## JCEDC discusses partnership with Warrensburg Schools

WARRENSBURG — The Warrensburg School Board of Education heard a presentation by Tracy Brantner, executive director of the Johnson County Economic Development Corporation, regarding the relationship between the organization and the district.

Brantner said the partnership between the district and the JCEDC focuses on talent retention.

“We need to take a really hard look at what we’re doing in our community and our county with regard to talent and being able to drive that pipeline in a way that is a difference-maker for our community and for our citizens,” Brantner said.

Information from the JCEDC shows the district is the fourth largest employer in Johnson County.

Superintendent Andy Kohl serves as treasurer on the JCEDC Board.

“This continual partnership that we have with the Warrensburg School District is so important and it can’t be overstated how important it is because in order to have economic development, you have to have a workforce,” Brantner said.

### School Board Recognition Week

Kohl read a proclamation signed by Gov. Mike Parson declaring the week of March 6-12 as School Board Recognition Week.

Board members received certificates of recognition.

Kohl reminded the board that March is also Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month.

### Building Highlights

Director Susie Osborn presented information on programs and development at Reese Education Center.

“One of our biggest challenges at Reese is just trying to change the community’s perception of what an alternative school is and what our students are about,” Osborn said.

Osborn said nine out of 10 projected students graduated in December.

## Making a plan amid tornado season

JOHNSON COUNTY — As tornado season is underway, the Johnson County Emergency Management Agency works to inform the community about severe weather events and to prepare for the possible aftermath.

“We want individuals to understand what severe weather is,” EMA Director Cassidy Poteet said.

Poteet said the three major things people should consider are having a reliable alert source, making and exercising a plan and having supplies on hand.

Tornado season traditionally lasts from March through June, but tornadoes have been known to occur at any point in the year.

Poteet said having a plan includes making sure each member of a family knows where to shelter when at home, knowing where to shelter while at work and getting up-to-date information.

“A lot of people don’t ask those questions,” Poteet said. “The older you get — in school you can do all the drills and it’s great. We also ask that workplaces do those drills cause we don’t always discuss that.”

Supplies include a weather radio, snacks and water.

Poteet said it is important for people to understand the difference between a tornado watch and a tornado warning.

“On a watch, we’re looking at — all the ingredients are right here to potentially see something bad happen and then a warning is either we see it or it’s very highly (likely) that it is going to happen,” Poteet said. “I think it’s just very important to understand the definition of those two so you understand.”

Poteet said, in the instance of a tornado warning, people should know where to seek shelter and make sure their children know where that location is.

“It’s really just wanting our community to get involved with ensuring their own safety,” Poteet said.

Poteet said the National Weather Service is a good resource for understanding where and when severe weather is occurring.

“If a tornado is suspected, a

tornado warning is issued for the affected area,” the NWS website states. “However, while Doppler radar can interrogate severe storms very well, it cannot always detect the small-scale processes that actually lead to tornadogenesis. Therefore, trained storm spotters, public officials and the media also are vital in the warning process by gathering, relaying, and disseminating pertinent observed weather information. This partnership facilitates the proper detection and warning of tornadoes for the general public.”

Poteet said EMA utilizes NWS classifications and criteria in issuing a tornado watch or warning.

A storm system can begin as a thunderstorm but with the right conditions can form a tornado.

“The big things to look out for are a severe thunderstorm warning and that is when we’re going to see heavy rainfall, maybe some high winds and also, like thunder, lightning potentially,” Poteet said. “That’s dangerous depending on the time of day due to visibility, flash flooding.”

Poteet said Johnson County has seen smaller tornadoes.

The Enhanced Fujita scale indicates the severity of a tornado on a zero to five scale. The lowest

## Recognition paid to community members with developmental disabilities

WARRENSBURG — Mayor Scott Holmberg read a proclamation for Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month at the Monday, March 14, Warrensburg City Council meeting.

The council heard from clients of the Johnson County Board of Services.

“I just think it is so very important that we understand how much alike we are,” Holmberg said. “I will tell you that Warrensburg gets awareness with developmental disabilities right. I know that for a fact.”

The proclamation reads, “new opportunities have been created through the efforts of those with developmental disabilities and their family members, along with professionals and officials at all levels of government. Working together, they have brought about significant changes in the public perception of young people and adults with developmental disabilities, opening new doors to independent and productive lives.”

### Audit report

Jon Cummings with KPM CPAs and Advisors discussed an independent audit of the city with the council.

Cummings said the net position of the city’s governmental activities increased by \$3,531,160 and the city’s business activities increased by \$968,808.

Total long-term liabilities of the city decreased by \$1,359,981.

### Oakmont Villas

The council heard a first reading for a minor plat for Oakmont Villas, located on Oakmont Drive.

The plat would create two buildable lots and no new streets in a residential district.

First readings do not require a vote by the council and a second reading will be scheduled for a future meeting.

### Enterprise Lift Station

The council heard a first reading for an agreement with Anderson Engineering for engineering services for the Enterprise Lift Station and Sanitary Sewer Extension Project.

First readings do not require a vote by the council and a second reading will be scheduled for a future meeting.

### Budget amendment

The council approved an ordinance to further amend the FY2022 budget for expen-

ditures from the American Rescue Plan Act Fund, adjust General Fund General Division to reflect an amendment to the WCVB Fund, and revisions to the adopted Water Pollution Control Fund.

### Error in ordinance

The council approved an ordinance nunc pro tunc, correcting an error city staff discovered in an ordinance previously passed by the council regarding a portion of 703 N. Devasher Road.

Community Director Barbara Carroll said city staff discovered the legal description was incorrect in an ordinance previously approved Jan. 10.

## UCM announces masks optional with limited exceptions

WARRENSBURG — As of Wednesday, March 16, face coverings are optional on University of Central Missouri campuses in Warrensburg and Lee’s Summit with limited exceptions.

According to a news release, this change follows 14 consecutive days with no reported cases of COVID-19 among UCM students, faculty and staff and the downgrade of Johnson and Jackson counties from the high risk of transmission category by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Exceptions include the University Health Center, where masks remain universally required; select class/lab settings in areas such as health and science where masks were required pre-pandemic; and any other areas designated as needing to comply with federal or state regulations.

The university states classes and activities not on campus will comply with local guidelines.

“Individuals may continue to wear face coverings and medical masks at their discretion and are not and should not be dis-

couraged from doing so,” the press release states.

Medical professionals continue to maintain that the most effective form of protection from COVID-19 is vaccination.

The UHC serves as a vaccination site for UCM students who desire to become vaccinated and faculty and staff should consult their own medical providers for guidance on the vaccine.

The university continues to monitor the pandemic environment and will adjust protocols should conditions warrant.

# Zelensky pleads for U.S. help for Ukraine

WASHINGTON — Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky on Wednesday invoked the Pearl Harbor attacks ahead of World War II and the 9/11 terrorist attacks, while urging the United States to do more to stop the Russian war against his country.

During the speech, delivered virtually to members of Congress in an auditorium on Capitol Hill, Zelensky drew a comparison between attacks on the United States and on his democracy and called on the U.S. to institute a no-fly zone over Ukraine.

He's made the request several times before, but so far American leaders have been reluctant to grant it, citing concerns that American or NATO military pilots enforcing such a restriction on Russian warplanes would lead to a direct confrontation, significantly broadening the war.

"Today, the Ukrainian people are defending not only Ukraine, we are fighting for the values of Europe and the world, sacrificing our lives in the name of the future," he said.

Zelensky began the 18-minute speech speaking Ukrainian, with a translator conveying his message in English. But he transitioned to speaking in English toward the end of the address after playing a two-minute video.

The deeply emotional video first showed peaceful scenes of Ukrainians leading their lives ahead of the war. It then transitioned to gruesome scenes of war, including bodies being added to a mass grave, images of people being treated in a hospital and several scenes of children crying as they evacuated. The video ended with the words "close the sky over Ukraine."

Maine Sen. Angus King told reporters afterward there was a "collective holding of the breath" in the room and "the fact that he concluded his speech in English was a very powerful moment."

Biden announces more military aid

Several hours after the address, President Joe Biden announced \$800 million in additional U.S. military assistance to Ukraine, saying that he listened to Zelensky's "convincing" speech from the White House private residence.

"He speaks for people who have shown remarkable courage and strength in the face of brutal aggression — courage and strength that's inspired not only Ukrainians, but the entire world," Biden said.

Despite Democrats and Republicans alike commending Zelensky for his speech and his actions in Ukraine, it wasn't immediately clear if the United States would shift its stance on the no-fly zone.

White House Press Secretary Jen Psaki said Tuesday that the administration "continues to believe that a no-fly zone would be escalatory, could prompt a war with Russia."

"I don't believe there's a lot of advocates calling for that at this point in time from Capitol Hill, but we certainly understand and recognize that is still a call from President Zelensky," Psaki continued.

Zelensky on Wednesday said that if a no-fly zone was "too much to ask for," the United States should supply Ukraine with the S-300 missile system, airplanes and other weapons to help Ukrainians defend

themselves from Russian attacks.

Using the words of the "I Have a Dream" speech by Rev. Martin Luther King Jr., Zelensky said: "I have a dream. These words are known to each of you. Today, I can say I have a need. I need to protect our sky. I need your decision, your help, which means exactly the same, the same you feel when you hear the words 'I have a dream.'"

Zelensky closed out the speech speaking directly to Biden, even though Biden was not present for the virtual address.

"As the leader of my nation, I'm addressing President Biden. You are the leader of the nation, of your great nation. I wish you to be the leader of the world. Being the leader of the world means to be the leader of peace. Thank you. Slava Ukraini."

The words mean, "Glory to Ukraine."

Biden said during his speech that "at the request of President Zelensky" the U.S. has "identified and are helping Ukraine acquire additional longer-range, anti-aircraft systems and munitions for those systems."

Biden also announced the U.S. would send the Ukrainian military 9,000 anti-armor systems, including "shoulder mounted missiles that Ukrainian forces have been using with great effect to destroy invading tanks and armored vehicles"; 7,000 small arms, including grenade launchers and machine guns; and 800 anti-aircraft systems "to make sure the Ukrainian military can continue to stop the planes and helicopters that have been attacking their people and to defend their Ukrainian airspace"; and drones, which demonstrates America's "commitment to sending our most cutting edge systems to Ukraine for its defense."

The United States and allied democracies, Biden said, would continue to send Ukraine more weapons and assistance in the future.

"I want to be honest with you, this could be a long and difficult battle. But the American people will be steadfast in our support of the people of Ukraine," Biden said.

Congress reacts

Zelensky's remarks had barely ended by the time lawmakers began reacting on Twitter. Members of both parties said they were moved by Zelensky's speech and the video, and pledged to help Ukraine fight the war.

Many were nonspecific about how the United States should aid Ukraine.

"I was moved by the remarks of President Zelensky this morning," Virginia Democrat and Senate Intelligence Committee Chairman Mark Warner tweeted. "Virginia stands with Ukraine as they navigate the terror of this senseless invasion."

Others called for more targeted actions, including providing the military tools Zelensky requested.

"The Biden administration must respond with more lethal assistance, including the airplanes, anti-air weapons, and tightened sanctions immediately," Sen. Rob Portman, an Ohio Republican who co-chairs the Senate Ukraine Caucus, tweeted. "If they won't, then Congress must again act in a bipartisan way with more help."

"We need to do everything possible to #StandWithUkraine," Arizona's U.S. Rep. Ruben Gallego, a Democrat, said. "We can only avoid using troops if we are willing to

arm them to the teeth with every conventional weapon available. We need to again be the Arsenal of Democracy."

"@ZelenskyyUa is David taking on Goliath, but he needs more than slingshots," Rep. Brian Mast, R-Fla., posted, using Zelensky's Twitter handle. "The Biden Administration should move immediately to provide him and the Ukrainian people with the necessary equipment to defend their country."

His fellow Florida Republican, Michael Waltz, was more succinct.

"Send the damn MiGs," Waltz wrote, referring to a type of fighter jet.

Another Florida Republican, Sen. Rick Scott, called for sending planes and adding economic deterrents.

"We must give @Ukraine the planes they need to fight, stop Russian trade & implement the most severe sanctions on ALL Russian politicians to cut off these tyrants," Scott said.

Some members also named Russian President Vladimir Putin as the aggressor.

"This morning, President Zelensky addressed Congress to update us on Vladimir Putin's unprovoked and evil attack on innocent Ukrainians," Kansas Republican Rep. Jake LaTurner tweeted. "I appreciate his leadership & willingness to stand up and fight for freedom."

Noting she was moved by Zelensky's courage, Sen. Debbie Stabenow lauded recent efforts to provide humanitarian and military aid to Ukraine, as well as the administration's sanctions.

"President Biden and Congress must continue to do everything we can to help them defend their people and their democracy," the Michigan Democrat said. "That includes the billions in essential aid just passed in the recent appropriations bill for military assistance to strengthen Ukraine's air defense capabilities and critical humanitarian assistance. And it includes continuing to hit Putin and his oligarchs where they feel it most — in their bank accounts."

Although there was a bipartisan consensus that the U.S. should provide more aid to Ukraine, partisan bickering continued.

Some Republican members blamed Biden for not acting fast enough.

"Russia invading Ukraine shouldn't surprise the Biden-Harris administration," Florida Republican Rep. Byron Donalds said. "Anyone who was paying attention saw this coming. Unfortunately, Biden is leading from behind, which has worsened the situation. We need to accelerate more support for Ukraine, starting with MiGs."

Sen. Chris Van Hollen, a Maryland Democrat, said House Republican Leader Kevin McCarthy targeted the wrong world leader in remarks following Zelensky's address.

"Leaving President Zelensky's speech was sickening to hear GOP Leader Kevin McCarthy attacking, not Putin, but" Biden, Van Hollen said on Twitter. "Somebody needs to tell him who the real enemy is & to stop playing politics with the defense of freedom in Ukraine. We're all in this together."

McCarthy, of California, told reporters he'd advised Biden to provide weapons to Ukraine and implement economic sanctions earlier.

## Avian influenza cases confirmed in Missouri

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Veterinary Services Laboratory has confirmed highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) in Stoddard, Bates, Jasper and Lawrence counties, according to a Missouri Department of Agriculture news release.

According to the Springfield News-Leader, the University of Missouri Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Lab confirmed positive birds in Pettis, Randolph and St. Charles counties.

The MDA news release states samples are delivered to the VMDL at MU for testing if birds are showing signs, or there a sudden increase in mortality in the flock. Then, the NVSL confirms the positive results. HPAI is known to be deadly for domesticated poultry. Missouri Department of Agriculture veterinary officials have quarantined the affected premises, and birds on the property will not enter the food system.

"The Missouri Department of Agriculture is working closely with federal animal health officials to contain and eliminate the disease," Director of Agriculture Chris Chinn said in the release. "Protecting the health and welfare of livestock and poultry is a top priority. We encourage both commercial and backyard poultry producers to tighten their biosecurity protocols to help stop the spread of the virus."

Poultry producers should prevent contact between their birds and wild birds, and report sick birds or an unusual increase in death loss to the state veterinarian's office at the Missouri Department of Agriculture at 573-751-3377.

MDA Animal Health Division team members are working with federal partners on additional surveillance and testing in the areas around the affected flock.

"Avian influenza does not present a food safety risk," Chinn said. "Poultry and eggs are safe to eat when handled and cooked properly."

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the recent HPAI detections do not present an immediate public health concern. No human cases of these avian influenza viruses have been detected in the United States.

## The Suffering Olympics

As prices are fast approaching \$4 per gallon here. On the West Coast, the average gallon is climbing past \$5.72. The prices of other goods, from groceries to gifts,

will soon follow suit. So will energy costs. And health care costs. And all the other costs. The longer Russia's invasion of Ukraine continues, the higher prices will likely go. The rich will get richer, the poor will get poorer, and the poorest Americans of all will have trouble commuting to work, traveling to medical care and maybe even feeding their kids.

People will struggle right here in Pettis and Johnson counties.

But don't you dare talk about it.

That is, unless you have something positive to say, like, "At least I'm not getting bombed in Ukraine," or "If you want lower gas prices, buy an electric car," or "Shut up and stop complaining, it could always be worse."

We're off to the races in the Suffering Olympics, that favorite American pastime.

The rules of the Suffering Olympics are as follows:

1. You are only allowed to be stressed or talk about your hardships if they are worse than every other group of people in the news and within earshot of your conversation.

2. If you do talk about your own hardships, you must downplay them with a disclaimer that of course you could have it worse, like starving children in China or the St. Jude patients in those sad commercials.

3. If you talk about your hardships publicly, other people are allowed to berate you for forgetting how good you actually have it.

As a cancer survivor, I'm very familiar with these Games. Upon my diagnosis in 2017, other people were quick to note that it could be much worse. I could have more cancer in more places. I could lack health insurance. Heck, I could be dead already. All these things were true, and I consider myself blessed. But the bigger truth is that when someone tells you how bad they have it, assuring them it's not very bad after all is not a solution to their problem. In fact, it's demeaning. And inconsiderate. It's like throwing a suffocating blanket of despair over a problem instead of trying to make it better. No complaining. Be quiet. Bottle it up. Deal with it.

We're doing this to each other locally right now over the cost of gasoline and the price of food. Just yesterday I saw people hating each other on Facebook. I'll paraphrase their comments instead of reprinting them directly, for privacy's sake, because they should be ashamed of themselves. They said things like, "Nobody here should be hungry. Just go to the food banks."

"You shouldn't have had so many kids and then complain. You should have planned for an economic crisis. Ukraine has it much worse."

These kind of statements are as ridiculous as they are cruel. Nobody can plan for two years of viral pandemic and the brink of World War III right on its heels. Nobody should be relying on Open Door to magically feed more and more of the community as prices rise higher and higher. Yes, we should all be prudent and prepared. Yes, we should all be grateful and thankful. But we should also be compassionate and oriented toward problem-solving in our own communities. The fact that other people in other places have it worse is not an excuse for apathy and mean-spiritedness toward our own neighbors. In fact, if you're a Christian, the Bible specifically commands we take care of those in our own towns:

"If among you, one of your brothers should become poor, in any of your towns within your land that the Lord your God is giving you, you shall not harden your heart or shut your hand against your poor brother, but you shall open your hand to him and lend him sufficient for his need, whatever it may be." — Deuteronomy 15:7

The Suffering Olympics has no winners, because the more you suffer, the more miserable you are. In fact, everyone in the Games is miserable. Everyone ends up hurting and scared and judgmental and stressed, but afraid to talk about it, lest they be seen as insufficiently grateful they don't have it worse. And someone is always worse. Hungrier, sicker, poorer, more abused. Everyone loses. Always.

This week, a man named Father Clinton Sensat wrote a fabulous Facebook sermon about comparative suffering and compassion. It is much too long to reprint here, but the best part is this:

"On the Cross he opened all suffering to his divine presence. He didn't say, as so many of his followers do, 'Look how much I'm suffering for you. Stop complaining.' Instead, he made his Passion the supreme act of compassion. In every moment of our suffering, he has been with us."

We can either imitate His mercy or wait in quiet despair for someone to hang the heavy medal of the Suffering Olympics around our necks.

Misery? Or mercy? Our choice.

I recently sampled some Italian Proseccos that I must admit amazed me by their quality for their super affordable price tag.

To make their wines more individualistic than the other Proseccos, each of the producers have a particular twist that makes their wines just a little different from the others and their wines are so affordable that Prosecco tasting has become a popular pastime.

## Zardetto Prosecco Brut (\$17)

Made from glera grapes, blended with a small amount of pinot bianco, aka chardonnay, this Prosecco is a light lemony yellow, with elegant, refined bubbles.

The wine displays aromas of white flowers, apricot and herbs, with citrus, orange blossom and peach notes in the finish.

## Dry 2020 (\$17)

This wine's delicate pink color is derived from a bit of Pinot Noir that accompanies the glera grapes.

The glera brings a delicate, juicy fruitiness, with golden apple, white peach and floral notes, with the Pinot Noir contributing red berry and spicy notes.

The wine ends with refreshing acidity and creamy bubbles.

## Marca Oro Rosé Prosecco (\$24)

Marca Oro Prosecco DOC Rosé Brut presents an attractive pink color and a stream of seemingly never-ending bubbles.

The aroma presents floral notes of apple, pear and red berries.

The flavor and finish are as fruity as is the aroma, ending in an explosion of berries and summer white fruits.

This wine is perfect as an aperitif and it pairs perfectly with pasta, fish and even pizza.

## Gran Passione Rosé Prosecco (\$16)

Again, the basic Prosecco flavors and aromas are there to be enjoyed.

This wine's added extra is a positive strawberry flavor and aroma derived from the bit of merlot that is responsible for its attractive pink color.

The strawberry carries right through to the finish where it is even more obvious.

I found this to be a very interesting and enjoyable Prosecco.

## Brillia Prosecco (\$16)

This Prosecco emulates all Prosecco's basic flavors too but it also presents its own individuality.

There is a suggestion of ginger and honey in flavor and the finish along with a very interesting mineral flavor.

This wine will be easy to spot on dealers' shelves as there are floral designs on the bottle's surface and a myriad of tiny shining speckles on the label.

## Lunetta Prosecco (\$14)

A straw yellow color and crisp fruity palate are the distinguishing features of Lunetta Prosecco.

Well-balanced structure, matched with aromatic fruity fragrance, make it the perfect pairing for delicately flavored seafood while also being excellent as an aperitif due to its distinctive characteristic.

The flavors of pineapple and peaches predominate with a honey and almond background.

There are also the familiar yeasty overtones and a crispness.

This wine should not be reserved strictly for special occasions, but can and should be served with almost any meal of any nationality or as is with dessert.

## Ca' Furlan Cuvee Mariana Rosé Prosecco (\$11)

Another example of blending glera grapes blended with pinot noir.

This wine displays the aromas of cherry, strawberry and summer flowers which are intertwined with the characteristics imparted by the glera grapes.

This wine too has very long-lasting bubbles, which is a sure sign of a better Prosecco regardless of price.

# Six candidates vie for position on Warrensburg City Council

**W**ARRENSBURG — Six candidates are vying for two seats, each a three-year term, on the Warrensburg City Council for the April 5 Municipal Election.

Candidates include Eddie Osborne, Bryan Jacobs, Peggy Lasater, Bruce Uhler, Peter Zwally and Scott Holmberg.

Anthony "Townie" Clevenger previously filed for the race but has since rescinded his candidacy and will not be campaigning for the position.

### Why are you running for office?

**Osborne:** I want to be of service to the community I've called home for 36 years.

**Jacobs:** I enjoy working to make our community a better place and feel that I am able to make a greater impact to our community by becoming one of your elected officials.

**Lasater:** I have thought about running for several years. But this year I had a couple of people asked me to run. So I did.

**Uhler:** My purpose in running for a seat on the Warrensburg City Council is to serve the residents of Warrensburg, to help forge a vision for a sustainable future of our city, and to use my business experience to help solve complex issues and create opportunities for our city. I will improve and strengthen our partnership with UCM and Whiteman Air Force Base, and work with the schools, organizations, tourism, and businesses in the city. I will represent the city in a professional manner and work to improve and promote the visibility of our community at the regional, state, and national levels.

**Zwally:** I have always been a volunteer and active in the many communities I have lived in. I feel I have the time and talent to add to the City of Warrensburg and play an active part in supporting our City's growth and success.

**Holmberg:** Actually, still working on that question myself.

### What are your qualifications?

**Osborne:** I believe my commitment to civility, cooperation, fairness and transparency serves to qualify me for city council.

**Jacobs:** I have owned and operated RE/MAX United here in Warrensburg for seven years. I have set on several boards to include the Fuller Center of Johnson County president, American legion director and VFW member. I was the president of Midwest Board of Realtors. I served on the Grievance Committee for the last five years. I am a 22-year veteran of the Air Force. In all these jobs I have learned to work with people and assist them in accomplishing the goals they are wanting to achieve.

**Lasater:** I want to thank you all for giving me the possibility of being on our City Council. I don't know if I have any qualifications other than noticing things around town that could be different or changed.

**Uhler:** As a native of Warrensburg, with a BSBA in finance and

marketing from UCM, I have been fortunate to have a broad U.S. and international business career in management, sales and 10 years as a global sustainability manager working with global environmental, social and governance issues based in Sweden. I was also a small business owner for several years and understand the associated problems and opportunities and support services needed for small business operations. Presently I am the volunteer president of the Johnson County Historical Society. ... My professional career has been based on creating a vision for the future, solving problems, setting goals and measuring success using key performance indicators. My background as a passionate supporter of Warrensburg, my business experiences as a visionary, global team support player and problem solver will serve me well as a member of the Warrensburg City Council.

**Zwally:** Thirty-two-year United States Air Force Veteran. Ten years as an enlisted Administrative Specialist. Sixteen years as a commissioned Security Police Officer, holding such positions as unit operations officer, three times as a Security Police Squadron Commander and three years as a Project Manager for Air Force-wide Intrusion Detection systems and equipment. Finally ending my military career as the Air Force ROTC Detachment Commander and Professor of Aerospace Studies at Troy University, Troy, Alabama, retiring in the grade of Lieutenant Colonel. In retirement, I served two years as the Air Force Junior ROTC instructor at Blue Springs High School, Missouri. I have been very active in the American Legion's local Matthew-Crawford Post 131 here in Warrensburg. Again serving in numerous positions including post commander for three years and as captain of the post Honor Guard for five years.

**Holmberg:** No one is ever qualified enough. I have experience in the military, industry, social service and city government. Most importantly is that I have the ability to connect with citizens and organizations across all demographics.

### Have you previously run for the Warrensburg City Council or held a position on the Warrensburg City Council?

**Osborne:** I ran for city council in 2013 and was not elected.

**Jacobs:** Yes, I was on the council for six years. During those six years, I was Warrensburg mayor twice. I

also sat on Planning and Zoning board for three years. I was the liaison for the Parks and Recreation board for two years.

**Lasater:** No, I haven't held any kind of city office in Warrensburg or anywhere else.

**Uhler:** I have not previously run for the City Council.

**Zwally:** No on both questions.

**Holmberg:** Currently serving.

### What do you think are some top issues facing the Warrensburg City Council that need to be addressed soon?

**Osborne:** Certainly solid waste collection is at the top of the list. It is important to note this issue is being addressed by current leadership. I see a need for expanded cooperation between the business community and the city that fosters a win/win situation for all concerned.

**Jacobs:** As always, we still need to address the roads as we continue to travel down a path of not being able to keep pace with required upkeep. Some of that was improved by the bond issues that were passed but we still have more to do. We are going to need to address the homeless situation. Find a compromise so that they are able to live here peacefully but also keep the city image. We need to continue to work with MoDOT to get matching funding for the bridge over Highway 50.

**Lasater:** I feel that the trash and recycling and also our streets are just a few things that need attention to our city.

**Uhler:** Finance and budget constraints are always at the forefront of city challenges. We have to increase our revenues so we can continue to improve our city services, our infrastructure, our schools and health care services. Specifically, we have to solve our local trash service problems, create a recycling program, manage our homeless population, solve our daycare shortage, create more local jobs and continue our full support for our first responders. We have a brain drain of millennial talent and need to foster more local business creation, attract talent to create more remote work opportunities and attract internet-based businesses to set up in Warrensburg by providing the necessary high-speed internet and support services. We need to improve and promote our reputation as a great place to live and as an easy and supportive place to build and create local businesses.

**Zwally:** Economic growth, city infrastructure, homelessness in the city and city ordinances and rules.

**Holmberg:** Public

safety salaries are not competitive. Warrensburg needs to focus on talent development and light industry recruiting. Stormwater infrastructure with a heavy emphasis on native plants, swales, and biological focused solutions. Develop partnerships to encourage home gardening and community gardens. The prime and easy to develop areas have been developed. This requires looking at zoning and partnerships for the remaining open areas, redevelopment and infill of areas such as Young Street.

### What goals do you have for office if you are elected?

**Osborne:** I will advocate for a community-led study to determine the feasibility establishing a city sanitation department tasked with solid waste collection and recycling. I would like to participate in a review of our internship program with a goal of expanding it to include a broader range of disciplines. I will do what I can to foster positive working relationships with current and future community partners. I will do what I can to foster cooperation and civic engagement throughout our community.

**Jacobs:** I have two goals I would like to accomplish if elected as a city council member. One is getting an elected mayor. The surrounding communities have an elected mayor however the council for Warrensburg currently appoints a mayor leaving the residents without a voice on the selection process. The second thing is affordable housing. I believe this can be obtained by allowing 5,000 square foot lots instead of the current 7,500 square foot lot. By doing this, a builder could build more houses, which would make the per lot price lower and passing this savings on to the customer in turn making the cost of a house less.

**Lasater:** To be a different voice with different ideas either from me or the people.

**Uhler:** The goals I have set are to increase revenue for the city, increase grant funds for the city, increase our town's visibility to potential visitors and employers, work with the police to reduce crime rates and work with the fire department to increase fire safety awareness. I want the city to be known for being easy to work with for quality development, suitable businesses and all while maintaining our small-town charm and quality of life.

**Zwally:** To effectively and cooperatively work with the other members on the city council and the other city agencies

to allow for a continuation of successful, open and cooperative agendas to make Warrensburg a successful and great place to live, work and visit.

**Holmberg:** The issues stated above are enough. I would like to see additional community spaces developed with an emphasis on accessibility. I would like to see fire department staff levels high enough to support a fire station north of 50 Highway.

### Why should people vote for you?

**Osborne:** It's important you know I make no claim of being a better choice than any of the other candidates. If you feel their views and goals are reflective of yours then by all means vote for them. Conversely, if my views and goals align with yours I would appreciate your vote. I have no personal agenda for seeking a spot on city council. I do however have a vision of what Warrensburg can be. I'm confident we can be a community that works for all, is fair to all and embraces responsible growth.

**Jacobs:** I have a proven track record of being involved with the city of Warrensburg, Missouri. I would also like to say how happy I am to see a total of six candidates running for these two seats. I had a great concern when I was on the council that there wasn't an interest in local government but having this many candidates makes me feel much better knowing that people do want to

get involved. To the four who don't get a seat, I hope to see you being on a board or being appointed to one of the city boards and continue to be involved with this great city of Warrensburg.

**Lasater:** I would like for the people of Warrensburg to because I would be a different voice of reasoning for the city.

**Uhler:** If elected I will serve all residents by working with a diverse spectrum of people and organizations to identify and solve community needs. I will continue to promote Warrensburg, its colorful history, and its small-town character while working to improve the quality of life in our city. My experience in solving complex corporate sustainability issues, compliance issues, and working with large budgets will be invaluable to my work with the city and with the other council members. It would be my honor to receive your vote for City Council to represent you and to help make Warrensburg the best it can be. “Only one of those students that we projected to graduate did not graduate and that’s because of a personal situation that happened,” Osborn said. “In addition to those nine out of 10, we had two students that we didn’t have projected to graduate that actually graduated early.”

Osborn discussed recent program initiatives at Reese as well as the overall impact the center has for students as they enter the workforce or gain work experience.

“Our goal is just to change the way our students are seen and create more opportunities for bridging the gap between school and employment opportunities,” Osborn said.

## Consent agenda

The board approved all items on the consent agenda.

The board voted to approve the annual contract with JCEDC, with expenditures not to exceed \$4,000.

The board approved handbooks for Warrensburg Area Career Center programs.

The board approved two memorandums of understanding. The MOU with Missouri Valley Community Action Agency Head Start program facilitates collaborative services for all children, including children with disabilities. The State Fair Community College MOU joins the district with the SFCC consortium for the WACC Adult Perkins program.

## Financial report

Assistant Superintendent Troy Marnholtz said funds for the district, as of the end of February, are up \$1,584,355 when compared to last year.

## Budget amendment

The board voted to amend the budget to account for additional revenue and ex-

penditures.

Marnholtz said the increased revenue from PK tuition is due to increased enrollment.

“You can also see we’ve added an increase in our Medicaid revenues,” Marnholtz said. “We started using (Missouri School Boards Association) for the billing of Medicaid through claim care,” Marnholtz said. “We’ve really increased our revenue sources there because they are a little better at managing all of that.”

The amendment also adds the \$100,000 in GEERS funds the district received.

Marnholtz said a major increase in expenditures is the Building and Trades House project due to the increased cost of construction materials.

## NEE training and evaluation

The board approved the Network for Educator Effectiveness, an educator training and evaluation system.

NEE includes classroom evaluation templates, student and teacher surveys, online evaluation templates, educator professional development and extensive teacher observation and walkthrough training.

The program has an estimated annual fee of \$12,500.

The program will replace the current portal through Frontline.

Marc Doss, NEE project director at the University of Missouri, attended the meeting virtually and discussed the program with the board.

## FTE at Reese

The board approved one full-time-equivalent position for language arts at Reese for the AIM program and alternative school students.

rating, EF-0, has winds 65-85 mph. The highest rating, EF-5, has winds that exceed 200 mph.

“In that classification, we’ve had, I think in 2018 or 2019, we had a couple EF-0s that didn’t cause any damage to property or land, but we’ve been fortunate,” Poteet said. “There’s a little bit of luck to that, just depending on where it hits.”

Poteet said a lot of what EMA does is centered around preparedness.

“Before we even have storms, we have community-wide plans that focus on all-hazard events,” Poteet said.

Poteet said the Local Emergency Operation Plan is revisited every two years.

“What we’re trying to do ahead of time is make sure that we are prepared in case something happens,” Poteet said. “(LEOP) is going to layout how agencies are working together. That’s going to layout, not necessarily step-by-step what we do, but it’s a starting point for what we’re going to do when we respond to an incident if it’s severe enough.”

The EMA Emergency Operations Center is operated in the EMA office. The EMA can also utilize its mobile emergency operations center.

“We can activate our EOC up to different levels depending on what our response is required, depending on the jurisdiction,” Poteet said.

Poteet said some of what EMA does can be done remotely.

“We’re looking at the weather forecast, we communicate with the National Weather Service about what’s going on because they’re also issuing that information off what we’re telling them,” Poteet said.

EMA also monitors the extent of power outages, property damage and vegetative damage.

“All of that is kind of happening when a storm gets issued,” Poteet said. “A lot of it’s communication too. Central Dispatch is who sets off the sirens, but we work in conjunction with them on when they’re set off. We also have storm spotters.”

EMA works with the other emergency agencies in the county and sends out warnings through the RAVE notification system.

“We are going to call key figures together,” Poteet said. “If (a tornado) hit Holden, that’s a different group of people than if it hit Warrensburg.”

Poteet said EMA would work with those figures to understand what they need and the extent of the event and could call in for assistance from the Red Cross.

“If it were necessary, we would make a disaster declaration and that helps get us federal funding,” Poteet said.

EMA has three full-time and one part-time staff members and 20-30 volunteers.

ARPA grant update

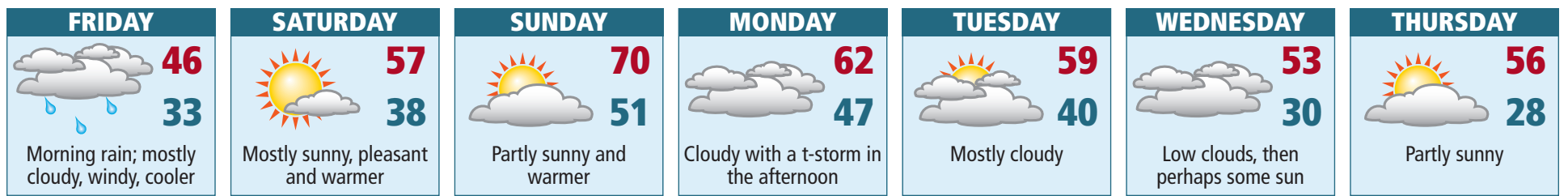

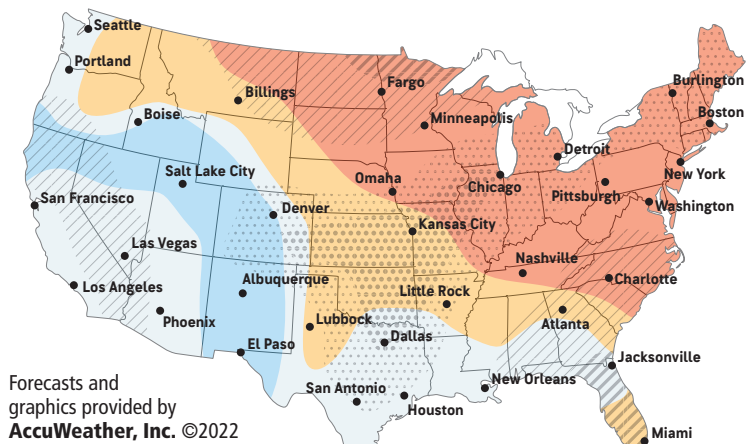

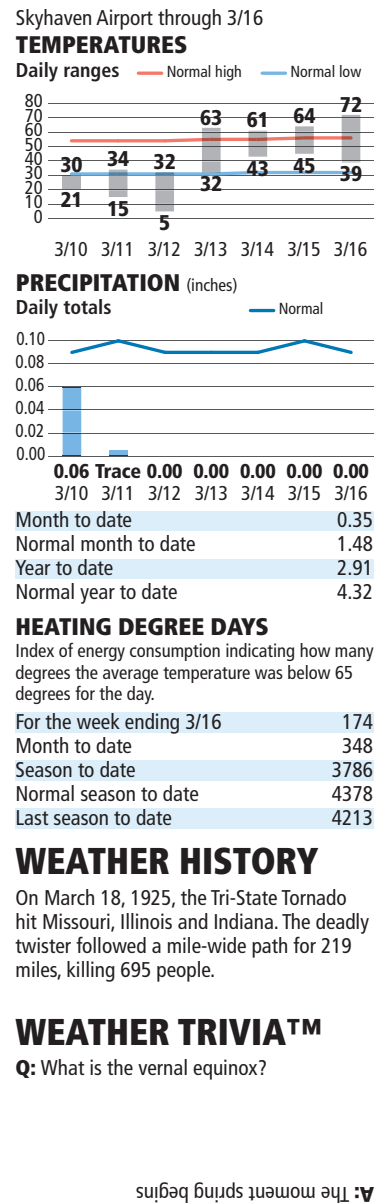

# Smithton native protests in D.C. with People's Convoy

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Over the weekend, a convoy of truckers arrived in Washington, D.C., to join others who have been there for a week to protest the government's response to the pandemic.

The People's Convoy consists of people driving semi-trucks, pick-up trucks, campers and even passenger vehicles.

Marcus Coppack, a Smithton native and member of the People's Convoy, has been in D.C. for two weeks. He spoke with the Democrat via phone to explain what has been happening with the convoy. Coppack now resides in Indiana.

"The scene with the convoy right now (Wednesday morning), D.C. police is blocking all entrance into the city," Coppack said. "They're not allowing the convoy into downtown D.C."

Coppack added that on Tuesday, there was a group of semi-trucks that were redirected by police onto a road only designated for smaller vehicles. The semi-drivers were not provided an explanation on why they were not allowed to continue on with their drive. The drivers are continuing on with the same plan.

"We have met with Sen. Ted Cruz, Sen. Ron Johnson and another from Ohio," Coppack said. "Sen. Cruz has come out to the convoy in Hagerstown, Maryland, at the speedway where we are and he rode shotgun with the lead truck."

Coppack said Cruz stands behind why the People's Convoy is protesting in D.C.

"We want our constitutional rights back but President Biden said if it comes across his desk, he's going to veto it. Why?" Coppack said. "Why veto it? So the government can be in control of the people? We the people have to remind our government that they work for us."

Coppack said that to his understanding, the government is trying to be in control of the people, but he admitted that he doesn't know much about it besides that it gives the government control.

"This country wasn't built on that in 1776," Coppack said. "The Declaration of Independence started out 'We the People of the United States of America...'"

Coppack continued by referencing Thomas Jefferson, noting that Jefferson said there will be a time when the people will have to stand up to the government and make them realize that they work for the people.

The convoy will be going to D.C. every day to protest until the government understands what the convoy is trying to get across.

Coppack said the convoy has received a lot of support from

bystanders but also a lot of people telling them to go home.

"Why should I go home when I am trying to stand on five principles known to man?" Coppack said. "Those principles are love, truth, peace, freedom

and justice. Just like this country was built on in 1776."

Coppack said he plans to be in D.C. until he is the last truck in the lot and on the road.

SEDALIA — The luck 'o the Irish has returned to Sedalia with plans for St. Patrick's Day celebrations taking place Saturday along Ohio Avenue.

Ann Adams, a board member with the Sedalia Lions Club, said a parade, sponsored by VFW Post 2591 Ladies Auxiliary, will take place at 11 a.m. with the route beginning at Seventh Street and Ohio Avenue. She added the Lions Club is sponsoring the Bed Races at noon and a Pub Crawl from noon to 7 p.m.

She noted they are still looking for Bed Race entries. It's \$25 to pre-register, online or mail-in, and \$40 the day of the race at check-in. The prizes include \$200 for first place, \$100 for second place and \$50 for third. The Best Decorated bed will receive \$100 and the Best Team Spirit will receive \$50. Sponsors include 3rd Street Mini Storage, Bryant Motors, Chancellor Painting, Goober Burger, Matz Properties, Sedalia Starter & Alternator Service and The Missouri Bank.

Adams said this is the Lions Club's fifth pub crawl. Check-in for the crawl is from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. in the lobby of the Pettis County Courthouse. The event is rain or shine and Adams they expect 800 to 1,000 people.

"How it works, is anybody that's ordered online, pre-registered or shows up the day of the event, shows up at the courthouse," she noted. "Because we check IDs and then we hand out their cups (and) we give them their wrist bands to show the bars they are of legal age."

"It alleviates the pressure of the bars having to check IDs," she continued. "And it can keep things moving."

It costs \$30 to participate in the Pub Crawl. The participant receives a cup, courtesy of J&D Pharmacy, a map, beads and tickets for three free

beers. T-shirts can be purchased for \$10 the day of the event.

"For the event, the open container law is lifted in our barricaded areas from noon until 7 (p.m.)," Adams said. "In order to have an alcoholic beverage in the barricaded area, you have to be a participant in our crawl."

She added anyone caught in the area drinking alcohol will have to abide by the standard laws and regulations. The Lions Club has local police officers monitoring the event. "The City of Sedalia has been amazing to work with, with all of these events," Adams said. "And the officers that step up to work these events ... there's just been minimal problems."

During the Pub Crawl, there are 12 drink stops and six food trucks. The food trucks will be parked along Ohio Avenue. She added the Hayden Liberty Center will host local singer and musician Clay Clear during the event. Clear will perform from 1 to 4 p.m.

Adams noted "it takes a village" to bring the event together each year. She's received help coordinating the event from Jessica Borchers, Courtney Hicks and Evan Fluty, who organized the food trucks. Kerrie Casey, a new Lions Club member, helped online with the event.

Adams said the event has already raised \$4,000 and all proceeds will stay in the community. The Lions Club donates to many organizations in Sedalia such as the Loftus Early Childhood Center, the Community Café, 4-H, Boys and Girls Clubs of West Central Missouri, CASA and the Salvation Army.

- JEER not leer. The word "disruptive" implies that the "pair" was loudly talking about the "masterpiece" and making mocking comments (e.g. JEERS). Leering, because it doesn't involve noise, would probably not be as "disruptive."
- WITCH not watch. WITCH is best because "typical" watches these days are digital and often don't have "hands."
- EWES not eyes. Raising sheep (e.g., EWES) would involve their protection; failure to do so would be a reason for blaming oneself. But the type of "work" and whether any eye protection was called for needs further explanation.
- SPILT not spell. He might "get in trouble for" being careless by SPILLING, but spell needs further explanation as to whether it was the misspelling that was "a bad thing to do" or the inappropriate word that the letters SPELLED.
- TOME not time. "A long" TOME can "seem endless," but time is, in itself, "endless" rather than being to be so.
- PEARLS not pearl. PEARLS fits the context of the clue best since the clue word "usually" indicates this is somewhat of a routine pattern. Buying pearls would not be considered routine by many.
- LINEN not lined. Compared to cheap-quality material, LINEN is more long-lasting. However, simply because the clothing is lined doesn't ensure that the quality of the material is good enough to be durable.

- CHAP not chat. CHAP is apt. Chat is redundant since it means to talk in a "friendly," informal way.
- WAY not war. History has shown that many wars conclude with one side having been overcome or conquered, giving them little possibility of a "satisfactory agreement." "A long" WAY leaves open the possibility of negotiations leading to some satisfaction between the opposing parties.

horrible situation came up I just put it out there, and our group said, 'yes let's do this,'" she noted. "It's important to us to pay back our community in any way we can."

"This is a horrible situation, and we live among Ukrainians and this is their community too," she continued. "And they are being affected because their families are all over in Ukraine."

Fante-Hession said she moved ahead with the idea to help Ukraine because she knows a Smith-Cotton High School social worker, Kat Zayats, who is Ukrainian.

She also posted about donations in a Pettis County Democrats Facebook group and said a member provided Vitaliy Shimko's name and told her to contact him.

"I called him and said we'd like to do something," she noted. "We are just a very small group but we'd like to do something for Ukraine."

She added Shimko told her the need was monetary.

"I noticed online there's the Red Cross and the Ukrainian Relief Fund and things like that," Fante-Hession said. "But this, to me, seemed like the most direct — skip the middleman, give the money right to the church and they know how to get it in the hands of the people that are in charge of buying food and clothing."

Schroeder added Shimko will send the money directly to their sister church in Ukraine where it will be distributed quicker. She added she feels like community is important. She went on to say if every Pettis County organization does a little to help Ukraine's humanitarian crisis, much will be accomplished.

Fante-Hession said Americans don't realize how much they have.

"It's pretty sad when we're complaining about the price of gas when they've lost everything," she noted. "Our donation will be a drop in the bucket, but it's a start."

"I think people get numbed to the idea that they see tragedies on TV and hear them on the radio," she continued. "They say, 'what's this mean, what can I do, I'm only one person?'"

Schroeder added each donation adds up.

"And whatever amount is in their budget (makes a difference)," she said. "What is good in somebody else's budget might not be good in mine, but it doesn't matter."

After the monetary donation is made, the women are planning to start collecting clothing, food or other needed items.

"We want to talk to Mr. Shimko on the 22nd because I understand we're going to get some refugees here," she explained. "And I want to find out exactly what it is they need such as food and clothing. Then, I'll go from there and post it and see what we can do."

She added Pettis County has a large Ukrainian population.

"They are our neighbors, our teachers, our people that we work with," she said. "We need to show some compassion and do what we can."

"This isn't going away," she said of the war. "This is just the beginning."

The girls have recently been seeing a lot of pets with matted fur coming in to get their summer trim. Dogs become matted if they are not brushed every day, which can be overwhelming for a lot of owners.

Each dog will receive the first rough hair cut, then a bath, blowdried, a finishing cut, and then their ears and eyes are cleaned along with getting their nails trimmed and body butter on their paws and noses.

Jacovino added that it’s been great watching her younger sister mature enough to be able to start a business with her.

Jacovino described some of the hopes and dreams for their busi-

ness, which include maybe having their own storefront.

“This is definitely just for now but maybe even turning the entire basement into something,” Jacovino said.

Levi Wilhelm's second season of high school wrestling featured plenty of success.

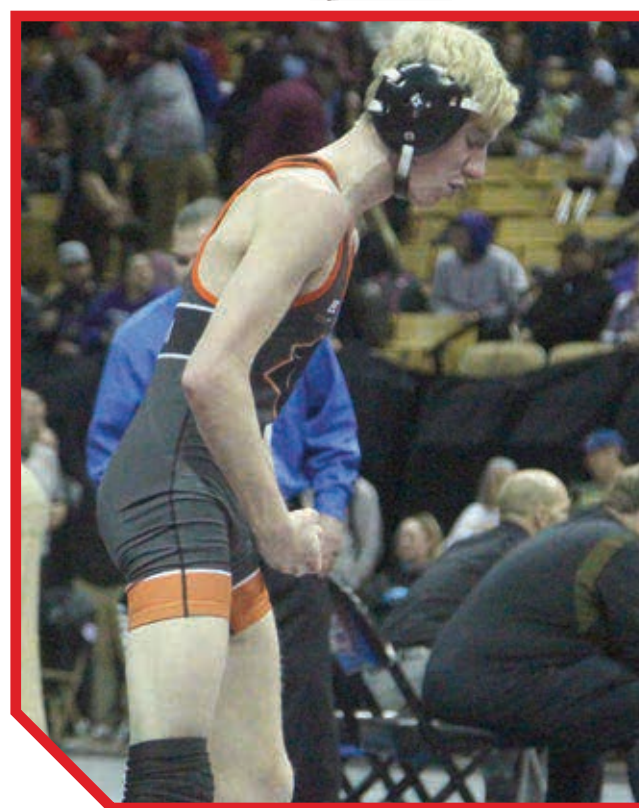

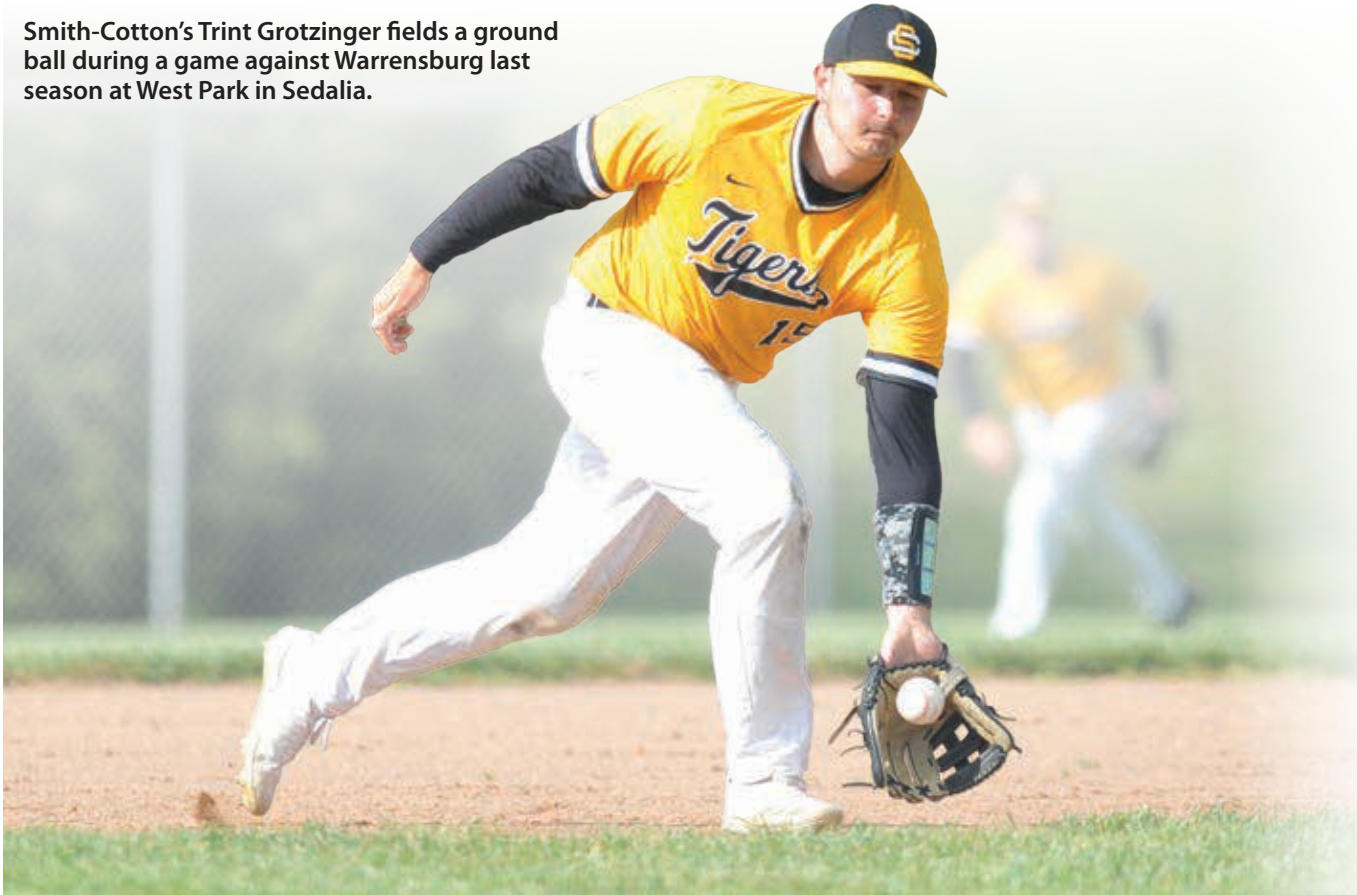
