Bullets pepper Dover Street home

Bullets flew through a Dover Street home as a vehicle drove past around 4:15 Saturday morning, residents told Shelbyville police. No one was injured.

One of the residents said she was awakened by the sound of gunshots followed by bullets entering the house. She said she got out of bed, took cover and called 911.

A police officer found one of the bullets in a bedroom among blankets; another was recovered from a bedroom closet. A neighbor reported hearing five gunshots.

A suspect, who has not been charged as of Wednesday, was named. That suspect has allegedly said he "runs Shelbyville" and isn't leaving.

Suspect arrested

A second suspect has been charged in connection with armed robberies of T & M Market, Depot Street, and two people outside a Germantown Road home.

Traynesha Toysha Garrett, 21, of Landers Street is charged with criminal responsibility for aggravated robbery, Detective Lt. Charles Merlo of the Shelbyville Police Department said.

Garrett allegedly helped Godice Clark, who is charged with aggravated robbery, and a second suspect who has not been found, escape after both robberies, Merlo said. She is being held on \$20,000 bond.

Realistic BB gun

A teenage boy displayed a BB gun resembling a serious firearm to an employee of AutoZone, North Main Street, during an argument Thursday night.

The boy, who has been charged with aggravated assault in juvenile court, told Shelbyville police he was upset because an employee refused to test this vehicle's battery. The employee said he told the boy to leave and a shoving match erupted, with the boy telling him he was lucky he was wearing an "employee

shirt." The employee allegedly removed his shirt; the boy said the employee pushed him against a wall. The employee denied any further contact.

The boy admitted going to his vehicle and returning with what is described by Officer Bailey Dineen as a "Glock-style CO2 BB gun," cocking it before speeding away. A co-worker told police the threatened employee was screaming "Pull the trigger!" Others in the store said the boy never actually pointed the gun toward anyone.

Police charged the boy, released him to a parent and confiscated the BB gun.

Donations stolen

Approximately \$300 was stolen during the day last Wednesday from a donation box for the Tennessee Walking Horse Alliance set up at Calsonic Arena.

The box had been in the area of the trade fair between 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m., according to a report filed by Detective Sgt. John Sweeney of the Bedford County Sheriff's Office.

Rifles taken

Two newly-purchased rifles were stolen from a truck at a Lindbergh Lane home Thursday or Friday, a BCSO report said. The owner was unsure if he'd locked the truck.

Stolen vehicle

A blue 2008 Volkswagen Jetta was stolen from a Church Street home at mid-afternoon Monday, police said.

The car has a cracked windshield and a cracked right side taillight.

Dog shot

A dog belonging to a resident of the 1400 block of Highway 64 West was found shot to death Thursday morning, a county deputy's report said.

The dog was able to escape a fenced-in yard by jumping, the owner said.

"Little Bit" was found near its owner's home, the report said. The owner said it might have been mistaken for a coyote.

Gun found

A Longview Road resident had a little help picking up a handgun she found in the roadway near her home just off Coopertown Road on Saturday afternoon.

She told a deputy she was walking to the road to pick it up and someone in a passing car stopped and handed her the gun. The people in the car didn't seem suspicious, she said.

Drug charges

Multiple drug charges face a driver after she passed out while driving while impaired with a child in her vehicle last Wednesday on U.S. 231 North, a Shelbyville police report said.

Sylvia Marie Whitaker, 32, of Springdale Avenue was found unconscious behind the wheel by officers after a witness saw her cross the road and slowly drift to a stop. A crew from Bedford Emergency Medical Service took care of the child, who was in a safety seat, and checked Whitaker as she regained consciousness.

Whitaker was too impaired to perform field sobriety tests, police said, and was charged with second offense DUI, child endangerment, possession of schedule II and IV drugs with intent to sell, implied consent, possession of schedule IV drug and driving on revoked license. She was held on \$36,000 bond.

We've been open through the heat, the rains, the horse shows, and we'll continue to be there for weeks more. We've got fall crops coming in, and the vendors with other goods are working to have new products as they can.

We're next to the big blue water tower at the Celebration Grounds. We're open on Thursday afternoons at 2:30 p.m. Come see us.

MASTER BEEF SCHOOLS

I'm going to repeat this announcement again. It's important for our cattle producers. I have scheduled my Basic Master Beef Producer series. This is an in-person training on several topics at the basic level, and it qualifies for certification for the Tennessee Ag Enhancement Program. I will cover basic reproduction, genetics, animal health, grazing management, government programs available, carcass quality, marketing, food safety, etc. This program is designed for new beef operators who have not had any training.

The dates are September 20, 21, 23, 28, 30, October 5 and 7. The sessions will be held here at the office at 2105 Midland Road. We will start at 6:00 p.m. and go to about 9:00 p.m. each night. FALL WEBWORMS

I've seen some trees that are full of nasty looking webs that the webworms have built with leaves and spun webs. And these trees look bad. With these webworms there's bad news and good news. The bad news is that they make a mess, and these webs prevent treating with sprays because they cannot penetrate to reach the webworms. The good news is that these trees are mature and they can withstand this invasion. They have been healthy all season and these leaves are about to change color and drop off anyway.

I've added a picture of one of these trees. And this particular tree has these things practically every fall. It's a walnut and it has a crop of nuts on it. It just looks bad.

The trees to be concerned about are the young trees with tent caterpillars in webs at the trunk and limb junctions. These larvae will strip the leaves off of the young trees early in the spring and this can damage the young trees. Watch for these in the spring.

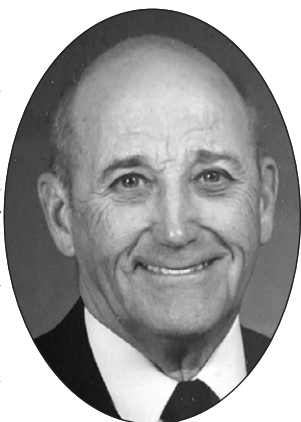

Grogan carries Eagles to region win

Shelbyville Central senior Cam Grogan excelled on both sides of the ball to lead Shelbyville Central's Golden Eagles to a 28-26 win over Coffee County.

The win was the first victory of the season in a Region 3-AAAAA matchup at the Eagles Nest on Friday night.

Grogan accounted for all four touchdowns for the Eagles.

He hauled in three touchdown passes and collected a pair of interceptions, including one for a touchdown.

"I'm just so proud of Cam Grogan for his efforts in this game. He's our offensive and defensive player of the game no doubt," Shelbyville Central coach Josh Puckett said.

"He was not going to let us lose this game."

The Eagle offense showed signs of what it can do in the first half but failed to score as a unit in the second half.

"A thing of beauty is far from what this was offensively," Puckett said. "We are really struggling with our consistency on offense. The offense finally started clicking in the first half and then in the second half, we just found ways to stop ourselves over and over. Coffee County did make a few plays and we did have a hard time blocking them at times, but I'm having a hard time trying to explain our inconsistency on offense."

Coffee County scored first when Jahlin Osborne caught a 17-yard pass from Conner Shemwell late in the first quarter. Elijah McCoy connected on his first of three extra points for the 7-0 lead.

Grogan hauled in a 44-yard pass from Kade Cunningham and Ben Betzelberger kick connected on the kick after to even the score at the end of the first quarter.

The Red Raiders (1-2, 0-1) regained the lead midway through the second stanza when Shemwell scored on a 13-yard run.

Shelbyville Central followed with back-to-back touchdown passes from Cunningham to Grogan before McCoy added a 25-yard field goal late in the half for Coffee County to cut the lead to 22-17 at the intermission.

Grogan intercepted a pass and returned it 55 yards to the end zone, with the ensuing kick after missing leaving the score 28-17.

Coffee County added a safety and another connection from Shemwell to Osborn in the fourth quarter as the Eagles held on late to get the win.

Both teams had five turnovers in the contest.

Along with Grogan's two picks, sophomore Theo Washington added another interception while Laquan Young and sophomore Logan McBee each recovered a fumble.

"At this point we are not clicking offensively like we were last year but we will get that fixed. I do see little things that excite me about this football program. We are getting more and more competitive on defense and that's a

Champs notch 1st region win as Ryan Inman delivers

MT. PLEASANT — All night long during Friday night's Region 5-AA opener at Mt. Pleasant, quarterback Ryan Inman made plays to keep the Cascade Champions (3-0, 1-0) offense in the game.

But when it mattered most, it wasn't his play on the offensive side of the ball that delivered the Champs their first league win of the season, but rather back-to-back tackles for loss in the closing seconds of the fourth quarter that secured Cascade's 16-14 win over Mt. Pleasant.

Inman was the spark plug for the Cascade offense that cranked out 196 yards, with 100 of those yards coming on 23 carries by Inman.

He also completed 3-of-7 passes for 89 yards as well.

"He's a heck of a ball-player. He found another gear. I've been waiting for him to hit that other gear for three years. He had to play almost the entire game on quarterback," Cascade coach Jake Tyre said.

Cascade had to wait nearly six minutes of game time to put its offense on the field as Mt. Pleasant (1-2, 0-1) worked over the course of 71 yards and 5:37 off the clock on the game's opening drive before Xavier Davidson punched the ball into the end zone from three yards out with 6:23 left in the first frame.

Cascade nearly got off the field early on in the first Tiger drive, but a pass from quarterback Nick Brown to Jeffery Williamson allowed Mt. Pleasant to orchestrate the 12-play scoring drive to open the game.

answered on the following drive with Inman firing off a 48-yard pass down the seam to Xamarion Dixon on the first Cascade play from scrimmage.

Four plays later on fourth and long, Inman dropped a perfectly placed 29-yard

pass to Hayden Dowell in the end zone to even the score following Drake Hodge's kick after.

Following the first Tiger drive of the night, Cascade's defense bowed up and played a break, don't bend style through the remainder

of the half.

The Mt. Pleasant offense totlaed just 46 yards of offense through the remainder of the half following the first scoring drive of the night.

Cascade, on the other hand, keyed off its defen-

sive effort.

With 10:36 left in the half, Kobe Inman came up with a sack on fourth down set the Champs up on the 46-yard line.

Cascade needed just seven plays from the Inman sack to take the lead on

a Connor Huie three-yard slice into the end zone.

Hodge's kick after put Cascade up 14-7 with 6:44 left in the half.

from their own 20. Cascade followed with three-straight negative plays that ended with a combined tackle in the end zone by Sawyer Lovvorn and Jake Bates to award the Champs a safety with 5:09 left in the half.

As well as things were going for Cascade at the close of the first half, offense became an absolute struggle in the second half.

Three plays into the third frame, Cascade fumbled the ball into the Tigers' hands, which set up the second Mt. Pleasant touchdown of the night—a 36-yard touchdown pass from Brown to Demarkus Brown.

Following the Brown-to-Brown pass, both offenses struggled to regain their consistency, which continued into the fourth quarter.

Disaster nearly struck for the Champs on the first drive of the fourth quarter as back-to-back losses of 13 and 12 yards backed Cascade up to its own one-yard line.

Inmon dug the Champs out of the hole with a nine-yard run to the 10-yard line.

After a three and out on the next Tiger possession, Cascade churned out seven-straight run plays that chewed up nearly four minutes of the clock.

Following a Cascade punt, Mt. Pleasant took possession on its own 17-yard line and pushed the ball nearly to mid-field, but on third and short, it was Inmon who burst his way into the backfield and recorded back-to-back

tackles for loss, totaling 15 yards of real estate, to seal the win for Cascade.

Even with all the adversity, Tyre said the resiliency of his team being able to overcome the second-half struggles was great to see from his young squad.

“They’re tough. That’s one thing before the season I was worried about is if we going to have the toughness to overcome the adversity because we’re so young. But man, we overcame tonight. The few seniors I have led tonight and it was awesome to watch,” he said.

The Champion defense had its handful defending a Mt. Pleasant offense that showed the ability to move the chains both through the air and via the option on the ground.

“They have players all over the place. We worked on it all week,” Tyre said.

In total, Mt. Pleasant totaled 105 yards on the ground, with Brown completing just 7-of-21 passes for 90 yards.

Cascade finished the game with 196 total offensive yards, 100 of which belonged to Inmon on the ground.

Following the win, an exhausted Inmon said he left it all on the field for the Champions.

“I was going a little crazy. I was just playing my heart out. I gave everything to my team,” he said.

The win gives the Champs their first 3-0 start since the 2013 season and puts Cascade in control of

Region 5-AA.

“We’re in the driver’s seat now. We control our destiny. We’re not waiting for someone else like we have in years past. They want to win and they want to play hard. That’s all I can ask for,” Tyre said.

Cascade joins Forrest and Loretto in the win column who both won their region openers on Friday night.

The Champions will return to the Stable on Friday and host non-district foe Huntland.

Alabama transfers making early impact

Alabama answered the question of what to get a team that has everything.

A speedy wide receiver and a new middle linebacker and defensive play-caller are welcome gifts for any football team.

The top-ranked Crimson Tide’s offseason transfer pickups, receiver Jameson Williams and linebacker Henry To’oTo’o, have already given Alabama fans a glimpse of what they hope to expect through the season.

The Ohio State transfer Williams had a 94-yard touchdown catch in the opening 44-13 win over Miami and ex-Tennessee starter To’oTo’o (TOE-oh-TOE-oh) made seven tackles.

It’s no wonder Alabama defensive back Brian Branch is much happier having Williams as a teammate than preparing to face him in the national championship game against the Buckeyes.

“It was very tough,” Branch said. “I was watching film of him every night.”

Williams and To’oTo’o make their Bryant-Denny Stadium debuts for Alabama Saturday against Mercer. But they’ve already made a splash as instant starters.

It’s no easy feat at a program loaded with other top recruits. But a team that was already defending national champs and a favorite to win again filled a couple of potential voids.

Williams gave the Tide an experienced receiver along with John Metchie III. He helped fill the hole left by two first-round NFL draft picks, Heisman Trophy winner DeVonta Smith and Jaylen Waddle, in a mostly young group.

Williams had four catches for 126 yards, most of it coming on the 94-yarder from Bryce Young that tied for the second longest touchdown pass in Alabama’s history. He did it with Smith, Waddle and

Henry Ruggs III — all first-round receivers — on the sidelines.

“The guys who were on the sideline, we talked during the game, before the game, just chopping it up,” Williams said Tuesday. “I feel like I am part of those guys. I was a part of those guys when I committed to Alabama out of the transfer portal. Once you’re Bama family, you’re family.”

But in January, Williams was preparing to face the Tide in the national championship game. He had just one catch for 14 yards.

Williams said he wasn’t considering a move to Alabama in January when the two teams faced off, but the transition has gone smoothly.

While ‘Bama was reloading at receiver, the Buckeyes were just plain loaded.

“I was real comfortable coming to Alabama. It’s a great environment,” said Williams, who had 15 catches for 266 yards in two seasons at Ohio State. “I love the environment and everything.”

“I feel like I fit in well with my mindset and these guys’ mindset, playing with my brothers. I feel real comfortable.”

He said Alabama was his second choice coming out of high school.

For To’oTo’o, two schools were ahead of the Tide. He wound up starting in each of his two years at Tennessee.

His arrival allowed Tide star Christian Harris to play his more natural position while To’oTo’o took over playcalling duties as the Mike linebacker. He had seven tackles in his Alabama debut.

But in some ways, it was a delicate balancing act coming in as the newcomer, albeit an experienced one.

“You come in here with a group, a team that’s been together and you’re the new guy, so I didn’t really come in with the mindset to be the defensive caller, to be the signal-caller,” To’oTo’o said.
