a film begins.

Concierge and Patron pass holders: See the theatre manager to claim a numbered ticket starting 40 minutes before showtime. All unclaimed Concierge tickets will be released 10 minutes before showtime. No one will be allowed entry after a film begins.

Updated COVID protocols : (As of 9/15 - Check ptfilmfest.com for the most current info.) PTFF is committed to providing a safe environment for all Festival participants. As a result, **masking is required** inside all theatres and venues for all events. Masks may be removed to eat or drink. Masking is also recommended at the Taylor Street Outdoor Theatre. **Theatre protocols:** Recording devices are strictly prohibited. Saving seats is not allowed. Check the program timing! Run times do not include Q&A sessions or introductions. Children younger than 6 are permitted only at the Taylor Street Outdoor Theatre. The Starlight Room is a 21+ venue. Films are not rated. Parental discretion is advised. All theatres are wheelchair-accessible.

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




Napoleon Dynamite




Bad Axe

Director David Siev returns to his hometown, Bad Axe, Michigan, to capture his family's recent struggle to keep its restaurant afloat during the pandemic. A real-time portrait of 2020 unfolds as this Asian American family in rural America fights to keep both its livelihood and its American dream alive. When some of the restaurant's workers participate in a protest, that footage becomes the film's terrifying centerpiece. In a small town in a red pocket of Michigan, marching for Black Lives Matter isn't a way to endear yourself to the community. The personal is political. The politics are personal. BAD AXE is both.

Ahead if its time, the series insisted on having kids speak directly to kids about their favorite stories. "Reading Rainbow" also introduced the world to one of the most adored of television hosts, LeVar Burton. Thanks to his direct, unpatronizing and kind delivery, Burton became a conduit to learning for children of every background. Masterful editing between archival segments, the creators' comments and Burton himself further enhance the tale.

Kendra, an adult adoptee, reconnects with her Native American birth family, discovers her lost heritage and confronts issues of her own identity. Kendra is refreshingly candid about her fears and confusion. Her story will resonate with the many whose lives are affected by the Indian Child Welfare Act and Indian Adoption Project. Involving the nearby Lummi tribe, this story strikes close to home for Port Townsend.



Make People Better

In 2018, the Chinese scientist Dr. He Jiankui crossed the Rubicon in human evolution by altering the genetic structure of embryos to produce the world's first genome-edited babies. This clandestine and flawed human experiment, supported by China's government and top U.S. scientists, led to an international uproar and swift moves by Chinese authorities to take Dr. He into custody, and hide the twin girls whose genes he had edited. A beautiful and skillful presentation of the question of scientific experimentation for "making a person better" (in terms of health) or "making a better person" (in terms of designing babies). This film is guaranteed to be a catalyst for discussion on many levels.

George Anthony Morton spent 10 years in federal prison for dealing drugs. While incarcerated, he nurtured his craft and unique artistic ability as a classical painter. It's a film whose intensely personal message stays gently in the mind.

This film follows oncologist Dr. Carl June as he takes on the impossible: finding a cure for cancer. Despite suffering a series of harrowing personal setbacks and constant resistance from the scientific community, June and his team struggle to develop a revolutionary treatment for leukemia. All of June's research and work are on the line when 5-year-old Emily Whitehead becomes the first child to enroll in his trial. Not at all a cutand-dried science story; the people are always at the heart of it.



The Pez Outlaw

This is a hoot with a lot of heart, a spy thriller wrapped in a fascinating oddball comedy. We follow the true adventures of Steve Glew, a smalltown Michigan man, who boards a plane for Eastern Europe soon after the fall of the Berlin Wall. His mission is to locate a secret factory that holds the key to the most desired and valuable of collectibles: Pez dispensers. Glew becomes the hero of his own adventure, smuggling these rare goods into the U.S. and making millions in the process. It was all magical, until his archnemesis, The Pezident, decides to destroy him.







Pleistocene Park

Russian scientist Sergey Zimov and his son, Nikita, have a grand idea. Pleistocene Park's intent is to populate a stretch of the tundra in Siberia with large herbivores (horses, reindeer, yaks, musk oxen and bison). Their purpose: to create a grassy biome that will replicate the Pleistocene era and prevent the permafrost from thawing and releasing vast amounts of carbon dioxide. Gritty with authenticity (lots of muck, mosquitos, disasters), this film will interest climate-change activists, farmers and anyone who has ever tried to move a very large very wild animal. Is this guy a crazy genius, or just plain crazy?
